EDUCATION GUILD REPORT  
September 30, 1969 Presidium

COMMUNITY PRESCHOOLING INSTITUTE

Accomplishments:

1. 185 children enrolled in all schools
2. All children and teachers in uniform by October 9th
3. The parents meeting had 35 in attendance and decided to have a Preschool Open House on October 18, 1969
4. CEP workers (Project 5) study every day from 1-2 p.m.
5. 4 community teachers in Child Development class at Malcolm X College

Contradictions:

1. More volunteers as classroom aides, trip guides and who have special skills (carpentry, sewing and art work.)
2. Parents to attend parents meeting which is the Education Board of the Preschooling Institute
3. More modern equipment such as tape recorders large toys, educational games, television sets, etc.

Recommendations:

1. 100 parents in attendance at parent's meeting
2. Parent's fund raising activity for Preschool equipment
3. Teachers attend one Preschool seminar out of the city
4. All children dress in uniforms every day
5. Schools teach the parents the curriculum
6. Salaries for 4 more community teachers



ECONOMIC GUILD REPORT  
September 30, 1969 Presidium

INCOME RESOURCES BUREAU - Employment Outpost

Accomplishments:

1. Employment outpost in full operation
2. Civil Services examination announcements on hand.
3. 8 factories and 3 employment agencies now accepting employees from us
4. 22 applications for employment - 14 were hired.
5. Openings now in factories, offices, railroads.

Contradictions:

1. Not enough trained people

Recommendation:

1. Full-time person in employment

INCOME RESOURCES BUREAU - 5th City Development

Accomplishments:

1. 5 full-time staff
2. Office system devised and functioning
3. 40 contacts with corporations or foundations
4. 23 proposals sent out

Contradictions:

1. Long-range planning on calling and calling teams

Recommendations:

1. Timeline for covering local and national firms and contacting government agencies
2. Calling packet of materials

5TH CITY REDEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Accomplishments:

1. Receipt of the commitment from F.H.A. for the insurance of the 1st rehabilitation package of 102 units.
2. Approval of 42 of the 95 residential units in the 1st package for FHA rent supplementation.
3. Submission of the 2nd package of 95 units to FHA.

Contradictions:

1. FCCRC has yet to establish good workable relations with other community organizations.
2. FCCRC has yet to hire a bondable black contractor for the 1st package
3. Difficulty securing financing at FHA interest rate.



Recommendations:

1. 10 private owners houses be submitted to FHA for rehabilitation
2. 2 small new houses be constructed in 5th City
3. Construction started Nov. 1st on the first rehab. package.
4. Construction on the 1st package using local employees and sub-contractors.

CONSUMER SERVICES ASSOCIATION -- Fifth City Federal Credit Union

Accomplishments:

1. Total amount on deposit - \$1800.00
2. Total membership - 53  
New members since 7/1/69 - 9
3. Bonded up to one million dollars
4. Limited loans can now be arranged
5. Credit Union League Meeting attended by 4 people on September 17, 1969

Contradictions:

1. Minimum of \$5,000 for full operations not yet reached
2. Too frequent withdrawals by members

Recommendations:

1. Every 5th Citizen buy at least one share in the Credit Union

NEIGHBORHOOD HEALTH OUTPOST

Accomplishments:

1. Over 2,000 x-rays done to date and tine testing
2. Funding pending - for Family Planning and National Academy of Science Research
3. Home visiting and Recording
4. In process of securing a physician

Contradictions:

1. Lack of community participation in donating blood
2. Lack of full services in the clinic

Recommendation

1. Full services for clinic and affiliation with a hospital
2. Contacts, proposals, and development trips or visits



5th city  
Political Guild

Accomplishemys

1. 5th city got commitment from the 29th ward joint meetings of city Government agencies to work comprehensively on urban maintainance problems.
2. 5th City Miracle workers cleared alleys, streets, and base ments.
3. 5th City Legal Aid clinic operated with an average of 7 to 10 individuals. *Monday night.*
4. 5th City Publishing voice started.
5. Procured sanitation department rakes, shovels & brooms.

Contradictions

1. Not enough room for the voting machines.
2. Rats and roaches continuing problem.

Recommendations

- Neighborhood snow plow & lawn Mower available.
2. Play lots needs to reconditioned.
  3. Abandoned cars need to be removed.
  4. Garbage cans & tops need to be procured for the whole Community.
  5. Begin stakes and Guild Boards.

1. Jet program not started do to lack of facilities.
2. Follow-up on emissary program.

Recommendations -

1. Jet Hanger needs to be leased to 5th City.
2. Set up emissary exchange student program.
3. Set up High School House after School Study Program.
4. Decide on a High School Urban Academy.
