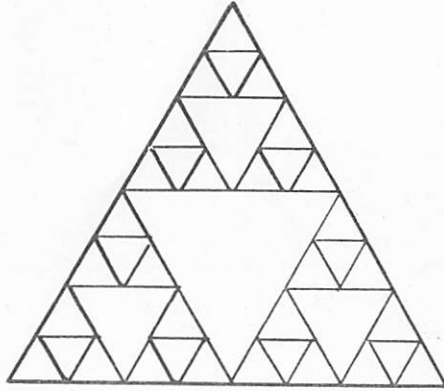
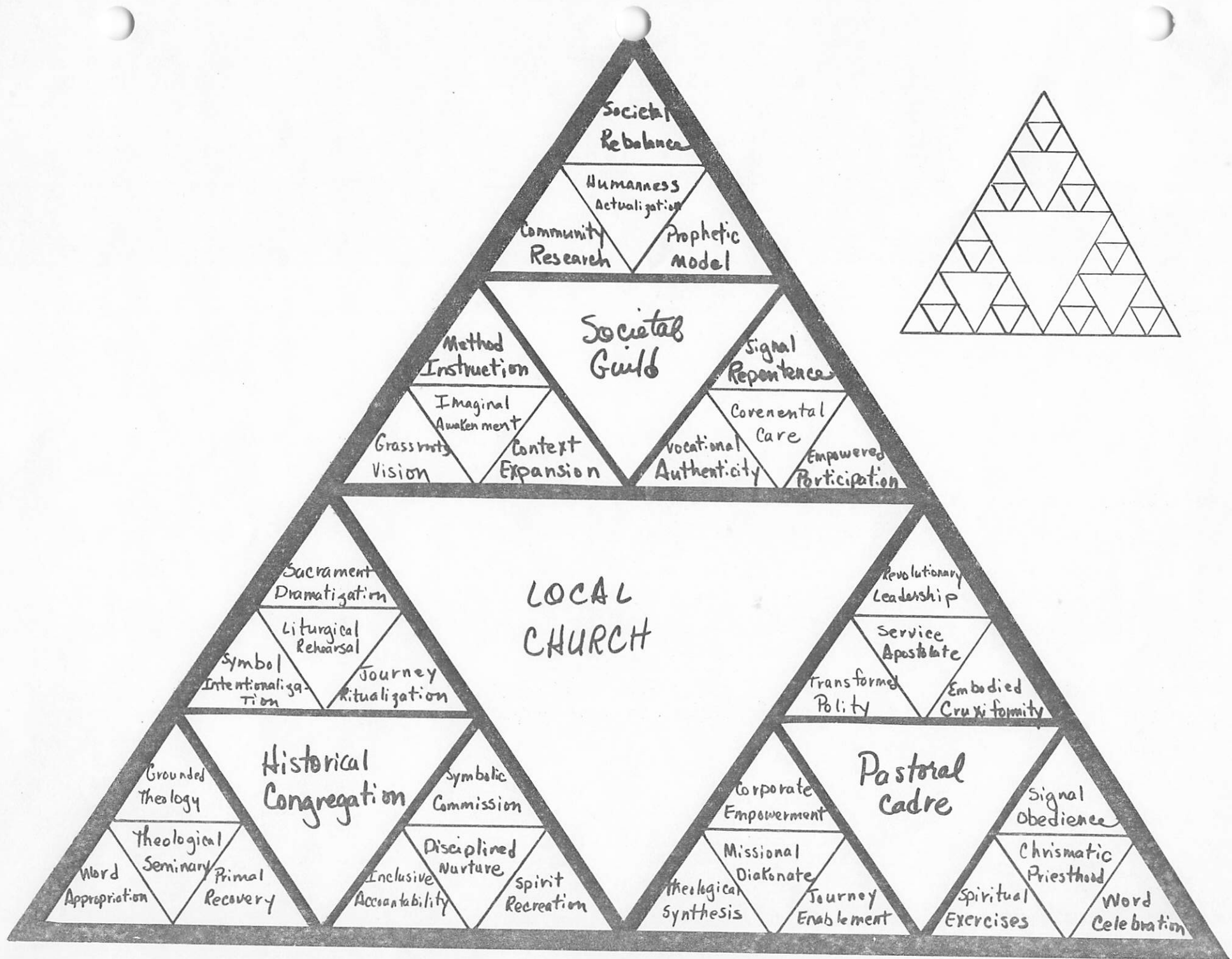


1. The Ecumenical Parish is a comprehensive reformulation of a particular community which deals with all the problems of all the people of all ages and races and traditions in a long range approach which relates that delimited community to the globe.
2. We will deal always with the Depth Spirit Problem - that particular form of radical self-depreciation that holds the people of this community in bondage rather than releasing them to engage the problems of Uptown.
3. The primary vehicle of reformulation is the local church, which means catalyzing renewal in the congregations of the parish, in which the clergy and the symbolic figures of leadership in caring for Uptown, and we are his invisible servants.
4. Those who would catalyze change will manifest a trans-establishment stance as those who embrace the fantastic diversity of the community and being the unifying dynamic amid that diversity, relying on the wisdom of the local residents, over technological expertise, and seeking always the intensification opportunity that takes the revolutionary leap rather than simple expansion.
5. The key to an Ecumenical Parish is the constant use of the Symbolic dimension in preference to preoccupation with actualities, of focusing on the imaginal rather than the practical, by making every occasion a great spiritual occasion for everyone present.

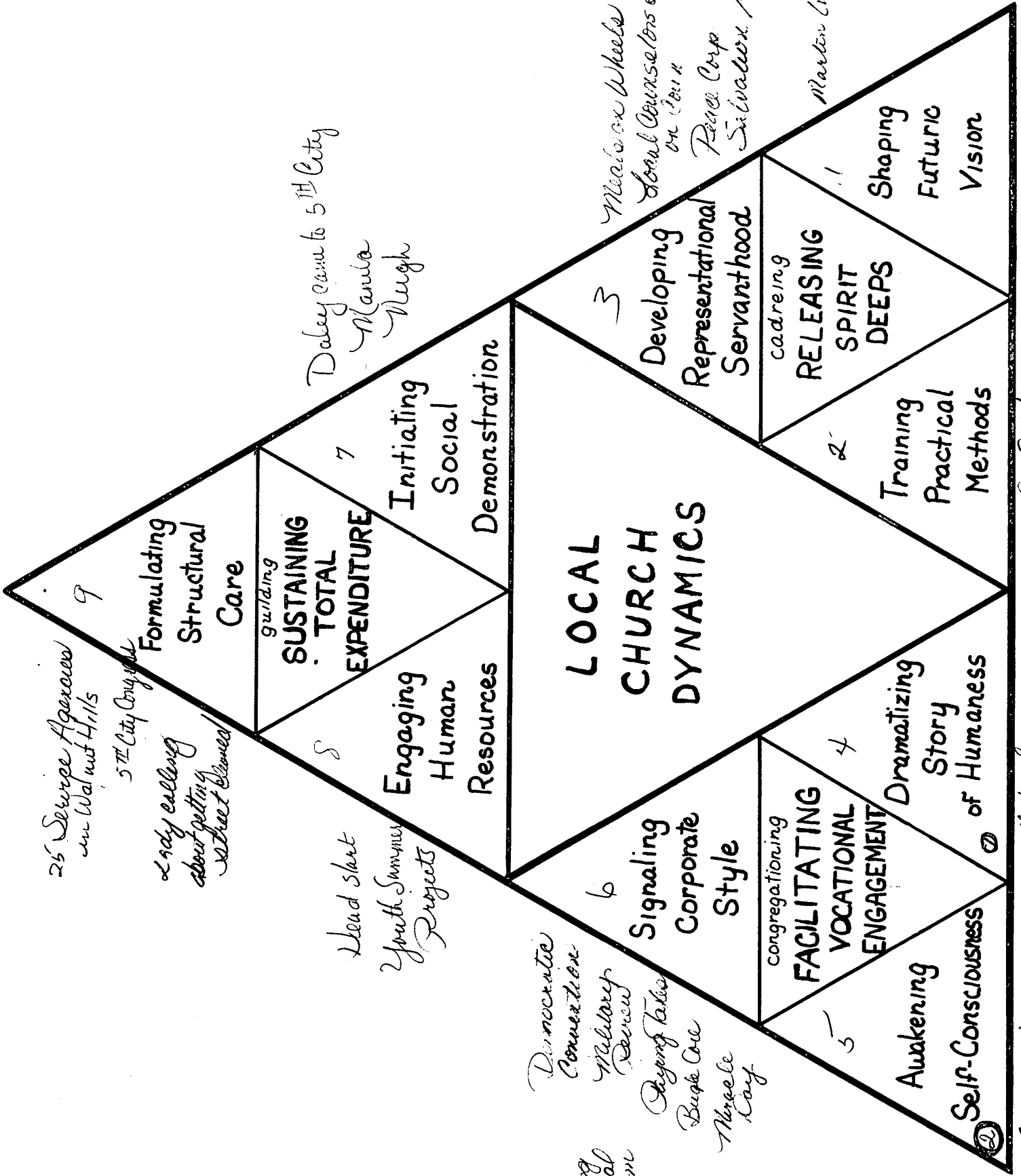

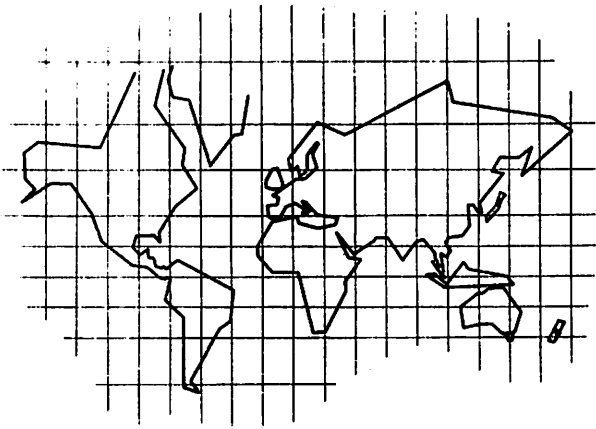

GALAXY INTENSIFICATION *7***Description:**

This tactic is intended to expand the present three church Auxiliary to six members for each Auxiliary, gain the decision of one other church to participate in the Galaxy, to develop the clergy leadership of the Galaxy, and to actualize the tertiaries for the first quarter of the Local Church Project.

Implementation:

There will be visitation of 8 potential lay Auxiliary members in each congregation to initiate their participation in Sodality meetings and recruitment of laymen from all Auxiliary churches for RS-I in Weeks 2, 5, and 7. In order to develop clergy leadership, there will be monthly Auxiliary clergy meetings for training and planning, as well as participation of Auxiliary members in CS-IIIAs, Odyssey, and Summer '74. Tertiary actualization will begin in all 3 Galaxy churches with weekly reports to Uptown 5 Post. The initiation and nurture of the journey of the fourth church through the clergy and laymen will be implemented.

GALAXY REPLICATION *EXPANSION*
*14***Description:**

This tactic is aimed at having a Galaxy of four church in the Uptown 5 protoparish and a Galaxy of four churches in the Uptown parish by September 1974 through establishing the climate and providing the nurture which will catalyze and sustain this happening.

Implementation:

After expanding the list of key churches to 30 out of the 55 religious groups in the Uptown parish, these key churches would be visited for PLC and RS-I recruitment, participation of the clergy in the Clergy Collegium, and participation in a Field Visit the last of May. Those who participate in PLC, RS-I, or the Clergy Collegium or who show some other definite interest would be nurtured through participation in Galaxy meetings, Guild events, visit to 5th City, participation in House Church at Centrum, and participation in Summer '74.

LOCAL CHURCH EXPERIMENT --PARISH GUILD EXPERIMENT
RELATIONSHIPS

1. The Local Church Experiment is to continue unaltered for Quarters 3 and 4 of 1974, with the parish tactics of the Experiment remaining unchanged.
2. The Parish Guild Experiment Initiation would begin Jan. 1, 1974, and continue 26 weeks, alongside the LCX, with the possibility of a Guild post being created at symbolic centrum--Chicago.
3. Practical relationship between the LCX and the PGX would be considered at the end of the 26-week period.
4. The Parish Guild Experiment would initially begin in a delimited parish around every Religious House on the North American Continent Jan. 1, 1974. Decisions relative to Guild Experiments beginning at Religious House locations other than North America, is still to be made.
5. The Religious House, activating its own Guild/ Parish experiments, grounding the master image: "Serve the people where we are" is the demonstration sign for the secular community and the local church auxiliary.
6. During the initiatory stage, the Parish Guild Experiment is begun and activated by R. H. priorship and not the local church auxiliary.
7. A Screen will be built for galaxies wishing to enter the Parish Guild Experiment. It would expose galaxy readiness and perhaps contain such criteria as strategic recruitment, troop readiness to do a Parish Guild, etc. and take the form of:
A) R.H. and Parish, B) Galaxy and 4 churches, C) Galaxy and 3 Churches, D) Galaxy and 2 churches, E) Galaxy and 1 Church.
8. The Guild is the parish dynamic that moves directly on its own parish and does the direct tactics of renewal and change. It is not a Religious House Project.

9. Guildsmen will need to be rooted (resident) in the parish.
10. The Guild Cell does not exist without the galaxy and the self-conscious religious dynamic present and may therefore include part of the local congregation cadre personnel.
11. The Guild Meeting would be held every other week II and one night each week I.
12. The Guild is long-range evangelism towards the recovery of the Faith, the Historical Church and therefore, the congregational dynamic.
13. The movement end-run with the initiation of the Parish Guild Experiment is the one on behalf of demonstration sign that is the practical revolutionary leap and breakthrough required for the next two years--giving a new context for Religious House sojourning and residency, and a new strategic penetration story and recruitment (RS-1, PLC) plan for galaxy churches and the region.
14. The Parish Guild Experiment will signal the seeking out and movement of churchmen into signal parishes, galaxy churches, and the recovery and renewal of congregations of the new secular-religious.
15. The dynamics of the local church and the congregation must be kept distinct.
16. The local Church Galaxy Experiment is always pointed toward primal community, not the cadre or congregation per se.
17. The congregation maintains the Holy Space in the Community, rehearses the liturgy, and moves on its parish, indirectly through the Guild Experiment.
18. Theoretical issues raised relative to the emerging new role and dynamics of the congregation in the life of the parish and the long-range issues are bracketed for the present.
