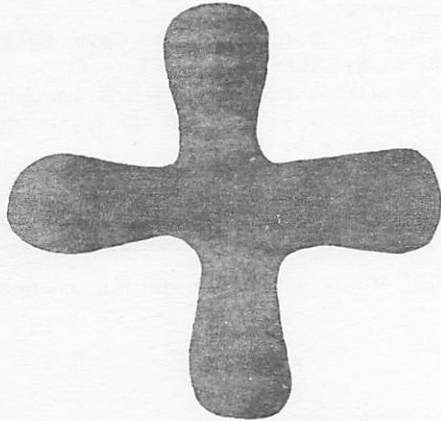


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

WEEK NINE

November 29 - December 5, 1976



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Distributes 4000 leaflets, covering every doorstep on Isle of Dogs to announce upcoming Town Meeting on December 4, and tells story of IHDP. Businessmens guild visits all 44 island businesses to invite to Businessmens Association meeting, advisory board meeting. Terrence McKee and John Kroeger develop for El Bayad.

Internal: Welcomes McKee family, sojourning for one week. Sends Cramer out on one-week Area trek. Ion Gilmour invites office co-worker to participate. Whole House and guild participates in Guy Fawkes Day fireworks display.

Contradiction: Transforming new phase of renewed questioning of interest in IHDP into effective engagement. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: ITI followup strategy begins to yield fruit with six yesses. Whole House returns from TM circuit with stories of possibility everywhere. IBM faculty representative call with images of how they can be of help.

Internal: Anne Conroy celebrates completion of intern year. Collegium study is on Liberal Heresy.

Contradiction: Maintaining missional focus while responding to the forest fires of possibility. (Wk.9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Visits with Avon County. Secures half page space in newsletter that is sent to all communities in Avon County.

Internal: Celebrates Stuart Wrights seventh birthday. Inkind moves ahead with seven reams of paper received. Hosts Reverend Mother for tea as she moves to new assignment in Manchester.

Contradiction: Ensuring that the momentum is not lost through lack of events to catalyze the focus. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: ITI and TM treks launched with sixteen appointments in five cities on Week II. First Institute Evening held with 12 ladies in Noffingham.

Internal: First ecclesiola features ease of applicability of 2500 years old writing to ITI and Tm campaigns of today.

Contradiction: Locating the whistle points in the three campaigns so that eight is the winning number. (Wk. 9)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Development scores with money and new support for three campaigns.

Internal: Julie Thonon, from the Caracas Cadre, stops by for a visit and for House Church and reports on Foro Comunitario Venezuela and Cano Negro.

Contradiction: Truning interest into practical community support for Forum Communautaire En France December 11. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Trastevere TM Document mailed out to contributors. 1500 kilometers on crash Folorence to Naples circuit in new Order Blue car. GSD slide show in Italian ready to go.

Internal: Guest guardians the Hollingers stop to do ecclesiola while on their way to Zambia. GSD search brings last use out of Gesterner loan and IBM typewriter on approval for document on Southern Italian villages.

Contradiction: Spinning the TM excitement into local guide commitment. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Uses indicative battleplanning methods and NRM spins and workshops as tools to enable Medical Missionaries

of Mary Regional Assembly to reflect on future of their order. Mother General was among the 35 delegates and participants.

Internal: Enables established order to reflect on its corporate thrust sparks off reflection on Order wisdom.

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Hosting of Area Priors for a special meeting including HDP direcots. Nigerian visas for all Nigerian assignees.

Internal: Decorating a common space as a war room adjacent to the Generals lounge. Collegium by Mary Warren Moffett on The Woman in the Future.

Contradiction: Creating structures to focus enemy into major arenas engagement. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Discovers native colleagues serve as translators and double troop strength on circuits. Holds initial core meeting for TM in Kortriut.

Internal: House Church with Nexus as guests occasions experience of great collegiality and corporate power. Austerity program keeps children home from school, making busy internal presence.

Contradiction: Adjusting circuit strategy from break-open visits to core solidification. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Venlo neighborhood decides to hold March 26 TM and prints flyer, while Dordrecht core begins to form. Prayers are uttered during contradiction workshop with Amsterdam North Church group as Sunday School mindset finally collapses.

Internal: Sun Tzu study places new demands upon all not to give in to failure when sustenance issues threaten missional time.

Contradiction: Getting clear on strategy in order to best use forces. (Wk. 8)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Leverkusen Neukirchen congregation uses HRM methods for a follow-up day of planning for a HRM held one year ago. Attendance doubled and broad cross-section of congregation takes place.

Internal: Inkind carpets cover floors in resplendid glory. Cynthia Todd gets job and Jim Baumbach passes through just in time for a Sri Lanken meal.

Contradiction: Battling the tendency for major thrust of Quarter to shift slightly from week to week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Finishes German translation of document and presents it to community at guild meeting; collates and packages 1000 documents for binding. Celebration of collation, films, singing, enable 40 residents to accomplish work in one short evening. Begins work on translation of Global Language School curriculum into German. Plans childrens' after school programme with community resident; distributes flyers for opening event. Community

woman goes on development calls.

Internal: Sends four people to Brussels priors meeting and one person to Frankfurt New Woman's Forum, leaving remnant to pull off event-filled week.

Contradiction: Maintaining all aspects of House functions full steam in midst of intensifying GSD Christmas Markt. (Wk. 8)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Nine ITI grads from Kitwe Cadre decide to attend and enable SHDP Consult. Wife of Mondolo Ecumenical Foundation Director, an ITI grad, has cadre to home for refreshments. Authorization calls disclose strong affirmation for Shantumbu HDP.

Internal: Victor Manchishi, ITI grad, begins intern year. Maybin Simfukwe sojourns. August ITI as \$30,000 paid. HDP Habitat slides enliven ecclesiola and cadre meetings.

Contradiction: Moving into SHDP site with no facility. (Wk. 6)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: First copies of document come off press, courtesy of American University. Arabic document goes to press. Trip to Barout chicken farm excites men with images of raising chickens as an industry. First development trip to Cairo with villagers scores gift of pipe for water mains. Pre-school teachers volunteer their time.

Internal: Amina joins staff in Bayad. Experiments with mid-day collegium. Consult team makes one last visit to village, leaves for Lusaka.

Contradiction: Keeping all programs moving at same time, as a few programs move quickly and others demand huge expenditures of time and creative energy. (Wk. 8)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Sends out Kawangware businessmen to Shantumbu Consult. Lions Club doctors and dentists examine 200 children in Muslim village Kawangware as the cobra strikes this target area.

Internal: Sends out Larry Leoppke to Ije-de Consult set-up. Sends out Allan Miller, Peter Njuguna, and Fred Lanphear to Shantumbu Consult and Linda Barnes to London for handicraft marketing. Welcomes Joe Pierce and Neil Vance.

Contradiction: Arranging a Continental Council around all the launching consults for social demonstration and Village Meeting schedule. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Sends day moving House to new facility, second day setting up 2 VMs with 10 contacts. Vehicle driver hears VM story, sees VMs being set up in his old porivince, reduces his fee to falf. Attends National Christian Church Conference in Mombasa.

Internal: Receives Humphrey Agack, Dan Otieno an Obedy Amutalah as firs of newly enlisted African staff.

Contradiction: Taking responsibility for assignments while consensing on bread strategies. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: Maliwada HDP Training School participatns have two-day Shram Dan, work day, giving face-lift to entire village.

Internal: Celebrates marriage of Simon D'Soza and Archana Mandal, October 17. Beth and William Jackson arrive.

Contradiction: Mobilizing troops to break through on all battlefronts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Gram Sabha is held in Nagpur. Byeulla 5 guild is given new meeting place. Pune guild member visits Bombay to finalize Pune Gram Sabha.

Internal: Celebrates with continental development team following successful four week blitz arrangements.

Contradiction: Being able to flow freely over any terrain needed instead of deepening an old rut. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Demonstration Gram Sabha, intended for 80, blossoms into full-fledged happening of 125. Old Movement man who filled M.C. role, confides, "This has been the greatest day of my life".

Internal: Three House members participate full-time in four-week continental development blitz, and one of those circuits nets 36,000 rupees in one week.

Contradiction: Accomplishing necessary practical tasks amidst overwhelming pressure of external tasks. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Speaking engagement with local Rotary club opens doors to Gram Sabha sponsorship. Guild surveys Gunfoundry garbage to prepare for next miracle. Guildmembers join House for development and authorization visits. Madras urban circuit team reports 2,743.00 rupees in hand and 6,700 more promised; establishes effective grassroots funding network. Municipal corporation of Hyderabad gives 10 concrete dustbins to Gunfoundry 5 for work day.

Internal: House celebrates "going through it, but not going under" with Hindi film, Roti, Kapada Aur Makan, Bread, Cloth and House.

Contradiction: Acting out the decision that now is the time for setting up Gram Sabha. (Wk. 8)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Hard arguments at local guild meeting bring group to realization that Gram Sabha is literally a community affair, and that nobody else is going to do it for them.

Internal: Fast Day comes as a healing experience, especially the Feast. Family taking on guardian role cuts daily telegraph clipping on Bridge House, come to House Church.

Contradiction: Deciding to do one thing, the mission, in the midst of the paralysing effect of the myriad of possibilities. (Wk. 7)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Celebrates development breakthroughs with US businesses and Rotary Clubs; proposals in for \$13,500.

Internal: Order Youth passes exams with distinction in Geography. Warboard covers whole wall of office. Collegium room takes on new look with HDP and Summer '76 decor. Celebrates by seeing "All the President's Men".

Contradiction: Getting to GCF battleground before enemy does. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Launches GCF in Malaysia with Majlis Tetangga Melawis in Kelang, with more than 200 adults and children and the committee already organized for continuing so porposals can be put into action.

Internal: Richard Stanley arrives to orchestrate Majlis Tetangga.

Contradiction: Resetting priorities relative to GCF and IGM before GSD plans are solidified. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: New uniforms presented at pre-school Selamatan. Health works from Central Java begin two week para medic training with six village. Tempe (processed soybeans) industry building completed and first contract for sales obtained.

Internal: Move kitchen for sixth time into permanent home.

Contradiction: Changing individualized image of development into community image of development. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Sends Bruce Robertson on Manila development trek. Sends Rafos's and Quimby to Tokyo LENS. GCF Training School mailing sent to Area Hong Kong announcing Week 10 event. Planned and staffed two day Methods Consult with Hong Kong Christian Service Agency; Sends Jim Oberg on economic intensification team in Majuro.

Internal: Sandra Rafos negotiates new job contract with even more flexible time. Humannes Is collegiums provide discontinuous reflection on everyday activities.

Contradiction: Creating time for necessary ongoing task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Weekly pedagogy for Regional faculty culminates in fine RSI with 21. New commitments to the movement anticipated as a result. Exciting dialogue with local man of Fuk Wah and subsequent proof of local grounding in development call make this most exciting week so far in consult preparation.

Internal: Permeator secures job in hotel across from Centrum and first chapter of English book for Japanese is sent to publisher.

Contradiction: Releasing excitement from teaching RSI into engagement in the new form of the church. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOSHSIUNG

External: Has dinner with Roman Catholic vicar general. Two House and 1 metro colleague go to Taipei LENS, resulting in new grads wanting to learn to teach course in Mandarin. Discovers Chien Chen village near Kaohsiung airport; becomes GSD site where least expected, under proverbial noses; begins initial research conversations with colleagues, revealing similar possible locations. GSD training takes new form as three commit to Fuk Wah Consult.

Internal: House fills with guests as George Packard arrives on Area prior trek. Metro ecclesiola includes 11 extras as ITI grads come unexpectedly from next city to attend. Hot water arrives at House in time for cooler weather.

Contradiction: Symbolizing focus of mission that releases engagement for GSD. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Recruitment treks for RSI and Global Community Forum Training School made to Cavite, Silang and Lucena. GCF Workbook translation completed. RSI sponsorship guaranteed by local priest for members of his parish.

Internal: Hosts Theological Ecumenical Extension class. Welcomes Francis Coker: sent out Bruce Robertson and Rod Wilson. Ecclesiola is a great happening with Sun Tsu well grounded in our daily task. 16 GSD sites celebration Saturday night.

Contradiction: Assuring corporate wisdom on issues with many demands raise the need for creative assignment rational. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Taichung PLC in Chinese taught by regional faculty and Area prior. Submit registration forms again with customary finished in two weeks response.

Internal: Thanksgiving Feast for 30 is depth event with ham and pies encouraging the spirit flow. George Packard pushes and pulls in giving area report. Ed Dillinger back in Taipei.

Contradiction: Developing at home as economic crunch begins to be felt. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: 25 top Cebu businessmen committed to visit SHDP project site and picture how to extend help as a result of a luncheon given by Mr. Edwardo Aboitez. Community workday started building Buri factory and craft workshop using local coconut lumber. Receives first sewing machine loaned from YMCA.

Internal: Sends out Lester Knutsen to Davao GCF and Rodney Wilson back to Manila. Attends Lapu-Lapu fiesta teachers night and met Maitan five colleagues.

Contradiction: Pushing through all current blocks to complete all arenas. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Holds first GCF Workshop Leaders Training Practice Session with 24 in attendance from two GCF sponsoring committees.

Internal: Fourth year high school student takes the National College Entrance Examination.

Contradiction: Coming up with the winning gimmick to insure attendance at the GCF. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Two new guild leaders assigned by community creates tactical timeline at guild meeting. Visits to Common

Mill Factory and co-operative store instigated by villagers signifies turning point of project from village side. Village Saemail leader working on construction permit for training center. Village commons House got new door and Je Ju NSG students do health survey.

Internal: Janice Barstow arrives and quickly plugs into work. Rex Rotary duplicator finally springs to life. Agricultural intensification model pushed at collegium. Constant stream of visitors from the mainland, Je Ju City and the village.

Contradiction: Creating an abundance of new images for the community. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Begins staff training house construction with grave site photographs to enable tomb's moving; carpenter examines blue print for staff house and compiles cost estimates and materials lists. Villagers move one step closer to obtaining construction permit. Health outpost receives big box of medicines from Korean Army doctor and trains local nurses aides; holds clinic in neighboring village. Village has Harvest Fun Night and then enjoys Saturday night at the movies.

Internal: Sees many new faces at the HDP: Ms. Lee Myon Ja, Rev. Kim Won Ho, from Seoul and Dr. Floyd Votaw, U.S. veterinarian, add troop strength and spirit to Kwangyung II model village. Bill Schlesinger from Tokyo, brings Area news as well as hay mower and rice catcher. Ms. Shinn Jin Yong of Jeju City prepares Mun Mondu for House Church meal and then remains to participate. First village couple attends ecclesiola, Lee Jun Wha with his wife. Digs 100 meters of water pipe trench.

Contradiction: Focusing on long-range. (Wk.8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Kwangju Metro maneuver opens up new contacts and schedules HRM; receives permission to hold ITI in Choonchun at Sacred Heart College July 31-August 20, 1977.

Internal: Welcomes Janice Barstow on way to Kwangyung II; receives much practical wisdom from Sun Tzu.

Contradiction: Employing the troops in the one war. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: CS-I dramatically impacts colleagues with challenges of times and calls forth revolutionary decision. GSD slide show generates new development and authorization.

Internal: Letter writing vigil for developing GSD money during Fast focuses on "on behalf of" significance of day.

Contradiction: Waiting for the RIGHT to strike. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: First Japanese TM steering committee initiated with Kobe Jaycee president as co-ordinator and pledge of support from Chamber of Commerce in Kobe. GLS in PCE raises \$400.

Internal: PCE residents drop in for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Breaking through contact net for Japan TM development. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Saw 8mm Hollywood movie clips with local colleague as possibility for future group conversations.

Internal: Gets machinery underway for GSD benefit

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI)

Christmas Party.

Contradiction: Trying to telescope a timeline before people have previous experiences for participation. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Major Funding Circuit in Sydney reveals buzz over ICA in network of corporate concern. Mailing to prospects for CTC and OHDP report to all donars.

Internal: Gets face lift for open house this Saturday with three new inkinded carpets, window drapes and lounge furniture.

Contradiction: Getting people to release resources for OHDP, but still struggling with interior decision to use the gifts we have to release people in their own situation thru CTC/CMA. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: CMA receives affirmation from federal member of parliament and local welfare officer takes summer brochures to mail to Roman Catholic contacts. Oombulgurri students arrive for holiday camp and large consignment of goods leave for Oombulgurri by ship and road.

Internal: Rees family visit to Manjimup strengthens CMA possibilities. Renovations begun in preparation for upcoming Bar-B-Q.

Contradiction: Nipping in the bud the reduced stories that spread the word of satan and continue as the authentic ones. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: First radio and newsmedia coverage for Christmas week celebrations signals intensification of the next three weeks before the event.

Internal: Sends Betonte to Port Hedland; signals initial coverage of region for CMA prospects. Lisa attends first school social as part of end of school year activities.

Contradiction: Maintaining corporate thrust and momentum and not being overwhelmed by immediate demand. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Gains big steps towards self-sufficiency this week with arrival of seven more pigs and plowing 30 acres. Shell Oil agrees to sell petroleum at government prices, 1/3 of what presently paying, and Department of Housing and Construction stake out bore well.

Internal: Area priors working visit allows depth reflection on state of project, especially impacting in a film of Mowanjum.

Contradiction: Keeping battleplan in mind with explosions and possibilities going every which way. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Development momentum continues with \$400 from two visits this week. CTC brochures received and dispensed. South region trek confirms two steering committees before Christmas. MacPhemons LTD. decide to donate inkind tools to Oombulgurri. Sixteen fairly solid for CTC with other possibilities.

Internal: Guests for tea stay for core meeting. Dick Charles comes to ecclesiola and decides to be a regular.

Contradiction: Keeping CTC momentum rolling in midst of the Australian wind down for summer. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Mono Pumps donates septic system for first Oombulgurri cluster of houses. Businessman's lunch expands Oombulgurri support task force.

Internal: Students finish finals. EG celebrate Isle of Dogs on Week II by exploring the port dock area but coming up with no fish. CTC mailing and prospect list completed.

Contradiction: Turning interest in CTC into registrations. (Wk. 9)

CANBERRA

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CANBERRA

External: Thirty five present at guardians meeting. Utah check for \$18,000 banked.

Internal: Dick Stanley returns from Area Singapore and reports on Delapa Dua, TM and movement happenings. Hosts guardian Sill Sinton and wife and Barry Oakley who reports on Area trek.

Contradiction: Using extended troops to pick up on the task. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: CTC recruitment momentum is accelerated by visit of Sister Janet Hughes (Sisters of Mercy) from Newcastle; two Apex speaking engagements hold promise for Oombulgurri.

Internal: Fast on Thanksgiving Day prompts reflection that for us, hunger is an intrusion which disturbs the normal. not an everyday grinding reality.

Contradiction: Finding the strategies that break loose new development possibilities. (Wk. 9)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: First English classes are held in two stakes; preschool 4 in Laura starts with mothers actively participating. Sister Betty McGee visits Catholic Church and team returns from Guam after handling a major TASC creditor which opened doors to key local authorization.

Internal: Thanksgiving Feast with 31 guests includes the head of the Church in the Marshalls. Reverend Jude Sampson, Judge Kabua Kabua and District Oscar De Brum sends his collegial greetings to the House and to MHDP.

Contradiction: Shifting from focusing on individual programs to having total community engagement without losing the ground already gained. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Moves into village circuiting for the quarter backed by hard work in authorization and long-range planning and culminates in week end wedding feast which illuminates the need for recapturing the historical heritage of the celebration.

Internal: Concurrent maneuvers staffed by the House finds split spacially but experiencing corpratness thru common missional momentum.

Contradiction: Shifting from focusing on individual programs to having total community engagement without losing the ground already gained. (Wk. 9)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Hosts informal consult briefing with 17 present; five firm up decisions to go to Nyan Gapki and three

others strongly consider. Two TM cores set up in Rohnert Park and Richmond District in San Francisco. Holds sponsors meeting in Alameda with 30 present; Alameda Unified School District endorses TM and assigns member to steering committee. TM dates begin to come in from past maneuvers: Merced and Tulare. Belmont TM coordinator appointed to state Jayce TM promotion director.

Internal: Receives \$500/month pledges in grassroots development. EG has great fun week-end with bake contest while at same time providing House with multitude of goodies. House guest include Karen Reese's sister, Christy Tewes, and Betty McGee.

Contradiction: Keeping up with momentum of maneuvers and building necessary models to recruit troops to follow up possibilities. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Scotts Valley TM comes off in triumph as method wins through once again.

Internal: Gets ready for and eats 6AM Thanksgiving feast complete with turkey, wine and pumpkin pies which raises that celebration to new levels of thankfulness.

Contradiction: Getting pulled into the whirlpool of We'll think about that tomorrow mindset which threatens to prevent us from doing the necessary tasks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Eight metro colleagues continue to participate in follow-up and initial calls after maneuvers.

Internal: Large House Church and ecclesiola continue with only three residents in House. Internal team structures include metro colleagues for two days and Week 11.

Contradiction: Winning a town rather than a set-up model. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Holds first Seattle TM, emceed by state insurance commissioner elect.

Internal: Vance collegium on NHDP breaks open new insights into possibilities for using HDP as catalyst for TM set up.

Monies come rolling in from around the globe. Brussels Nexus reports writing \$15,000 in proposal in Berlin, Hong Kong receives \$934 from Osaka, showing the program fund power of the GCF. In Canberra Nexus, the guardians launch major donor and in-kind drive for urgent housing in Oombulgurri and release freight, steel, and cement blocks. Nairobi hosts site visits from key funding prospects: Keny Freedom From Hunger and Barclay's Bank. Chicago Centrum received \$5,000 from Ford Foundation for El Bayad and 600 Kodak shares for the revolving loan fund, making plans for the upcoming Chicago blitz and circuiting drive before Christmas. The contradiction lies in the arena of using authorization interests to make funding breakthroughs.

Brooding on replication model for the seven provinces of Kenya occupied the energies of Nairobi Nexus, discovering that intern training in development illuminates how story creation brings significance to the task. Hong Kong, the collegiums on Humanness enabled reflection on present struggle and offered new ways of talking about depth human issues. TM logo and TM:Europe launching were put into the works in Brussels Nexus, launching a personnel interchange for continental TM recruitment. Chicago Nexus sent Phase I representatives to Inyan Gakpi HDP Cosonsult and held Academy evaluation. The contradiction lies in the arena of focusing training on the task.

Courses held around the globe this week included LENS for Tokyo businessmen, PLC in Taipei, RS-1 in Manila, and Consult methods in Hong Kong, a two-day construct that pulled corporate methods into powerful package that sets all three campaigns spinning. Recruitment for ITI Birmingham continues in Brussels Nexus, winning with relating TM to GSD. Acceleration is planned in Canberra Nexus, with 11 community meetings scheduled for coming quarter, with 3 on one week end, 4 on another. Nairobi Nexus announces first Village Meeting held in Sari, Kenya, has 400 participants; sends staff to Shantumbu Consult, receives word that everyone wants "another Kawangware" in their location. 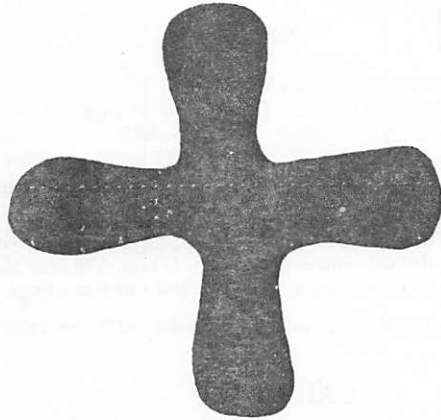

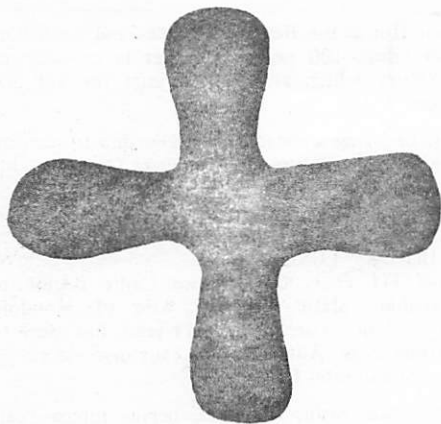
