Robert was a husband, father, brother, and grandfather. He was bound in covenant of marriage for 36 years to Evelyn and was father to Robert Gregory, Stephanie and Kenneth Neal. He was the brother of Pauline, Christine, Aldine and Gloria. He was grandfather to Eric Leon, Maija Monique, Gregory Neal and Evelyn Alene.

Robert was a citizen of the United States, the City of Chicago and finally of the world. He attended elementary school in Atlanta and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School. He attended Clark College in Atlanta where he majored in music.

Robert became a businessman, musician and truck driver. His primary passion was music. He was a drummer and began his career in Atlanta with the Troubadors, Ambassadors and the Clark College Band. He also worked as a promoter of bands and received much of his early business training while working at the Esquire Club for five years, the 34 Club with "Cool Breeze" and finally forming his own band, "The Shropshire Lad and His All Star Combo."

Ever mindful of the uncertainties of a musical career, Robert held many jobs during his lifetime to ensure a regular income for his family. He began as a laborer at International Harvester and the Curtiss Candy Company. He drove a truck for the Great Northern Laundry Company and for the City of Chicago for 15 years while working as a musician at night. He left the City of Chicago to become Assistant Manager of the Club House Lounge and Budland. He operated the New Regent Ballroom and owned and operated the Rat Puck Lounge. When his failing health required him to adopt an easier schedule, he opened and operated "Bob's Newsstand," a general store and snack shop that became a community gathering place, especially for youth.

Robert always had time for his community no matter how busy his schedule. Raised by his parents in the Baptist Church, he was baptized into the Lutheran Church where he served as a member of the Church Council, was a Boy Scout leader and organized social events for the youth. He served as a precinct captain for the City of Chicago and was a charter member of the Rat Pack Social Club.

Robert died as he lived. He lived continually in the midst of a plan for the future. He lived with a passion for the direction and welfare of the youth of his community. He lived his life in radical responsibility and compassion for those in need. His life is complete and will remain forever a part of the eternal mystery who creates and shapes the world.
