**CONTEXT**

History has brought us to a destinal turning point wherein a quantum leap is required. This leap moves us beyond the danger of plodding on a one-to-one individual basis in endless succession, to the new, emerging global society. This leap provides a new momentum to move through impact events and social demonstration to the one society, and to practically break open all 54 areas.

Making this leap gives us the concrete possibility of building the global mythology and provides a focus for our programing and research. This leap takes the "pressure" off of deeper and deeper commitment to hundreds of local situations, so that global awakenment and engagement can occur in thousands of local situations.

Moving now to the 54 areas enables us to claim our geography and take charge of it. For example: the USA in 1968; Latin America in 1973; and Maharastra in 1976. Moving to claim our geography was the first key step in catalyzing later explosions of the movemnet. We are now on all continents, and face a clear demand to cover all areas.

Moving now to the 54 areas empowers our concern for a global council. It enables us to move toward fulfilling our responsibility to the globe before the council.

**I YR STATEMENT**

In the arena of the Global Expansion Strategy, we will have launched into the social penetration of every area of the globe, by June 30, 1980.

This will involve the implementation of Phase I of the Area Penetration Scheme. It will require opening 7 new Area Houses, designating Priorship to an additional 8 Areas and assigning practical research of the untapped Areas to the Centrum Band and the adjacent activated Areas.

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ARENA 24 Transition.

## STRATEGIC PILLARS

In the arena of the 24 transition dealing with Transition Pillars, by June 30, 1980, we will have held five common events globally in every one of the 24 Showpiece Projects. These events will be commonly designed and orchestrated:

1. A Corporate Patterns (D.O.O.P.) Manoeuvre in relation to the Community structures.
2. A demonstration community circuit module for the village's participation in the awakenment campaign.
3. A Community Economic Systems module to assure that the management of the community's economics is in their bands.
4. Experimentation with the voyage construct for village leadership.
5. The holding of Consult II.

## FORMAL DOCUMENTATION

In the arena of the 24 transition dealing with Formal Documentation by June 30, 1980, we will have documented the 24 in relation to the economic, social, political and human factors. Screens will be established to objectify the profound journey of the villages through each of the four arenas. Each of the 24 Projects will write its documentation and forward it to Research Centrum for publication. A selected number of Projects will invite professional evaluators to do formal documentation for worldly credibility.

## DEMONSTRATION EXTENSION

In the arena of the 24 Transition dealing with Demonstration Extension by June 30, 1980, we will initiate a local band of at least four demonstration communities around each of the 24. Each Project training and deploying its residents will implement an impact campaign within its surrounding geography, a follow up and selection circuit, a globally consensed set of guidelines for actuation within at least four demonstration communities and an ongoing circuit rythm (no less than bi-monthly). This process would effectively begin with an impact training week in the HDP which ends in actually launching the impact campaign. Strike forces and GRA tools will be crucial to this strategy.

## LEADERSHIP MATURATION

In the arena of the 24 Transition dealing with Leadership Maturation, we will have a core of corporate local leadership in each of the 24 who:

1. Are able to discern contradictions, plan and implement programs and are involved in all project decision-making.
2. Are managing the local programs and have ongoing management training structures for their replacements.
3. See themselves as part of Global Social Demonstration.

A significant number will have participated in HDTS or modules, as well as movemental councils. Project leadership will be responsible for 10 impact and demonstration circuits in their regions.

#### SHOWPIECE INTREGITY

In the arena of the 24 Transition dealing with Showpiece Integrity by June 30, 1980, each of the 24 Projects demonstrate excellence in economic development through generating projects from community-managed industries and businesses that are channeling substantial support into Social Programs; and striking community design highlighted by a unique community landmark; a weekly, quarterly, yearly rythm of events which reflect corporate patterns; and programs that care for the health, education and welfare of the community that are visible and self sustaining.

#### GLOBAL-LOCAL SIGNIFICANCE

In the arena of the 24 Transition dealing with their global-local significance, by June 30, 1980, we will have related to each Project the particularity of the sign that it is within its own societal contradiction.

This would be done by having a workshop with the local guild and auxiliary to articulate the particular sign quality over againstthe local contradiction. The strategic global particularities and roles of the 24 would be decided and bombined with the local imput and areal discernment of the significange give an articulation of the global story of the 24 and documentation of their diverse accomplishments in the field of human development. One concrete result might be a second blue book highlighting the global-local significance of the band of 24 as they enter the time of transition.

ARENA CONTINENTAL IMPACT STRATEGIES

SEAPAC

By June 1980, the Order will have moved to the next phase in all of the Areas by doing:

1. Systematic Geographic Coverage (county and polis level) of GCF in Japan, New Zealand and S. Korea.
2. Strategic Mass Demonstration (multifurcated forums and clusters) in Fiji, Korea, Taiwan, Malaysia, Australia, Indonesia and Hong Kong, including demonstration towns and communities.
3. Massive Geographic Coverage (every village or region) in Guam, Western Samoa and American Samoa.
4. Inclusive Social Programme (network invitation and engagement) in the Marshall Islands and Mactan.
5. Forays into Bangkok.
6. ITI in Western Samoa and HDTS in Area Manila and Area Singapore.
7. New project initiation in Indonesia as a result of multiple forums.

EURASIA

By June 1980, the Order will position for work in this continent 1) by making pilot forays into Eastern Europe from Area Frankfurt and 2) doing research entrees into Eurasia from networks (i. e. universities, corporations, religious orders) and establishing ourselves in Vienna as the port of entry to Eastern Europe in Stockholm and Frankfurt.

CONTINENT ORIENT

By June 1980, the Order will:

--penetrate present openings of borders to the world by intentionalizing contacts with China through occasional forays (probably as a tourist) and building a file of contacts.

--have made unofficial research and contacts which will have produced additional data to enable recommendations to be brought to 1980 Council regarding overt ICA presence in China. Research will be conducted in Area Hong Kong from Korea, Japan, the Philippines and others that will be available.

Continent NAME

By June 30, 1980, we, the Order, will do a cluster demonstration with the other villages in Bayad's "local council unit" catalyzed by Bayad villagers.

By June 30, 1980, we, the Order, will do continental areal investigation in Areas Algiers and Istanbul, bracketing areas Tehran, Addis Abbaba, and Beirut.

By June, 30, 1980, we, the Order, will do research forays into the Sudan, Khartoum region, or Area Cairo.

By June, 30, 1980, we, the Order will impact networks of Cairo using LENS, Global Womens Forum, etc.

By June, 30, 1980, we, the Order will polish the El Bayad Human Development Project by doing practical visible signs

By June 30, 1980, we, the Order, will do systematic geographic coverage with a total of 250 Community Forums (10 per governorate), including 100 forums under UNICEF sponsorship.

Continent LATIN AMERICA

By June 30, 1980, we, the Order:

Will begin the breakloose of corporations thru the use of a Lens Trek in October or November.

Will build the Guardian Network by having a continental Guardian Meeting in April or May

Will hold LENS, GWF, GYF and explore framing possibilities in Columbia and Argentina.

Will have held a Town Meeting in each region and explored and have begun to develop funding sources in San Jose Region (Costa Rica).

Will hold at least one Town Meeting in every metro, explore and begin to develop funding sources in Region Mexico City.

Will build a strong colleague base by holding Town Meetings in each region in Chile, Brazil and Jamaica.

**CONTINENT: Sub-Asia**

In the arena of Continental Impact Strategies and dealing with the Maharashtra replication plan, by June 30, we will move towards 100 Town Meetings in one taluka of each of the 25 districts in preparation towards the 2500.

In dealing with Human Development project expansion in Sub Asia, we will do impact events and town meetings to release one project in Area Calcutta and one project in Region Colombo in Area Madras (Schrilanka) and village clusters (town meetings) around Sikror and Nadlapur.

To impact the 15% networks of the 4 active areas in India, we will hold impact events in the key areal cities of Bombay, Delhi, Calcutta, Madras, also Hyderabad and the 25 division centers of Maharashtra.

**In Continent Europe:**

We will do strategic mass demonstrations (multiple forums in selected territories, i.e. clusters throughout the region) in Areas London, Paris, Rome and Frankfurt, namely the nations of Ireland, U.K., France, Italy, Netherlands, Belgium, West Germany and Austria.

We will do massive geographic impact (every village invited-massive regional coverage) in Area London, around the Tairgwaith HDP, Area Paris, in the Brussels region, Area Rome, around Termine and area Frankfurt in Frankfurt Rbgiön (Ruhr Valley).

We will do regional forum pilots (demonstration events in each region) in Areas Madrid and Stockholm, namely the following countires, Spain, Protugal, Finland, Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland.

We will do regional geographic proves (regional demonstration events\*\* in Area Madrid, region Madrid, and Aaea Stockholm, Stockholm Region.

**BLACK AFRICA**

By June 30, 1980, the Order will move to strategic mass demonstrations (multiple forums in selected territories) of village meetings in southern Nigeria, possibly in the whole country.

-will hold an ITI in Area Douala and establish an ICA presence.

-will do impact saturation in 41 locations across Kenya.

-will hold an HDTI in Ijede with participants from Ghana, followed by impact forums in Ghana and hold an ITI in Zambia with participants from Zaire, Botswana and Malawi.

NORTH AMERICA

By June 1980, the Order will:

- deal with saturation in North America for future positioning by doing massive geographic impact in at least one to two states per area and one province in Canada.
- carry out a coordinated mass demonstration by the three Native American projects (Minto, Vogar, Inyan Wakagpai and Pisinemo) in the surrounding Native American communities.
- do city saturation with all the battery of impact tools tying into strategic cities decided by each area.
- combine forces from across areas and bi-areas to carry out the state campaigns.
- have operations and development center teams out of Chicago working with the areas on funding, authorization and framing, packet creation public relations to do the targeted state campaigns and position others.

## STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE STATEMENTS

ARENA REPLICATION SCHEMES

Group 4

1) CIRCUIT CLUSTER EXPERIMENTS

In the arena of replication schemes dealing with Circuit Cluster Experiments by June, 1980, we the Order will have launched 4 varied but similar experiments in the Philippines, Korea, Indonesia and Mississippi to develop new alternatives for doing the 2,000,000 villages. The 4 experiments will use existing Order personnel (i.e. no additional extrationals) and village leadership. To maintain basic commonality, each experiment will operate within a 2-year timeline and utilize all of the following dynamics: initiating consults, regular circuits, the HDTs, a mass awakenment campaign, and regular village interchange structures.

2) POSITIONING FOR MULTIPLE REPLICATION POSSIBILITIES

In the arena of Replication Schemes we are dealing with positioning for multiple replication possibilities by June, 1980. In order to do this we, the Order, will conduct Mass Awakenment Campaigns surrounding the original 24 HDP's, the 30 expansion HDP's and the 232 HDP's in Maharashtra. This will be done through local and area maneuvers using existing troops.

3) CONTINUE MAHARASHTRA MASS REPLICATION EXPERIMENT

In the arena of Replication schemes dealing with Mass Replication Experiment, by June, 1980, we, the Order, will position ourselves with the necessary strength to go from the 232 to the 2500 in the state of Maharashtra with reduced numbers of outside troops in order to carry on this experiment on behalf of the globe. The emphasis is on establishing permanent Indian repositories, deepening the frame, the advanced training of existing troops and village leadership, and on divisional teams. The Block Model will be experimented with as soon as possible where we have authorization and strength to do so.

4) NATIONAL MASS REPLICATION IN KENYA

In the arena of Replication schemes dealing with Mass Replication, by June 1980, we, the Order, will initiate an example of nation-wide village development in Kenya, utilizing existing troops plus a replication support unit, and will incorporate impact events, divisional level projects, HDTI and the involvement of government in funding and actuation. The intent will be to build on replication learnings and establish a major replication scheme in Sphere South.

5) SUPPORT AND MONITORING

In the arena of Replication Schemes dealing with the support and monitoring of the replication and circuit cluster experiments, by June, 1980, we, the Order, will have compiled and distributed learnings which were accumulated throughout the year. A monitoring unit will be established in the Global Operations Band in each nexus to gather information by direct communication, sit visits, HDTI faculty and consult participation.

### Urban Strategy Research

In the arena of urban probes dealing with urban strategy research, by June 30, 1980, a five person team representing Fifth City, Uptown, North Shore, Research Centrum (master strategist) and another urban center will create a long range urban strategy that can be tested and used in any urban area.

Based in Fifth City, they will experiment in moving through the project to urban impact, define an operating image of a renewed city, define entry points to the economic, political and cultural networks which have the highest potential for catalyzing renewal, experiment with unique configurations of urban settlement, delineate the application of existing tools and define what new tools need to be created. The team will also coordinate regular interchange between all other cities where experimentation in intensive urban impact is taking place.

### Coordinated Planning

The strategic objective is to build coordinated continental/areal/regional strategies and manoeuvres to maximize effectiveness in the urban centres. This is particularly crucial to intensify use of networks for impact, funding and framing. Centurms and area/regional houses will build corporate strategies and manoeuvres at Councils. Any visits to the areas by Centurms will be carefully scheduled in coordination with consensed strategies and manoeuvres.

ARENA THE SECOND 30

SYMBOLIZE VICTORY

In the arena of the overall victory of the thirty expansion projects, the Order will ensure that by June, 1980, the projects:

1. Symbolize their victory to themselves  
(ie... 2nd consult, celebrations,)
2. Become dramatic visible sign through program victory infrastructure and construction.
3. Become a symbol to society at large (i.e: reception of a major grant, media articles and requests for training)
4. Turn outward to operating on behalf of society  
(i.e: residents visit other projects, involvement in awakenment campaigns, residents help staff other projects, taking their story to others.)

The implications of this strategic objective are:

In North America -

\*staging massive awakenment campaigns, for example doing a state/region campaign off the story of the U.S. 12.

\*opening doors to social networks thru projects that deal with particular lifestyles or ethnic groups.

\*use the project as a training center for agencies and other communities.

In SEAPAC

\*training government agencies in rural development nodels.

In SUB ASIA

\*formulating area autonomy.

In EUROPE

\*demonstrating a highly visible economic sign

In Latin America

\*breaking loose the continent thru impact & training across all six areas

\*flanking and positioning for 6 new projects, one per area, to be initiated in Oct, 1980.

TRANSITIONAL EXPANSION

In the arena of Transitional Expansion, the Order, by June 30, 1980, will capitalize on areal advantages by:

1. Initiating an anchor project in Japan in Okinawa prefecture.
2. Initiate Ottawa Commonwealth springboard in Area Montreal
3. Initiate final Singapore project in Surabaya Region.

**SUB-CATEGORY: STRENGTHEN ESTABLISHED CHURCH RELATIONS**

During 1979-80 we will extend and deepen our relation to the established Christian Church. The advantage created through the Roman Catholic networks has generated significant funding and a protective frame of authorisation. In this coming year, we will go beyond this level to targetting Religious Orders and historical church structures for the programs of the movement, including LENS, GWF & possibly the Voyage. This past years' learnings have indicated that this would provide troops for the task as well as strengthen the funding and authorisation commitments.

Develop centrum would take responsibility for collecting and making available to each house lists of Religious Order & other church structures who have supported us in some way.

The Rome House will need to have a particularly heavy emphasis in this arena, therefore troops would need to be assigned accordingly.

**SUB-CATEGORY: FILL OUT GLOBAL CHURCH FRAME**

At least once this year, every House will cultivate and nurture key church authorization figures to involve them in our ongoing task. This will be done in relation to areal campaigns. This could involve requests for funds, troops, contacts and gathering data for possible demonstration communities. All contacts need to be written up and reported to Development Centrum.

**SUB-CATEGORY:**

In our relationship with major world religions, the strategic objective is to intentionalize already established collegial relations at the local level to explore and define arenas of service. In the coming year we would initiate this dialogue in Malaysia, Indonesia or Nigeria in respect to the Islamic structure. Research Centrum will receive the findings for evaluation.

In the arena of forms of the Order, dealing with Continuing experiments towards the Pluralistic Order, by June 1st 1980 we will

commonise an initial clarity throughout the Order on basic elements of our current self-discovery and growth as a Pluriform Order. This will involve exploring and articulating our indicative situation, foundational clarity, issues, useful experiments, and one public story. The elements to be considered include: some rudimentary and temporary forms in the Order to which all members can say yes; exploring the rule or foundational covenant as possibly expressible in alternative poetries; guidelines of clarity or acceptable unclarity for self-support and the Funds for situations such as Philippines or Kenya; establishing a common image for one-year internship with an orientation which is the same across the board; House collegiums so that the whole Order is aware of the issues and participates in shaping the directions; using the viewpoints of national governments and the historic church to check the building of our public story about who the Order is, and articulating the basic whys of symbolic life and social forms as the way that the Ordering dynamic manifests itself in history.

If we do these things we will be able to arrive at Caracas on July 1st with a consensus about what to do and what not to do during the first ten minutes of the opening session, and we will have built ourselves a context about, and for, all who come.

. . . . . , dealing with journeying full-time local forces to global assignments, by June 30 1980 we will have 225 new globally assignable troops.

It is anticipated that these are troops who are already engaged in the local mission in India, Latin America, Indonesia, Philippines, Korea, Africa, Australia, North America, Europe and Japan. In light of the fact that roughly 50% of these colleagues are Hindu, Muslim, or Buddhist, this move will dramatise the issue that we are a pluriform Order.

ARENA RELIGIOUS HOUSE

In the arena of the Religious House dealing with global commonness and local appearance by June 30 1980 the external and internal Religious House space will be appropriate to the community and will display a beckoning style. Every house will have a minimum of three pieces of common decor in place (world grid, Profound Humanness Chart, Guild Symbol)

In the arena of the Religious House dealing with the common liturgical experiment by June 30, 1980 we will have experimented with a different form each quarter beginning with Tagore Quarter II. During Quarter II ecclesiola sodality will include an exercise in liturgical writing. Global Research Centrum will be responsible for gathering and refining the material from each house in time to create a liturgical form for the next quarter. Quarter III and Quarter IV

In the arena of the Religious House dealing with reseach by June 30, 1980 we will have completed a research project in each house. Collegiums will be used to do an in depth series of studies on the culture/Ur/major religion in the area in which the house is based. At Sept Area Council each area will decide which culture/Ur/religion to study. Ecclesiola will be used to expeirment with myth conversations, story, dance, drama and other cultural forms. Celebrations will be built around cultural images with houses participating in and reflecting on cultural events. Quarterly reports will be sent into Global Research Centrum.

In the arena of the religious house dealing with weekly spirit events, every house will by June 30, 1980 structure time each week for reflection and nurture meetings.

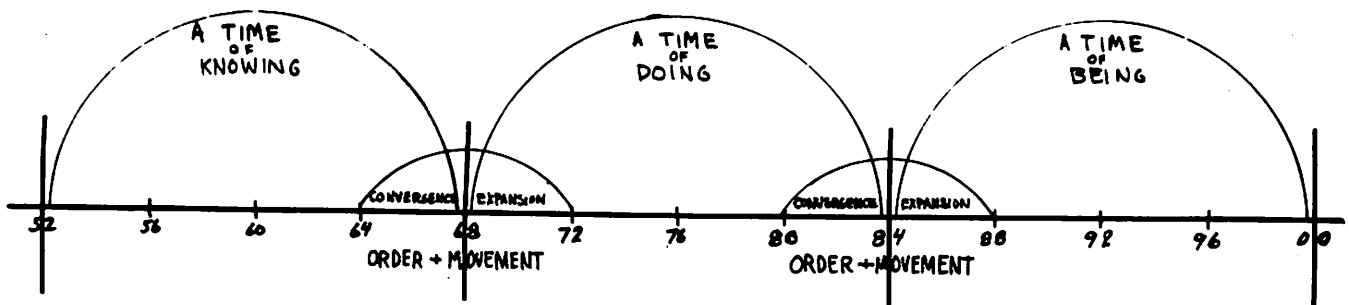
In the arena of the Religious House dealing with creating disciplined people for the task by June 30, 1980 we will at each area council in Sept create a set of guideline for economic, political and cultural life of sojourning and interning in the Religious Houses of that Area. The workshop would include the rituals with mark the beginning and ending points of the journey. These models will be brought to the July 1980 Global Order Council with reflections.

IN THE ARENA OF THE 1980 GLOBAL ORDER COUNCIL WHICH DEALS WITH GATHERING OUR ENTIRE BODY IN ONE COUNCIL, by June 30, 1980, WE WILL HAVE COMPLETED ALL PREPARATIONS AND MOVED INTO THE STAGING OF THE COUNCIL.

In calling a Council in 1980. the Order is signaling to itself that it is entering a four year time in which it is completing 16 years of profound "Doing" and preparing itself for a corresponding time of profound "Being". A helpful analogy can be drawn from a similar period of our history, 1964-1968 during which time we declared our intention to operate together as an experimental order, proclaimed the emergence of the spirit movement and deployed ourselves to local Religious Houses to nurture and care for that movement as we crossed over from a time of "knowing" to a time of "doing" across the globe. The 1980 Council would symbolize to us the radical plurality of our body and mark the beginning of a four year period in which we would articulate the new myth of a global historical order committed to enabling local man to create the human forms of the 21st Century.


THE JOURNEY OF OUR BODY

**STRUCTURAL CARE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS**

In this arena it is proposed to continue the cluster network during the year 1979-1980 to care for 72 North American 10th, 11th, and 12th graders. The intent of the clusters is to provide the framework in which students who have already made the decision to be vocated in the life of service can acquire excellence in academic and vocational skills, while at the same time providing the context for those students who have not yet made the vocational decision in which to formulate that. A corporate context is to be designed among the students, their parents, the religious house priorship and the Phase I program which allows a clear understanding on the part of all in relationship to the intent of the clusters. The components of the context are: 1) students primary mission is to be students, and they need to be enabled to excell in the academic; 2) participation in extra-curricular activities is an important part of being a high school student; 3) participation in movement-building would take place primarily through the impact forums. The clusters would provide the nucleus of the CYF national faculty through scheduling regular training modules and actual teaching of the events. The future implication would be the competency and availability in relationship to the special events and work-days in nearby HDP's; 4) the academic and extra-curricular school activities, movement-building and religious house activities are complimentary - one does not exclude the other; 5) equal participation with all other members in the internal life structures of the religious house; 6) opportunities for gainful employment where expedient and/or necessary.

The image of "it is possible to work out the tensional dynamics between school and movement-building" will be the primary one in creating the context for the clusters. The proposed configurations for the year 1979-80 allow the experimental phase of larger clusters to begin. The edge of the larger clusters would be to provide sustenance and priorship within the cluster and call forth the emphasis and interchange in relationship to availability of academic and vocational skills. This would take the form of post-school modules designed to address the training needs, both current and anticipated, of the students within the particular clusters. The role of the clusters in relationship to the urban strategies would also be explored.

Two experimental clusters of 8 to 10 students each are proposed for the starred cities of Houston and New York. The alternate designated cities are 1) Milwaukee, 2) Indianapolis, 3) San Francisco, 4) Denver, 5) Memphis and 6) New Orleans. These two clusters would be accompanied by one adult staff in each location who would have primary responsibility for the cluster victory. All other clusters would receive 3 to 4 students.

**NORTH AMERICAN STUDENT HOUSE EXPERIMENT:**

In this arena, it is proposed that the Student House be moved from experimentation to program and that the assigned Student House staff determine and initiate it's program for the next six years. The documentation of the concluded Student House experiment and consideration of replication models will be done by Research Centrum.

#### 9th GRADE HDP DEPLOYMENT YEAR

In the arena of the 9th grade year of HDP deployment, it is proposed that the experiment begun in North America, 1978-79, be continued and expanded to include students from other continents. As it now exists, the model calls for students in their 9th grade year (ages 14-15) to participate fully in the globalizing work-experience of a human development project. During the past year, the 15 globally-deployed 9th grade students and the 10 students assigned to North American projects experienced the profound transition from the parochial to the global that can occur in this program. As well, the year marked an appropriate mediation from the Student House to adult structures and provided a grounding experience for the next three years of high school academics. Finally, the year allowed for a structure within which students could act out the care they had been trained to exercise in their previous two years of Student House life.

Practically, to continue the experiment in North America a new funding support structure needs to be created which will be independent of funds raised exclusively in the Student House. This will allow for the consistent application of the deployment model year after year and will release the model from dependence only on Student House business enterprises (which also support 100% of the Student House program costs). The sharing scheme proposed for future North American older student global assignments combines both earned and developed funds to support the deployment of a student, i.e., Student House earnings would sponsor the \$300.00 cost of correspondence school for one year (per student) as well as contribute \$200.00 (per 9th grade student) into the global travel fund; whereas, family and Order development would raise an additional \$500.00/student for the global travel fund. These resources should cover the basic travel and educational cost/student for most global student assignments. As well, all ticketing needs to be handled through standard Order and Operations Centrum structures. It is further recommended that a similar model be considered, at the area level, for non-North American Order students during their 9th grade year or at whatever equitable level would apply.

#### THE INTERNATIONAL SUMMER CAMP

In the arena of the International Summer Camp, by June 30, 1980 we will emphasize the role of the Summer Camp as a globalizing experience for youth of the Order around the world and make known to potential participants the procedures for attending. All details of assignment, travel details, and expenses will be evaluated at the local levels.

#### GLOBAL EMERGING GENERATION CARE:

In this arena, Research Centrum (Chicago Nexus Phase I staff) will prepare a manual to be completed and delivered before the end of Quarter II, 1980 with basic structures and guidelines holding the key learnings of the six-year Phase I experiment. This will be used as a resource as religious houses and parents prepare the curriculum, structure, and events for emerging generation assigned to their care. In non-North American situations, the Phase I models will continue to be experimented with and renewed quarterly at the areal level, including consideration of an emerging generation and/or student house program.

#### POST HIGH SCHOOL RELATIONSHIP TO THE ORDER:

In this arena it is recommended that all high school graduates would by July 15th of each year declare their intention to the assignment commission or the priorship of the house to which they are at that time assigned as to their covenantal relationship with the Order as would any adult. Special consideration would be given to request for school or other assignments, but this would be objectified at that time as with any adult each year.

- 1) In the arena of training dealing with the need for all staff to be effectively and broadly trained, each operational level will conduct quarterly method labs. These labs will equip those who work in the mission in skills such as leading a meeting, pedagogy, conducting a conversation, priorship etc. The type and the duration of the labs will be designed to most enable the mission.
- 2) In the arena of training dealing with the need to do structured training. at every council by June 1980 each operational level will have had a training event held at every council. These regional, areal, continental and global council events would relate to the need discerned at the local level.
- 3) In the arena of training dealing with the advantage of global commonness and confidence in symbolic life practices, we will create quarterly training constructs that rehearse the rationale and procedures for all aspects of our common life. This will be done by the Global Research Band or a Training Centrum and be initiated by quarter II.
- 4) In the arena of Order training dealing with the need for practical training models for use in Houses a comprehensive training design will be build in quarter II councils, meeting at the operational level. This design will include methods training, common memory articles, development, management and operations skills with priority coming out of the local need.
- 5) In the arena of training dealing with the need to improve the pedagogical skills of the staff and their sensitivity to the need of their audiences each House and Nexus by June 1980 will have reestablished the program evaluation before, during and after for all courses and modules.
- 6) In the arena of training dealing with the pressure of the mission consuming all the available time, each operational level will make and foolow quarterly time designs which include training, brooding and corporate reflection. This may include time set aside for reading and private study.
- 7) In the arena of training dealing with the need for trained local leadership and ICA staff, by June 1980 each HDP will have one HDTs module held in its community inviting local leadership from each of the Demonstration towns of the saturation strongholds. Then required modules may be held in the Demonstration Communities.
- 8) In the arena of training metods dealing with self support by Jan 1. 1980 each operational level will identify one existing advantage to be seen as an experiment for using our training methods and skills for self support purposes. This could be a "Training Inc." type venture, a global language course, manual writing or specialized workshops for selected groups.

- 1) In the arena of research dealing with the emerging global mythology, by end of 1980 we will have working papers as a result of careful global interchange on the transparentization of the Urs, cultures and religions of the world. This will be coordinated by the research Centrum.
- 2) In the arena of research dealing with the current state of the globe, by June 1980 Research Centrum will have working papers regrounding our geo-social analysis and pressure points.
- 3) In the arena of research dealing with the pioneering dynamic in history, by June 1980 we will have entered into an indepth exploration of the seven revolutions and our strategic relationship to them. This will be grounded by using selected opportunities for in-field experimentation which are already available to us. Research Centrum will coordinate this work.
- 4) In the arena of research dealing with the need for commonality in our body, by June 1980 Research Centrum will discern the global tools for individual and corporate spirit care (eg. the Way, the Voyage, the briefcase library). Simple constructs will be devised for corporate and individual use.
- 5) In the arena of research dealing with the vocational resolve for local communities, by June 1980 Research Centrum will create a course (eg. CS-21, the Voyage) . This will assume a committed core leadership group in projects and Metro Cadres.
- 6) In the arena of research dealing with guidelines for later training and assignments, by June 1980 Research Centrum will design a 4-Phase journey model for TWC. This model will ground phases 2, 3, and 4 as phase 1 has been by our previous work.

DIRECTIONS TOWARD THE FIVE YEAR VISION

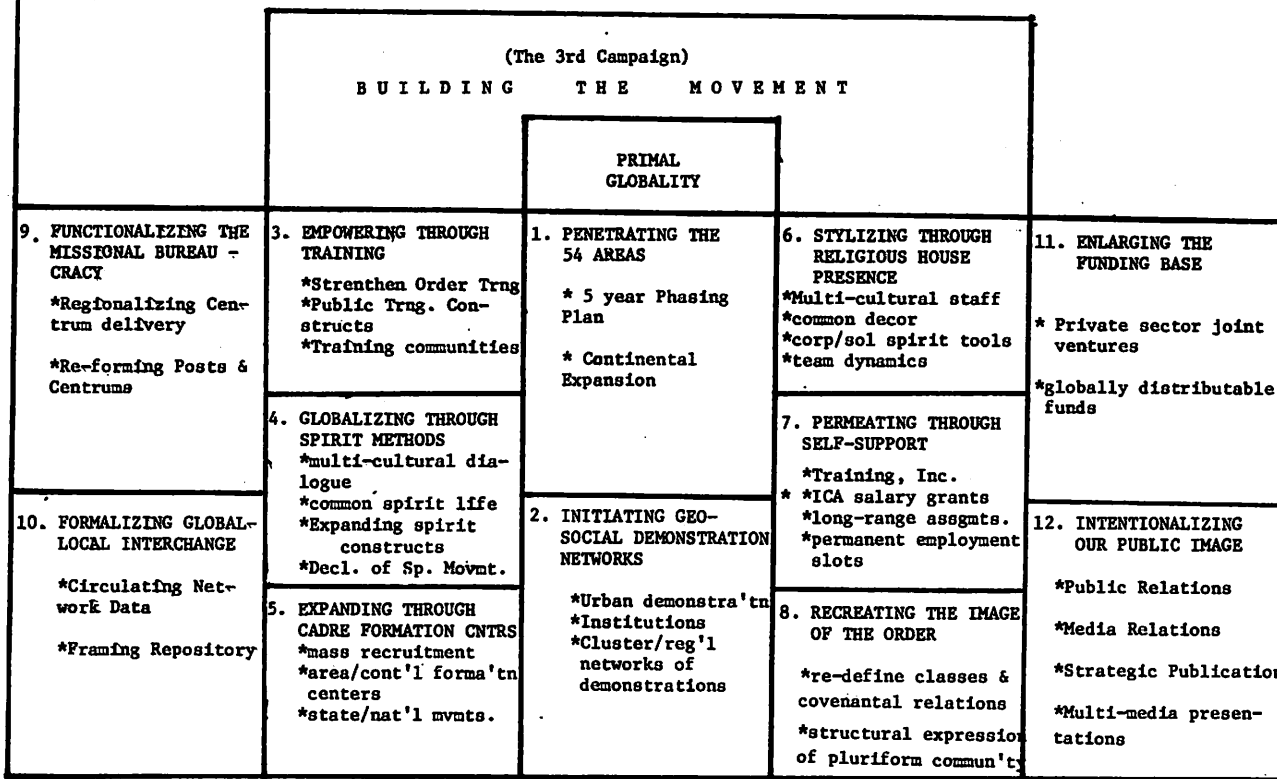
1. ~~Within~~ five years the Order will PENETRATE THE 54 AREAS of the globe. This will require a five-year phasing plan for areal coverage with all of our awakening and engagement tools.
2. Within five years the Order will INITIATE GEO-SOCIAL DEMONSTRATION NETWORKS. This will require expanding the number of urban demonstrations and linking them together. It will also require moving into strategically targeted institutional demonstrations such as schools and corporations. Finally it will require working in larger geographic regions where all levels of the social infrastructure, including the local communities, government and business, will be impacted and restructured.
3. Within five years the Order will EMPOWER THE MOVEMENT THROUGH TRAINING. This will require a basic image change from doing direct catalytic action to training others. We will strengthen our own order training, create new public training constructs which we will take on the road into communities.
4. Within five years the Order will GLOBALIZE THE MOVEMENT THROUGH SPIRIT METHODS. This will require maximizing the impact of the multi-cultural dialogue within the Order informed by a careful listening within each of the cultures. Common spirit life forms will be developed and used, through experimentation with transcultural myths, rituals, and artforms. New constructs carrying our accumulated wisdom in articulating the profound human depths will be invented. A new Declaration of the Spirit Movement will be called forth, announcing the presence in history of the 3rd Campaign.
5. Within five years the Order will EXPAND THE MOVEMENTAL BASE BY ESTABLISHING CADRE FORMATION CENTRES. This will require expanding and engaging available troop strength as rapidly as possible so as to enable the programmatic leap symbolized by 2 million villages. Areal and Continental formation centres consisting of a large training facility with a regular schedule of movement training events will be established. A linkage between major national and state movement and our own convergence campaign will be required, as is happening, for example, between our work in the Republic of Korea and the Samael Undong (New Village Movement).
6. Within five years the Order will DEMONSTRATE THROUGH THE RELIGIOUS HOUSES THE STYLE OF GLOBAL SERVICE. This will require the assignment of multi-cultural house staff, and the development of common cross-cultural decor, rituals, and corporate and solitary spirit tools. Team dynamics will be strengthened by careful assignment and by building an extended team model engaging house members and colleagues together in common tasks.

7. Within the next five years the Order will BROADLY PERMEATE SOCIAL STRUCTURES through radically intentionalizing our self-support structures. This will require expanding self-support training packages like Training, Inc., in various social arenas. It will require writing fees and salaries into program grants that allow us to continue our direct work in the field in cooperation with concerned public and private agencies, and committing long-term high salaried employment positions and providing intentionalized training for acquiring such positions. Positions in collegial structures that allow permanent employment through rotating Order personnel will be found.
8. Within five years the Order will RECREATE THE IMAGE OF THE ORDER AS PLURIFORM. This will require a restructuring of the Order classes and covenantal relations to allow for the recognition of the multi-faceted nature of the Order. Each House will be composed of various urs, nationalities, ages, and religious traditions.
9. Within five years the Order will FUNCTIONALIZE THE MISSIONAL BUREAUCRACY at all levels. This will require developing many of the Centrum dynamics at the Area/Rgl levels. This would include such things as common filing systems, new forms of monitoring through circuit teams and interchange systems. New posts or centruns may need to be formed to respond to new edges such as training and network relationships.
10. Within five years the Order will FORMALIZE THE STRUCTURES OF GLOBAL/LOCAL INTERCHANGE. This will require controlled yet accessible data circulation regarding network participation and potential, establishing a memory bank of data from areal framing maneuvers, and an annual internal publication of our learnings regarding the corporate journies of our various configurations.
11. Within five years the Order will ENLARGE THE FUNDING BASE. This will require obtaining operational grants which allow funds to be globally distributable. It will also require seeking private sector joint ventures in which a sponsor invests money, forces, materials, and technological assistance.
12. Within five years the Order will INTENTIONALIZE ITS PUBLIC IMAGE. This will require coordinating our public image through common public relations strategies, a public information post and a global editorial board. Everyone will be prepared to handle media relations, maintaining regular contact with friendly media people to assure more objective reporting in a time of high visibility. A wide range of quality publications will be required, possibly including a Journal for the general public. We expect to see increasing use of multi-media documentation and presentations. Imaginal methods will allow us to reach and train a wider range of emerging leadership.
