TASK FORCE CULTURAL RESEARCHMANDATE TITLE Intensifying Local Research

In order to address the seemingly insane fragmentation humankind experiences today, it is necessary to begin to create the elements of the Global Myth as part of the declaration strategy for 1981-84.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate in 1981-82 by intensifying local involvement in cultural research by

1. Designating every region as a Global Myth Lab, producing myths and dramas with universal significance. This will enable the creation of a first-level screen for discerning the elements of a Global Myth.
2. Designating Global Research Centrum to initiate the activities that will allow our pluriform and multi-lingual order to have access at the local level to edge writings on society and culture, and to social art, from a global perspective. This will include creating a report form so that each house may suggest significant articles, reports and books to be shared.
3. Designating Global Research Centrum to disseminate simple procedures to every house for creating universal myths from local stories, dramas, festivals and ceremonies, and to create a means of interchange of the products.
4. Encouraging each region to re-state societal contradictions in their region as discerned from their regional consult, interviews, films, Roundtable conversations and local reports.

TASK FORCE SYMBOLOLOGYMANDATE TITLE EXPANDING AND DEEPENING THE SYMBOLOLOGY EXPERIMENT

Symbology experimentation in the year 1981-82 requires expanding and deepening the Order's symbolic life. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Designing the remainder of the recommended 4-year phasing model for the whole symbolic life experiment in coordination with Global Research Centrum.

2. Continuing the daily office/daily ritual experiment by:

- a. All houses maintaining the Daily Office during Week I except:

Chile Hong Kong India Kenya Nigeria
Egypt Indonesia Japan Malaysia Taiwan

- b. During 1981-82 every location will participate in using a Week II daily ritual by completing, refining or writing a local daily ritual. The guidelines for writing the ritual and suggested studies will be furnished by Global Research Centrum. This ritual will then be used in rotation with the India, Japan, Kenya and Indonesia rituals according to the schedule below.

- c. Compiling common wake up rituals, meal rituals and meeting formats by Global Research Centrum. They will put together a suggested set of rituals to be used at Global Council '82 and then be considered as experimental sets of common global rituals for 1982-83.

TASK FORCE SYMBOLOGY**MANDATE TITLE EXPANDING AND DEEPENING THE SYMBOLOGY EXPERIMENT**

3. We recommend that Global Research Centrum continue to provide tools that empower the spirit life of the Religious Houses. These will include:
 - a. Exercises and a PSU on the Vocational Journey Chart
 - b. Corporate/Solitary exercises
 - c. Rituals and dramas for all cultures which point to each culture's experience of the deans of life (e.g. Neil Diamond's Soolaimon from Black Africa).

4. We recommend four years of active research in the arena of Order vows and covenants during 1980-84. The year 1981-82 will be devoted to sharing and analyzing the current experiments in Order covenantal rituals by:
 - a. Compilation and study of existing intern conversations and rituals for beginning and ending the intern year.
 - b. Interchange with the Religious House experiment on Movemental and Extended Order covenants.
 - c. A recommendation from the Panchayat on formalizing Order vows after a series of collegiums or PSUs during 1981-82.
 - d. Analysis of the Phase I work on symbolizing the journey of Order youth and their transition into Phase II as it relates to Order covenants.
 - e. Draft a symbolic rite for marking the journey of IDTS grads from mission staff to Order members.

ACADEMY TRANSPOSITION

TASK FORCE _____

MANDATE TITLE SYMBOLIZING ACADEMY TRANSPOSITION

The Academy Transposition in 1981-1982 requires symbolization of the intent to create the Academy as the one common training tool for the Pluriform Movement.

The Global Order will respond to the mandate by:

1. teaching Academy core courses (RSI, CSI, CSIIA, RSIIC, & Imaginal Education) in strategic locations scheduled by the Training Post of Global Operations Centrum;
2. initiating curriculum edge PSUs in the regions coordinated by Global Research Centrum;
3. refining the current curriculum with new papers and illustrations by the Academy faculty;
4. accelerating faculty rotation and interchange between the Academy and Advance Training Schools coordinated by Global Operations Centrum;
5. holding the Academy in Chicago Quarter II & IV;
6. making the Academy available during Quarter III to be held on invitation from another continent, or where it can be held in a Christian context, with global participation and in English.

MANDATE TITLE Developing a Profound Commitment Course

Academy Transposition in the year 1981-1982 requires developing a "Profound Commitment" Course based on the contentless word and calling people to the life of service.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Evaluating the various forms of the Profound Commitment Courses presently being used around the globe through the research band.
2. Holding a major PSU involving the Research Band and colleagues from around the globe who've had depth experience with the RSI course.
3. Testing the construct in selective locations through the research band.

TASK FORCE HDZ PhasingMANDATE TITLE Global HDZ Experiment Formalisation

The Global Human Development Zone Experiment in the year 1981-82 requires the grounding globally of the HDZ image as a common missional strategic focus, and the formalising of the 2nd year of the 4-year global experiment.

The Global Order will respond to this Mandate by:

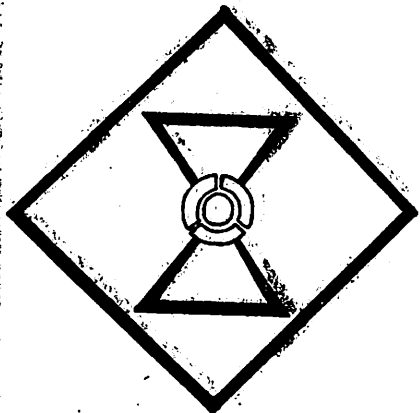
1. Focussing Regional Strategy. Activated regions will focus authorisation, research, training and impact events towards the selection of a regional Human Development Zone.
2. Maturing Cluster Demonstrations. Existing multi-settlement demonstrations will continue with their next phase of maturation, and contribute their findings to HDZ research while moving towards Human Development Zone consideration.
3. Launching Pilot HDZs. 5 Pilot HDZs will be launched representing the varying settings of human community, as a step towards establishing the HDZ common global pillars.
4. Refining Critical Mass Labs. The Order in Maharashtra and Kenya will refine the experiments with mass impact on geography and population, while discerning the relationship of the HDZ image to the process of replication.

TASK FORCE STRUCTURAL REVITALIZATIONMANDATE TITLE STRUCTURAL REVITALIZATION

STRUCTURAL REVITALIZATION in the year 1981-1982 requires systematic research activities. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by 'implementing:'

1. TWO DEMONSTRATIONS: Training Inc. and RVI Consortium;
2. FOUR LABS: MacDonald's Corporation, Indonesian Plantation Network, Minnesota Government Structures, and Quality Work Life Program in New Orleans.
3. NINE PROBES: Nishi N'hon Testusu, Japan
Hughes Tool, U.S.A.
Minia University, Egypt
Caritas Sociales, Vienna, Austria
World Health Organization, United Nations, Copenhagen
8 Universities, Indianapolis
Women's Organization for Equality, Belgium
Religious Order Probe, Rome

4. SPECIAL TASK FORCE: Black Engagement Strategies Team, Atlanta
5. Research Centrum serving these activities through
 - a. enabling the continuing refinement of the selection screen such as the one included in the Back up Materials,
 - b. conducting an interchange system between the above activities and all the Religious Houses both in writing and face to face,
 - c. developing program packages that will be offered to organizations,
 - d. continuing to document the learnings,
 - e. enabling additional probes to be initiated and exchanged.

PROBE

A probe is the initiation of contact in a functioning structure. It involves doing programs and creating a screen to determine the likelihood and desirability of an intensified relationship at a profound level for both parties.

LAB

A lab is an experiment in the use of our methods at many levels within the structure. It involves a serious commitment of personnel and resources.

DEMONSTRATION

A demonstration is a show case of the combined efforts of our staff and methods in a full fledged program of human development.

SPECIAL TASK FORCE

A special task force is a team called together for a specific task related to one of the major revolutions of our times and for a specified intent and time period.

TASK FORCE Globalizing the IERR

MANDATE TITLE The International Exposition of Rural Reconstruction

The IERR in the year 1981-82 requires establishing a comprehensive global frame and funding base, and initiating regional events that complement regional strategy in support of the Exposition.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Conducting a global campaign for the formation of the Indian and Global Advisory Boards - to be coordinated by Development Centrum.
2. The publication of the brochure in English, and translations, by the Public Image Post in coordination with Brussels Nexus.
3. The formation of National Steering Committees through Global Advisory Board circuits and regional events in participating countries, with special emphasis on depth framing in India.
4. The submission of proposals for funding through the coordination of the Development Centrum.
5. The development and implementation in each Continent, Area and Region, of a timeline focussing on recruitment, lead-up events, funding, and other forms of movemental participation.

IERR - RECOMMENDATIONSI. THE COMMITTEES

The Exposition will need a substantial frame for purposes of authorisation and support. It is recommended there be three kinds of committee.

a) Global Advisory Board

Function: to be the global frame around the Exposition with leverage at the top levels of support.
Criteria: the best image is probably that of the "senior statesman". These would be people of international influence, e.g. (examples only) Professor Jan Tinbergen, Senator Percy, Senator Edgard Pisani, Adam Malik, Willy Brandt, Robert McNamara, T J Coolidge.
Recommendation: every nation where we work should recommend two candidates for this committee by August 2, 1981. (to Brian Williams).

b) Indian Advisory Board

Function: to be the national frame around the Exposition with leverage at top levels of national support.
Criteria: a committee also under the image of 'senior statesman', is needed in India on a national basis because of the particularly high visibility of the programme in that country, e.g. Dr Bharat Ram, J R D Tata.

c) National Steering Committees

Function: to host various lead-up events, and assist in the selection and formation of the national delegations; in short, to lend work and financial support to assure both national participation in the event itself and impact on their own nation. In India, the National Steering Committee will be active at all levels of preparation for the Exposition.
Criteria: they should be people of national influence who are prepared to put in concrete work and support.
Recommendations: these committees should be constituted in every nation where we work: recommendations for eight candidates in their own nation should be put forward (to Brian Williams) by August 2, 1981.

II. THE SPONSORSHIP

The following three levels of sponsorship are envisaged to help carry a substantial supporting load in the preparation, planning and implementation of the Exposition:

- a) Organising Sponsor. This will be the Institute of Cultural Affairs; held in a separate category from the other sponsors so as to guard the participation of local people, to ensure that the character of the discussions is highly participative, and to ascertain that the final document does put

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forward a composite picture of the effective methods and models being used for grassroots reconstruction.

- b) Co-sponsors (6 to 8). Two types of organisation are eligible: international agencies concerned with development (e.g. UNDP and UNICEF), and Indian national bodies representing the four sectors (e.g. State Bank of India, National Productivity Council, National Council on Social Welfare, and the Association of Indian Engineering Industries).
- c) Supporting Organisations (1 or 2 per country). National bodies, including governmental departments and aid agencies, trade/industry chambers and associations, trade unions, and prestigious cooperatives and development projects.

Recommendation: every nation where we work should put forward, in order of preference, two candidate-organisations by August 2, 1981 (to be given to Brian Williams)

III. THE MOVEMENT

The Exposition is imaged as an event which will assist every region in the globe to catalyse and form a movement of Those Who Care. Over the next 26 months, efforts will be focussed in the regions on creating various events and programmes to facilitate support and participation from all parts of the world.

During the programme year 1981-82, emphasis will be placed on building up the support base (committees, supporting organisations, etc). In order to facilitate the launching of this 26-month countdown, workshops will be conducted during the September Continental/Area Councils in relationship to the appropriate targets for the support base. GDC will be responsible for coordinating this work and it is recommended that they participate in these Continental and Area preparation workshops. GDC Brussels Nexus will be responsible for the overall coordination. This would include gathering and distributing all data regarding the committees, issuing formal letters of invitation, and publishing a quarterly newsletter to be sent to all houses, providing upto-date progress information about the Exposition.

TASK FORCE CHINA STRATEGYMANDATE TITLE COORDINATED RESEARCH

China Strategy in the year 1981-1982 requires a coordinated research thrust to prepare us in depth for an appropriate response to the new openness of China in the world. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by :

1. Getting on top of the current situation in PRC through :
 - the creation of a research screen and guide by Global Research Band
 - listing current articles, journals and newspapers
 - tracking and attending conferences related to China at which Chinese residents will be present,
 - having conversations with people who know the ins and outs of China and could make recommendations, such as Ted Johnson, Jerome Chen, U.N. related people like Andrew Young, Symond Kock's contacts etc...
2. Creating and keeping in Hong Kong a computerized file of China contacts as well as an entree list of our 100 top China names and reports on key conversations and interviews to the Research Band.
3. Inviting some key-Chinese contacts to the IERR through the U.N. in consultation with Sir James Lindsay.
4. Recommending to the Houses a study on China during the year.
5. Presenting a report prepared by Research Band at the 1982-1983 Council.

MANDATE TITLE Locating Entry Points

The China Strategy in the year 1981-82 requires the expansion of entrees to the Chinese people by intensifying programmatic work with overseas Chinese groups to establish a broader base of experience and contacts. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. extension of the LENS program in Sespac, especially Hong Kong, Macao, and Kuala Lumpur with particular emphasis on companies that are now or will be working in the PRC
2. continuing to undergird efforts to hold Town Meetings in each district of the New Territories
3. intensifying programmatic activity in the Hong Kong region
4. production and global distribution of sparkling new reports of the Hai Ou and Nam Wei Human Development Projects with a contexting letter and an ample supply for regions with a significant overseas Chinese community
5. intensifying coordination and interchange of information that will allow increased site visits by Chinese visitors to Human Development Projects in Sespac
6. extending informal contacts with China by exploring employment opportunities for Order members, expanding contacts with Chinese students studying abroad, and maintaining contacts with China experts.

TASK FORCE _____ GLOBAL RHYTHMS _____

MANDATE TITLE _____ EMPOWERING GLOBAL EVENT RHYTHMS _____

Empowering the emerging global pluriform movement requires designing the global rhythms so that they become more broadly available. This would mean moving toward more inclusive participation in the globalizing research, polity, and spirit life of the movement at the continent area, and regional level while the unifying dynamics of the Global Order Council are maintained.

The Global Order will respond to the mandate by:

- 1) having one 7-10 day continental research, training, formation event per continent with inclusive participation from the movement and the Order. Broad participation at this event would enable more selective participation at the GOC in Chicago. This event would be co-ordinated by Global Research/Operations in conjunction with Area and House priors. Dates of these continental events would be decided at this meeting.
- 2) Intensifying training and research across each continent through enabling every adult to participate in one "globalizing event" each year beyond their own geography. This would strengthen regular Regional/Areal Councils through global presence and for Regional/Areal interchange.
- 3) maintaining the Global Order Council in the year 1981-82 in July and in Chicago, but in the shortest time possible that honors the comprehensive dynamics of the Council as well as ongoing program momentum in many locations.
- 4) moving toward the 1984 Grand Assembling of the Order through initiating conversations as a part of Area and Continental meetings during the year 1981-82. We would continue to research the issues and design of our Global Rhythm to take effect after the 1984 assembly. Symbolic decision on the grand assembly of 1984 would be made now with practical decision on the location researched during the year.

TASK FORCE REGIONAL TEAMMANDATE TITLE PILLARS OF THE REGIONAL TEAM

The Year of the Regional Team requires discerning the pillars of the Regional Team through experimenting with and documenting the operational forms toward the broadening self-conscious engagement in the task of human development.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

- 1) Declaring this the Year of the Regional Team.
- 2) Commissioning the Regional Team in Quarter I.
- 3) Experimenting with covenantal forms that give shape to and sustain all the dynamics of the Regional Team.
- 4) Empowering the regionalis dynamic of linking the local to the globe through inter-regional and intra-regional interchange of informational and human resources.
- 5) Empowering human development efforts within the Region through presence, articulated collegueship, and practical methodological assistance related to the regional mandates and using the screen of 4-sector involvement.
- 6) Deepening the profound consciousness of the Regional Team through providing regional training, counciliar, reflective, celebrative and engagement events.
- 7) Research Centrum designing a construct for quarter III to objectify learnings on the pillars of the Regional Team.

TASK FORCE TRANSFORMATION OF THE RELIGIOUS HOUSEMANDATE TITLE TRANSFORMING THE RELIGIOUS HOUSE

Transforming the Religious House in the year 1981-82 requires recreating the style, structures and story which beckon, sustain and renew depth missional participation. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. re-empowering the Religious House to respond creatively with new forms of time designs, space and house style to demonstrate to all four sectors the possibility of participating in the corporate, vocated life of service;
2. releasing the Religious House to encompass all the dynamics of the Order in its internal life and external mission through intentionalizing the context, training and journeying of every individual and family;
3. articulating the story of the fullness of corporate life and the exciting struggle of multi-covenant and multi-cultural house members living a new ethic of commitment;
4. initiating a formalized, residential, programmatic scheme which will encourage participation in House life by pre-interns, sojourners, interns and the Movemental, Extended and Symbolic Order for various time commitments through such things as a quarterly rhythm of 8 weeks program, 4 weeks training and 1 week reflection and planning; contextual events; formation fortnight and the Tokyo sojourn programme.

TASK FORCE BUILDING GLOBALIZED PRIORSHIPMANDATE TITLE INTENSIFYING GLOBALIZED PRIORSHIP

Intensifying Globalized Priorship in 1981-1982 requires intentionalizing priorship journey and training. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. "Fortnight" events or GRA's held at Continental/ Area level (as appropriate)
2. Mobile Academy (Black Africa/SEAPAC)
3. Intern Orientation Pilot
4. Priorship Training Schule Probe
5. Area node for priorship training
6. New priorship journey screens and assignment process integration
7. Representational Global Priory meetings that coincide with continental Order events
8. Vocational Journey Lab to be held in each Religious House
9. Regular priorship training in each house beginning with a PSU using new priorship journey screens
10. Area forces priorship journey tracking profile
11. Global Priory rotational assignment rationale

TASK FORCE _____ PHASE I EXTENSION _____

MANDATE TITLE _____ DEEPENING PHASE I PRESENCE _____

Deepening Phase I presence in the year 1981-82 requires an effective demonstration and extension of Phase I programs in order to initiate a global dialog toward addressing the current social contradictions.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Empowering missional family roles and rites through providing each order family with a copy of the "Journey of Phase I Formation" as a working context for the Phase I experiment, teaching an Imaginal Education course for the families of the regional team, working toward a PSU on the missional family and creating models for the symbolization of transition from phase I to the single missional family unit.
2. Revitalizing regional E.G. care through creating E.G. curriculum events which are based upon the phase I journey chart, engaging E.G. in house and regional activities, and designating two regional people to catalyze phase I structures and imaginal training for the region.
3. Positioning Student House extension through operating as a self-supporting self-contained unit, building a phased plan to extend the student house program to other continents, making the Student House program available to extended order families and researching and preparation for relocation.
4. Intensifying high school cluster model through integrating the cluster into the regional team using the Youth Presidium document as a screen for regional strategies, enabling internal cluster planning and implementation, expanding the cluster trek, providing regular communication and support systems through the Centrum Phase I staff, operating with common financial guidelines and developing common operating images.
5. Integrating the university probe into regional strategy through supporting university probes, exchanging models and reports and establishing university student clusters.

Task Force..... SELF SUPPORT DIRECTIONS

TOWARD DIVERSIFIED INCOME MODES

Self support in the year 1981-82 requires intensifying practical undergirding towards diversified self support income modes.

The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Accelerating an employment upgrading system through creating and updating resumes for every Order member, establishing an automated job repository, expanding job advocacy, and phasing vocational education.
2. Experimenting with and evaluating diversified income producing modes through targeting strategic geographic areas for specific experiments, assessing income producing potential of our facilities, expanding consultant activity, exploring an Order business, and researching restructured financial benefits.
3. Exploding images of self support through building Regional one year self support plans in light of Area or Continent self support plans for the next three years, creating events that undergird and celebrate self support activity, and initiating specific coordination and interchange for self support.

Plotting LENS Development

TASK FORCE

MANDATE TITLE Accelerating the Strategic Use of LENS

LENS Development in the year 1981-82 requires accelerating the strategic use of LENS across the four sectors and the nine continents to follow-up the Year of the Region. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by:

1. Seeing that the Area Councils involve a major initiation of LENS across the regions through participation of the regional teams in a plan that includes targets highlighted by the regional consults and areal strategies, and bottomlines, assignments and the use of the process in the Council. Operations Centrum will coordinate with the Areas in respect to a helpful model for the inclusion of these objectives in the Council format.
2. Setting the LENS fees within the following global guidelines at a continental level:
 - LENS is an income-generating programme of the ICA.
 - Fees are set on a sliding scale for private, public, local and voluntary organizations.
 - The fee scale is set at a consultant rate that is competitive within an appropriate geographic entity (continent, area, nation, etc.)
3. Facilitating global coordination and interchange by means of Global Operations Centrum working through designated Continental/Area structures, to include:
 - Staffing coordination
 - Global interchange of scheduled seminars
 - Ongoing documentation of learnings
 - an updated list of LENS clients with sample briefs from each sector on each continent, and with basic data entered into computer
 - Setup and coordination of a global distribution model to provide manuals and decor in sufficient quantity and quality to meet anticipated program needs. (This may include local materials production.)
4. Conducting in-depth comprehensive training for the regional team with a view to developing competent local and national marketers, facilitators, and consultants. This will be initiated with pedagogy sessions at Area Council Quarter I and throughout the year supported by Operations Centrum assigning trainers to Regions and/or Areas for training marketers and facilitators.
5. Each Regional Team structuring time, space and office systems which embody an appropriate professional style.

TRAINING IMPLEMENTATION

TASK FORCE _____

MANDATE TITLE _____

TRAINING EXPANSION

Movement training in the year 1981-82 requires expanding systematic training in every activated region. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by :-

1. SCHEDULING PEDAGOGY EVENTS through continental training events, area council sessions and regular regional pedagogy.
2. JOURNEYING REGIONAL FACULTY through providing curriculum building skills, up-dating our global faculty files, creating and maintaining teaching journey tracks of individuals, and using this data in the assignments of individuals to programs in this coming year.
3. TEACHING COURSES appropriate to regional needs through making generally available RS-1, CS-1, LENS, GCF, Imag. Edu., and CR-3A (individual & family); by distributing manuals, creating a system for evaluation and interchange; continuing the development of Human Development Course, Profound Motivity Course and Methods Modules; and by creating a phasing chart on the development and refinement of each course in the present curriculum.
4. EXTENDING EFFECTIVE MARKETING through scheduling courses and by pulling together available promotional materials, providing a means of regular interchange at the regional and areal levels, and by the upgrading both the quality of marketing materials and skills, eg: participation in marketing PSU's; and by regional, areal, continental councils discerning the training demands in society through screens such as the regional consult materials.
5. STRUCTURING TRAINING CO-ORDINATION through empowering the training post of the operations centrum and commissioning them to work with regional and continental teams on the evaluation, reflection and creation of the comprehensive spiral curriculum, and to assist in the training of the continental faculty including metro cores, and to back-up the training through the logistical services of materials delivery, journey tracking and data interchange.

TASK FORCE Instruments CatalogueMANDATE TITLE EQUIPPING OUR INTERCHANGE

The global dispersion of our troops and the expansion of our programmatic opportunities is requiring that every location of our network have access to the basic information, learnings, and models. The Global Order will respond to this mandate by

expanding our emphasis on interchange, begun during the last year at Chicago Nexus by making interchange assignments at each of the other nexus, and adding two major tasks to their assignment:

1. bring the living archival function into the interchange system by assigning staff to update the files, develop a globally common archival system, and thus make our materials available as needed.
2. taking on the edge experimentation (on behalf of all the centrums and regions) with the development of a comprehensive plan for a global computerized interchange system. Their task would be the coordination of the plans development. This would be done through a series of PSU's which utilize the expertise of order members and guardians who have experience in the use of computers. Special consideration will be placed on a system which is equally applicable in any part of the world.
