

#15 THE MAJURO CONSULT

THE MAJURO CONSULT 1. Economic and vocational development for the future of the Marshall Islands will be the focus of a team of experts during a week of consultation with Marshallese leaders and businessmen on the Majuro Atoll beginning September 9th.

THE INCLUSIVE INTENT

2.Consult participants will consider issues dealing with the total life of the Marshall Islands people and make proposals for the development of resources, upgrading of manpower, and long-range growth in productive capacity and world trade. The proposals will spell out steps both for local implementation and for follow-up through the global team toward the acquisition of development capital and the application of technical know-how and training. The principal concern of the consult is to acknowledge the actual dependence of these islands upon the world economy and to determine their given and potential ability to become self-supporting and to make a significant contribution to the world resources. consult team will include expertise ranging from oceanography to banking, agriculture and environmental health, encompassing the paramount issues in the development of an ocean community. Through the engagement of global expertise with local representatives, the consult will focus global care on Majuro and enable the Marshallese people to discover their unique role as full participants in modern global society. Finally, the team will evaluate the consult itself as a part of the continuing development of this tool for use in any community or area of the globe.

3. The Marshall Islands lie at the center of the Pacific within a million-square-mile ocean area which presently constitutes the eastern-most district of the U.S. Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. Majuro is the District Center with an urban population of 10,000. The rest of the 30,000 Micronesian population is scattered over 20 inhabited places among the 34 coral atolls and islands of the Marshalls group. The U.S. administration, established under a United Nations trusteeship following World War II, is the latest of four periods of dependent

status stretching back over several hundred years, including the Japanese mandate after World War I and an earlier German economic administration, to the earliest period of Spanish exploration in the western Pacific. Now, with the ending of the American administration in accordance with the intent of the trusteeship and an emerging capacity for self government, the Marshallese are facing independent status in some form. This prospect gives rise to the concern for developing an economic substance and a role consistent with any such new status. The local consultation is sponsored by the United Church of Christ in the Marshall Islands, in cooperation with the Kwajalein Import and Trading Company. KITCO, a publicly-owned Micronesian corporation serving the Marshall Islands, has invited the 20 member team from among experts on the Board of Consultants and staff of the Institute of Cultural Affairs, a Chicago-based social research agency. Staff of the Institute have been doing consultation with several business and education institutions on Majuro for several years.

THE PARAMOUNT ISSUES

4. The gathering of a team of experts is a response to the complex variety of issues which must be considered in preparing effective proposals for the future development of a community. The team will consider these paramount arenas of issues: claiming the local and global resources for the development of the Marshall Islands; increasing the productive capacity of the ocean, land, and people; expanding the context and focus of education and enabling local structures to implement such programs. The ocean's resources remain untapped, yet are the greatest economic potential for an ocean people. Agricultural and industrial production are unorganized and untooled, barring the possibility for self-sustaining food production and leaving the labor pool unemployed. Vocational training, articulation of the Marshallese heritage in the context of the 20th century, and the doubling of basic educational facilities are needed. Through a field-visit dynamic, the consultation team will talk with leadership and businessmen in both formal and informal meetings, conferences and gatherings. Thus, the consult will blend specialized experience, a synthesis of perspectives, and a comprehensive overview with the practical wisdom of local man. In this engagement will be created the effective proposals for the development of the Marshall Islands.

THE REPLICATION MODEL 5. Following the consult on Majuro, the team will do an Intensive evaluation. The evaluation of that experience will be a crucial part of the team's work in order to refine the methods and produce a Consult Manual. The Consult is a replicable model, which can be used wherever local leadership requires the service of global expertise in meeting future needs. Therefore, the Majuro Consult concerns not only the Marshall Islands, it concerns every local community around the globe.

TEAM:

1. The Majuro Consult is the forerunner of a series of consults that will utilize experts drawn from among the Guardians, Lens grads, and others. There have been gathered the names and occupational data of 250 such experts and from this pool will be selected a team for this Consult based on the paramount issues existing in the Marshall Islands. Out of this particular project comes the possibility for the development of a global network of consultants and therefore the pool from which future teams will be selected will continue to be expanded both in size and scope.

TRAVEL:

The overall arrangements have been initiated for the travel of the team across the Pacific to Majuro for a week-long consultation with local businessmen and community leaders. This involved a detailed investigation of transportation, lodging and conference facilities in Honolulu and Majuro, and the recommendations for specific airlines and flight schedules. A Travel Time Design was then created based on these recommendations. In addition a pre-consult 8 week Implementary Time Line was built for use by both the Centrum Task Force assigned to this Project and the staff on Majuro. Also from the investigations initial cost estimates were determined.

CONSULT:

Caring for the needs of the team and enabling them as they engage in the critical day-to-day work of the Consult will be the responsibility of the staff on Majuro. This will involve the arranging of appointments and meetings, housing, meals, and transportation as well as designing daily battleplanning and evaluation sessions. A recommended time line for implementing these responsibilities has been drawn un. The Centrum Task Force will be responsible for enabling the team during its travel to and from Majuro and at the preliminary briefing and evaluation sessions in Honolulu before and after the The implications of this initial Project include Consult. the development of an effective procedure and format that could be reduplicated anywhere thereby resulting in the creation of a care structure for any community across the globe.

INTRO-DUCTION While the task of reduplicating the Majuro consult begins in other parts of the globe, the people of the Marshallese Islands, due to the catalysis of economic resources and heritage awareness, continue to be a sign to the rest of the world.

CREATING REDUPLI-CABLE CONSULT On behalf of the Majuro consult a global consultation manual was established, incorporating the pioneer demonstration in the Marshall Islands, and preparing the way (by adopting battleplanning methods) for signal future village projects. We stress the importance of this demonstration consult as a pioneer, which will give an impetus to other demonstrations around the globe. The consultation manual will be a vital tool not only for reference on Majuro, but for the rest of the globe. Not only can we catalyze a Marshall Islands village project; but by adopting the battleplanning methods we can also create expertise for the research at hand.

CATALYZING ECONOMIC DEVELOP-MENT We see continuing exploration of the ocean resources, further employment of industrial technology and an expansion of the possibilities of the land. Crucial to the economic development of the Marshall Islands is an expansion of images, including one million square miles of water as the Marshall Island region, thereby releasing creativity for marine exploration, tourism, farming and industry. The Marshallese must decide what to do with these before the rest of the globe decides for them.

EXPLODING HERITAGE AWARENESS We see an explosion in awareness of Marshallese history in the near future, by recovering, through cultural education, the past images of the Marshall Islands, and by developing pride in what will soon emerge as the first ocean nation. To recover the images from Marshallese history, it is necessary to initiate a cultural education course, including new myths about the peoples as well as the old heritage, in order to develop pride in this island country. The Marshall Islands will create history by becoming the first country with the ocean as its focal point, instead of land.

INITIATING GLOBAL SERVANT FORCE The Majuro consult's concrete manifestation of global care will come in the initiation of the Pacific section of the guild network, and in the catalisis of the global servant forces — both Marshallese and guardians. Global care is exemplified by the availability of experts for consults, and the fact that we can mobilize this movemental expertise for inclusion in any situation. We are charged with the beginning of the guild network for local and global visibility in the Pacific Ocean. We must release the passion of the Marshallese in order to include them in the global servant force of the future.

CONCLUSION

From this consultation will come, not only the practical battleplanning for the Marshall Islands, but the realization on the part of the Marshallese that they can care for their islands, and that others care for them. These plans are to encourage, and to initiate the start of a trend towards a more human life-style in the Pacific, and to present an indicative to the rest of the world.


