#### GENERAL STATEMENT

The intention of the P S II is a concentrated workshop for concerned people to deal with a Particular problem. The issues raised, and specific, concrete models are created for the resolution of this problem and presented for the concensus of the community.

How does Uptown demonstrate that no handicap is an obstacle to a full and effective life, or, how do we engage all the human resources in Uptown?

- \* What are their basic needs?
- \* How do we shift the poor self image to authentic engagement?
