

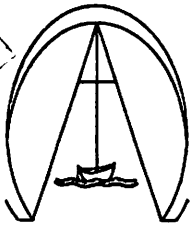

Dear Colleague of the Spirit Movement:

The Winter Presidium - 1968 of the Spirit Movement will convene on Friday, December 13 at 8:30 a.m., and will complete its business by 7 p.m. on Saturday, December 14, 1968. On Thursday there will be common sessions with the order on pedagogy. Continuity with previous Presidium meetings and Councils is desirable whenever possible.

It is recommended that each region send two representatives and as many other persons as they wish. \$120 per person (the first two persons) is needed in advance in order to cover travel pool and costs for room and board. (If you have your reservations in at least ten days in advance, along with indication of the time you can leave for Chicago, we will make plane reservations, write your tickets and send them to you via airmail so that you will not have to purchase them.)

(2) It would be helpful for mailing if each region could bring its exact grid by metros (indicating all zip codes). It is also imperative that you have your exact Winter Calendar (several copies if possible) as well as your intended Spring Calendar.

allow smaller localities the use of the brochure for recruitment. This brochure will not replace a regional calendar but will have a space for address labels.


Finally, the enclosed course cards and teacher availability slips need to be filled out and returned by December 1, 1968.

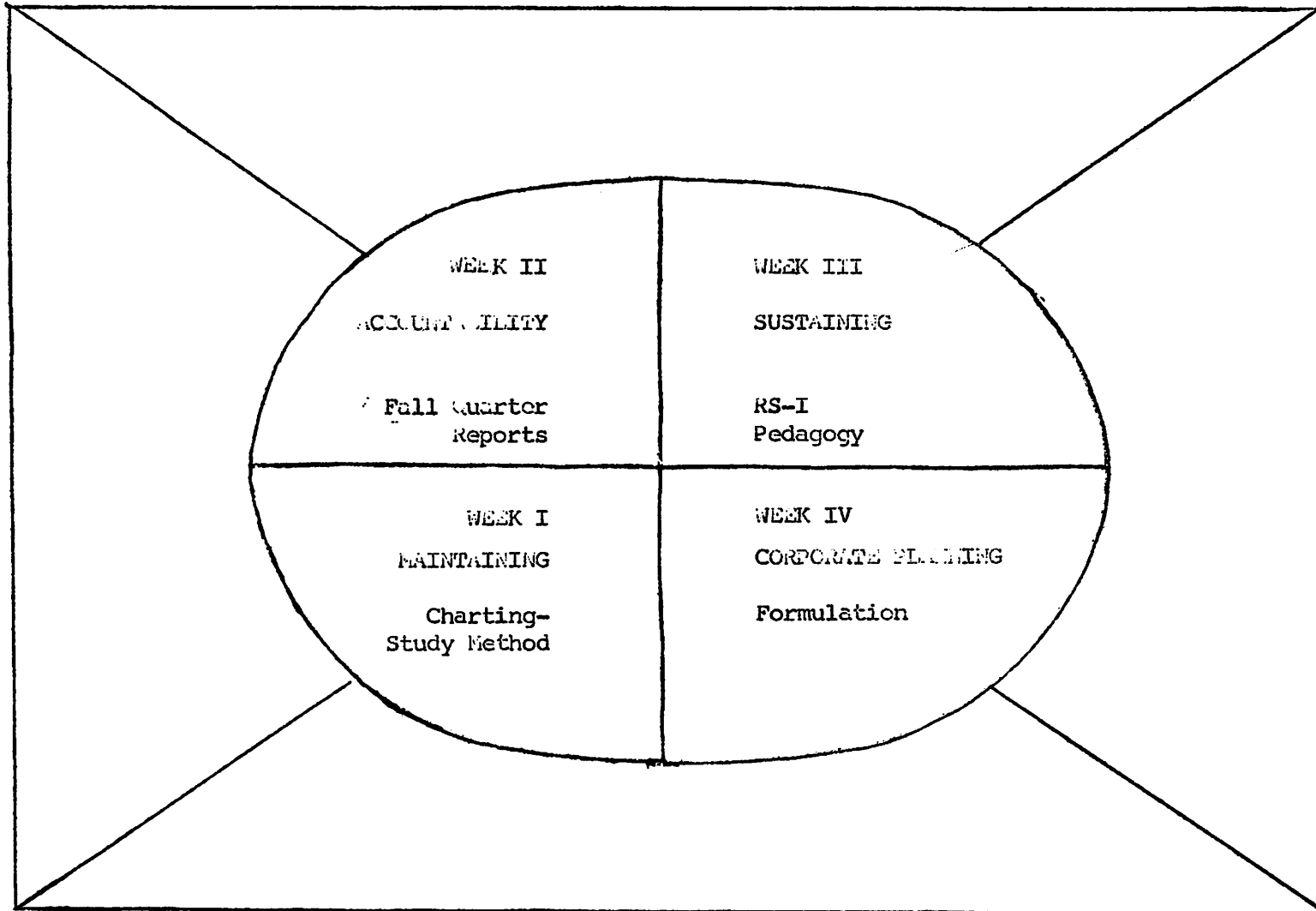

- Needs:
1. Clarity on Guru/Prior functions and roles in history.
 2. Distances on our missional assignments.
 3. Rituals, games, roles which force and allow new roles to be played.

Material Care: is the offsetting of irregularities and problems within the structures and breaking through the oppression of "fairness".

- Needs:
1. Within the corporate use of property a reverence for fineness.
 2. A plan for the decor and style of the room.
 3. "Sick" - unblocking particular pressure points.
