## CHALLENGES

- L. In the area of Communications Gap the fact that the Village has no control over utilities, don't know regulations, has no federal grants, and there is a fixed cost if water system maintenance. Also, the cost of clear water due to the lack of a circulating pump.

  This indicates that the contradiction's are between elected officals and individuals which causes lack of funding.

  This is illustrated by misunderstanding on the cost of clear water, also misunderstanding on sewer grant, and lack of interest in community.
- II. In the area of Economics the fact that there are a lack of facilities and need to educatepeople, the lack of funds, and no demand for some services and priviate business people spend long hours.

  This contradiction is illustrated by the village population is to small. This is also shown by the people who go to other cities to trade.
- III. In the area of social health the fact that older peoples interest is difficult with both parents working, lack of interest in park, local businesses hire outside help, indicates that the underlying problem is a lack of interest with nothing to do. This is illustrated by vandalism of park, kids roaming streetsat all hours.
- In the arena of law enforcement and relation to the county, the fact that no enforcement of lecal regulations, no dog tags, people don't want to offend their neighbors, some older people can't take care of their property, parents parents won't deal with their kids, people won't vote or find out who they are voting for or what the issue is. This indicates that the contradiction is that people don't want to get involved or commit themselves due to fear of offending their neighbors or over stepping the many regulations that exist.

  This is illustrated by the people in the county who "Cannot be A peased" go to the Sheriff's office and get turned over to someone else.
