RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Experiences a time of planning and initiation: key clergy couple phone in their PLC registration; Bishopton Cadre holds planning retreat with focus on imminent expansion and Edinburgh Cadre leads and enables curriculum consult for science dept. of largest city secondary school.

Internal: House and Regional colleagues join in send out celebration for Hockleys and together host Wright family (R.H.: Paris) and Colvin family (R.H.: Amsterdam) delighting in Continental network.

Contradiction: Releasing passion of 10 local and Metro Cadres toward autumn courses: ITI, PCE, GCF, and continental faculty in way that makes sense for Scotland and for world. (Wk. 9)

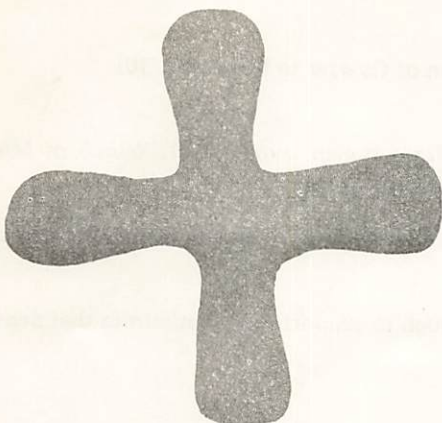

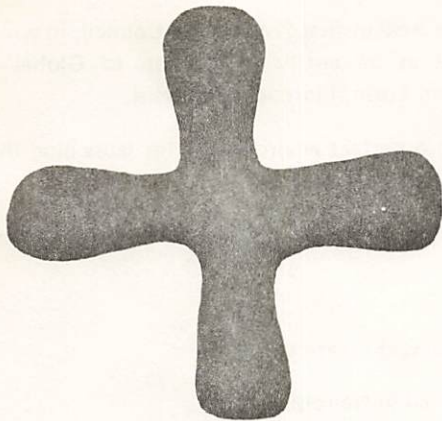

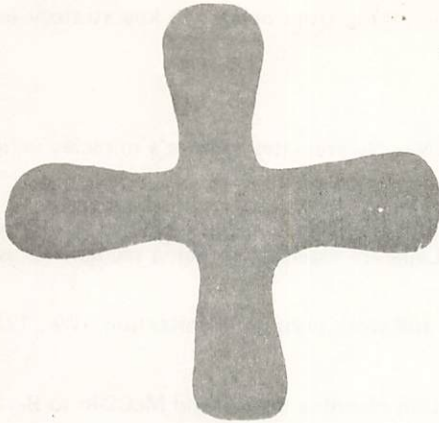

Contradiction: Finding the category that permits the world to acknowledge and participate in demonstration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Grounds Area proposals in own Bi-Region battleplan. Owen Sound speaking engagement elicits response of "It is a great idea, we would love to help."

Internal: Spencer's paper on the Metro Cadre dynamic gives new images of what our circuits are out to do.

Contradiction: Breathing life into a gem of a battleplan. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Experience breakthrough in our understanding of the relationship of LENS to the total PCE in terms of it being a lead into groups whose concern is community development on a human scale.

Contradiction: Turning contacts into commitments - friends into registrations. (Wk. 12)
