Roxana Harper peacefully completed her life on Wednesday, October 28, 2020, at her residence. Her three children were with her at home.

Roxana was born in 1935 to Wilbur and Corinne (Milne) Markham in Connecticut, and was a graduate of Syracuse University. She was happily married to Gordon, her husband of 56 years. Roxana and Gordon were members of the Institute of Cultural Affairs (ICA) for over 40 years, working with a grassroots approach to empower communities to achieve their goals. They lived in multiple cities in the States, as well as in villages and cities in India, Singapore, Malaysia, and Taiwan. After she and Gordon moved to Seattle in 1996, Roxana worked for Plymouth Congregational Church for several years.

Roxana loved to attend the theatre, read a good mystery novel, and travel to new places. She greatly enjoyed the camaraderie of the Group Health Cooperative Enhance Fitness Class, OWLs, and the ICA "Lunch Bunch." As a long-time member of Seattle First Baptist Church, Roxana loved the fellowship and community in worship. Both she and Gordon were stanch civil rights supporters who acted on their beliefs that with love and understanding the world can be a better place.

Roxana is preceded in death by her parents and husband. She is survived by her brother: William Markham (Beverly - Lincoln, NE), nephew David (Gilbert, AZ), niece Sara Friest (Jacob - Lincoln, NE), four grandnephews & -nieces: Ethan, Oliver, Lyla, August; her three children: Geoffrey (Kayla—Rogers, MN), Stuart (Christine—Danville, KY), and Elena (Seattle, WA), as well as eight grandchildren: Brittany, Reuben, Benjamin, Tania, Gabriel, Alexander, Lily, and Simon.


