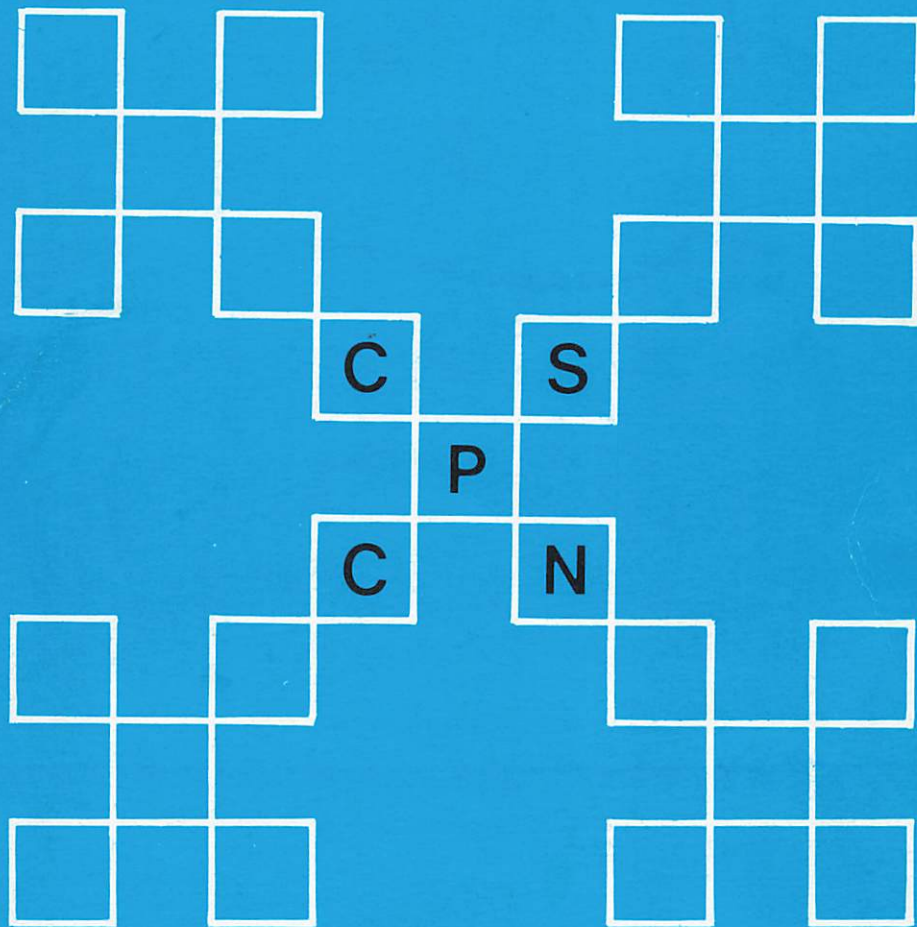

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INTRODUCTION

PUTSAN HDP

Putsan Human Development Project was initial step of comprehensive demonstration of barangay development. The project was launched in May 1982 as a pilot demonstration for the expansion of human development projects throughout the municipality of Tiwi, Albay. During the following 7 years, the barangay residents involved themselves in all aspects of social and economic development. Projects initiated include an Early Learning Nutrition Center and Health Center along with a Cooperative store, poultry and Ceramics industry. By May 1984, the Putsan HDP was handed over to the residents and efforts were focused on expanding into 4 neighboring barangays.

LOCATION

Cale, Cararayan, Naga and Sugod are the 4 barangays chosen for the first step of the expansion project. They are neighboring barangays of Putsan and are situated between Mount Malinao and the Lagunoy Gulf coast. The road leading south from Tiwi passes by all 4 barangays and along this road the Philippine Geothermal Incorporated (PGI) compound is situated. The PGI came into this area in 1971 when the first pilot project was initiated in Cale, since then they have expanded to 94 wells in the area. The scenery is dotted with drilling sites, and water pipes and disposal channels run through the country side. The educational facilities are well represented, with 3 of the barangays having their own elementary school, the elementary and high school of Cararayan also taking the pupils from Naga. Various community services are available. Electrification in all barangays came along with the advent of the PGI. Health clinics are present in most communities, along with a Rural Health Midwife who circuits this area regularly. Water facilities are present, although few residents individual supply. The occupational skills of the residents are root crop and rice farming, abaca weaving, fishing, employees, labourers and teachers.

ICA

The Institute of Cultural Affairs is an intra-global research, training and demonstration group concerned with the human factor in world development. At present the ICA has offices in 35 nations. The ICA Manila Inc. is incorporated in the Republic of the Philippines as a not for profit corporation. In 1976, a Human Development Project was launched in Sudtonggan, Lapu-Lapu City, Mactan Island, the success of this pilot demonstration prompted the ICA to expand the Sudtonggan experiment to 23 more communities in Mactan Island. Since then the ICA have projects in Mahayag, Zamboanga del Sur, Langub in Davao City, as well as Putsan, Tiwi, Albay. The ICA is convinced that effective human development must be initiated at local level and is concerned with the teaching methods through which local communities can economically self sufficient, socially self sustaining and spiritually self motivating. The Institute supports its programs around the world through grants, contribution from government departments and agencies at National, Regional and Local levels, along with private foundations, corporations, thrusts and concerned individuals.

CONSULTANTS

The Consultation took place between November 25 – December 7, 1984. In total 22 consultants attended, some of whom were residents of the project area. They brought with them varied skills and experience in fishing, agriculture, rural health, day care, local business management, municipal administration and teaching. Graduates from the Human Development Training School (HDTS) for the expansion project of Putsan, Tiwi, Albay also attended, using the methods thought during this 3 weeks training. The HDTS graduates along with the ICA staff organized, facilitated and coordinated each of the Consultations. The residents were asked for 1 representative from each household to be presented at all times, however numbers swelled in afternoon and evening session as residents arrived home from work.

CONSULT DESIGN

For the 2 week Consultation period it was decided that Sugod be chosen as the site for the first Consult, the remaining 3 Consults were held simultaneously in Naga, Cale and Cararayan, this was followed by a Reconsult of the Putsan project. The 2 weeks concluded with an assembly involving all the 5 barangays, which was held in Putsan as a symbol of the pilot project. The Consultations lasted 2 days, during which the diversified groups used common methods for comprehensive community reformulation. The first step was to chart the Operating Vision of the residents in each barangay. Second, they discerned the Underlying Contradiction which have presently been blocking the realization of the vision. Third, they built a set of overall Practical Proposals for dealing effectively with these contradictions. Fourth, they created a set of Tactical Systems through which these proposals could be released. At the Putsan Reconsult which lasted for 1 day, the participants reviewed the Underlying Contradictions chart created at the initial Consult of May 1982; and created a list of proposals to deal with the remaining contradictions. From this a Tactical Systems chart, by which these proposals would be realized, was formed. The final event was the assembly. From each of the 5 barangays 10 representatives attended this 2 day event. Here the Tactical Systems for each of the 5 barangays involved was reviewed and from this a 2 year calendar of events was cleared, through which the Actuating Programs could be realized. The final session dealt with the major to be initiated over the following 3 months. Detailed tactics and events were compiled in the 3 months Actuating Programs calendar. During these Consults the residents and consultants involved themselves in working in teams, interviewing residents, investigating resources along with creating their own song, story and symbol for their respective barangays. The intent of the Consultation was, by using a set of social methods, to enable the people of the barangays to accelerate and expand self help projects in each of the communities involved.

DOCUMENT

This Document, being the tangible result of the Consultation, is intended as a highly practical tool. It contains the hopes and dreams, along with the practical intent to reshape and develop their communities and represents a symbol of the participation of the barangay people in the practical decision making of the future. This document will also be used for training in the principles and methods of comprehensive community development.

CALE

STORY OF CALE

Historically, the present Barangay of Cale was a part of Cararayan, another barangay of Tiwi. It is situated near the foot of the Mount Malinao. The residents of Cararayan were in need of water for irrigation, most of them being farmers. They dug an irrigation canal from the river which flows from the mountain. Five families constructed their houses along the near canal. As the number of houses multiply, it became a small sitio and the people named it Cale, meaning Canal.

The Canal however was used mainly by the residents of Cararayan, only a small part of Cale was used for rice fields and most of land was covered with abaca. Abaca at that time was the main source of livelihood. The men were engaged in stripping abaca (parahagot) while the woman weaved this abaca into sinamay, and the dry stalks were turned into bags and basket.

People from the nearby towns and barangays purchased their abaca needs from Cale, so the barangay progressed. Cafeterias and stores engaged in buying and selling abaca were put, amidst this cluster of stores a Mercado (Market) was established.

In the early 1970's the first Geothermal site was dug, and a salt making pilot plant was established. The National Power Corporation purchased part of the land planted with abaca and were turned into Geothermal Plants.

At present the Barangay is part of the National Geothermal Reservations and any moment now the whole barangay will be relocated.

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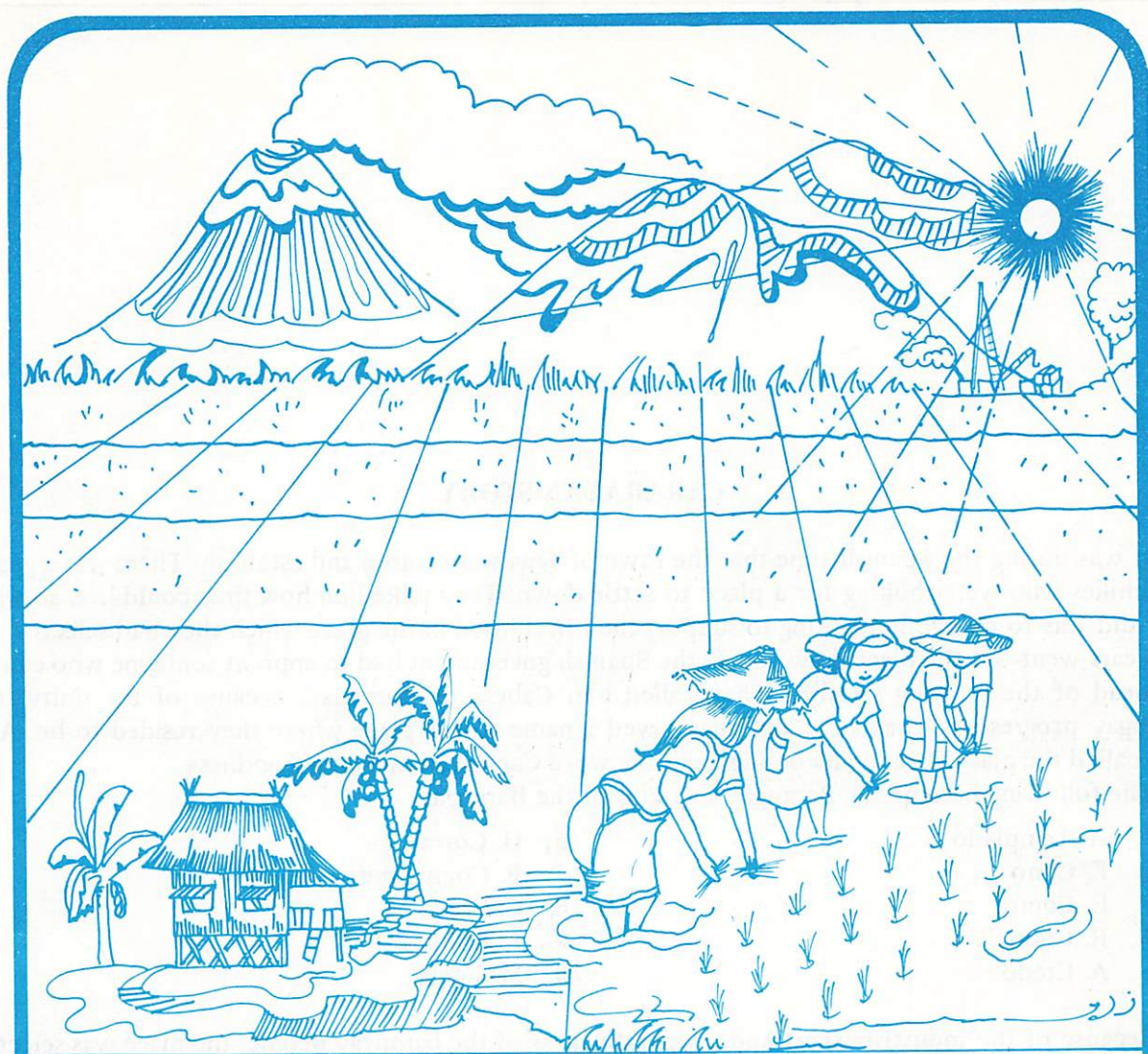

It was during the Spanish time that the town of Tiwi was created and establish. There was a group of families who were looking for a place to settle down. They talked on how they could live, so what they did was to engage in planting to support their livelihood in the place which they had selected. As the years went by, the place grew and so the Spanish government had to appoint someone who can be the head of the growing families. They called him Cabesa de Barangay, because of the unity, the Barangay progressed. Then later on, they gaved a name to the place where they resided to be. And they called the place Cararayan coming from the word Cararayan meaning Goodness.

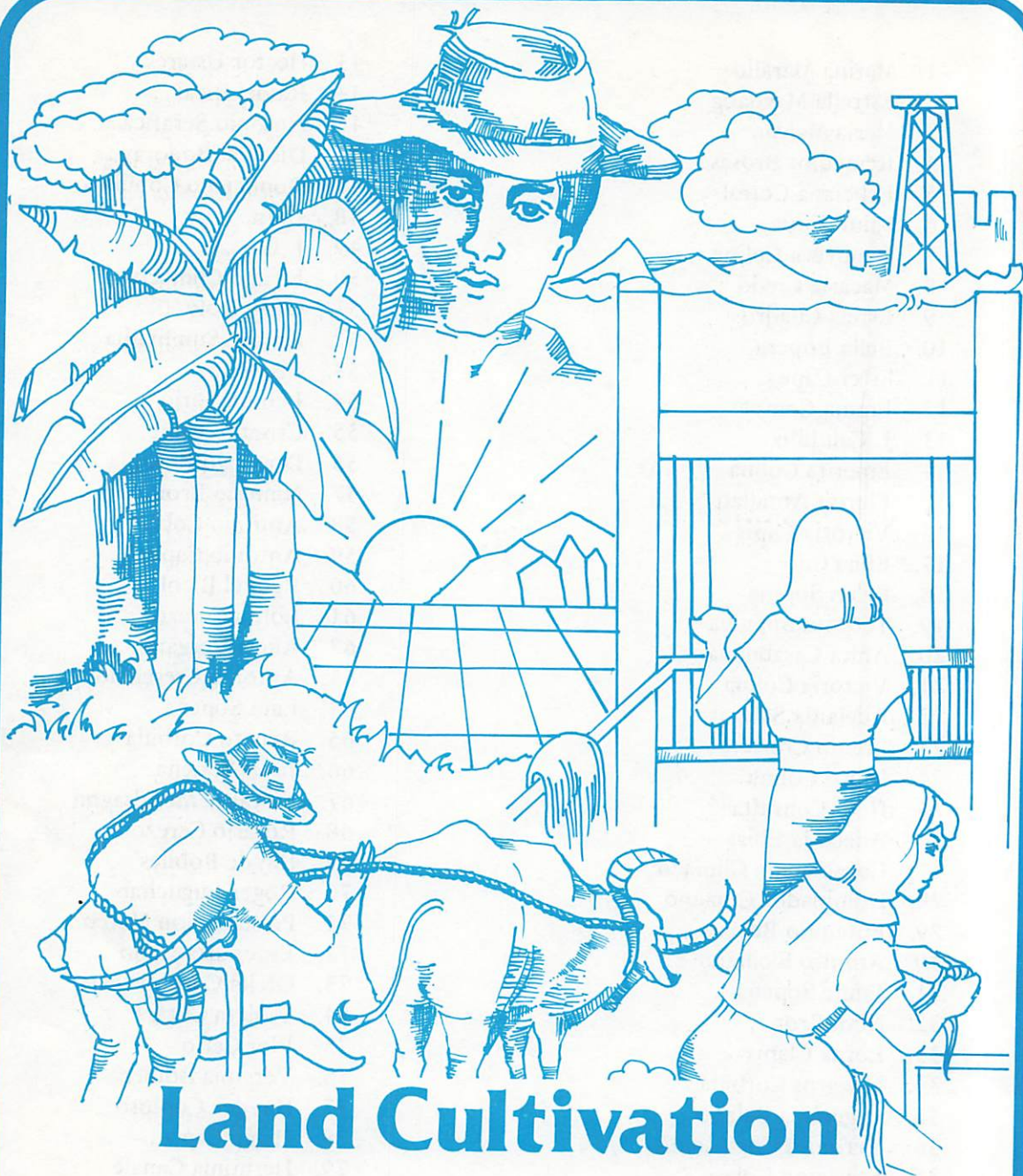

It was many years ago since time immemorial, this place does not have any name. Then came the Spaniards and they wanted to know the name of this place. Nothing has been said by the people since they did not understand the question. To the surprise of the one asked was the name Naga hoping that what he asked was the name of the trees which were present and abundant in this place.

In the year 1970, the people experienced a disastrous heavy typhoon "Sining". Many of the houses, ricefields and other plants were destroyed. Starvation and poverty arose. Then came the implementation of the Masagana 99 program, they also built a concrete chapel for the first time.

Naga had electrification when the Geothermal Power Plant functioned, in which this was a great help among the people. Due to the extreme temperature of the earth surface the Naglagbong erupted in the year 1980, where the residents relocated themselves.

Presently, sitio of "Santo Cristo" known as one of the official sitios of the barangay. There were a construction of the barangay pavement to hold the activities. The Human Development Training School had a consult in this barangay. Because of the creativity shown by residents, they have formed a dream of progress and development of having a

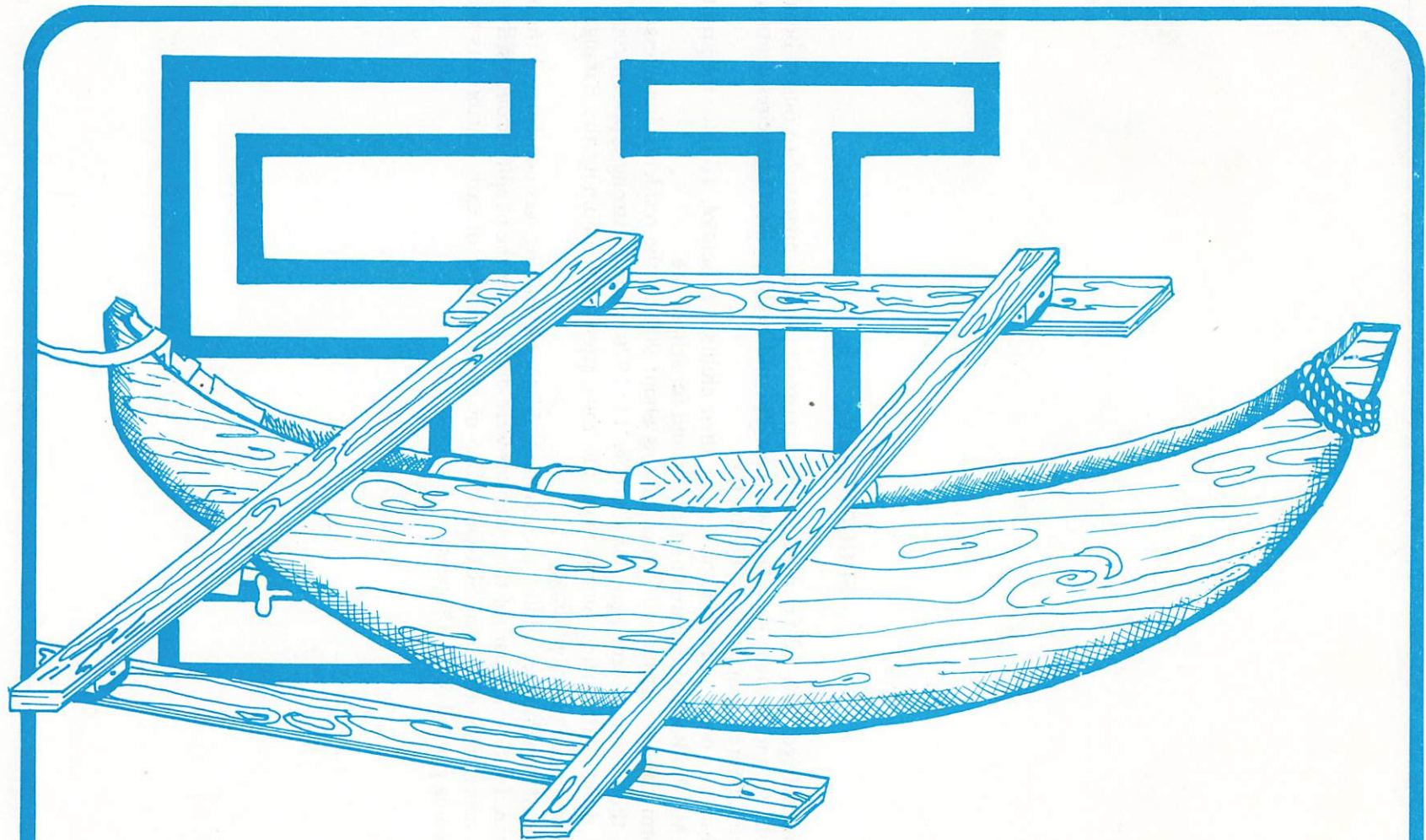

SUGOD STORY

Barangay Sugod started with 12 families. As years passed by many migrated to Sugod because of the abundance of fish and because the place was peaceful and healthy. Most of the residents were fisherman. Some people were engage in Crop Production.

In 1935 the residents meet a problem of sending their children to school. To solve the problem the people met and Mr. Pio Bosquit donated part of his land for school site.

In 1952 a storm typhoon struck the place causing about 90% of the residents; homeless. Thus they reconstructed their homes. And again on October 13, 1970, another strong typhoon rock the place causing land slides and cutting Sugod from the town previously adjoining the Barangay; It totally destroyed homes and Public buildings.

The people joined hands in rebuilding their homes. A school building was constructed through the RP-US Bayaniban, from which part of the materials were donated by the people through self-help.

Sugod got its name from the term SUGOD (Sting of bees) because of early inhabitants found this place to be breeding ground of BEES (bees).

PUTSAN

PUTSAN STORY

Putsan is a barangay in the town of Tiwi in the Province of Albay. It is located in the northeast section of Tiwi and is separated from the rest of the town (it was once an Island). There is a volcano on the filled the small gap separating Putsan from the land. Now Tiwi and the island are connected. At one time, the people used this as a passageway to go to other barangays, yet no one stopped to settle in what was then called Putusan, which means passage way. Much later one family decided to stop and live here. They cleared the land and built their houses. Their sources of livelihood were farming and fishing. When they started digging the land they discovered that there were three type of soil to which they give the names Pula, Baran and Itim. They collected samples so each and mixed them together and also added water, they found out that the result was a thick, sticky mixture. They experimented working with this mixture and discovered they could make clay pots and lot of others specially designed utensils. They called these products "Koron." Through the years all of their descendents have inherited and developed the skills necessary for making pottery. These products are sold throughout the Philippines by way of Bangka (boats).

In 1890 the population of Putusan was growing. They united and formed a community which they continue to call Putusan. The people elected a barangay captain and officials. Then the Americans came and won over the Spaniards in 1896. That year an American came to Putusan by boat and asked where he was. Unluckily, he couldn't pronounced the name. The closest he could manage was Putsan. From that time on the village has been called Putsan. The population continue growing and everyone engaged in the making of clay pots.

When the Japanese envaded the Philippines the Villagers had to stop making the pots because they could not get clay. Everyone became poorer and poorer. After the Japanese surrendered to the Americans, the people started to make pots again, but they had a difficult time finding a market for their products.

In 1976, through Aleco, the electricity wires were built in the village. A few years later the NPC built their housing projects in the village. This Modernized the barangay a little. The population had now reached 2,229 people. In 1978, the Albay Provincial Jamborette was held here in Putsan.

People of Putsan make their living mostly from pots making, fishing and rice farming. These are times of change. As we move toward the 21st century who knows what may happen in Putsan.
