IN THE AREA OF Inflation the following bock exist: employment, energy, and education of mass of people. This indicates that this underlying contridiction facing us is: if indvididuals are allowed to prepare themseleves with proper education, then this would alleviate the direct cause of underemployment, inflation and the energy situation as a whole. Local illustations of this challenge are: appointment of minorities to public health service; election of more minorities to public office; getting nuclear energy in Mississippi.

IN THE AREA OF Governmental Regulation the following blocks exists: corruption in politics; lack of fair representation in government organization; lack of public and political participation by those affected; inadequate school training of the public. This indicates that they underlying challenge facing us is leadership in terms of government organizations. Local illustrations of this challenge are forced resignation of two Mississippi Cabinet members, and lack of Blacks in Congress and State Offices.

IN THE AREA OF Economic Affairs the following block exists: individual competition, survivial, maintaining standards of living. This indicates that this underlying challenge facing us is: to present or establish an equalized chance of opportunity for everyone towards their desired style or fashion of life. Local illustrations of this challenge are: increase of gas price, increase of food prices, devaluation of the dollar.

IN THE AREA OF Economic Stability the following blocks exist: discriminatory, advance technology, graduation. This indicates that this underlying challenge facing us in the contradiction is advance technology is not related to or taught closely enough before graduation. There is a desire need for knowledge of these things so we as students can be better prepared for the world. Local Illustration of this challenge are: learning about discrimination is not gone into such as physics, calculus, etc.
