CONTINENTAL REPLICATION STRATEGIES

SUB CONTINENT

In the arena of Demonstration Strategies in the Sub-continent, the Order by June 1980 will have initiated 2,500 projects in 25 Districts of Maharashtra. Further research and experimentation will be started in the other three Areas of India, such as cluster formation around the existing projects in DELHI and MADRAS Areas, and the initiation of a project in Area CALCUTTA. In addition forays will be made into the two remaining Areas of Karachi and Dacca.

BLACK AFRICA

In the arena of Demonstration Strategies in Area Nairobi, the Order by 1980 will have launched a national replication scheme in Kenya focusing this year on Machakos District, and will include launching 1 HDP in each of 6 Divisions in Machakos plus doing a Demonstration HDP in one additional Province in preparation for the next phase of replication. Impact events will be used intensively before and after launching a HDP in an area. Government and EEC structures will be involved in actuation and funding. The HDP's will have resident auxiliary from existing auxiliary and from the 2 HDTI's planned this year. In addition to HDP's, a circuit model utilizing impact events and training modules in strategic configurations will be conducted around Kamweleni as a part of the phasing which will be done around each HDP in the following year. LENS will be used as a major impact strategy, both with government structures as a way of engaging them in actuating comprehensive village development and in the private sector to establish broad support in the form of direct program funds, guardian relations and involvement in economic development of the villages.

This scheme is fulfilling the long-standing continental strategy of intensifying the African strongholds and has many strategic advantages, including Kenya's stability and progressive image both on and off the continent, which gives it great catalytic power of demonstration for other African nations and of releasing major funding from external sources. It also has the advantage of demonstrating a coordinated effort of national village development in conjunction with government structures and funds. As it fits into the national development plan it has a basis for ongoing government involvement towards doing the whole nation. Timing is a critical factor in moving at this time because of the readiness of government, external funding agencies, and availability of troops.

In the arena of Demonstration Strategies in Area Kinshasha, the Order by 1980 will have launched a pilot cluster project of 4 villages around Kapini, which incorporates training of forces with ITI and HDTS, and will include regular circuiting of the villages utilizing various impact events and local planning and actuation. This will position Zambia for possible national replication by the following year.

In the arena of Demonstration Strategies in Area Lagos by June 1980, the Order will have conducted awakening events around Ijede and will have positioned itself to initiating a buffer project in northern Nigeria by 1980-81.

CONTINENTAL REPLICATION STRATEGIES CONTINENT SEAPAC

In Continent SEAPAC, the demonstration strategies for 1979-80 will include the following objectives:

In Area Manila, it is proposed that the Mactan Demonstration is ready to move from the establishment of an anchor project in the initial cluster model to geographic coverage in 1979-80. A total of 33 projects would be initiated on Mactan and Cebu and 2 HDTS would be held, resulting in 100+ trained nationals. Authorization for this move is with the Ministry of Local Government and Community Development. Funding would be provided by the Philippine Interagency Council for one cluster, and World Bank for the other.

In Area Jakarta, the proposed replication model for 1979-80 is to "Do the Nation" through the authorization of the Ministry of Home Affairs with funding support by the Indonesian government, International Aid Agencies, and private sources. 18 projects and 3 training schools would be components of this demonstration in 79-80.

In Area Tokyo, demonstration in Korea in 79-80 would result in national positioning for the future launching of 10 strongholds around each of the 2 projects. In 79-80, 7 forays into 7 provinces would be done to research future projects, plus 2 major training events. Authorization includes support of the Saemaul Community Movement and the success of Kuh Du E Ri. Funding would lie in support by private Korean companies and potential church and government support.

THE GRID

In the arena of the SEAPACgrid we propose:

1. that there be no changes made at this time in the continent or area grids.
2. that these changes be made within areas:
 - Area Tokyo - change name of region Sendai to Sapporo
 - Area Singapore - change name of region Manado to Ujung Pandang
regrid combining regions Singapore and Kota Kinabalu as
region Singapore and splitting region Jakarta as regions
Jakarta and Surabaya.



3. that every House in SEAPAC do the kind of geo-social research that was done in Europe during the past year.

CONTINENTAL COUNCIL

In order to empower the continental mission, we propose a continental council to be held Week 13 of Quarter II. At this time the geo-social research will be pulled together and the question of the grid reviewed.

CONTINENTAL COLLOQUIUM

We propose that the continental colloquium held this Council consider the following:

1. create the story of "one thrust" in SEAPAC for the coming year to give a common focus to the continent.
2. look at the advantages and vulnerabilities of one vs. two Nexus locations in SEAPAC.
3. consider how to open up Area Bangkok this year.

In approaching the Summer of 1980 and in preparation for the new decade and the new millenium, Councils will become a primary tool in shaping images of the global vision, in developing campaign strategies for the global task and in deeping the common resolve. The Global Priors Council has particularly expressed concern for councils' strugglin anew with an adequate geo-social analysis of their geography, with rebuilding the strategies for orchestrating the two campaigns, and with mobilizing the training dynamics necessary to strengthen the movemental forces and provide massive formation. It is recommended that a yearly rhythm be established by each continent which allows for an appropriate rotation of continental, areal and regional councils, and providing for any decision about future Global Councils.

In looking thru GRA documents and Council working papers, these specific recommendations were found:

I That Continental Councils

- be held late in Quarter II
- use the global symposium method
- do geo-social analysis
- design grand and operational strategies
- build 4 year plans and design a trans rational global holding chart.
- build strategies relative to demonstration towns.

II That Area Councils

- build 4 and 1 year impact plans
- workshop the myth factor
- workshop framing network exchange plans
- plan the order prowess training needs
- build a strategy for offensive framing
- look at ur and culture studies
- commonize models for sojourn and intern relationships

Other arenas which were suggested for consideration at area level were: urban strategies, expansion, replication, relationships with established religions, self-support, development plans, order council financing, youth meetings and special troop configurations.

The GRA Documents on Foundational Contexts and M.A.P. strategies should definately be used in the planning of the councils.

TASK FORCE COMMENT

We recommend the foregoing Guidelines (overleaf) and Covenant to this Council in this context: The guidelines and covenant are meant to set broad parameters for the greatly variant experimentation now going on across the globe where demonstration and awakening are converging. They are meant to outline a strategy and not to suggest a program. They intentionally do not set goals or numerical objectives. It is further our recommendation that Operations Centrum begin to pull together common models of implementation such as designs for the community modular events and a "consult" design. It seems to us imperative that we leave this Council with continental and/or areal symbology which gives momentum to the direction indicated by the guidelines.

The Project Transition Event will mark the completion of the consultant role of the auxiliary and the transition of the project into a demonstration of self-sustenance and extended care. The following are the objectives of such a transition event:

1. Symbolizes community self-reliance, self-confidence, self-sustenance through the redefinition of the catalytic core.
2. Refocuses the community vision through the creation of a 2 year development plan.
3. Celebrates the completion of two years of actuation through the documentation of program implementation.
4. Displays the community's commitment to the globe through the decision to occasion awakenment in the surrounding geography.
5. Rehearses community polity through the full operation of the community organization structures.

It is recommended that the 24 original projects as well as other two year old projects which have not already dramatized this transition use this instrument as a rite of passage to a new phase. The enclosed model used in the Nadlapur H. D. P. is offered as a possible design for global use.

THE GLOBAL BAND OF 24

In the arena of the Band of 24, it is the intent of the Order to give the entire band to history by transferring control of the community structures and programs to local residents, documenting the dramatic changes, and establishing linkages of each project with regional support networks and with surrounding communities.

Recommendations:

1. We recommend intensifying the Band of 24 by distinguishing two groups of projects for conducting the transition experiment:

A: Communities in which no I.C.A. staff will reside by June 30, 1980 but to which continued support will continue.

B: Communities in which I.C.A. staff will continue to reside beyond June 30, 1980 in order to:

- a) conduct urban research,
- b) maintain continental and national strategy,
- c) operate training and program centers.

2. Recommend designing the maneuvers and configurations which will intensify the communities' engagement in Awakening and Demonstration programs and events in light of the total areal mission.
3. We recommend phasing the project transition to community leadership by holding the following events:
 - a) A Corporate Patterns (D.O.O.P.) Maneuver to strengthen community structures,
 - b) A Demonstration Community Circuit module to initiate the communities' participation in the Awakening Campaign,
 - c) A Community Economic Systems module to insure that the management of the communities' economics is in their own hands,
 - d) A Community Assembly to evaluate the projects' journey and to plan the future directions.
- 4) We recommend that Global Operations Centrum conduct a management skills school and create maneuvers to insure the economic viability of local industries.
- 5) We recommend preparing a design for symbolizing and publicizing the new stance of community autonomy.

GLOBAL ORDER TRANSITION

In the arena of Global Order Transition, it is the intent of the Order to self-consciously symbolize through an event in 1980 the thrust of the 20 year march to come and the Order journey into a pluriformity. The shape of the Order would be formally celebrated in 1984.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Prepare during the 1980 council a new working draft of the Prolegomena and Declaration of the Spirit Movement
2. Commission the 20 year march during the 1980 council
3. Hold 3 simultaneous GRAs in 1980
4. Hold 1980 Global Priors Council outside North America, preferably Third World
5. Create rationale for additional assignments to 1980 Global Priors Council
6. Begin preparation for 1984 Global Order Council
7. Create a 20 year timelined vision, broken down into 5 four year blocks of strategic objectives to inform the nature and structure of the new pluriform Order. Create a 5 year thematic journey timeline
8. Create a six month design for a series of Religious House collegiums, Area Council and Research Centrum sessions which would address the various issues of the 20 year vision and the pluriform Order during 1979-80. The results would be interchanged quarterly for further review and evaluation.
9. Work on the classes of the Order
10. Push the People of God triangles to establish clarity on the movemental, extended and symbolic Order dynamics
11. Research universal ordering dynamics
12. Research multiple forms of world religions
13. Devise rituals to empower the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience
