Verse 1 -


I wished I'd lived in times of Upton,

Continued:

We hope more citizens will actively work with our present and future leaders. We envision an improved Marquette Park and a community building in which cultural and recreational activities may be enjoyed. We believe a United Fund approach would be a more efficient method of collecting for worthy causes than the present individual drives. We are convinced that a second access road to the city is of utmost importance. Our dream for Savanna is that we can create not only a "Playground of the Middle West", but a vital American community.

COMMON RESCURCES

In the arena of technological resources the following blocks: the need for collecting more taxes and the need for a larger tax base, indicate the underlying contradiction of a lack of industry with which to raise the bax base. This is illustrated by industry having not expanded here in the past, businesses being hit hard by the Army Depot being in a state of regression as well as adverse railroad activity, and trying to find a place for industrial sites.

UNIFICATION OF OBJECTIVES AND COMMUNICATION

In the arena of the economic the following blocks: a lack of communication, a lack of organization of the United Fund, funds are needed to build a bypass road and annexation of land, indicate the underlying contradiction of organizing community groups to back the annexation of land, the United Fund, and other challenges. This is illustrated by people working here, but having to live elsewhere because they can't find homes here. Industries have to give donations often, rather than give a United Fund at one time, with duplication of services. Traffic is congested because there is only one through road.

ECONOMIC INFORMATION

In the arean of economics the following blocks: the attitudes of the people are negative and poor, and education is needed; indicate the underlying contradiction of a various circle of apathy and lack of information. This is illustrated by the lack of information. This is illustrated by the fact that the United Fund never got off the ground.

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

In the arena of economic commonality, the following blocks: lack of public and private funds, leaders' attitudes affected by community apathy; indicate the underlying contradiction of people not willing to invest in the downtown and in the entire community, and a lack of communication among various groups. This is illustrated by the lack of rental housing, poor attendance at significant functions, and shopping outside Savanna.

POLITICAL CHALLENGES

COMMON CAUSE

In the arena of politics the following blocks: insensitive leadership, uneducated voters, self-centered individuals and groups, low-esteem of political office; indicate the underlying contradiction of a lack of awareness of a common cause. This is illustrated by no individuals or groups applying pressure on behalf of the youth, the library, sidewalks, or housing. The citizens of Savanna can't even name the leaders.

CULTURAL ATTITUDE

In the arena of the cultural the following blocks: a negative attitude, a lack of communication, the lack of communication in city affairs, a lack of leadership, and families changing; indicate the underlying contradiction of people not assuming their responsibility as parents and citizens in the community. Their image has changed. They no longer volunteer to do things when pay is not involved. This is illustrated by actions needed to change the community's image.

CULTURAL RESPONSIBILITY

In the arena of cultural relationships the following blocks: the lack of involvement, indicates the underlying contradiction of being fearful of taking on any responsibility. This is illustrated by the lack of attendance at any moderal event.

COMMUNITY VALUES

In the arena of cultural Affairs the following blocks: fear of involvement, self-satisfaction, and a lack of exchange among some groups; indicate the underlying contradiction of personal values that supercede community values. This is illustrated by not all churches belong to Inter-Church Council, and some Service Clubs are socially oriented rather than actively oriented.

CULTURAL CCMMONALITY

In the arena of cultural commonality the following blocks: apathy, selfishness, laziness, individual iniative; indicate the underlying contradiction of fear of involvement. This is illustrated by a lack of women in leadership roles, on community level and in politics, no Community Center, no centralized organization.

We the citizens of Savanna in order to recruit industry and expand the job market; propose to include City Council member(s) in the Chamber's Industrial Development Committee through recruiting people to do durveys, assemble information to present to industries and find more ways to "Speak for Savanna".

HOUSING INVESTMENT

We the citizens of Savanna, Illinois in order to create better housing propose a "Keep Your Money in Savanna" campaign through advertising, The Chamber of Commerce, agreements with local Suilding and Loan Institution, and return of money invested elsewhere.

SAVANNA COMMUNITY CLUB

We the citizens of Savanna, Illinois in order to overcome apathy and promote citizen involvement propose the formation of a Savanna Community Club through formation of an organizational steering committee from existing Civic groups.
