Our land was once sparsley inhabited in the midst of majestic pine timber. Way back in 1883 the railroad was completed from New Orleans to Meridian. Four young men from Georgia made their way tothis untouched land. Piatonia, up the road apiece. almost became the site of a town; but due to the stubborness of these four men, their railroad spur at Lumberton became the center of activity. This was the beginning of Lumberton.

Mills cutting the pine timber cause the town to grown. The town was laid out correctly to entcie more families to settle here.

Churches were built, schools were erected.
In 1929 the big mill cut out and the depression began. Many of our folks had to leave our fair city in order to profide mean and bread for their families . Bass pecans gave our town a Class A post office.

In 1942 a gas explosion on Main st. resulted in the loss of life and property. Thegood people had to regroup and rebuild. In 1950's gas wasbrought forth, and oil activities in our

area. New wkweikex blood came to our town.

Hurricane Camille will never be forgotten -- the terror, the

loss of property.

But again, Lumberton people worked side by side to rebuild Today there are new signs about. A new library, and restore. homes, streets improved, and bond issue passed for the new elementar school, improved school system, industries locating here, signs of day care for th aged and small children, improved hospital care, better fire protection -- solidly located plants, such as Turbodyne, Move Stars of Lumberton, Hurt Mfg., Miles Lbr. Co., and thenew feed mill.

Old timess still recall the railroad station and waiting to ride the train; the section houses; the Hines Lumber Comany. Signs of today are waiting in line at First Mississippi National Bank; street lights and houses numbered all over town; and the streets named.

'EmmIoday as I walk down this old Main St., I remember so many good things, that I can say LUMBERTON was made for you and me. In the arena of DAY CARE, the fact that there is funding for a new day care center for up to 33 children but not enough children have signed up for the program, indicates that the challenge facing lumberton is EDUCATING THE CITIZENS ABOUT THE BENEFITS FOR THEM AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE NEW DAY CARE CENTER.

In the arens of community beautification, the fact that lots are overgrown and the town is not as clean as it could be, indicates that the challenge facing lamberton is INVOLVING BOTH THE COMMUNITY AND THE TOWN FO LUMBERTON IN CLEANING UP ALL PARTS OF THE COMMUNITY.

In the arena of pUBLIC WORKS, the fact that there are not fire hydrants in some parts of the community, the hospital needs expansion to accomodate all of the patients, and the sidewalks are bruken, indicates that the challenge facing Lumberton is DEVELOPING AND OVERALL DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR CITY AND THE SURROUNDING COMMUNITY.

In the arena of HOUSING, the fact that some people don't fix broken down houses, in some communities no one knows who is reponsible for the upkeep of the total community housing, and knexa indicates that the challenge facing Lumberton is FINDING INEXPENSIVE AND QUALITY HOUSE REPAIR WORK.

In the arena of RECREATION, the fact that children have nothing to do in the summer, teenagers have no activities, there is not enough cultural activities, there are not enough recreation locations, indicates that the challenge facing Lumberton is FINDING A LEADER TO ORGANIZE RECREATION.

In the arena of senior wkriers xixi citizens, the fact that many elders are invalids and have not one to care for them, that many elders have no wlak ways, that there are not emough senior citizen workers, indicates that the challenge facing lumberton is involveng THE WHOLE COMMUNITY IN CARING FOR SENIOR CITIZENS.

We the citizens of Lumberton, in order to teach selfmaintenance, propose to demonstrate one clean-up job through:

1. self-help

2. help one another fix houses

3. demonstrate improving surrounding area, the i.e., flowers, hedges 4. as for help to get others involved.

We the citizens of Lumberton, in order to help the senior citizens so they can say out of nursing homes, propose to visit senior citizens and find out their needs through:

1. providing transportation

2. fixing sidewalks

3. carrying meals to them.

We the citizens fo Lumberton, in order to make Lumberton a better place to live, propose to involve everyone and get them instructed to get together and work togerther.

We the citizens of Lumberton, in order toget a recreation leader, propose to raise local funds for a salary by:

1. home visits

2. involving youth in selection

3. check potential workers' backgroughed and past records.

We the citizens of Lumberton, in order to educate parents and explain the Day Care Center, propose to kww talk to parents and explain the center through:

1. advertisement,

2. post information

3. announce in church

4. provide cars.
