COMPOUND CONSULT

INTRODUCTION

The Compound Human Development Consultation is the initiation step in a demonstration of comprehensive barangay development. The Consult represents the intention of the residents of Compound to work in the spirit of balikatan in improving the quality of life of their community. This resolve complements one of our national priorities of strengthening the barangays, the smallest political unit, and of training effective local leadership. The focus on total development was reinforced with Presidential Decree No. 1396 affirming the government's policy to "foster the growth and renewal of our communities, both rural and urban, in an integrated manner that promotes optimum land use, adequate shelter, rational inter-dependence amongst self-reliant communities, all towards the fullest development of man as a civic person and as a human being, involving in this process the coordinated contribution of the public and private sectors." It has become clear that the events of history are calling for methods to assume the task of renewing the local community. For this reason, the Compound Human Development Project promises to be of critical importance, not only to its 51 households, but also to the other barangays in the Municipality of Mahayag, Zamboanga del Sur, as well as the communities throughout the Philippines.

COMPOUND BARANGAY

The Consult took place in Compound February 28 - March 5, 1983. In a village meeting a week prior to the Consult, it was decided that one representative from each of the 51 households would be present at all times. There were 30 non-residential consultants. Expertise represented by these people covered a broad spectrum of skills and experience including agriculture, livestock, law, accounting, finance, day care, rural health, mid-wifery, business management, education and community development.

THE PARTICIPANTS

During the Consult this diversified group used the following method for comprehensive community reformulation. First, the Consult charted the Operating Vision of the people of Compound. Second, they discerned the Underlying Contradictions which were blocking the realization of the vision. Third, they built a set of overall Practical Proposals for dealing with the contradictions effectively. Fourth, they created a set of Tactical Systems by which the proposals could be realized. The time of the Consultants was divided between in which team reports were formed into the corporate product of

the Consult. The aim of the Consult was to assist the residents of Compound in accelerating the expansion of the project and empowering its impact upon the village.

**CONSULT
DOCUMENT**

This Consult Document is the tangible product of the Consult. It is intended to be a highly practical tool. It summarizes the results of research which involved representatives of each household of the community. As such, the document symbolizes the residents' decision to participate in practical decision-making about the future of their community and thereby serves to call forth incentive needed for project actuation. The document will also function as an educational tool for rapidly training local leaders in the principles and methods of comprehensive community reformulation.

ICA

The Institute of Cultural Affairs is an intra-global research, training and demonstration group concerned with the human factor in world development and has offices in 30 nations. The ICA is convinced that effective human development must be initiated at the local level and is, therefore engaged in planning and implementing community development projects. ICA's aim is to develop methods through which a local community can become economically self-sufficient, socially self-sustaining and spiritually, self-motivating. The Institutes' programmes around the world are supported by grants, gifts and contributions from government departments and agencies at the national, regional and local levels and from private foundations, corporations trusts and concerned individuals.

**PROJECT
ORIGIN**

The Institute of Cultural Affairs: Manila, Inc. is incorporated in the Republic of the Philippines as a not-for-profit corporation. In 1976, a Human Development Project was launched in Sudtonggan, Lapa Lapu City, Mactan Island, Cebu, at the invitation of the residents of the community, the mayor and concerned citizens of the municipality. The success of this pilot demonstration prompted ICA to expand the Sudtonggan experiment to 23 more communities on Mactan Island and to five remote rural communities in the Tolomo District, Davao City. The ICA has a coordinating office in Manila, a Training Center in Sudtonggan and project residences in Davao City and Albay Province.

ANG KASAYSAYAN SA BARANGAY COMPOUND

Niadtong tuig 1942 may mga Amerikano nga ning sulod sa among dapit. Usa niini si Captain Thomas. Sila naghimo ug kampo, usa ka balay nga presohanang - tambalanan nga ilang ginganlan ug Compound.

Ang Compound usa ka sityo sa Barangay Panagaan, nga nahisakop sa lungsod sa Mahayag sa Probinsya sa Zamboanga del Sur. Sa wala pa moabot ang mga Amerikano ang unang nag-ukopar ning dapita mao ang mga Suban-on. Ug niining panahona may pipila ka mga kristyanos nga ning sulod sa maong dapit. Sila mao si Marcos Baguio, Tomas Nuneza ug Nicasio Dagooc. Hangtod nga daghan ang misulod sa pagpuyo tungod kay ang mga Suban-on naghinayhinay man sa pagpamahawa. Ang ilang kabuhian mao ang pagpananom sa mais ug humay ug ingon man usab sa pagpangayam sa baboy ihalas. Wala silay mga proyekto nga gipalusak tungod kay wala man silay nahibaloan. Ang balatian sa lumulopyo ning dapita kasagaran takig tungod kay daghan pa man ang mga dagkong kahoy.

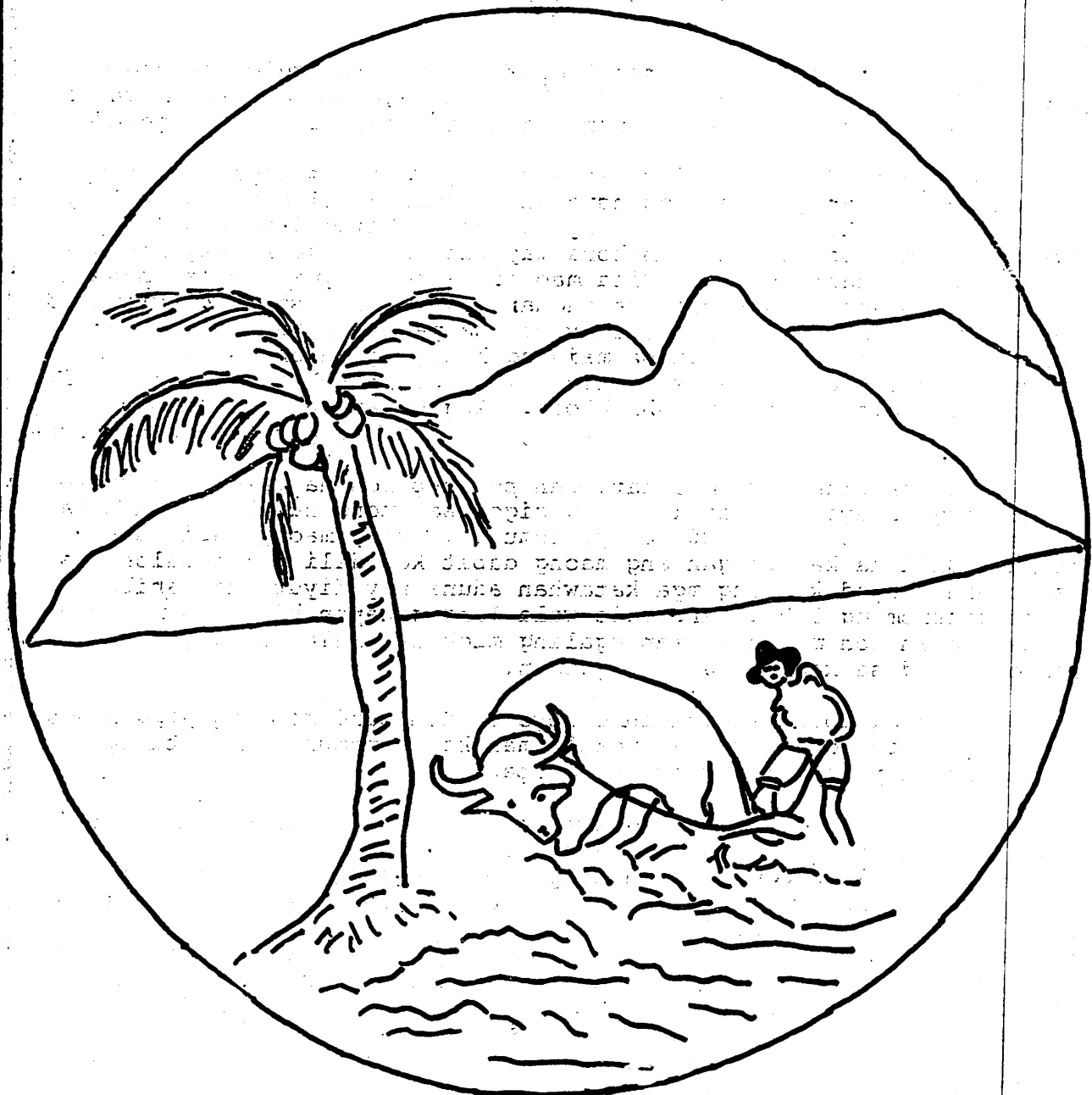
Sa pagpanglabay sa mga katuigan pulos-pulos na gayod mga kristyanos ang namuyo ning dapita. Ug sigon sa among nahibaloan mikabat sa kenyentos ngadto sa 600 ka mga lumulopyo ning maong dapit sa Compound. Dili na kalasangan ang maong dapit kon dili pulos-pulos mga kalubihan tungod kay ang mga katawhan aduna nay diyutayng kahibalo sa pagpananom ug lubi. Ang mais wala lang gihapon biyai sa mga katawhan, apan kon magpugas man ugaling magkinahanglan na gayod ug abono tungod sa kaumaw na sa kayutaan.

Ang panginabuhi sa mga lumolopyo sa Compound mao ang pagpanguma mangariyada sa kopras ug binangkal, manaka ug mamunot ug lubi ug ingon man sa pagpamuhi ug mga kahayupan.

Sa Hulyo 1, 1982 maoy pagdawat sa kalig-onan nga gikan sa municipal nga ang compound mahimo na nga usa ka barangay diin si Mr. Marcos Lingatong ang nagdumala isip usa ka barangay kapitan. Sa unang mga panahon walay maayo nga karsada pulos libaongon ang kadalanan ug karon maayo na ang dalan gani aduna nay pipila ka mga balay nga nagpasuga sa dagitabnon. Wala pa gayo'y mga kalihokan nga nahimo dinhi sa barangay compound sama pananglit sa seminar gawas sa pagsulod sa mga ICA nga adunay Compound Human Development Consult nga nagahatag ug mga pamaagi o usa ka plano diin ang tibuok balangay gayod ang moplano kon unsa ang mga panginahanglan sa balangay. Ug kinsay nasayod nga ang mga umaabot nga mga katuigan nga aduna nay mga malantaw dili lamang sa taga balangay sa Compound kon dili hasta na usab sa mga taga laing lugar.
