## ECONOMIC CHALLENGES

NO CHANGE MODELS

GUILD CREEN

In the arena of Economics, the fact that the people feel powerless to change their situation indicates that the underlying contradiction is <u>lack of knowledge</u> of the process of change. This contradiction is illustrated by no community initiated models of change.

INCOMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC SENSE OF COMMON GOOD

GUILD YELLOW

In the arena of Economic Life in Uptown, the fact that there is an ineffective economic organization indicates the underlying contradiction is everyone is out for himself. This contradiction is illustrated by unbalanced markets, too many restaurants, acceptance of prostitution and only low-paying jobs.

LOW FINANCIAL INVESTMENT

CUILD RED

In the arena of Economics, the fact that a transient population is offered temporary jobs and there is no child care offered for working mothers indicates that the underlying contradiction is <u>lack of money circulated locally and low local financial investment</u>. This contradiction is illustrated by businesses moving out (i.e. Hillman's), absentee landlords (i.e. highrises), and people from outside taking local jobs.

# POLITICAL CHALLENGES

TRANSIENCE

GUILD YELLOW

In the arena of The Political, the fact that little intercommunication exists between social groups indicates that the underlying contradiction is <a href="Transience">Transience</a>. This contradiction is illustrated by fragmented ethnic group socialization.

STIRRING OF COMMUNITY CONSCIOUSNESS

GUILD YELLOW

In the arena of The Political, the fact there exists a migrant mind-set indicates that the underlying contradiction is that today's citizen is totally unaware of the significance of their role in their community. This contradiction is illustrated by a lack of corporate community meetings.

DECISION MAKERS REMOVED

GUILD RED

In the arena of The Political, the fact that the environment is a dis-incentive for personal responsibility indicates that the underlying contradiction is that decision makers are removed. This contradiction is illustrated by vacant lots, unclean and unsafe streets.

IGNORANCE OF RIGHTS

GUILD GREEN

In the arena of Law and Order, the fact that people feel they can't fight city hall indicates that the underlying contradiction is they don't know what they're fighting for. This contradiction is illustrated by local teenagers being arrested for things that others would be warned about.

RESTRUCTURING HUMAN COMMUNITY

GUILD GREEN

In the arena of Corporate Welfare the fact that money made in the community is not re-invested in the ocmmunity and there is a high rate of transience indicate that the underlying contradiction is <u>reduced image of community</u>. This contradiction is illustrated by eight locks on doors, people hanging out on street corners, people left to die, and truancy.

AN INFERIOR STORY

GUILD GREEN

In the arena of Belongingness to Community, the fact that people have no encouragement to help themselves indicates that the underlying contradiction is an inferior attitude. This contradiction is illustrated by absence from Council meetings.

ACCEPTING DIVERSITY

GUILD YELLOW

In the arena of Cultural Environment, the fact that residents are blocked from participation by socio-economic differences indicates that the underlying contradiction is ignorance of meaning of socio-economic differences. This contradiction is illustrated by Internationals who seek their traditional life styles.

NEGATIVE COMMUNITY ATTITUDES

GUILD RED

In the arena of Cultural Activities the fact that there ixists neighborhood's separatist attitude indicates that the underlying contradiction is a lack of community pride. This contradiction is illustrated by street gang activity causing apathy and a lack of responsibility towards their community.

INADEQUATE COMMUNITY STORY

GUILD RED

In the arena of The Cultural, the fact that people do not seem to care, have poor community and social education, and a negative self-image indicates that the underlying contradiction is an inadequate community story. This contradiction is illustrated by unsafe and dirty streets, people wandering aimlessly on streets, vagrants treating elders very badly and the obvious neglect of personal and public space.

BREAKDOWN OF SOCIAL MODELS

GUILD GREEN

In the arena of Cultural Commonality, the fact that there are peer pressures, parental indifference and isolationism indicates that the underlying contradiction is the lack of purpose in life and values. This contradiction is illustrated by youth disorders and indifference of people.
