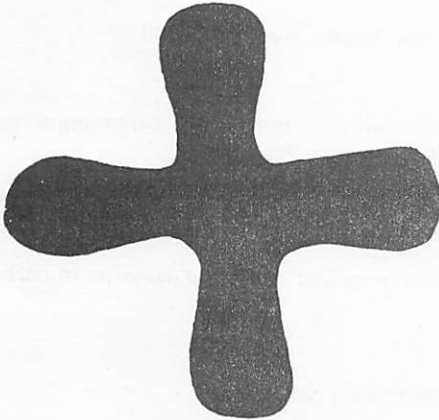


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

LONDON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Representatives of four cultures participate in ploughing urban farm's first field on London's hottest day. Senior citizens work with guild to tell Isle of Dogs history. Guild transforms school facility, joins teaching staff. Home industry for manufacturing pug shoes acquires markets, funds, facility; recruits local staff. Mayor of Tower Hamlets visits Bridge House. Canterbury Cadre impacts city with massive work day project on large central area. Receives powerful authorization from visit of Director of London Council of Historic Buildings, London Authority Estates Manager.

Internal: Sends Mary Bengel to teach Lusaka LENS, John and Rose Brown to enable Kreuzberg pre-consult set-up, House personnel and Canterbury Cadre as orchestration team for Bristol Community Day. Receives European priors for week of prep for GRA:London. Open-air end of Quarter celebration with guild sends out Mark Jewell to Chicago for summer.

Contradiction: Creating structures, stories, that effectively engage available troops. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Twenty-one show up for first Community Forum steering committee and create six-week timeline for four committees.

Internal: Sue Chapman from Australia visits Glasgow as part of ITP journey.

Contradiction: Creating a new story of possibility for key municipal structures desperately engaged in immediacies with a no win stance. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Attends wedding of Order member's sister; Youth sojourners sent out to Paris, Frankfurt, Berlin.

Internal: GRA participants return. Discontinuity starts, with prior family away.

Contradiction: Trying to keep to structures with numbers extremely small. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Week II extravaganza features 50 teachers and spouses at lawn party Friday night, and 30 for grounds blitz with next door congregation on Saturday.

Internal: Wilf Seville and Sean Mac Blain are welcomed as summer sojourners. Delpha Yost, from Denver, visits during Week II.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER)

Contradiction: Sensing selves in holding pattern in face of GSD site selection. (Wk. 4)

PARIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

External: Research treks to Rennes, Nantes, and Paris allow taking the pulse of the church in France; nets new contacts for ITI:Paris.

Internal: Hosts Wallace family and many others. Patricia Allan passes French Baccalaureat and graduates from high school.

Contradiction: Getting accommodations at lowest possible cost for future treks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Miracle translation week: 20 people participate in translating entire Global Community Forum Workbook into Italian, "Incontro della Comunita" or "Operazioni Quartiere/Paese".

Internal: Celebrates full permeation load towards July 31 solvency, full guest rooms for hosting of Movement. colleagues from around the world, full tables in spite of dramatic dispersion due to summer assignments.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive scope at all times over against particular victories in particular arenas. (Wk. 4)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Second recruitment mailing goes out. First two development calls net \$600.

Internal: Moves one stage further in arranging jobs and permits for new troops. Kitney is appointed General Secretary of the Christian Health Association of Nigeria. Position carries considerable authorization, good salary, House in Lagos, car and travelling expenses. Rev. Ebony Ukpong sojourns prior to ITI recruitment trek.

Contradiction: Getting birds in the bush into the hand. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Sends team to do pre-prep in London for GRA:Europe.

Internal: Manages to have everyone, except one for end-of-year picnic in midst of constant comings and goings.

Contradiction: Re-creating collegium room. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: GSD research trip to Charleroi by whole House opens possibility of a project in mining community. Publishes GCF flyer in Dutch in two days. Does GSD research in Gent and Antwerpen on Belgium's National Day. Kortrijj circuits nets two potential GCF sponsors out of four service clubs visited and hears about enthusiastic report of Caritas head, Vanistendael to Bishop de Smedt of Brugge on 5th City and Order Ecumenical's prayer life.

Internal: Hosts three great Order Youth en route to Kawangware, three colleagues returning from Isle of Dogs to Berlin, Rick Robison on tour in Europe, and two Centrum colleagues for ecclesiola with British guest. Meets many contacts at church dinner for Archbishop of York.

Contradiction: Getting on road while continuing to push for income. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Creates "Buurtdag Nederland", GCF Netherlands flyer. Spends intensive brooding session on GCF contradictions and where to move, how, and when.

Internal: Becomes Wayside Inn with four House members present, hosting 13 guests in seven days. Begins transformation of House with 20 x 12 bottles of in-kind paint.

Contradiction: Enabling GCF to get off ground across Europe and quickly weaving together GCF circuiting, pedagogy, theme and all materials for Quarter II pilot. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: GRA:London impacts Area and House participants with power of corporate work in a time of doing.

Internal: House takes form of Wayside Inn/Emerging Generation Camp for time of GRA.

Contradiction: Getting guardians to participate in Kreuzberg Consult. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Visits local government representative and Siemens expands.

Internal: House without electricity, water, and gas has many guests including Brown family from Isle of Dogs. John Vances from Vancouver and a Turkish translator visit.

Contradiction: Discerning methods and organization to insure Consult funding. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Nets 59 registration for ITI. Business continues to sponsor ITI participants who are the church. Two outstanding contributions come in of 50 reams of Gestetner paper and 100 loaves of bread a day.

Internal: Intense ITI recruitment means hosting numerous PLC grads who drop by for more information and late evening meals for recruitment teams. Sends Ted Farrar out to Global Priors Council.

Contradiction: Meeting development and in-kind needs that still loom three weeks before the ITI while tying up recruitment ends. (Wk. 5)

NAIROBI GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: All programs cover all five stakes in Saturday health survey. Opens community arts centre. Experiments for the first time with soil cement. In-kinds office for training.

Internal: Grow arrive to head up ITI. Receives Student House Youth, Elaine Butcher, Kent Knutson, R. Grow for two-month assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining acceleration in KHDP while personnel shifts constantly. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Annual circuit ride to Nyeri near Mt. Kenya renews old friendships and boosts ITI registrations. Mombasa circuit ride nets provost of Anglican cathedral and executive secretary of Mombasa Diocese. In-kind reaches total of 12,600 Kenyan shillings with gift from Ministry of Wildlife and Tourism of gazelle and impala. Receives 15 international registrations for ITI, including two Catholics, six Anglicans from Uganda, two Catholics and five Lutherans from Tanzania.

Internal: Welcomes Bill Grow, sends Nan Grow to Lusaka ITI. Anticipates move to PCE in september. Njunguna Waitende has brief stay with House, then joins Nyeri circuit ride.

Contradiction: Breaking loose wazee (elders) from the Bahati PCE churches. (Wk. 5)

BOMBAY GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: First week of 75,000 per week quarter is successful. Multi-purpose cooperative registration is promised. Sends Suryabhan Devatkar, leader of Farmers' Guild, on development trip to Bombay, Pune and Delhi, with authorization and advocacy, winning all the way.

Internal: Receives five Order Youth, three of them for a month.

Contradiction: Preparing the village for cooperative economics. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Holds meeting of 14 with three Muslim women from Byculla 5. Circuit reports reveal that all regions are planning strategic use of Gram Sabha; holds PCE tea party in House for Muslim women from key guildmen's family.

Internal: Sends Ronald Powell to MHDP. Interns experience for the first time RS-I pedagogy week end. Visits, reports by Ehokebai Sathe and Suryabhan Deateae from MHDP impact House. Clare Clements wins first prize

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY)

in elocution competition in school.

Contradiction: Actualizing internal sustenance that enables all to do radical total and unconditional mission. (Wk. 5)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Cadre members visit from two regions to assist with Gram Sabha set-up. Completes Area mass mailing list. Sends out Ramesh Agrawal to Maliwada to continental Gram Sabha preparation task force.

Internal: Revitalizes Emerging Generation structures to enable students to be top in their classes. Has ecclesiola supper out on the town to send Cynthia Elliott to Paris.

Contradiction: Engaging entire House in Gram Sabha preparation when Emerging Generation outnumber adults. (Wk. 5)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Creation of Gram Sabha slide shows allows winning at Rotary Club meetings. Sends out Mario and Teresa to Maliwada to prepare Gram Sabha manual.

Internal: Study of "Small is Beautiful" allows everyone to participate. Celebration of Gunfoundry guild member's birthday at House Church is signal event.

Contradiction: Getting the world to do Gram Sabha as troops disburse. (Wk. 5)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Gives Gram Sabha signs to Rotary in Asansol and Xavier Institute in Ranchi on same evening. Asansol Cadre chooses its Gram Sabha community.

Internal: Welcomes back Rev. and Mrs. Kundu from visiting Rome and parish Houses, eager to visit Calcutta House again. Does back-up work for continental Gram Sabha meeting during Week II.

Contradiction: Finding old and new colleagues and exciting them to bring off Gram Sabha in Circus 5. (Wk. 5)

SINGAPORE**GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE**

External: Donnelly reports that Australia ICA receives total tax exemption.

Internal: Preparation of financial reports of the year are interrupted by brief exploration of Singapore agriculture with Dick West.

Contradiction: Developing "Move It" spirit. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Writes brief on selected site for Tekong Human Development Project, Singapore.

Internal: Gail West visits for two days to pull together ITI finances and reports on GRA:Hong Kong. Midnight movie and costume party celebrates Kendra's eleventh birthday.

Contradiction: Getting new contacts to authorize GSD in Singapore. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: New authorization emerges and old colleagues participate in new way as GSD site selection teams go out for a week to east and west coast, south Malaysia, Federal Territory. Meeting with Datuk Harris, Chief Minister of Sabah, opens new soyabean possibilities in East Malaysia.

Internal: Celebrates life and death of John Oorjitham, long time Movement colleague and ITI:Penang 1976 staff.

Contradiction: Finding the way to determine which type of village will be sign in Malaysia. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Receives 600,000 rupiah (\$1,500 USD) from Union Carbide, 60 tons of bricks from PCE colleague, drilling and pump for deep-water well, 400 kilos of rice, loan of seven-ton truck from Nippon Steel to haul building materials, and \$500 USD from Ajinomoto, all for Kelapa Dua HDP. Generates excitement in village

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA)

by ground breaking for community center. Receives promises for printing of Kelapa Dua HDP Consul document and food for consult.

Internal: Receives word that two families want to intern in Kelapa Dua: Marie Malau, Penang ITI grad and Mr. Maria Novel, also Penang ITI grad, arrives from Kuala Lumpur House for six months work in Kelapa Dua. Bengels come from Singapore to help with consult prep. Sends Lushes to Global Priors Council.

Contradiction: Obtaining troops, in-kind materials, money for Kelapa Dua. (Wk. 4)

HONG KONG GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Three nights of English teaching using Global Language School methods raises money for development, leaves people asking for more.

Internal: Emerging Generation Camp, Spirit of '76, comes to great finale as it sends out troops under image of Dr. Noguchi at House Church, charms local congregation with singing, and guests at House with presentation of "Tom Sawyer".

Contradiction: Waiting for future events to give clarity for today's tactics. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: GRA becomes effective regional tool as old and new colleagues participate in GCF day and GSD section of program. Complexity of SEAPAC addresses participants.

Internal: Much "to-ing" and "fro-ing" to tiny island off Hong Kong as House becomes enablement and back-up for GRA. In-kind beer and coke cool sweat accumulated in walk from ferry to GRA site.

Contradiction: Working over against summer mindset of relaxing in order to gear up for Fall programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Sends five House members to ITIs: Taipei and Osaka. Demonstrates total engagement in "great July of training" which promises rich returns relative to Order and Movement training.

Internal: One adult and three Emerging Generation remain to care for House and metro realize after only one day that "where even two or three are gathered in blue" the march continues, the waltz goes on.

Contradiction: Creating training models for colleagues not attending ITI. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Four development calling teams submit new proposals and follow up on those in process.

Internal: Celebrates completion of Quarter IV and launching of Quarter I at the beach.

Contradiction: Intensifying corporate discipline during world's time of discontinuity, with reduced number of troops in House. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: ITI: Taipei concludes having 70 around table. Closing celebration and send-out hold fine spirit and top quality reports. Taiwan Catholics personally report to Archbishop Lokuang and suggest ITI be used to train local priests.

Internal: ITI staff stays on sight to evaluate and write report. House attempts to return to normal.

Contradiction: Deciding what to do first with lines forming rapidly for sojourning, pedagogy, metro cadres. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Visitors drop in by the minute: 16 nuns come and donate 10 pesos each for document, Vice President of Squibb Corporation comes to see if it is true, promises all the medicine we need. Paints huge Sudtongan symbol behind new stage on work day; ten boats go on fishing expedition.

Internal: Completes three more rooms; tribal resettlement finds all but men living in one room; they live out of office! Denise Quimby and friend drop in for a visit.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU)

Contradiction: Finding and tapping available resources in order to keep moving at no cost. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Participates in Bunawan Town Fiesta, complete with much feasting and key contacts made.

Internal: Roy Philbrook returns from development in Manila. Telegram from Chicago sends Elizondos to Global Priors Council in two days' time, complete with an on-the-spot community-initiated "despedida", farewell party, which includes key PCE colleagues who drop in.

Contradiction: Training troops on the run, gathering corporately to celebrate, and planning comprehensively for the future, all right now. (Wk. 5)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Twelve adults from local community come to House for first session of Tuesday evening English conversation group. Development calls on parents of students, nets unexpected interest and promise of support. LENS grad visits House to show films and receives invitation to visit GSD projects on his Asian tour.

Internal: Extensive research by sojourner, Takashi Oda reveals things about parish we never knew. Korean participants from Osaka ITI spend several days in Tokyo, at House.

Contradiction: Transisting from summer programs to gearing up for Fall. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Two Kwangyung pioneer farmers plant new high protein sorghum from Purdue, a first for Korea. Education Guild builds pre-school sand box, then celebrates at Kwangyung Gorge. Health Outpost receives 50,00 won (USD100) donation; briefing held for primary school teachers.

Internal: Conversation on "Last Words of the General" and "Saviors of God", study of "Christ of History" occasion renewal of knowing in midst of intensified doing. Sends out Sev Sorensen after three months of consultation.

Contradiction: Planning effective actuation implementaries while daily forging out effective methods of planning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Sends out nine to ITI:Osaka as well as Helen Chung and Chaplain Ahn of Ewha Girls High School to Jeju. Presents plaque of appreciation to key Jeju official. Preparation continues of Global Language School to be held during school vacation.

Internal: Spends Week II doing indicative battleplanning for 1976-77, especially for Quarter I, which provides new vision.

Contradiction: Conquering bureaucratic swamp that consumes energy. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Intensifies recruitment and preparation for Week 5 English teachers seminar and student Global Language School.

Internal: Experiences week of troop movement: infants return to Sendai, Hikari Goto visits, Bergdall returns after twelve weeks of ITI.

Contradiction: Waiting for the Global Priors Report to shed light on next quarter's directions. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Closing of ITI with feast of 70 includes many PCE guild members. ITI closes in the black as a result of broad base grassroots gifts and massive in-kind donations.

Internal: Is overwhelmed with flood of in-kind from ITI; begins plan for giving some away. House ends year in black, overcoming massive mid-year deficit. Welcomes sojourner, Kathleen Hill, from New York, after she participates in ITI.

Contradiction: Planning, ordering follow-up while discerning the practical PCE tactics accomplished during ITI in order to plan next year. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Local professor and expert on Tohoku villages comes with round of three GSD possibilities.

Internal: The "Spirit of '76" camp journeys to historic Aizu-Wakamatsu and ecclesiola highlights EI/ICA in history.

Contradiction: Maintaining tension between development, primal community and Area training. (Wk. 4)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Duffy goes on Area circuit to all Houses while donor circuit gets going in Newcastle. Glen Innes CMA receives \$400 from New England Regional Council for Social Development (A.A.P.).

Internal: Celebration of completion of Quarter IV takes House to see "All the Presidents Men" followed by first meal out in neighborhood of our new residence (a six-course Lebanese meal in Redfern).

Contradiction: Looking for a way to objectify the journey of settling into new House to maintain mission while getting settled. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Visit with state parliamentary member, Bill Withers, sets up appointments with Federal Minister for Aboriginal Affairs and symbolic head of State. Their decisions affect authorization and interchange links.

Internal: Jesus Principle conversation, opening address at GRA:Chicago, and Sun Tzu allow House to name exactly where the spirit is moving in pushing through government and CMA bottlenecks.

Contradiction: Discerning which are the encounters that are brightening the air and which are the ones blinding us. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Development raises \$250. Holds CMA steering committee meeting at site for CMA to inspect facilities.

Internal: Hosts Mr. CMA, Richard Stanley.

Contradiction: Obtaining the sponsorship yeses needed to turn September 4 CMA into a community event. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Arthur Hughes, well-borer, flies in with owner of Kimberley Seeds for quick survey of land for location of well-bores. New sidewalk cafe under awning is complete in front of KITCO store.

Internal: Sends out David White after week's work with the stock crew initiating this season's muster. Health Sister receives pay raise as result of gaining credit for master's degree.

Contradiction: Deepening the awareness of the global context to elicit future-oriented vision a. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Guardian colleague gives list of possible donors; first three give \$550, another gives fourteen more names, providing strong start for two-week donor circuit. Returning GRA:Hong Kong participants push Area involvement in SEAPAC as number one priority. Attendance of regional colleagues at superb Portland CMA fires up region for CMA push.

Internal: Attends school party, socializes, tell a few tales about Oombulgurri, and soon has enthusiastic audience. Visiting donor circuit gun is assigned to be third House family while he is here as House experiences winning on all fronts. Raymonde Tickner and Ray Richmond stop en route to Perth; House experiences different ecclesiola dynamic with all adults out on development visits.

Contradiction: Getting an urban CMA from initial stages to actual occasion. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Liza Tod returns home from GRA:Chicago. Bill Sinton prepares Oombulgurri newsletter and \$3,000 July funding push draws to close with \$2,999.20 in sight.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE)

Internal: Grad and development files are meshed and organized by circuits in preparation for donor circuit and major funding push.

Contradiction: Doing circuits and sustaining House momentum. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Three interviews at Department of Aboriginal Affairs prove useful preparation for meeting with Federal Minister, Oombulgurri Aboriginal Council members, and ICA in Perth next week.

Internal: Concentrates on phone calling and visits for last push on recruiting for Indonesian Consult, two certain.

Contradiction: Assessing the right time for emphasis on particular aspects of programme. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Moves forward with warm response to Oombulgurri story from doctors. Hoya Brown participates in Aboriginal Week observances.

Internal: Receives visitors, including Area prior, and Aboriginal leader of Northern Rivers, Frank Roberts.

Contradiction: Creating generals out of self-imagined Movement privates. (Wk. 4)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: First Community Congress of the Marshall Islands happens with local man reporting and speeches about past quarter accomplishments, communicating possibility of real care for the people and future of islands.

Internal: Exertion of last quarter reveals great changes under the weight of GSD with new self-consciousness and new grasp of how to meet the task demanded.

Contradiction: Taking what has happened last quarter and pushing through to the level of detail with spirit that allows community to break through. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Two Marinole Brothers join metro cadre to further their assignment to care for the Luanua Alofa Parish. House attends funeral service for Sarasopa Enari, Melbourne ITI grad, first to die in the Suva Area.

Internal: Two metro cadre colleagues sojourn, adding depth to the depleted House dynamic.

Contradiction: Bridging the gaps with comprehensive planning. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: After long zoning battle, Los Altos' City Council recommends TM '76 as a way to bridge the communication gap between the city and the people and offers to locate sponsor.

Internal: While indulging in an over-abundance of in-kind apricots, House does initial brooding on TM acceleration which turns attention to new relationships with governmental units.

Contradiction: Re-imagining TM set-up strategy to practically include all social dynamics in a community in order to accelerate set-up time and ensure widespread participation. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: McDonalds promises food for July 17, San Jose TM; two displays in city bicentennial celebration net registrations and favorable publicity from crowds.

Internal: Program funds for June from metro colleagues come in with all promised for July. New decor in collegium room sets mood for sojourners and circuits.

Contradiction: Projecting comprehensive circuit model beyond July. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Chico holds great TM as the northern hub city with nearly 300 present. Local workshop leaders and 70-year-old M.C., "Old Hutch", carry the day in fine style.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO)

Internal: All House troops are on circuits or at rally; metro colleagues pull together to help set up House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping corporate focus with people in Diaspora. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Sets up Carnas and Burlington TMs with metro colleagues setting up appointments and making calls. Local steering committee member calls to remind consultant to be at the steering committee meeting.

Internal: Acceptance speech of Jimmy Carter impacts all.

Contradiction: Maintaining local program while having no in-House ICA office personnel. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Regional Global Research Assembly concludes with TM Assembly. Community representatives from five inner city neighborhoods, including Hollywood, participate.

Internal: Five more House members go to Chicago for TM Rally. Cynthia Hahn returns from visit to Alaska.

Internal: Welcomes Ilonka and Stacey Roker from Nassau for two weeks sojourn and study. Guardian's Meeting Tuesday night brainstorms ways to raise money. Works on new decor, using summer program theme.

Contradiction: Doing task with fewer troops and same mission with everyone in midst of travel to and from Chicago. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO**GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO**

External: Experiences breakloose in global communications systems: receives first message on computer from London. Prints and distributes another issue of Uptown Voice.

Internal: Celebrates birth of Teresa Lynn Brazen in Caracas. Discontinuity allows time for travel, family reflections as enablement systems are down to a bare minimum, buffet meals allow unsung cooks to emerge.

Whittierites (150) attend one-week family camp at in-kind facility, including staff and meals. Signal forging out of troops with team consciousness from what on the surface appears to world to be community's problems. The 48,000 people in Minneapolis Region who attend July 3 and 4 celebration learn the "Whittier Story" from official host, Whittier colleagues.

Internal: Celebration takes place at Art Institute as Whittier workers and House are guests with city's patrons at special preview.

Contradiction: Articulating corporate story, corporate decision out of battleplan that allows things to happen. (Wk. 1)

Internal: Participates in Global Priors Council, Chicago, 25th Jubilee Celebration of the Order:Ecumenical. New person is assigned here while another from House is re-assigned to 5th City Chicago.

Contradiction: Reconfiguring forces based on demands of acceleration set-up across three states, 100 polises Area-wide, St. Louis City strategy, and local development thrust. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

Contradiction: Following through on TM openings, especially Manchester, Nashua, Portland, Bath, with necessary troops and intensity. (Wk. 4)

External: TM matching funds are developed by telephone after Lynn TM. Blitzes TM set-up in nearby towns. Circuit appointments come in this week with office open as usual. Week II northern foray visits six towns for next phase of TMs in the Fall.

Order Youth were assigned globally for year to GSD sites; deployment model solidified for high school students going to Houses. Centrum priorship finalized for coming year. Contradiction lies in the arena of creating comprehensive Phase I structures for coming year.

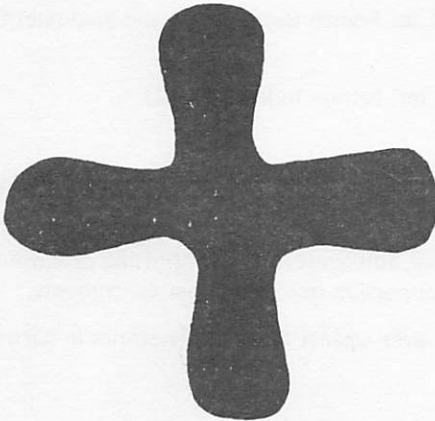

Operations Centrum around the globe was concerned with the basic issue of moving the troops to the various campaigns around the globe, launching the year of Canada and the year of Global Social Demonstration. As assignments were made, Operations made transportation arrangements, formed models for moving possessions, sent Telex messages notifying Houses of arrivals and departures, while maintaining the on-going program systems. Town Meeting workshop leadership training meetings, steering committees, authorization meetings were held in North America, Canada, Japan, India, South America. ITIs in Osaka and Taipei ended; Africa geared up for three ITIs in Nairobi, Lagos and Lusaka. The contradiction lies in the arena of providing the necessary transportation systems to release engagement rapidly during transition.

Maintaining local management, facility systems with few continuing troops consumed energies of Management Centrum. In-kind continued around the globe, with breakthroughs in coffee, soup, and paper folders in Nairobi. Personnel posts sensed selves on unending journey, like Sisyphus, trying to forward mail to troops deployed. Closed Ecumenical Institute books for 1975-76 year. The contradiction is in the arena of holding the comprehensive while all efforts are focused on immediate needs.

Receives European priors for week of prep for GRA:London. Open-air end of Quarter celebration with guild sends out Mark Jewell to Chicago for summer.

Contradiction: Creating structures, stories, that effectively engage available troops. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Twenty-one show up for first Community Forum steering committee and create six-week timeline for four committees.

Internal: Sue Chapman from Australia visits Glasgow as part of ITP journey.

Contradiction: Creating a new story of possibility for key municipal structures desperately engaged in immediacies with a no win stance. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Attends wedding of Order member's sister; Youth sojourners sent out to Paris, Frankfurt, Berlin.

Internal: GRA participants return. Discontinuity starts, with prior family away.

Contradiction: Trying to keep to structures with numbers extremely small. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: House work day recreates church grounds. Huddersfield family, Mick and Maureen Rushton, decide to intern. First meeting of cadre set up by local priest meets and decides to give support to Maliwada with fund-raising event.

Internal: House keeps filled with sojourners, including two from Isle of Dogs. Spin on new images for coming

year as Frank Hilliard visits. Sends out McIntosh family to Winnipeg and Zenon Janik for month in Berlin.

Contradiction: Experiencing being carried out to sea by August issues in midst of helpful drift of discontinuity. (Wk. 6)

PARIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

External: Research treks to Rennes, Nantes, and Paris allow taking the pulse of the church in France; nets new contacts for ITI:Paris.

Internal: Hosts Wallace family and many others. Patricia Allan passes French Baccalaureat and graduates from high school.

Contradiction: Getting accommodations at lowest possible cost for future treks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Miracle translation week: 20 people participate in translating entire Global Community Forum Workbook into Italian, "Incontro della Comunita" or "Operazione Quartiere/Paese".

Internal: Celebrates full permeation load towards July 31 solvency, full guest rooms for hosting of Movement colleagues from around the world, full tables in spite of dramatic dispersion due to summer assignments.

Contradiction: Maintaining the comprehensive scope at all times over against particular victories in particular arenas. (Wk. 4)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Second recruitment mailing goes out. First two development calls net \$600.

Internal: Moves one stage further in arranging jobs and permits for new troops. Kitney is appointed General Secretary of the Christian Health Association of Nigeria. External: Attendance at two European conferences breaks open new level of national and international Catholic laity. Grids polishes so that GCF target communities can be pinpointed. Unofficial cadre meeting gets so involved in French GCF workbook translation, they stay three hours longer and return at night again.

Internal: Multinational companies become source of "Income 13" cleaning work which continues to draw upon colleagues' help, including visitors Paul Gibson and Tim Wilson. Hosts eight unexpected guests representing six nationalities at ecclesiola supper.

Contradiction: Keeping up with all the opportunities, maintaining detailed Wayside Inn hospitality and embodying discontinuous sustenance for life-long task ahead. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Creates "Buurtstag Nederland", GCF Netherlands flyer. Spends intensive brooding session on GCF contradictions and where to move, how, and when.

Internal: Becomes Wayside Inn with four House members present, hosting 13 guests in seven days. Begins transformation of House with 20 x 12 bottles of in-kind paint.

Contradiction: Enabling GCF to get off ground across Europe and quickly weaving together GCF circuiting, pedagogy, theme and all materials for Quarter II pilot. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Cadre in Bergisch Neukirchen completes second major translation effort, prologue and epilogue of Isle of Dogs document, with in-kind typing, printing, collation.

Internal: Discontinuity rubs noses in the venerable power of the old cities of Europe such as Amsterdam and Vienna; this year Austria is celebrating its 1000th birthday as a nation.

Contradiction: Wanting to wait for "staff orders" instead of moving into missional arenas of the new year with quickness and certitude. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

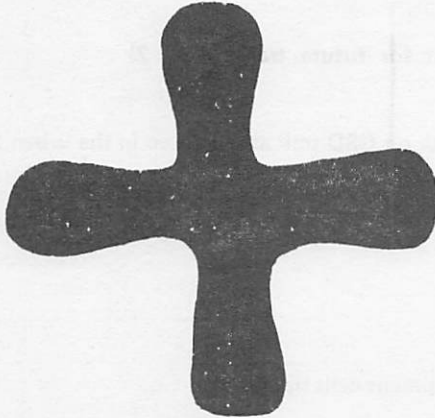

Contradiction: Needing economic breakloose to maintain program balance and development. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Makes plans for Obrero LCC at PCE meeting held at home of newest core member. Obrero 5 mini-school PTA elects officers. ITI reunion beach party celebrates return of Vilma Fuentes from ITI: Taipei.

Contradiction: Discerning specific practical demands that will distribute the strength of the region to places in globe that are crying out for such human resources. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE MELBOURNE

External: Port Melbourne sets date for CMA. Bi-regional circuit follows up on Portland CMA and launches four more along Victoria-Adelaide border.

Internal: Relocating worship room provides more office space for circuits and PCE office.

Contradiction: Preparing for mid-course corrections in CMA phasing and House configuration. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Creating the model for using a few troops to catalyze the new Movement in a vast rural geography. (Wk. 7)

External: Outer Island school teachers visit pre-school and request pre-schools on their own atolls and the T.T. curriculum teaching lab request working closely with them in the Majuro schools this year. Local guardian paves TASC's way for regular supply of Japanese goods, and 38 more young men sign up for the copra harvesting team.

Internal: Transforms House. Sends out Dan Tuecke to Kelapa Dua and the consensus taking place on concrete replication plan with September 7 as departure date, spins House into consciousness of the fact of being fifth phase of replication.

Contradiction: Working through the practices of freeing selves from own particular jobs and training local people to pick them up. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Launching necessary internal structures while keeping TM plates spinning. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Allowing the building of TM battleplan to release momentum. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

Internal: Welcomes new troops, Randall Halthcock and Colleen Gleason. House and metro colleagues ground generalship image with game of Risk after House Church.

Contradiction: Getting feet on the ground and getting feel of the turf quickly so that new troops are soon old generals. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Creating futuric program story of TM while bridging gap of parochial expectations. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

Internal: Week of fasting and feasting: steak and egg breakfast is held to send out Karen Kivimaki to Omaha assignment; the day after the fast, House feasts at invitation of Mr. and Mrs. Austin Troxel at country club.

Contradiction: Getting the economic community involved in funding TM and getting powerful authorization in order to set more dates. (WK. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Nurtures TX Jaycee contacts; does initial proposal writing designed to give TM program status at Jaycee Summer Board Meeting. Fort Worth cadres host TM booth at community July celebration.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

McComb, MS, plans core meeting for next week. West Jackson and Montgomery steering committees are impacted with demand to do attendance, rather than just publicity, with two weeks to go to TM.

Internal: Rethinks relation of space to task, resulting in decision to claim and transform last unclaimed first floor space into a Management Centrum service center. Week II plenary on internal designs begins to forge the common mind for the coming year. Begins study of memorials in morning collegiums. Sends out first of El Bayad troops: Gene and Iris Boivin, Jim Stovall, Wayne and Jo Nelson.

Internal: Week II of intensive three campaigns battleplanning session and Order life designs shifts while universe.

Contradiction: Harnessing the momentous energies of 5th City into one common, catalytic, one-day task that powerfully signals the imminent completion of HDP this first year. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Circuits produce excited TM advocates with one Wichita man deciding to pull together troika for Northwest city TM.

Internal: Marge Tomlinson impacts House with four-day stay; sends Emerging Generation out to camp and sixth grade trip.

Contradiction: Eliciting metro troops to participate in metro circuits. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Lincoln mayor approves TM by assigning three staff to steering committee.

Internal: House and 1500 others attend second Northside Festival, second of twelve miracles from TM.

Contradiction: Appropriating discontinuity as a 44-hour retreat, with loose ends to tie up. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Visits eight new towns this week as part of Summer '76. Sends two to GRA:Chicago with buckboard fiesta for 20 colleagues with barbeque chicken, watermelon as kick-off for summer.

Internal: Welcomes Terri Druckenmiller as sojourner. Guests are present for collegium every morning.

Contradiction: Maximizing effectivity of 14 TM callers when 200 are needed. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Receives Butler Foundation grant for \$5,000 for MN Town Meetings. Schedules first Urban Native American Community Forum for August with full fee in hand. Whittierites (150) attend one-week family camp at in-kind facility, including staff and meals. Signal forging out of troops with team consciousness from what on the surface appears to world to be community's problems. The 48,000 people in Minneapolis Region who attend July 3 and 4 celebration learn the "Whittier Story" from official host, Whittier colleagues.

Internal: Celebration takes place at Art Institute as Whittier workers and House are guests with city's patrons at special preview.

Contradiction: Articulating corporate story, corporate decision out of battleplan that allows things to happen. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Circuits continue with team support from Chicago Region while forces return from two weeks on the road in western Kansas TM set-up. West End, St. Louis TM is postponed to increase community support.

Internal: Many colleagues move through St. Louis to new assignments, stopping overnight for visit.

Contradiction: Persisting in communities long enough, making enough visits so that a strong core group generates a TM of 200. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Amidst small numbers and swirl of intensified permeation, Avon is contexted on TM set-up and sites A-F are reviewed for 2/20/1 impact model.

Internal: Linda Ikenberry returns from wedding with reports of leading an "Order-style" rehearsal dinner. House receives summer cleaning and August "troop usage" chart is built.

Contradiction: Maintaining a sense of urgency amidst feelings of summer laxity. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: St. Gaults church school appears on TV as iron man symbol goes up 18 feet high on side wall of church. Sets up five new steering committees. Brodhead steering committee jumps from six to 20 in one week.

Internal: Once again, worship paper impacts all. Send out is a wrenching experience as colleagues leave on new assignments.

Contradiction: Imaging discontinuity as missionally assigned. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: At Jefferson County, KY, Jaycee Presidents Meeting, ten presidents state "we're going to do one". Seven out of 15 towns visited on circuits are new ones.

Internal: Hosts House Church plenary with ten metro colleagues. Secures \$225 for circuits and ICA titled car.

Contradiction: Learning to operate office as remote control switchboard when all are on the road. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Grasps sense of grassroots Movement as Zanesville sets TM date, covering 12th polis; break open occurs in Columbus through Urban League and Borden Corporation two quarters ahead of schedule and rash of appointments open up activity in Kentucky.

Internal: Arrivals and departures are key happenings as Anna Stanley is sent to Canberra at bi-metro celebration; Rickerts are welcomed into House, Watsons tell Maliwada miracle stories. Youth TM grad decides to intern and ground taking the future seriously relative to leadership development.

Contradiction: Participating in Areal manoeuvres in Kentucky and Missouri while local TM set-up intensifies in 20 communities and new internal House structures need creating. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: CIF in Detroit with mayor and his staff present, as well as police chief, has 250 participants, further breaks open Detroit authorization and ICA visibility.

Internal: Champagne, steak and egg breakfast at 4:00 a.m. creates a memorable sendout for relocated families. IBM delivers new Correct-o-Matic typewriter to be used while doing TM set-up.

Contradiction: Moving systematically on the geography and having meetings all over the region to attend while losing one full-time circuter. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Plan for summer TM cultivation breaks loose with three new steering committees, growing list of TM grad consultants. Visits old metro grads for TM pledging; produces TM rally registrations and pledges, bringing count to 19 for rally attendance.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to highlight week as celebration of external expenditure and reception for new TM grads. Development plan begins to activate non-givers for TM funding. Goes on regional camping celebration for 4th of July.

External: Key demonstration community in Pittsburgh sets date; permeators demonstrate set-up prowess; metro colleague/ consultant reports on status of five communities under care; follow-up meeting is requested for purpose of setting up more TMs.

Internal: Gail Lumpkin comes from Washington, DC, to enable Pittsburgh Region August circuit preparation, which inaugurates bi-region strategy. Welcomes Millers from Philadelphia and Cameron Grow from Student House to fill out House.

Contradiction: Operating with at least two separate TM strategies. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Bi-regional meeting in Albany plans manoeuvres which get held with the song, "We'll be coming around the mountains...".

Internal: Taking the consultant's manual seriously helps to plan the first consultant training session for Week II.

Contradiction: Organizing troops for effective engagement in an expanded war. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Holds TM in Charlottesville (Tom Jefferson's home); city-wide committee of 21 people of all ages, social and economic strata consense on setting nine steering committees for nine TMs in city.

Internal: Extended family is here for week from Oklahoma; children return from camp.

Contradiction: Keeping an ace up your sleeve when you have laid all cards on table. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: First pre-consult miracle in Washington GSD calls forth over 100 residents of Ivy City for Community Clean-Up Day as all ages and people in blue put shoulders to a common task. Community resident exclaims: "This is the first time in 32 years that I have seen this many people work together on a common project."

Internal: Sunday morning six-hour House Council and task force reassignments dramatize shift from Horizons Festival to GSD prep.

Contradiction: Turning the waves created by Horizons Festival weekend into the tidal wave for GSD in nation's capitol. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Circuit to Hagerstown Metro firms up Hagerstown and Cumberland TMs.

Internal: Work day ends with send-out for Shinn family.

Contradiction: Communicating profundity of TM to those who have not experienced it. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: New coordinator's manual is a smashing hit with on-going steering committees, and helps clinch several decisions of potential steering committees into dates.

Internal: Sends out troops to Africa, Pittsburgh and Richmond, and receives a troop from New York.

Contradiction: Feeling that life is not fair: August, a discontinuous month, is most intense TM set-up month in history. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Metro task force blitzes office and reports all circuits go at Wednesday night meeting.

Internal: Reduced House in numbers with two working out, experiences taking care of itself as all House structures are maintained.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK)

Contradiction: Getting ahold of the state of the war in all targeted circuit towns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Bi-regional task force focuses forces of two regions into unpenetrated section of Pennsylvania in order to assure a TM date is set in every polis in both regions before Area Council.

Internal: House continues full missional activity at high speed in midst of operating with only 1/2 of troops and the ambiguity of shifting assignments.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues and TM steering committee vets to become consultants. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Launches circuits into Vermont with good results. Attends New Hampshire state Jaycee meeting; Al Simonson, national V.P. is present and most helpful. Phones follow-up invitations to consultant training day. TM set-up is held in Wallingford, CT. Work begins for Title XX proposal to do training.

Internal: Jim and Peter Flynn, dog Eightball, visit for three days, return to serve local congregation in New York state. Does budget work for 1976-77. Tony Pardo ends two-week sojourn.

Contradiction: Creating a whole new circuit pattern and grid. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Portland, Maine, sets October 9 TM date, first TM in state.

Internal: Many colleagues come for send-out celebration House Church for Bellamy, and Amy Bridgham. Goes on foray to Albany, NY.

Contradiction: Selling House without new debts. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

Entry into the circles of wealthy individuals (upcoming luncheon and slide show for one of Chicago's wealthiest patrons) has mean new seriousness about public posture. Both of these come with a jolt in demanding more time and troops than what seems immediately available. The contradiction facing Development around the world is determining a risking strategy that will capitalize on troop motivity and that will, in the timing of each move, capture the full potential of the situation.

Global Research Centrum launched the Academy task force with determination to incorporate the latest edge wisdom and methods from Global Social Demonstration and Town Meeting. Worked on New Evangelism forces rehearsal of the strategic role of the historic church in the drama of history. Plenary on internal designs reflected new clarity and confidence in polity dynamics. Created models dealing with modes of troop deployment that are fitted to new Nexus realities. The contradiction lies in the arena of ensuring the common memory as context for operating decisions.

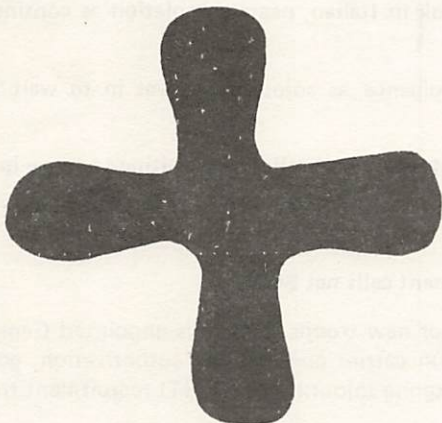

Contradiction: Having a story that enables communities to see that the only way to deal with the immediacies is to build a comprehensive plan. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Three Philadelphia/New York bi-regional circuit teams meet for mid-circuit de-briefing at a log cabin in mountains. Circuit plan is 12 TMs in 14 days.

Internal: Bicentennial guests continue as House receives and sends out troops to most intensive circuiting ever.

Contradiction: Intensifying consultant training to meet tripled demand for TMs. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Five guardians sojourn in near-empty House and build plan for TM set-up. Twelve TM colleagues spend day at House to set up five TM task forces.

Internal: Guardians "take over" House in absence of House members, save one.

Contradiction: Determining the effective use of troops that will launch acceleration phase. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Bi-regional task force focuses forces of two regions into unpenetrated section of Pennsylvania in order to assure a TM date is set in every polis in both regions before Area Council.

Internal: House continues full missional activity at high speed in midst of operating with only 1/2 of troops and the ambiguity of shifting assignments.

Contradiction: Moving colleagues and TM steering committee vets to become consultants. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Holds Consultant Training Day in Saturday session with 19 attending. Visits eight towns in New Hampshire. Steering committees meet in Cromwell, West Haven, Newington.

Internal: Task force work prepares for development thrust and Title XX proposal to be hired as consultants. Fr. Don Richards visits from Milwaukee and celebrates mass at St. Peter's, next to House. Emerging Generation presents song/story/symbol at morning collegium.

Contradiction: Accelerating decisions to set TM dates and final prep for Park Street 5 Guild Planning Day on August 28. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER/ALBANY

External: Day-long trek through South End raises unforeseen possibilities for project there.

Internal: First Albany House Church launches new year. Refiors arrive and House keeps in step with metro troops.

Contradiction: Locating Albany House facility in Albany. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: New wave of powerful steering committees is experienced in Quincy, Massachusetts, Roslindale, and Portland, Maine.

Internal: Sends out Chaffee family to Newark House.

Contradiction: Encountering new geography from Pawkawtuic, Rhode Island, to Presque Isle, Maine. (Wk. 8)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Frontenac Forum is releasing colleagues to care for the whole region. Ecclesiola happens as three colleagues with House ponder the grid and open up circuiting possibilities as one asks, "What is my assignment?"

Internal: Redesigns House space as Reilys are sent out; receives Glenda Johnson and intern, Michel Nolet, and plans for the 22 residents.

Contradiction: Initiating new people into House without overwhelming the local enthusiasm. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Decides and initiates practices for Weeks 8 and 9 GCF blitz with all House troops and available colleagues.

Internal: Holds tribal resettlement of 14 in permanent nests in midst of 18 temporary places needed in five-bedroom building.

Contradiction: Knowing the right catalytic people and tactics to accelerate CFC during two-week blitz. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: CFC continues to break open with strong support in Hearst for Maliwada due to church served by John Patterson. Development calls by Patterson and Williams give promise of \$50,000 by October.

Internal: Maliwada and GCF Rally and Cardinal reports break open 20 regional colleagues' Movemental participation in send-out for Woodbury and LePage families.

Contradiction: Discerning what is the form of global responsibility in the midst of changing assignments. (Wk. 8)

External: Guardian, Dan Forsythe, spends evening at House talking about Barlovento in relation to GSD. House forays to Estado Cojeres to look at GSD sites. Sends special grad letters for January consult. Visits Valencia during GSD site foray, narrowing down possibilities.

Internal: Sends out Rose West on training assignment. Works on Latin American and global song translation. Trinidadian sojourner, Ruth Palmer, leads House in Caribbean song fest. Luis Borges' study on "The Handwriting of God" plumbs depth of red Ur.

Contradiction: Maintaining authentic momentum. (Wk. 7)
