- . . . 5TH CITY VOICE now being published twice per month.
- . . . 5TH CITY SHOPPING CENTER ADS published weekly earned revenue covers the cost of the bi-weekly voice.
- . . DEVELOPMENT TRIP TO WEBSTER CITY, IOWA to develop funds for sending Lela Mosley to Maliwada, India for the Social Demonstration Consult which begins on December 27, 1975. She will be sent out on Christmas Day, December 25.
- . . . TOWN MEETING scheduled for Saturday, November 29, 1975, at 10 S. Kedzie.
- . . TOM WASHINGTON HALL walls painted and ceiling tiled now ready to be rented on a regular basis for community events.
- . . . COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING CELEBRATION planned for Sunday, November 23. The program was planned and several people worked on inkind. To date we have received one turkey, gizzards, livers, and two grocery lists will be picked up today. Approximately 300 will be in attendance.
- . . . 5TH CITY DIRECTORY put together by the community development task team this week to be used for stake calling.
- . . INFANT CARE CENTER INKIND 90% of the materials and labor have been inkind. Some of the items are as follows: vents, firedoors, tile, paint, shelves, plaster, pipes, sinks, playschool toys, cribs, lumber, curtain material, and window shades.
- . . SEVERAL SITE VISITS four foundations from the Donor's Forum visited 5th City-all were very excited and future gifts from all four look very promising; the Signod Foundation, Walter Heller Corporation, and McDonald's Corporation were on site visits as well as students from the Urban Life Center.
- . . . SHOPPING CENTER BANKER'S LUNCHEON Friday, November 21 about 20 people will celebrate the final closing of the Shopping Center.
- . .. , CURRENCY EXCHANGE final papers drawn up and decision to open the Currency Exchange around the first of the year.
- . . ACADEMY WORLD DAY hosted nearly 100 people from the Global Movement Academy. R.Lee McMullen gave the opening welcome and context; R. Lee McMullen, Ella Beasley, Jean Mack, Leona Morris, and Wanda Lee lead the group in five tours around 5th City; Peggy Davis led a question-answer session and Lela Mosley talked about Social Demonstration and invited the Academy to financially participate in that activity.
- . . STAKE CALLING plan to cover all stakes before the Social Demonstration Consult in 5th City in April, 1976.
- . . . 5TH CITY AUDIT all field work done report will be bak to 5th City by the end of the month. This will be a very important development tool over the next year.
