2. Planning a class schedule

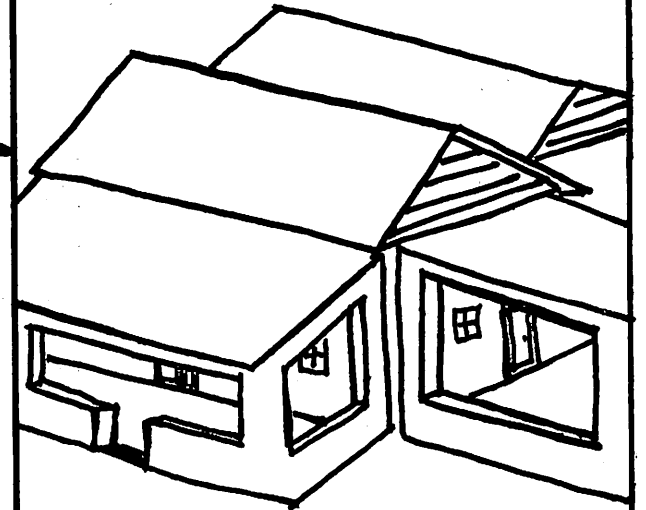
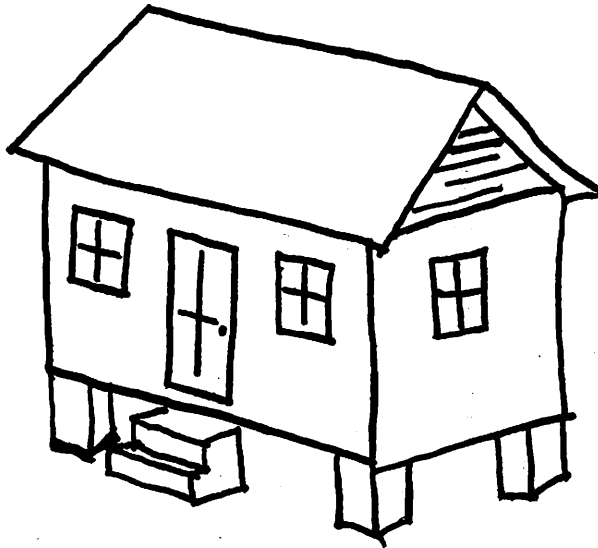

2. The bus shed was about to start, but was stopped due to lack of cooperation.

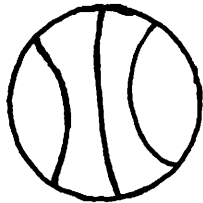
