People of Knobtown want recreation facility for the young people. Dreams of the people are to get medical care for Knobtown citizens. People getting jobs in Knobtown is one of the greatest dreams of the people of Enobtown. We are looking for a better day.

In the arena of community decision, the following conditions exist; inadequate housing, working towards incorporation, most people satisfied, and a generation gap. This indicated that the underlying contradiction is people need to support and work with leaders.
