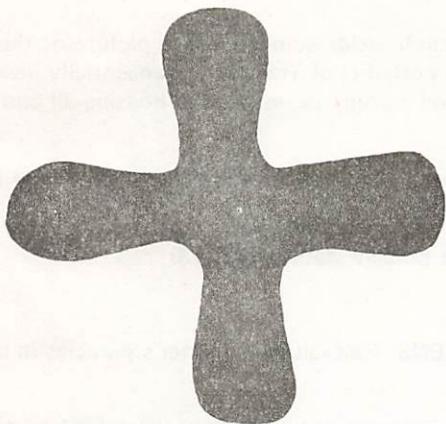


## GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

## LONDON

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Completes first Isle of Dogs story for telling to Those Who Care. Work on development follow-up and next quarter's penetration schedule.

Internal: Week of welcoming and sending out. Extended family members, Mrs. Fisher and Mr. and Mrs. Westblade, visit; receive and send out Kay Hayes and Jim Troxel to Nairobi.

Contradiction: Seeing that Isle of Dogs as well as other thrusts are wedded into one mission - everything is about one task. (Wk. 7)

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Cadres emerge from summer with a deep resolve to intensify their missional activity in local situation. Week 11 battleplanning lays out indicatives for quarter.

Internal: Relocation of collegium and family space gives house new feel for coming year. Celebrates colleague anniversary at House Church - the sixth year of marriage, the year of iron.

Contradiction: Figuring out the long-range while the Cadres are running down the road ahead of us. (Wk. 12)

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: First ITI registration, Con Moore, pays full fee and is sign for others who have said yes and others who are considering. Two regional colleagues say yes to Isle of Dogs Consult in February, 1976. Regional colleagues decide to do regular recruitment.

Internal: House Church of 19 celebrates second anniversary year of Bristol House. Decision of Connie Moore to intern celebrated with 29 present representing three continents.

Contradiction: Looming need for new facility, transportation models as missional task in Region grows. (Wk. 13)

## RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: New Castle ITI blitz gains one definite and six hot prospects. House joins New Castle Cadre for celebration.

Internal: Receives Zenon Janek as intern and sends Ann Conroy from Liverpool as intern to London.

Contradiction: Creating internal story that symbolizes great possibilities the quarter has already birthed. (Wk. 13)

**PARIS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

**External:** Week II RS-I calling blitz in Paris secures three registrations and site, while treks to Marsailles and Lyon set up courses in those cities.

**Internal:** Reflections upon seminary on Rahner and sodality on week's events in ecclesiola, is great spirit exercise in midst of a hard external week.

**Contradiction:** Intensifying, broadening and deepening the thin ice we are on in the Regions. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

**External:** A demonstration visit week of intensive urban research yields comprehensive picture of the living conditions of Rome's 3 million people, underscoring catalytic potential of Trastevere. Tangentially invaluable visits with two cardinals, creation of Phase One battleplan and zeroing in on feasible housing all add up to significant week.

**Internal:** Experience of profound spirit care culminates in christening party of Esther Katharyn and Naomi Elizabeth Lazear.

**Contradiction:** Procuring new facility which meets anticipated miracle status. (Wk. 13)

**LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

**External:** Ibadan Chamber of Commerce agrees to promote LENS. Re-evaluates quarter's miracles in light of Continental Council; builds releasing implementaries.

**Internal:** Attends colleagues' wedding in Nigerian garb and accompanies Bishop Kale to funeral celebration for Chief's mother (102 years). Discover that Agbada, Buba and Lapa are essential to being recognized as fully human in Yorubaland!

**Contradiction:** Discerning pressure points in LENS recruitment and work permit authorization. (Wk. 12)

**BRUSSELS****GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

**External:** Metro Cadre meets and plans mobile schedule of meetings in four Metros of Region. ITI trek to Copenhagen opens doors to 13 appointments in two days, resulting in one coming and four considering.

**Internal:** Marty Lapka arrives Saturday; looks for job Monday; hired same day as legal secretary. The Ian and Brenda Gilmour family announces birth of second daughter, Ramona Evelyn, weighing 3.17 kilos on Thursday, September 18th. All doing well.

**Contradiction:** Updating practical tools needed to back up the vision of Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

**External:** Exciting weeklong trek through southern Belgium for ITI recruitment, ITI mailing, and receipt of three ITI registrations delight us with affirmation that ITI momentum can be built during holiday season.

**Internal:** Welcome Nancy Rowland's brother and friend from San Francisco as we shift to new schedule after Europe '75.

**Contradiction:** Delighting in present excitement without losing long range perspective. (Wk. 5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

**External:** Receive registration, money in hand, for ITI: Amsterdam paid in full.

**Internal:** 'Wij Komen uit een duistere afgrond...' -Kazantzakis study with local people on Tuesday night, in Dutch, addresses House with seriousness of their engagement and opens new perspective on PCE/GCF.

**Contradiction:** Needing to search for the second wave initiation of RS-1/PLC thrust with only three weeks to go. (Wk. 13)

**FRANKFURT RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

**External:** Two from House attend development PSU in Brussels Nexus and return ready to plunge into new model for catalyzing Area program funds.

**Internal:** Leadership PSU for Area colleagues excites us about the possibilities for increased participation and intensified training; visit by Lyn Mathews en route to son Jim's wedding enables House to share in that happy event.

**Contradiction:** Finding the tactics which will get people beyond the blocks to their participation. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

**External:** Receive ten yeses to LENS! ITI trek to Bremen nets set-up of key evening consult with pastor and council members in November.

**Internal:** Eight students join in Pizza Party to lay out plans for Week 8 RS-1. Create kitchen on first floor out of nothing.

**Contradiction:** Designing plan to pull hundreds of missional arenas into one imaginal thrust. (Wk. 13)

**KINSHASA RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

**External:** Angolan ITI grad dines at House, and works on plans to stay at Nairobi Nexus.

**Internal:** New House established. Week of "rigging the ship" for the long voyage ahead. McCabe family arrives; are greeted at airport by superintendent of school where they will teach. House Church banner unfurled.

**Contradiction:** Locating job for additional House person outside of tried and familiar educational structures. (Wk. 13)

**NAIROBI RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

**External:** Secures Nexus facility in the center of Kawangware and makes first ITI follow-up Metro trip.

**Internal:** Jean Miller assigned to Nairobi House arrives; Jon Wenge assigned to Lusaka house arrives. Task forces build continental finance model, development battleplan revised, and area planning started.

**Contradiction:** Needing immediate funds and long-range development nurture. (Wk. 12)

**BOMBAY GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY**

**External:** Continental Council and faculty meeting gathers in Hyderabad where 47 order and movement colleagues engage in four days of intensive pedagogy and movement planning for year and coming quarter.

**Internal:** Send personnel at Centrum to Continental Council in Hyderabad save two who meet with JWM for Taj Gunj authorization visits.

**Contradiction:** Dealing with State of Emergency which prohibits public meetings just when we're ready to prepare for Consults and experimental LCC's. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**

**External:** Holds Clergy Collegium with eleven present including Bishop Joshi. Bombay area sends eight to Continental Council where all are impacted with new rationale: RS-1 every week across the sub-continent.

**Internal:** Ecclesiola journey into Muslim culture at Byculla 5 Crossroads at open feast of fastings followed by visual feast at "Lawrence of Arabia".

**Contradiction:** Appropriating the decisions made by Continental Council into this House's timeline and attention this week. (Wk. 12)

**DELHI RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

**External:** Forty-one at Continental Council in Hyderabad (first continental movement meeting outside ITI and GRA structures) provides backdrop for pedagogy, PCE miracle Council as responsibility for the movement is grounded continentally.

**( RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI)**

**Internal:** Rajan George begins intern year . With House at Continental Council all week, Emerging Generation and Youth carry symbolic structures of Daily Office and prayers and engage in intensive House Cleaning and yard recreation.

**Contradiction:** Having the recruitment base and self-story to guarantee seven courses in Quarter II. (Wk. 13)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

**External:** Area Madras hosts 50 movement and Order colleagues at Continental Council of advanced RS-1 pedagogy, council planning and Parish engagement; 11 delegates from Area Madras attend.

**Internal:** House completely transformed with new decor and space shifting to accommodate Continental Council.

**Contradiction:** Planning formulation thrust in Hyderabad with renewed vigor, at Regional and Metro levels by creating new care structures for all movement colleagues. (Wk. 13)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

**External:** Receive four requests from three different regions asking for consults of various kinds. First Cadre gathering takes place in Durgapur Region.

**Internal:** Finish design and decor begun in new facility. Complete Global Social Demonstration wall in collegium room. Local Muslim furniture dealers have donated tables, chairs, and a sofa set as gifts or indefinite loans. Enrolls Gwen Rowe in Catholic school in Circus 5.

**Contradiction:** Building a comprehensive picture of area development which embraces all of the many diverse facets of the mission in midst of chaos of moving. (Wk. 12)

**SINGAPORE****GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE**

**External:** First tri-nation movement Area Council in Singapore begins. Area Sydney Council concludes.

**Internal:** Breakthrough occurs in corporate planning as entire Nexus works on each Centrum's battleplan. Spirit addresses from GRA: Chicago serve as vehicle for pushing further into theological issues for the next 100 years.

**Contradiction:** Making far-reaching decisions before battleplan completed. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE**

**External:** Metro treks continue in Singapore Region with ecclesiolas in Kalang and Queenstown Metros this week.

**Internal:** Six ITI participants from Manado and Kota Kinabalu Regions stop over at Singapore House as travel back to their homes. Sev Olson from Galaxy Church in Sydney spends week with House enroute from GRA: Manila and ITI: Hong Kong.

**Contradiction:** Getting a hold of arena of celebration within Singapore movement. (Wk. 6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

**External:** Entire House travels with regional colleagues to Singapore Area Meeting first time ever gathering of 40 from five of six Regions. Special courses requests come from Ministry of Education and Women's Leadership Committee of Consumer Cooperatives.

**Internal:** Plunge into concrete tactical planning for launching of PCE in Sentul and Klang and for Metro treks to K'L. and Medan. Area Prior drops in for visit. Celebrate Wests securing of one year multiple-entry visa.

**Contradiction:** Maintaining momentum between planning and actualization by hitting the road. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

**External:** Visits with hierarchy of the National Council of Churches and Rev. Eka Darmaputra reveals breakthrough in church authorization and promise of accelerated momentum.

**Internal:** Entire House focuses on symbolic. Rebecca Morris (13 months) learns first line of Holy Holy Holy. House completes preplanning for Week II Area Council.

**Contradiction:** Clarifying images of future while creating decor and space utilization. (Wk. 12)

**HONG KONG****GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG**

**External:** Bengels report on Scotland and Europe. Consults and Development treks take place composed of R. Rafos, J. Jenkins, and Charles Morrissey. Finalize circuit materials for quarter.

**Internal:** Sends out guests Bengels and R. Philbrooks. Holds ecclesiola study on Oombulgurri report. Discovers indicative battleplanning insights in relationship to funding. Jean Paul goes to Angels Catholic Kindergarten.

**Contradiction:** Symbolizing radical shift that is beginning of Quarter II in midst of experiencing oozing into new quarter. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

**External:** Begin pedagogy training for colleagues teaching HRM. Metro circuit trip in Macao reveals RS-I recruitment underway.

**Internal:** Striking Area Council Calendar sparks brooding on formulation tactics. House celebrates Chinese Mid-Autumn Festival (Moon Festival) by sending out intern to family celebration, hanging lanterns and observing festivities on Chinese T.V.

**Contradiction:** Radicalizing colleagues' passion for community renewal. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

**External:** Pat Despain represents House at Area Council meeting in Manila. Tom and Candy Wilson arrive in Kaoshiung for sojournship on their global tour and are immediately assigned to pick up new arriving Prior family and to cook the evening meal.

**Internal:** Ecclesiola bubbles with many guests. House participates in Chinese Moon Festival by celebrating arrival of all newly assigned people, making us whole and perfect (Moon) community. Typhoon comes following day.

**Contradiction:** Creating effective cohesive story of who we are and what we are about in midst of widely diverse group of colleagues who know us by several names. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

**External:** Launches development of Metro Cadre network in circuit ride to Baguio and Tarloe Metros to set up meetings. Manila Metro Cadre meets to bring into being task force design and project objectives for year and quarter.

**Internal:** Celebrates New Society Holiday with collegium study on Philippine history and pressure point analysis.

**Contradiction:** Seeing the value of the corporate celebrative process in midst of urgency of doing. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

**External:** With the word that it is possible to send colleagues to Jeju Consult, we quickly move to send key LENS grads. Receive ITP invitation for Norman Kao to begin Academy in October.

**Internal:** Battleplanning session turns into deep spin relative to mission here. House celebrates Mid Autumn Festival with many guests and gifts of moon cakes and fruit.

**Contradiction:** Sensing the year requires a new shift yet unclear on how to practically proceed. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

**External:** Mactan 5 Guild miracle work day to build and plant bread fruit tree nursery actualizes a 15-year-old great idea. It will provide five shoots for each family in the Parish in less than two years; 45 involved in responsibilities.

**Internal:** New decor transforms collegium room; long-awaited aquarium hypnotizes all with display of fine tropical fish. House receives Youth Asel Rabor.

**Contradiction:** Keeping focus on external while enabling LEDI (Lapu-Lapu Export Development Industries) to produce financially. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

**External:** Missional pulse quickens to vertigo proportions as hear reports from ITI and GRA '75 grads. Colleagues outnumber House two to one at House Church and experience depth globality and collegiality.

**Internal:** Experience releasing power of Boulding's "Image" at ecclesiola with grad and non-grad guests.

**Contradiction:** Taking counsel of fears, paralysis, vertigo. (Wk. 6)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

**External:** Send out two to Jeju Consult: one prior and one Japanese Regional colleague.

**Internal:** Creates new two-quarter warboard; adds prayer wheel to Prayer Room decor; studies "Chrysanthemum and the Sword" by Ruth Benedict, a study of Japanese history and culture.

**Contradiction:** Discerning structural corporate understanding of mission. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU**

**External:** Rev. Kang Byoung Hoon and Rev. Kim Chong Man prepare for Jeju Human Development Project Consultation by meeting with the provincial governor and ten ITI grads. Welcome consult team of Crockers and Wiegels.

**Internal:** Rev. and Mrs. Kim Chong Man attend Area House Priors' Council held in Seoul. Whole Jeju House attends Regional Council where colleagues consent to do Global Social Demonstration in Jeju.

**Contradiction:** Moving quickly to island-wide grassroots leadership with authorization in excellent shape. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

**External:** Commission Jeju House; 65 hear reports at Regional Council on Global Social Demonstration Area Priors' Council. Presence of Jeju consult team focuses new collegiality. Printing of first Jeju consult brochure complete.

**Internal:** Chusok celebration, the lunar calendar Thanksgiving, is highlighted by dinner and evening at home of mother of Kil Jeong Sook. Send out Eunice Miclat to Hong Kong; hosts Griffins. Send out Rev. Park Shi Won and Rev. Min Byung Ryul to ITP.

**Contradiction:** Getting tactical clarity on future sociological vision that enables corporate and solitary spirit life. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

**External:** Metro circuits begin to light up again with preparation for trip to Nagasaki. Area Tokyo Priors' Council in Seoul on Area commonness.

**Internal:** Celebrates Jeju Human Development Project with a feast topped with Jeju mushrooms.

**Contradiction:** Tying down the particulars of weekly scheduling. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

**External:** Mr. Kiyo Fukata leads Lens Club in work to translate GCF with help from Mark Reames and House. Minoru Horiguchi translates Jeju development program proposal for Japanese companies. Rev. Oki, professor of Ethics, Tokyo Union Seminary, meets for lunch and agrees to urge company to provide low-cost housing facility for House.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA)**

**Internal:** Rev. Nishihara's witness at ecclesiola in reporting Jeju visit: "I must train myself for global leadership" addresses all. Send out Kitty Cole to Jeju Consult. Uses holiday to re-design interior space.

**Contradiction:** Deciding to trust timeline vs. "do all the mission now" propensities. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI**

**External:** Participates in ending of first semester at three permeation sites.

**Internal:** House decors for new space and prepares newsletter for beginning of quarter.

**Contradiction:** Creating methods for making the quantum leap from 300 course grads to a Metro circuit. (Wk. 13)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

**External:** Launching of Sydney Metro Cadre promises to coordinate work of three campaigns throughout coming quarter.

**Internal:** Celebrates at top of the Cross and finds us remembered by the orchestra as the people who sing. Marks rite of passage for Jane Miller who is sent to ITP and Claire Chapman sent to nurses' training.

**Contradiction:** Handling the area backup systems on the side to insure that momentum be maintained in every Region on all missional fronts. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

**External:** Highlight of Regional Council is report on Chicago G.R.A. by Alison Harris. Decides on three treks, each of six towns, for Quarter II.

**Internal:** Secures first job and Gwenda Rees starts with national concrete company. House inundated with gift of cream buns. Students plant vegetable garden, visit Royal Show and tell bedtime stories about Oombulgurri snakes.

**Contradiction:** Moving colleagues from having to be asked, to being those who take the initiative. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN**

**External:** Planning 26 week timeline includes five treks totaling 35,000 miles for development of Community Meeting Australia and Metro Cadre circuits.

**Internal:** Full House plans; hosts Phil Mathews of Department of Aboriginal Affairs, colleague from Canberra.

**Contradiction:** Hanging loose to accommodation and job uncertainty in order to launch powerful trust across Region with 26-week timeline. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI**

**External:** Community's preparation for Minister's visit impact him with transformed space, new guild uniforms, cattle in paddocks and fantastic school assembly. Council moves with power on three key issues: development, new boat, Guardians' meeting.

**Internal:** Finance workshop enables objectivity relative to financial data and to discern great new possibilities. Assigns Laurie Rhodes to Melbourne.

**Contradiction:** Building steps to do multiplication of impact without additional troops. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

**External:** Ecumenical Institute presentation at ministers' gathering turns hostile Methodists friendly and results in new parish Anglican priest expressing great interest (he's three-fourths of the way through Rahner).

**Internal:** Robert Yallop arrives in midst of House reconstruction involving redecoring of House to meet world and Youth's continued planning of Global Social Demonstration summer trip.

**Contradiction:** Allowing demonstration to recontext old grads and to build new images of revolutionary engagement. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

**External:** New six week training session with Galaxy is highlighted by presence of Daniel Kwok with stories of Shum Oi Church and its care for Shek Kip Mei Parish.

**Internal:** Send out Rees family to Perth and Wegner family to Adelaide and welcome Norton family from Canberra who immediately secure job possibilities.

**Contradiction:** Enabling the Region to make the quantum leap and embrace the three campaigns as their own. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

**External:** Head of Department of Aboriginal Affairs Policy Board George Stern, requests interview and raises possibility of much closer cooperation with ICA.

**Internal:** Charting each of the 18 Oombulgurri programs begins to clarify funding avenues not directly available from Department of Aboriginal Affairs.

**Contradiction:** Channeling enthusiasm of guardians for support of Oombulgurri into strategic implementation of the project. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

**External:** Kurilpa clergymen discover difference between men-of-goodwill and those with divine vocation via Segundo study; deep affirmation by Roman Catholic bishop (grad) of three campaign focus.

**Internal:** Discovers again that on-going structures and exercises hold life in being as the very few confront the awesome task.

**Contradiction:** Revamping the Regional structures that hold missional decisions. (Wk. 13)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO**

**External:** Workday centers in on sodding and tree planting in the courtyard of the newly opened Hotel Ajidrik; sanitation conference members living in the hotel for a week ask if they are in Honolulu by mistake.

**Internal:** Hosts Irioj and family from Mili for dinner and conversation about the Marshall Human Development Project.

**Contradiction:** Calling forth depth grounding in the vision of the project for the practical implementation of programs by many and not a few. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA**

**External:** Barbeque celebration over finished painting of school is a great happening. Large school sign put up on bus shelter.

**Internal:** Evaluation of past year reveals great journey as turn to planning for Quarter II.

**Contradiction:** Breaking people loose to new images when all outsiders are immediately pigeon-holed. (Wk. 13)

**SAN****FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

**External:** Holds Bi-Metro Celebration with 65 galaxy forces complete with hilarious one-act play. Regional Primal Community Experiment PSU provides a time of sharing and planning for the year.

**Internal:** The Area House welcomes colleagues from all four Centurms of Chicago Nexus: Management, Operations, Development, and Research, all doing development and all here at same time!

**Contradiction:** Using effectively the power of the troops we have. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE**

**External:** House hosts meeting of PCE participants from the Region; broods over future of PCE; creates 21-Point Plan.

**Internal:** Secures another new job. On-going House decor renovation dynamic turns front door red.

**Contradiction:** Expanding involvement in the circuits. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO**

External: New face of Primal Community appears as development task force, Town Meeting, collegium, and Metro Cadre meet to resolve to build new patterns.

Internal: House Council demonstrates effectiveness of corporate methods as all members participate.

Contradiction: Structuring movemental troops so that everyone sees themselves as responsible for everything. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

External: In Steilacoom, Washington, TM'76 coordinator calls to report full funding secured as well as commitment of 54-piece Air Force Band for interlude. The menu will be in-kind franks and saurkraut. The Seattle PCE sees "Nashville". Development team with Karen Reese strikes gold in Seattle.

Internal: Retreat at the Hideaway House in the Cascade Mountains gives permission to operate transrationally as we create a new experimental time design.

Contradiction: Integrating our missional stations with the missional demand. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: All Metros now covered in Foray 21-6 with calls in widely diverse communities raising possibility of some unique Town Meetings.

Internal: Futuric possibilities break through in midst of Week II. In-kind success helps pull off miracle of Ken Gilbert getting to Jeju. End week with great celebration at Polynesian restaurant.

Contradiction: Creating the new models in midst of demand facing us. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

Management Centrum exchanges wisdom as Chicago Nexus financial wizard, Lyn Mathews, visits Brussels and leads Mobile Global Finance PSU. International Training Center kitchen begins to take shape with the look of stainless steel (in-kind equipment of 175,000 USD value obtained from a closing Montgomery Ward's store.) Establishment of systems and procedures to carry us through the year is our common thrust with Hong Kong establishing common procedures in all accounts in 5 nations and 6 currencies. The contradiction lies in the arena of thinking ahead as we anticipate future miracles to plan to the implementary level.

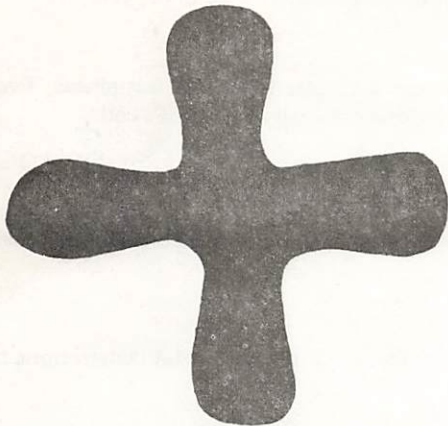

**External:** TM '76 calls continue to plow circuits while three Metro cadres are commissioned. Send out two from House to Academy; five commit themselves to Chicago Guardians' meeting.

**Internal:** Quarter planning, House repairing, cleaning, and room building go on in midst of arrival of colleagues from Singapore, and troika member, Ronnie Seagren.

**Contradiction:** Standing poised at end of diving board ready to jump while viewing detailed quarter plan now in front of us. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

External: South Phoenix clergy group decides to attend Scottsdale TM '76 as group. Invitations sent around Region with indications of strong response.

Internal: Experiences lively House Church with several guests including Loudermilk and Nixon from Centrum. House celebrates end of quarter at top of South Mountain overlooking lighted city in quiet reflection on how we care for it all.

Contradiction: Establishing economic base to sustain mission for year. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

External: Visits with district Bicentennial Commission illicit call for countywide TM'76.

Internal: Writes lease proposal which raises issue of local church engagement.

Contradiction: Discovering the interrelatedness of all movemental activities raises issue of coordinating all of our tasks. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

External: Firms up Kiwanas TM '76 dates.

Internal: House and Guild receives drum at House Church made by Cheyenne Indian elder with Southside symbol on top.

Contradiction: Following through on details and picking up all of the loose ends. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

External: Metro Cadre puts dynamic form together for quarter, and reveals new cadre has come into being in the Colorado Springs Metro.

Internal: Amazed by amount of work that can be done in a short time as various PSUs nail down House manual, Imaginal Education, printing, and quarter designs.

Contradiction: Breaking out of image that some, not every one of our practical tasks are done on behalf of the one missional thrust. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY**

External: Creates warboard of miracles that will catalyze Quarter II.

Internal: Secures another full time job. Metro colleague, Ken Fieber visits.

Contradiction: Remembering every action is catalytic thus never getting bogged down in any one thing. (Wk. 1)

**EDMONTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: Learns ways to catalyze CFC in follow-up treks to Grand Prairie, and Drumheller, and in mini-consult with the Redemptorists Parish Mission team. Internal: House face lift continues, with new floor laid and basement clean-up blitz. P.T. James and Ken Fisher expand context of House and colleagues with Global Social Demonstration ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Seeing that the mundane is utterly significant in midst of growing consciousness. (Wk. 13)

External: Texas Community Housing agrees to fund and completely staff three Town Meetings in Beaumont, Port Arthur, and Orange. Last week's House Church guest shows up this week at Metro celebration with Mexican guitarist and in-kind barbeque dinners.

Internal: Receives Margaret Oakley from Chicago following hospitalization. Sends Clark family on global visit to Area Houston; welcomes St. Clair senior for visit. Mary Warren Moffett stays over after Womens' Consult and captures imagination of House with Monday morning collegium on Women.

Contradiction: Applying transrational models to complexity of mundane or profound. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Barrio planning session on Sunday morning is impacted with presence of ten Chicano college students, who prepare Mexican breakfast and lead workshops.

Internal: Seven unexpected guests at House Church create marked contrast in uniforms of pure-white representing fundamentalist stance of "we have the only word of life," which occasions opportunity to rehearse again for ourselves and colleagues what we are about. Fantastic ecclesiola celebrating end of quarter by song and dance reflection of past five decades.

Contradiction: Embracing all guests. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Brownsville circuit schedules two meetings for sponsors, signaling possibility and need for securing key sponsors. New Metro Cadre format makes outstanding maiden voyage, emphasizing doing pole.

Internal: Receives John Rader as intern. Internal House manual receives final form and excellent execution.

Contradiction: Moving through mere doing. (Wk. 1)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Two TM '76 signals: The city of Guthrie has 25 present for sponsorship meeting, sets TM '76 date; the guild of Central City 5 holds TM '76 sponsorship dinner with 45 present, interested in meeting back next month.

Internal: House sees "Give 'em Hell, Harry", is refreshed by Truman's decisive character; adds a new historic-futuric addition to our meditative councils.

Contradiction: Wanting to hold the wisdom of past structures while knowing that the task requires new and futuric strategies for maximum effectivity. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

**External:** PSU on TM '76 circuits and fund raising leads to Guardian take-over of fund raising task. Two from Metro attend Houston's New Woman's Forum construct.

**Internal:** Neighborhood Guardian pops in during Wednesday evening dinner to offer new House (in-kind) to replace facility just sold out from under us. Two from Metro leave for Academy; one from House leaves to augment Chicago Student House.

**Contradiction:** Struggling to figure out what we did right that allows Metro Cadre's picking up responsibility in fine way that it has. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA**

**External:** City Council approves Hugo TM '76. Tremendous responses for TM '76 in three sizable towns.

**Internal:** Achieves full employment with new job in advertising agency. Complete indicative battleplanning and decor.

**Contradiction:** Cutting over against image of futurity with only one car for transportation. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

**External:** Roman Catholic church sponsors TM '76, scheduled in Arnaudville, (Louisiana) a community of 3000. TM '76 is in set-up stage in Mobile and Chickasaw (Alabama), Jackson (Mississippi), New Orleans and Baton Rouge (Louisiana).

**Internal:** Sends three women in House to "Women and Culture" workshop in Houston. First floor House renovation nears completion as lounge is established and office space ordered.

**Contradiction:** Beginning to see implications of TM '76: what if all five "in process" want someone to speak to steering committee on same day. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

**External:** Forays in four different states. Gary Gibson and Frank Powell meet in Jackson, Mississippi to discuss endorsement with the Mississippi Bicentennial Commission. TM '76 endorsement received from Greenville, Green County Tennessee Bicentennial Committee. Metro Cadre battleplans PCE Quarter II strategy.

**Internal:** Ecclesiola study of "The Purpose of the Church" impacts House and four Metro colleagues. House internal planning session results in tribal resettlement.

**Contradiction:** Creating the particular symbol which will allow the corporate body to move into future as one thrust. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

**External:** Now have two full time on circuits. Kiwanis invite us to set up booth at District Convention on two days notice.

**Internal:** Jay and Ann Antenen bring Majuro to East Lake 5, as guild comes over for evening of slide viewing and story telling of Majuro Consult. In-kind fish heads go into stew as House struggles with being global.

**Contradiction:** Letting chaos nourish our caring rather than deciding not to care in midst of chaos in intense mission. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE**

**External:** Meeting with Eastern Airlines Management Association nets possible sponsorship for TM '76. Week 12 Planning Council is a happening, with Metro colleagues leading workshop; non-movement colleague shows up, stays overnight, and asks, "What can I do next?" Sends two to Academy.

**Internal:** Colleague brings stranger to ecclesiola, who decides to sojourn, participates in structures, builds wall charts, decides to attend Academy. Collegiums on methods study, regrounds in knowing, doing, and being.

**Contradiction:** Shifting image of "there ain't no snowball" to "we are it!" (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Area Prior's visit impacts both House and Metro Cadre when an interested citizen of parish sits in. Don Clark visits Jacksonville, holds House Church with Metro Cadre. Caracas Metro Cadre member, Bede Hornung, does hour recruitment of parish person for ITI:Caracas. Eastern Management accepts model proposed by Clark to catalyze 20-30 TM '76 in greater Miami.

Internal: Ecclesiola study of Rahner shows possibility for church as aggressive force.

Contradiction: Needing a center shot pistol approach and having a scatter gun. (Wk. 1)

**CHICAGO****GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO**

External: Ninth Global Guardian Consult focuses three teams on Intra-global Movement, three teams on Global Social Demonstration and twelve teams on Global Community Forum. Global Social Demonstration consult reports by Rodney Wilson on Oombulgurri and Ken Gilbert on Jeju fascinate all. Bishop Samuel, Bishop of Public Ecumenical and Social Service of the Coptic Orthodox Church: Egypt, visits on Sunday to share his work in villages and slums of Egypt with us and to hear of the progress of our work around the world.

Internal: Visit by Father Bede Hornung of Caracas and going to movie "Give 'Em Hell Harry" address House with ways in which you take care of yourself.

Contradiction: "Hanging 10" (toes) on TM'76 surfboard. (Wk. 13)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

External: Academy recruitment gains momentum. Taped report of Global Priors Council impacts Metro Cadre.

Internal: All House attends Area Council, highlighted by Saturday night celebration. Receive 11 gallons of in-kind paint.

Contradiction: Getting the story of year's priorities grounded in Metro colleagues' consciousness. (Wk. 12)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

**External:** Receive news that Readers Digest plans to reprint article on TM '76 and The Whittier Community that first appeared in "League of Minnesota Municipalities" magazine. Excitement is in community as Sunday in Whittier approaches. Residents of retarded homes and drug dependency houses have first meeting. Receive \$3,200 from General Mills for Sunday in Whittier.

**Internal:** Welcome Heaths, Ecclesiola continues with No. 6 in Global Social Demonstration series - Trastavere.

**Contradiction:** Discerning logistics of community celebration where half of people are chemically dependent. (Wk. 10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST .LOUIS**

**External:** Two new pre-sponsors meetings set up in southern Illinois for TM '76. Creates tracking model phasing of sponsorship consultations. Finalizes and prints quarter PCE rubrics.

**Internal:** Creates and prints House structures. Commonizes Daily Office for four liturgists through new customary. Help arrives from Chicago for Metro circuits.

**Contradiction:** Devising the "primal spin" that will serve as a popular preaching device in every TM '76 call. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA**

**External:** Two circuit teams on the road all week for six days each make breakthroughs in TM '76 visitation in Micro city visits. Initiates groundwork research for PCE in South Side Parish.

**External:** Two proposals submitted to Indiana ARBA to fund 25 TM '76 and expenses of initiating program. Kentucky trek nets pre-sponsorship meeting, good visit with Kentucky ARBA headquarters. New ICA office set-up.

**Internal:** Dramatic shift of personnel just after internal assignments finished. Presence of Sue Laxdal sparks House and Metro mood through enabling TM '76 effort.

**Contradiction:** Getting a grasp on secular passion that allows one to keep going in research and break open while not knowing what the follow-up model is. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON**

Internal: Great week with Sr. Rosemary, Sister of Mercy, sojourning with us as part of religious development program. Send out Sr. Rosemary and receive Sr. Elizabeth at House Church.

Contradiction: Maintaining steady beat in midst of multiple demands of TM '76 and 20 programs while launching new quarter. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER**

External: Proposal to general membership of Manchester Jaycees on TM '76. Metro Cadre meets for Week 11

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE MANCHESTER)**

on TM '76 training and new directions breakloose in circuit planning workshop.

Internal: Reflections on Customary highlight House symbolic life. Drop-in visiter returns with fiancee to be House Church guests.

Contradiction: Seeing it's time to "move Patton and 3rd Army into France" in midst of faltering movement structures. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

External: Experience Battleplanning as really working; gives us four sharp tactical thrusts and ten miracles to go into the future.

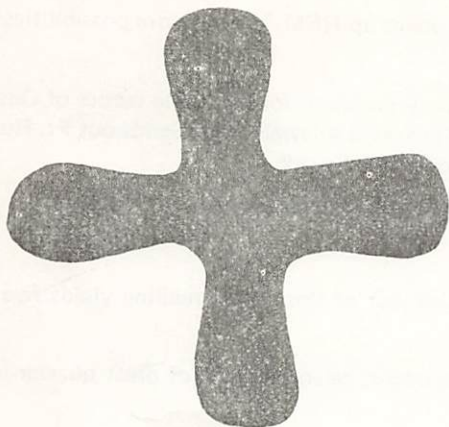

Contradiction: Potential sponsors saying "Putting a bell on cat is great idea, why not have other mice do job?(wk. 2)

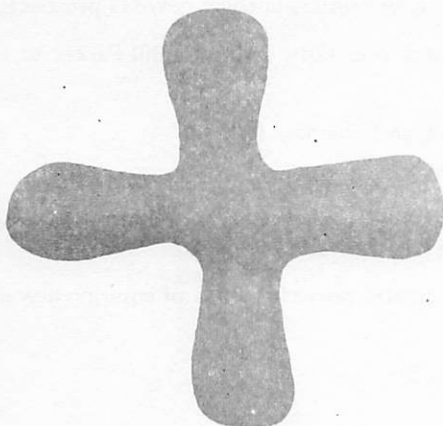

**LAGOS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

Internal: Establishes long-needed filing system, completes House decor, celebrates end of great quarter all in one day.

Contradiction: Orchestrating two weeks remaining before the LENS course. (Wk. 2)

**BRUSSELS****GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Two development teams are on road; three programme events are planned.

Internal: Bookcase library and other decor items arrive.

Contradiction: Inventing quickly the adequate responses to the intricacies of new quarter. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

External: Metro Cadre begins translation of Global Community Forum (GCF) workbook into French and Flemish. House begins leading study at American Protestant Church.

Internal: Welcomes Frank Little on way to ITI recruitment trek in Area London.

Contradiction: Restructuring missional life to be able to do everything at once in midst of increasing complexity of our external mission. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

External: Plans circuit treks, visits and development.

Contradiction: Seeing training is key, actualizing structures to do it. (Wk. 3)

**NAIROBI****GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI**

External: Nexus moves to Kawangware, as in-kind provides linens, dishes and other necessary items.

Internal: Two guests at ecclesiola and Kawangware residents. ITI grads help Nexus move.

Contradiction: Getting House ready with all speed so can really settle in. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**

External: Participates in organization and leadership of an Ecumenical Seminar with 150 people present. Secures rent free sites for Bombay and Pune RS-Is. Send out Caswells on circuit ride, concerts in Nagpur and Jabuipur.

Internal: Second Quarter off to fresh start with great Emerging Generation happening. Rahner study - his outline of the reality we experience in House community, Order, Church and world impacts us.

Contradiction: Transforming interior life struggle to be or not to be (being the corporate body equals guarding the symbolic) into the missional activity of caring for the world. (Wk. 3)

**DE LHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

External: Secular authorization is hallmarked by visits to USIS (United States Information Service) on TM '76, a meeting in the mayor's conference room with his foreign secretary relative to government registration, attendance at bus company's production of Chinese Opera escorted by female colleague radio newsbroadcaster who introduces us to city councilwoman, and finally attendance at Sunday morning cocktail reception party honoring opening of the President's Department Store, the largest in the East.

Internal: Indicative battleplanning day is happening.

Contradiction: Clarifying the year's focusing of the three campaigns into an integrated tactical system. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Simultaneous circuit ride into Tarlac Metro for Metro Council Meeting; Quezon City Polis Cadre meets to plan work in Polis; gets another authorization visit with Msgr. Ortiz. OLF (Our Lady of Fatima) Parish celebrates fiesta (2nd) with Archbishop. Tom Aquino reports on Jeju Consult. Development calls renew corporations support.

Internal: Don Quimby family holds open house for order colleagues who live above them. All celebrate move to new location with feast. Despedida for Jose/Narcisa/Sandee Armas leaving for Hong Kong. Receive Allens, Jeff Coolidge for Cebu LENS.

Contradiction: Keeping necessary horse before the strategic cart as we forge ahead with plans for development, primal community and metro cadre tasks. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: First Metro Cadre meeting of quarter begins to use indicative battleplanning method to train and build plans for future. Father Garcia returns from Jeju Consult expressing very positive comments.

Internal: First ecclesiola of Quarter II is happening with 16. Bi-regional meeting at Chang Hwa results in common operating principles and quarter course calendar.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on cooperative spirit generated by Billy Graham crusade to release new images of church. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Metro cadre, including two Roman Catholic priests, uses holiday to do indicative battleplanning. Ends week of PLC calling that keeps appointment book full.

Internal: Kick off common memory study with God lecture and Sartre's philosophy of revolution. First ecclesiola is greeted with excitement over all three dynamics. Welcome Mike and Joyce Bonafield on their way to Taiwan.

Contradiction: Calling on RS-I, PLC prospects without benefit of speaking same language. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU**

External: Jeju Human Development Consult is followed by thank you visits to Vice-Governor, Chief of Planning and Chief Prosecutor; medical research trip and report by Dr. Gilbert; two preaching engagements and beginning a four-day local church youth program.

Internal: Move into new temporary House; host colleagues from Chicago, Seoul and Thomas Aquino from Manila; send out consult team, Kims and Dexters to Seoul to write the Consult report. Celebrate Hangul Day with picnic on Mt. Halla with colleague family.

Contradiction: Waiting while working. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Jeju Human Development Consult begins following week of hosting and preparation, including reception for staff at home of Mr. T. Jefferson Coolidge

Internal: As Jeju House members as well as Consult staff and participants depart for Jeju, House welcomes Lee Jae Joon family as interns.

Contradiction: Holding tension between Global Social Demonstration intensification and missional demands so there is still only one thrust. (Wk. 1)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Visit of regional coordinator to House schedules first joint foray with new House prior to Okinawa Island (28 hours travel); Catholic Bishop provides full visa sponsorship for prior.

Internal: Quarter's planning loses corporate vision of metro cadres and spins wheels in readiness for long-range development delivery model. New decor gives radical image alteration and creates attractive and more functional office.

Contradiction: Getting feet to catch up to the beat with hearts and voices having enthusiastically begun the March. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI**

External: Trip to Sapporo takes care of clergy collegium and secular colleague. Prepares for Quarter II Metro circuits.

**Internal:** Signal emergence of catalytic care with division of trek team to be that team and participation of 17 community people in Guild night.

**Contradiction:** Enabling community to deal structurally with issues in midst of practics. (Wk. 2)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE)**

**Contradiction:** Facilitating movement by creating back-up systems and troop assignments across the three campaigns all at once. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

**External:** Department of Immigration approves policy document to include ICA and EI.

**Internal:** Donnelly and Duffy visit to work on government liason.

**Contradiction:** Forging flexible teamwork to face constantly changing winds of challenge - such as Oombulgurri public sector funding crisis. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

**External:** Hosts six colleagues from Oombulgurri on way to Guardians Meeting; Northern trek continues through Gympie, Bundaberg, and Mackay.

**Internal:** Struggle with corporateness in dispersion continues and regional colleagues decide to care for House.

Internal: Emerging Generation and metro couple respond to invitation of Reverend Don Larson of Othello and reap 600 lbs. potatoes and 200 lbs. apples.

Contradiction: Turning urban interest into sponsorship decisions for Town Meeting '76. (Wk. 3)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

External: TM '76 paves way for building earth: all present at Ridgecrest sponsors meeting volunteer time and donations to bring off event: five attend Chicago Guardians' Council; Chamber of Commerce secretary volunteers to work with ICA. Watch Out, Local Community, Here We Come!
