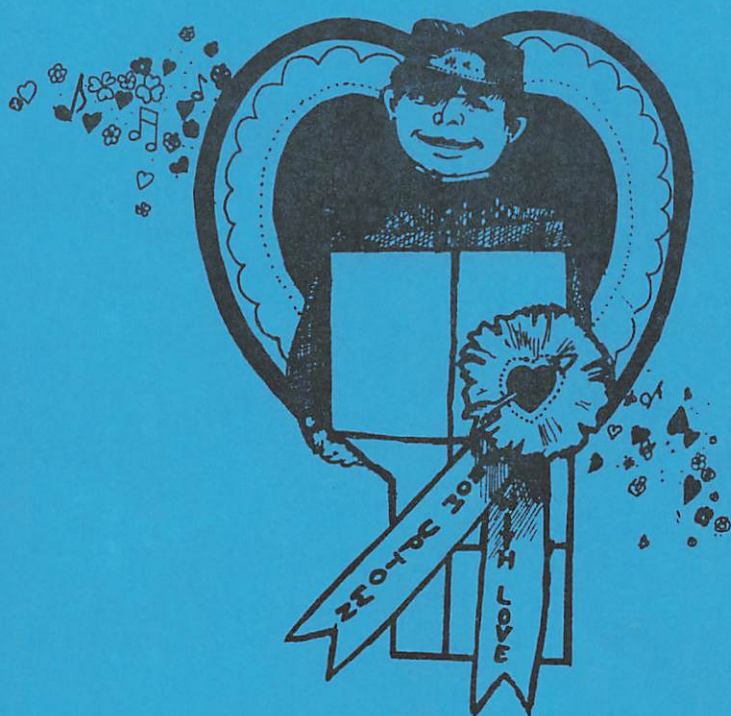

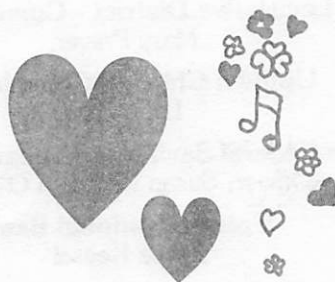

I'd never done before.



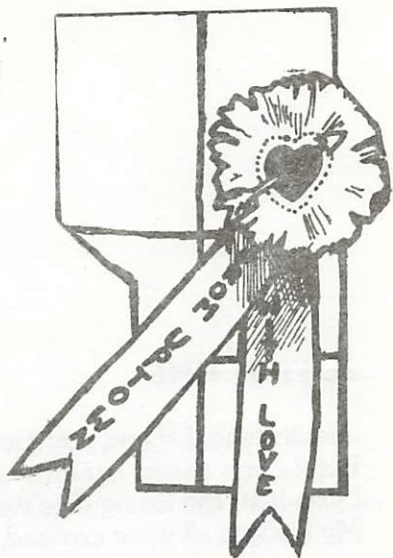
I'll never know what made it so exciting
