



Reflections on Robert

I was shocked to realize a few months ago that I had met Robert almost 50 years ago when he and his family and I became involved with the Institute of Cultural Affairs (known as the ICA) in Cleveland, OH. So, I will be telling you of the Bob I know through the ICA.

I.

Robert always brought a calm, steady thoughtful presence to any situation. He basically saw that it was possible to solve any challenge and he would go about doing exactly that. One example of this was when he was in Kenya. When he arrived in Kenya, he found that the ICA was in need of its first financial audit in order to keep getting international funding for it s village development work. So, he set about figuring out how to get the books in shape for the audit. The audit was successful and the systems were put in place for the future.

Now all this may seem relatively easy BUT:

- 1. money was being spent in Nairobi and in 10-15 small villages throughout the countryside
- 2. records were being kept by local staff probably on bits of paper
- 3. there was nothing even resembling a computer And he did it!



Sometimes meeting a challenge took him having the determination and courage to truly risk action. This quality can be seen when an international staff member was gravely ill and in a coma in Kenya. Over the protests of the doctors in the Nairobi Hospital, Robert got her transferred to a much superior medical facility and then to the states and basically saved her life.



Robert was in touch with his own vulnerability, compassion and humanity which allowed him to truly see the gifts of others and nurture those gifts.

- 1. He took a 'quirky" bunch of folks (which I can say because I was one of them) and helped us become an effective team caring for and maintaining an old 8 story barely renovated insurance building that was the international headquarters of the ICA.
- 2. He could authentically connect with:
 - wealthy US donors
 - local village leaders in Kenya
 - high school and college student children of ICA staff
 - to mention only a few

It was a true honor, privilege and joy to have worked with, been a friend of and to have just been in this world with Robert Rafos.



10 Pillars



Bob Rafos July 6, 1935 – March 9, 2018

Was one of the founding partners at Northwater Capital Management Inc.

In June of 1994, he laid out the underpinnings of the firm in a presentation to staff and friends at a company retreat at Minaki Lodge in Northern Ontario.

This is a summary of that presentation.

Allow intuition to play a role in developing the direction and decisions of the organization. This means trusting your judgment and life experience as well as rational thinking and information.

Our greatest asset is our people. "Good" is not an allusion to morality, but rather describes people who exhibit creativity, responsibility, clear thinking, and independence.

3 ESTABLISH THE FIRM'S PHILOSOPHY AND ETHIC

This has to do with the fundamental beliefs of how to treat clients, employees, shareholders and suppliers. It is about the image and operating mode that we intend to project. This stems from the belief that the whole is greater than the sum of the parts. There is no star system, but a team effort focused on maximizing the whole.

5 INTENTIONAL DESIGN OF CORPORATE SPACE

Space can care for people. It can create an atmosphere that is inviting instead of discouraging. Consciously reflecting on the messages that the space communicates is important.

6 FOLLOW YOUR BLISS

Enable people to follow their "heart's desire". This means paying attention to yourself and others about what you and they really want. Encourage people "to go for it", both within and outside of the organization.

BUILD PARTNERSHIPS WITH CLIENTS AND SUPPLIERS

This is the understanding that we intend to create win-win situations for everyone – that all are on a larger team for mutual benefit. This facilitates trust and fairness among all parties.

BE CONFIDENT IN YOUR CAPABILITIES

When things are going smoothly, it is easy to be confident. It is when adversity strikes that confidence is tested. It is at these times that the firm's people must be strong in believing that they have the intellect, resources and will to carry on.

9 CELEBRATE AND SIGNIFICATE

Individual and team efforts are frequently recognized and celebrated to honour team members' contributions. Celebration also strengthens our sense of team and community – the heart of our culture.

10 CONTINUALLY INNOVATE THE PRODUCTS AND SERVICES

Resting on one's laurels is a sure way to fall behind. The world constantly changes, and clients continually seek solutions for existing and emerging problems and ways to address new opportunities.
