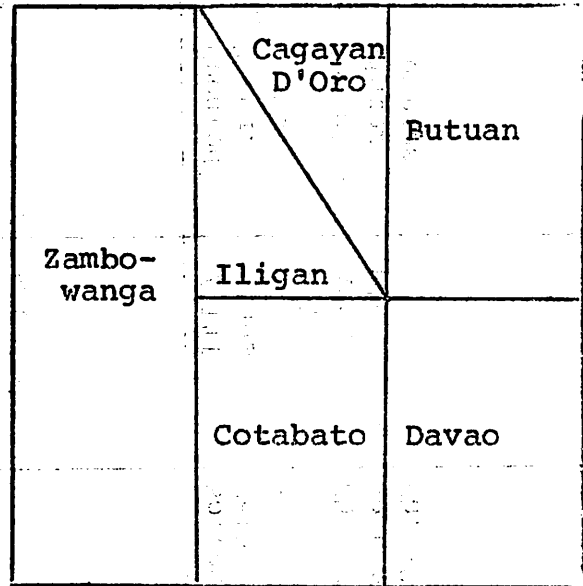


AREA EAST SOUTH EAST ASIA REGIONAL GRIDS

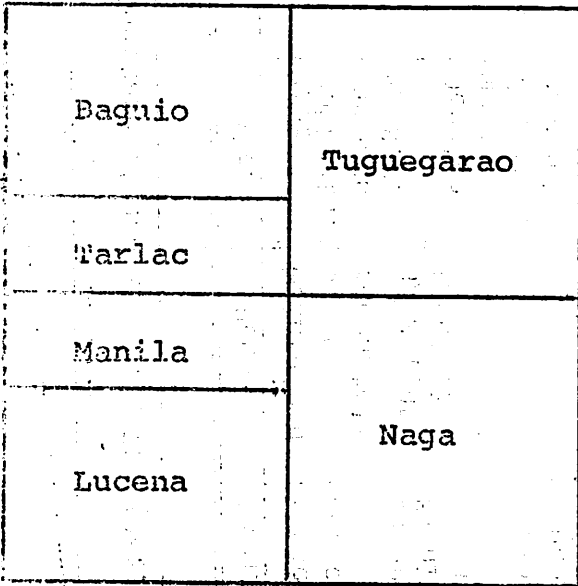
HONG KONG REGION



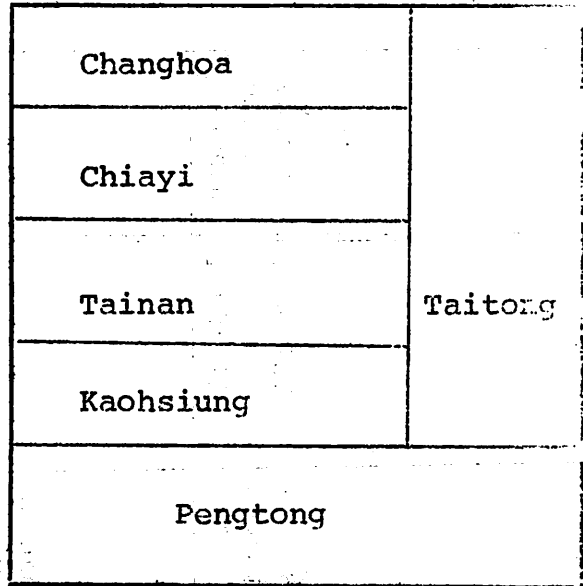
DAVAO REGION



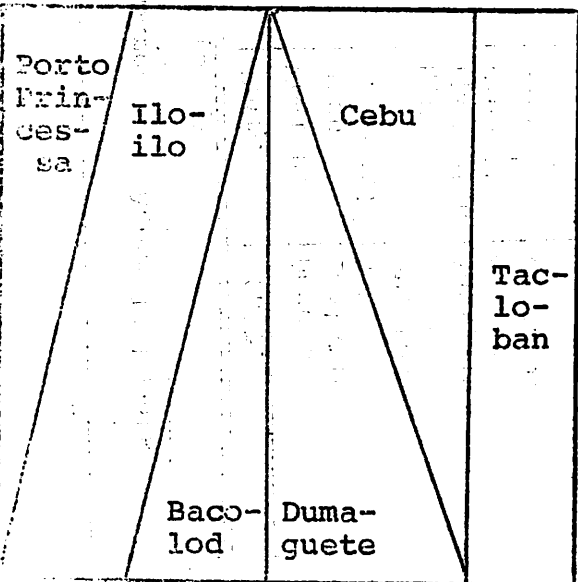

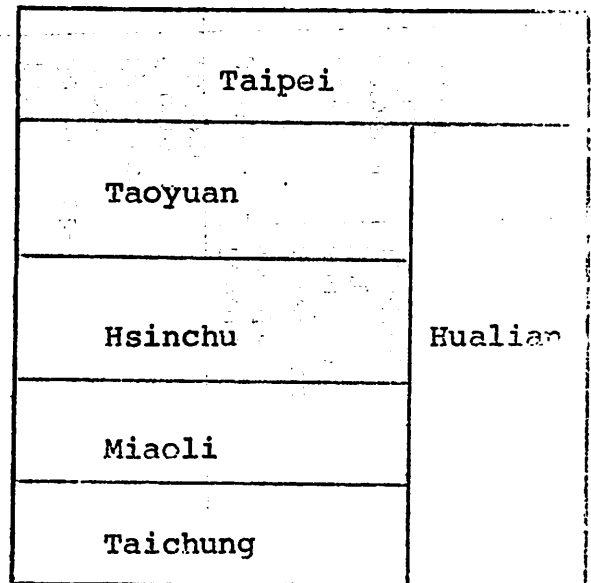

CONTINUOUS COURSES -

RS-1

PLC

For 1st Quarter it is recommended that:

1. The second area meeting be held in Seoul in the ITI Council week.
2. All 6 religious houses be in full operation by Sept. 30, 1972.

For 2nd Quarter it is recommended that:

1. The location of the 4 key churches in each region be finalized.
2. Work with these key churches be concentrated with them.

For 3rd Quarter it is recommended that:

1. The Local Church Project start in all 6 regions on Jan. 1, 1973.
2. The area meeting be the 2nd week of March.

For 4th Quarter it is recommended that:

1. There be a big push on ITI Funding.
2. ITI Recruitment be finalized.



### AREA CENTRUM

There will be an Area Centrum which will be located in Hong Kong.

The Area Centrum will conduct monthly inter-communication and accountability via phone.

### AREA MEETING

Twice a year, the area should meet, once after the ITI in the summer, and the other time in March. It is recommended that at least one movemental colleague from each region should be present in along with order members.

### AREA FUND

The budget for the area fund for the year 1972-73 was set and the financial responsibility of each region was decided (based upon an equalization formula of average income per month per adult as over against average house expenditure per month per adult):

1. The stipend category is to pay two \$50 stipends when that is needed by a newly assigned person or persons.
2. The collegium category is to pay the transportation costs of 8 people to area meetings.
3. The faculty exchange category is to provide for six trips within the area.
4. The office category is primarily for long distance telephone calls.

\* Allotments are to be included in each House's budget. Allotments are to be paid monthly, in US dollars, to the Area account in Hong Kong.

## REGIONAL RESPONSIBILITY

### 1. Courses

a. In any region of ESEA where colleagues are either in proximity or available to conduct advanced courses or otherwise nurture new grads, the "classical" constructs of RS-1 and PLC will be used. Where colleagues are unable to followup with advanced courses before one year, the International RS-1 Construct may be used. In any case, the SEQUENCE and the CONTENT of the COURSE as described in the manuals printed at BASE, including the prescribed conversations, lectures, short courses, seminars, and all other instructions, are to be adhered to without exception. No change is permitted whatsoever. HOWEVER, the actual time may be varied to accomodate local custom; for example, in the case of weeknight courses or weekend courses that may require attendance at local church services.

b. Faculty members may be invited from any ESEA region to teach in another region, providing the local region assumes full responsibility for the costs of travel and expenses. However, any region may request funding from the Area Budget for international travel when that region's portion of the Area Budget has been paid in.

**ITI**

Each region of ESEA is directly responsible to ITI:Seoul's recommendations and mandates regarding all matters pertaining to the SEAPAC ITI, 1972, including:

- a. Raising its designated funding quota. (All monies contributed for ITI are to be sent to ITI:Seoul without deductions for costs of fund raising, the latter to be paid by the region or house.)
- b. Sending delegates in the quotas announced by Seoul under the criteria recommended by Seoul.

Symbolic life is the key to hold the corporate spirit of the Global movement. It is symbolized that we are one movement across the globe doing the same thing, the same task on behalf of all mankind.

The minimum commonness of symbolic life in each house consists of:

1. Daily time design starts at 5:00 a.m.
2. Collegium, the full daily office during Week I, Geneva office during Week II.
3. Evenings: Family on Monday, Ecclesiola on Thursday, House Church on Sunday.

HOUSE COMMONALITY

**Corporate Wisdom:** - Order wisdom on Religious Houses is available in various forms. The following items are held up for particular note by the Area Houses.

**Prior** - The Prior is responsible for the total life of the house. His strength, as well as that of each member, is from the symbolic life of the House.

**Style** - Style is the crucial point of being a Religious House. This includes the following aspects.

**Time Design** - We hold a common time design with the Global Order. This time design is particularized concretely in each house and held. This is not for reward but to get the job done.

**Decor** - House decor serves the crucial function of self-consciously self-imagining both the house members and visitors. In the decor the common memory and common vision is constantly rehearsed.

Goods - The point is scientific budgetting of all goods to get the job done.

Work Assignments - In terms of external (out) and internal (in) assignments, there is always the danger of thinking one's own assignment is not crucial and that the other category is a better one. It must be always remembered that there is no status or moral value in a person's assignment. Assignment is for making responsible use of personnel for missional advancement. For those assigned "out", the demand is to be "the best employee they ever had".

Assignments

Local Church - Be present in a local congregation for Sunday worship.

Inter-regional - Recommendations to Base for assignment of people across regions to enable finances of any one house are made by the Area Centrum.

**FINANCIAL COMMONNESS**

Recommendations for Minimal Financial Commonness include:

1. Stipend per month per adult, US\$50; senior youth US\$25; children US\$11; and preschool US\$8.
2. Cost per person per meal US 20¢.

The following bookkeeping model for use by all religious houses in this area was consensed upon.

The House Account Bookkeeping Model: The following model for the house account bookkeeping will be used by all houses. This model is for the salaried income of the house in contrast to funds raised which would be carried in the ITI account or course funds, etc., which would be carried in the regional account.

(1) Note: The 'medical' category is to cover medical insurance of persons of the religious house who are not covered by order insurance and for medical emergencies.

(2) The ITI category is for seed money. That is, it is the money to be used for fund raising expenses. A similar category may be held in the regional budget to enable regional colleagues to participate in this responsibility. But all funds raised for ITI go into the ITI account, apart and separate from this category within the House budget.

COMMON AGREEMENT: It was agreed that this area would hold to these decisions:

1. Adult stipend: US\$50.
2. Cost of meals: 20¢ per person.
3. Each house will be self-supporting.
4. Every course will be self-supporting.
