UPTOWN CHICAGO

Welcome

Welcome to Uptown. As a temporary resident of Uptown, while engaging in the research task of the summer, you have the opportunity to sense yourself as a part of one of the most sociologically unique urban communities in the United States.

History

Uptown is one of the great historic neighborhoods in the city of Chicago. First settled in 1847 it became part of Chicago in 1889. Its residents were among the wealthiest in the city and its business district was the first one developed beyond the Loop. In the 1920's Uptown became a nationally famous entertainment center with such features as the Edgewater Beach Hotel, the Aragon Ballroom, and two large theatres, now the Uptown and Riviera theatres. Whatever the movie showing, walking into the lobby of the Uptown is well worth the price of the ticket. In the 1930's the immigration of people of many nationalities began, resulting in what is probably the most ethnically heterogeneous neighborhood in North America. The people of Uptown represent all six of the major races of mankind and every one of the nine continents. One community leader estimates that as many as 57 languages are spoken in Uptown. The major groups--American Indian, Spanish American, Black, Chinese, Japanese, Asian Indian, Appalachian White and European White--have constituted this unique community for 40 years. Uptown also contains the largest elder citizen population in the city of Chicago.

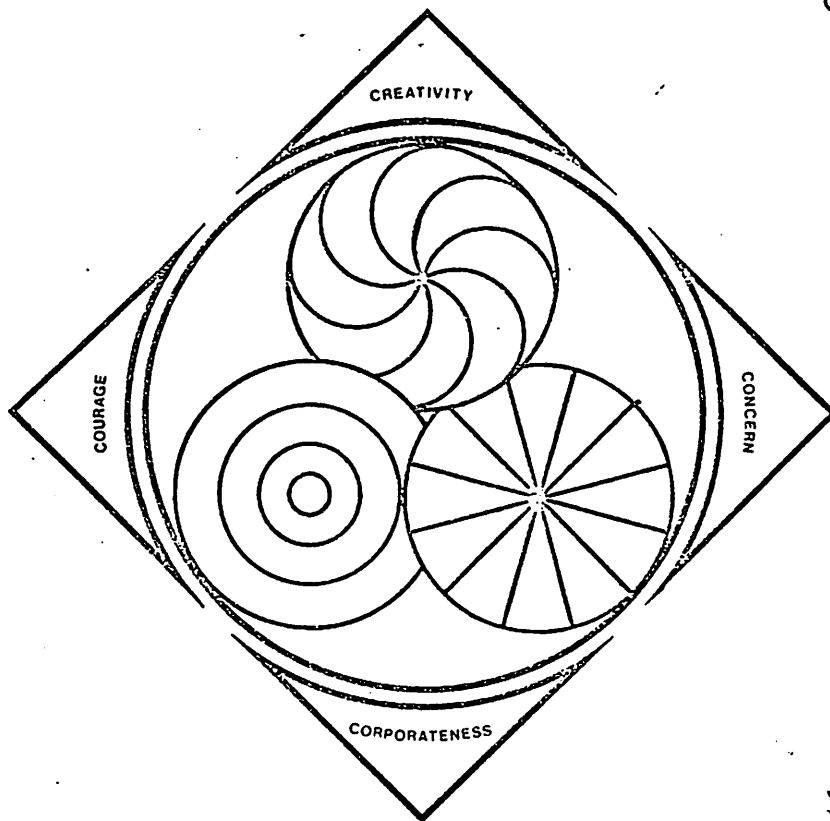
Neighbors

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force D has completed the tasks we set before us. The most critical aspect of our work has been the work on the forum construct with special emphasis on the afternoon workshop; and the Pre-Forum Handbook including constructs and practical models for set up of Global Women's Forums--with a short contextual conversation anyone interested in setting up a Forum will be able to do so. In order to focus our energy on these arenas we bracketed several issues that are critical, but not blocking the launching of Global Women's Forums for Quarter II. Our promotional pieces are ready to go to production.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

Task Force D believes that on the other side of the Council it will become necessary to be prepared to do many Global Women's Forums across the globe. The coordinator's handbook should facilitate this momentum. We believe the revised construct moves in the right direction and strengthens the day considerably. In terms of the Global Women's Forum as a mass impact tool, we must now deal quickly with the issue of training which has been bracketed during the Assembly. Training, finalizing trek scheduling and teaching forums in the local languages are the next arenas for attention.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The Student Involvement Task Force has been about the task of creating Program Designs for the school, youth and Higher Education Institution. Those tools are now completed and ready for the press. They have provided a necessary tactical unit for the North American GCF Campaign and can now be used to initiate or intensify consensed upon Area Maneuvers.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

The team on Higher Education has created a one semester HDP Internship Program, an HDP Issue Seminar to be used on-site in conjunction with Universities and a one-day Forum Event for the total University Constituency and its service area. The Youth Team has created a complete one day course construct for "Venture 21". The course focuses on Phaseology awareness and social engagement. The team on School Forums has created a new student workbook and teacher's guide for the Intermediate Classroom. A teacher's guide for the Primary classroom is also ready. A Consultant's Manual and accompanying Administrator's guide have been created which enables the "doing" of a whole school system with a maximum of a 13 day on-site consultant service. Marketing tools and phasing designs are complete to indicate the testing and actuation of these Special Focus Forum designs.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The Higher Education Programs will enable increased availability of human and technological resources. It will also intensify the discussion of the ethical and moral responsibility of the University to its service community. It will expose the University community to new methods of social engagement. These models can be used by GCF circuiters, development teams, guardians, and HDP Auxiliary with Higher Education Institutions, agencies and organizations with particular expertise, and can when needed focus on the engagement of mature youth.

Some future implications include: grounding the role of Higher Education in the Human Development, requests from Institutions to apply methods of ICA and linking special audience forums with GCF geographic maneuvers.

"Venture 21" can intensify the engagement of Order Youth as faculty in awakening and engagement of society's youth. The first 6 months could be focused on doing courses in 14 major North American cities. The program is also an awakening event which could augment particular GCF Maneuvers at the Area or Regional level.

"Town Meeting: Special Focus: The School in Community" is an awakening tool for a single school or a total school system. It has the capability of softening up the urban areas of the Continent and catalyzing Forums more directly focused at the neighborhood level. It will demonstrate new forms of corporateness for school systems as well as exposing them to Imaginal Education Methods.

Following an experimental quarter, the program can be used to broaden or intensify the North American GCF Maneuvers. A cautious phasing design indicates the possibility of 2,000 forums before July 1977 with minimal troop expenditure.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The work of task forces G and H was the preparation for Community Forum to move into a new phase of mass impact globally. This requires a pull together and clear picture of our current situation, both in global coverage and in financial undergirding. Taking this data and discerning our effective tools in relationship to the new thrust, the needed framework was created. This fell into four major arenas: 1) the undergirding support which included directions for effective financing, and proposals for workbook changes, 2) global phasing plan in order to determine and coordinate mass awakening in the globe and in North America, 3) effective maneuver planning to analyze effective and rapid coverage, and 4) troop training in order that the new immersing colleagues can be effectively engaged.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

- 1-MASS ACCELERATION DOCUMENT (for phasing and phasing strategies)
- 2-MANEUVER MANUAL for 77-78 (tactics and compendium of models and tools)
- 3-TRAINING DESIGNS (for circuiters, movement and awakened communities)
- 4-WORKBOOK MODIFICATIONS (adapted format, leaerguide & simplified language)
- 5-FINANCIAL REPORT & PLANS (pull together of costs and means of self-supporting programs in the future)

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

- 1- A document to show global phasing , principles of acceleration strategizing, and practical maneuvering. To be used in Global Priors' Council planning.
- 2- A tactical system for mass awakening campaigns usable globally for all maneuvers.
- 3- Constructs and modules for in-depth and short in service training; useful for training of circuiters, for community follow-up, and for the engagement of new colleagues.
- 4- A proposal for a replicable and common workbook that can be used anywhere in order to maintain method commonality and format flexibility.
- 5- The plan is useful for effective funding of all GCF's. The data pull together will be used for the council to seriously build a common model of budgets and self-supporting programs.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The Light Industry Task Force has created a Business Acceleration Trek Manual, a Project Industries Analysis, an Industrial Set-up an Operations Manuel, an Industrial Selection Formula, an Industry Guild Operations Phasing Plan, an Industry Guild One Year Curriculum and an Industry Resources List.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

The Business Acceleartion Trek Manuel includes a one year design and the four week detailed design. The Project Industries Analysis is a chart showing the industries in each project and their stage of development. The Industry Set-up and Operations Manuel includes an abstract chart, and an industry operations checklist. The Industrial Selection Formula is a two page check list. The Industry Guild Operations Phasing Plan includes a one year guild phasing chart and weekly guild meeting design. The ready made Industry list is a list of Industries that are set up by other agencies. The Industry Curriculum is a one year abstract design.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

These products will be used by auxiliary and economic or business guild members for setting up industries and used by the trek to accelerate economic developementin projects.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The Commerce Task Force approached its assignment out of several concerns. First, there was a felt need to strongly illuminate the daily usefulness of the five economic principles in the imagination of both ICA staff and local man.

Secondly, we felt the urgency of detailing the workings of the nine basic dynamics which a survey of HDP documents indicated could be structured to activate commerce.

Thirdly, we saw the need to provide practical aides to the quick start-up and successful operation of commercial ventures.

Fourthly, we experienced a strong demand to present the basic theory of commerce imaginably and simply so that ICA staff and local people could grasp the concepts and operating procedures.

Finally, we responded to the need to create curricula which would enable the Commerce Guild and Auxiliary to actuate commercial structures as the content of the training.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

1. BACK-UP PAPERS SCREENS: Business Start-up; Business Operation; Market Research; Facility Research; Management Roles; Description of Seven Commercial Enterprises; Start-up and Operations Check List for each of the Seven Operations.
2. GLOBAL ECONOMIC TREK RATIONALE
3. TREK ON-SITE DESIGN
4. HDP COMMERCE SURVEY
5. CURRICULUMS: Economic Principles; Business Set-up; Business Operations; Accounting; Store Game; Symbol Holding Five Economic Principles.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The work of the Commerce Task Force has two basic thrusts. One, the imaginal, has significance for grounding the five economic principles in the community, and the other, simple practical procedures, is significant for alleviating the fear of the economic. Ultimately we would hope that a dramatic leap forward in economic development will occur in the coming year. Finally, we anticipate that the new understanding will break loose creativity at the local level bringing new solutions to existing problems. The manual would be utilized by a commerce/industry acceleration team, during a trek. The auxiliary would utilize the curriculum at stake and guild meetings and the procedural outlines during on-the-job training.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The task force reviewed and gestalted the issues and insights of the plenary and other back up material. It also heard pertinent reports from Projects already moving towards a local economic vehicle. Extremely helpful input came from business guardians who gave their practical wisdom on business operations. Considerable time was spent on identifying the tensions and values which had to be held by the vehicle and in consensing upon the basic structure and values which needed to be designed. The taskforce met once with the GSD Campaign to aid and coordinate its work with the Local Operations and Commerce and Industry taskforces. Team work produced the products which were critiqued and revised several times before production.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

1. Contextual Statement containing a statement on needs, values, objectives, functions, and relationships.
2. Legal Context containing recommended forms for a legal entity plus operational guidelines and systems charts for cash flow, management and LEV overall organisation (suggested alternatives appended)
3. Operating guidelines for practical implementation of the legal forms of the LEV.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The economic life will undergird the social life and integrate these two dynamics of the community. The economic ventures of the HDP's will become profit making and the auxillaries will have a design for working immediately in a comprehensive way with industry, commerce and agriculture. Common legal forms and bookkeeping will be set up in all GSD's.

Intended Use: To be reviewed by the Global Priors and used as a timeline for implementing the LEV in all GSD's.

Implications: It will focus resources on a framework for building the economic structure of the GSD communities.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Team 28 reviewed the replication process in the Maharashtra Village Development Project over Phase I, Part 1 and Part 2. It then built the expansion model for moving to Phase II or the 250 village projects in moving from the district to the tahsil level. Team 29 examined the 24 GSD's as to their readiness to replicate within their area, state, or nation. Four projects emerged as anticipating readiness within the next year: Kwanguyng Il, Korea; Kawangware, Kenya; Sudtonggan, Philippines; and Oombulgurri, Australia. Team 30 considered the criteria for launching new projects over the next four years. A total of 96 projects emerged as necessary during that period with a preliminary recommendation of 24 during the next year.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

A manual was prepared that laid out replication principles and a rephrasing of the overall project. Maneuvers were built for Phase II. In light of this, operational designs were redone for replication strategies: site selection, demonstration visit, Gram Sabha, HDTs entrance procedure, auxiliary residences, and village consult. Divisional operation was spelled out in detail for scheduling and for the acceleration and monitoring teams. The phasing of replication has been designed for each of the four projects including geographical coverage, site selection, team meetings, exchange visits, replication schools, interns, and consults. A brief was written for each of the four including an initial draft of a replication budget. The criteria for new sites next year has been discerned, the possible sites designated by nation or state for the next four years, a brief created for each of the next year's sites, and supporting world maps to geographically illustrate continental and national penetration designed.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The leap from doing 25 to 250 projects in one year is an overwhelming task. This will put an unbelievable burden on the new staff trained in the Human Development Training School and seasoned in the replication projects. Also, doing the training required to prepare people for all stages of the replication strategies and acceleration and monitoring teams is a horrendous job. In addition, the administrative load required of the Centrum dynamics and the money required from development are phenomenal. A 5-year phasing model projects the earliest dates when all 24 projects will replicate. Delta Pace and Lorne de l'Acadie are serious contenders for beginning replication in their immediate regions in North America. An imaginal projection over the next four years illustrates both strategic options and methods for objectively determining global and continental maneuvers. Moving on Latin America and other rural communities of the United States along with strengthening the subcontinent and SEAPAC emerge as high priorities for the immediate future.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force N worked on Back-Up Systems of the GSD Campaign. We concerned ourselves with three arenas: (1) GSD Consults, (2) Acceleration Treks, and (3) Monitoring Systems. To break loose these arenas, the Task Force worked to articulate the basic phasal dynamics and activities thus far discovered, which delineated the two-year journey of any Human Development Project. With this context, the Task Force worked to compile practical insights from across the band. Primarily related to launching and accelerating of projects, the arena of monitoring was substantially bracketed, as it appears to be an abyss. We compiled three products.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

PROJECT LAUNCH TEXTBOOK - A rewrite and expansion of last year's consult textbook to include the learnings of project launchings of the past year set in the larger context of overall launching rather than just focusing on the consult teams.

PRELIMINARY TREK DESIGN - Nine (9) pieces that begin to spell-out basic designs of doing treks for the next year is intended to be the basis of commonality for each of the treks.

BACK-UP SYSTEMS RECOMMENDATIONS - An assortment of operational guidelines and insights in the broad arena of GSD. Backup which cover areas beyond the scope of the above documents and attempt to delineate arenas where future thinking will be required.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

Task Force N experienced the significance as taking different experiences of effectively launching projects into a common tapestry and capturing the experience of two unique arenas. We are under the gun to do acceleration and discern that teks are a viable vehicle for launching and accelerating projects.

The consult textbook can be a resource in every house as a guideline for the front lines. The Council decision about assignments for launching projects and acceleration is simplified because the tools are available for everyone to do the job. The implications of our work is that launching in replication and new areas as well as commonality in acceleration treks is a viable possibility. Anyone now has the tools to win in an assignment to a launching or acceleration trek.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force O has addressed itself to doing projects in one year. Because of the future expansion of projects into other nations and new replication configurations developing, doing these projects rapidly and profoundly has become the crucial issue. The struggle to refine materials for minimally trained auxiliaries has been a central point of the work.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

Auxiliary Almanac--a composition of models and designs representing current and projected wisdom on doing a project

Project Update --an interview report using GSD report format for each Social Demonstration

Statistical Abstract--totals of current activities and finances

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The Almanac is a symbol of our commonness and features a one year completion design for a Human Development Project. It is intended for auxiliaries in projects and of particular concern for auxiliaries graduating from replication schools.

The updates are of general use and provide indicators for tracking and back-up systems.

The statistical abstract is of minimal value, but provides a current snapshot of the activity and accomplishment of the projects.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force P, Health Care focused its efforts primarily on pulling the practical experience gained by the Health Acceleration Team over the past six months into a guidebook for use by future acceleration teams and auxiliary staff. Thus, one primary product was produced, a manual which will not only allow future teams to further augment acceleration, but provides a screen which will allow planning an effective acceleration visit for any point in the life of a Human Development Project. It is written in such a manner that it can be understood by someone who has only basic English skills, and if he follows the guidelines provided he can implement a showpiece quality local health program with or without the aid of an acceleration team. In addition we looked at the issues of which acceleration visits were needed in the coming year and concluded that of first priority are a Maharashtra Replication and a SEAPAC zonal team; of second priority North-south American and Europe-African circuits. Emphasis will be placed on recruiting regional professionals

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

1. GUIDEBOOK FOR THE RENEWAL OF VILLAGE VITALITY INCLUDING SECTIONS on the implementation of nutrition, sanitation, local funding, health education, and local care systems. All sections include practical guidelines, analytical screens, and models of appropriate technology. Each is introduced by a phasing scheme which may be applied to a two year or one year actuation timeline
2. Global resources compendium - comprehensive list by site with local references
3. Acceleration Trek Design, staffing model, and schedule

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The work of the task force has created the basis for recreation of the health care structures of the globe. In the process we have treated a tool which will be of practical value in the urban or rural situation. In this effort we have begun to get a glimpse of how the ICA would begin to translate its methodology into a form that governments and agencies around the globe could pick up and use with the same kind of profound results that we have seen in our own operations.

We suggest that during Order Council enough copies of the manual be produced to adequately meet the needs of all project auxiliaries, acceleration teams, and development. The manual will be put to intensive trial over the next year and those making use of it should note arenas in which further refinement is needed so that it will become an even more practical tool in the hands of local man.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force Q: Living Environment identified four major issues blocking momentum in the human development projects task of transforming the physical space of communities:

1. There was no comprehensive screen for the pre-consult gathering of data on the living environment or the post-consult translation of the operating vision and the tactical system into a unified physical design of the transformed community.
2. There needed to be a method which required implementation by transrationally clustering the tactics and programs which was simple enough to be used on a regular basis.
3. The block to actualization of hard miracles was discerned to be the lack of understanding of how major construction occurs at the local level.
4. To ensure that the auxiliary could leave in two years a project which would sustain its own momentum, a method needed to be developed for involving, training, and motivating people in the community construction force or builders guild.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

Space is the revolutionary edge of our work in Human Development Projects. Space alterations symbolize social change thereby guaranteeing and guarding interior transformations. In the corporate planning, it is essential to aim spatial transformations at the one thing that is blocking the momentum of the community. The key to motivity on terms of space changes is the phasing of consistent work-day soft miracle events, with monthly hard construction miracles. Transforming background space is key to long-term imaginal shifts: transforming focal space is key to motivity breaklooses. With the handbook produced from the Living Environment Task Force, the blocks to engaging a project in construction and space changes are removed.

WHAT:

The Community Life Task Force assembled the present wisdom of the movement in the arena of intensifying community life by examining past records and researching what has been learned in the social demonstration projects in the last year. The contradiction in community life and the life giving dynamics in community life were identified. Methods already being used have been examined and given new forms of application. The task force created curricula and activities to intensify community life through a trek design, a one year implementing design for acceleration and methods to develop the stake concept.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The products and backup materials will be of particular importance for use in the acceleration of present projects and in the rapid replication of additional projects by providing simple, practical ways by which the local leadership in a project can be contexted quickly and given effective skills in the arena of community life. Since this task force included representatives from 12 of the 24 projects, the wisdom of half of the projects was available directly to us and now, through experience on the task force, these projects have persons who have been contexted in depth about the fundamentals of community motivity.

SYNOPSIS

The Total Education Task Force kept the following goals in mind throughout the Global Research Assembly:

1. The primary educational task is to equip the 85% to share a proportionate amount of the world's resources.
2. A Total Education Handbook is needed to enable project auxiliary to implement training programs. These programs are particularly aimed at the village residents who may neither read or write, but who need to learn practical job skills and contextual images.
3. The one-year timeline for phasing a project into independent operation places the emphasis on leadership skills in the midst of skills training.
4. The real question at every point is "Will it work?"

The significant happening in the Total Education Task Force was the realization of the practical emphasis of education. This practicality then becomes a concrete means to awaken and engage forces in Global Human Development in a year's time. The actual curriculum and timelines will speed up demonstration projects for world-wide replication.



SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The Council Planning Task Force has created the basic models and procedures for the Global Priors Council which melds the Assembly's work into a unified strategic thrust for the coming year. Three documents have been prepared for Council use. The document on Polity which emerged from the Global Panchayat Task Force at Chicago Nexus was re-written and completed. A working document was written on the 24-year and 4-year operating vision of the Global Order. Then followed a process that produced an issue screen which allowed the 11 contradictions to the mission to be discerned. A document accounting for the implementation of the 25 Memorials from the 1976 Council was written. The Task Force served as consultant to and liaison with Nexus staff and Order priors in thinking through the areas of spirit life, Council addresses, invitations, the songbook, Council time design, committee configurations, and preparation issues and tasks. The Task Force prepared for use by the Council Regulatory a file of resources, plans and models to facilitate their work.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

Polity Document, Vision/Issues/Contradictions Document, Memorial Accountability Document, Council Resources and Designs File

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The Polity Document is the first comprehensive documentation of the common wisdom and practice of the Order in relationship to decision-making and consensus-building. It will be an invaluable resource for reflection, discussion, and training across the Order. The Vision/Issues/Contradictions Document represents the first time such a statement has been made available to the Council. It is intended to be used as a screen in organizing data and in facilitating a focused reflection on the reports.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force W did an analysis of the comprehensive training needs of Those Who Care, and built a triangle dealing with intellectual, social, and spirit capabilities. By plotting a brainstorm of existing and anticipated training needs on this triangle, pressure points of training were noted.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

Over one hundred pieces of curriculum were then brainstormed, refined, and written up in 30 one-hour curriculum events. Content includes key intellectual concepts, classical spirit methods, and selected social methods. These modules are designed for old hands as well as new colleagues. It is suggested that these training events would be appropriate for common Monday morning collegiums around the globe, but they may also be used in the laundromat or in the car.

In reviewing the Academy, it was felt that a radical change in curriculum is not needed at this time. The primary contradiction of inaccessibility can be dealt with by streamlining the faculty and by putting the Academy on the road. It is increasingly clear that we must be prepared to train large numbers of non-North American troops in the Academy in the near future. This will require the development of indigenous staff through Academy pedagogy. A four-year phasing plan was designed for the Academy. The first year would have an experimental pilot Academy outside of Area Chicago. The second and third years would see treks to hold Academies in all three spheres, and the fourth expansion to meet the needs in 1980-81.

The Priorship Training Pak is made up of thirty one-hour curriculum modules. Content includes key intellectual concepts, classical spirit methods, and selected social methods. It is designed to rehearse basic assumptions and build essential prowess for both old hands and new colleagues, to enable the three campaigns.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

Task Force V produced 16 pieces for publication in "Estimates II", 8 of which dealt with the emerging edge of social philosophy and 8 dealt with the profound mythology, operating principles and public story of Those Who Care.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

Task Force V put out two products. The first was a year's calendar for Those Who Care with 52 pages, one for each week each featuring symbols and quotations dealing with our social philosophy. The second was Estimates II with articles on The Moral Issue, Primal Community, trends and contradictions in local community, the strategy of human development, programs for social demonstration, the health trek, strategy of human awakening the story of community forum. It also features compilations on profound humanness, local community legends, the methods of effective action, gimmicks for internal discipline, forms of corporate operation and finally two brochures, one on ICA and the other on Global Community Forum.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

These products can be used for formal or informal study sessions, for the solitary sustainment of mobile troops and for corporate conversations. The brochures are intended as suggested new forms for a general ICA brochure and a campaign piece on GCF for use in development. The calendar and mythology items will provide ways to keep the accent on the theme of community and the corporate, and point to an emerging mythology for developing local communities. These products are intended to provide a handlehold on the current operating form of Those Who Care.

GLOBAL DEPLOYMENT

The process of assigning forces missionally across the globe has increasingly become a complex, creative and very practical task. It requires the careful computation of data from all parts of our operations, including areas, centers, projects and individuals. It depends on the establishment of the missional fronts being developed by the various task forces of the Assembly. From this data, it then discerns an accurate picture of assignable people, their specific skills, needs, requests and recommendations. The work finally of the Global Deployment Task force is to design from all of this the specific assignment recommendations for the Global Priors Council.

In order to accomplish this objective, the following guidelines or operating principles have been used:

1. Establish global assignment task priorities and then assign persons as missional needs require.
2. Utilize a comprehensive global screen for each and every assignment.
3. Honor individual gifts and needs in relation to the common missional task.
4. Maintain troop continuity for the sake of the mission whenever possible.
5. Assign troops so that economic self-support is assured.

The following procedure is being used during this two week period to complete the task of presenting to the Global Priors Council a set of recommended assignments:

1. Compile data from all sources.
2. Study every need, name, request and recommendation.
3. Arrange interviews with area and continental prior groups.
4. Discern assignment and missional priority possibilities.
5. Project assignment rationale.
6. Construct initial draft of recommended assignments.

As significant trend in the arena of forces has been the emergence of auxiliary troops in demonstration and replication sites. In the future, it is conceivable that local auxiliaries will be prepared to receive assignments to other locations, other continents and will provide new impetus to our global servant force. To symbolize this, all auxiliary forces will be held in this year's assignment.

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

1. Equipment obtained and assembled for editing task.
2. A total review of all film shot during the trek.
3. The development of a method for corporate input involving consultants, Auxiliary and village residents from project sites to chart the film and select the sequence of footage and to build the script.
4. Cataloguing every shot on the film footage by shot number, time, footage, and description for a complete record of all footage.
5. Editing World's Fair and Sudtonggan footage for group presentations.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

By Friday, July 15, a one-hour presentation readied on the World's Fair footage.

Sudtonggan footage brought to the stage of script writing and film footage assembly into a formal presentation, possibly during the Global Prior's Council.

Methods developed of corporate film production.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

The significance of Task Force X's work during the Global Research Assembly was in developing methods of corporate conversation involving people with on-site experience to give background and significance of visual scenes. These events pulled together the project's thrust and allowed the auxiliary, staff and village residents to articulate the impact of their year's work.

The methods developed can be used during the Global Prior's Council to elicit the data and significance of each project for the individual films on every Global Social Demonstration project. The separate project films and the corporate composite film on all the projects will be developed over the next months to be used for development and authorization purposes.

The films will become a strategic tool for development as well as a significant part of the corporate memory for the Global Servant Movement. Films will be refined and sound tracks prepared in the weeks ahead

SUMMARY OF TASK FORCE WORK

The GRA kitchen was charged with the task of providing food which would not only sustain the participants but also feature a global reduplicable menu. Showing the way to honor food preferences of the many different ones present, working with the Basic 5 Food Groups from the Global Health Care Manual, using staple foods from each of the Human Development Projects and creating tasty meals centered on combinations of inexpensive proteins was brought off with a style and spirit enlivening the whole assembly. Creating reduplicable menus usable to feed 100% of the world happened.

DESCRIPTION OF PRODUCTS

The production of 17,400 meals and 10,400 snacks has been the focus of much of the kitchen's activity. Space was transformed and with the assembly's enablement and the kitchen staff's direct demonstration of servanthood, all were cared for well. Menu plans, the Basic 5 Food Group screen, and recipes for being able to replicate the demonstration for 25 or multiples of 100 are available in the kit of RECIPES FOR AN INTRA GLOBAL PEOPLE.

SIGNIFICANCE, INTENDED USE AND IMPLICATIONS

Breakthroughs in the demonstration of a global kitchen were the use of global local staples so that foods served anywhere will not be so "foreign", breakfasts and suppers with each of the five food groups represented, and effective uses of troops with one "general" in charge. ICA as it shows up around the globe will find usable recipes and imaginal nutrition tools in the kit. The El Bayad HDP has experienced using the 5 Food Groups for meal planning and cut not only their food expenditures by 20% but also their illness rate, with an increase in the satisfaction in the midst of eating meat only once a week on butchering day. Use of the kit with DIET FOR A SMALL PLANET by Lappe, RECIPES FOR A SMALL PLANET by Ewald can produce similar results around the globe.
