

We the participants of the 7th Latin American Continental Council in taking responsibility for the globe declare that by July 1984 the following pillars will be manifest on the Latin American Continent:

1. 1000 flash flood of community foros with documents
2. 100 Latin Americans journeying in the Order
3. 36 Training Schools - 10 done and 26 to go
4. 6 area rural/urban operations
5. Jamaica: The Nation ✓
6. Sr./Sra. movement contact in 36 regions
7. Engaged 4-sector linkages through IERD
8. Operative 4 year areal strategies
9. 6 viable village clusters toward HDZ
10. Globally mobile staff with bi-lingual skills
11. 6 strong areal faculties with continental interchange
12. The 4 continental sub-heritages articulated for programming
13. 6 sustaining areal donor bases
14. Paying full monthly stipends and depositing full funds

THE STORY

A mighty continent - so diversified
 Five mighty myths that clarify
 Majestic mountains tamed by a few
 Recover a past forever new

We came to a continent united only in images of economic exploitation, massive poverty, political instability and hopeless division. A continent screaming with pain, yet ignored by the globe. A hotbed of revolution and rhetoric. Six small signs of hope were planted, a gift of a global people convinced that all the earth belongs to all and possibility is born of contradiction. The spirit movement of Latin America now stands with a new maturity, ready to bring to the world the gifts of this continent. An urban society reconciled with its vast rural area. A Catholic continent willing to participate in the global equity. Where the world sees today only economic, moral and political bankruptcy, we see the resurgence of local people. Latin America will not unite through a new Simon Bolivar liberation, but only through the awakening of the new compassion, the formation of the new capacity and the demonstration of the new community. Así Será.

The continent of Latin America has been a vast foreboding yet tempting land of mystery and possibility. For the first decade of the spirit movement, pioneering treks revealed that Latin America possessed a vibrant Mountain of Care and service for creating the future. The depth of the Latin American River of Consciousness was an unrepeatable gift of freedom to be shared with the globe. The profundity of the continent's peoples has deepened the spirit movement's resolve to immerse themselves in the chaos and suffering of the poorest of the poor yet venturing out on the Sea of Tranquility that develops the Latin spirit. This reality in the midst of this world gave birth to the decision to launch the first Latin beachheads.

We see our task in this land of Mystery as researching, reempowering and popularizing the heritages of the sub-cultures of the continent, in union with Indian, African and European spirit people of the past, to ensure the dawning of the sun of awakening as a manifestation of the liberation of all peoples.

We see our task on the River of Consciousness as exploring, opening, and building the networks for continental interchange, in union with the Inca road builders, the colonial explorers, and the prophetic missionaries, to ensure the declaration of a global life style of communion among all peoples and sectors of society.

We see our task before the Mountain of Care as struggling, visioning, and creating signs of hope through our Human Development Projects, in union with the independence heroes, of every nation and culture, to ensure the formation of clusters of primal communities where every person is challenged to participation in the creation of the New Social Vehicle.

Finally, we see our task over the Sea of Tranquility as standing, dancing and voyaging together with the innocent suffering, to establish a solid, mature base for the movement and the Order: Ecumenical, in union with local people of all sectors, but especially from among the poor and those who care, to be a radical sign of service and reconciliation on behalf of all.

1. SECURING THE \$300,000

The \$300,000 bottom line for Latin America for 1982-83 will be put in focus during the first trip through collegiums and workshops with the 4 houses visited. These will put the bottom line in a global and regional context and break it down by areas and constituencies, toward a final consensus at Continental Council in December, 1982. Accountability and revisions will be made during GDC white weeks. Development space in each house will be designated and decored to enable sustained development activity between GDC trips.

2. ESTABLISHING DEVELOPMENT SYSTEMS

Systems will be established within each house which will empower development as an ongoing activity in each area, thereby increasing and regularizing developed income. These systems will include; 1) establishing or upgrading the Hong Kong system in each house; 2) establishing a regular interchange rhythm between L.A. houses and GDC CHINEX; 3) locating access to computers, word processors and telex services in each area city and 4) tying areas into the global financial systems.

3. ENHANCING PROGRAMMATIC THRUSTS

Strategic program thrusts will be enhanced by 1) participation in strategy workshops bringing the funding/framing perspective into view, by 2) building and sharing a common story of the ICA's mission in Latin America, by 3) promoting a strategic tension between urban and rural strategies, and by 4) encouraging and enabling area participation in global events.

4. DELIVERING ON NA/EUROPEAN LIASONS

North American and European prospects for Latin American funding will be researched and moved on through 1) Chicago corporation visits for introductory letters; 2) probing Ford Foundation prospects for Peru; 3) framing the Inter-American Foundation and securing a local "front" to receive funding and; 4) contacting Brussels Nexus for European organizations interested in funding Latin America and linking them with Latin American programmes.

5. CREATING MASTER PROPOSALS

Master proposals will be developed for each Area, as well as at least one for the continent as a whole for use with major national and international targets. This would be done through 1) a story-building workshop in each area that would 2) create a detailed proposal package in each area including 3) endorsement letters and back-up materials and 4) the creation of national PR materials for use in each area. Two-page briefs will be excerpted for use with large numbers of local prospects.

6. PREPARING FOR THE I.E.R.D.

The areas of Latin America will be moved toward I.E.R.D. participation through 1) setting up the Lindsays' November trip during the September-October development trip using Lindsay contacts and other key cross-sector targets (e.g. U.S. ambassadors, U.N. res-reps, etc.); 2) targeting and inviting GAB and 3) NSC prospects and 4) setting dates for Rural Development Symposiums.

7. CULTIVATING CROSS SECTOR SUPPORT

The four-sector frame will be nurtured and expanded through engaging the sectors as appropriate i.e. 1) developing private sector funds, using their referrals and enlisting technical assistance; 2) framing the public sector to secure grants; 3) engaging church figures and groups, as well as service organizations in programmatic partnerships and 4) ensuring local support in project/program communities through effective engagement tactics. All sectors will be nurtured through regular communications, invitations to symbolic events and GAB/NSC participation where appropriate..
