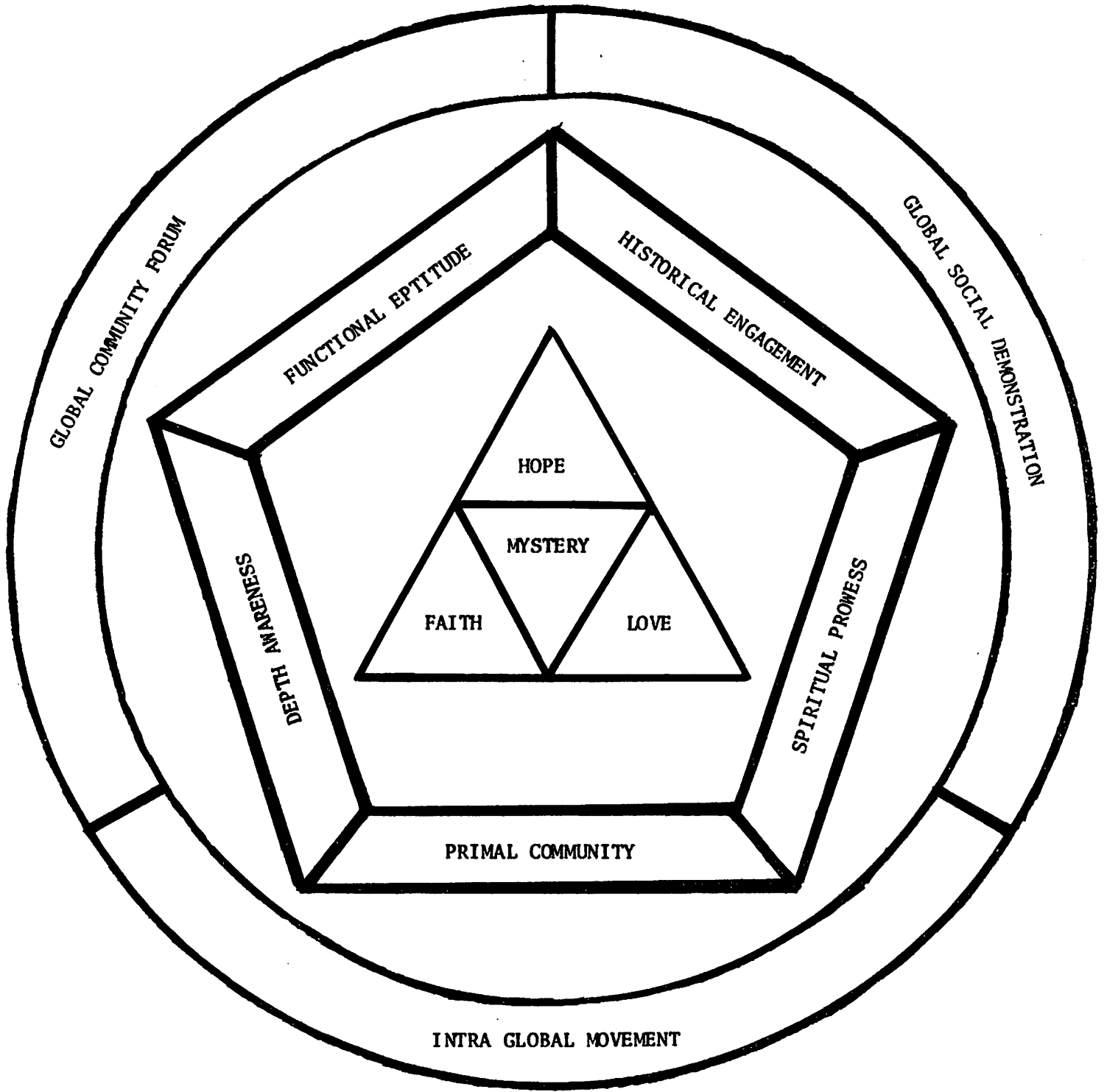


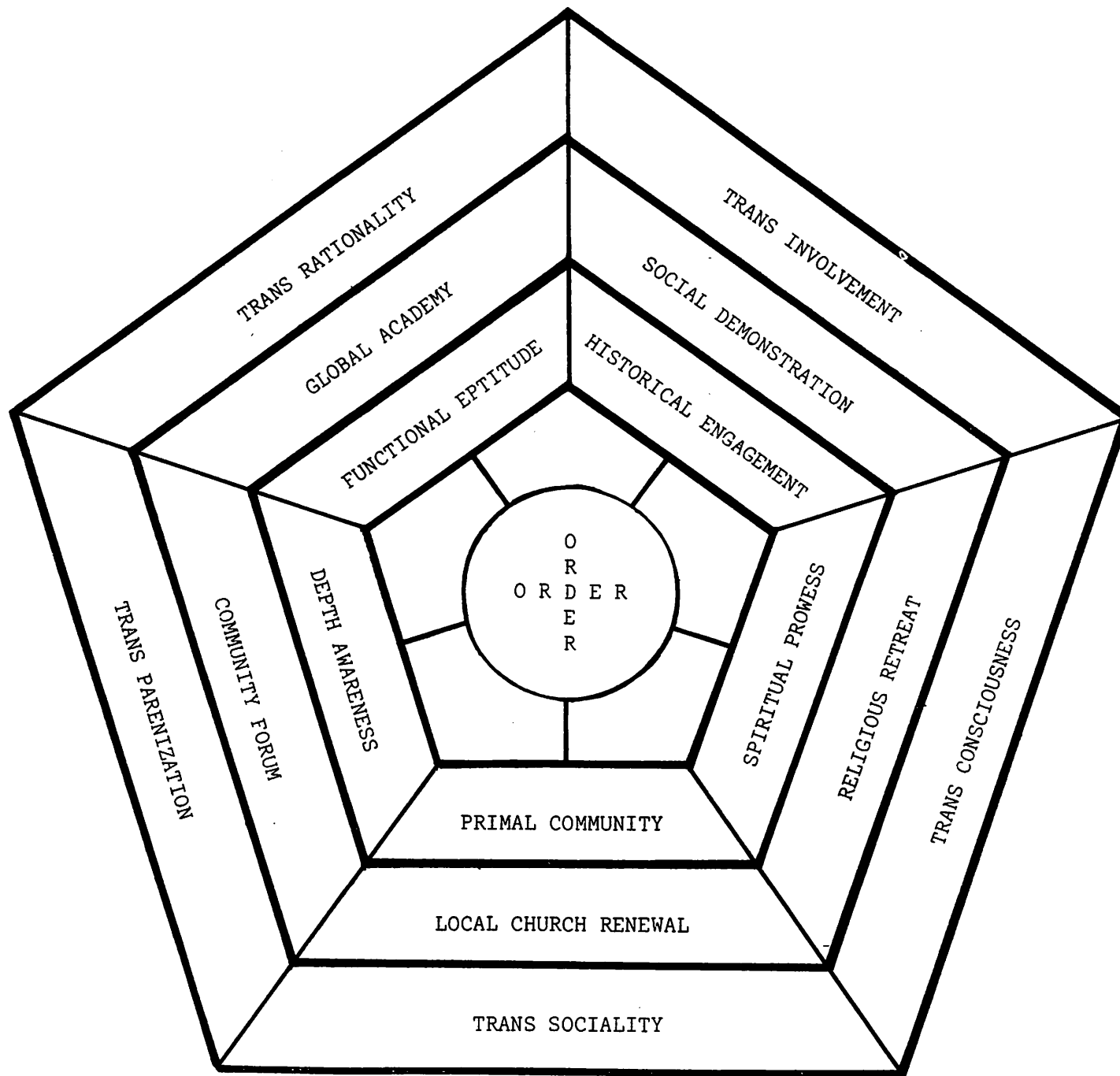

Building of the directions for the Global Movement this coming year will be done in working Committees which will cover the various arenas the Council sees as needed for planning the year. One of the dynamics being experimented with is the Steering Committee, which will enable the whole body to move quickly to the heart of the issues, recommend directions, and continually relate the direction of the work to global priorities and strategies.

The following are the basic procedures for the work of the Council as it launches the Committees through preparation of the final reports. Also included are the procedures to be used by the Steering Committee.

The Global Council Issues is a pull-together of reflections from the Global Panchayat Trek, the Global Council Task Force working during the Global Research Assembly in Chicago, the Global Movement Council in North America, and the Global Priors Council preparation work done this past week. It is not meant to be a conclusive list. It is meant to stimulate your own reflection on the major issues needing to be dealt with during the Council.

There will be 24 Social Demonstrations within the next three years; 8 this coming year. The locations of the first 8 have been determined and consults scheduled through March, 1976.
