LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Signal RSI with spouse of the four key couples in Region, each attending second course in year and each preparing to teach. Third South African participant in two weeks reports husband and she return to Johannesburg where he will become first black Dean of the Anglican cathedral.

Internal: Host LENS team on way from Europe to Nairobi and reorient House structures as Summer '75 recruitment nears completion.

Contradiction: Addressing the many changing faces of Europe. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Full week with three Cadre meetings, Foray to Aberdeen secures site and recruits for Week 6 RSI, Pedagogy for 5 in Glasgow intensifies regional pedagogy dynamic, and fantastic Field Visit for PCE on Sunday for 4! Glasgow and Edinburgh colleagues signals we have decided to get Movement 'on the ground' in Scotland.

Internal: 'New Castle' continues to dazzle whole House, especially Ecclesiola guests, Kathy and Ian Galloway.

Contradiction: New tactics to get penetration done adequately in quarter of intensive formulation. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Final week of S'75 blitz results in four Yesses, and invitation to do 20-session Adult Education Evening Institute (on whatever we want) and LCC. First RSI held in Southampton Metro and first paid registration to GRA.

Internal: Rationale for meals of the Continent during Ecclesiola becomes nurture tactic as regional colleagues prepare French feast. Week 11 miracle squad from Area House culminates Week 11 with celebration as colleague secures in kind meal and cinema tickets for House and other colleagues. Mrs. Leenhouts visits House.

Contradiction: Model for engaging all sectors of society in participating and funding S'75. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Aintree (Liverpool) Community Council appoints official committee to promote LCC. Plans finalized for young adult consult at University of Liverpool next week.

Internal: Huge thermometer graph of our debt hung in office and serves to brainwash us with our primary contradiction.

Contradiction: Finances! (Wk. 5)

PARIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

The move to PCE symbolized by three events: Parish research that reveals new grid; work on practices of the HRM; and another level of practical planning with participating pastors.

Internal: 'Hope' study, 'Rome' study, and reading of the 'Acts of the Apostles' pushes our grounding of who we are and demonstrates our sociological thinking as what is needed now as then.

Contradiction: Shift in trends, in terms of external situation, reveals need for bridge from this quarter to summer. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Intensified visitation and guest events continuous all week, with good news in the form of PLC registrations and Patronage of the Amsterdam ITI from the Superior General of the Brothers of the Christian Schools.

Internal: Arrival of Judy Hess with Joan Avery puts E'G' structures in gear and sharpens House's sense of global simultaneity and 15 guests continue the process of establishing the House as a Wayside Inn.

Contradiction: How to keep the balance between adroitly bracketing and expanding activities without a nervous breakdown. (Wk. 5)

BRUSSELS**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Field Visit in Vienna with top Protestant leaders marks first program activity in Austria.

Internal: Vienna visit triggers Week II mealtime reflection on Eastern Europe, creating new images and filling in data on Area: Budapest.

Contradiction: Securing funds needed to assure ITI's in India. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Held demonstration Field Visit with regional colleagues, then hosted Prof. Baers and priests in his theology class on adult Catechesis next day. RSI same week with three European pedagogues. Wayside Inn treats unexpected 30 Australian pilgrims, from Cairns Cathedral (Fr. Lizzio) to St. Peter's, to coffee, and de-mythologizes Holy Year Story developed by Rome House.

Internal: Welcome Tom Grayshock, Frank Little, and Joe Thomas to Brussels, and Jim Troxel back from two week Berlin-Typing job, part of the House's doubling its income with gardening and basement painting at \$3.50/hour.

Contradiction: Holding to tactics, like Bishop Joshi speaking to colleagues, to keep full vision before us. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: During clergy conference established collegiality with Albert van den Heuvel, Moderator of Dutch Reformed Church, who welcomed seeing colleagues in midst of old guard Dutch Calvinists. Mobile Religious House in the Hague nets contact with two Ecumenical groups and keeps up contact with colleagues.

Internal: House celebrates the Queen's birthday with rest of the nation, and sends out lady on World Council of Churches scholarship who is studying Religious Communities and learned about us through Roman Catholic Church in Amsterdam.

Contradiction: Breaking loose a practical vision in people we talk to, even though we still are without a model for the church in Netherlands. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two consults (25 people each) in Vienna and Pforzheim stir new ground, while pedagogy weekend in The Black Forest builds roots for area faculty.

Internal: Biggest House Church in a long time with guests from Bombay, Brussels, Berlin, and Maine. Necessity of moving from present facility intensifies house hunting strategy.

Contradiction: How maintain momentum for PCE work, with courses, consults, and facility-crisis, popping their heads up and down in regular rhythm. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Discovery of ten British churches broaden international contacts in Berlin while a 22 participant planning consult shows readiness of laymen to take PCE seriously.

Internal: Final spurt chaotic marathon completes 600 page Ph.D. thesis typing and earns 1500DM for House. Three travel to RSI pedagogy in Freiburg at beautiful Black Forest retreat center.

Contradiction: Maintaining the intensity to complete the RSI's, PCC's and LCC's coming up. (Wk.5)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: LENS course sponsored by University of Nairobi with 21 participants goes very well. Nairobi grads meet to begin work on June PLC.

Internal: LENS team arrives, exploding House context. 'New Castle' study expands vision of Muslim world we live on edge of--1200 miles to Mecca.

Contradiction: LENS grads ask about forming a Guild--What's a Guild?(Wk.5)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: GRA completed in Hyderabad. ITI materials received and cleared. Study plan completed.

Internal: Sent out P.T.James and T.Patterson to Calcutta, and receive Judy Hess for ITI.

Contradiction: Operating images needed to manifest globality and oneness of Spirit Movement. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Intensive researching for new GRA site and ITI site has brought us into close contact with many Orders and Schools.

Internal: Week of arrivals: GRA faculty arrives in Bombay; Hess from Chicago, Shinns from Oombulguri, Tickners from Delhi, Dharmalingam from Hyderabad. Joyous welcome to Clements family in time for Easter celebrations.

Contradiction: Keeping GRA and ITI momentum going while practics begin to bear down on the house. (Wk.2)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: ITI registration from Agra gives us registrations from 4 of 6 regions as recruitment effort is intensifies.

Internal: Marle Paul sent out to GRA, children to grand-mothers for summer; House troops drop from 9 adults to 5 in 2 weeks.

Contradiction: Finalizing ITI recruitment and guaranteeing goal of 36. (WK. 4)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: All male members of House sent out on round-up circuit rides, while rest of House joins with GRA on all day recruitment blitz in Hyderabad Metro.

Internal: House continues to be wayside inn for thirsty travellers and GRA participants.

Contradiction: Intensifying Hyderabad recruitment when almost all recruiters are out. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Two leading Church Schools near Circus 5 Parish will provide furniture, crockery, and cutlery for ITI in kind hand soap and detergent powder arrive.

Internal: Unification service in Calcutta Cathedra makes House member, Art Rowe (Anglican clergyman), a minister of the Church of North India and Bishop assigns him as honorary assistant at Cathedral.

Contradiction: How to get the strategic people, especially those from Circus 5, to the ITI. (Wk.5)

SINGAPORE**GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE**

External: Ten New Town teachers spend informal evening with Nexus and engage in corporate reflection on trends in education today as preparation for their attendance at GRA:Manila. First international Town Meeting exploration visit to Secretary of Cultural Affairs at U.S.Embassy in Singapore receives favorable response.

Internal: Nexus spends Week preparing for Global Panchayat visit by midnight shopping tour, May Day celebration, sprucing up facilities, and pulling together the acccomplomat, challenges, and projections of each Centrum.

Contradiction: Location of Nexus demands fantastic creativity and ingenuity in securing authorization in order to concretize direction by focusing Global Order toward some particular demonstration sign in this situation. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: CSI brochure completed and mailed. David Scott from Operations Centrum:Singapore and Scott Morris travel to East Malaysia. Invitation from Sarawak government given for our staff to assist in training government civil servants.

Internal: Study of Peking in Ecclesiola led by Chen I An, who has lived in Peking, is exciting address.

Contradiction: In experiencing the immediate, how to get ahold of our long-range vision.(Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Launch fullscale attack on ITI recruitment as Titus quits job and heads out on Metro circuit-first stop Penang. LENS marketing continues (7 paid registrations with four weeks to go and a phone call inquiring if LENS would be appropriate for Trade Union Leaders); speaking engagement at Catholic Womens League.

Internal: Our decision to participate in PCE concretized with sending out of grid cards. Procure small used car with help of old colleague, for ITI, soybeans and LENS; welcome Margy and Kjell Knutsen at House Church.

Contradiction: Making manifest the story and style which will enable old grads to see ITI as first priority for self and others. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Guardian network produces LENS registrations for first LENS of Jakarta, as Quimby's name shakes loose six from Union Carbide. GRA and ITI prospects look good. Side trip to Bandung Metro completes sweep of six metros in less than a month.

Internal: All energy focuses on big Week 5 with three circuit rides in one week end including an RSI and two grad meetings. House hosted at Korean restaurant by Seoul LENS grad, Mr. Kim. 'New Castle' study at Ecclesiola successfully boggles all minds.

Contradiction: Keeping on top of immediate and long-range priorities in midst of exploding interest and demand to participate in GRA and ITI. (Wk.5)

HONG KONG**GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG**

External: LENS in Cebu with global LENS team of Jon Jenkins and Don Elliot families. Taipei LENS Club (Guild) in Taipei spins on Social Demonstration for Taiwan and first Field Visit of Quarter takes place in Taiwan.

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG (cont.)

Internal: Sent out Margaret Griffie to Global Assignment in Chicago and welcomed first Majuro colleague, Kathleen White, who spins with us on Majuro miracles. Final preparation of space for Global Panchayat Trek.

Contradiction: How to move from theoretical clarity to practical preparation for PCE and Social Demonstration. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Perfect location for ITI secured at very low cost in week scheduled for miracle 'ITI location'.

Internal: Rome Seminary impacts House's awareness of our cultural and religious roots.

Contradiction: Many promises, but few registrations for Week 7 PLC and LENS call for attention while loud call to maintain ITI and GRA recruitment momentum. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: It's a 'Week of Miracles' as we receive \$1200 US in Development (largest year yet for Taiwan Development and have 10 paid registrations for ITI in hand - putting us in sight of goal. Hsu spiritizes colleagues in Taipei in two - day Pedagogy.

Internal: House spins into the 'Other World' in long overdue Week II study of the OW charts. One person says: 'The great thing about the chart is that it is so ordinary'. Fate assigns us to study Jerusalem and we are rewarded with a new appreciation for the meaning of Israel

Contradiction: Building structures of corporateness that will produce common passion in us all. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: RSI pitch given at annual UCCP conference in San Pablo. Grads visited in 4 day, 3 Metro trip. ITI/GRA registrations arrive steadily—GRA facility secured. LENS follow-up by LENS teaching team.

Internal: Formally welcome sojourners Manillo Armas and Al and Erlinda Senturias family. Spirited Ecclesiola with 14 guests who are exhilarated by 'Pekin' study. New troops and resettlement forces office and storage re-ordering.

Contradiction: Question of how to maintain a plan when more arenas open up; how employ 'he jumped on his horse and rode off in all directions'. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Planning done in '89' different arenas as we anticipate Week 4 as gun which sets off race. Franciscans decide to send 5 to ITI: Hong Kong.

Internal: Week of nearing crest and readying ourselves for full-blown quarter with green light on tactical models. Emerging Generation play, 'Let Sleeping Beauties Lie,' reveals awakened talents.

Contradiction: Expressing the vision in a way to release the 'yes'.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Mactan Community LENS with 50 around table. Participants were largely local people who live and work in community. A great response holds possibility of guild training and guild miracles.

Internal: Welcomed sojourners, Elvira Monson and Erlina Martinez, for training and House development. Hosted LENS team and participants from Bacolod Metro.

Contradiction: Mactan 5 follow-up and Guild training yet unfocused. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: National Strategy Session held in Cebu; a first for movement in Philippines LENS marketing call with NEDA nets suggestions for others to recruit. Week of intensified recruitment moves PLC registrations from 5 to 22 'yes-for-sure'. Second ITI pre-registration fee received.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO (cont.)

Internal: House is Wayside Inn for female participants in Methodist work camp held in our 'backyard'. Necessary space shift gives breakloose to future possibilities. Guests for wonder-filled Ecclesiola twice as many as last week and include grad from June, 1971, RSI. House celebrates pre-victory of PLC by seeing 'Oliver!'

Contradiction: Weaving effective web of time/task/forces to do the necessary deed. (WK. 4)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Arrival of Global Panchayat with first woman member and their Majuro report, heightened our awareness as we intensify our efforts to aid project through our 'Majuro connection' activities.

Internal: Sojourner, Marie Watanabi, was sent out and new sojourner, Paul Nomura was welcomed at House Church. Welcomed Dan Dale who is helping to search for marketing possibilities for Majuro shark products while he awaits work on board ship.

Contradiction: Anticipating joy and terror of keeping our 21 plates spinning in full view of us all. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Global Panchayat Trek makes signal journey to Jeju Island to research Social Demonstration Project possibilities. Other visits included lunch with Bishop McNaughton, International School of The Sacred Heart (Global Demonstration School), and many high government officials.

Internal: Rev. Kang Byoung Hoon and Joseph Mathews co-celebrate the marriage of Paul Jan Thomas and Pamela Dale Johnson and the baptism of the Kang children, Hae Kyung, Hae Young, Shin Whan, and Hae Jin and the Work children, Benjamin Kang and Christopher Edward. The House sent Rev. Kang to join the Global Panchayat Trek.

Contradiction: How to implement Regional consensus to utilize lay leadership in movement in concrete demands of Quarter's plans. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Cathedral Church 'Drop-In Center' enlists House for advanced group English teaching.

Internal: A week of 'settling In' new House sees room cleaning and decor building climaxed by hanging of new world grid before House Church.

Contradiction: Absence from region of key leaders postpones needed impetus for Spring PLC push. (WK. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Bob Rafos visits Region on way back to Hong Kong. Scheut Fathers Vice Provincial visits House to discuss future relations. Galaxy moves to tactics for engagement in Kamagasaku Primal Community Experiment and church painting.

Internal: Area Priors' Council report reveals seriousness of Kamagasaku PCE. We raid the big Gomi for neighborhood in-kind contributions ready for the move. House and Rafos participate in this year's cherry-blossom viewing by river at night in Osaka. House sends out Junko Fujiwara after 6 weeks to serve world as an international stewardess.

Contradiction: Discerning the crucial missing link in each of three major tactics that enables us to move ahead. (WK. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: The secular becomes a living reality as we hold an Imaginal Education Consult weekend with Metro educators.

Internal: Visit and participation of colleagues from Tokyo Cadre enhances and enlivens Week II Imaginal Education Consult.

Contradiction: Having refreshing clarity relative to overarching goals, and incredible confusion relative to which particular tactics to apply and when. (Wk. 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: ITI phoning continues as RSI blitz gets 19 round table with galaxy pastor on faculty. Janeen Barker invited to share Mowanjum wisdom with Department of Education (State Government) teacher in relation to education of Aboriginal children.

Internal: South Sydney PCE inspires managing director to create and present proposal to his board (Australian Glass Manufactureres) who agree to give \$1000 to install Telex in House and pay for first year's messages. Holcombe, Bishop visit and Stovers stay and teach RSI on their way to Chicago.

Contradiction: Getting past clergy image of impossibility to people in congregations. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: A strong move on grass roots authorization with ITI mailing to 100 clergy, LENS recruiting wrap-up, Development with Donnelly, and HRM speaking engagements.

Internal: Aboriginal students complete school term and do examinations. A promising facility inspected. Worship room transformed with new decor, and lay out.

Contradiction: A concern for all the miracles on the battle plan leads to a reticence to die one's death for particular miracles as they come up. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Appointment of two House members to staff of Darwin Reconstruction Commission as Community Development Consultants, and phone calls to local leaders by Federal Social Security contact pushing Loomis for position with Regional Council for social development. LENS business colleague drops in to push for consultation with top business leaders of Australia on Darwin.

Internal: Discussion with owner of House faces us with need to consider purchasing facility as no other big old (or new) places are left standing. End of Quarter Feast of chicken as we celebrate Region and First- Among Equals reminisces over 36 Quarters of celebrations.

Contradiction: New public positions in tense community occasion brooding on ICA program in light of need for radical new sophistication in community. (WK. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Three day visit with community by three Department of Aboriginal Affairs officials results in favorable response of officials to Oombulgurri project.

Internal: Priors return from Sydney Areal Council bringing back-up work to enable up-coming replication PSU; their reports on favorable visits en route with our Perth D.A.A. contacts give positive foundation for our conversations with officials visiting Oombulgurri later in week. House hosting visitors for meals provides opportunity for deepening collegiality.

Contradiction: Up-grading of financial status reveals need of story to maintain long-range vision and momentum for guilds accomplishment of quarterly tasks. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: South Australia Institute of Technology Social Work head asks ICA to send him one ICA staff member for next academic year to build and teach, LENS style, University curriculum for social work students.

Internal: Forty-one people attend Ecclesiola to send out Stover family to US., Smith family to Adelaide Region, and welcome Hamptons to their new assignments.

Contradiction: How to focus energy and concern on all events and getting real grassroots support for LENS. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Tantalizing week of penetrating four Metros, including flight to Hobart; LCC authorization collection leads to possibility of ICA being affiliate member of parish's Good Neighbor Council.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE (cont.)

Internal: Discontinuity visits bring affirmation from non-movement friends for global demonstrations and reveals global network with nodes in Malaysia, Libya and Algeria waiting to be tapped; when Hobart trek reduces House by half, Metro colleague pours an extra measure of spirit in Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Plowing up Metros of new soil while keeping previously tilled fields full of healthy crops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Local civil networks open up after two impact events: firstly, with an address to senior staff of Canberra Hospital and secondly, at 'lunch with National Director of Council of Social Service.

Internal: First attempt at tactics modification indirectly grounds miracles in actual week.

Contradiction: Actualizing Missional Commissions. (WK. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Request from David Jones, large department store chain, to train its training staff through LENS.

Internal: Regional colleagues, John and Judy Newsome sent to European/North American trip; Evening Prayers and 'Hope' study in Ecclesiola sustain in midst of losing and winning.

Contradiction: Enabling those who have decided to be the Church to grasp cruciality of long-range corporate planning and training now. (WK. 5)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Expansion of Marshall Islands Business School opened for its second quarter of classes with 50% increase in enrollment; a TASC member in Laura reports sales up 300% due to TASC volume buying; rabbits for rabbit farm.

Internal: Sent out Robert Fishel and Associate, Rhine Brain to Saipan for Marshalls Community Action Association Conference; welcomed Queenie DeBrum and Joses Zebede as interns.

Contradiction: Pushing deep enough to fuse economic and social dynamics into one tactical system so that we are operating out of one focus. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Led Apia Protestant Church study on Worship. Grad meeting looks at trends in world and Samoa relative to social demonstration. Holcombe and Bishop arrive and spend whirlwind day meeting friends and colleagues of Movement, highlighted by trip to Temese's village and great feast.

Internal: Holcombe and Bishop spin us on Hope and Prayer.

Contradiction: Contexts which enable vision and possibilities relative to future to be released. (WK.4)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: ITI grad, Marg Jackson gives 45 minute witness at Church while another, Mac Stanley arrives Sunday at 8:00a.m. to spend eight hours with cadre collegium, breakfast, service and evaluation. Area funding PSU gathers five Houses and Development Centrum in struggling with coordination of funding for TM. 76.

Internal: House Church of 38 welcomes back 13 regional grads of ITI. Study of 'Peking' from 'The Castle' inspires all.

Contradiction: Coordination of funding, promotion and sponsorship of TM 76. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Galaxy I, Wesley United Methodist, hosts Galaxy II for celebrative Suki-yaki meal and joint Galaxy meeting. Preaching mission held at parish church, St. Paul's United Methodist, and paves way for further involvement there. Galaxy pastor's wife and House person asked to help lead and participate in parish Galaxy church Women's Retreat. TM Task Force launched in Watsonville as A.A.U.W. assumes full responsibility for planning and obtaining other sponsors.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE (cont.)

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to be high celebrative event. Two more jobs secured including Summer School teaching job.

Contradiction: Turning to world and planning for TM, leaves forgotten items in path behind RSI only three weeks away with only one registration. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Guild tactic gathers the parish in a 'Community Day' with 57 representatives from: Police Dept., Fire Dept., Lions Club, Welfare Dept., Volunteer Bureau, Day Care Centers, all parish schools, Youth Centers, Little League, Girl Scouts, elders groups. Winning miracle of the day lays strong foundation for TM and the next 20 years of the North 5 Parish Demonstration.

Internal: Constantinople study grounded with the return of 'The Pantacatar'. Sharon Heiges from L.A. ITI and decision of Earl Blackmer to sojourn.

Contradiction: Nurturing present TM Sponsorship while still recruiting new sponsors for the June 14 State Demonstration TM in Parish. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: State Bicentennial Commission accepts proposal to do nine TM's in two communities.

Internal: Two new jobs secured, one with 100% increase other shifting from nights to days.

Contradiction: How to engage in external visits while doing necessary planning and brooding. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Discovery that Saturday is great time for TM blitz in small towns. New Mexico Bicentennial staff to send TM*76 brochures to all local committees.

Internal: Impact of deeper acquaintance with Mao and revolutionary style. Report on ITI: L.A. from returning House member.

Contradiction: Discerning knife edge between this world and Other World, enabling migration to continue. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Had a fine RSI with particularly 4 couples and 2 individuals coming out as real ontological colleagues. Advocacy TM calls with Apostle of Mormon Church, Governor Rampton and UARBC committee chairman and Executive Secretary.

Internal: After assignments to L.A. ITI, National Microbiological Conference, strategic visits, House personnel reassembles for House Church.

Contradiction: Deciding what is catalytic action in relation to TM Guild and Galaxy. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Week begins with 23 members of local Newman Club visiting, excited over singing, community and possibility of change; clergy collegium, and LENS possibility and Indian elder visits; Week II sees all systems go; RSI teaching, TM trek and community symbol identifies parish at fantastic (Black, Brown, Red, White, and Yellow) celebration de Cinco de Mayo.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS (cont.)

Internal: House church real zinger; District Superintendent, Indian elder and 3 Guilders; Latter ask, 'We are going to have accountability and absolution before send out, aren't we?' Dispersal of House members (2 at Ecclesiola) dramatizes our power to hang together.

Contradiction: How to maintain momentum in each event and not wait just for major ones. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Week II Pedagogy Lab, with Clarence Snelling, brings us up to date with new education methods. Slide show on past-present-future of city Parkwest falls into place for pre-Guilds Booth in Capital Hill Fair.

Internal: House hosts Region for celebration with Jim Johnson family celebrating marriage of their daughter, Pam, in Seoul, Korea. Sent out Larry Greenwald to last four weeks of academy.

Contradiction: Experience of troop dispersion during heaviest week of quarter releases anxiety in every direction. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: PCE Consult and TM date changed to Flag Day.

Internal: Children using week IIs to journey to 'Other World' through Yellowstone Park, (later this quarter) and 'Bad Lands' last week.

Contradiction: Too few miracles mean too few troops. (WK. 5)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Local Church attendance enables two HRMs and a fine PCC reveals collegueship of two families we had only known a few days. Calgary CFC sponsoring committee continues its work toward pilot forum while Medicine Hat is broken open to possibility of CFC. RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

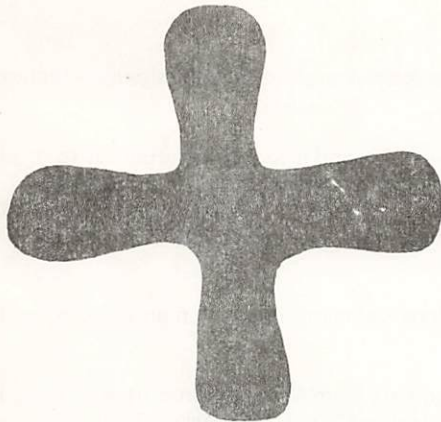
External: Church and World break loose with HRM confirmation and a \$1,000 donation to CFC-- first in Canada.

Internal: Ecclesiola great address with guests and House becoming ardently vocal on different possibilities for social demonstration.

Contradiction: Developing forms in time to address many changing faces of Europe. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: A week of key cadre meetings; Edinburgh Metro Cadre and Calton Cadre (inner city Glasgow) continue the March, Glasgow Metro Cadre's PCEPSU planning meeting is held, and Vale of Leven Cadre holds its first official meeting with members from two neighboring congregations present (both Galaxy prospects).

Internal: Whole House plus regional colleagues celebrate Glasgow's 800th. with 800 party at House followed by discontinuity for city-wide celebrations, and participation in ecumenical service of 10,000 Glasgowian churchman, which was coordinated by PLC grad David Graham. Ecclesiola again a hit as 'Jerusalem' makes sense of Old Testament for us all.

Contradiction: Finances! (Wk. 6)

PARIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

External: Finalization of plans for HRM reveals openness of local church to new missional direction for their community.

Internal: Two day holiday allows full House to participate in PCX and give new commonness to total mission by researching Parish, completing new House decor and celebrating movie 'Front Page'

Contradiction: Long on 'break open' tactics, but short on long term strategies. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Spring Quarter opens with alively week of stations swinging into action and PLC recruitment systems all go with first registrations coming in.

Internal: Pontifical Institute for foreign missions sends members from Milan to Consult with us in Rome before being sent to Hyderabad, and 5 white Sisters come to House Church on their way home chapter meeting to London, Goa, Glasgow, Germany and American. Local participation in Ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Translating terrible lucidity on tactical system into daily operating procedures. (Wk. 7)

BRUSSELS**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Field Visit in Vienna with top Protestant leaders marks first program activity in Austria.

Internal: Vienna visit triggers Week II mealtime reflection on Eastern Europe, creating new images and filling in data on Area: Budapest.

Contradiction: Securing funds needed to assure ITI's in India. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Held demonstration Field Visit with regional colleagues, then hosted Prof. Baers and priests in his theology class on adult Catechesis next day. RSI same week with three European pedagogues. Wayside Inn treats unexpected 30 Australian pilgrims, from Cairns Cathedral (Fr. Lizio) to St. Peter's, to coffee, and de-mythologizes Holy Year Story developed by Rome House.

Internal: Welcome Tom Grayshock, Frank Little, and Joe Thomas to Brussels, and Jim Troxel back from two week Berlin-Typing job, part of the House's doubling its income with gardening and basement painting at \$3.50/hour.

Contradiction: Living out of stance that 'winning' is not everything, it is the only thing. (WK.6)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: LENS course sponsored by University of Nairobi with 21 participants goes very well. Nairobi grads meet to begin work on June PLC.

Internal: LENS team arrives, exploding House context. 'New Castle' study expands vision of Muslim world we live on edge of--1200 miles to Mecca.

Contradiction: LENS grads ask about forming a Guild--What s a Guild? (Wk.5)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: GRA completed in Hyderabad. ITI materials received and cleared. Study plan completed.

Internal: Sent out P.T.James and T.Patterson to Calcutta, and receive Judy Hess for ITI.

Contradiction: Operating images needed to manifest globality and oneness of Spirit Movement. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Intensive researching for new GRA site and ITI site has brought us into close contact with many Orders and Schoolss.

Internal: Week of arrivals: GRA faculty arrives in Bombay:Hess from Chicago, Shinns from Oombulguri, Tickners from Delhi, Dharmalingam from Hyderabad. Joyous welcome to Clements family in time for Easter celebrations.

Contradiction: Keeping GRA and ITI momentum going while practics begin to bear down on the house. (Wk.2)

DEHLI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: ITI registration from Agra gives us registrations from 4 of 6 regions as recruitment effort is intensifies.

Internal: Marle Paul sent out to GRA, children to grand-mothers for summer; House troops drop from 9 adults to 5 in 2 weeks.

Contradiction: Finalizing ITI recruitment and guaranteeing goal of 36. (WK. 4)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: All male members of House sent out on round-up circuit rides, while rest of House joins with GRA on all day recruitment blitz in Hyderabad Metro.

Internal: House continues to be wayside inn for thirsty travellers and GRA participants.

Contradiction: Intensifying Hyderabad recruitment when almost all recruiters are out. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Two leading Church Schools near Circus 5 Parish will provide furniture, crockery, and cutlery for ITI-inkind hand soap and detergent powder arrive.

Internal: Unification service in Calcutta Cathedra makes House member, Art Rowe (Anglican clergyman), a minister of the Church of North India and Bishop assigns him as honorary assistant at Cathedral.

Contradiction: How to get the strategic people, especially those from Circus 5, to the ITI. (Wk.5)

Internal: Keep machinery rolling to enable ITI/GRA recruitment and LENS marketing with charts, mailings and phone calls. Experience new excitement through light and space in 'Castle of Constantinople'.

External: LENS in Davao makes this the 3rd. LENS in Philippines in last 3 weeks. Development trek in Cebu and development follow up in Kaohsiung yields US\$1,2000. from Kaohsiung.

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG (cont.)

Contradiction: Maintaining common vision in midst of scattered troops on multi-front. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Mactan Community LENS with 50 around table. Participants were largely local people who live and work in community. A great response holds possibility of guild training and guild miracles.

Internal: Welcomed sojourners, Elvira Monson and Erlina Martinez, for training and House development. Hosted LENS team and participants from Bacolod Metro.

Contradiction: Mactan 5 follow-up and Guild training yet unfocused. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: National Strategy Session held in Cebu; a first for movement in Philippines. LENS marketing call with NEDA nets suggestions for others to recruit. Week of intensified recruitment moves PLC registrations from 5 to 22 'yes-for-sure'. Second ITI pre-registration fee received.

External: Regional Colleagues addressed at spins about Majuro and TM showing possibility of deciding time through window of miracles. PLC push gets mailing out to all Churches in Fukuoka.

Internal: Global Panchayat visitation walks with House through Petagon of 'Love', Majuro Demonstration signs and broadens vision of Primal Community possibilities. 'Open House' invitations off to printer.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on Penetration schedule without overall strategic coordination for all Quarters miracles. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Consult held at Kanaguchi Church with Mike Miyajima and prior.

Internal: Using gift of time-national railway strikes-to do workshop and work-days in parish. received the keys to building.

Contradiction: GRA one-month away and no registered. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: House hosted movement and English teachers for two days of continued training in global language. Train strike forces us to intensify Week 6 visitations to Sapporo and Aomori metros.

Internal: House celebrates with local, secular, colleagues an evening in Fukushima: dinner, movie, and dancing in street.

Contradiction: Transforming mystery of our regional city into form and structure. (WK.6)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Beginning of Inner City study group - initial tactic for galaxy replication. Studying Rahner's 'Shape of The Church'. There were many present who hadn't participated in our structures before. Marketing ITI. direct to local congregation. (new tactic)

Internal: Visit of Global Panchayat. Sodality sparked as it came clear that social demonstration is on our prayer list.

Contradiction: Getting 'down' story to tell diverse audiences the one thing. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: A strong move on grass roots authorization with ITI mailing to 100 clergy, LENS recruiting wrap-up, Development with Donnelly, and HRM speaking engagement.

Internal: Aboriginal students complete school term and do examinations. A promising facility inspected. Worship room transformed with new decor, and lay out.

Contradiction: A concern for all the miracles on the battle plan leads to a reticence to die one's death for particular miracles as they come up. (WK. 5)

Six sponsors for LCC enable brochure to go to press. Sunday morning, House impacts 5 churches, A.A.P. meeting and fledgling Parish Sunday School.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE (cont.)

Contradiction: Challenge of involving old/new grads and colleagues in edge missional happenings. (WK. 6)

Contradiction: Discovering unique blend of order and chaos which will keep us moving and still ready to respond to what needs to be done. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: LENS recruitment elicits strong affirmation of trends toward community; Toowoomba colleagues reshape Metro strategies.

Internal: In midst of colleagues 'in and out' and LENS recruitment we pray. Gogarten leads us through interior gyrations that leave nought but awe; full employment secured.

Contradiction: Raising up core of people to embody power and possibility of corporateness, that brings vision to reality. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

Contradiction: No simple image to hold fact that we are working out of one tactical system. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Morning Collegium on ITI lays out possibilities and challenges to be considered in sending delegation to years ITI.

Internal: House participates in 'ecumenical Bible study' to hear about Buddhism and find ourselves addressed by richness of its traditions in Sri Lanka.

Contradiction: Discerning direction to go when many seem necessary. (WK.6)

SAN FRANCISCO RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Great TM 76 breakthrough can only report few. ARBA State Director invites us to display exhibit at State Fair and Co-Chair Horizons discussion. Lafayette Framing Meeting Model success as we frame and date set for Fall.

Internal: High mood of House members enflamed with TM 76 explodes in Quarterly celebration at Omar Hkayyam's and The Penthouse where even our teenage poet turns into wild rock dancer to amazement of all.

Contradiction: Four key TM 76 breakthrough convince us we are winning yet tempt us to forget hard work that is still before us. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Galaxy I, Wesley United Methodist, hosts Galaxy II for celebrative Sukiaki meal and joint Galaxy meeting. Preaching mission held at parish church, St. Paul's United Methodist, and paves way for further involvement there. Galaxy pastor's wife and House person asked to help lead and participate in parish Galaxy church Women's Retreat. TM Task Force launched in Watsonville as A.A.U.W. assumes full responsibility for planning and obtaining other sponsors.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE (cont.)

Contradiction: Turning to world and planning for TM, leaves forgotten items in path behind RSI only three weeks away with only one registration. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: State Bi-Centennial director puts TM 76 on agenda for State Bi-Centennial workshop and assures us of State endorsement.

Internal: Rome reminds us that spiritual and moral authority will chase away 'Atilla The Hun' far more effectively than all our this worldly tools.

Contradiction: How to relate to RSI, GRA, TM and other targets as tactic rather than goal. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Trek to 7 of 12 Parishes chosen from PCE, Week II returns grids and data to help ground decision to care for Metro. 1000 envelopes stuffed and mailed for Regional Council.

Internal: Ecclesiola study of 'Peru Indians' reveals gift to us as Americans.

Contradiction: How to create effective story about decisions of chosen Parishes. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Dr. John Greenfeld, president of moravian Church of North America is guest at House Church and talks with House about common concerns. Entire house goes to see the Seabee and scrapes barnacles in readiness for Majuro.

Internal: Religious House hosts PSU on Town Meeting advocacy, practical operations and office procedures. Day highlighted by reading of the play '1776'

Contradiction: Finding catalytic points that will engage maximum troops and turn the chaotic possibility into systematicaction. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: In midst of TM Trek North and South, Key visit to Calledge with proposed date for June T.M. Exciting visit in South Phoenix.

Internal: Spirit 'shower' for unexpected Reed family addition. Recovery of family address.

Contradiction: Breaking loose Guardian dynamic in colleagues not yet in contact with T'M' swirl. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Visit to Utah Endowment for the Humanities uncovers favorable prospects for TM 76 funding.

Internal: Experiencing responsibility for global movement in getting double jobs. New RSI grad participates in Ecclesiola and seeing Ecclesiola as similar dynamic to his previous monastic life.

Contradiction: Creation of necessary style while carrying all programs and activities along with holding jobs and providing adequate income. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: PCE Consult: decide PCE four-year Timeline for Butte-Billings Bi-Metro. Participation of 5 Metro colleagues with 7 House adults.

Internal: Ecclesiola experienced as 'Oasis' of refreshment on Quarter IV journey 'Pekin' study lights-up enigma of China; pre-Consult re-gridding insight of TM 76 thrust.

Contradiction: Finding way to move into continuing relationship with historical church by pronouncing absolution on past. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: TM 76 in Casper, Wyo., RSI in Boulder and parish participation in Community Fair engages all quad-metro troops in single week-end.

Internal: House Church with 16 guests appropriately celebrates events of week-end. In true pioneer spirit House forges on with washing machine refusing to participate in House mission.

Contradiction: How do we focus feverish energies toward the next 11 months and 40 years. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Getting authorization of Wyoming Metro's Bi-Centennial Committee chairman for the TM; House member assigned to lead Casper's TM getting GRA in our minds and holding a Week II Galaxy preparing for recruitment model for Summer 75.

Internal: Study of paper 'Corporatens is priorship impacts every member of House differently and study of 'Constantinople' for Ecclesiola holds interest of Houses.

Contradiction: Seeing our parish sign rust while waiting for weather and painter to cooperate calls into question possibilities of new miracles. (WK. 6)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: CFC initiation forays in Drayton Valley, Prince Rupert, Prince George, Williams Lake and Hanna. We are guest speakers at Drumheller Chamber of Commerce and Victoria B.C., request a CFC this quarter.

Contradiction: Lots of us doing 100 yard dash, but how to catalyze the Marathon Run. (WK6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: RSI nestled in shadow of Historic Church and Roman Catholic Bishop.

Internal: Youth drive to Portage to prepare for camping retreat this week-end.

Contradiction: As vision becomes clearer practical strategies become foggier and it becomes 'humanly impossible' to trust our creativity and freedom. (WK. 6)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: TM state-wide training session held in Bryan with 50 present; clergy LENS happens and proves to be powerful tool; visit with State Jaycee Bicentennial chairman initiates promising cooperation with 400 Texas chapters.

Internal: 'New Castle' continues to build vision and ground key function of the Religious in history.

Contradiction: Missional excitement often and too easily translates into hurried impatience instead of steady destinal urgency. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Mexican-American Parish task team from Buena Vista 5 Church arrived en masse at Suburban Methodist Church to participate in exciting Imaginal Education workshop for 30 participants.

Internal: Nearly whole House exited to Bryan, Texas, for TM 76 pedagogy Rally and returned to celebrate completion of Lauree Hawthorne's intern year to receive her as Fellow.

Contradiction: Total expenditure to bear fruit this week does not necessarily plant the seed for the next. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Mr. Isbell, Oklahoma representative on Kiwanis' district Bicentennial committee visits and shows great enthusiasm for TM 76. Central City 5 collegium creates Jet curriculum.

Internal: Day of Fast, on Behalf of, 24 Social Demonstrations finds us creating new decor to hold us before shift to TM 76.

Contradiction: Occasioning vocational shift necessary to break loose decisions for Summer 75. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: TM visits with two Mayors and two organizations go very well with Kiwanis working hard; Exchange Club excited about program, Primal Community activate inter-agency luncheon.

Internal: Ecclesiola construct going fine; with Social Methods School training format, 'New Castle' begins to intrigue and spin personal montages. Many visitors including Grace Umbagai and Julie McCauley.

Contradiction: Necessity of reminders that each recruitment call is also a happening and care structure. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Bartlesville TM 76 with 125 in attendance marked a great event for community.

Internal: Combustion let loose with TM 76 grand finale. Visitors, Don Clark, Jean Barringer and Nancy Task.

Contradiction: Need to build underlying systems to implement models for Fall Demonstration of TM 76. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Loyola course participants let in on TM plan and respond enthusiastically. PCE training continues to show great ability of clergy. Local parish TM mailing aided by Australian colleagues. Trek to Mobile sets up Week 8 RSI. Local radio executive agrees free publicity for TM.

Internal: Australian guests boost numbers and excitement of structures--raw oysters go like popcorn. Rahner study (Shape of The Church to Come) reaffirms TM. Ecclesiola grounds journey as journey of all the world and it's secular, too.

Contradiction: With two weeks to TM, how do we turn lots of promises into 200 'for sures' for TM. (WK 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Week II forays into Polis cities of Hot Springs and Jonesboro, Arkansas. Trip to Little Rock paves way for State Bicentennial endorsement for Arkansas. Circuit to Nashville and Knoxville firmly establishes Metro cadres in both places. Nashville Cadre ignores discouraging remarks and demands pilot Town Meeting.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS (cont.)

Internal: New job begun and House receives in-kind car from Louis Deos, frequently now showing up for House and Cadre events.

Contradiction: How to 'Go for broke' on TM without giving selves permission to 'lose' other course. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Atlanta Bicentennial Commission executive chairman gives enthusiastic 'yes' for sponsorship and funding TM across city of Atlanta. Milledgeville Ministerial Association is second group to sponsor their TM.

Internal: Gergen lands job. PCE Guilders tells boss she must have Tuesday afternoon off even though it means loss of some income for her. Lincoln Chase, new neighbor and song writer (Jim Dandy-Name Game) sees name plate on door and begins coming to PCE meetings.

Contradiction: Getting giddy over 'overwhelming authorization' we're receiving (City Councilwoman-Executive Board of Metropolitan Atlanta YMCA) when we haven't faced real situation-how to get 200 to each TM. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Bi-Metro Cadres ask for commonality meeting format as they celebrate with House the new facility. 1816 E. 7th. St. TM appointments set up, RSI calls on old grads get 'yes' to recruiting.

Internal: Temporary gives way to interim as large facility is secured for Charlotte House. In-kind continues to pour in, internal time design enables external missional thrust.

Contradiction: Taking old images for Religious Houses and pushing them into new possibilities for creating House in new edge of the Movement. (Wk. 6.)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: First visits in Key West and West Palm Beach in two years. Authorization by 1800 member Management Council of Eastern for TM 76; 4-year phasing of Region enables building concrete 26 week Parish Timeline.

Internal: Finances enabled by Federal Government, who takes less withholding and bends income tax refunds back. Emerging Generation plant Resurgence Garden. House nurtured by daily call from guardian.

Contradiction: Not knowing all there is to know and having to catalyze the troops anyway. (WK.6)

CHICAGO

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO

External: Pentecost Sunday heralds the start of HRM's happenings across the continent and impacts 1600. Parish signs are created in Uptown 5 with enthusiastic Work Day. Two week Development Experimental Treks and Town Meeting Advocacy and Sponsorship are actualized.

Internal: Collegium on Human Resurgence Mission as a mass impact tool reveals our passion for engaging local man. Rob, Mary, Benjamin and Christopher Work arrive from the Seoul House. Grace Umbagai and Julie Mc Cauley return from 2 month Religious House Trek. Students are impacted by labour as they work with local man harvesting Spring vegetables.

Contradiction: Taking the swirl of reflection on the Summer and giving it form. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Preliminary TM Committee of 18 meets, including representatives from Global Guardians, House and Chicago Centrum. Strategy creation for pulling off TM in Chicago. Good week for executive LENS recruitment.

Internal: Let the sunshine in--new and clean windows for Room A transforms Collegium Room. Ecclesiola study of Pekin gives us screen through which to grasp the current shifts in SEAPAC.

Contradiction: Longing for discontinuity somewhere other than in thick of the battle. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Traveling in Kansas nets many open doors in churches and Kiwanis Clubs for TM'76. Lapka's installation brings together 75 top clergy and laity from Wichita.

Internal: Lana Guy returns from San Francisco Area ITI. New job possibilities emerge and babysitters (finally) procured for infants.

Contradiction: 'What? When? Where? Who? How?.... (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Trip to Nebraskan Panhandle promoting TM reveals future possibilities. First task force of The Northside Community completed.

Internal: Dolly Mannan of India impacts House and colleagues with the true globality of the Movement. Martin study of 'Rome' enables reflection upon role of Historical Order of our time.

Contradiction: Getting all practics handled before the events. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Clergy visitation in parish relative to TM finds brand new kind of 'Yes' with significant entree to further cooperation. Parish Cadre weekend PSU discerns necessary miracles for Bi-Metro battleplan.

Internal: Shift internal time design to meet recruitment needs and find real breakthrough in re-imaging our expenditure. Bi-Metro recruitment task force attends Newport Jaz Festival after full day of calling.

Contradiction: Need story of RSIIIA that is adequate for recruiting grads. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development Team from Chicago unlocks key to Minneapolis foodchest and the Summer Program is equipped with an array of stuff ranging from 4400 plastic bags, 800 lbs of popcorn, and cash donations; 7 sent from House to enable TM in Bethel, Alaska, and Green Bay.

Internal: Two House members are transformed into 20 Centruy executives and POs at Area LENS. Ecclesiola is experienced as journey to Orient as we feasted on Chop Suey. Metro colleague, gained insights for our revolution via the 'Buddha Smile' after a week of closely watching shifts in Southeast Asia.

Contradiction: Ideas ready to cook yet truning on stove has not been figured out. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: VFW in Cedar Rapids endorses TM 76. Missouri State Bicentennial Commission endorses demonstration TM in Missouri in Knasas City. PCC builds four year porjection and phasing of PCE initiation across St. Louis Region.

Internal: Ecclesiola construct, especially Martin study, remains powerful weekly care structure for maintaining context of global resurgence. One job produces raise of \$50 per month.

Contradiction: Allowing ourselves to drift in gap between Primal Community Experiment initiations across whole Region and beginning of major Social Demonstration project in St. Louis. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Finished proposal for six TMs in Peoria for presentation to ARBA and city council. Two Council members endorse project: one says city might appropriate funds.

Internal: Attendance promotion, in-kind solicitations lead to great TM.

Contradiction: Desire to put arms down after battle is won when greater wars to be fought. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Galaxy pastor decides to attend Green Bay TM to so that someone could report back on it to clergy associations and services clubs considering sponsoring TMs. Summer 75 recruitment kick-off dinner held.

Internal: Moving office to the first floor creates new node for House and holds us before the task of TM 76.

Contradiction: Internalizing indicative Battleplanning to the point that when the indicative becomes clear a response of 'I am the one is' released. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Lord winks at us as neighborhood association agrees to sponsor TM in parish school of former Galaxy church in PCE.

Internal: Circus celebration reminds us of our passingawayness and contingency, individually and as group, as Orth family is sent out and Jack Bayer for five weeks sojourn.

Contradiction: Shifting internal troops and images of promises in present economic up-against-ness. (WK. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Authorization from Archdiocese to do HRM.

Internal: Development team lives in this week intensification of Xavier principle.

Contradiction: How to shift into the Summer with all breaking loose. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Swirl of block-club, civic groups, and community protection program disperses all House for Urban Mission in 'infact instead of theory'.

Internal: Old Testament review without House prior requires all Region and House to decide to be first teachers and in fact all became first teachers.

Contradiction: Standing on brink of May 31st. TM with much to do done. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Leaflet blitz of Parish Stake announces to residents the Health Day. Development team continues major breakthroughs for TM Advocacy and entrees for funding.

Internal: Rediscovery: Creative edge of structural revolution is obedience enabled by its free re-creation in each enactment as we walk into Angor Watt for our last night dinner/Ecclesiola seminary surrounded by garden, temple, forest, and goldfish punchbowl.

Contradiction: Willingness to be the expended creativity which catalyzation requires. (Wk.5)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: House member presents lay 'sermon' at St. John's Lutheran in South Bronx, while House permeator lands job as Director of Community Services at First Moravian in Lower Manhattan, signaling new relationship with Historical Church in New York City.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK (cont.)

Internal: Rahner study gives new images of nature of Long March and provides absolution for our impatience.

Contradiction: Waking up to reality; revisioning the forty-year march as to where we are. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Our week if filled full as first PLc in year comes off in grand style, with both new participants and POs being key people in Region and Parish; four year visions for Clarksburg, Pittsburgh, and Charleston (at last) are mapped out during Week II PCC.

Internal: Our guest rooms are never empty, as 10 colleagues from Chicago, Cleveland and New York spend a part of Week 5 in Pittsburgh, helping to spiritize Ecclesiola, House Church, and giving us an excuse for a fantastic night tour of Pittsburgh.

Contradiction: How does symbolic order embody comprehensive contest in a way that catalyzes movemental order decision. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: LENS blitz nets 10 registrations; Buffalo Clergy Collegium begins with 10 new pastors present; Ithaca TM sponsors group meets for first time.

Internal: Robert Mayo, sojourning for four weeks, is sent to Washington D.C. for remaining two weeks to enable Demonstration TM 76 to happen; leaving us with no one in House.

Contradiction: How to maintain emphasis on symbolic life with focus on programs. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: TM advocacy calls in Ashland, at State Farm where inmates/staff sponsorship committee met and made assignments for May 31 TM, and in Hampton spark week culminating in PCE consult, all of which makes 36 PCE's look realizable.

Internal: Linda Ikenberry was sent out to Chicago from Ecclesiola. We hosted Wanda Brinton, Barbara Hawley's mother, for week before sending her home to Iowa. Also hosted Kathy Bauknight during Week II PCE Consult, ending in fine celebration and conversation 'out on the town'.

Contradiction: Developing spirit forms to sustain us as life explodes in intensity through next months and years. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: 7 groups self-consciously call selves TM steering committees. Over 100 direct contacts made for TM in a week. Merkle Press agrees to print 20,000 TM brochures, inkind! House helps American Issues Forum for national citizens involvement net staff--who stays for dinner and past midnight.

Internal: House picnic includes baseball and fishing, and Bicentennial trek to Jefferson and Lincoln memorials. Full semester credit given for Academy by American University. Finalize House assignments to back up Town Meeting.

Contradiction: Keeping Movement internal life responsive to wildly intensified demand of doing eight TMs this spring. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: TM 144 participants on T.V.; three requests for TMs in future. One Emerging Generation participants in Walkathon.

Internal: Guests from Texas

Contradiction: How to journey colleagues in TM effort far enough to form guild and give major impetus to Metro Cadre. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: House sends two to Washington, D.C., to ensure National Capitol is signal Demonstration while in Philadelphia Christ Church (George Washington-Benjamin Franklin's Church) decides to do TM.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA (cont.)

Internal: House surprises itself in willingness to give up two members while major events stand around corner.

Contradiction: Articulating depth struggle in standing in crushing tension of doing mass evangelism. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Two miracles in one day-mini-park and community mural saying 'I Dig Newark' City councilman from our Ward comes by after being called by one of his aides and promises sod and list of all vacant lots in North Ward. Best remark of day (made by 12 year old to another as they raked glass) 'this is better than baseball'.

Internal: Resident landlord (and guildsman) on his own initiative takes 5th. City film next door to show to neighbors-with comment 'something got to make those people believe and I think this might be it'.

Contradiction: Facing the reality that our model for creating guild is creating guildsman faster than we have models to care for them. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Staten Island Bicentennial Corporation endorsement of TM 76 results in their setting up luncheon with 30 most important people on the island to promote sponsorship. Development picks up \$4000 for Majuro boat.

Internal: Constant stream of people continues to stream through House. Welcomed sojourner Mary Happer, the mother of Amanda Cooke, one week after Amanda's sojourn.

Contradiction: Creating models to sustain new break loose of guilding dynamic on Long Island; i.e. engage them while they're hot. (WK.6)

Brussels has offer from wealthy Indian businessman in London to set up dinner with a dozen of his friends. Warboards activated as a way to hold potential donors. Singapore welcomes Donnelly who touches down for one day on the way to Kuala Lumpur for Development circuit. Six proposals submitted to business and corporations in Australia. Four week Area Sydney circuit trek is completed. Last letter from Singapore legal structures suggests we may be able to register as the Ecumenical Institute. 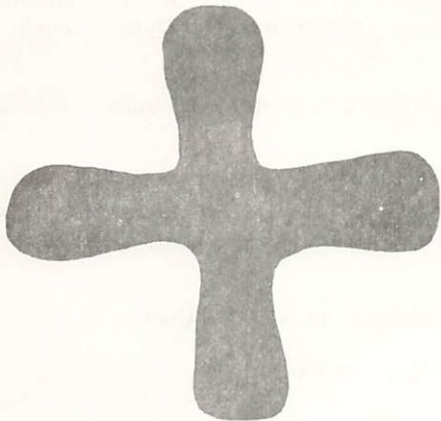

Contradiction: A concern for all the miracles on the battle plan leads to a reticence to die one's death for particular miracles as they come up. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Panchayat team helps build miracles model for Darwin reconstruction project set-up. PCE launches first Darwin Housing Co-op and Lions Club funds after-school program for \$5,000. Visits to business leaders involves enthusiasm for planning long-term re-building thrust.

Internal: Celebrative meal with 'intra-global' Panchayat team breathes spirit across ruined city with enthusiastic singing. Search for new facility intensifies, with 6 weeks to vacate house.

Contradiction: Completion of '21 Signal Events in 21 Weeks' manual reveals request for troops founded on necessity rather than wish-dream. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Intensification of March of Miracles signalling shift from 'settling in' to 'building Oombulgurri' with clean-up of whole community, repainting coCommunity Center, first Guild Night, and planning workshops. Seven emissaries return for holidays.

Internal: Mid-quarter evaluation with Global Panchayat team builds 42 miracles for next 13 weeks. Decor completed and House set up to host 23 people for a 'Djuruk Bara Nanne Nor Ngeni.'

Contradiction: thinking through miracles to wring out of each one the greatest catalytic impact. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Community Park Project creates involvement of local neighborhood and businesses in the building of this parish sign. One business donates \$60 worth of best timber for park seat. One man, visiting neighbour for day, puts a full day work to help out park creation.

Internal: Receive Fisher family as new interns, LENS pedagogues hosted House for High Celebration of Ecclesiola. Peter Robins arrives for discontinuity and Paul Duffy journeys to Sydney for discontinuity.

Contradiction: How to cover geography on on-going basis. (WK6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: HRM is key movemental eyecatcher as tactical work wins over intended planning committee from target parish HRM congregation and Hobart trek reveals Anglican Churches openness. Six sponsors for LCC enable brochure to go to press. Sunday morning, House impacts 5 churches, A.A.P. meeting and fledgling Parish Sunday School.

Internal: Tim Wegner begins 'Flex Time' job as actuarial assistant: pre-Ecclesiola 'Sting Party' scores colleague commitment for Week 6 strategic missional involvement.

Contradiction: Challenge of involving old/new grads and colleagues in edge missional happenings. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: JWM visits Senator Cavanaugh and is assured of further government support. Department of Aboriginal Affairs bureaucrats are excited about Oombulgurri Consult and will endeavour to contribute half cost.

Internal: Kang Byoung Hoom and JWM stay one night. Sisters of Mercy request House to design guild training program for college credit.

Contradiction: Formulating Social Demonstration as training dynamic and not just another community project. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: LENS recruitment elicits strong affirmation of trends toward community; Toowoomba colleagues reshape Metro strategies.

Internal: In midst of colleagues 'in and out' and LENS recruitment we pray. Gogarten leads us through interior gyrations that leave nought but awe; full employment secured.

Contradiction: Raising up core of people to embody power and possibility of corporateness, that brings vision to reality. (WK.6)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO**

External: Relations with Catholic Church begin to be cemented as 'Blue Shirts' and students pour 23 loads of concrete for floor of new Assumption Church and High School.

Internal: Kathleen White returned from Hong Kong Centrum. House impacted by Collegium Report given relative to trip, the meetings and the spirit encountered there.

Contradiction: No simple image to hold fact that we are working out of one tactical system. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Morning Collegium on ITI lays out possibilities and challenges to be considered in sending delegation to years ITI.

Internal: House participates in 'ecumenical Bible study' to hear about Buddhism and find ourselves addressed by richness of its traditions in Sri Lanka.

Contradiction: Discerning direction to go when many seem necessary. (WK.6)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Fifty-six Guardians attend profound Guardian Evening at Thorsons, complete with Fifth City Video, Majuro slides, Town Meeting display, goldfish in tanks and address by Orvis Agee, 72 yrs. old, who just returned from three month's work in Majuro. A great HRM in Mission Galaxy inspires all, especially local Lutheran pastor.

Internal: Many guests bring news of demonstration signs across globe. Oscar Sperstad and Dick Hamje arrive with 27 ft. truck pulling huge trailer with sawmill, manure spreader, tractor and equipment to be put on newly acquired ship for Majuro, named (not by us) 'The Bonhoeffer.' Kamela Parekh welcomed for first trip to Area House.

Contradiction: Which are key cities for TM '76 that will really catalyze the others? (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Galaxy I, Wesley United Methodist, hosts Galaxy II for celebrative Sukiyaki meal and joint Galaxy meeting. Preaching mission held at parish church, St. Paul's United Methodist, and paves way for further involvement there. Galaxy pastor's wife and House person asked to help lead and participate in parish Galaxy church Women's Retreat. TM Task Force launched in Watsonville as A.A.U.W. assumes full responsibility for planning and obtaining other sponsors.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE (cont.)

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to be high celebrative event. Two more jobs secured including Summer School teaching job.

Contradiction: Turning to world and planning for TM, leaves forgotten items in path behind RSI only three weeks away with only one registration. (WK. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: HRM held in key black church with sponsorship provided totally by Oak Park Parish black businessmen.

Internal: Address from Sodality of beginning to understand the cruciality of the role of United States in the next 20 years; grasping the offense that the US is the place to be.

Contradiction: How to prior and co-ordinate TM task forces as 'consultants' and not as priors or co-ordinators. (Wk. 7).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Seal Beach Town Meeting undergirded by \$200 check from Religious Council; 150 experience 'whole new face of church' in Pomona HRM; now other churches want them.

Internal: Continued spirit healing while reading 1776, then took a leap to deal with budget as young executive Scott Chamberlain takes first business trip to San Francisco.

Contradiction: Integrating Summer 75 recruitment and Town Meeting emphasis into one depth push into the future. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Demonstration Town Meeting date set for June 14 for Coolidge, Arizona, with firm sponsorship of mayor and state and local Jaycees.

Internal: Visit of Rob and Mary Work and gift of decor from Seoul House, sojourn of Colleague Jackie Cook.

Contradiction: Loving the burden of winning with T.M. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Guild holds first meeting. Four avow intent to go to Summer '75.

Internal: RSI followup reveals deep understanding. Questions very open: how do I participate and what do I do?

Contradiction: How to shift images from immediate anxieties and possibilities to promises of four year comprehensive plan. (Wk. 7).

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Glendive TM 76 startles participants to new awareness of possibilities of grassroots involvement in community's future; Conrad and Gayle Himmel 'gun' preparation for and coordination of day in grand manner. Guilders from Billings and Humanist from Helena provide leadership for Demonstration Town Meeting.

Internal: Collegiums zero in on recruitment for RS-I and Summer 75. Ecclesiola re-scheduled when all House members assigned to permeation and child care. Phone calls from N.A. Houses, 'How did you do it?' demands mailing of materials pertaining to grant from Mantana Humanities Committee.

Contradiction: Threatening paralysis as volume of work involved in Primal Community Town Meeting projections of next few months mounts and cruciality of 'Framing' homework increases pressure and points up immediate imperative. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

Contradiction: Not pulling through Parish miracle leaves us in ambiguous position. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Contradiction: Tendency to slip into nurtural on the other side of the hump rather than keeping in gear gear with vehicle under full control. (Wk. 7)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Calgary CFC sponsorship group builds E.G. structures for the day. First Academy registration from Edmonton Region in hand for October 1.

Internal: Pentecost celebrated by attendance Ecclesiola night at Anglican Whitsuntide Festival to hear Dean Herb O'Driscoll of Vancouver on 'A New Spirit.' Edmondton Region receives new Canadian colleagues (via Detroit), John and Gerta Hazenberg. New House decour, including 16-foot Totem Pole, stressing Xavierism.

Contradiction: Instigation of effective catalyzation everywhere except among ourselves. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

Internal: Allowing local congregation to carry the ball for an amazing HRM frees House to fill the freezer with home-butchered moose. Receive Kimberly Gruner from Seattle House to join her family. Frisbee football after evening structures in extended Alaskan daylight takes toll of one injured knee.

Contradiction: How is it with emphasis on HRM and T/M entire House gets engaged in edge participation? (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Institute of Cultural Affairs hosts opening of Prince Albert Colleagues' Art Show.

Internal: Preparation for double header, PCC and HRM, engages House in local and study of 'Mecca' pushes us to the universal.

Contradiction: Lots of us doing 100 yard dash, but how to catalyze the Marathon Run. (WK6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Local community support spreads across region as community newspaper goes to press and Brandon colleague's CFC presentation to Social Agencies elicits overwhelming response of total sponsorship of CFC.

Internal: House celebrates Victoria Day week-end at camp donated by Portage la Prairie Presbytery--- a great time for corporate games, campfire meals, solitary-corporate reflection.

Contradiction: Anticipation of summer dissipation throws troops into struggle with future foginess, total engagement, being the invisible presence, and being indispensable. (Wk.7)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: TM state-wide training session held in Bryan with 50 present; clergy LENS happens and proves to be powerful tool; visit with State Jaycee Bicentennial chairman initiates promising cooperation with 400 Texas chapters.

Internal: 'New Castle' continues to build vision and ground key function of the Religious in history.

Contradiction: Missional excitement often and too easily translates into hurried impatience instead of steady destinal urgency. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Amarillo Guild care ready for training sessions to begin on Sunday mornings from 6-9am. At same time, Lubbock Metro Cadre requests Ecclesiola as they begin TM push.

Internal: Ecclesiola exciting time with four adult and five Emerging Generation guests. House Church comes alive in new way with Episcopal Priest as celebrant.

Contradiction: How to crack self-conscious parochialism. (Wk.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Mexican-American Parish task team from Buena Vista 5 Church arrived en masse at Suburban Methodist Church to participate in exciting Imaginal Education workshop for 30 participants.

Internal: Nearly whole House exited to Bryan, Texas, for TM 76 pedagogy rally and returned to celebrate completion of Lauree Hawthorne's intern year to receive her as Fellow.

Contradiction: Total expenditure to bear fruit this week does not necessarily plant the seed for the next. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Seven Guildsmen travel 160 miles to attend Bartlesville TM 76. Consensus: 'We should have more of these.'

Internal: New sojourner Doris Compton picks up in-house role as prior is sent out on teaching circuit.

Contradiction: How to shift inertia of early quarter run to fourth quarter sprint. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Town Meeting training in College Station. 4 Dallas Metro clergy go to Houston Clergy LENS and return excited. 2 visits open entree to Black community in Dallas for LENS. RSI registrations climb above what course facility will hold.

Internal: Facility work for RSI. Perkins semester ends. House personnel up one. Development team arrives.

Contradiction: The Lord provides us with everything we've asked for--now what do we do with it all? (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: HRM with attendance of 75 is miracle No. 1 initiating the Community Reformulation Project.

Internal: Visitors Don Clark and Iris Boivin to do PCC and HRM.

Contradiction: Keeping up momentum after TM76 and HRM in finding a Religious House, beginning CRP, and setting six Demonstration Town Meetings for Fall Quarter. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Julie McCauley and Grace Umbagai occasion spirit-filled Metro Cadre evening with many guests present. Consult on PCE is key Movement building event for Region with 19 around table representing four Metros.

Internal: Sent out Gary Bigson to California for three weeks job training, and received Louis Deos into House to sojourn three months before completing his intern year. Financial breakthrough as many weekend painting jobs open up for corporate second jobs.

Contradiction: As Town Meetings approach, temptation is to cop out on being catalytic and pick up doing the last minute necessities ourselves. How to remember that the May demonstrations are to demonstrate that they can be catalyzed (not done). (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: East Lake TM 'endorsed' when all we'd asked for was 'approval.' Guildsmen actively recruiting for RSI and write East Lake Song. Sponsors for East Lake T/M hold second planning session and take individual assignments back to their organization.

Contradiction: How to catalyze and bring commonality to existing Movemental structures and penetration indicative. (Week 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: First visits in Key West and West Palm Beach in two years. Authorization by 1800 member Management Council of Eastern for TM 76; 4-year phasing of Region enables building concrete 26 week Parish Timeline.

Internal: Finances enabled by Federal Government, who takes less withholding and bends income tax refunds back. Emerging Generation plant Resurgence Garden. House nurtured by daily call from guardian.

Contradiction: Not knowing all there is to know and having to catalyze the troops anyway. (WK.6)

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO

External: Chicago honored with visit of Dr. Helen Chung Lee of Seoul, celebrating with her the receiving of her Doctor of Pedagogy degree from the University of Northeastern Ohio at Ada, and engaging in the futuric hopes of Korea as she spoke of her country's heritage, tensions, and dreams. Summer planning task force breakthrough reveals need for major practical research this Summer on methods of effective actuation.

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO (cont.)

Internal: The Global Order celebrates with the Seoul House the marriage of Paul Jan Thomas and Pamela Dale Johnson. Issues of Vocation, Vision, and Style show up as primary arenas in continuing discussion on the spirit life of the Summer.

Internal: Dolly Mannan of India impacts House and colleagues with the true globality of the Movement. Martin study of 'Rome' enables reflection upon role of Historical Order of our time.

Contradiction: Getting all practices handled before the events. (Wk.4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Clergy visitation in parish relative to TM finds brand new kind of 'Yes' with significant entree to further cooperation. Parish Cadre weekend PSU discerns necessary miracles for Bi-Metro battleplan.

Internal: Shift internal time design to meet recruitment needs and find real breakthrough in re-imagining our expenditure. Bi-Metro recruitment task force attends Newport Jaz Festival after full day of calling.

Contradiction: Need story of RSIIIA that is adequate for recruiting grads. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Development Team from Chicago unlocks key to Minneapolis food chest and the Summer program is equipped with an array of stuff ranging from 4,400 plastic bags, 800 lbs. of popcorn, and cash donations. Seven sent from House to enable T/M in Bethel, Alaska and Green Bay.

Internal: Two House members transformed into 20th Century executives and P.O.'s at Area LENS. Ecclesiola experienced as journey to Orient as we feasted on Chop Suey. Metro colleague gained insights for our revolution via the 'Buddha Smile' after a week of closely watching shifts in Southeast Asia.

Contradiction: Ideas ready to cook, yet turning on stove not been figured out. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: 18 registrations firm for Community LENS (Week 8). Cedar Rapids T/M brochures printed. Mailing on T/M sent to Region.

Internal: Grace Umbagai from Australia visits House. Summer Pre-School curriculum well underway. \$500 gift bails out press costs. New Sodality participants from Galaxy.

Contradiction: The need to appropriate self-consciously the style of acting catalytically. (WK.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Finished proposal for six TMs in Peoria for presentation to ARBA and city council. Two Council members endorse project: one says city might appropriate funds.

Internal: With House fully employed (by common definition), entire Troika nevertheless turns up at lunch on three days and has helpful strategy sessions.

Internal: In midst of Fast Day, whole House marches in back of T/M banner and show up on local TV news.

Contradiction: Sailing calmly toward the abyss. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Leaflet blitz of Parish Stake announces to residents the Health Day. Development team continues major breakthroughs for TM Advocacy and entrees for funding.

Internal: Rediscovery: Creative edge of structural revolution is obedience enabled by its free re-creation in each enactment as we walk into Angor Watt for our last night dinner/Ecclesiola seminary surrounded by garden, temple, forest, and goldfish punchbowl.

Contradiction: Willingness to be the expended creativity which catalyzation requires. (Wk.5)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: House member presents lay 'sermon' at St. John's Lutheran in South Bronx, while House permeator lands job as Director of Community Services at First Moravian in Lower Manhattan, signaling new relationship with Historical Church in New York City.

Internal: Rahner study gives new images of nature of Long March and provides absolution for our impatience.

Contradiction: Waking up to reality; revisioning the forty-year march as to where we are. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Our week is filled full as first PLC in year comes off grand style, with both new participants and POs being key people in Region and Parish; four year visions for Clarksburg, Pittsburgh, and Charleston (at last) are mapped out during Week II PCC.

Internal: Our guest rooms are never empty, as 10 colleagues from Chicago, Cleveland and New York spend a part of Week 5 in Pittsburgh, helping to spiritize Ecclesiola, House Church, and giving us an excuse for a fantastic night tour of Pittsburgh.

Development Centrum Hong Kong reports a week of large corporation gifts: 5,000 pesos from General Milling, Mactan, and 2,000 pesos from Cebu shipyards were received in hand. Carlotta Sugar Central and Pilar Sugar Central both approved gifts of 5,000 pesos. The total for the week in Hong Kong comes to 2,000 U.S. dollars. Building on this corporation thrust, a week II task force in Hong Kong worked on the Centrum's development systems to prepare to raise \$40,000 for the ITI's and GRA which are fast approaching. In Chicago, a Week II circuit to Rockford brought in \$1,000 and an Academy pitch netted \$3,000. Plans were laid for a team of 12 telephone callers to use seven in-kind Wats lines for Town Meeting '76 funding. Circuits were made to Cincinnati and Dallas. The contradiction is located in the gap between promised funds and cash-in-hand. The difficulty lies in attempting both to gear up for a new month and to follow up donor commitments from previous months and quarters.

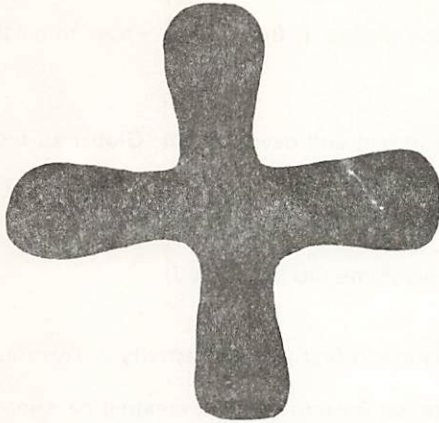

Contradiction is designing new possibilities for particularly grounding the 'beggar' image.

University 13 develops new form for background work on courses, making full use of University students in research and course-building. Vocations conversation developed, using poems of Robert Frost, as well as work done on Vocation 'triangle'. CFC held in Ottawa, an LCC in Sentul (Kuala Lumpur), PCCs in Berlin, Frankfurt, Los Angeles, Phoenix, Houston, Cleveland, and New York; HRMs reported in Bristol, Kaohsiung, Edmonton, Mandaluyong (Manila), and Caracas, adding to the previous 16 held across North America. Contradiction: GRA one month away and none registered. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Brochures announcing Jeju, Korea ITI produced and sent to all regions. Met with Teachers Guild to plan next educators conference, June 28-29.

Internal: House decor for both offices finished and put up. Reimpacted with technological possibilities of 20th. Century as we watch videotape of Queen Elizabeth II during Guardian development event.

Contradiction: Re-interpretation of commitment as participation in vision of the whole or global task. (WK.8)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Field visit and Rahner study brings 'yes' from Historical Church on local level in face of our anticipated 'no'. Visits from Jim Bishop and George Holcombe bring consciousness of Guardian Net in reference to T/M and Oombulgurri intensification.

Internal: Guest Night allows us to see how a celebrative event can be a time for indirect, but powerful recruitment of ITI. House income increased by \$250 per week.

Contradiction: All signs point to a 'yes' and disclose we had been busy preparing ourselves to expect a 'no' (Wk 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

Internal: Key educator, Bob Arthur of Universities Commission visits House while Nancy Vosler here from Brisbane on teachers conference.

Contradiction: Pulling off Metro Council that will train local movemental troops with a vision of further participation. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Saturday night has 18 Guardians to dinner with Jim Bishop as guest speaker emphasizing their role in global projects. Colleague opens access route to 'at cost' printer for LCC bi-lingual pamphlets. Dinner leads into 'meet your neighbor' event in front Guild room with 11 from Parish.

Internal: Sr. Moriaty phones to say she is here for three weeks and wants to work with House, comes to dinner, and tells of her work in Tokyo. House experiences gifts of school vacation as extra in-House troops empower mission and Emerging Generation exchange visits with rural cousins.

Internal: Memorial Day weekend extravaganza. T/M 76 PSU plus workday culminates in wild touch football game at House picnic. All receive bruises, sprains and battle scars and wear them proudly.

Contradiction: Need for a comprehensive and quick strategy for getting our Committee of 76. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Galaxy I, Wesley United Methodist, hosts Galaxy II for celebrative Sukiaki meal and joint Galaxy meeting. Preaching mission held at parish church, St. Paul's United Methodist, and paves way for further involvement there. Internal: Jim Bishop and George Holcombe return from trek through Australia. The Mark Reames family sent out to Boulder, Colorado, to study as part of their missionary 'sabbatical' program. Receive Robertson and Mark Work and their sons, Benjamin and Christopher, from Seoul. The Global Order celebrates with Jack and Neibaj Silk, of Majuro, the birth of a son on Pentecost Sunday, May 18. Weather allows great evening at home as all four Congregations celebrate with 'indoor' picnics.

Contradiction: Finding self on point where you decided to be and expecting to have something to stand on. (Wk.8) prehensive vision--one thrust. (Wk.

External: LENS course in Parish expected to have 35 local community people. First call back from Granite City on T/M '76 mass mailing to 500 grads. Neighborhood Advisory Council in Parish invites ICA to join its Board of Directors.

Internal: Galaxy pastor celebrates House Church on "Trinity Sunday," first Sunday after Pentacost. Summer pre-schooling institute initiated, as in Majuro, a teacher and a student on each end of a log. Training Center preparations underway for LENS, Receive Centrum guests.

Contradiction: Willing ourselves to be broken loose into the new radicalization of Summer '75, thereby releasing us to catalyze the participation of other colleagues and civic leaders. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Finished proposal for six TMs in Peoria for presentation to ARBA and city council. Two Council members endorse project: one says city might appropriate funds.

Internal: With House fully employed (by common definition), entire Troika nevertheless turns up at lunch on three days and has helpful strategy sessions.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Two Galaxy pastors sent to plan Area Clergy Convocation come back breathing fire and seriously dealing with future visoun. Summer '75 steering committee comes into being out of cadre's warboard. Grad care training night produces new seriousness about advanced course and how you do follow-up on RS-1. T/M trek continues to six more cities and villages.

External: Primal Community Consult gives us new sense of direction and power of the spirit in Parish. Painesville T/M demonstrates the power of local man's decision and polis cadre's power to move catalytically and seals our turn to practical engagement in the world.

Internal: Rugs shampooed and dormitory painted for LENS. EG return from "Sound of Music" singing Do Re Me to PCC participants. Pause for Memorial Day retreat and reflection on Quarter. Celebrate termination of three months of double jobs with progressive dinner launched at midnite.

Contradiction: Imagining our shift into Summer as shifting back to "normal" while holding the tension between moving on the 24 Parishes we projected right away and planning more time for research. (Wk.8)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Primal Community Consult gives us new possibility for dealing with our masses. West Point indicates interest in T/M.

Internal: Memorial Day comes as great gift as we engage in recruitment blitz, closet cleaning, and hosting Area Priors' PSU.

Contradiction: How to shift to catalytic tactics. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Put out Regional Newsletter which went a few levels deeper than just news getting out, spirit edge and vision of the Movement.

Internal: With only two weeks remaining in our present location-our visit with the Carmileta Fathers to start talking about a shared facility.

Contradiction: Having ignited initial spark for the T/M across the globe, our role now is to nurture or to blow the spark into flame. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Buffalo Clergy Collegium (1st. for that Metro) sends one to Hartford PLC to catalyze neighboring churches who request RSI in Quarter II, 1975-first since 1971 for that Metro.

Internal: Prior heard (via telephone), but not seen as he circuit rides throughout Region and on to Baltimore Annual Conference.

Contradiction: Caring for world only good theory when care is particularized in the local (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: TM advocacy calls in Ashland, at State Farm where inmates/staff sponsorship committee met and made assignments for May 31 TM, and in Hampton spark week culminating in PCE consult, all of which makes 36 PCE's look realizable.

Internal: Linda Ikenberry was sent out to Chicago from Ecclesiola. We hosted Wanda Brinton, Barbara Hawley's mother, for week before sending her home to Iowa. Also hosted Kathy Bauknight during Week II PCE Consult, ending in fine celebration and conversation 'out on the town'.

Contradiction: Developing spirit forms to sustain us as life explodes in intensity through next months and years. (WK. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: Area PLC with participants from Baltimore, Philadelphia and Washington. T/M post active on National and local contacts; 14 grassroots workshop leaders trained. Pepsi pledges pepsi for all 6 T/Ms this spring. Funeral Homes give \$300 to T/M fund. In-kind printing of 20,000 T/M flyers and local printers overprint with local T/M data. Loan of typewriter for T/M office and T/M days.

Internal: Fourteen colleagues join House during week for half-day to two week tours of duty. New Post assignments ease chaos of ever-expanding and shifting universe. Rochester Region provides Janice Ulanka and Lonnie Weinheimer for two weeks as Bob Mayo returns to Albany.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON (cont.)

Contradiction: Full Orchestra on stage, symphony has started with arrangers still in back room finishing the score, less than one hour till the finale. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: PLC in Washington with 17 around the table-were Roman Catholic Priests; Ministerial Association Meeting held in House collegium room-impact was use of methods in directing the meeting, and power of the symbolic. PCC clarifies four-year picture with 12 concrete locations for direct action.

Internal: Mildred Moore's death; recruitment intensification of LENS; crab trip; Ecclesiola study and sodality, job promotion, and visits by Centrum colleagues for PCC.

Contradiction: Walking on water while holding on to edge of boat. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Week 11 Metro PSU names committee of 76 to do 100 T/Ms in city of Philadelphia and immediately goes out and gets two strategic 'yesses'; Philadelphia Bicentennial Committee and Regional Planning Commission.

Internal: After Quarter planning of 10 day Regional Trek made up of PCC sojourning and regional T/M celebration, find overwhelming 'yes' response from colleagues.

Contradiction: After being so used to doing everything ourselves, how to put T/M in hands of others.(WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: East Orange T/M demonstrates that construct is viable inspite of reality not meeting our expectations.

Internal: Celebrations following T/M becomes spontaneous Cabaret.

Contradiction: How to sustain story of 'caring for the world' when from all external appearances world does not want to be cared for. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: T/M 76 task force moves on key resource people in Brooklyn and Queens and turns up immediate access to advocacy networks for Committee of 76 in New York City.

Internal: Whole House (adults and Emerging Generation) see 'Alice Doesn't Live Here Any More' and experiences authentic celebration in context of Hope against hope.

Contradiction: Becoming sign and demonstration to whole Bi-Metro of free obedience to radical, total, unconditioned demand placed upon us all by the Summer. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: PLC with participants from many nationalities-Spain, Venezuela, Jamaica, etc. T/M breakloose in Amherst.

Internal: Preparation of facility for LENS. Ecclesiola writing of paragraphs is key and study great. Metro colleagues come to enable PLC.

Contradiction: Making shift to mass awakenment. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: T/M advocacy-Laconia-for the Fall. 87 year old woman stays whole week-end, then went to hospital.

Internal: House impacted by globality of International Food Fair that not obvious else where decision by PCE to House CSIIIA.

Contradiction: Thinking you have to be present at consensus in order to be part of consensus. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Break open in T/M dynamic as Rhode Island sets dates and creates financial backing, committee of 18 does training day in T/M methods and four neighborhood associations in South-end commit themselves to T/M of June 14.

Internal: Passage into adulthood of Jeff Wiltse is celebrated by the House at a 'Christian Bar Mitzuah' which raises for everyone the question of being an adult.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON (cont.)

Contradiction: Creating a battleplan that bridges the hot Summer and catches the local vacation evasion, 'Let's do it in the Fall' into concrete events. (WK.8)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: CFC held in Sackville, Nova Scotia, with over 100 present demonstrates how a community can sponsor and enable such an event completely on their own, with faculty responsible only for teaching.

Internal: Reconstruction of Metro Cadre structures is done due to new demands for mission emerging.

Contradiction: Feeling of being swallowed up reveals new openings and new possibilities and raises question of 'How to strengthen sustaining dynamics and new practical structures. (WK.6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: 50 Stephanie Forum-larges movemental gathering in region with 100 people; turns out 10% of high-rise with indirect tactics.

Internal: Dr. Ted Johnston impacts us with China and points indirectly to need for implementation of citizen participation in Canada.

Contradiction: Unformulated strategy for next six weeks. (WK.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Clergy collegium wrap-up celebration hosted by two PMC grads of a decade ago. Wild LENS course results in demand for French LENS in the Fall. Two grads (Capuccians) turn up to explosive Guild Meeting in preparation for festival as their church assigns all its parishioners to celebrate life at the festival.

Internal: Whole House attends LENS, discovering great spirit sustenance and parish colleague stays after House Church to corporately write new parish song.

Contradiction: How to keep cool in the heat wave of getting what we have prayed for. (WK.8)

CARACAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

External: HRM for LaSantisima, Trinidad congregation produces additional invitation for second HRM and is signal event for regional pedagogues. LENS breakthrough as recent grad arranges for presentation to five Rotary Clubs. ITI Foundation proposals preparation completed.

Internal: Rev. Paul Tidemann, former LCX pastor, now working with theological education in Guyana, visits House and plans for week-long course in Guyana. Vocation's conversations spiritize Week II.

Contradiction: Creating happenings of scheduled events and producing signal CSI course. (Wk.7)

<p>GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM</p>	<p>Chicago closes month at \$100,000 which includes \$30,000 in major funding gifts. Circuits called upon to do increasing amounts of Town Meeting Advocacy, while major funding uncovers several sources of money from Fiscal Year 1975 government budgets which must be disbursed by June 30. Circuits in Laramie, San Jose, Los Vegas, Richmond, Boston, and Newark. Hong Kong raises \$1,000 US, from two sugar companies in the Philippines. Week II task force develops system for contacting and following up Hong Kong Development. ITI funding quota raised to \$100,000US. Collegium on 'packages' that Development has to sell breaks loose images of amazing possibility. Bombay secures in-kind dishes from Ambassador Hotel for the Bombay ITI, with value at Rs. 1,000. The contradiction is that of creating an adequate story to assure reaching the June through September goals.</p>
<p>GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM</p>	<p>Bombay supplies three International Training Institutes and secures meeting place for the Global Priors. Chicago collates and packages all available T/M 76 and CFC materials in print, fully supplying all scheduled through August 10. Practical preparation for the GRA: Chicago begins with full speed as serious collegiums deal with practical care and the spirit life as struggle with what practical arenas Centrum needs to be particularly attentive to, particularly Major Services in the arenas of In-kind and troops; and what the spirit life of the Summer needs to be. Hong Kong uses Guardian presence for marketing LENS, makes follow-up calls in Taiwan, and prioritizes the audiences for LENS courses in the different nations, for Quarter II of 1975-76. Bank letter completed, as continue to struggle with minimizing the NEXUS and maximizing the bands. The contradiction is felt in holding the tension of ongoing and new tasks, practices and program.</p>
<p>GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM</p>	<p>Representation from Bombay and Hyderabad House to Conference on health and poverty in India, sponsored by Gurukul Theological College in Madras, results in invitation to do a course with 400 staff members of the Christian Medical Association in India. Duncan Holmes sent out from Hong Kong to GRA in Manila. In midst of collegium, revolutionary principles in relation to Operations functions; Chicago discovers we have amazingly common image of what it means to be revolutionary. RSIs held in Frankfurt, Jakarta, Kaohsiung, San Francisco, Atlanta, Rochester, and Boston; PLCs in Boston and Hong Kong; CSIIA in Manchester and New York; LENS in Hartford, St. Louis, Dallas and Adelaide. The Contradiction is that of shifting all systems from recruiting, enabling, and sustaining courses to recruiting and enabling a great Summer for everyone.</p>
<p>GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM</p>	<p>The Town Meeting shows itself as increasingly the event of the local community as reports return to Chicago. Largest number held yet--twelve, with over 1,400 participants. More HRM's held: Area Tokyo, Area Hong Kong, Paris, Perth, Adelaide, and Medan. Uptown 'Plant-Up' Day begins creation of 'Magnificent Mile,' catalytically enabling some 5-10 organizations to see this as their event, not an event of the E.I. Hong Kong's Week II task force builds 24 week format to teach English to businessmen. Out of concern for global communication and the exchange of ideas and models with total Research band, list of issues and concerns, and an edge article from N.E.A. sent out to other Nexus for reflection and brooding. PCCs held in Berlin, Seoul, Toronto, Philadelphia, Oklahoma City, Denver, and Salt Lake City. The Contradiction is that of making the shift to Summer preparation when major programs continue through Week 10.</p>
