The cruciality of doing systematic circuits has been re-established. All indicators point to total victory, the future word is accelerate!

SYNOPSIS

Task Force C on Actuation Analysis began the process of compiling a computerized working catalogue of data which, as we grow more sophisticated in gathering, processing, storing and distributing the material, will be an invaluable tool in calling forth Global Community Forums. The major breakthrough of this task force is that, though working with incomplete and undisciplined data, a vision of the possibilities began to emerge. By the use of selected data and careful programming of retrieval and analysis new sponsorship networks will begin to emerge from the many volunteer organizations, corporations, government agencies and local contributors who have and will have a part in Global Community Forums. As more data is gathered and processed additional uses will be found locally, areally, nationally and even inter-nationally.

The efforts of the Task Force concentrated on analyzing the existing data to learn that certain networks are already in existence with the promise of other networks already defined yet untapped. The Task Force:

- 1) devised an encoding system for letters of appreciation and sponsorship; and
- 2) logged and filed available written materials.

We analyzed the data emerging from the Town Meeting proposals contained in the documents. We created an intuitive gestalt method for proposals trend analysis from 12 representative documents. These results can be used to project and test strategic trends in the analysis of the remaining documents. This data (as well as most of the data of this Task Force) will be turned over to the Global Community Forum and Operations Centers for further processing and utilization.

SYNOPSIS

Task Force D: Project Activation, has debriefed the Social Demonstration guns from the Social Demonstration sites and have gleaned the wisdom learned in the launching and actuation of the first eight projects. This wisdom has been drawn into a practical manual laying out the six months journey before a consult and the 6 months following. Foundational principles of Social Demonstration have been gleaned from the experience of the first year of actuation. A careful program by Program Analysis and status report has been compiled and a short range and long range needs in hardware and personnel has been projected.

SYNOPSIS

To enable the effective actualization of replication throughout the 40,000 villages of the State of Maharashtra, Task Force E has "walked through" the particularities of the components of the strategic replication plan, and created "The Replication Plan: Maharashtra" Chart which depicts a transrational geographic approach. In addition guidelines for replication have been stated, maps and grids for social analysis of each of the 25 districts created, staffing models and a recruitment model for the methods school devised.

GSD Replication in the State of Maharashtra is a demonstration in itself. It will be the break-open ground and the pace setter for the global band, and more than any other move made over the next two years will literally change the face of the movement. The key component of replication is the Methods School which is not out to build the Movement but to enable "Nava Gram Prayas" and to build the earth.

Task Force F designed an 8 week Human Training Institute for use in equipping auxiliary for the replication of Maliwada in the State of Maharashtra beginning October 3. The task force delineated 14 distinct curriculum blocks in the school and built session by session curriculum constructs for them. The task force wrote a brief prose description of the school and built rituals and a rough songbook. An implementary checklist for the school was also created to guide work on setup and recruitment during the coming months. Several arenas of work still lie immediately ahead. The total design must be re-examined and orchestrated. Remaining daily lesson plans must be written. Three stories from each Social Demonstration must be collected for use in lunch conversations. A students handbook currently in outline form must be compiled out of currently available sources and certain sections written from scratch. PR materials and brochures must be created and published. Breakthroughs lie in the arena of rebuilding familiar curriculum for use with a student body of university graduates and village people. A second breakthrough has to do with transposing our social methods into the posture of doing rather than knowing. Perhaps the most important insight about the school is that we are enabling students to put on the clothes of an auxiliary and walk in the world of social demonstration until they get used to it.

SYNOPSIS

The major breakthrough the task force experienced was related to the decision to revise the initial draft of the textbook out of a new clarity about the dynamics of initiating a human development project. This caused the focus of the Global Team's role (as described and documented in the text's procedures and tools) to shift from the first draft's concern for doing a great event or demonstrating applied social methods to one of anticipating and laying the foundations for effective project actuation from the moment of arrival. This new clarity pushed a large part of the content of the first draft beyond the level of checklists into comprehensive operational modes. By using the orchestration of the three-week Global Task Force as an overarching frame for its work, this task force clarified the nature and function of a Global Task Force in any situation; objectified the critical role of the Consult Team during the third week beyond that of simply leading the document writing; and grounded the complex roles and tasks of the Team during the week before the Consult. In limiting the audience to the Global Teams of the future, the task force expanded the text to include a large amount of refined and updated material covered generally in the first draft. It also wrote new copy on arenas not included in the earlier draft such as procedures for the four Plenaries; rationalized and illustrated pull together of the five Consult Spins; formats for symbolic opening and closing sessions; the orchestration of the consult co-ordinator's daily responsibilities; guides for using team procedures in effectively calling forth the team dynamic; and statements on the 24 Actuating Principles.

SYNOPSIS

Task Force H reports these five accomplishments and breakthroughs.

1. We became aware of the repository as a dynamical interchange of data, know-how goods and personnel.
2. We experienced several breakthroughs in terms of the handbook format as we moved from detailed collections of available external materials to working through the operating principles, guidelines, check points, and questions to ask relative to an arena.
3. We found a way to build comprehensiveness and organization out of overwhelming particularities.
4. Through our work we extended the network of personnel related to and supportive of the repository, particularly in the arenas of nutrition and appropriate technology.
5. We developed a screen and procedures for doing initial research on the Global Social Demonstration site and wrote research briefs on the next four Global Social Demonstration sites.

SYNOPSIS

The Task Force concentrated on compiling a series of proposals for submission to various governments and agencies totalling over 90 million dollars. Detailed per capita and village costs were computed and a funding budget built allowing specific requests to each funding source. The AID proposal for over \$9 million and a proposal for World Bank funding are ready for submission. In working through the major funding aspects of the replication programme, the Task Force was impacted with the practical feasibility of state wide replication and the low per capita cost of \$186.

SYNOPSIS

The group assigned to draft Strategic Essays assumes responsibility for its assigned task and reports as its accomplishments the creation of six essays on the major strategic arenas facing the Movement at this time. The essays are: "The Liberal Heresy: the Campaign Contradiction", "The Philosophy of Human Awakening:", "The Profound Function of Community Forum", "The Philosophy of Social Change", "The Methods of Social Analysis", "Operating Principles of the IntraGlobal Movement". The major breakthrough of the task force came in seeing vividly the role of sociological reconciliation being played by the Movement at this time in history and of the convergence of the three campaigns in Primal Community.

The accomplishments of the Lab were the Guild Birthday Party of 90 Uptowners which pulled in a whole new body of troops ready to work, completed the funding of the Argyle Beautification Project and held a Businessmen's dinner which gave permission to the core of businessmen to proceed with the reorganization and unification of the Argyle businessmen, established a Guild work force to construct bus stop benches for the community, set up research procedures for the month of August to empower the future planning of the Guild, produced a Voice and achieved through visitation sustained care of the 3400 yards of sod which is all still green and growing. The major breakthrough of the summer was the use of teams to expand the sphere of contact with the community.

SYNOPSIS

The task of Council Preparation on the part of a small task force required the creation of methodologies for including the entire assembly in the planning process. The methods included initial brainstorm of gestalt by the task force as representatives of the total global wisdom; then a testing of this through interviews across the assembly; and finally an openhouse one afternoon to host all the task forces informally and acquire their additional input. The initial gestalt was reviewed twice - once after the interviews and the second time after the open house. To acquire the fiscal data, the task force created a common reporting format and then sought the data on what actually occurred during the past year. The memorials for the past year were reviewed in light of the global fiscal trek to determine where they were functional and where dis-functional relative to actual needs and complexity of accomplishing the mission, including such things as legal and tax status from nation to nation. The result was a comprehensive screen of all legal and fiscal issues and the closely related program development concerns. This was transformed into challenges, operating principles and pre-memorials for council review, revision and consensus.

The task of designing the council basically involved reviewing, revising and building on the emerging models for this annual event and developing a comprehensive screen of things to be done to prepare for this occasion this year.

TASK FORCE M: ORDER ASSIGNMENTS

JULY 1976

SYNOPSIS

Task Force M created a method and rationales for making global assignments. We have discerned the following guidelines in making global assignments:

- 1) Maintain the continuity except where troops may be more effectively used elsewhere, as discerned by a critical analysis of recommendations submitted.
- 2) Determine the contradictions and match troop strength to master then
- 3) Image those assigned to a place as the team necessary to cover the missional operation effectively.

The assignment process began using these priorities, first, Area Priors; second, the Consult trek and school teams; third, the Social Demonstration guns; fourth, the Nexus Bands; fifth, the Religious House priors; sixth, Chicago Centrums, seventh, Religious House troikas. We are keeping a log of the process and intend to edit and publish it for future use.

The most recent breakloose was the awareness that this is the year to intensify Canada and thus top priority consideration is being given there.
