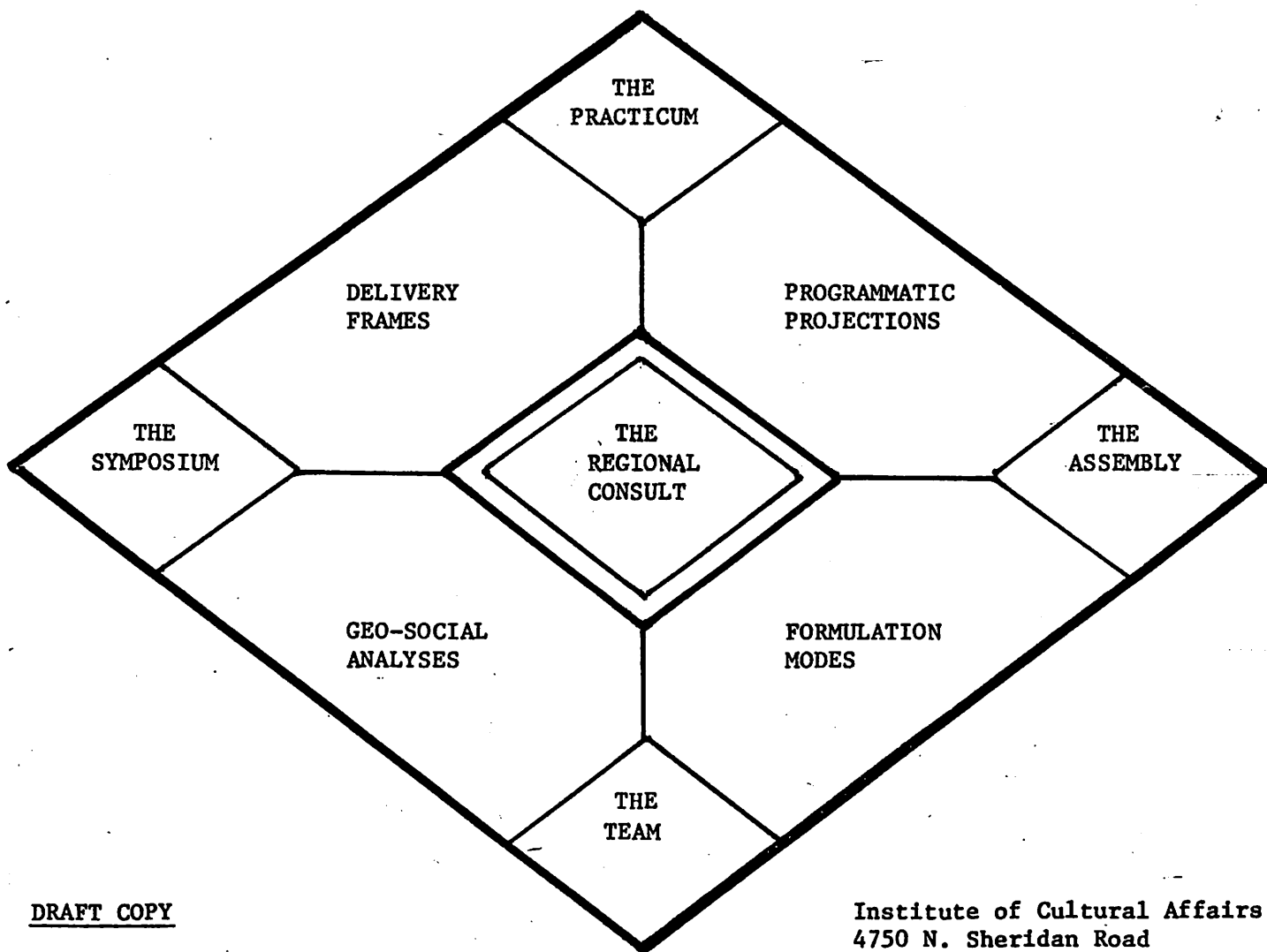

THE REGIONAL CONSULTS INTENT

In the context of the Year of the Region, it is our global consensus to design and implement the Regional Consult in every operating region of the globe by June 1981.

1. As a method for building the movement by activating and intensifying local decision making and local engagement of all three of the global strategies of manifestation, declaration and formation.
2. To create a plan and produce a document similar to a CEM document which will allow us to compare, contrast and analyze the visions and contradictions faced and strategically plan the next four years in the Global Research Assembly and the Global Priors Council of 1981.
3. In order to actualize and formalize the movemental and extended Order dynamics around the world.
4. To intentionalize the building of the movement, the reaching of villages, and the forging of framing and funding networks as one common thrust.
5. To occasion the opportunity for those who care in each region to grasp anew a practical corporate vision of the historical global task as it is grounded in their region.

THE IMPLEMENTATION FLOW

The common global flow culminating in the Regional Consults is inclusive of the following dynamics:

I. The Preparation

Preparation for the consult creates the atmosphere for the broadest participation of all sectors throughout the region. We are out to involve groups and individuals who care but who may not have had previous movement contact as well as movemental cores, past and present, colleagues, and friends. Preparation activities will include planning with metro cores, documenting regional realities, conducting broad invitational activities, circuits, practices, and gathering data on what the future requires.

The Regional consult has three basic pillars which are interrelated, yet autonomous units of one thrust: 1) The Regional Symposium; 2) The Research Practicum
3) The Regional Assembly.

II. The Regional Symposium

The intent of the symposium is to draw together a broad representative group of all sectors within the region to discern the depth contradictions, and 20 year trends and name the mandates of the future upon the region. Speakers will be selected to point to indicators of the new.

III. The Research Practicum

The intent of the Metro Seminars is to disclose alternative catalytic responses to the mandates. The morning team collegiums (A) will probe the operational modes called for in the future. The Daily Research Activities (b) will expand the operational screens. And the Evening Core Gatherings (C) will focus on broadening the collegial base.

IV. THE REGIONAL ASSEMBLY

The function of the Regional Assembly is to create the regional declaration of the strategies over the next four years which will break loose vocational commitment across the region. Activities will include, workshopping, producing a document, a great celebration, and a commissioning which forms fresh collegiality into covenant with the historical task.

V. THE FOLLOW UP

The publication of the document, distribution to movement and guardians, evaluation and planning by the Regional Team and a great day of discontinuity are essential elements of followup after the consults.



THE INTENT

The intent of the Metro Practicum is to initiate the three master strategies of 1980-1984 in each metro by:

1. Initiating or intensifying programatic activity,
2. Objectifying the socio-spirit contradictions,
3. Illuminating the Those-Who-Care Forces,
4. Broadening the advocacy and funding sources, and
5. Ascertaining new operational modes and directions.

These activities combined with the pre-consult set-up activities are all directed toward the creation of a total regional strategy and an expanded self-conscious movemental base.

INTENT

The intent of this day in the metro is to construct and orchestrate the next four-day plan for the team's action in this metro. This will require getting a clear picture of the geo-social and movemental situation, so that the way of "breaking loose" this metro as a grounding in the region is clear. The purpose is not simply to supply "extra forces" to do what the metro is already doing; rather, it is to discern the underlying contradiction to the enactment of the three Master Strategies and to determine the Keystone actions for this week that will put this metro, and therefore the region, in a new position.

CONVERSATION ON THE TIMES

The attached one page titled "Conversation on the Times" is part of a framing a research project undertaken by the Public Image post last spring. It has been redrafted to apply to the Regional Consults of this year.

USE OF THE CONVERSATION ON THE TIMES

This approach will be helpful in recruiting people to the Symposium, in setting up appointments for the week of Metro research and in introducing the Institute to people who otherwise might not presently know ICA's work in their region.

1. Have a taped conversation with someone in your frame. i.e. Bishop Mathews. (See attached conversation.)
2. Ask that person to help in getting others to participate in this project by writing a cover letter of introduction, enclosing the one page sheet, "Conversation on the Times". The letter should commend the research project and encourage the person to participate.
3. Follow up the letter to the person with your own letter and then a phone call to set an appointment.
4. If you do not have this kind of entree to a person, you can write your own letters and call for an appointment. (Perhaps naming some of the people who have participated.)

We discovered that the appointments were easy to get with the recommendation from a third party.

Two people go on the interview, one to ask questions, the other to work the tape recorder and to take notes. We did not discuss ahead of time taping the interview. As we informally gathered to do the conversation, we asked if it would be all right with them to tape the conversation. In all but one case there was an immediate yes. If there is a question about it, assure the person it is only for ease in getting everything they say, that we do not intend to use the material for anything but research, that if we want to use a quote from them in our compilation we would get their permission ahead of time.

At the end of the conversation, briefly describe the work of the ICA. Leave some material for their further reading. The people we interviewed are very busy. We never went past the time we had said it would take. Be sure to write a thank you note to the person.

Enclosed are some samples of the kinds of responses we have received, ie Bishop Mathews' list of prospects, Father Hesbergh's response to him (we will interview him Dec. 11) and a sample of a letter from our office to Father Hesbergh.

CONVERSATIONS ON THE TIMES

The new decade provides everyone the opportunity to reflect on the past and to try to discern the new directions for this nation and the world. The Institute of Cultural Affairs (ICA), over the next several months, is holding conversations and conferences in 88 regions of the world designed to distill the thinking of numbers of people from the private, public and voluntary sectors of society on the relevant concerns of the emerging future. You are invited to participate in this enterprise.

For twenty-six years the ICA, a voluntary, non-profit organization has worked to devise and demonstrate practical methods of comprehensive local renewal in urban neighborhoods and rural communities around the world. The ICA has 107 offices in 32 nations with an international staff of 1585, representing many cultures, creeds and vocations. The organization emphasizes methods which enable local residents to plan and implement socio-economic change in their own communities. This has meant working with local people. For example, in the state of Maharashtra in India, the village of Maliwada which was the pilot project in that area, has been a demonstration for 232 other villages throughout the state who are now undertaking their own socio-economic development. Maliwada has tripled the income of its citizens through the introduction of light industry and expanded agriculture. In addition, malnutrition has decreased from 50% to .5%, and all of the school age children are enrolled in educational programs. All of this was made possible by releasing individual potential through planning and acting together. The ICA saw a generation ago the promise of local peoples' ability to implement their own hopes and dreams. What has been learned from these experiences is that what begins as intuition often results in changes that provide a deeper understanding of humankind.

The conversations and conferences during this year will be designed to state common priorities assimilated from the comments and perceptions of people who participate in this effort. We hope these opportunities will stimulate new insights into the challenges facing this nation and the globe.

Individual conversations will deal directly with questions of how individual potential is harnessed for the common good of society. For example, how can creative results be elicited in an inner city neighborhood as well as in rural communities. Your particular perspective in this undertaking will be valuable input.

Finally, the simple opportunity of talking about the most significant topic of all, the future, is reasons enough to set aside an hour in your crowded schedule for a conversation. The results of these regional research projects will be compiled and used as the fundamental data for a Global Research Assembly to be held in Chicago next July.
