OUR STORY

PAST

Cedar Bluff's heritage goes back to the land and the people. The land lies along the banks of Line Croek, which was a dividing line between two Indian tribes. The land was given to the Indians by the US government in the Dancing Rebhit Creek Treaty. After this time an Indian chief sold the land to white settlers and the people came to farm the land and cut timber. The railroad came in 1890 and gave a means of transportation.

At first it was more or less a self-contained community with a school going through grade 12. It had about 14 businesses, doctors, a railroad denot, etc. With the paving of the highway in 1950, jobs opportunities have opened up for the citizens in nearby towns.

PRESENT

Cedar Bluff is making progress, not by the leavs and bounds as we would like, but with steadfastness and enthusiasm. We are proud of our new community water system. We have worked hard and long. It took nine years to finally achieve a clear and abundant water supply. Our churches are growing stronger each year and working together to fulfill the Lord's a feeling of strenght and unity. A new post office has created into the future. Farmers have continued as they have for many years but with perseverance and updated methods. Although we continue to survive and grow effectively.

THE CHALLENGES

In the arena of Roads, the following blocks exist:

2, consideration of potential loss of revenue to another county.

3. county district lines

This indicates that the challenge facing us is briming BRINGING COMMUNITY PRESSURE OF RIGHT STRUCTUPES,

Examples of arena are 1) two sides of square need to be paved 2) road to Starkville unpayed.

In the arena of Community Center, the following blocks exist:

This indicates that the challenge facing us is FORMING A COMMUNITY CLUB.

2) restroom in center needs fixing, 3) tenris court is cany

In the arena of Growing Community the following blocks exist:

l. no funds

2. pror education

3. distance form from jobs and shops This indicates that the challenge facing us is creating awareness of potential this community has if we'd pull together, Examples: no stores or businesses, need sub-division for growth, county hospital equipment outdated.

In the arena of Upgraded Education, the following blocks exist:

1. 2 county school system
2. federal interference(school not representative with population)

3. lowest class teachers due to low pay

4. unresponsive adminstration

This indicates that the challenge facing us is discerning what citizens can do to upgrade school system

Examples: low ACT scores, whites in private schools to maintain standards.
