ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

I Co-operative Agriculture

- Demonstration farm: 40 acres
- New Cash Crops: Tobacco, Hybrid jowar, peanuts
- Improved methods: Hybrid seeds, fertilizer, pesticides, scheduling planting, composting
- Vegetable production increased
- Expanded livestock: 1,000 laying hens, milk cows, upgraded goat stock, cross breeding, improved feeds
- Full-time agricultural agent in residence
- Increased water availability: 10 rebuilt nalla bunds, 7 reconstructed wells, new deep bore wells, delivery canals, pump-lift irrigation, wells blasted and deepened, 8 new wells dug
- Community equipment pool: 2 tractors, truck, trailor, compressor, drill, water tanker
- Two villagers ready to take bank loan to buy a truck and a tractor.

II Appropriate Light Industry

- Box factory (automotive part crating)
- Nutritious food processing and packaging (sykhri): 30,000 packets per day
- Spices and papad making enterprise
- Specialities processing: peanut butter, guava jelly
- Brick factory
- Rope weaving
- Floor Mill
- Co-operative dairy: shed constructed, initial stock secured, Dairy Society initiated
- Rural Tailoring Centre initiated
- Egg production: chicken house built, stock secured.

III Local Commercial Services

- New Bakery
- Bicycle repair and rental service
- Expanded tailoring service
- Co-operative marketing: sucre, boxes, bricks
- Residents savings: 200 new accounts
- Expanded credit: loans to farmers, small businessmen and tradesmen
- State Bank of India: Maliwada Branch opened.

IV Human Living Environment

- New housing: model houses, 16 new private units built
- Home rehabilitation: survey, all houses whitewashed, roof repairs, maintenance system
- Electrification of village
- New facilities: Community Centre, 2 stores, storage facility, 2 industrial sheds, health centre, community kitchen, dairy shed and poultry shed
- Increased bus service to Aurangabad
- Play Centre created
- Large community well reconstructed
- Land levelling done
- Roads and drains built
- Trees planted.

V Corporate Action Structures

- New jobs created (275), extensive employment upgrading
- -- Youth work force (120)
- Weekly neighbourhood workdays
- Completed village census
- Extendee community participation: task guilds (200 meet weekly) neighbourhood stakes (180 meet weekly), monthly village reporting session, weekly guild leaders meeting
- Monthly Panch meeting.

- Fortnightly community newspaper

- Hosting: 12 replication delegations
- Staffing: Gram Sabha one-day village meetings

VII Preventive Mortality Care

- Sanitation System: 12 public latrines, drains, biogas plant installed
- Nutrition programms: school lunches, community breakfast, meal planning training, vitamin distribution, common vegetable garden
- Systematic pre-primary innoculations
- Refrigerated medicine storage
- Health Clinic: medical records, skin, ear-nose-throat camps:
 2 volunteer doctors, paramedics training
- Ambulance service to Aurangabad
- Weekly trips to the Hospital
- 60 people visit the village clinic daily.

VIII Inclusive Functional Education

- Preschool established: 200 pupils, 5 teachers trained, 20 parentaides recruited curriculum built
- Expanded primary education : 4 additional classes youth guild activities
- Total enrolment: all village children
- Literacy classes: Marathi, Hindi and English (400)
- Vocational schooling: food processing, agricultural, mechanics, brick-making, carpentry, finance, management, business
- Human Development Training School: 30 grades
- Training done for 24 preschool staff from 12 projects.

IX Local Community Welfare

- Infant care centre: 20 adults, 3 local trained staff
- Child care and hygiene demonstration
- Family planning clinics 75 voluntary operations
- Domestic sciences: menu planning, home budgeting
- Global women's Forum: 300 participants, Mahila Mandal
- Health care training.
