GLOBAL MANOUVERS

TASK FORCE: SYMBOLIC LIFE

The Corporate Life: The rehearsal of our stance in history through the Daily Office and the daily gathering for deliberation on issues in the Local Collegium are the anchors of our corporate life. As we are deployed into many places at all times of the day, the week and the quarter, it is urgently necessary that these anchors be filled with renewed efforts and energy. Where a Daily Office is done representationally for a house whose members are out on circuit, that office takes on global significance. It is critical also that the total Order emerge itself at other times in the three Acts of worship in the evenings, on Week II or on the road in a colleague's home. A free form of the three Acts will be done this year in as many settings as seem appropriate. The meal in many settings can be imbued with significance where depth reflection is injected into the occasion no matter where it is taking place. The collegium dynamic is not just a planning of immediacies but takes place also on many occasions. The same effort these occasions involve is also required daily where the daily office and collegium occur fully and regularly since routine is an enemy as well. We will grasp anew these dynamics by introducing the Daily Office with contexts for worship and collegiums on the function and design of the Local Collegium as described in "A Collection of Brief Essays on the Dynamics of Order Polity". Another tool is for each house to employ witness rationales, such as the facets of Profound Humanness presented during this Global Priors Council. During the year the collegium will produce three elements to guard the whole corporate body and its mission. One is preliminary broodings on the elements of a universal corporate office, to be generated in three collegiums across the Order, each transposing an Act of the Daily Office. This will be done in an entirely secular manner. A second is a rehearsal of Order Polity through a series of weekly collegium constructs studying the essays on the dynamics of Order Polity beginning in Quarter I and finishing in Quarter II before the first Panchayat election. The third is, in Quarter IV, the creation in collegium of a design for covering the total assigned geography, resulting in a vision of the whole globe for next summer. Also in this time of acceleration of geographic coverage our tasks have demanded flexibility and shifts in our quarterly rhythm and weekly time design. At the same time there are essential elements or dynamics in a creative and effective time design that are a part of our corporate wisdom that need to be rehearsed. Therefore, each house will do quarterly collegiums on the essentials of designing corporate and solitary time and build a time design for the quarter, week and day.

The Solitary Office: In a time of doing we show up in greater dispersal than ever before and our corporate gatherings for reflection and symbolic life become less frequent. The use of solitary constructs for reflection on our experiences of life as expenditure will enable us to live profoundly human lives as we participate in the three campaigns. Three tools to enable our reflection are journal writing, reflective screens and quarterly reflection. 1) Each Order member needs to keep a journal this year. A house or Area is encouraged to provide common bound journals for all members. There are various types of journal writing: chronicles or diary, charting and naming the day, profound learnings. Individuals are urged to experiment with the style to find that which is most helpful. 2) Two screens will be printed and distributed: the Profound Humanness Chart and the Comprehensiveness Screen. These are intended to be kept with the journal and used to enable reflection. In addition a card with a quotation will be printed. Individuals are to add a picture to this card and place it before themselves when writing in their journal. Circuiters may find it helpful to use this card as decor in their various short term accommodations. 3) Once a quarter Research Centrum will send a con-

MANEUVER PARAGRAPHS

One team was assigned the task of evaluating the GRA's GCF workbooks. This task included: "considering the workshop procedures and the form of the workbook", and producing "an alternative workbook design with simplified procedures."

GRA WORK

The team gathered GCF workbooks including those from Australia, Great Britain, India, Canada, Oklahoma - middle school, U.S. As most of the available workbooks were modeled on the U.S. T.M.'76 book, the evaluation centered around that document. The four movements of the workbook - challenges, proposals, story and interlude - were evaluated under the screen of function, gifts, challenges and proposals. Workbook evaluation questionnaire sheets were prepared and given to all task forces. The data compiled from these was used to inform the group's own evaluation.

THE PRESUPPOSITIONS

The four basic presuppositions used were:

1. The workbook is symbol: a symbol of the commonness of the global campaign done in a quality that honors the receiver.
2. The procedures create the life happening: the eight movements represent a proven life method.
3. Globally replicable-locally authentic: globally common procedures, imaginal format, and printing style, while allowing for locally authentic language and pictures.
4. Simplicity is key: easily read and understood, to allow people to see through to the method.

THE WORKBOOK

A working copy for a mock-up of an alternative G.C.F. workbook was produced. The values held by the team are reflected in the following:

1. Global commonness - methods approach.
2. Local flexibility - national/local cover, pictures, language and quotes.
3. Expanding consciousness of life - pictures, contextual statements.
4. Universal understandability - simplified wording for procedures.
5. Universal applicability relative to time and group size.
6. Campaign continuity - using gifts of past wisdom
7. Universal honoring - quality document, unpretentious.

This book is a model that needs to be transposed to your own nation. It includes pictures that were chosen on the basis of the other world, the qualities of profound humanness and action in the different G.C.F. dynamics. You can find or make pictures in your own nation that reflect the same intent.

This workbook includes the workshop leaders procedures, which the participants do not need. You make therefore two books.

Finally this workbook needs to be a reflection of the community's greatness and the day's significance. It is our gift to the community. This should be reflected in the quality of the workbook. We suggest a colour cover and black-white inside.

MANEUVER PARAGRAPHS

The North American Community Forum Saturation Maneuver will hold 3000 Community Forums by July 1, 1978, one in each county on the continent. The maneuver will encompass two nations, Canada and the United States and engage six divisions. The basic strategy of the maneuver is areally assigned teams involved in state or regional field maneuvers.

The Campaign Maneuver Frame defines the launch schemes, public base, activating systems and oblique maneuvers which will have insured that 2553 Town Meetings happened across the United States and 400 in Canada, completing the coverage of one per county.

The common story of the continental campaign includes the Community Forum Internal Story (4 x 4 and sentences) which answers the questions: How do the times we live in call for "Going to the Rural" and "Why are we doing this continent to the county level?" Phases of the Town Meeting Campaign (US) and Community Forum (Canada) provide the external story of the campaigns to be used publicly. The chart of United States GSD's to the Region provides an imaginal design of taking the GSD campaign to the regional level this year and shows its potential for impact on the mass awakening campaign.

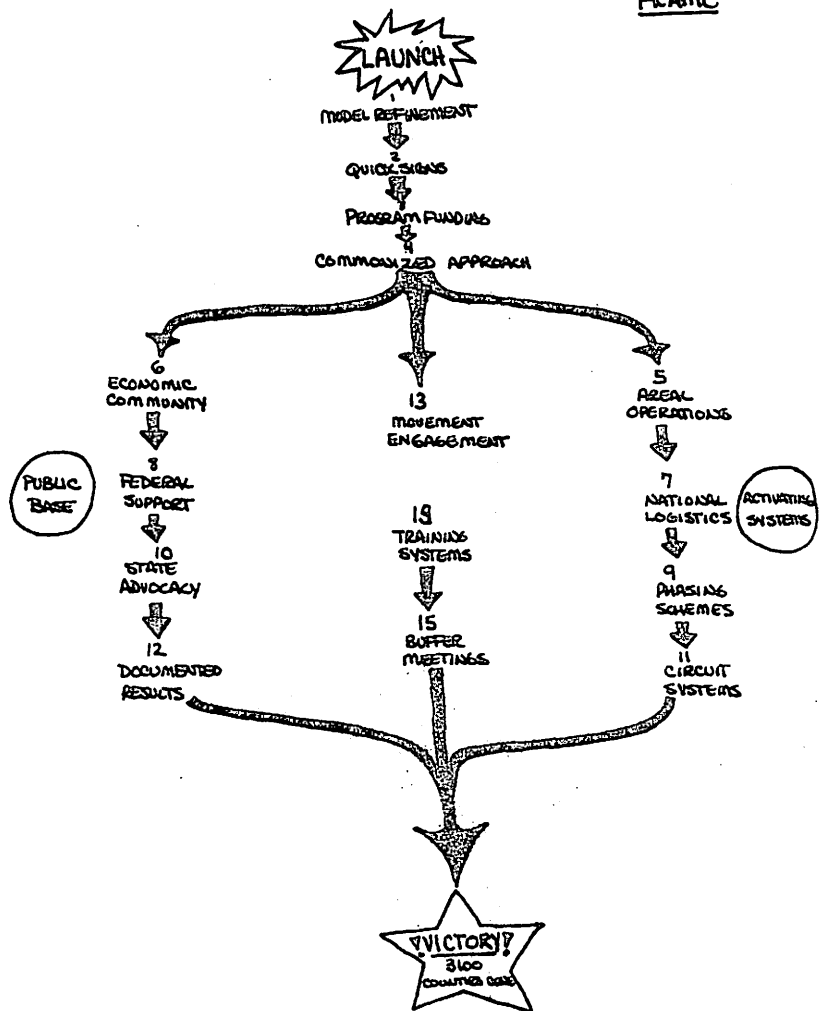
Guidelines were established for budgeting the maneuvers and program funding. The products include GCF cost parameters suggestions for how to develop program money, how to ensure receipt of program checks and a model for creating a quarterly maneuver budget.

Transrational phasing designs were created for the continent. An imaginal design for the year, giving quarterly images, tasks and events focused the campaign thrusts. Working charts of quarter objectives and maneuver foci are ready which distribute the 3000 Forums into "biteable numbers".

Canada's broad maneuver outline phasing model is designed to include all Canadian "counties". Signal maneuvers in New Brunswick and Manitoba will launch area teams into the year. The county map was designed and yellow now fills completed counties.

A North American Guidebook of task force products is prepared for North American Houses to focus the Area Council Planning.

TASK FORCE: MEMORIAL - REVIEW BOARD

CHICAGO

1977-1978

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

The task of this group was to review, edit and submit the proposed memorials to the Panchayat for final symbolic approval.

The Board did a first review and editing, and reported to the entire Council in Plenary session. A second editing followed, concentrating on concise wording and brevity. These were given to the Panchayat.

In addition, the Board prepared a statement concerning the memorial process, created titles for the 20 memorials, listed the memorials of the last two years, and designed a cover which symbolizes the importance of the memorials document.

We recommend that a similar process be followed next year, with a strong group of people with order memory assigned to the Board.

TASK FORCE: Self-Support

CHICAGO

1977-1978

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

The foundational intent of this global maneuver is to explode images of the self support resources available in any local situation. It has become critical that self support take on a new image as we move into new orbits of missional demand. This new image appears to have two elements.

- i. The self support potential of a House is maximized when all support resources become the focus of decision making rather than looking only at the income potential of the individual members of the order.
- ii. All troops in house regardless of assignment are responsible for self support. This has to do with breaking loose from static images of employment as the only way to earn income.

The Maneuver involves three points:

Improved preparation through corporate research

Breaking loose new possibilities through sharing exciting stories and rehearsing skills we have as an order.

Using practical workshop methods to corporately plan the comprehensive plan to win the self support way

This will be accomplished by holding house and area workshops. Suggested models are provided.

THE COUNTY-BY-COUNTY G.C.F. MANOEUVRE:

Because of the growing trend towards corporate responsibility and the capacity that community forums have for capturing the imaginations of "companies who care", we will fund the GCF campaign in the county-by-county acceleration of forums across the world. The breakthrough in development of this past year will be analysed to find the new leverage on large and small corporations, service organizations, and financial institutions; to corral the key corporations, organizations, visible and informal "round-table" leadership. Then we will launch a frontal attack with locally designed trans-rational development field-manoeuvres co-ordinated with GCF set-up manoeuvres, to put two armies in the one war to produce funded forums, large attendances, and strategic geographic coverage. Local forces led by a general from the religious house, and centrum forces will comprise the two armies. The long-range objective of these development manoeuvres is national and local organization and corporation commitment to the catalysis of primal community through support for replication, and expansion of the band of social demonstration communities. This manoeuvre will demonstrate the use of both large and small forces, and beginning in the countryside.

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN MANOEUVRE:

The seven global revolutions of our time are awakening the engagement of local man and calling for structures to form that engagement. Responses to these revolutions have included new agencies, departments and funding priorities such as emphasis on women in development projects, youth programs and technological assistance to the 3rd world. In order to fund our courses and programs aimed at these same revolutions, and to take advantage of being on the ground floor for these new mines, we will do probes into each of the seven arenas. We will do special follow-up of the 15% in GWF's, for HDP support and to help open up the network of women who care globally, such as Zonta International, Ambassadors' wives, International Business families, Business and Professional Women, etc. A special tour of HDP's might be arranged for wealthy patrons. Individuals and agencies with concern for appropriate technology will be approached for repository development, support, and for introduction to other such agencies around the world. Youth-orientated groups will be approached re: exchange programs, Youth Corps funding, school programs, In the USA, the successful Student House will be used as a saleable product and source of troops. Work will be co-ordinated between next to accelerate the break-open of ethnic and minority networks, especially in the developed countries, using the HDP's in their home countries for advantage.

THE MULTI-NATIONAL CONQUEST MANOEUVRE:

Riding on the responsiveness of large corporation support for HDP's and US Town Meeting, (notably British Petroleum, Gulf, Exxon, Barkley's Bank of London, the Royal Bank of Canada and the Bank of America), the seed monies needed for 12 U.S. HDP's, 12 others around the world, and GCF matching funds will be met through their engagement and support. This manoeuvre would involve a webbing of local offices near HDP's and their Head Offices, of corporation clout, and of previous support. An appeal to the public image of "a responsive corporate citizen" to deal with the basic needs of the world will be made, with ITT as a point of catalysis for this manoeuvre. Site visits and consult participation will be hand-in-hand with proposals and result in a network of support of the 200 key corporations strategically worked by the Global Band.

THE SELF-SUPPORT ASSISTANCE MONIES TAPPING MANOEUVRE With the increased authorization we have received from both the public and private sectors of society for the credibility of the GSD and GCF program effectiveness, a major effort will be made to tap and release existing funds for staff and program support. The Global Development Band will work with each HDP auxiliary to secure those public monies allocated for support of service volunteers, such as CITA, CEDA, VISTA, Peace Corps, AID, UNDP, AVA in Australia and equivalent agencies in each nation. Also, the Band, working with the acceleration treks will probe and secure support funds from interested groups within the private sector such as pharmaceutical corporations, farmer's associations and service clubs, etc. Thirdly, the Band, in seeking program support of GCF campaign will probe existing public agencies and private foundations at both the local and national levels for support such as the National Endowment Fund, community foundations, etc.

DEVELOPMENT - Continued

THE EVANGELICAL ENGAGEMENT MANOEUVRE. Anticipating the transparentization of Christianity, which is particularly manifested in the rising concern of local churches to be practically engaged in mission, this is the "Year of the Church" for development. Strategic targets of this manoeuvre will be the major Christian denominations at all levels. We are operating from a strong position of advantage based on break-open work with Roman Catholic Orders in Canada, the US, and Europe; ALC in Ivy City; UMCOR for Maliwada; PLURA and CCOOP in Canada; Caritas in Belgium & Austria; and the Australian Council of Churches for Oombulgurri. Also, instrumental in this manoeuvre will be galaxy and movemental church relationships plus ITI grads and authorization developed for our HDP's. Arenas of this manoeuvre will be the 'adopt a village' program for local congregations and conferences, proposals to the church foundations. Site visits and involvement of human resources in the projects will be a key emphasis along with financial resources.

THE SYSTEM COBRA STRIKE MANOEUVRE. Due to last year's global funding victory, we are now at a time when we are ready to establish the interchange of vital data to inform the entire band on the most powerful way to forge the manoeuvres to create the next orbit of development. This systems interchange using both regular communication and immediate "hot-line" channels will inform each nexus location of the current global development advantages. Determining the advantage on each turf will make it possible for future options to be globally available and allow a broader perspective from which to sort out and coordinate our targets. The death ground on each continent holds the specific strategies guiding the global thrust there. The strategic momentum accruing within each continent that stretches across the lobe will be tracked by a series of specific operation: 1) global master index file, 2) proposal drawer, 3) seasonal mailings, 4) quarterly reports, 5) grant monitoring, 6) key contacts recommendations, 7) scheduling of development treks and circuits and 8) troop assignments.

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

THE CIRCUITS OF DR. LAO MANOEUVRE: Knowing that there is money in every geographic unit in the world and that it is possible to collect that money at any time, a critical manoeuvre this year is to operate out of a global trans-rational circuit scheme. This entails annual coverage of all the geography using a rational yearly trip schedule. The regular visitation of geographic circuits will continually contact new funding sources broadening the base of support and systematically expanding the number of circuits, while maintaining the regular contributions of previous donors. This manoeuvre will involve the total development efforts of the movement through the coordinated use of centrum, house, colleague and gardina troops catalyzing and concretizing the fact that "everyman is a developer". This will require a published and distributed yearly-scheduled rhythm of circuits, house training constructs, the recreation of the metro circuit and cadre dynamic, and gardina involvement.

THE GLOBAL 232 SUPPORT MANOEUVRE Since the global priorities of the total mission depend on the 232 Maharastra villages coming off, these 232 present a unique contradiction/possibility to global funding. The Global Development Centrum Band intends as one unit to provide the support necessary for the second phase of replication represented by these villages. This involves action by all of the nexi. Bombay nexus will pursue a village adoption scheme initially with Tata Industries and at the same time with other major corporations within India. Also, Bombay will work with the State Bank of India and City Bank to devise the scheme for the World Bank funding of the loan portion of the budget and will seek approval in September from the governments of Maharastra and India for that scheme. Chicago Nexus will follow-up with visits to the World Bank in Washington, D.C.. Bombay will continue to pursue the India government "no objection" relative to USAID and the work with the Canadian High Commission to continue to prepare CIDA staff for receiving a major grant request for the project. Chicago will continue to work with USAID and initiate work with CIDA by visiting Maurice Strong the first week of August and will talk with John Martin in Montreal regarding the necessary matching funds for a CIDA grant. The Brussels Nexus will continue to pursue the Belgian government funding for the Training School and the EEC grant for the Kendur and Vaviharsh projects. This funding overall will establish our advantage for broad agency and governmental support for the next two years. The Nexus around the globe will have copies of the Local Church Village Adoption proposal and use it to raise from local congregations the 6% extra-national funding component in the budget. Bombay Nexus will supply on a monthly basis to all other nexi the names of the newly selected villages, their tahsils and a map indicating its location. As many funds as possible will be kept in convertible currency so as to prevent over-funding of India and guaranteeing of funding for the global mission.

THE TWENTY FOUR CAPITAL KEYSTONES MANOEUVRE. Because of the symbolic power of the original 24 projects and in order to take advantage of the momentum already established in these projects, and to focus the efforts of international agencies and local governments in their desire to serve local communities, the Global Development Band will secure funding for the one catalytic keystone element in each of the original 24 HDP's. Actuation of these keystone elements will release the central development contradiction in each project's implementation such as the water system has done in E. Bayad and the sewage system will do in Delta Pace. Common budgets will be created and proposal submissions around the world transmitted monthly through nexus telex messages.

GLOBAL MANEUVERS

TASK FORCE: ORDER FUNDS

CHICAGO

1977-1978

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHSHEALTH

In the arena of Order Health we recommend a continuation of the 20% Health Supplement Plan instituted during the past year with some modifications as to its operational mode and as to its coverage. Also recommended is the establishment of an advisory guardian insurance committee to investigate optimum health care for our money by use of alternative (e.g. national, etc.) coverage where appropriate.

EDUCATION FUND

The purpose of the educational fund is to provide financial support for formal education leading to a certificate or degree. These funds are to be released only after other sources of support have been explored. The education fund is not intended for travel expenses. We recommend that the education fund be available for students whose parents have been on Funds for a year.

We recommend that the following components be involved in the creation and implementation of educational plans of all Order youth where education funds are involved: (1) the youth; (2) the youth's parents and priors; (3) Phase I or Research Centrum staff; and (4) the finance office.

GLOBAL COUNCIL TRAVEL

We recommend that the proposal to assess globally the costs of Global Priors Council travel be continued for the year 1977-78, with Management Centrum adjusting the assessment according to the present travel costs. We recommend that Management Centrum send out a memo to Houses in time for August-September Area/Continental Councils to enable planning for the year.

NORTH AMERICAN HIGH SCHOOL CLUSTER FINANCIAL MODEL

We recommend a one-year North American experiment, to be evaluated during Summer 1978 Global Council, and to be monitored by Phase I Faculty Chicago Nexus, Internal Life Commission throughout the year.

Student clusters in dialogue with their priorship will determine specific work assignments and time schedules. One responsibility of cluster permeators will be to earn sufficient funds to cover a monthly stipend supplement of up to \$27 for each student in the cluster. The level of earnings above the amount of \$27 which might be assigned to the cluster to earn, as well as the manner in which those additional funds are expended is to be determined by the House priorship in consultation with the Phase I Faculty in Chicago and/or the Chicago Nexus Internal Life Commission. Through this review, values of local missional need, cluster academic priorities, and Global Phase I Programs would be considered.

TRUST/TASK FUNDS

We recommend that we postpone changing the percentages set aside for Trust and Task Funds until next year, with the possibility of retroactively adjusting them at that time.

PROJECT LEGAL VEHICLE

This set of maneuvers anticipates the transfer of responsibility for the ongoing human development programs to the community at large. Since comprehensive socio-economic development is key, it is necessary to assure the continued linking of the social and economic programs. During project initiation this link is established by the auxiliary staff and informally develops thru the polity dynamics of its assembly, commissions, guilds and stakes. A formal legal structure which embodies the revolutionary principles of those dynamics is critical to assure that there will not be a retreat to hierarchical patterns of decision making after the transfer is complete. The necessary maneuvers are developing a global consensus on the revolutionary design of such a vehicle; the retaining by each project of a local attorney to determine which legal structure of that nation/state most appropriately embodies that design; reviewing by the legal commission and management centrum of the recommended form for commonness of function; obtaining and orchestrating clout to allow for effective and rapid incorporation; incorporating prior to project completion to allow for familiarization; and symbolizing completion by the transfer of stock/membership in the corporation(s) to each community member.

TRANSRATIONAL DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

The increasing demands of the 3 campaigns across the globe require a new flexibility and objectivity in the dispersal of funds. As we move toward having 50% of the developed funds being raised outside North America, a transrational distribution system is called for. The major fronts of this maneuver include the development of global and area dispersement priorities through centrum and area council consensus quarterly. In order to have maximum flexibility in grant dispersal and share the burden across the globe for program expenses, methods and procedures will be created whereby money in any one location can be used to cover expenses elsewhere. Establishing a more effective communication system through the use of monthly reports to centrum and contextual financial reports to Houses, will inform our current operating status. The finance commission operating in every Nexus location will insure that these global priorities, procedures and principles are being met.

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

OPERATION CREDIBILITY

The economically dominated modern society places high value on strict accounting for funds given for charitable purposes. Specific donors and the general public alike expect charitable institutions to be able to document their intent with proofs that monies given have been spent in the programs for which they were raised. The movement honors this preoccupation while not being hamstrung by it. We will therefore set up two credibility-systems maneuvers which will be primarily management centrum functions in close liaison with development and the finance commission. The first is a comprehensive grant monitoring system built from the wisdom of our past successes (eg. the EEC grant). It will trigger interim and final reports as needed with appropriate backup from HDP or area campaign staff, depending on the program for which the grant was received. The second maneuver will arrange audits of national ICA's where the amount of funds received or government regulations so require. It will also create annual reports for public distribution that show general inflow and outgo of funds in helpful categories of sources and programs.

LEGAL SOPHISTICATION

The social situation in many nations has been sensitized by the public unveiling of mismanagement of funds. In the midst of this situation the missional task of the ICA continues to expand, thus increasing its public exposure, demanding closer relations with important officials, and expanding growth in funding. This demands a greater accountability and a broad based legal and financial sophistication to maintain our credibility. In order to deal with this reality, management centrum and the legal commission will pull together and maintain a detailed account of forms of ICA legality across the globe. They will also push the establishing of legal forms where they are needed, and the closing of inappropriate and superfluous ICA incorporations and accounts. This will enable the publication of a comprehensive guidebook on legal responsibilities including operating procedures and the implementation of a training program of order members that will increase local responsibility.

FINANCIAL PROWESS

The expansion of our work in 24 nations, dealing in 24 different currencies, and the many aspects of our program funding and disbursements, calls for new approaches in managing this complexity. In the arena of finance and management perhaps the most important maneuver theatre of the 1977-78 management campaign is that of building financial prowess. For the sake of greater effectivity and the enabling of all other financial maneuvers at the centrum, area and house (including HDP) levels, new images, abilities and expertise must be developed. In order to maintain effective communication at every level and in every direction, commonness and corporate understanding of this maneuver is essential. An initial maneuver to establish a global consensus on the financial principles that hold our best wisdom would enable a transrational approach to necessary deeds. The secondary maneuver effects the creation of simple, common record keeping systems for the Ecumenical Institute, the Institute of Cultural Affairs and the Order: Ecumenical books which can be moved on with all due haste. To maintain this simple record keeping system a maneuver creating three manuals (nexus, area, house) would establish necessary means and forms, would include a means of reporting, of data storage and retrieval, and would anticipate audit requirements and procedures. A comprehensive, imaginal training maneuver that grounds established principles and operating procedures, functions of the books and the flow of monies, and involves a global financial collegium design, will establish the win.

TASK FORCE: GRA POLISH

CHICAGO

1977-1978

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

The Global Research Assembly Polish Task Force has completed the the writing, typing and production of the products of several GRA Task Forces. For the Light Industry Task Force we have completed The Light Industry Set up and Operations Manual, The Project Industry Analysis, and the Economic Guild One Year Curriculum. For the Community Life Task Force we have completed the Stake Manual, which includes a 48 week detailed curriculum for stake meetings. These four products have been submitted to the editorial board.

Still in process are two tasks of the GRA Polish Task Force: 1) Edit and Produce the Order/Movement Song Book for the year 1977/78, and 2) Pack boxes for all Houses to be taken by representatives when they return to their assigned locations (Boxes have a variety of products and are tailored to the needs of each location.).

TASK FORCE: HDP EXPANSION

6. The Samoan Outpost Maneuver will locate one human development project in Western Samoa, Area Suva. This maneuver will bring all of the areas in SEAPAC which have so far been activated up to the level of at least two projects each. It will also demonstrate the dramatic change at the local level which the nation of Western Samoa, and those world powers which are interested in assisting national development, wish to see. The Global Consult Team will orchestrate a consult launching in December, Quarter II. Auxiliary staff will be drawn from assigned personnel in Apia.

1. The India Buffer Maneuver will place two additional human development projects in Continent Subasia. One project will be located in Area Calcutta and the second in Area Delhi. This maneuver will expand the authorization base for Maharashtra Replication as it moves to the more visible level of 250 villages in the state. These projects will be launched in Quarter III, in conjunction with the Mallwada Human Development Training School to be held that quarter.
2. The Singapore Sweep Maneuver will launch three additional human development projects in Area Singapore. One project will be located in Kota Kinabalu Region, and two will be situated in Indonesia, Regions Medan and Manado. This maneuver will activate the grid at the Regional level, thereby engaging local man across the vast areas of Indonesia and Malaysia, with 150 million people, 90% of whom live in rural villages. These projects will be initiated in Quarters I and II, with one consult each in the months of September, October and November. These three projects will be staffed by assigned troops in Area Singapore, and the consults orchestrated by a Global Consult Team.
3. The KOSKI Extension Maneuver (Kwang Yung II, Oombulgurri, Sudtonggan, Kawangware, Isle of Dogs) will prepare five of the Human Development Projects for replication. One project will be located in the northern part of the Seoul Region; two in Australia, one being in the rural area of New South Wales and the other in the Northern Territories; one project in Davao Region, one in Kenya and the sixth project in Wales. These projects will be the first step toward replication outside India. The mobile replication training school based on the Mallwada School will be held in Quarter II for the Kwangyung II Replication Project. In Quarter III the replication training school will be held for the Oombulgurri Replication Project. The Kwangyung II, Oombulgurri and Sudtonggan Consults will be staffed by the mobile school task force; Kawangware and the Isle of Dogs Consults will be orchestrated by the Global Consult Team.
4. The Latin America Spinoff Maneuver will establish four new projects in Latin America, one each in Guatemala, Brazil, Jamaica and Chile. The Cano Negro project and the ITI held on site there have made the extension of the campaign not only desirable, but eminently feasible as well. Mobile School II, based on the Mallwada School, will be held in Quarter II in Cano Negro, followed by four consults, orchestrated by the training school staff. One couple will be assigned for each of the new prospective sites, and they will spend the remainder of Quarter I and the first part of Quarter II selecting the village sites and recruiting national auxiliary staff to come to the Cano Negro Training School. This maneuver is designed to dramatically take the brackets off of Latin America.
5. The USA Saturation Maneuver will establish twelve new projects in rural communities across the United States of America. Three of these projects will be located in each of the Areas. At least one community will be in Appalachia, probably in West Virginia; at least one other community will be among Latino rural people in California and/or in Texas. This maneuver is designed to locate a human development project within a four-hour drive of any community which has or will during the coming year, conduct a Town Meeting. This maneuver, therefore, is indirectly catalyzing a vast number of experienced farmers for service across the globe, and releasing new potential in terms of global funding. Mobile School II will be held in Fifth City during Quarter III. The ensuing consults will be orchestrated by the staff of this school to be held one a week, rotating through the four areas, during the months of April, May and June, 1978. Staff will come from existing Religious Houses which will be relocated across the United States for the two-year project life.

maneuver involves engaging them in the life and activity of the 24 projects through site visits, consultations, funding and gift support to demonstrate the common concern existing in the total society and assure the availability of resources for both present and future projects.

URBAN APPROACH

This will involve developing a common set of guidelines for monitoring the urban social demonstration sites to assure their completion by July, 1978. This maneuver will be accomplished by the GSD Post in each Nexus enabling the maintaining of project objectivity.

ACCELERATION TREK

This maneuver involves sending out four acceleration treks in September with each trek visiting 6 projects, one month per project. Each trek would be made up of four to six people reflecting critical expertise and skills. Each trek would focus upon the major contradictions facing that particular project. Projects would be prioritized according to their perceived level of implementation, newness, and seasonal factors.

REPOSITORY PSU

This maneuver involves holding PSU's in each of the 24 projects by Nexus in order to breakloose the research/monitoring dynamic across the band. This maneuver will be accomplished by teams composed of a) Nexus representation, b) Area guardians, c) auxiliary and local leadership from other projects conducting a Week II evaluation and planning PSU during Week 13 of each quarter 1977-78. Focus of Quarter III is Global Celebration.

TASK FORCE: COMPLETING THE 24

MANEUVER PRAGRAPHS

LEV PILOT

This maneuver will involve setting up in each of the 24 demonstrations a LEV construct in the project operation through which community participation, local economics and services can be accelerated and sustained. Learning the how and the operational dynamics is critical to future replication. This will require completing stakes, guilds, commissions, Assembly and secretariat so the village can operate the economic and social services. Legal work will be held to a minimum and referred to next year's GRA.

VISIBLE FINISHMENT

This maneuver involves visibly impacting anyone coming into the community by such signs as tree-lined roads, beauty spots, plan of village, road signs and one major construction like a plaza or community hall which will act as the focus for all village activities and celebrations.

WOMEN'S ADVANCEMENT

This maneuver involves insuring the full participation of women in the economic and social structures of every project and creating a visible sign of possibility for their engagement in community by putting particular emphasis on Program Number 34-- Women's Advancement.

REPLICATION PERMISSION

A project cannot be called complete until it is in a position to be replicated. This maneuver involves the use of Global Community Forum in conjunction with a strategically managed framing program during the year to ensure readiness for replication at both local and administrative levels for each project.

PROJECT CONTINUATION

Until the village can continue in creating primal community without the presence of Auxiliary Staff, the project is not finished. This maneuver involves equipping local leadership in all social methods and training them in the functioning of all aspects of the community's organization (organization chart toward comprehensive actuation of HDP on local level), undergirded with an adequate, operative financial scheme and a firm regional network.

GLOBAL CELEBRATION

This maneuver will involve symbolizing the completion of the 24 faces of global social demonstration with an hour by hour global celebration held in every local site globalized by governments' ambassadors representing nations which have HDPs, with common decor, symbol, songs and an inkind unbelievable feast to mark this occassion.

15% INVOLVEMENT

The 15% hold the physical resources, the technological know-how and the power of decision-making necessary to the development of human community around the world. This

QUARTERS

FOCUS ON THE U.K.

INTRODUCTION

The Continent of Europe experiences itself in the midst of a crisis of meaning. The possibility to become a world servant force is there and prominent but as yet this needs to be grounded in concrete care for suffering in her own midst as well as obvious signs of service to the developing nations which once were her direct responsibility.

GLOBAL COMMUNITY FORUM

This campaign to be held during the Year of the United Kingdom, will be done thru two primary manoeuvres. The kick-off in Quarter II will build off the momentum that the Ferndale Town Meeting unleashed to do a Wales Manoeuvre with 100 Town Meetings across the country. The second phase over the next two quarters will be the Sister Cities Manoeuvre, moving comprehensively on the geography of England and Scotland. In this phase of the campaign the 180 polii of the United Kingdom will be systematically covered through the Sister Cities Network to yield maximum visibility and intensify the participation in the campaign across the Continent.

GLOBAL SOCIAL DEMONSTRATION

In 'The Year of the United Kingdom' it is our intent to 'symbolise and celebrate the completion of the Isle of Dogs Human Development Project and initiate a Human Development Project in Wales. This requires that the Project in Wales be a lightning-quick explosion of rural transformation and that the Cahir Street emphasis on the Isle of Dogs, be expanded into the rest of Stake IV in order to have a beach-head in which to replicate into the remaining four Stakes. This year is likened to the activity of "building the ship that sails the globe".

GLOBAL SERVANT MOVEMENT - TRAINING

Four celebrative events initiated by each House will be held to launch 'The Year of the United Kingdom'. Mass awakenment will be achieved primarily among university students, religious orders and churches, industry and banking groups by particular courses and programmes throughout the year. All programmes will point toward mass awakenment initiation on the Continent in Quarter I, 1978.

DEVELOPMENT - AUTHORISATION

The Global Servant Movement will raise 65 thousand pounds cash this year from both individuals and corporations. In-kind development will be intensified to support the Town Meeting and GSD campaigns. Grassroots development will be intensified to follow-up both old and new grads by means of a comprehensive mailing and circuiting plan. The authorisation and support required to bring off the 'Year of the United Kingdom' will be sought from dignitaries, heads of churches, service groups, womens groups and the networks of our guardians. That kind of top level support will be assured by intentionally building our present contacts and authorisation in the social sector.

CONCLUSION

In this coming year the United Kingdom will signal its care for the world.
