FUTURIC CONSUMPTION CONGRESS

We the people of Kemper City propose the formation of a Futuric Consumption Congress through conducting (1) Local PSU for data input (2) Developing a model for global representation (3) Holding a regional demonstration, and (4) Proposing such a congress to the United Nations.

COMPREHENSIVE SOCIO-ECONOMIC TRAINING

We the people of Kemper City propose the formation of Comprehensive Socio-economic Training in order to abolish victimization by economic complexity and enable people to grasp and direct the flow of the social process through effective planning methods- propose comprehensive socio-economic training through

1. Business day seminars
2. Family budget conference
3. Neighborhood teaching corps
4. Weekend methods seminars

COMMUNITY CONSUMERS FORUM

We the people of Kemper City, in order to direct production and distribution according to need, propose humanizing the economic process through anticipated needs analysis, consumer education programs, community consumers forums and legislative accountability structures.

LOCAL ACCESS CO-OPERATIVES

We, the citizens of Kemper Village in order to develop low cost equal distribution of consensed needs, propose Local Access Co-operatives through:

- 1) Researching needs and operating methods
- 2) Decide on service area
- 3) Create enabling support base
- 4) Develop polity structures

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to enable comprehensive care within the community, propose that we mobilize community participation by creating a services directory, dividing the community into stakes with a core of leaders, and by holding a community work day.

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to discern social needs and make available local services, propose a local services network through developing a local services council, creating a services screen, doing resource analysis, and establishing a self-conscious community node.

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to reimage and promote responsible citizen participation, propose to utilize mass media information systems through televising critical public meetings and through promotions using advertising methods.

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to engage the community in resolving local issues, propose to hold semiannual town meetings through community publicity, relevant agenda, task forces and broad sponsorship.

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to achieve total support for community decisions and to insure that the informal consensus-making is part of the public problem-solving activity, propose consensus method training as a consulting service to schools.

We, the people of Kemper City, in order to legislate enablement of community participation, propose local participation incentives through developing legal monetary incentives for community participation, the simplification of the registration process, the promotion of registration, and the introduction of consensus methods in local meetings.

We, the citizens of Kemper City in order to embrace the gifts of every culture, propose the institution of a citizens cultural odyssey through establishing travel pools for educational and cultural opportunities.
