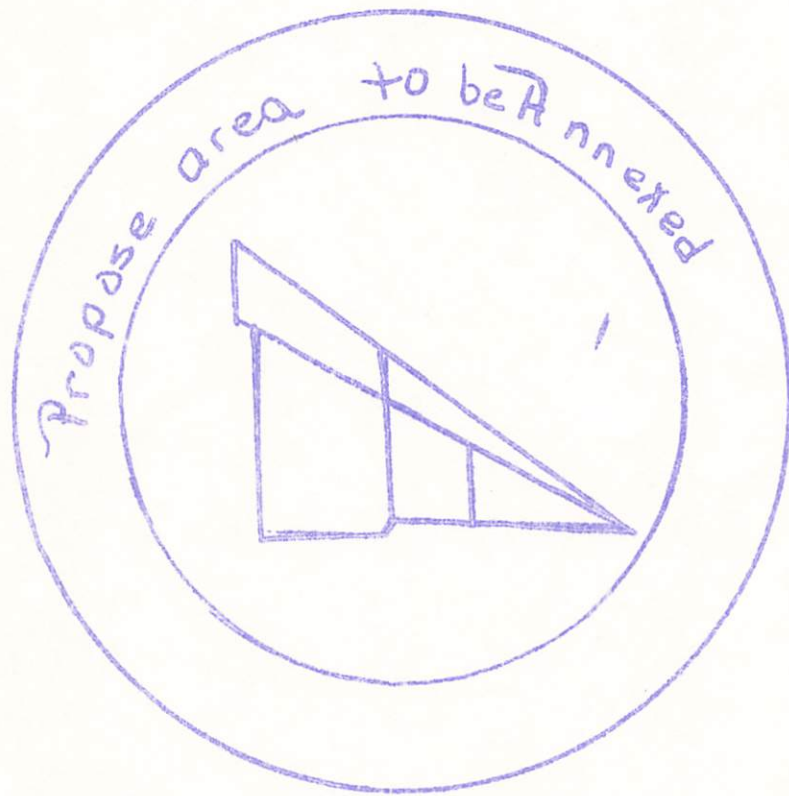

DELTA PACE TOWN MEETING, FEBRUARY 24, 1979

Proposals

We the citizens of Pace, in order to provide a plan for expansion, propose that we have a meeting of people interested in spending time in other towns to share our ideas and learn some of theirs, on Saturday, March 3, 1979, with the Plans For Tomorrow (PFT) at 7p.m. We also propose that the ICA staff be invited to stay and work with us on expansion.

We the citizens of Pace, in order to strengthen ourselves and do a better job the next 2 years, propose to hold a consult May 28-June 1 in the evenings by:

1. Securing the cafeteria for large meetings and town hall(s) and preschool for small meetings
2. Sending notices through children and do personal visits
3. Getting volunteers from each stake to do the personal visits
4. Making up registration forms and flyers
5. Getting a committee to plan the format
6. Invite all ICA staff to attend our consult.

We the citizens of Pace, in order to beautify the town, propose to have workdays every Saturday. This proposal will be done by the citizens of this community each Saturday of the month beginning March 3, 1979 at 8a.m. by:

1. clearing the ditches, lawns
2. fixing signs
3. making the commercial building safe
4. controlling pests
5. cleaning up specific sites
6. fixing the town dump truck
7. repairing the health center
8. utilizing the help of the community and volunteers.

We the citizens of Pace, in order to provide adequate law enforcement, propose to provide a daily caretaker for the laundromat, establish a curfew for youth under the age of 16, maintain the upkeep of public and private property, notify the Planning Commission of the current status of ordinances and level fines when ordinances are violated. Through the Community Association, Planning Commission, and the Board of Aldermen, by hiring a caretaker for the laundromat, requesting the Board of Aldermen to pass ordinances for youth under the age of 16 and for the upkeep of public and private property, notify the Planning Commission of the current status of the ordinances, and to provide strict law enforcement of ordinances after adoption.

We the citizens of Pace, in order to provide new and improved facilities for the town, propose the following: new bank, service station and the completion of the restaurant. This proposal will be carried out through the Community Association by considering with the Board of Aldermen as early as a date can be set. This will be carried out by forming a committee and deciding on a specific location for service station and specific improvement for the bank and restaurant. The Planning Committee will call a meeting to finalize the specific funding and carrying out of the work.

Proposals (continued)

We the youth of Pace, in order to reorganize the Youth Service Corps and raise money for school trips, propose the following:

1. get an adult sponsor by vocal invitation to interested persons.
2. recruit new members by sending letters of invitation.
3. elect officers.
4. have meetings at members' homes.
5. set specific requirements for membership
6. establish a group identity.
7. publicize meetings by putting up posters and give specific information.
8. sponsor fund-raising activities such as dances, movies, gathering old newspapers to sell, talent shows, etc.
