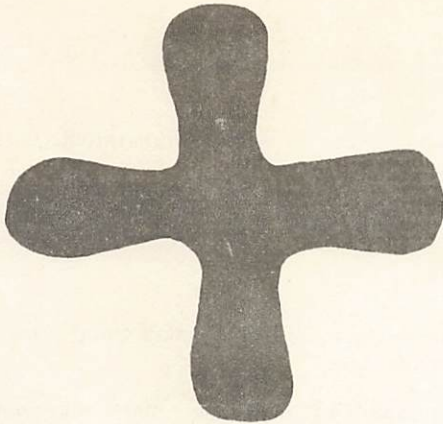


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: YMCA workday opens new possibility for future work; visit with Roman Catholic archbishop is authorization for church and laity. Parish walk confronts all with practical implications of PCE.

Internal: Stories of possibility for future excite guests of two families at House Church. Becomes publisher as first newsletter of new year is completed.

Contradiction: Sensing ourselves making headway in RS-I recruitment but feeling overwhelmed by possibility. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Area Council and workday on Isle of Dogs gives new motivity for social demonstration and PCE.

Internal: Visit to Stonehedge and Salisbury Cathedral occasions awe over the archaic. Sends out Fiona Willoch to ITI and McIntosh family to new assignment in Manchester. "New" old car joins House.

Contradiction: Turning lucidity about next quarter from "Let's Wait and See" attitude. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Receives Sandy Ariel to fill out year's assignment. Sends out priors to Brussels. ITI decor party is a big hit. Large House Church with a lot of Roman Catholics on Gaudet Sunday.

Internal: Another registers for ITI with full tuition. Trips to Wales and Southhampton excites those people with Global Community Forum proving again that to do one thing in complex society just keep mixing the punches.

Contradiction: Dealing with anxiety relative to pivotal events of week, threatens ITI final push. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: House planning council initiates organization into posts with an emphasis on metro circuits and cadres.

Internal: Begins quarter and greets new year with luscious meal at Five-Star Hotel.

Contradiction: Establishing intermediate checkpoints which will inform us of the state of the mission during coming quarter. (Wk. 1)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Quarter planning done in record time following social demonstration consult method, finish in one day.

Internal: Celebrates New Year by "traveling" the metros. Decor and food from four different nations enables traveling. Guests and House members present represent six nations, three continents.

Contradiction: Maintaining unified thrust in midst of great diversity of care that's demanded. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Full week of Advent hosting is highlighted by presence of local man neighbours for Tuesday evening hanging of greens.

Internal: First Italian sojourner gives new spirit and practical enablement to week of intensified guesting, Advent festivities, Global Social Demonstration research and study.

Contradiction: Forging from remainder of Quarter II an appropriate transition into new quarter and year. (Wk. 13)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Begins brooding on metro circuit activation as shift in House assignments makes troops available. Participates in "Retreat for National Concern" with national church leaders.

Internal: Experiences "gaze of history" reading report on spirit movement in Nigeria. Shifts to new time design as school term ends.

Contradiction: Building the objective picture to enable battleplanning for Quarters III and IV. (Wk. 12)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Nexus battleplanning for Quarter III creates miracles, proposals for all Centruns and new step-up plan for European Development system.

Internal: Centrum celebrates Phase IV (60 years) birthday of permeation colleague and guardian extraordinaire Madame Francis Vandeveld, with dinner and "this is your life timeline."

Contradiction: Discerning practical assignment and rhythms which will enable productive and intense quarter when the development task is clear. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: First week of ITI in-kind activity yields \$500 worth of food. After social demonstration training meeting seven guardians of five nationalities decide to attend Isle of Dogs Consult.

Internal: Joan Weeks, Jean Taylor, and Joseph Lapka arrive while half of House in Amsterdam for ITI decor weekend.

Contradiction: Seeing through to solidifying last ITI registrations while simultaneously beginning whole new battle. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Receives first in-kind materials for ITI:Amsterdam at Religious House: 15000 sheets paper from leading paper manufacturer in Netherlands; on same day Gestetner says yes to equipment loan through January.

Internal: Week II decor task force for Brussels Area meets in Amsterdam and completes major ITI decor pieces with in-kind materials in spirit-filled event.

Contradiction: Getting visas for Polish ITI participants, in only three and a half weeks. (Wk. 12)

FRANK-
FURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Sends out first issue of "The Waves of the Times," area bi-lingual quarterly newsletter, with a surprising wealth of movemental events reported.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT)

Internal: Launches Christmas discontinuity with festive House celebration, punctuated by visit of Speichers from Berlin and Jackie's parents (the Mackenzies), and closes with celebrative House Church with ITI sponsor, Dr. Phillippi from University of Heidelberg and family.

Contradiction: Discerning and giving form to the one thrust for the coming Quarter III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Breakthrough in course set-up as one congregation requests 100-man RS-I and another requests RS-I for theological study group from Martin Niemolier's old church in Dahiem. Strategic follow-up to Open House brings offer to do consult with city's fraternal workers.

Internal: Hosts eecumenical leaders from across Berlin in planning activities following Nairobi meeting. Receives Jackie Speicher's parents as Christmas guests. Preparation for Christmas guests provides incentive to clean some usually unseen corners.

Contradiction: Experiencing internally that top speed is needed for planning coming quarter in midst of world grinding to halt for Christmas. (Wk. 12)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: Grad uncovers Lusaka PLC site. Sends mailings to ITI hierarchy. Completes grad follow-up mailing.

Internal: Grids Lusaka to parishes and primal community. Travels to Rhodesian border on the Zambezi River. Gains new sense of struggle of the South.

Contradiction: Securing Kitwe PLC site, having registrations in hand. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI**GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI**

External: Experiences Miracle Day in Kawangware with over 350 participating all day along with 17 women at second Women's Tea which launches all programmes in training arena. Begins work on an infant curriculum which will be taught in home, with 21 women present.

Internal: Daily collegiums on Miracle Day turns whole House into contractors in one week's time. Celebration of Christmas with neighbourhood visits and beginning research for cultural heritage curriculum.

Contradiction: Creating images of people's expectations that coincide with what is actually being done or planned for. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: First phase of Area circuit ride begins with trip to Kisumu discovering key colleague with movement decor who offers site for cadre meetings. Whole House participated in in-kind activity, preparing for Kawangware's first miracle.

Internal: Study of Kawangware document rebuilds story for Area formulation.

Contradiction: Trusting that the Lord will provide for circuit rides. (Wk. 13)

BOMBAY**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY**

External: Maliwada Human Development Consult venue shifts to a scenic location five minutes walk from historical Ellora Caves.

Internal: First of the MHDP consultants arrives in Maliwada.

Contradiction: Being sign without being focus of movemental activity on the Sub-Continent. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Area Council with 17 around table, harvests regular metro cadre and regional treks, and promises strong network of spirit colleagues.

Internal: Delhi Metro colleagues Rev. Pillai and Rev. Stieeven Jacob are celebrants at House Church. Charles Innes begins his internship year -- third new intern family this quarter.

Contradiction: Using momentum created through planning at Area Council over next four weeks to enable ITI recruitment. (Wk. 11)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: House and movement participates 20 strong in Church of South India Parish Church Choir Festival. Colleague from Madras Region, from Brothers of Holy Cross, sojourns for two days after Area Council.

Internal: Spirit explosion occurs as ecclesiola breaks open prayer; visitors stay for Parish Choir Festival rehearsal. Recovers past area history and grads as old files are reorganized and oriented to future.

Contradiction: Imaging futurically coming weeks as anticipate discontinuity, Maliwada Human Development Consult, and assignment of House to Consult. (Wk. 12)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Three circuit rides out at same time with one reporting that community group decides they are Panchayat of village.

Internal: House self-support moves forward as Ravi George begins work with export firm.

Contradiction: Operating out of battleplan yet to be formed on other side of Maliwada Consult. (Wk. 13)

SINGAPORE

GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE

External: Launches authorization task force. Sends Donnelly to Area Meeting in Sydney, McCleskey to HRM in Kuala Lumpur. Zervigon returns from six-week trek in Area Sydney and reports on PCE consults in all six regions.

Internal: Emerging Generation produces Christmas musical play. Reading "Watership Down" at meals becomes our discontinuous event for this month.

Contradiction: Creating a missional vision that involves everyone. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Authorization calls and visit by colleague from Sarawak begin to clarify current relationship to authorization. Works on development proposal for Australia. Al Senturias visits on way home to Manila after World Council of Churches in Nairobi. Concludes Area Council with three-phase celebration, plenary reports launching ITI strategy and joyous House Church. Sends out Westre to Maliwada Consult and welcomes home Chia family from Academy.

Internal: Wayside Inn bulges at seams as many colleagues from other Houses in Area join us for Christmas discontinuity and enjoy urban gifts of Singapore. Friday night discontinuity features "Great Gatsby" and peanut butter sandwiches. Saturday work party features great victory over "the Jungle" (our yard) in preparation for Area Council.

Contradiction: Creating effective troop configuration to continue intensive authorization work. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Attends December Area Council in Singapore, highlighted by global reporters Bernard Knutsen (Washington) and Andrew Knutsen (Chicago) Santa Claus, (Edmonton); and movie "The Day of the Jackal."

Internal: Sends families out for Christmas across Southeast Asia to Bangkok, Penang, Singapore, Taiping, Kelang.

Contradiction: Hesitating over divergent views of future PCE strategy in Malaysia when colleagues are ready to go.. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Correspondence begins to firm up plan for 5-day consult in Solo (Central Java) for social workers, clergy and lay leadership. Reaffirms global network with arrival of expected Australian priest.

Internal: Studying again Knox paper, "The Event and The Story" deeply addresses all. Mood surges high with purchase of Christmas tree and Saturday night decorating party.

Contradiction: Searching for new House facility in midst of mood of urgency and frustration. (Wk. 12)

HONG KONG GLOBAL CENTRUM HONG KONG

External: Holds meeting with region priors of Area Hong Kong to implement council decisions. Receives 20,000 pesos from San Miguel Corp., in Cebu. Bacolod LENS yields \$1,126 U.S.A. dollars, course fee. Receives responses to Advent grassroots mailing.

Internal: Celebrates family Christmas party on Tuesday night, turkey and trimmings Christmas day, hosts Kitty Cole and children from Japan and Mrs. Naske of India. Another new low temperature (-32 C) in Hong Kong while hosting Filipino colleagues. Holds Quarter III battleplanning at Salesian retreat center.

Contradiction: Completing battleplanning, designing new constructs and launching new quarter in midst of discontinuous season. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Response to Advent mailing begins. Expands in-house troops out doing exciting PIC recruiting as well as intensified PCE work.

Internal: Sends out two Methodist teachers from India who spent Christmas with us and sends out colleague Victor Lui to visit family in the Mainland. Centrum joins us in bringing in New Year. Finishes station realignment and battleplanning.

Contradiction: Swirling several programs (PCE, LENS, PLC, RS-I, Development, etc.), raises question "what is one spirit thrust to pull it into focus." (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: LENS grad leads metro cadre through bilingual PCE analysis and problemat workshop, creating strong sense of being one movement.

Internal: Metro cadre solves transportation problem by giving House blue bicycle for Christmas.

Contradiction: Being catalytic, especially in development work. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Rev. Mendoza and George Packard deliver Christmas messages to Fatima Church, Tim Dissmeyer to United Methodist Church. Celebrates conclusion of FAEC (First Asian Ecumenical Congress). Establishes key contacts and strengthens relationship with parish Misa de Gallo Preaching assignments and services.

Internal: Priors arrive from Hong Kong. Al Senturias is home from Nairobi and House visits. Explodes Christmas feelings with Norma's birthday celebration. Quimbys host Union Carbide party and open house. Receives in-kind donations from sponsors through House staff.

Contradiction: Finding discontinuity that unites for Week 12 while forces are divided and Advent cards need to be mailed. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Visits by Fr. Charles Morrissey to Roman Catholic grads elicits support for ITI: Taipei.

Internal: Great week of planning ends with House Church with six guests; greet sojourner Ann Hu, daughter of Peter, and new intern Mary Wu.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum build by solid battleplanning through nitty gritty implementation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Minischool teachers begin Quarter III planning and corporate curriculum building full-time during vacation. Houses celebrates Christmas mass with Mactan community. Guild Miracle Community Christmas Singing Festival involves all five Christian denominations on Mactan. Seven hundred plus seated with business and government; prisoners and city dump truck help pull it off. Large grant from major foundation now supports Mactan.

Internal: Sends Ledi tropical fish shipment to man in Hong Kong who sells them at train station and may be regular buyer. House RS-I pedagogy prepares/reveals all ready to teach. Quarter III planning begins with three-day stretch non-stop of region, PCE parish and internal life structures; end of year/quarter/Christmas celebration planning breeds excitement.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU)

Contradiction: Creating images of next quarter with pressure of whole next year's demands. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Plans with ITI grad for annual Episcopal-Philippine Independent Church Youth Conference. Sends out prior couple to Area Priors' Council in Hong Kong. In midst of House hunting, local realtor reports on activities at New York House she visited on recent trip to U.S.A.

Internal: Anticipation mounts for coming Christmas season as House celebrates Sta. Lucia Day and youth creates Christmas star lantern. In midst of quarter evaluation, number of miracles performed this quarter impacts us. ITI Grad Fr. Cunanan and Sr. Maria visit and stay for evening prayers.

Contradiction: Battleplanning for future in midst of looming key practical incertitudes. (Wk. 12)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Visit by Area prior results in decision of General Secretary of Caritas Japan to visit Jeju and stop at Global Centrum:Chicago during visit to United States in near future.

Internal: Area prior's report on state of Movement, and proposal of possible House location near project PCE area, bring mission into sharper focus.

Contradiction: Internalizing close personal relationships, the key to effective corporate action in Japan, thus releasing turn to world. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Second village consultation (70) is covered by MBC TV. Holds ladies meeting (38), credit union meeting (105); visits Archbishop and Governor Lee to report on Japan fund-raising; Jeju YWCA establishes "sister" relationship with Kwangyung.

Internal: Welcomes Area prior Kang, Jeju guildswoman Teresa Kim and Seoul House members for visits.

Contradiction: Moving from programatic thinking to miracle thinking in context of four-year plan and present ambiguities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Climaxes preparation for Area Council by sending Kang Byoung Hoon, Harry and Mary Ann Wainwright to Osaka for council. Receives ICA registration document from Chicago. Hears report of Kwangyung consensus meeting, Area Prior's Council, Area Development trek with four teams.

Internal: Sends Han Sang Shin to Kwangyung to work project for six weeks. House symbolizes emphasis on village with visit to Suwon Model Village. Finishes Seoul Region indicative battleplan for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Creating story to allow us to mobilize both business and church leaders to financially support Global Social Demonstration. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Extends personal invitations to all Guardian prospects for upcoming Guardians' meeting in Jeju. Makes appointments with two key Kyushu corporations for LENS marketing. Region participates in PSU on movement directions during New Year holidays in Osaka. Eight week primal community training is ready to begin next week with decision of metro colleagues to join House in Thursday night research.

Internal: Christmas Odyssey with entire House and regional colleagues is deeply reflective event. Prayer particularly takes on new significance in light of primal community. Joins with rest of nation in celebrating New Year.

Contradiction: Getting priorities of primal community and metro circuits into focus with one another and moving on grassroots in development. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Community, galaxy and metro cadres enable Area Priors' Council with food, furniture and

enablement.

Internal: Area Priors' Council fills with six Houses present and Area-wide consensus — "We can do PCE" and plans to hold next APC in Kwang yung following Kwangyung report, "We're moving at speed of light".

Contradiction: Maintaining cruciality of development for PCE, metro circuits and Global Social Demonstration. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Ends December with program budget raised by development for first time.

Internal: Reflects on global celebrations as House participates in Christmas parties and Japanese Bonenkai (Forget the past!).

Contradiction: Doing development that builds region and at same time fulfills immediate demands for new signs that are coming into being. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Regional Council provides time for reflection that serves to weld movement together with fresh sense of resolve and purpose.

Internal: Welcomes Grace Umbagai from International Training Program.

Contradiction: Waiting actively during Advent when planning for January is yet to be conceived. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Receives 15th Rotary Club speaking invitation. Work begins in preparation for Christmas open house celebration. Pharmacist colleague announces needed in-kind drugs ready for Oombulgurri.

Internal: Celebrates four House birthdays including Jago's 21st, with night out in Chinese restaurant. Celebrates with colleagues send out of Glenys and Gabriel to Oombulgurri for school holidays. Welcomes Erica and Kathleen Rees who arrive to spend Christmas with parents. Sends Zervigon to Singapore and Richmond to Oombulgurri following month of development.

Contradiction: Letting missional discontinuity care for us over against 'holiday' mindset. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Parap Fannie Bay hosts week-long series of events "Christmas in New Darwin Week" with 5,000 people and 100 organizations taking part and city mayor opening proceedings.

Internal: David returns from Area Council and 10,000 kilometer five-week regional trek.

Contradiction: Allowing emergence of guild core from excited colleagues of festival coordinating task force to see themselves as responsible for CMA, PCE and Oombulgurri. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Oombulgurri School holds break-up celebration for school holidays with reports and presentations. Seven piglets are born, more on way causes rapid extension of pig yards. Begins preparations for Christmas with church painting. Receives gift of \$3,000 from Myer Foundation.

Internal: Transforms House in weekend and week of renovations, painting, and decor. Ray Richmond returns from development and gives fantastic report on in-kind items and visits for Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Dramatizing events that will symbolize to everybody that we are moving the major contradictions. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Twenty-two colleagues participate in PCE consult, resulting in decision to do both urban and rural parishes simultaneously. Regional colleagues conduct speaking engagements for Oombulgurri in Adelaide, Pt. Pirie. Donor circuits break open inner city contacts.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE)

Internal: Quarter evaluation reveals that over 70 colleagues have been actively engaged in missional doings during Quarter II. PCE consult exchangee, Pom Ligtermoet, sojourns for a week en route to Area Council.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on breakthrough of regional colleagues into critical arenas of internship and regional leadership. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: House Youth accompanies Telfords to Swan Hill Rotary speaking engagement on way back from Area Council. Have \$1,000 in hand from Colac Rotary!

Internal: Christmas sojourn model taking concrete form. House Youth wins \$50 scholarship and all Emerging Generation are promoted!

Contradiction: Rounding off year while constructing practical models for external and internal life for Quarter III. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Research continues on apprenticeship training for Oombulgurri with Department of Labour and Immigration. Visit to Department of Aboriginal Affairs by Betty Gowers and Bob Lingafelter from Oombulgurri. Grace Umbagai has great report time with Department of Education on her ITP in North America.

Internal: Goes to Sydney for Area Priors' Council; celebrates end of school year; sends out Ann Pether to Maliwada Consult in India; Dines with key cadre prospects; catches up on area development recording; Liz Banks prepares Maliwada Consult Journey.

Contradiction: Finding way to catalyze formation of cadre and hold present government and development work. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Four regional colleagues travel to Area Council and celebration of Yallop wedding.

Internal: Celebrations abound with covenanting of marriage of Anne Edwards and Robert Yallop, and arrival of the Roger Ross family.

Contradiction: Clarifying corporate screens out of which decisions are made. (Wk. 13)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO**

External: Mariculture demonstration arena lights up with arrivals of Gene Buck family; seaweed is planted and samples are sent for appraisal. Now to get acquainted with coconut crabs!

Internal: Tree trimming and games mark preparation for Christmas as entire community keeps itself busy practicing for what promises to be another 14-hour Christmas pageant on Christmas Day at The Memorial Church of the Marshall Islands.

Contradiction: Tying down the big loose ends as we turn full face toward new year. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: With prospect of TM '76 in Pago, parish engagement, new Religious House and action excites old cadre and makes TM '76 authorization in Pago seem possible. Secures first secular yes to LENS in Fiji. Support comes from Roman Catholic Bishop Mataka, Anglican Bishop Bryce, Methodist Conference President Tuilovoni and President of Council of Churches in Fiji for Religious House: Suva.

Internal: Christmas prep begins with House and guests making decorations for Mango Christmas tree. Receives gift from customs official, Richard Mariner. Religious House: Apia moves into new house in Taufusi 5. Gratefully receives first Samoan intern into The Order: Ecumenical, Hana Aloese. Whole house treks to big island of Savaii for discontinuity.

Contradiction: Trying to shift into high while the vehicle of history is already going 90 mph. (Wk. 1)

SAN FRANCISCO RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Hears first-hand report on movement in Singapore by colleague, James Chia, on his way to Singapore from Quarter II Academy.

Internal: Dean Ellis receives an "oscar" for "Hardest Worker of the Year" at Hyatt Regency Hotel.

Contradiction: Holding tension between holiday celebrations of '75 and Town Meeting '76 planning. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Local church board votes to participate in Human Resurgence Mission, bringing commitments to four congregations, with four others actively considering.

Internal: Christmas discontinuity renews our spirits, with an unscheduled Christmas eve journey to pick up colleagues with crippled car adding to excitement.

Contradiction: Standing in midst of looming first month of New Year as unprecedented possibility. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Metro makes volitional response to the call for 5000, with declaration of war for Town Meeting '76 and set-up of three Nevada troika lunches.

Internal: House assigns itself to Guild New Year's Eve celebration and regional celebration. Guild phones Darwin, Australia, and discusses interchange and Global Community Forum.

Contradiction: Realigning of troops and efforts to win 5000. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Jaycees convention yields new sponsor in new town and collegueship of state Jaycees.

Contradiction: Starting at 60 mph. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Meeting with actor Andy Griffith produces TM '76 endorsement and may open doors to other contacts and funding. Nine House and metro journey to San Francisco to participate in fantastic guardian celebration.

Internal: House attends lecture by Palos Soleri who presents his dream for a new human community. Opposing panelist leaves audience with the question: if you don't agree with his concepts and timelines, what are yours?

Contradiction: Building a battleplan with depth and fresh new tactics that holds us on course in midst of ever changing situation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Initiates battleplanning 5000 by creating tactical system for doing 216 in Phoenix Region.

Internal: Celebrates completed life of Robert Campbell in midst of celebration of the New Year and sending out to Miami Region of the Sandra Cordes family.

Contradiction: Creating systematic tactical operation to avoid burial under the avalanche. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Patient stone-turning uncovers key individuals in Idaho Falls, Midvale, and Provo, UT. Return to Burley finds people willing to write endorsement letters and make TM '76 calls in other towns.

Internal: Two requests to sojourn at coming of new year by a phase three couple and two phase one youth.

Contradiction: Creating new models for external mission, internal life and single-mindedness as Advent, Christmas, New Years confront us. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Two on Town Meeting '76 circuits bag two Town Meetings in northern Wyoming and central Montana.

Internal: Home-made Christmas decorations and tree allows Christmas decorating as Guild.

Contradiction: Doing what is needed in face of quarter end and celebrative season. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Three requests arrive in mail during Christmas week for TM'76 set-up meetings.

Internal: Movement New Year's Eve celebration happens despite all day snowfall. Claims promises for the year of TM '76.

Contradiction: Experiencing breakloose of TM '76 as being caught inefficiently organized with ineffective response to new demands. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Pre-sponsorship meetings in Winner, Pierre, Edgemont, and Belle Fourche. Forty residents attend Winner meeting. Meetings cover three polises and two power parishes.

Internal: House goes Christmas caroling at homes of metro cadre members. Basil attends Priors' Council in Chicago. Decorates Christmas tree with all trimmings made by House.

Contradiction: Preparing for Town Meeting training session in midst of discontinuity. (Wk. 12)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Primal Community (parish) and Metro colleagues join in celebrating "the coming of the 5000" on New Year's Eve.

Internal: House income and outreach increased in new traveling job which covers one circuit! Order youth home for Christmas are fun and helpful "guests."

Contradiction: Tusting that doing Town Meeting will hit primary contradiction in community. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: House, colleagues and a neighbor join in three days of scrounging to create a house and a great New Year's kickoff with 14 present.

Internal: House members trickle into Vancouver; Bruce Miller from Winnipeg starts his intern year.

Contradiction: Deciding where avalanches will fall on this new mountain of care. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Power of corporateness illuminates corporate sermon writing in clergy collegium and Advent carols written in metro ecclesiola.

Internal: In one great night House receives gift of tape deck and painting from colleague. Sends out Gene Buck family to Majuro. Writes Christmas newsletter and celebrates with hanging of the greens and egg nog.

Contradiction: Capturing corporate thrust in seasonal anticipation, while in combat with spirit demons and overwhelming task. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Global Order New Year's celebration gives Global Community Forum new face for colleagues present.

Internal: Preparation for Global Order celebration of New Year enables House to review Council's decision about our common thrust.

Contradiction: Gearing colleagues into GCF planning, calling, while adequate structures are yet to be created for mobilization. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Four phases participate in two events: HRM-Christian Resurgence Day with 120 people and also New St. Andrews Place Health Action Meeting with largest attendance at a meeting in community.

Internal: Children decorate House tree for Christmas. Kathleen Smilianov returns from Academy. Shift in time schedule symbolizes ending of quarter.

Contradiction: Dealing with whirlwind of activities that takes our breath away as the future is wildly blowing in our faces. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Oak Forest TM '76 Steering Committee swells to 30, launches five major promotion/attendance tactics featuring a personal letter to 150 business and civic leaders from Houston's No. One public citizen, a resident of community.

Internal: House and metro see "Cuckoo's Nest"; New Year's Eve celebration features 12 polises; two Oakley teenagers arrive from India for extended visit; sends St. Clairs to Chicago.

Contradiction: Learning how to shorten TM '76 set-up timeline in order to enable them to happen in February. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: New Year's Eve party brings together two metro cadres and guardians.

Internal: Quarter II evaluation is transformed into poem "Second Quarter String."

Contradiction: Involving metro cadres in planning for Bi-Metro Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Traditional Movement New Year's Eve celebration symbolizes putting everyone "On the Road" to do 76 Town Meeting 76's—by means of circuit stories, circuit food and drink (border buttermilk), and dance.

Internal: Traditional and non-traditional battleplanning session breaks loose new circuit system with teams of two assigned to every piece of our geography and new weekly debriefing and strategy session which replaces "metro cadre" meeting.

Contradiction: Getting on top of "molasses response" to Town Meeting—sweet and slow. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: House and guardians attend Delta Sigma Theta Sorority ball at Skirvin Hotel Ballroom on New Year's Eve. Find ourselves in midst of community event with tactic of attaining local authorization boosted. Appropriates event as victory celebration of the 5000.

Internal: During battleplanning and New Year feast of black-eye peas (eyes into the future), studies the 5000 Document to inform all of Continental strategy for local implementation.

Contradiction: Needing to quickly set up effective structures to enable task to be actualized—or—how to pack many possibilities into one snowball. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: PCE initiates TM '76 in East Dallas and creates an Inter-Agency Directory. Metro helps to fund participant to ITI:Caracas. Charles Bush, Morton and Clark activate first official cadre meeting in Athens, Texas.

Internal: Joyously anticipates new family for House. Hosts ecclesiola visitors who are intrigued with Order life and come for a closer sniff. New in-kind office equipment greatly ups efficiency and productivity; key sign is new Advent Song Book.

Contradiction: Creating boot camp readiness and discipline needed for every situation. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Calls on two key women in Tulsa open door little wider for Tulsa Town Meeting '76.

Internal: Snowball in decor possibility at Priors' Council impacts House.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA)

Contradiction: Stopping for discontinuity when jobs and demands go on. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Rotary Club in Biloxi calls, wanting to sponsor Town Meeting, and primary sponsor decisions made in New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and Shreveport. First miracle done in Uptown 5 (a mini-park around bus stop at key corner, in parish) generates excitement, amazement, and much conversation. Dan Isherwood reports on Kawangware; Roger Guissinger finishes paperwork for Maliwada; and two more guardians announce their intentions to attend consults. PCC sees 28 around table.

Internal: Completes House renovation on first floor as worship room is done, complete with new records. Miracle in parish deeply impacts all.

Contradiction: Finding necessary troops to shepherd new breaklooses and requests coming in. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS,

External: Receives endorsement letter for TM '76 from County Judge, who is also head of Bicentennial Commission of a mid-Tennessee county.

Internal: Sends out Gibsons to Priors Council in Chicago. Purchases new car with insurance money and in-kind gift. Finishes new data system.

Contradiction: Getting as much missional work accomplished now, before January explosion occurs, when everyone really wants to get ready for Christmas. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Bi-regional Council (Atlanta/Miami) in Jacksonville occasions quarter reflection on PCE, GCF and Development. Places first signal bus-stop bench by East Lake Guild (all materials in-kind). Representatives from Monroe, GA (Walton County Bicentennial Commission) with 22 organizations from three towns on commission ask if we can handle 400 at their upcoming TM '76.

Internal: Zan White presents new House possibility at collegium and continues research. Bud Ames (Chicago) in town for veterinary conference, visits PCE.

Contradiction: Handling the fact that Christmas takes up a lot of people's minds for a long time for a one-day holiday. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: State Jaycees mail out 400 Town Meeting brochures, and new officers of Eastern Management Council confirms co-sponsorship of Charlotte Town Meeting.

Internal: Dines at parish node owned by Greek, who re-caps history of area for us; parents accompany five-year-old daughter to Christmas party at school in parish.

Contradiction: Imaging movement methods as life dynamics rather than as programs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Spends one day going through one of stakes in parish block by block. Participates in neighborhood planning.

Internal: Decors front stairwell. Sends priors to council.

Contradiction: Doing 143 Town Meetings in 25 weeks. (Wk. 12)

CHICAGO GLOBAL CENTRUM CHICAGO

External: Cross-centrum task force finishes AID proposal that agency wants to use as model for all program grant documents. Uptown plans Quarter III tactics from year-long battleplanning highlighted with plans for a Bicentennial Ball in February and TM '76 in March.

Internal: Sends out John Roddas and Heather Brune to Houston, Stewart Stowells to Amarillo, Jaime Vergaras to Saskatoon, Jim Kelly to Charlotte, and David Dunns to Dallas. Welcomes Bob St. Clairs from Houston. Recreates space in congregations and in Centrum hub.

Contradiction: Allowing one trip to accomplish what was planned for two or three. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Holds community consult with 25 colleagues. Applies for State Grant for 60 Town Meetings set; learns grant deadline is postponed.

Internal: Experiences great House tree trimming celebration.

Contradiction: Maintaining the necessary focus on both common life and common task in midst of feeling that symbolic life has broken down. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Holds New Year's Eve celebration with conversation on future of major industries and the C.P.O. in Wichita.

Internal: Works on TM '76 strategy, builds four-year metro circuit projection resulting in new decor to hold all before global mission.

Contradiction: Bouncing all the balls toward getting the mission done. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: New Year's Eve is grand occasion in midst of relaxed, collegial atmosphere. Receives Iowa State Jaycees presentation with enthusiasm that provides access to four networks with which to cover Iowa with TM '76.

Internal: In-kind gift of 56 cases of napkins provides inroads to new and larger facility across street.

Contradiction: Equipping rest of House for TM '76 presentations. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Uses TM methods to reflect on Quarter II and discern challenges, creates proposals for Quarter III. Spends four collegiums on eight week church training mission.

Internal: Welcomes Valerie Mosley for holidays. Quarter celebration leaves House spinning after "Rollerball".

Contradiction: Deciding to operate with small number of troops knowing that number is not contradiction. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Town Meeting '76 in Crookston is great success and have experimented successfully with using local workshop leaders. New Rockford, N.D. TM scheduled, first snowflake falls with St. Joseph calling in for TM. Whittier Community Directory printed. Groups homes meet and discuss new role in community.

Internal: Ecclesiola is discontinuous as House and metro go to see "Hellzapoppin", 1930's forerunner to LaughIn.

Contradiction: Using time and space in midst of awareness that our time design does not meet missional needs and space eats us up. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Receives \$100 for Clinton TM '76. Breaks open four major networks in Iowa for TM '76 set-up. Writes 14 points 'missional consideration for winter quarter'. Develops three meeting consult plan for TM '76 set-up.

Internal: Receives Mary Lou Jenks and children from Rochester House to complete intern year in St. Louis. Celebrates 1976 with metro colleagues. Finishes House rubrics for winter quarter. Guilder gets raise effective January 1.

Contradiction: Experiencing Quarter III as off and running before it's officially begun. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Colleague who is TM '76 coordinator calls to say that after his community gets going on TM '76, he is going on the road to tell others.

Internal: Polishes up on latest Town Meeting details with study of 5000 document.

Contradiction: Discovering how to organize tools that we already have. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Hosts 30 for House Church as House returns from Christmas discontinuity, including priors from Pittsburgh, Don and Diane Francis.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 5000 kernels of popcorn enables internalization of TM.

Contradiction: Spotting heathen community and knowing when to shake dust off its feet. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Metro celebrates dawning of New Year at glittering event symbolizing eight global social demonstration projects while second metro colleague (Nancy Eggert) celebrates it in direct involvement in Maliwada Consult.

Internal: Celebrates return from discontinuity by seeing "The Man Who Would Be King" and getting new insights on life as one big adventure.

Contradiction: Building 5000 snowflake snowball in midst of 1000 snowflake mindset (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Key secular guardian attends Odyssey.

Internal: Care structure of Academy, GRA, and TM '76 cassette tapes enable TM '76 and permeation trekers as each travels more than 3,000 miles per month.

Contradiction: Doing spirit exercises which will allow us to be humiliated, weak, resent filled, suffering ones we already are as dark night intrudes afresh. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Expands metro Town Meeting back-up system with coordinating staff of five to handle swirl of activity needed to pull off 20 Town Meetings for winter.

Internal: Celebrative atmosphere whirling, as eight-foot Christmas tree is decorated, a Jeju night, with goldfish in a rock garden, and Emerging Generation spearheading creche scene and gifts creation.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves waiting for holidays end to build the implementation models, we seek hiding places in old secure models of family discontinuity with the overwhelming reality of 20 Town Meetings for winter quarter along with everything else. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Sends TM circuit to Mt. Pleasant and sets date for steering committee. University 13 blitz nets one.

Internal: Tree decorating celebration expands to include two at-cost trees. Sojourner, Michael Price, and one more swing shift job are a boon to us.

Contradiction: Shifting from second gear to overdrive sustaining ongoing mission in midst of necessary discontinuity. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Three circuits daily steadily pushing for dates for 17 Town Meetings before 1976 begins - "17 for 76". Day II participation allows six teams "on the road" in evenings to secure dates and committees.

Internal: Gives TM presentation to Ohio East Conference of Methodist Church at request of Bicentennial Committee and Bishop. Study of "Profound Vocation" paper for interim ecclesiola with eight guests is profound experience for all and enables vocational journey. Regional Council with 60 produces practical

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND)

products for TM and spirit enablement for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Broadening base of troop commitment with concrete journey and using clear need effectively. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Board of a major community organization and one of largest Churches says yes to sponsoring Town Meeting '76 in Hamilton Heights community of Harlem.

Internal: Receives Yun Man Wu from Seoul, Korea as well as Gini Terri, old-time colleague just returned from Academy, as sojourners.

Contradiction: Glimpsing really winning in midst of anxiety of "holding back". (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: First miracle in new parish, a gridding PSU, uncovers grateful colleagues who had been waiting for us for four years.

Internal: Justin Morrill on area trek participates in PSU and highlights event of last four years for those gathered for feast and tree lighting celebration.

Contradiction: Creating and telling the story that holds global vision in midst of new push and excitement in local parish. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Publishes three-color Town Meeting report with in-kind printing! Rochester Metro Council re-defines roles and areas of engagement.

Internal: Festive mood prevails in midst of intensified missional thrust, culminating in evening of House symbolic gift exchange.

Contradiction: Defining critical tasks relative to external mission so we do not get lost in midst of world's luring celebration. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: New Year's Eve effectively launches and grounds 5000 in metro cadre colleagues, and Emerging Generation celebrates with "Ghost of 5000 Town Meetings."

Internal: Acquisition of new filing cabinet offers long-needed opportunity to redo filing system. Discontinuity sees House exploring turf, doing "family" circuits.

Contradiction: Shifting contextual gears to mobilize from knowing to doing. (Wk. 1)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

Internal: Space transformation for celebration features circuits, center piano bar shaped like DC grid, topped with capitol dome made from umbrella and foil. Social demonstration buffet is impactful reminder.

Contradiction: Desiring to remain in limited context of discontinuity with memory of overwhelming report from Priors Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Town Meeting network breaks loose with Kiwanis in three states, Baltimore city-wide community relations department, international treasurer of Lions Club and ministerial associations throughout bi-metro.

Internal: Birth of Christanna Cora Dessie Betonte, 3900 grams, to Anthony and Hildegard Betonte on December 7. Hosts Moffetts with Don reporting on Guardians Meeting and Mary Warren reporting on

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE)

Kawangware Consult, World Council of Churches and LENS in Nigeria and Oxford, England.

Contradiction: Rebuilding contexts of colleagues and former contacts that allows them to assume responsibility for present mission. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Announcement of proposed TM date for North Philadelphia comes in midst of New Year's Eve party. Business and agency offices gear up facilities for mailing letter of invitation to 750 neighborhood leaders for citywide Philadelphia Town Meeting.

Internal: Wayside Inn dynamic flourishes during discontinuity with guests from New York City, India, Cincinnati, Chicago, Denver, Boston, Hartford, and Boulder.

Contradiction: Recruiting for battleplanning new year, making it as significant for regional colleagues as celebrating old year at New Year's Eve party. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Metro colleagues assume ICA consultant roles with sponsorship committees.

Internal: Returns from discontinuity, tribal resettlement to make way for coming additions and guests galore all swirl us to great regional New Year's celebration.

Contradiction: Enabling metro colleagues to see importance of planning for the whole bi-metro, not just one micro. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Series of TM '76 miracles: Riverhead Town Board unanimously votes to co-sponsor TM '76 (their first unanimous vote on anything), Amityville Community Council calls us to come talk about Town Meeting, and forty show up at first steering committee meeting in Hempstead.

Internal: Regional Odyssey, with a substantially modified format, is significant event in its emphasis on the corporate. Dinner each evening is "at the back door" as all troops are out for Day II assignments.

Contradiction: Meshing TM '76 and Primal Community Experiment in the implementation of tactics for each. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Metro battleplanning procedures manual and prep allows completion of battleplanning in one day.

Internal: New Year's Eve is signal family celebration (16 months-88 years). Skits star Roman Catholic priest. Guardians give Global Social Demonstration reports at regional House Church.

Contradiction: Engaging colleagues adequately in TM '76 without undermining clergy role. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: At tri-metro battleplanning, colleagues from remote metros bear witness to metro ecclesiola as key care structure. Global social Demonstration comes to Boston region through spins and pictures from Jeju, Kawangware and Bangladesh by Jeff Coolidge, Harry Bliss and Jake and Martha Jacoby that reveals suffering and hope of the world.

Internal: Internal life reflection and planning rehearses external timeline for next year. Beefs up structures to enable and sustain.

Contradiction: Believing that action will remove the doubt that theory cannot solve. (Wk. 1)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: PSU on Habitation for Frontenac Community mixes local people and experts.

Internal: Advent ecclesiola welcomes new francophone colleagues.

Contradiction: Getting hold of depth corporate reflection on particular aspects of mission in midst of scattered mode of engagement permitting broadening collegial relationship. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Receives unsolicited phone calls asking when community forums are happening.

Internal: Discontinuity prepares all for unknown next quarter.

Contradiction: Recreating over-all context with colleagues. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Christmas gift to parish is leaflet co-sponsored by Knights of Columbus (Chevalier de Colombe) and Recreation Department. Nine youth, from church in Cardinal, at house for "Day in Ottawa".

Internal: Visits from Lepage and Woodbury extended family promises benefits for other Houses.

Contradiction: Discerning what the one thrust of House will be. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Week of recruitment intensification with over 50 visits made and 150 tactics employed nets several strong possibilities and a registration. Development receives \$600 check from La India raised from staff and Father Marcell Rainville returns from U.S.A. on vacation with \$1000 from churches he preached in about ITI which brings weekly development total to \$2,000.

Internal: Sr. Ruth Palmer (Corpus Christi Carmelite from Trinidad and 1975 ITI grad) begins sojourn over Christmas season.

Contradiction: Keeping recruitment "yesses" in midst of ITI practices looming as massive mountain coming in. (Wk. 1)

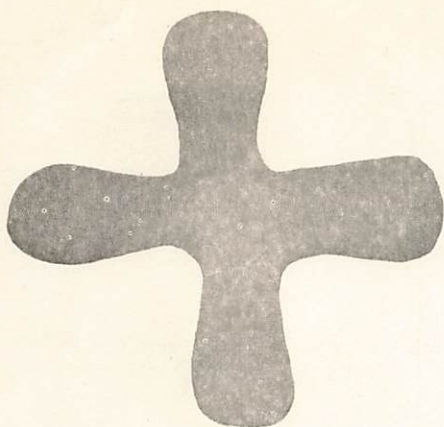

Hong Kong discerns that all treks, consults and programs need to coordinate and mesh in order to effectively use troop resources. Programs include Town Meetings in New Providence and New York City and LENS in Manchester. The contradiction lies in the arena of holding the tension between global assignment demands and local demands upon the staff.

Chicago reports printing and distributing ecclesiola materials with the new machinery that collates, stitches and folds documents up to 96 pages. Hong Kong completes stipends for all Houses as well as reimbursements of medical, priors councils, and resettlement expenses. The contradiction lies in the arena of discovering manpower and extent of distribution for local impact.

External: Contacts 20 networks with very positive results. Decides to focus on Regional 10 Demonstration TM '76s and Phoenix 10 called for by Vice-mayor.

Internal: Global and mystery impact all with Area priors trek, Prayer Room creation, Campbell Memorial service, and gaining Chief Joseph on meditative Council.

Contradiction: Gaining clarity on how and who to add to new clarity on what, when, where. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Area trek and return of Overalls from Maliwada catalyzes accelerated engagement in mission; two luncheons with community leaders prove effective to solidify community decision about TM '76. Midvale and Salt Lake City mayors attend luncheons.

Internal: Welcomes Colleen and Vic Smith as sojourners. Great celebrative House Church of 30 includes six first time participants and bulges the walls.

Contradiction: Getting everyone on the 5000 train. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Sends newsletter to two bi-metros (all TM '76 contacts, actual and potential). Billings TM '76 swings into high gear!

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS)

Internal: Sets up office. Consenses on quarter's internal life structures in record time. Views Chief Joseph "I will Fight No Mare Forever" as total House.

Contradiction: Structuring teams to utilize both symbolic and actual care. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Saturday TM '76 PSU gathers colleagues from two metros to build battleplan of snowballing 5000; circuits expands to 22.

Internal: Moves into Epiphany by dealing with issues of decor and worship space. Sojourners plug into preparation for Denver metropolitan area blitz.

Contradiction: Dealing with troops sitting in stadium waiting to be beckoned to arena. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Pre-sponsorship meetings in Winner, Pierre, Edgemont, and Belle Fourche. Forty residents attend Winner meeting. Meetings cover three polises and two power parishes.

Internal: House goes Christmas caroling at homes of metro cadre members. Basil attends Priors' Council in Chicago. Decorates Christmas tree with all trimmings made by House.

Contradiction: Preparing for Town Meeting training session in midst of discontinuity. (Wk. 12)

EDMONTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Drayton Valley is firm for CFC on their 19th anniversary Janaury 31. Workshop leaders in training as intensive publicity begins.

Internal: Week II battleplanning creates practical operating systems and charts which receive added impetus from Ken Tickner, beginning his sojourn and Rory Gowers arriving from Chicago Centrum.

Contradiction: Overcoming post battleplanning sense of accomplishment which lends itself to "taking your ease." (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Begins visitations of friends and colleagues. Receives metro cadre support in re-gridding region, doing quarter planning. Receives generous help in remodeling and supplying House.

Internal: Colleagues join House for work and celebration regularly. Robert Allen enters new school and Brian Griffith turns out to be Canadian citizen.

Contradiction: Having only two quarters to build strong sign of power of Community Forum while entering new pool calling for swan dive, not belly flop. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Works on coordinating committee for TM '76. Promises 12 TM '76s in Anchorage some of which will be in high schools and elementary schools.

Internal: Return of John Poole and Buck family to Anchorage overwhelms all with global network as six-year old Lys Buck sings in Marshalese.

Contradiction: Focusing troops and efforts in midst of irrational, rational and rhythm of circuits. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Global Order New Year's celebration gives Global Community Forum new face for colleagues present.

Internal: Preparation for Global Order celebration of New Year enables House to review Council's decision about our common thrust.

Contradiction: Gearing colleagues into GCF planning, calling, while adequate structures are yet to be created for mobilization. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Week II battleplan creates 26-week timeline enabling initial primal community experiment. Meeting of Winnipeg Metro Cadre and CFC circuits begins for new quarter. Schedules sponsors committee meeting in Virden.

Internal: New Year's internal life battleplan begins and Anja Bos' report on Holland, overview of Kawangware at ecclesiola, along with arrival of new priors, initiate quarter's activities. First in-kind donation comes in as bread.

Contradiction: Remaining steadfast to diversified tasks while sorting out relationships between metro cadre and PCE. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Learning how to shorten TM '76 set-up timeline in order to enable them to happen in February. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: New Year's Eve party brings together two metro cadres and guardians.

Internal: Quarter II evaluation is transformed into poem "Second Quarter String."

Contradiction: Involving metro cadres in planning for Bi-Metro Council. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: San Antonio American Issues Forum director encourages TM '76 funding proposal. Catalyzes Jaycees to pick up leadership role. Kingsville city leaders decide to have Town Meeting!

Internal: Gets warboard up that covers entire wall, thus making whole quarter (six months) an art form. Experiences Charles Watson's collegium on India releasing.

Contradiction: Exploding engagement in midst of unprepared for demands on back-up system. (Wk.2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Amid TM '76 circuiting and set-up, two Oklahoma tribes are negotiating for tribal Town Meetings: Sauk and Fox set date for April 3, and Cato-Kiowa Vo-Tech School entertains circuit riders at lunch. El Reno Federal Reformatory is excited about prospects of TM '76.

Internal: Week end of joint battleplanning with Tulsa ends on Sunday with document production. Twenty-six people participate in House Church. Receives Mark Smith as intern.

Contradiction: Getting best intuitions of battleplanning funnelled into an effective tactical calendar. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: New Years Eve party with careful structure unites bi-metro colleagues (with Majuro's Silk family as global presence) climaxing in midnight Daily Office, commissioning of three metro cadres. Holds exciting quarter planning with new cadres. Does TM '76 forays to Bridgeport and Terrel.

Internal: Welcomes David Dunn family. Sets up and implements development models. Puts up warboard.

Contradiction: Clarifying how to journey and nurture colleagues while keeping focus on TM '76. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Secures sponsors for two cities: Okmulgee and Drumwright as TM '76 wagon builds up steam.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA)

Internal: Prepares for PCC in order to form core that catalyzes PCE.

Contradiction: Keeping up with snowball. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Receives invitation to make presentation at Kiwanis district mid-winter conference. First two troika meetings nets two steering committee meetings on schedule. Excited sojourner goes home and gathers 12 people on two days to hear about sponsoring TM '76. Development turns up new interest.

Internal: Creates weekly time design for quarter. Combined presence of Chen I An and Christopher Asava globalizes all.

Contradiction: Putting three circuit riders on the road with two cars. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Successful New Years Eve party sees 25 guests participating in festivities, many as midnight drop-ins from other parties. Receives TM '76 endorsement letter from Harold Ford, U.S. Congressman from Tennessee.

Internal: House Christmas party follows safe return from discontinuity for all House members. All House vehicles back in functioning condition.

Contradiction: Building adequate follow-up model to cover all "after January first" visits necessary to "hot" cities at just time when troop strength is depleted by demands of permeation assignments. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Regional indicative battleplanning with Charlotte House at colleague's church in Marian, NC, ends in receiving Carlene Crisp as new intern in Atlanta. Makes appointments with key state Jaycee president and executive director of Atlanta United Way.

Internal: House brainstorm creates slightly modified PCE training manual geared toward Global Community Forum training and also creates impromptu ecclesiola on "The Time My Father Died". Lines up House Church celebrants for quarter with only one hour of phoning.

Contradiction: Living problemlessly in midst of all troops ready to move it and an ancient furnace failure in all-time low weather in sunny south. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Seven-week countdown begins with meeting of 16-member Charlotte TM '76 steering committee.

Internal: First Atlanta regional House planning council brings excitement over engagement, reflection and reports; colleague hosts House Christmas party; one new job, as House prepares for arrival of new colleague.

Contradiction. Creating transrational model and story that enables us to see engagement in Foray 5,000 as training for the troops. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Reactivates circuits after holidays. Completes battleplan. Sets up troika for Kendall Town Meeting.

Internal: Receives another new intern, Sister Delores Marie. Hosts guests for three days. Image of Miami as center of Americas reimpacts us as four staff stop on way to ITI:Caracas. Creates new team structures. House celebrates by seeing "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest".

Contradiction: Letting battleplan be a help rather than being paralyzed by its complexity. (Wk. 2)

CHICAGO**GLOBAL CENTRUM CHICAGO**

External: Chicago experiences breakthrough in cross-centrum training and task forces as demand to get TM '76 workbooks and I.E. created and printed; printers work on 24-hour schedule. Completes HUD proposal for Global Social Demonstration.

Internal: Sends out Andrew Knutsen to Phoenix, Rebecca Nichols to Edmonton, Henry Ziegenmeirs to Fukuoka, Dorothy Baines to Green Bay. Weigels return from Global Social Demonstration trek with great stories.

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO)

Contradiction: Handling the increasing intensity and complexity of the practical Nexus tasks. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Holds community consult with 25 colleagues. Applies for State Grant for 60 Town Meetings set; learns grant deadline is postponed.

Internal: Experiences great House tree trimming celebration.

Contradiction: Maintaining necessary focus on both common life and common task in midst of feeling that symbolic life has broken down. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Two cities agree to do TM'76 "early spring" after slide presentation. Schedules seven more presentations.

Internal: Starts quarter with great battleplan that gives overwhelming leap into quarter of doing the 5,000.

Contradiction: Keeping all wheels moving while rebuilding vehicle. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Begins Week II TM '76 circuits, setting up four presentations and bringing snowball into House function.

Internal: Secures all jobs.

Contradiction: Keeping up with office work. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Launches city circuits. New Years Eve with bi-metro charades and professional mime, 5000 snowball and the Great Carnac delights all. Global slide show at reception sets mood for evening.

Internal: Attends Order celebration of completed life of Robert Campbell. Valerie Mosley sojourns during Christmas.

Contradiction: Moving metro cadre from thinking about doing TM '76 to doing TM '76. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Collation of 4,000 70-page Whittier Community Directories with help from group of handicapped people and chemically dependent of neighborhood. Sets up complete integrated office system. First urban TM '76 set up in Philbrook, MN.

Internal: First miracle of quarter, the great office party, sees House dining out and dancing. Welcomes Barkonys' arrival as sends out Glenda Johnson to Vancouver and Frank Dyson's new assignment to Los Angeles. Hanson returns from Maliwada. Experiences breakopen with collegiums centered around guild work. Dana Humphrey sojourns. Sends out Gergen children to Taipei.

Contradiction: Taking time to plan over against demands to do, while operating out of indicative rather than attaining to some particular goal. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Consultation with sponsors committee in Clinton, Iowa, launches January circuits in three states. Confirms invitation to present TM '76 to Iowa Development Commission. Plans model for TM '76 workshop leader training sessions.

Internal: Receives Sandee Dunker from Greenville College as sojourner. Hosts guests from Boston and Chicago, some on way to new assignments in Area Houston. Children storm St. Louis arch twice in one weekend.

Contradiction: Connecting corporately to move directly on 5000 TM '76s through completion of quarter's indicative battleplan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Arthur, IL, village board says yes to sponsoring TM '76 and sets up steering committee headed by Academy grad.

Internal: Week II battleplanning for quarter sets pace for internal and external thrust.

Contradiction: Requiring everyman to be his own model builder, while trying to deal with both metros at once. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Hosts 30 for House Church as House returns from Christmas discontinuity, including priors from Pittsburgh, Don and Diane Francis.

Internal: New Year's Eve celebration with 5000 kernels of popcorn enables internalization of TM.

Contradiction: Spotting heathen community and knowing when to shake dust off its feet. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Metro colleague, Nancy Eggert, returns from Maliwada Consult as circuiting continues in nine metros, including Week II circuits. Mails first newsletter, holds troika lunch workshops, receives yes from Kiwanis and Jaycees for two TM '76s in Madison; Monroe newspaper prepares first color use full-page TM '76 spread.

Internal: Creates new team/role assignments for quarter. Does circuit workshop in ecclesiola. Receives Ken Gillgren as fellow. Fast day on ecclesiola impacts all. Metro colleagues decide to man office five days a week.

Contradiction: Making assignments that allow people to be clear about how to fulfill them. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Griding, research, rationale building for new quarter go on at same time as circuits and two sponsor's committee meetings. Indiana Jaycees door opens with speaking engagement at mid-year Jaycees' state meeting. Metro cadre indicates availability for trekking and working with sponsor's committees.

Internal: Routine is normal (on one floor) as carpenters, plumbers, electricians, phone repairman and painters get minimum functions repaired. Metro colleague who has to travel long distance making overnight stay necessary, comes to Metro cadre meeting.

Contradiction: Creating intentional decisional style with only one or two adults present for many corporate structures. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

Internal: Celebrative atmosphere whirling, as eight-foot Christmas tree is decorated, a Jeju night, with goldfish in a rock garden, and Emerging Generation spearheading creche scene and gifts creation.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves waiting for holidays end to build the implementation models, we seek hiding places in old secure models of family discontinuity with the overwhelming reality of 20 Town Meetings for winter quarter along with everything else. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Metros meet to complete plans for quarter engagement in Town Meeting and are commissioned at House Church.

Internal: Battleplanning releases creativity regarding internal life for quarter. Experiences "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" as great movie that takes its place alongside "Requiem". Welcomes two sojourners.

Contradiction: Continuing war now that all plans are complete. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Three circuits daily steadily pushing for dates for 17 Town Meetings before 1976 begins - "17 for 76". Day II participation allows six teams "on the road" in evenings to secure dates and committees.

Internal: Gives TM presentation to Ohio East Conference of Methodist Church at request of Bicentennial Committee and Bishop. Study of "Profound Vocation" paper for interim ecclesiola with eight guests is profound experience for all and enables vocational journey. Regional Council with 60 produces practical products for TM and spirit enablement for Quarter III.

Contradiction: Broadening base of troop commitment with concrete journey and using clear need effectively. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Board of a major community organization and one of largest Churches says yes to sponsoring Town Meeting '76 in Hamilton Heights community of Harlem.

Internal: Receives Yun Man Wu from Seoul Korea as well as Gini Terri, old-time colleague just returned from Academy, as sojourners.

Contradiction: Glimpsing really winning in midst of anxiety of "holding back". (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: First miracle in new parish, a gridding PSU, uncovers grateful colleagues who had been waiting for us for four years.

Internal: Justin Morrill on area trek participates in PSU and highlights event of last four years for those gathered for feast and tree lighting celebration.

Contradiction: Creating and telling the story that holds global vision in midst of new push and excitement in local parish. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: All three bi-metros name communities slated for TM '76, 216 in all and circuits to all are timed for Quarter III.

Internal: Transforms ground floor radically into chapel, office and conference room. One sojourner for month makes twenty appointments for Town Meeting oriented speaking engagements.

Contradiction: Trusting that decisions and preparation made are right and what is needed for getting into this quarter. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: New Year's Eve effectively launches and grounds 5000 in metro cadre colleagues, and Emerging Generation celebrates with "Ghost of 5000 Town Meetings."

Internal: Acquisition of new filing cabinet offers long-needed opportunity to redo filing system. Discontinuity sees House exploring turf, doing "family" circuits.

Contradiction: Shifting contextual gears to mobilize from knowing to doing. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: Holds regional PSU with emphasis on practical model: networks, development, data exchange, war room, DC city-wide TM '76 strategies. Creates invitations for New Women's Consult, February 21, 1976 with highpoint to be report by Mary Warren Moffett on Kawangware Consult. Roanoke, VA, National RURITAN (1200clubs) article in monthly magazine affirms Town Meeting. Lynchburg Jaycees work on nine Town Meetings simultaneously in April, followed two weeks later by consensus assembly.

Internal: Creates war room, transforms space. Infant School opens with three pupils. Ellen Rash, metro colleague, teaches study of Sue Laxdall's paper.

Contradiction: Experiencing jet lag between new models and old images. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Town Meeting network breaks loose with Kiwanis in three states, Baltimore city-wide community relations department, international treasurer of Lions Club and ministerial associations throughout bi-metro.

Internal: Birth of Christanna Cora Dessie Betonte, 3900 grams, to Anthony and Hildegard Betonte on December 7. Hosts Moffetts with Don reporting on Guardians Meeting and Mary Warren reporting on Kawangware Consult, World Council of Churches and LENS in Nigeria and Oxford, England.

Contradiction: Rebuilding contexts of colleagues and former contacts that allows them to assume responsibility for present mission. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Hesitant regional colleague is catalyzed by letter from Mayor asking her to serve on steering committee at which she is assigned to train local workshop leaders.

Internal: Internal structures are drastically streamlined and simplified to allow everyone to be on road all time in preparation for 5,000. Shifts space for second time in four years.

Contradiction: Finding ourselves slipping back to old forms of colleague visits when future demands boldness with new contacts. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Bi-metro priors affirm resolve to do what is necessary for 5,000 Town Meetings by building 6' X 11" warboard. Holds second and third sessions of workshop leader training in New Providence to assure that they are the best trained local leaders yet.

Internal: Internal life battleplanning enables us to discern contradictions which seem to speak to whole Order. Completes entire process quickly with greater clarity than in previous quarters.

Contradiction: Holding tension between collapsing existing movement structures and sustaining symbolic power of those structures and their role for future. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Begins implementing Quarter III battleplan for penetrating 72 micros by March 20. Are introduced at Lion's Club luncheon with cover story in monthly magazine on TM '76. Girl Scouts in Hempstead take TM '76 flyers around when selling cookies.

Internal: Stock family arrives, cause for celebration at famed Long Island sea food restaurant.

Contradiction: Developing expertise on which button to push at which moment to enable Town Meeting avalanche throughout metro. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Manchester, CT, sets tentative date for TM '76, May 1, 1976. Three cadre meetings happen as colleagues plunge into actualizing battleplan. Visits two new towns. Joins woman in Bridgeport to do geo-social analysis to discern next steps to break open TM '76. Celebrates with dinner at Kunkels.

Internal: Completes eight-foot warboard, enabling new space design for office. Celebrates Larry Henschen's 41st birthday.

Contradiction: Turning friendly reception into positive action. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Holds signal LENS seminar with priests and sisters from diocese of Manchester very affirmative.

Internal: Moving office, lounge, and collegium rooms creates new space.

Contradiction: Engaging colleagues in teams with House members for TM '76 without taking away their initiative. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Highlight of Brockton sponsorship meeting is announcement of eight-foot cake for TM '76 complete with flags, fireworks, pictures of presidents, liberty bell, Betsy Ross and will feed 1,000 people!

Internal: Receives George Howard as sojourner. Seeing "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" raises question of what is successful care.

Contradiction: Finding time to build necessary materials and warboards, tracking charts, when you are actively engaged in doing that which goes on warboard. (Wk. 2)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Capucia colleague holds trend analysis sessions with three Houses of his Order in preparation for provincial chapter meeting.

Internal: New external assignments build Xavierism through individual responsibility for miracle events, while Day I forces become servants of all.

Contradiction: Moving on actions we have seen as necessary while waiting for a broader consensus to form so that others can share the responsibility. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Lays four practical foundations for quarter circuits. Creates warboard and plans for quarter and appointments for four weeks sociological screen of community structure, grid of Toronto Metro. Quarter III indicative plan produces five actuating programs from 24 tactics. Kawangware Consult document proves extremely helpful for program models that need building.

Internal: New Years Eve celebration with colleagues involves all in circuit game. Indian feast highlights Narandra and Miriam Paul's visit. Welcomes Jim and Isobel Bishop.

Contradiction: Implementing quick practical training which produces effective callers out of those who feel like they have just unchained wild elephants. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Christmas gift to parish is leaflet co-sponsored by Knights of Columbus (Chevalier de Colombe) and Recreation Dept. Nine youth, from church in Cardinal, stay at house for "Day in Ottawa."

Internal: Visits from Lepage and Woodbury extended family promises benefits for other Houses.

Contradiction: Discerning what the one thrust of House will be. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Week of recruitment intensification with over 50 visits made and 150 tactics employed nets several strong possibilities and a registration. Development receives \$600 check from La India raised from staff and Father Marcell Rainville returns from U.S.A. on vacation with \$1000 from churches he preached in about ITI which brings weekly development total to \$2,000.

Internal: Sr. Ruth Palmer (Corpus Christi Carmelite from Trinidad and 1975 ITI grad) begins sojourn over Christmas holidays bringing gifts from Trinidad cadre. Transforms House with imported Canadian pines and tree for Christmas season.

Contradiction: Keeping recruitment "yes es" in midst of ITI practics looming as massive mountain coming in. (Wk. 1)

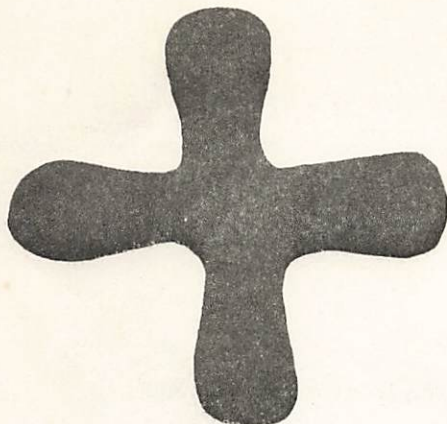

Internal: Sojourner arrives for three-week stay. Creates new Emerging Generation space.

Internal: Justin Morrill on area trek participates in PSU and highlights event of last four years for those gathered for feast and tree lighting celebration.

Contradiction: Creating and telling the story that holds global vision in midst of new push and excitement in local parish. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

Contradiction: Making transition from gathering place for movement, to a dispersal place for the movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Week II circuits net more yesses to Town Meeting. Completes eight-foot room-long warboard. Mailing to 100 organizations in Newark once again demonstrates our decision to catalyze the 5000.

Internal: Amidst Superbowl, House Church prep and Sunday p.m. discontinuity, a new life is born to Paul Fraser family. Celebrates birth of Peter Rowland Fraser, born Jan. 19, 1976 at 3:13 a.m.—10 lbs., 3 oz.

Contradiction: Keeping colleagues turned on, turned in, and participating in turn to world. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN
