
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

THE ECONOMIC GUILD'S CONTRADICTION IN EACH ARENA IS:

CORPORATE PLANNING	Creating a comprehensive picture that enables the community residents to see themselves being responsible for the planning.
VOLUNTEER ACTION	Providing a model to involve volunteers in any arenas of the guild significantly.
LOCAL CHURCH	Lack of common grounding beyond self-interest and self-preservation.
LEADERSHIP TRAINING	Lack of a common image of leadership training that perpetuates the "I can only do 'X' syndrome."
STAKE PENETRATION	What are the stakes out to do? Lack of an image of practical stake dynamics.
YOUNG ADULTS	Unclarity and lack of a structure to enable their participation in 5th City.
FAMILY SERVICES	Broadening family planning and participation in the community.
RELATIONSHIP TO ESTABLISHMENT	Providing a way for the establishment to operate out of our context in behalf of their interest.

THE EDUCATION GUILD'S CONTRADICTION IN EACH ARENA IS:

CORPORATE PLANNING	No Education Guild self-consciously concerned with the total educational life of 5th City.
VOLUNTEER ACTION	No model for concrete, authentic, on-going action.
LOCAL CHURCH	No design to impact the local church and allow it to deal with its heritage in the context of the 20th Century.
LEADERSHIP TRAINING	No common comprehensive model to embody practical life methods.
STAKE PENETRATION	No definition of the practical role of the stake in relation to education.
YOUNG ADULTS	No relevant educational structures to engage young adults to deal with arenas of education.
FAMILY SERVICES	Not focusing common structural thrusts.
