Guild Tactics

1. INCLUSIVE MYTH is relating man to the mystery through creating the story of his origin and aim, the meaning of his relationship to society and the significance of being a person.
2. COMMUNITY GROUPINGS is providing a new posture of man and his community relative to biological relationships, primary social relationships, vocational relationships and chosen relationships, filling full these social groupings.
3. BASIC ROLES is providing local community with a new posture relative to every person's place within the social fabric. It has to do with functional necessities within a community, necessary points of influence within the community, and the self-conscious and unconscious controls on those various relationships.
4. SOCIAL MORALITY is providing for local man images of meaning for historical engagement in relationship to society's future and his community.
5. FORMAL METHODS is providing a means through which man creates self-consciousness relative to images, social relationships and depth human spirit.
6. KNOWLEDGE ACCESS is structuring the means through which man has adequate access to necessary community images, current edges of the community's image and ongoing data relative to making responsible decisions.
7. BUREAUCRATIC SYSTEMS is the structuring through which a community corporately acts out its own decisions relative to the regulation, administration and execution of the communities will.

1. Inclusive myths

The task of the guild in the resurgence of local community is to reinvest the community with the images that refocus and emplify the existing myths. Creative images of individual story, of sociality, and of the community's thrust in the globe provide the possibility that new and resurgent myths can be created. In this way, the community can transform the wisdom in its old stories and symbols into global and futuric stories and symbols that will release the individual for significant engagement and bring together the corporate community in focused missional action.

2. Community groupings

The task of the guild in the resurgence of the local community is reinvesting the community posture by creating meaning ful social groupings. This means that the existing primal relationships such as the family and friendship and culture groupings will become self-conscious of a new authenticity that is futuric rather than traditional. The structural relationships will have a new validity focusing on a sense of the destinal task of the whole community. The voluntary societies will also discover meaning beyond the immediate.

3. Basic roles

The task of the guild in the resurgence of the local community is reinvesting the community posture through the basic roles of the community. Various assignments by people taking initiatives through ordinary procedures based on relevant needs are placed ypon members of the local community. The local people also see their historically symbolic roles with special rights and particular obligations. In social controls, public opinion, legal delineation and common expectation are all part of the basic roles in society. The embodiment of all these primal roles as revolutionary style invention, releases radical guardianship of all the past, present, and future.

4. Social morality

The task of the guild in the resurgence of local community is to demonstrate the indicative of responsibility for this community and the whole globe. This means raising consciousness of the thrust of human sociality into history. It means forging structures through futuric covenant and accountability to a common missional task and this will enable responsible relationships held in tension between community obligation and individual freedom.

5. Formal methods

The task of teh guild on the resurgence of the local community is to reinvest the community images through creating meaningful practical methods. These methods include the intellectual methods, the rational methods, the study methods, the teaching methods and the rational methods. The societal methodologies include problem analysis, model building and tactids prowess. The motivational methodologies include interior discipline, practical visioning and symbology prowess. These are all tools which give the community a way to commonly act out its vision, thereby recreating the community.

6. Knowledge access

The task of the guild in the resurgence of local community is to create structures of knowledge access for everyman. This means a new appropriation of the idea of basic education making it more comprehensive and continuous throughout the phases. It will enable a creative grasp of the corporate wisdom. It will create valid systems of communicating publicly, data, and reliable information.

7. Bureaucratic systems

The task of the guild in the resurgence of the local community is to restructure the community's means of decision-making through creating accountable systems for implementing decisions. It involves creating local structures and systems which see themselves obedient both to the local consensus and to the authority which symbolizes that consensus. It means rebuilding an image of radical servanthood on the part of the bureaucratic structures of a local community where they see themselves in existence on behalf of the local individual, serving his needs, and willing to change forms in response to local man's needs and consensed decisions.

8. Forming consensus

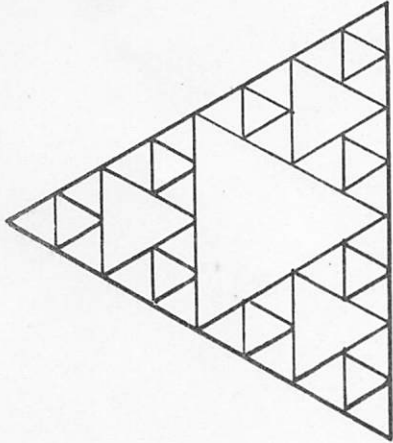
The task of the guild in the resurgence of local community is to restructure the community's way of ordering its relationships through restructuring the community's means of decision making, through creating the structures for forming and articulating the local consensus. It means investing every local man with the power to participate in creating the practical vision and concrete models which give form to the consensus. It means providing the forms through which the community has time to brood, to stew over decisions being made. It means creating the means for symbolizing when a consensus has been reached and when a new consensus is required. It means discerning the common ness.

9. Anticipated needs

The task of the guild in the resurgence of local community, by reforming the sustenance plans of the community, by reshaping the vision of the consumption, by the community, is to create the means for the community to anticipate and plan for its long range needs. In its planning, the community will need to estimate its conserved resources, gauge its limited depletions, evaluate supplies and project various trends. In the arena of productiveness the local community will need to see its licensed directions, its needed capital investments and the incentive conditions which affect all. A universal vision would guide the means of structuring local exports and global imports.

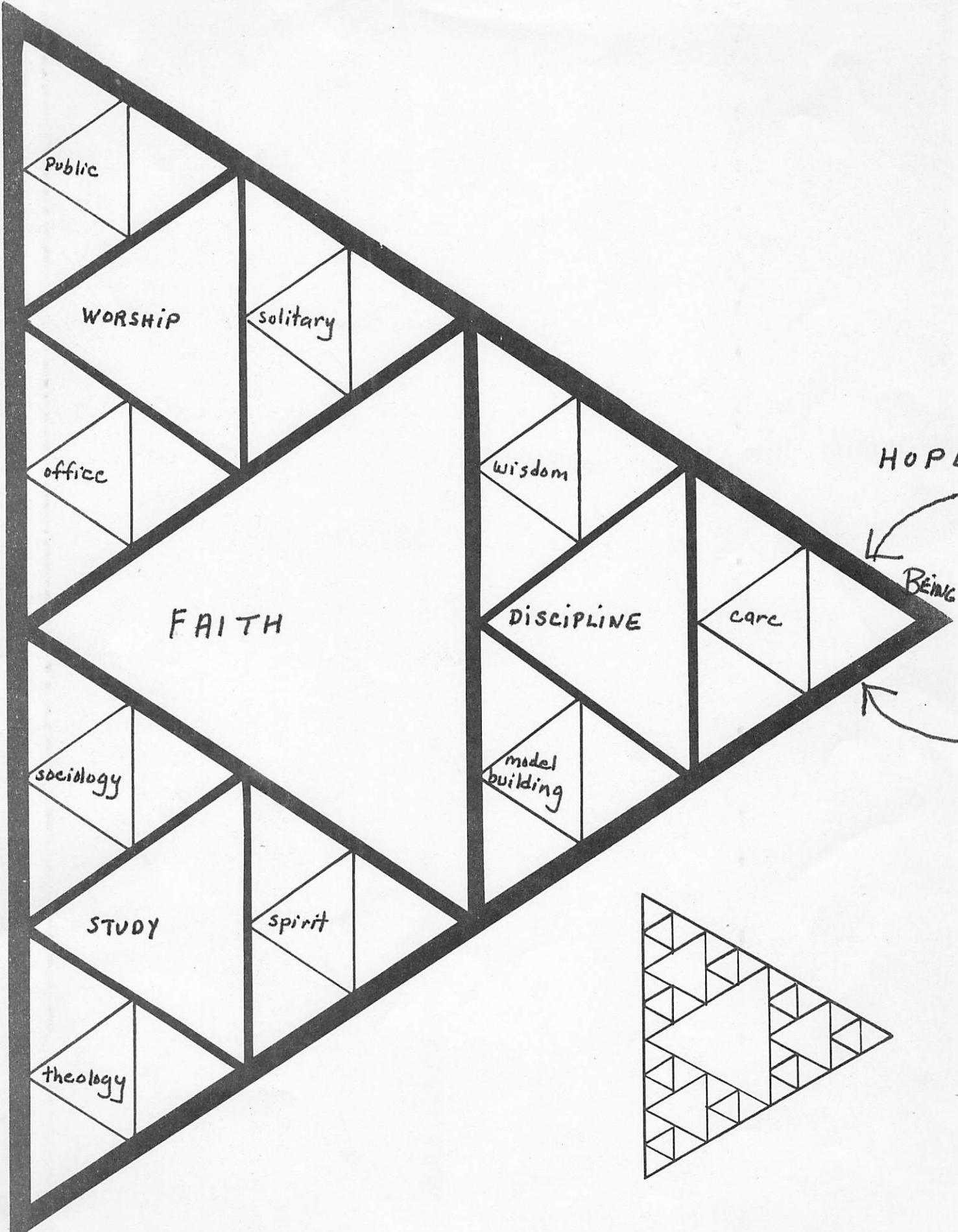

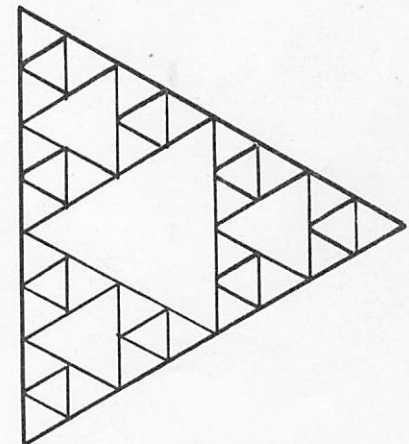
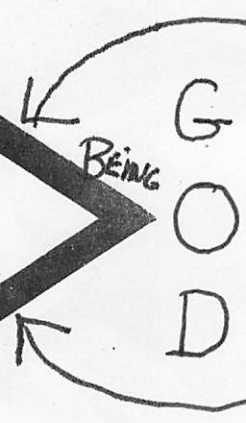
