LEAKESVILLE STORY

Greene County has developed many and varied vocational and cultural activities. The beginning of industry and recreation started with logging, rafting on the river, sawmills, farming, and boat ferrying with Robert's ferry. Several small schools in the county were developed. Teachers taught from house to house. There was a Post Office, called Betty's Post Office, operated by Mrs. Elizabeth Ball. Mr. Toby Pipkins and Guy Amsler were carriers. The McInni's settled in Leakesville setting up a hotel. His main object and purpose was to make whiskey. He later started rafting logs here at Leakesville and sending them down river to Pascag oula.

In 1932 after the severe depression, the star highway depot built a new bridge across the river. The M & A railroad's primary job was transferring wood and wood products. A "doodle bug" passenger service was also provided via rail, pulpwood, and pine poles. Farming was a primary mean of life until Basil Basila came in the early 50's establishing the Nicoles ready to wear.

We seem to have a lack of leadership and cooperation from elected officials. The people seem to suffer a sence of defeat because of past failure. There needs to be a since of renewed hope for the community in order to accomplish initiative hopes, assistance, throughts for today (not yesterday). We don't need rebelion in the future, but to face the challenges which lie ahead.

The following needs exist in order to improve the communities conditions. Technical Vocational Center for skill training; attractive job opportunities for our youth; availability of jobs to prevent long distance travel; full-time doctor for hospital; renovate public buildings; build a recreation park; build a rail-road in Greene county.

CHALLENGES

CREATING WELL-PAYING JOBS

In the arena of new industry, the fact that lack of industrial facilities indicates that the underlying contradiction is working on building an industrial park and airport. This contradiction is illustrated by insufficient interest in ongoing programs.

COMMUNICATION IN A STRUCTURED MANNER

In the arena of public awareness, the fact that lack of published knowledge of city and county government board of supervisers have no way of informing people adequately indicates that the underlying contradiction is a public demanding to know. This contradiction is illustrated by the fact that people would like to know more.

LACK OF FUNDS

In the arena of lack of funds, the fact that there is not enough industry bringing in money indicates that the underlying contradiction is that we are producers of "raw material" only. This contradiction is illustrated by 95% of Greene county's timber is processed outside Greene county. The same is true for agricultural products.

LEADERSHIP AND FUNDS

In the arena of people who are willing to work, the fact that money to do thing with is unavailable indicates that the underlying contradiction is needing leadership and more funds.

EDUCATION AND WELFARE

In the arena of education and welfare and higher education and vocational education, the fact that there is a need for vocational education for young people to train into higher paying jobs, more funds are needed for education and people need to be more concerned about education indicates that the underlying contradiction is that money is not being spent properly. This contradiction is illustrated by the fact that there is not enough control on the money for schools.

LACK OF LEADERSHIP

In the arena of lack of leadership, the fact that there is a lack of communication indicates that the underlying contradiction is that public officials do not communicate with laymen to see their needs and desires.

YOUTH FECREATION

In the arena of youth recreation, the fact that the young have no recreation, there is dope in the schools, and there is no speed control indicates that the underlying contradiction is a lack of jobs in Leakesville that would allow families to have more time together spent in a common interest.
