

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS**CONTEXTUAL COMPONENT: GLOBAL SOCIAL VISION****PRIMARY VISION: GLOBAL DECISION-MAKING ASSEMBLY**

The primary component of the social vision of the deliberative system is a globally representative research and decision-making assembly which forges out the consensus of global will, while similar dynamics are occurring on all levels.

SECONDARY VISION:

1. **METHODS TRAINING INSTITUTE:** The first secondary component is a methods training institute that will equip every man on all levels to engage in visioning, corporate dialoguing and consensus making, thereby insuring the equitable participation of all men in the total decision-making process.
2. **COMMUNITY DATA-GATHERING NETWORK:** The secondary component is decision making on a local basis; a community data-gathering network which collects and gesticulates the local wisdom through polis and community forums enable this process.
3. **GLOBAL/LOCAL INTERCHANGE SYSTEM:** The third secondary component is the prioritized data and decisions made on this level disseminated across the globe, a dynamic enhanced by a global local interchange system by which representatives from across the regions deliberate over and examine in depth.
4. **ACCOUNTABILITY STRUCTURE:** The fourth secondary component is the corporate will of local man which insures the implementation of that will by those assigned to effect justice, enhanced by a structure of accountability.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

CONTEXTUAL COMPONENT: GLOBAL SOCIAL CONTRADICTION
PRIMARY CONTRADICTION: REDUCED DECISIONAL STORY

Local man does not see a way to state his needs, wisdom, and vision so as to make a significant contribution in the decision-making process that affects his destiny.

SECONDARY CONTRADICTION:

- 1. **INDIVIDUALISM INHIBITS DECISIONS:** Individual self-sufficiency emphasis is inhibiting the crucial corporate efforts essential for making comprehensive decisions in resolving global contradictions.
- 2. **INADEQUATE DECISION SYSTEMS:** Inadequate decision-making avenues prevent local man from significantly engaging in the deliberative systems.
- 3. **POLITICAL-EDUCATIONAL INFLUENCES:** Political ideologies that disrelate local man from the decision-making process are taught by public and private educational systems.
- 4. **ECONOMIC DOMINATES DECISION:** The final decisions are raised within a limiting context of economic values which are propagated by the economic institutions of the society.

CONTEXTUAL COMPONENT: IMPACT ARENA

PRIMARY IMPACT ARENA: REPRESENTATIVE DECISION-MAKING BODIES

Deliberative Systems is the process whereby representative decision-making bodies forge out new forms of human involvement and participation in local, regional, national, and global issues by experimenting in the Guilding Dynamic.

SECONDARY IMPACT ARENA:

- 1. **CREATIVE LOCAL LEADERSHIP:** Local, regional, national legislative and judicial systems are designed to give formal structure to the needs of man to initiate his creative local leadership.
- 2. **EDUCATIONAL CENTERS:** These provide the medium through which local man can grasp the meaning of the times, and discover his options for new legislation which will bring justice to all.
- 3. **LOCAL CHURCH NODES:** These are areas where local man can be authentically engaged in the determining of his destiny in the parish through such bodies as Community Planning and Public Action Commissions.
- 4. **GLOBAL PLANNING AND LEGISLATIVE BOARDS:** These are bodies which determine man's life priorities through the forming of corporate legislative procedures which will catalyze the Guilding Dynamic.

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: SHAPING CONTEXTUAL IMAGES

The paramount tactic is shaping contextual images. The intent of this tactic is to recontext local man so that his self-image is globally related, globally responsible, giving him radical permission to embrace the ideology, "All the Decisions of History Belong to All the People", as he participates in making decisions which shape his destiny. The form of this tactic is vocationally-oriented seminars conducted in community centers, educational institutions and local church nodes. The content of this tactic is practical experience and thinking through of the process by which every man can grasp his role in decision-making structures of the local community. These structures concurrently serve as the means for global policy setting through the specific content of corporately constructed lectures, workshops and model building constructs. An example of this tactic is a weekend vocational course wherein local secular men think through their relationship to their vocation, their community and the globe. This tactic deals with catalyzing self-conscious decision making through providing the context out of which every man sees his critical role in shaping history.

PRIMARY TACTIC: INITIATING SOCIAL REFLECTION

The tactic is Initiating Social Reflection. The intent of this tactic is to ensure the activity of stepping back from any given situation to allow objective analysis of the way local will is moving and depth brooding on what is happening. The form of this tactic is a variety of screening constructs by which the community can reflect on current directional trends, such as the cabaret dynamic, imaginal education activities, mass media, and special publications. The content of this tactic is trends/contradictions workshop, media forms such as editorials and films, community polls and questionnaires and issue screening process for comprehensive bias revelation. If zoning were an important community issue, an example of this tactic would be a billboard displaying the distribution of shopping facilities, industry, and residential areas. This tactic informs self-conscious decision making by allowing issues and trends operating behind any social milieu and to release the power of taking an objective position for the purpose of analysis.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ENABLING SOCIAL OBJECTIVITY

Enabling social objectivity in order to provide distance by giving a discontinuous viewpoint in a humorous or satirical form, for example political cartoons on the editorial page of a newspaper accomplishes awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: IMAGINALLY DISPLAYING CONCERNS

Imaginally displaying concerns in order to impact local man's self-consciousness by the use of highly visible and powerful art forms in community nodes, for example a billboard depicting youth drug problems accomplishes awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INFORMALLY ELICITING PUBLIC RESPONSE

Informally eliciting public response in order to enable man to express a decisional stance by providing informal ways for him to make known his opinions in visual forms such as bumper stickers, buttons and clothing patches, for example a bumper sticker saying "vote for zoning regulations" accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INITIATING STRUCTURAL DIALOGUE

Initiating structural dialogue in order to ensure that all possible positions on an issue are recognized and stated by providing community structures for interchange in public forums and special publications, for example a television editorial series written by community people accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: REFLECTING EMERGING CONSENSUS

Reflecting emerging consensus in order to create public consciousness of trends by taking the pulse of the community on a given issue in public opinion questionnaires, polls, and petitions, for example polling parishes before final decision rendering accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: SHAPING CONTEXTUAL IMAGES

PRIMARY TACTIC: GLOBALIZING INTERIOR SPACE

The intent of this tactic is to expand local man's self-conscious operating context to embrace the reality of responsible, missional citizenship in the global village. The form of this tactic would be image-expanding constructs such as mass media, for example, newspapers, magazines, films, documentaries, special publications, and advertizing; inter-cultural exchange programs; intentionalized global trips; and speakers bureaus on global issues. The content of this tactic consists of self-consciousness releasing commentary, which illuminates man's relatedness to man and familiarizes him intimately with the current state of the globe. An example of this tactic is an editorial on famine in the third world in a community newspaper. This tactic deals with catalyzing self-conscious decision-making by instilling a comprehensive image system for local man to operate out of, which holds him before his responsibility in shaping the destiny and future of the whole globe as acted out in his local situation.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INTERNALIZING GLOBAL SPACE

Internalizing global space in order to enable local man to imaginally embrace the reality of the global village as his own reality by providing comprehensive exposure to human settlements outside the local community, for example, intentional global trips, accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXCHANGING LOCAL IMAGES

Exchanging local images in order to enrich local man's common memory bank by creating opportunities for sharing edge opinions on social issues in a speakers bureau, for example, a speaker on "Ethiopian Economic Trends" accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: IMPACTING COMPREHENSIVE IMAGES

Impacting with comprehensive images in order to bombard local man's consciousness with global contemporary events by providing an information channel for news in a mass media program, for example a community newspaper accomplishes awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INTRODUCING INTERCULTURAL PARTICIPATION

Introducing intercultural participation in order to create opportunities for direct relationships with the gifts and customs of other cultures by implementing intercultural exchanges in special programs, for example hosting a Tanzanian foreign exchange student accomplishes awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXPANDING TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Expanding training opportunities in order to encourage self-generated expansion of global consciousness by creating supplementary educational programs, for example a seminar series on the contemporary Chinese family accomplishes awakening in Deliberative Systems.

PRIMARY TACTIC: RECREATING INDIVIDUAL MYTH

The tactic is Recreating Individual Myth. The intent of this tactic is to allow man to be self-conscious about the meaning and purpose of his life. He is sustained in his recreated stance by standing present to a story which allows him to live out of images of possibility and missional expenditure so he might genuinely participate in the consensus forging that shapes the future. The form of this tactic is vocational engagement seminars focusing on the creation of an individual myth and the infusing of images that contribute to global missional consciousness. The content of this tactic is activities such as brainstorming the present world situation, corporate study of historical myths, lecture-seminar constructs on the function of myths and how they relate to the future, timelining major events for the next twenty years, and a writing exercise to create individual myths. An example of this tactic being carried out is a timelining exercise in a vocational seminar. This tactic catalyzes self-conscious decision-making by grounding an individual life in what it is called to be and do, sustaining intentional relationships taken to situations, and rehearsing the call to be a decisional participant in the creation of the future.

SECONDARY TACTIC: IDENTIFYING POPULAR HEROES

Identifying popular heroes in order to present creative models of the new humanness by presenting media images in film, photograph and story in a structured art form conversation, for example a discussion of the qualities of the new man after exposure to an archetypal model accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXHIBITING ART FORMS

Exhibiting art forms that communicate depth human possibility in order to allow local man to grasp his own human potential anew by encountering such imagery in a public statue or a poster, for example the "Freedom Statue" accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: REHEARSING CORPORATE RELATEDNESS

Rehearsing corporate relatedness in order to ground local man's uniqueness in the uniqueness of the larger community by illustrating the concept that "no man is an island" in a community drama, for example Albee's Zoo Story accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: AFFIRMING ANCESTRAL ORIGINS

Affirming ancestral origins in order to enable local man to appropriate family racial and cultural roots by providing the element of a self-story in a heritage festival, for example a lecture on the origin of the digeridoo accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: TRAINING FOR AUTHENTIC VOCATION

Training for authentic vocation in order to recover creative vocational engagement by providing new images of missional expenditure via vocational seminar, for example LENS accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: SHAPING
CONTEXTUAL IMAGES

PRIMARY TACTIC: DEMONSTRATING SIGNAL INVOLVEMENT

The name of this tactic is demonstrating signal involvement. The intent of the tactic is to exemplify the possibility for every man to be intentionally engaged in activities that are responsive to human need by offering concrete signs of the style of missional engagement in the social process. The form of this tactic is created channels and structures for human participation grounded in specific geo-social issues. The content of this tactic is manifestations of local will around a given area and edge pioneering activities such as a cadre of people who contribute their time to a local church establishing a day care center for children, establishing vocational co-operatives, setting up free health clinics and conducting a street cleaning and alley clearing campaign. An example of this tactic would be conducting a survey on community physical needs and submitting the report to the town council. This tactic catalyzes self-conscious decision-making as it dramatizes local man's intent to concretely utilize his decisional power.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INITIATING PUBLIC DISCOURSE

Initiating public discourse in order to create the climate for public consensus making by articulating and exchanging ideas and insights in a public forum for example a panel discussion would accomplish awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: FORMALIZING COMMUNITY DECISIONS

Formalizing community decisions in order to set the stage for formal consensus making by identifying the direction of growing public will in a public hearing, for example the watergate hearings accomplish awakening in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: PLANNING COMMUNITY PROGRAMS
Planning community programs in order to train in forging the corporate
will by enabling opportunities for practical model building in a
P.T.A. workshop, for example designing a remedial reading tutorial
program would accomplish awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: SYMBOLIZING LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITY
Symbolizing leadership responsibility in order to recast a positive
image of public service by enabling leadership roles in a political
campaign, for example working on the campaign for city councilmen
accomplishes awakenment in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ENGAGING IN DIRECT ACTION
Engaging in direct action in order to effect a particular local contra-
diction by exercising corporate local influence in a demonstration,
for example lunch counter sit-ins accomplish awakenment in Deliberative
Systems.

STRATEGIC ARENA: FOUNDATIONAL JUSTICE

MASTER STRATEGY: STRUCTURING LOCAL CONSENSUS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: ENGAGING COMMUNITY STRUCTURES

The paramount tactic for the pressure point of Deliberative Systems in the strategic arena of foundational justice is Engaging Community Structures. This paramount will provide channels through which local man can directly and effectively participate in the decision making process in his community. The community forum, where persons may come together to discuss vital issues and plan a source of action is an excellent community gathering through which to implement this tactic. The forums could be versatile in structure and would allow every man to contribute his wisdom through the use of methods such as geo-social gridding, brainstorming, gestalting, battleplanning, gapping, and consensus making. For example, consensus making methods could be used to deal with the collapse of the local school system. Thus local man would be able to directly participate in deciding the issue and participate in a just resolution of the vital issue in his community.

ENGAGING COMMUNITY
PARAMOUNT TACTIC: STRUCTURE

PRIMARY TACTIC: INSTITUTING GLOBAL REPRESENTATION

Instituting Global Representation in dealing with the needs of local man is an imperative of our time. There are both global and particular concerns of local man which requires urgent action. Actual representation in a world-wide coordinating body is required to deal with his vital concerns. To accomplish this it would be necessary to have the formal structure of a deliberative organization called into being or developed by the appropriate committee of the United Nations. It would be broad in scope like UNICEF but focus on the deliberative process in local communities. This would enable local man to have some voice in the task of dealing with the right of each person to involve himself in an effort to resolve vital issues on a just basis.

SECONDARY TACTIC: DEVELOPING POLICY STRUCTURES

Developing Community Policy structures so as to enable the injection of global/local wisdom in a planning session, policy-making body, the calling of a meeting on the coordination of multi-national corporations which would accomplish common laws.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ANNOUNCING INTERNATIONAL MEETINGS

Announcing International Meetings will create collegial strength and enabling the inter-change of defense agreements which are to be decided by the policy making body during the planning session the calling of the meeting must be coordinated in multi-national cooperation.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ESTABLISHING COURT SYSTEM

Establishing World Court Systems will maintain a better and effective justice, which will be applied to global and local courts, the empowering of the local ombudsman to act on international social issues this at the same time will promote a better relationship to every country.

SECONDARY TACTIC: SYMBOLIZING COUNTRY EMERGENCE

Symbolizing the emergence of new countries to expand global consciousness by enabling the evoking of new leadership in a symbolizing meeting, the affirmation of Red China by every country is a good sign for a cross-cultural wisdom in the consensus making methodology.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INTRODUCING REDUCED FARES

Introducing reduced air fares to stabilize global air travel by enabling the consensing of air fares in an action session, for example this idea will be a great jump and would reduce differences between airplane owners.

PRIMARY TACTIC: DEVELOPING CONSENSUS CONSCIOUSNESS

A program of international, inter-cultural exchange would develop local appreciation of the world's cultures and provide the imaginal basis for local man to engage in a world-wide process of consensus decision making. To have cultural units from different nations encountering one another in local community settings over a period of time would encourage that appreciation and understanding fundamental to such consensus making. To create a cultural exchange program involving families is a way of bringing this about. The student exchange program sponsored by many institutions and organizations is already doing this. The family cultural exchange program would bring about a greater awareness of need, and lead to progress in the area of social justice.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ARRANGING FAMILY MEETINGS

Arranging meeting of families having hosted exchange students to discuss feasibility of a family exchange program based on their knowledge of exchange student's family interested in coming to their community and possible sponsorship by local clubs, churches or associations internationally minded.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ACKNOWLEDGING EMERGING GROUPS

Acknowledging emerging national groups in order to move community engagement by enabling the involvement of community leadership in planning session for example the participation of immigrants in local community festivals.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ANNOUNCING PUBLIC MEETING

Making sure that announcement is made of public meetings, festivals etc. where inter-cultural groups will have an opportunity to share their culture and come to know each other better and encouraging attendance through church bulletins and newspaper advertising.

SECONDARY TACTIC: HONORING INDIVIDUAL GIFTS

Honoring individual gifts in order to elicit full community involvement by enabling the symbolizing of new arrivals in a country to be personally greeted and given citizens status.

SECONDARY TACTIC: PROVIDING INTERNATIONALS DECISIONS

Providing opportunities for people of other cultures to participate in community decision making processes by making it possible through political influence for these people to be represented in office seeking processes of the community.

PRIMARY TACTIC: DEVELOPING AGGREGATION SYSTEMS

Developing Aggregation Systems in the world of today is a challenging concept. The strengthening of existing global organizational systems and creation of new aggregations would greatly increase local man's awareness of global social responsibility and opportunity. Now existing structures of professional and occupational associations could become strong global guilds for the service of mankind in their particular roles. Those in leadership position in such associations should be recruited for courses that would both motivate and train them in the forging of these guilds. Leaders of service organizations and labor unions as well as professional groupings could be recruited for a course such as LENS. The effect in strengthening and creating avenues to fundamental justice for local-global man could be immeasurable.

SECONDARY TACTIC: RECOGNIZING GLOBAL ASPECT

Recognizing the global aspect of local international organizations such as Red Cross, "service organization" etc. by holding an international night planned by local representatives of each such locally established segment with visual and other methods of what they are doing internationally.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CONSULTING PROFESSIONAL LEADERS

Consulting with leaders of professional groupings, doctors, lawyers, teachers etc. in regard to their interest in global issues, their travel experience and encourage them to enter into dialogue locally on the vision of international understanding inviting them to an informal evening of discussion in one's home.

SECONDARY TACTIC: RECRUITING PROFESSIONAL LEADERS

Recruiting leaders of internationally operating associations such as Red Cross "survival organizations" etc. as well as leaders of various professions for LENS courses or a secularly-structured PLC to be motivated and indormed through their involvement in such an intensive experience.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INTRODUCING CELEBRATIVE EVENTS

Introducing celebrative events in order to develop community awareness of the global through intercultural festivals planned by Church and Civic and Professional groups expressly interested in their world service and intercultural experiences.

SECONDARY TACTIC: SUPPORTING GLOBAL PROGRAMS

Supporting all programs of the globally oriented groups such as relief, exchange students, celebrative events etc. sponsored locally by pushing publicity through local church bulletin notices, newspaper announcements and by individual participation.

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: ENGAGING COMMUNITY
STRUCTURES

PRIMARY TACTIC: ALLOCATING RESOURCE COMMISSION

The allocating of resources through a commission is a primary tactic for exchanging persons, equipment, and natural resources across the globe. The apparent reason for this structure is to distribute raw materials, machinery, and man power to assist communities in their development. The commission would serve the function of coordinating the flow of equipment and material to a community. However, the more important value derived from implementing this tactic is in the global consciousness this brings to a community. This tactic sets the stage for local communities across the globe to make decisions out of a global context. An example of this tactic in action is the way the European Common Market effects the sharing of persons throughout the European community. Another benefit from this tactic would be the sharing of ideas and cultural wisdom that occurs when persons move to a new community. It is through the sharing of persons, resources, and ideas that global consciousness is intensified and local model building can proceed out of a global context.

SECONDARY TACTIC: LISTING COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Listing Community Resources in order to hold before the community the potential it has to serve the world by posting a list of human manpower, machinery, and natural resources available in the community for example posting a list of the manpower talents in the library node accomplishes justice in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXCHANGING STUDENTS PROGRAM

Sustaining a student exchange program in order to have the opportunity of experience in a cultural consciousness in the community's school system by helping in obtaining financial support, for example hold a fund raising dinner in a local church to accomplish justice in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: STUDYING ECONOMICS GROUP

Studying international economics in order to broaden the community understanding of the global needs by instigating a community study in the economic situation of various countries, for example having an eighth grade social studies class compile the economic needs of communities in India.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CREATING CULTURAL MONTAGE

Creating a cultural montage in order to develop global-community interest in world news by mounting pictures and news items, for example creating a Kiosk, (round standing bulletin board) which contains global news from ITT accomplishes justice in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CULTURAL EXCHANGE AGENCY

Supporting a community cultural exchange agency in order to encourage the community's participation in international happenings by sponsoring cultural events in the community, for example the community create a cultural festival on a celebrative day which accomplishes justice in the area of deliberative systems.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: ENGAGING COMMUNITY
STRUCTURES.

PRIMARY TACTIC: ORGANIZING COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

A primary tactic within the arena of foundational justice in Deliberative Systems is Organizing Community Leadership. Often community leaders make decisions in response to immediate out of a short range vision. The intention of this tactic is to give community leaders a structure whereby they can plan the future of the community out of a corporate vision that is both global and long range. This tactic could be implemented through a quarterly planning retreat. The basic format would be a PSU week-end with time devoted to secular spirit spins (song conversations) and short courses on the cultural heritage of the community. Initially some community leaders could be invited as resource persons to a retreat on community transportation. In the process, they would be impacted by the power of the methodologies and the comprehensiveness of the created models. The retreat would expose the need to explore other community issues at future retreats with additional community leaders present.

SECONDARY TACTIC: FORMING LEGISLATIVE BODIES

Forming Local and Regional Legislative Bodies which decide on political, economic and cultural needs of every individual by corporately agreeing on these needs in a formally organized manner; the creation of state legislatures to take care of that particular state's needs accomplishes corporate welfare in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INJECTING HUMAN RIGHTS

Injecting Human Rights Clauses in laws is to protect the dignity of each man's pride by the extreme limiting of certain areas of man's freedom of choice in legal manner, for example the anti-discrimination clause in Great Britain's system to protect the black race accomplishes social justice in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: FORMING LOCAL ACTION

Forming Local Decisive Action Committees to decide on all matters concerning the local people by formalizing the manner of decision-making in a committee meeting, for example the calling of a meeting to initiate the blockage of a main road through a residential zone, accomplishes corporate welfare in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INITIATING PUBLIC HEARING

Initiating Public Hearing Session to meet the demands of local men by formalizing the method by which to accomplish this task in a hearing session hearing held at City Hall to hear the complaints of the community accomplishes corporate welfare and justice in the area of deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: FORMING PUBLIC CONFERENCE

Forming Public Conference. Structure reviews past work of secular or religious organizations and decides on future tactics by coming together as a corporate body in a conference meeting, the annual conference assembly of the Methodist Church each year accomplishes corporate welfare in the area of deliberative systems.

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: COMPUTERIZE DATA INTERCHANGE

A computerized data interchange centrum will enable the development of local knowledge banks in order to have information coming into the community from the world, and information going out from the community to the world. The form of the tactic is to create research seminars in which a broad cross-section of local men will be invited to participate. At these seminars local man will receive relevant information and participate in workshops on global and local problems. Through his new vision and the workshops, he will become more aware that his participation and knowledge can help solve local and global situations, and will be motivated to create practical solutions. For example, weekend problem solving seminars could meet to inspect for repairs all community playgrounds. The repairs could be dealt with by a regional recreation committee. By having such a problem solving seminar, local man would become conscious of needs and become more willing to participate because he could see his suggestions being dealt with in the community.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: COMPUTERIZE DATA INTERCHANGE

PRIMARY TACTIC: EXPANDING NEWS AWARENESS

As local man wrestles to create the corporate will of his community, a key tactic is expanding his international news awareness. By relating regularly to events from around the world, one begins to internalize the reality of the Global Village as his every day decision making context. Using local radio stations and global news services as a resource, news items are sorted and catalogued by a task group, assembled through participating special interest groups and distributed through daily radio and television spots, weekly summary sheets and monthly catalogues of abstracts produced for each special interest group in cooperation with sponsoring businesses. For example, the recreation department, P.T.A. and auto workers and unions send representatives to participate in both the practical leadership and creation of secular symbolic life, like songs of such a group. This tactic enables primal care by providing a structure for expanding global/community common memory.

SECONDARY TACTIC: PROVIDING NEGOTIATION METHODS

Providing negotiation methods, especially data gathering seminars and information exchange meetings will enable governments to creatively negotiate emerging international issues.

SECONDARY TACTIC: REPORTING INTERNATIONAL VISITS

Following important international trips, like Nixon's visit to China, utilizing depth reporting to local communities through a series of articles inserted into local news publication will enable authentic understanding at the local level.

SECONDARY TACTIC: PUBLISHING GLOBALLY COMMON NEWSPAPER

Publishing an international newspaper with globally common format, provides local man with a comprehensive report of current events, for example a monthly non-partisan magazine, published in the native language of each country reporting on affairs of the United Nations.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CELEBRATING GLOBAL EVENTS

City wide celebrations of major world wide events, such as new nations' independence would enable a fresh appreciation of such global happenings at the local level.

SECONDARY TACTIC: HIGHLIGHTING GLOBAL POSSIBILITY

Increasing local man's grasp of resurgence around the world will be accomplished through strategic reporting of global events of future possibility through creation of monthly "posters of possibility" highlighting international agreements like international water regulation treaties, by local guildsmen.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: COMPUTERIZ E DATA
INTERCHANGE

PRIMARY TACTIC: DEVELOPING PUBLIC INFORMATION FLOW

The intent of this tactic is to provide a structure for expanding local man's interest in and consciousness of public information which will keep him better informed and more deeply sensitive to the fact that he can shape society's decisions. There will be seminars for enabling exchange of data. During these seminars potential guildsmen will meet by professional interest groups to formulate a corporate consciousness of all activity on a local level. The Rotary club or local PTA can be groups to begin to offer such public information. Such seminars may begin to show up in communities all over the world catalyzed by a local/global movemental dynamic. This tactic would insure a flow to and from local communities with their data. This tactic would accomplish primal care in that human beings would begin to sense the cruciality of their own concerns as they relate to the complex context of urban life, and symbolize their own interrelatedness to all mankind.

SECONDARY TACTIC: RE-ESTABLISHING LOCAL VOICE

Presenting a public opinion poll in order to re-establish local man's voice in decision making by raising in-mass his concerns in an orderly, intentional fashion, for example community groups building issue/stance oriented questionnaire which accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: DRAMATIZING GLOBAL COMMUNITY

Availability of information concerning United Nations Policies/Programs in order to dramatize global community by relating global affairs to local affairs, for example weekend P.S.U. discerning methods and forms of U.N. information presentation within a community accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXCHANGING GLOBAL VISITORS

Exchanging of worldwide tourists and students in order to enable international exchange of local information by establishing resident housing for tourists and exchange students in a context expanding environment, for example a P.S.U. on context orientation program accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ESTABLISHING NEIGHBORHOOD CLINICS

Establishing Neighborhood Clinics to allow medical care in a local proximity by citizenry of cross-cultural groups in a weekend P.S.U. discerning the needs of the people, for example presenting possible methods for dealing with drug problems accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: UTILIZING MEDIA SYSTEMS

Utilizing mass media systems in order to enable distribution of information by gathering community members in a weekend P.S.U. for example consensing of effective local movement through media systems accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

COMPUTERIZE DATA
PARAMOUNT TACTIC: INTERCHANGE

PRIMARY TACTIC: ESTABLISHING SOCIAL RESOURCES

This tactic concerns establishing comprehensive social resources in every community. This would provide local man with a way to obtain information about global-local social events, thus enabling him to develop an awareness of what is going on in this arena in his community as well as the whole globe. The diversity as well as the commonality of such events would enlarge his understanding of the various cultures and types of communities. These resources could be communicated to the community through a weekly written publication, such as N.E.A. Review, or displays in store windows, or brochures in waiting rooms. This tactic deals with awareness for decision making by local man, stimulating his participation in community social events and expanding his interest in global events, as he engages in creating the will of his own community.

SECONDARY TACTIC: TEACHER/STUDENT PROTEST

Exposing teacher/student protests in order to examine their causes and effects and their meaning to society by creating investigating teams of concerned local men, for example the federal and state investigation of Kent State accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: ECOLOGY MOVEMENT

Publishing a community newsletter by local men in order to awaken community ecological awareness by supplying a comprehensive collection of current ecological happenings in a newspaper to be sent quarterly through the mail, for example an Ecological Progress Paper accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CHURCH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Development of an ecumenical council in order to provide means of social change by enlightening local man's knowledge of social change in weekend seminars and monthly research assemblies, for example the Summer of '73 accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: INSTITUTIONAL REFORM

Empowering the community with a realistic vision of institutional reform in order to enable local man to see his responsibility for his neighbor by holding a workshop in which information is shared concerning local institutions, for example P.S.U. on injustice concerning mental institutions accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: IMPROVING LABOR CONDITIONS

Empowering the community in order to develop a concrete awareness in local man by establishing a new image of labor in accurate special televised objective reporting, for example televised labor union trials accomplishes care in the area of Deliberative Systems.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: COMPUTERIZE DATA INTERCHANGE

PRIMARY TACTIC: PROVIDING ECONOMIC BALANCING

The tactic is providing economic balancing. The intent of the tactic is to allow local man to rebalance his economic models both in his family and his community context. It intends to re-educate him in the use of economic resources and thus to release him to deal with community and global issues without his being victimized by the social bias which presently exists toward the economic. The form of this tactic is a community-wide seminar which deals with the economic models the individual, family and community live out of. The content of this tactic is contextual lectures presenting a comprehensive global perspective of the use of resources, problemats of community needs, model building to deal with them and the creation of a family economic budget. An example is a weekend globe-community-family economic seminar. This tactic deals with local/global awareness for decision-making by recontexting local man as to new possibilities in the use of economic resources.

SECONDARY TACTIC: FARMERS EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Introducing an international data exchange program which will publish a quarterly magazine for farmers that will give frequent detailed listings of knowledge to enable local man to gain knowledge in economic and technological fields, for example The Farmers Almanac accomplishes care in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: COMMON MARKET

Create a common market that would investigate and regulate high prices and economic costs by a specially created investigating committee, for example ceiling limits accomplishes care in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: MULTI-NATIONAL CORPORATIONS

Introducing multi-national corporations to create national economical multi-directional brainstorming methods with equal economic regulations with intense depth by a deliberating seminar, for example a corporately developed economical system accomplishes care in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: CHURCH RE-THINKING INVESTMENT POLICY

Create re-thinking church investment policy to create an economic balance through local church week and seminars to enable local man to become aware of economic inbalance, for example, planning for missional economic out put accomplishes care in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: TRADE MOVEMENT

Creating a council of trade movement to establish an economic exchange system that would deal with global economic balance by systematic approaches by planned debate sessions, for example the comparison of U.S. and Chinese trade accomplishes care in Deliberative Systems.

PRESSURE POINT: DELIBERATIVE SYSTEMS

PARAMOUNT TACTIC: COMPUTERIZI
DATA INTERCHANGE

PRIMARY TACTIC: ESTABLISHING POLITICAL RESOURCES

This tactic is establishing comprehensive political resources. The intent of such a tactic is to provide guidelines for political change that will come from local data-gathering seminars. Local man will begin to sense he can shape the broad context for political change and therefore risk meaningful participation in shaping the future. The form of the tactic will be for the seminars to draw information from and feed into a local/global library where data is kept for reference and study of trends. The content of the tactic will reimage for local man the need to understand and create the symbolic dimension of political roles. For example, seminars established for the purpose of historic local/global data gathering will insure creative reflection on major political events such as Nixon's trip to China in order to train local man to see his historic perspective objectively. Through these seminars local man will once again recover a sense of significance as one who can shape decisions made on his behalf. This will accomplish primal care in deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: EXTRACTING LOCAL RESPONSE

Extracting local response to current political issues in order to continually develop the local consensus by engaging local citizens in discussion panels in a monthly community forum of political issues and trends patterned after the popular television program "Meet the Press."

SECONDARY TACTIC: PROMOTING LOCAL AWARENESS

Promoting local awareness of political methods in order to give perspective to international political decisions and events and to local practices, by examining international political practices in a series of informative presentations at high school assemblies and other community gatherings, for example, a review of the Vietnam negotiations accomplishes primal care in Deliberative Systems

SECONDARY TACTIC: HIGHLIGHTING HISTORICAL ROLES

Highlighting historical roles in order to give historical perspective to current local political decisions by providing a history long picture of political change in an imaginative study format with art forms for local citizens and leaders for example creating public political wall murals accomplishes primal care in Deliberative Systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: POLLING LOCAL OPINION

Polling local opinion in order to continually sense the sociological response to political issues and decisions by taking daily opinion polls of international, national, regional and local issues in a series of community opinion polls, for example, man on the street interviews accomplishes primal care in deliberative systems.

SECONDARY TACTIC: REVIEWING POLITICAL ISSUES

Reviewing political issues in order to develop broad based familiarity of local concerns, especially in conjunction with elections, by establishing a cross-party review committee to produce a weekly news sheet summarizing pro's and con's of current issues, for example a brochure discussing school busing accomplishes primal care in Deliberative Systems.
