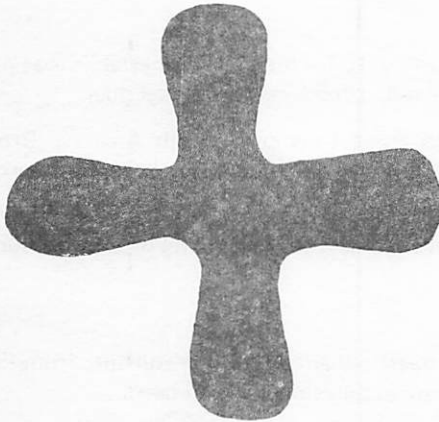

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Representatives of four cultures participate in ploughing urban farm's first field on London's hottest day. Senior citizens work with guild to tell Isle of Dogs history. Guild transforms school facility, joins teaching staff. Home industry for manufacturing pug shoes acquires markets, funds, facility; recruits local staff. Mayor of Tower Hamlets visits Bridge House. Canturbury Cadre impacts city with massive work day project on large central area. Receives powerful authorization from visit of Director of London Council of Historic Buildings, London Authority Estates Manager.

Internal: Sends Mary Bengel to teach Lusaka LENS, John and Rose Brown to enable Kreuzberg pre-consult set-up, House personnel and Canterbury Cadre as orchestration team for Bristol Community Day. Receives European priors for week of prep for GRA:London. Open-air end of Quarter celebration with guild sends out Mark Jewell to Chicago for summer.

Contradiction: Creating structures, stories, that effectively engage available troops. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Regional Council celebrates year of victory in midst of underlying sense that it is not enough.

Internal: Re-decor in preparation for Regional Council; finds great British Town Meeting quotes.

Contradiction: Remembering real issue is to move it instead of being tempted to worry about those who want the loose ends tied up. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Britian Community Day is very successful with temperature of 102 degrees; elder of 79 gives great witness. Representatives from parts of Bristol, including Lord Leutenant of County of Avon attend. House enables decor. Colleague facilitates Isle of Dogs with \$2,000 pounds. Sends out ITP participant, Connie Moore, to Chicago and sojourner to help in Isle of Dogs pre-school.

Internal: Sends Mark Hockley on re-assignment to Chicago with celebration to symbolize end of year with fish and chips at local pub. Hosts 30 people in House on Friday evening for preparation for Community Day. Jean Wright from Isle of Dogs comes to train for cottage industries. Sends out prior to GRA:London.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum as troops are dispersed. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Sends six to GRA:London with two more to go this week.

Internal: Thirty-person House Church sends out Ross Smith family to Sydney, Paul Gibson to Green Bay, and Peter Clements to Delhi.

Contradiction: Narrowing GSD field to communities that manifest Manchester's particular dimension of human suffering. (Wk. 1)

PARIS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

External: Visit to Comite Platform, community organization run by 100 volunteers with established network across France, opens door to Global Social Demonstration by providing connections to local man.

Internal: Sends out Penelope Portman and Andrew Parker to Phase I camp in North America. Broadens corporateness through struggle to get practical images for life this summer. Ecclesiola becomes impromptu slide presentation on GSD with two French women present.

Contradiction: Creating spirit life for scattered community, knowing this is just beginning of very full summer. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: In midst of compiling data from Trastevere research questionnaire, group of students from English Language Institute (ICA) drop in and push for concrete action now to move on revealed need.

Internal: Ecclesiola guest night continues to bear fruit as people of religious orders and local men from Trastevere meet together over Schumacher.

Contradiction: Doing tactical implementation that is obedient to God's new activity while at same time taking seriously quarter's battleplan. (Wk.9)

LAGOS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

External: Initiates ITI development in Lagos with key visit to director of Lagos Chamber of Commerce. Tracks down ITI brochures from Nairobi Centrum in time for second recruitment mailing and development calling.

Internal: Disperses to three tasks in three different locations, assembling on Week II for reporting, planning and discontinuity.

Contradiction: Gauging accurately necessary recruitment push needed over next three weeks. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Sends team to do pre-prep in London for GRA:Europe.

Internal: Manages to have everyone, except one for end-of-year picnic in midst of constant comings and goings.

Contradiction: Re-creating collegium room. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: During Regional Council, cadre plans next programmatic year and two decide to attend GRA. Heavy GSD development push continues. Breaks into national foundation possibilities.

Internal: Discontinuous part of quarter begins, highlighted by House members doing reflective spins on past year. Buss returns once again from Cairo and reports Cairo consultant recruitment is well underway, with many green lights from authorization figures.

Contradiction: Maintaining GRA recruitment thrust amidst heavy development and permeation downbeat. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House and cadre consense on model for accomplishing GCF transposition during Quarter I.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM)

Translates GSD publicity into Dutch. Collegium model-building enables task to move ahead even throughout summer months.

Internal: Sends prior to GRA:London preparation. Shares bicentennial celebration of hamburgers and banana splits with Order Youth Elaine Worden, David St. John and Laura Ennis, en route to Maliwada.

Contradiction: Designing a way to maintain momentum in midst of colleagues' vacations, House discontinuity, and unexpected summer sojourners. (Wk. 1).

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Bergisch-Neukirchen Cadre translates, types, and prints 250 copies of the Kawangware Community Council Report. Completes translation of Isle of Dogs prologue and epilogue. Celebrates year with a bonfire wurst roast.

Internal: Journeys for Week II to Berlin and enables miraculous one-day move of Berlin House to Kreuzberg Human Development Projects site Wayside Inn hosts guests from Chicago, Washington D.C., and Sri Lanka.

Contradiction: Focusing task next four weeks on what is necessary rather than what seems possible with nearly all troops scattered. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: GSD starts with move in 90-degree weather to new facility in Kreuzberg. Colleagues and guests from all over globe help in 18-hour miracle.

Internal: Lays last floor as first truck load arrives. Extends major effort throughout week to get facility ready. Welcomes Speicher family as guests.

Contradiction: Intensifying all GSD arenas while one takes all power. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

External: Thirty-five attend Lusaka PLC; grads help teach. Forty business men and women from 25 major national and international companies gather at University of Zambia for LENS; response is "We'll recruit the next one." ITI site is confirmed. Mails 85 ITI invitations to PLC grads.

Internal: Movement grads move in for weekend to enable LENS. Lyn Mathews brings Isle of Dogs Consult to Lusaka and sets get-prepared-context. Lusaka businesses provide in-kind needs for program. Host teachers from Chicago, London, Nairobi.

Contradiction: Regrouping for ITI, HRM and development while consolidating past gains. (Wk.9)

NAIROBI**GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI**

External: Mombasa ITI circuit ride surprises all with yielding 16 promises for ITI in August. ITI in-kind rises to value of Kenyan shillings 5,600. Impacts Bahati 5 Guild with slides of GSD projects.

Internal: Guests from Berlin, Hardvich and Valena sojourn during the week. Celebrates July 4 with hamburgers and hot dogs at Kawangware Demonstration farm.

Contradiction: Broadening the visitation net to enable colleague recruiters to produce registrations. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: ITI recruiting is in full swing with 79 visits made during week, 26 registrations in. In-kind for ITI continues apace with 75 kg corn flakes, 50 kg cooking oil, 100 kg soaps.

Internal: Re-gears internal structures to enable external mission.

Contradiction: Maintaining adequate circuit rides to recruit ITI, with car out of action. (Wk. 13)

BOMBAY**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY**

External: Meeting with Chief Minister in Maharashtra results in official letter releasing extra national funds to come to MHDP.

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY)

Internal: Joseph Mathews visits Maliwada, spins on four global contradictions confronting GSD.

Contradiction: Enabling emerging giants to operate as an effective corporate force. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Battleplans and discovers the mission includes participating in Development and formation of guardian net.

Internal: Experiences spirit deeps with fast. Welcomes Bishop Joshi as House Church celebrant and hears his enthusiastic witness of North America trek and Wayside Inn dynamic of Houses given to Indian churchmen. Spends informal evening with him, including songs of Joseph sisters and Indian classical dancing of Claire Clements and Anita James.

Contradiction: Commissioning whole House as Generals to stations and miracles so as to internalize and actualize battleplan. (Wk. 13)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Eight-day circuit rider returns and House visits new PCE location. Week II indicative battleplanning creates tactical system and miracle stream grounded in local reality and global demand. Joseph Mathews and Pat Moriarty breeze into New Delhi to meet U.S. Ambassador Saxby.

Internal: Experiences exciting collegiums, including Gram Sabha pedagogy, relating Gram Sabha (Town Meeting) to RS-I. Goes to movie after Saturday PCE workshop. Allahabad colleague, James Nathan, joins House for Week II battleplanning. Cynthia Elliott comes to Delhi, after five months in Maliwada, to launch marathon Subcontinent trek.

Contradiction: Stepping into corporate decision making with five new faces around table. (Wk. 1)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Gunfoundry 5 Guild meetings resume after GRA training period with 25 guildsmen present. First PCE data interchange report is written by guild. Initiates Gram Sabha marketing.

Internal: Holds Youth Meeting for new quarter and lively ecclesiola study on "Buddhist Economics" raises issue of how to honour human creativity in technological age.

Contradiction: Caring for all regions when emphasis is on August 15th Continental Gram Sabha. (Wk. 1)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: GRA grads pick up key roles in Circus 5 guild meetings and English classes begin four nights a week for guild core. Completes first circuit ride since GRA. Discovers strong decision to be Movement on part of recent GRA grads.

Internal: Narendra Paul family arrives. Engages in celebrative resettlement and planning. House built for nine suddenly expands to fourteen comfortably.

Contradiction: Holding tension between internal support structures needed and missional expenditures. (Wk.1)

SINGAPORE

GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE

External: ITI:Penang concludes with over 80 participants.

Internal: House moves from empty to full with visiting family from Malaysia, Pam Wampler from Seattle, and Kathy Zervigon returning from hospital. Enjoys 14 at House Church and sends Kathy to recuperate in New Orleans.

Contradiction: Raising funds for ITI and Kelapa Dua. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Sends off last of ITI participants to Oombulgurri, Sydney and Manado. GRA participants return from Hong Kong. Area-wide development effort moves from Kuala Lumpur to Singapore and Jakarta.

Internal: Sends out Eunice Miclat to North America to represent Singapore House at GRA:Chicago, as Sheila Westre returns from GRA:Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Securing consultants and funds from Singapore for Kelapa Dua. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: JWM visit accelerates GSD pace with whirlwind visit through villages. Discovers need to range further afield where piecemeal development is not so pronounced. Dr. Seevarhtnam becomes Kuala Lumpur key guardian as he sends development team to friends who have money and can also give access to top government figures for GSD.

Internal: Visit requires permeator to make fast shift including borrowing company car for village looking.

Contradiction: Holding tension between local breakthrough for GSD and Area and global program demands. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Welcomes and hosts 39 Indonesian ITI participants on way home from ITI:Penang.

Internal: Welcomes home Lush and Morris from ITI and hosts Marie Malu from Manado as sojourner.

Contradiction: Knowing timeline to consult is short and there is no House to live in yet. (Wk. 1)

HONG KONG GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Nexus and House do pre-consult planning for GSD, now planned for last of November. GRA packets are ready to go to Houses.

Internal: Sends people out from GRA and gets people to two ITIs and development treks. Writes AID and four Philippine proposals.

Contradiction: Creating models for next year when all data is not known as yet. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: GRA becomes effective regional tool as old and new colleagues participate in GCF day and GSD section of program. Complexity of SEAPAC addresses participants.

Internal: Much "to-ing" and "fro-ing" to tiny island off Hong Kong as House becomes enablement and back-up for GRA. In-kind beer and coke cool sweat accumulated in walk from ferry to GRA site.

Contradiction: Working over against summer mindset of relaxing in order to gear up for Fall programs. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Development trek nets \$130 with another \$1000 looking good. In-kind locates 100 lbs. of cookies. With ITI two weeks away, recruitment nets two more.

Internal: Studies ITI papers as pedagogy prop. Sends Pat Despain to GRA:Hong Kong. Hears report from Lapu Lapu Consult.

Contradiction: Spinning ITI authorization success into GSD authorization success. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Hosts Regional Council to initiate battleplanning for Quarter I gear up for final papers processing for ITI participants.

Internal: Sends Juana Nerequita to do Imaginal Education Consult in Cebu. Hosts Fr. Alfredo Santa Ana, Fr. Dave Albano. Duncan Holmes and Franco Arcebal spend evening reporting and reflecting.

Contradiction: Holding tension of demand to battleplan in midst of immediate necessary deeds. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Bottlenecks and uncertainties over entry papers and registration for ITI pop up but are dealt with through careful explaining.

Internal: Studies "Christian Tradition" papers and mass produces fine ITI decor.

Contradiction: Holding final site prep until registration document is on the wall. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Sudtonggan Community Assembly of 275 people signals launch of all 14 programs of LHDP. All sign up for five guilds and begin meeting every Tuesday. Early Learning Center (ELC) officially begins full-day classes 120 children. Health Clinic opens with 95 patients on first day. New bamboo floor classrooms are completed for ELC and city begins fixing road. With commitment of gift from guardian of 100 chickens, Agricultural Guild builds first chicken coop. Nine sari-sari store owners go to Cebu for first bulk buying trip in jeepney and save 175 pesos on price of corn and return ecstatic about future possibilities.

Internal: House experiences collegium like being in a gold fish bowl.

Contradiction: Activating all programs at one time. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Launches Obrero 5 mini-school with 25 students, ages two months to four years. Sends out Vilma Fuentes to ITI:Tapei.

Internal: Jobs abound as Global Language classes jump from two to seven each week with total of ten students, coupled with three-week substitute teaching job at local college.

Contradiction: Building models to release prospective interns to actually move in. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: After Joseph Mathew's visit to Osaka to look at GSD in Japan, House steps up village research and teams up with Sendai House to visit villages in Sendai Region.

Internal: The funeral of a neighbor, baptism of one parish colleague, and marriage of another, involves House in significant rites of passage in community.

Contradiction: Receiving parish colleagues question: "Now that you have been here 2 months, what is your plan for Sanya?" which creates need for corporate planning. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Visits every house in village to launch stake care dynamic. Draws map of every physical structure and codes it according to presence of electricity and water. Local PLC yields colleagues for replication circuits.

Internal: Schumacher continues to impact auxiliary during ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Holding tension between kairotic time and move it now. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Regional Council emphasizes opportunities for practical action which includes signing up for sojourning at Jeju HDP and participating in week-long metro development circuits. Summer school begins at the International School of the Sacred Heart. Receives first money in hand from business community.

Internal: Celebrates Quarter IV with picnic and wading in stream. Begins research on possible Urban Demonstration site in Seoul.

Contradiction: Engaging in research and development with same intensity as with ITI preparation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Initial brooding reveals three possible GSD sites on Kyushu. Guild and House begin to gather data on each in anticipation of Week 13 trek.

Internal: Completes fifty pieces of ITI decor in record time during discontinuity.

Contradiction: Operating without long-range strategy, allowing House only to hold the line. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: ITI team arrives to begin set-up. Ken Hamje gives presentation to 30 guardians and PCE guildsmen on Maliwada. Receives in-kind printing on 20 pieces by A.M.'s Osaka office. PCE guild does contradiction swirl followed by offer of enablement support for ITI.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA)

Internal: "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest" is center of celebration for House. End of quarter reflections show solid realization of last quarter's tactical objectives far beyond expectations. Hosts Area Priors Council. Welcomes Frank Cookingham from Jeju to Council. Sends Muriel Griffin to GRA:Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Confirming ITI interest with registrations. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Experiences consciousness shift relative to rural GSD.

Internal: Emerging Generation chooses name and symbol for camp: "Bicentennial Camp".

Contradiction: Transforming consciousness shift into possibility. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Steering committee for Community Meeting Australia in Glen Innes capitalizes on resurgence of pipe band for entertainment.

Internal: Completes House move from McMahan's Point to 93 Redfern Street. House presence catalyzes neighbours to paint wall adjoining front yard.

Contradiction: Stopping long enough to plan a quarter that already seems underway while giving systematic attention to gracious presence of House without that becoming sole occupation. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: National authorization of Oombulgurri by Apex nets one speaking engagement with excellent follow-up prospects, and two more in diary. Cheques, including one for \$1000, roll in after development blitz. Affirmative response to CMA by clergy includes one pledged sponsor congregation.

Internal: As follow-up to development in Geraldton, Dorothy Royston-Ing and son Danny sojourn and are sent out demanding that they be treated as metro cadre. Celebrates birthday of emissary Gabrielle Evans with barbeque feast. House spirit comes alive as students decide to participate in Daily Office and other assignments.

Contradiction: Releasing colleagues who insist on standing still when everything is demanding that House move it. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Community Meeting Australia proposal goes before Darwin city council. Mails Oombulgurri report to local colleagues. Deputy mayor, four service club presidents and MLA (Member of Legislative Assembly) endorse CMA.

Internal: Hosts for five days and sends two Oombulgurri citizens, Norman Horace and Jennifer Euro plus Dennis Churchill to ITI:Penang. Quarter's evaluation illuminates necessity for radical decisions to get wheels under mission.

Contradiction: Going boldly ahead with work, not knowing what troop availability will be at any given point. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Mr. Ian Viner M.H.R., visits Oombulgurri along with local and federal, state government department heads. Kitco store and market garden impress all, proving authorization homework pays off. Director-General of Transport flies in for short visit and comments on amazing change he sees in place since his last visit 10 years ago. Tansanyika Mining Company agrees to pay 2/3 cost of helicopter for aerial muster and arrival of stockmen's gear heralds beginning of muster. Processing plant transforms 25 meat birds into delicious chicken dinner. Community mourns death of Henry Evans.

Internal: Sends Teresa Lingafelter to Area Council, Bob Lingafelter to Area team in Canberra. Reviews budget.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: "Toward the Next Four Years" development blitz reaches \$1,250 Australian dollars in hand and \$2,000 committed at end of second week. Experiences miracle raising quarter's programme money, programme debts and sustenance debts in one fell swoop.

Internal: "All the President's Men" excites House in terms of winning, chastity, and being gun. Local colleague pays for all petrol for July. Fish becomes regular food item as Paul Duffy catches some big ones.

Contradiction: Integrating three campaigns into one thrust. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Metro Cadre hosts fantastic guest night which heals and re-engages former regional coordinator family. Hears comments on way home of "We need to know more about this Community Meeting", with kids remarking "When are we coming back again?" PSU looks at next 26 weeks of whole mission.

Internal: Amanda Telford celebrates her seventh birthday at MacDonald's. Curriculum models are underway to undergird intense circuiting effort.

Contradiction: Keeping rock rolling uphill, like old friend Sisyphus. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Department of Aboriginal Affairs, Canberra, invites ICA to conduct seminar on policy and community development methods. Seminar goes off well. Models for Oombulgurri undergirding and development are hammered out day and night for a week.

Internal: Hosts Garnet Banks' parents and six colleagues of OHSP task force. Has birthday party for Emerging Generation. Welcomes guests throughout week.

Contradiction: Tying down assignments which ensure Oombulgurri, Wyndham, Perth and Canberra authorization and development all get done in concert rather than sequentially. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Area Council data shapes new model to enable CMA and development thrusts. As three participate in Area Council, Kurilpa 5 Caretakers decide to do sign in community every three weeks.

Internal: Experiences fearsome newness, as Newkirk is reassigned, and Schumacher blasts all with demand and possibility of engagement for every man. Hoya Brown returns from ITI; David Jago arrives for three-week sojourn.

Contradiction: Engaging totally, in midst of sense of waiting for clarity. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Receives funds of \$56,00 for Summer Service '76; other structures emerge: MIECO Management Team, TASC Wholesaling wins government bid, district administrator appoints R. Fishel advisor to Youth Commission.

Internal: Quarter I planning occasions House to experience power as missional movers through methods and humility over changed live of colleagues within MHDP.

Contradiction: Keeping perspective broad enough. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Sojourners from metro cadre plan year's battleplanning Week II, write and address send-out invitations, and mail newsletter.

Internal: Sojourners enliven House activity.

Contradiction: Experiencing being suspended just above a bed of nails. (Wk. 1)

FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: New image of TM follow-up emerges from "Evening at the Institute" program attended by 60 people, many from past TM's. Nob Hill holds "Survival Revival" planned by TM grads; 140 attend. The

impossible becomes possible as 350 attend Haight-Asbury TM with great TV coverage and 6:00 news. Mission District CIF has 20% law enforcement present; good cross section of community participates.

Internal: Holds 14-hour planning marathon Saturday resulting in funding breakthrough, decision to do summer sojourn program and concrete images for summer circuits. Hosts families for school graduation of Cathy Elliott, Kathy Marshall, Hendrick Idzerda, John Wainwright, and Tim Stewart. Sends David St. John to Maliwada for summer.

Contradiction: Setting up suburban TM 's during summer months. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: McDonalds promises food for July 17, San Jose TM; two displays in city bicentennial celebration net registrations and favorable publicity from crowds.

Internal: Program funds for June from metro colleagues come in with all promised for July. New decor in collegium room sets mood for sojourners and circuits.

Contradiction: Projecting comprehensive circuit model beyond July. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Decides in midst of 4th of July to evaluate and plan for the next 200 years, just as forefathers did back in Philadelphia.

Internal: Sends out sojourn family to consider their future care for the world.

Contradiction: Pulling together into one thrust to get corporate priorities out. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Creates July '76 sojourning model, revises circuiting assignments and model to undergird mission financially.

Internal: Park Si Won gives challenging collegium on Korea. Movie "Entertainment - Part II" and discovery of summer song for Phoenix Region, "Taking A Chance on Love" impacts all.

Contradiction: Being sensitive to emerging new face of Movement and giving concrete form to it. (Wk.13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Conversation with design students from Brigham Young University begins cataloguing of Utah intermediate technology resources. A first, Latter Day Saints leader decides to set international meeting for community of three small towns.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY)

Internal: House and colleagues celebrate birth of David Anthony, June 23, to Jim and Kitty Overall. House member is unexpectedly offered job in University of Utah medical school, and accepts.

Contradiction: Nailing down concrete images of future significance of TM '76 completely apart from Bicentennial in order to remotivate colleagues. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Circuits travel to Butte for recruitment of rally.

Internal: Regional battleplanning and Week II celebration with Rapid City House ends with trip to Mount Rushmore.

Contradiction: Moving It even when we are not sure where. (Wk. 1)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Broad-based visitation in city and rural communities begins summer quarter as House and metro prepare for Fall steering committees.

Internal: House celebrates 4th with Salt Lake City and ITPs Rev. Park Si Won and Faedgra Mattos at Steam Boat Springs, CO. Rodeo highlights day.

Contradiction: Operating strategically as opposed to out of anxieties as realization strikes that there are only five weeks left of quarter. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Symbol of globe is covered as trek is made to North Pole, Alaska.

Internal: Fourth of July celebration holds up three birthdays and sends Margaret Stoner to summer in Chicago.

Contradiction: Chosing which treks to do and how to develop program monies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Gives form to expected CFC explosion in Fall through intensive evaluation and planning week while keeping development plates spinning.

Internal: Collegium room gets face lift as best social process triangle ever and CFC explosion decor cover two large walls.

Contradiction: Keeping missional focus and House running while journeying creditors beyond 90 days. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Climaxes Quarter I battleplanning by clean-up of vacant lot.

Internal: Experiments with new time design which allows for one-hour collegium.

Contradiction: Continuing push of TM, knowing that world doesn't stop turning during summer. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Sets TM dates for New Orleans CIF, downtown New Orleans TM, Lake Charles, Shreveport, and Mobile. Day II troops, House, and metro break loose five new cities for TM's projected in August, September. New focus on catalyzing snowball has 25 TM's projected by September 31, with next wave in October-November.

Internal: Welcomes Don Clark with Lapu Lapu slides and presentation, new funding scheme of regional program self-support, and latest brooding on GSD.

Contradiction: Allotting time to raise necessary program funds without missing a step. (Wk. 12)

Internal: Welcomes Mike Hoff and Roger Williams back from Majuro. Completes new summer song book with first compilation of songs from all of the Global Social Demonstrations. Contradiction: Discerning edge of thrust as a global Movement in midst of GRA:Chicago. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Two 5th City men lead weekly TM steering committee. Washington, D.C. funding trip offers new development possibilities. CIF for Youth is great contexting event for 350 West side Youth. Mayor's Youth Program begins with 100 from 5th City working in FHDP project. Safe streets men riding patrol jumps to 20. Collates and uses 160-page tactics workbook in Phase II miracle battleplanning.

Internal: Celebrates 4th of July by singing along with Mitch Miller, steak-champaign House Church brunch, watching fireworks. Hears Lapu Lapu Report by Sandra True at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Finding first major funding that will release other funding. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Circuits produce excited TM advocates with one Wichita man deciding to pull together troika for Northwest city TM.

Internal: Marge Tomlinson impacts House with four-day stay; sends Emerging Generation out to camp and sixth grade trip.

Contradiction: Eliciting metro troops to participate in metro circuits. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Visit with State Department Economic Development results in commitment to an urban TM and steering committee with an eye on using TM through Community Development Commission and some funding.

Internal: Visitor, Darsi Ratnam, Bombay House landlord, tours famous stockyards and has lunch at Bohemian cafe; gives India report.

Contradiction: Shifting troops to enable program self-support, while keeping on the circuits. (Wk. 1)

Internal: "Council on the Road" workshop with Marge Tomlinson focuses summer task and tightens up timeline.

Contradiction: Contexting and re-contexting House and metro on new image of summer as Town Meeting acceleration rather than research. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: New missionary image program presented by Consult returnees to representatives of seven never-before impacted churches points to possible ways for them to participate in GSD.

Internal: House battleplanning session for quarter ends with celebration on warm shores of cold Lake Michigan.

Contradiction: Instilling image of community from the outside. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

Contradiction: Falling victim to habit and routine in timedesigns. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Second city-wide advisory committee for TM turns advocacy to sponsorship as Action Coalition of Elders commit themselves to sponsorship of TMs wherever they are held.

Internal: Greets Joyce Ollison for consultant training PSU and Sally Fenton back to New York after six-week urban TM circuit; celebrates July 5 with swim in Youghiogheny River.

Contradiction: Designing transrational time for Phase III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Small but powerful black downtown Town Meeting in Rochester knits two black organizations into one thrust which reveals entre into black leadership of Rochester.

Internal: Sends House Youth and sojourner to Chicago Youth Program and sixth grade trip with mini-steaks and eggs breakfast celebration.

Contradiction: Knitting together many and diverse plans for Town Meetings across region into one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Over-all summer strategy put into effect and made effective with mailings, phone calls, visits, and sponsors meetings.

Internal: Metro cadre watches "1776" on television and ecclesiola is a picnic complete with frisbee.

Contradiction: Keeping setbacks and immediacies from dissolving spirit in midst of breakloose. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: Horizons Festival is phenomenal event with over 650 participating in events of weekend: 300 plus at city-wide TM alone; McDonalds donate 1,000 burgers, Safeways 1,000 apples, Coca Cola, 1,000 cokes, plus many more; 23 local workshop leaders, ranging from male preschool teacher to retired deputy police chief do quality job of leading workshops. Contradiction: Discovering that someone can be engaged without knowing what they are marrying. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Largest Town Meeting yet in NJ happens in Newark's North Ward with 284 registered.

Internal: In-kind marches on and counts five watermelons as part of harvest. Eighty-four year old Italian neighbor takes responsibility for community garden.

Contradiction: Clarifying muddled models for moving Town Meeting grads into mainstream. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Brooklyn Metro breaks loose with 3 TMs set this week; Canarsie, June 27, Flushing, June 26, Springfield Gardens, June 26. Maspeth TM set for June 12.

Internal: Carlos Ollison does guest collegium on 5th City Consult and enables to see not just past but future. 5th City Love Song becomes Number 1 on House hit parade.

Contradiction: Building models to engage everyone, with competence in every aspect of mission. (Wk.7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: At Canton, CT, Town Meeting '76, 88-year-old woman presents poem about Town and significance of day at final plenary. First selectman is M.C. and town adopts proposals and all work of the day is put on display at Town Hall Open House Sunday following the meeting. Celebrates miracle of South Green Park Day: planting, painting, trimming.

Internal: Rudi Ke is sojourner for three weeks. Major family spends last night in Hartford at House before moving to Toledo, OH. Sends out Fred McNutt to Work Camp staff in Wisconsin. Welcomes Carolyn Browning and children Edith and Elizabeth for internship year.

Contradiction: Making certain of plan for great fourth of July. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Portland, Maine Jaycees vote to sponsor TM (first TM for Maine). Workshop leader from Claremont signs up for GRA, asks to sojourn.

Internal: Fund-raising calls on metro colleagues becomes occasion for profound spirit care, all are eager to be engaged in all arenas, including financial.

Contradiction: Overcoming summer mindset in NH and Maine "vacationland" in House, colleagues, and TM sponsors. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Habitat participant from Boston Redevelopment Authority calls after seeing ICA presentation and asks to be part of guardian network; other guardians come alive from TM networks, development calls, and decide to meet monthly.

Eighteen priors from Religious Houses are assigned to Development Centrum in Chicago for the month of July. The contradiction lies in the arena of consistent income for program expenses while corporations and foundations ruminates over funding.

Hong Kong reports concluding the GRA with six Areas present, 18 regions represented, with new disciplined leadership for the Movement and a new continental awareness. Chicago Uptown holds International Festival, and GRA opens. The contradiction lies in the arena of researching funding, global repository, troops for GSD and GSD replication and moving into high gear in these areas in the task forces of the GRA.

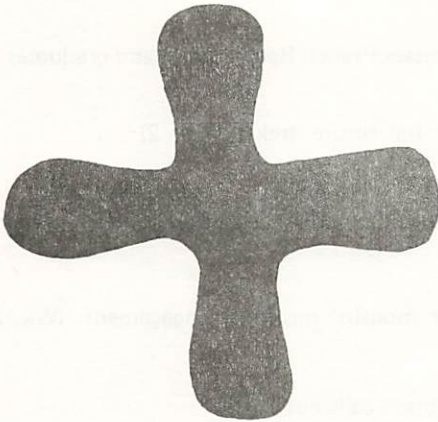

Internal: Experiences exciting collegiums, including Gram Sabha pedagogy, relating Gram Sabha (Town Meeting) to RS-I. Goes to movie after Saturday PCE workshop. Allahabad colleague, James Nathan, joins House for Week II battleplanning. Cynthia Elliott comes to Delhi, after five months in Maliwada, to launch marathon Subcontinent trek.

External: Launches Obrero 5 mini-school with 25 students, ages two months to four years. Sends out Vilma Fuentes to ITI:Taipei.

Internal: Jobs abound as Global Language classes jump from two to seven each week with total of ten students, coupled with three-week substitute teaching job at local college.

Contradiction: Building models to release prospective interns to actually move in. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Has appointment with J. Kawakita, famous Japanese creator of planning and problem solving method, who says LENS method and global network surpasses his, but what he has is a name that opens doors throughout Japan.

Internal: Having sent half of staff to ITI, House returns home from work to find shutter still closed on office, no one "in-House" yet mission is being done.

Contradiction: Knowing that the arenas of framing and webbing are critical, yet having no clear articulation of product or result desired. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: Visits every house in village to launch stake care dynamic. Draws map of every physical structure and codes it according to presence of electricity and water. Local PLC yields colleagues for replication circuits.

Internal: Schumacher continues to impact auxiliary during ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Holding tension between kairotic time and move it now. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

Contradiction: Creating a GCF using manual as basic resource. (Wk. 2)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Steering committee for Community Meeting Australia in Glen Innes capitalizes on resurgence of pipe band for entertainment.

Internal: Completes House move from McMahan's Point to 93 Redfern Street. House presence catalyzes neighbours to paint wall adjoining front yard.

External: "Toward the Next Four Years" development blitz reaches \$1,250 Australian dollars in hand and \$2,000 committed at end of second week. Experiences miracle raising quarter's programme money, programme debts and sustenance debts in one fell swoop.

Internal: "All the President's Men" excites House in terms of winning, chastity, and being gun. Local colleague pays for all petrol for July. Fish becomes regular food item as Paul Duffy catches some big ones.

Internal: Celebrates 4th of July Interdependence Day with 26 colleagues. Works on Quarter I models put in Areal perspective as Rob Duffy makes visit.

Contradiction: Finalizing quarter assignments for circuits and training. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Department of Aboriginal Affairs honours ICA expertise in social initiation methods, but claims the main consultant gift is economic expertise.

Internal: Development team completes writing document brief for D.A.A. policy division, who intimates the consideration of OHDP as "special status" project.

Contradiction: Creating the model to actually pull mission through. (Wk. 2)

Contradiction: Projecting comprehensive circuit model beyond July. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Decides in midst of 4th of July to evaluate and plan for the next 200 years, just as forefathers did back in Philadelphia.

Internal: Sends out sojourn family to consider their future care for the world.

Contradiction: Engaging people in the midst of the end of the year mindset. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Contradiction: Keeping on truckin' when the world is skiing, biking, boating, swimming across path. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Task force planning meetings continue to plan summer program with breakthroughs in time design, practics, and recruitment.

Internal: Builds Jaycee model for meetings with representatives of local clubs set up across Southern California through District Governors. Park Si Won gives collegium on Korea and impacts House with song "Ari-rang".

External: Sends Carl Ennis to GRA:Chicago; creates opportunity for corporate reflection on TM strategies. Finds exciting new ways to see TM as part of historical trend. Advisory Board meets to plan fund-raising events.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS)

Internal: Recreation of Daily Office space allows all to stand before Final Awe. Ruth Ennis, student, locates and begins summer job.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the place of glory and time of fullness to release energy for task of life-time. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Aurora steering committee decides to reconstitute itself to do October TM for those who missed first one. Engelwood sets September date.

Internal: Study of CIF paper impacts House with new images of profound happening forum. Sends out Sharon Heiges and two clergymen to GRA:Chicago.

Contradiction: Maintaining yes decisions of steering committees while deferring tactical actualization until August. (WK. 2)

External: Experiences TM core breakthroughs in Sinton, Uvalde, Mercedes, Floresville; emergency development campaign nets the needed June/July program funds.

Internal: Repaints and refurbishes House to prepare for annual rent negotiations.

Contradiction: Releasing inside small town authorization while being outside consultants. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Stiles Circle Park Renovation comes off as a true miracle as 150 people show up to re-create OK City's oldest public park, using totally in-kind food, materials. Contradiction: Holding tension between internal life and move it, move it. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Macon TM steering committeeman, who knows Jimmy Carter on a first-name basis, sends invitation to August 14th meeting to Carter. Receives immediate responses from key Atlantans who were sent documents from CIF.

Internal: Eunice Mclat, Singapore, visits sister in Atlanta, works Day I at House. Newest intern, Susan Curry, begins good paying computer programming job. House cheers Braves on to come-from-behind victory with standing room only 50,000+ crowd.

Contradiction: Covering all the appointments set and meetings scheduled in eight metros while maintaining jobs, income, as well as being in Summer Assembly. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Holds first TM in South Carolina in Blacksburg. Sets up two more in Columbia and Charleston for October. Chicago development team sows seeds for future Carolina harvest.

Internal: Employs both Youth in summer jobs.

Contradiction: Giving in to the practices now that there are 16 TM plates spinning. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Guardians take responsibility for special development letter as one of the signers hands over \$100 check.

Internal: Sends prior out as part of GRA:Chicago staff. ITP visitor is impacted by fireworks, Key lime pie, summer battleplanning, popcorn. Indonesian geography lesson impacts House.

Contradiction: Releasing local man to risk. (Wk. 2)

CHICAGO**GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO**

External: Whole Nexus is involved in GRA while Centrum work goes on. New GRA time design releases huge blocks of time for task force work, leisurely 8:00 p.m. dinner, and GSD slide presentation in Generals Lounge. External: Front-page Sun Times reflects HUD has picked up Institute models on financing housing. Jets program begins; Business Association takes responsibility for businesses in geo-rationality; 60 on CIF stepping

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO)

committee secure 100 paid registration in two days with two weeks to go. Develops \$1850 for program funds. Three cars of Safe Street Patrolmen in State Street parade; 50 people work in Van Buren Work Day.

Internal: Sends JWM paper to guardians. Chicago Nexus keeps calling up to globally assign one after another of House troops to GRA:Chicago when present miracles here say don't let them go!

Contradiction: Discovering that we are not fanatics at releasing contradictions, but fall off into goal orientation. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Circuits produce excited TM advocates with one Wichita man deciding to pull together troika for Northwest city TM.

Internal: Marge Tomlinson impacts House with four-day stay; sends Emerging Generation out to camp and sixth grade trip.

Contradiction: Eliciting metro troops to participate in metro circuits. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Creates TM schedule for summer; signals in new phase as first non-Movement colleague becomes coordinator. At tri-metro picnic celebrates last year as that of the PCE.

Contradiction: Finding way out of trap of own skepticism and cynicism when faced with impossible task of 5000 TMs. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Receives Butler Foundation grant for \$5,000 for MN Town Meetings. Schedules first Urban Native American Community Forum for August with full fee in hand. Whittierites (150) attend one-week family camp at in-kind facility, including staff and meals. Internal: TM grads continue to participate in doing TM work.

Contradiction: Holding tension between program development, rally recruitment, TM sponsors meetings. (Wk.1)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Hosts 50 advocates and Town Meeting contacts in GSD evening. Sets TM dates in Crown Heights (Brooklyn) and South Ozone Park (Queens); forceful re-entry happens in Norwalk, CT.

Internal: Hosts international guests from Indonesia, Philippines, Taiwan, Kenya. Monday regional strategy meetings become critical in formation of week's strategy in development and Town Meetings.

Contradiction: Falling victim to habit and routine in time designs. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Second city-wide advisory committee for TM turns advocacy to sponsorship as Action Coalition of Elders commit themselves to sponsorship of TMs wherever they are held.

Internal: Greets Joyce Ollison for consultant training PSU and Sally Fenton back to New York after six-week urban TM circuit; celebrates July 5 with swim in Youghiogheny River.

Contradiction: Designing transrational time for Phase III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Small but powerful black downtown Town Meeting in Rochester knits two black organizations into one thrust which reveals entre into black leadership of Rochester.

Internal: Sends House Youth and sojourner to Chicago Youth Program and sixth grade trip with mini-steaks and eggs breakfast celebration.

Contradiction: Knitting together many and diverse plans for TMs across region into one thrust. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Richmond urban strategies and development push begin to merge with visit to C & P Bell Telephone Company for money and troops.

Internal: Regional Council in Washington D.C. entices whole House to remain in D.C. for 4th of July festivities.

Contradiction: Coordinating four simultaneous thrusts with the same small group of people. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: First pre-consult miracle in Washington GSD calls forth over 100 residents of Ivy City for Community Clean-Up Day as all ages and people in blue put shoulders to a common task. Community resident exclaims: "This is the first time in 32 years that I have seen this many people work together on a common project."

Internal: Sunday morning six-hour House Council and task force reassignments dramatize shift from Horizons Festival to GSD prep.

Contradiction: Turning the waves created by Horizons Festival weekend into the tidal wave for GSD in nation's capitol. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Regional Council comes forth with several new insights about role of consultant to history. Next week's Central Northeast Baltimore CIF promises to be exciting with a police officer for M.C. Mayor's Council on Criminal Justice heading the list of endorsements.

Internal: Kathy Bambeck sojourns for a week and Harold Williams stops in from Chicago to help with final week of CIF set-up.

Contradiction: Finding a new list of contributors and a way to break loose present list. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: PSU creates Summer and Fall timelines simultaneously; makes visits relative to TMs for Fall and Town Meeting rally.

Internal: Celebrates nation's birthday at its birthplace. Parades, fireworks, and live performances are shared with six grade trip and a million other visitors.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA)

Contradiction: Doing the task of the summer in three weeks before the rally with demands of Fall already pressing hard. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Town Meeting grads receive 632 rally invitations. Middletown follows up with wine and cheese party.

Internal: House interrupts thieves circuit in red Volkswagon with two House women and angry landlord chasing thieves' Cadillac through Newark; recovers TV.

Contradiction: Falling into parochialism in assignment to turf, rather than with 5000. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Calls regional development task force into being and produces \$1000 in first week. Intensifies TM circuits in spite of less funds and less troops. Follow-up meetings for Maspeth TM and Springfield Gardens/Rosedale TM produce unexpected resolve to become guilds.

Internal: Discontinuous week seems strangely continuous as circuits and framing continue. TM emcee joins House for Daily Office on his first visit. Sends Elinor Stock and Judi Harvey to GRA:Chicago and Barbara Williams to Montreal Olympics for permeation assignment.

Contradiction: Maintaining the image of one vision while leaving no particular task undone. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Holds steering committee meetings in Newington, West Haven, Bridgeport. Initiates grassroots development push with letters and visits to colleagues. Submits four major funding proposals. Framing in Springfield; Park Street Guild decides planning day for August 28.

Internal: Three sojourners arrive from South End Town Meeting: Jose Rodriguez, Tony Pardo, Elaine Vollrath. Sends Shirley Henschen to GRA:Chicago. Rudi Ke announces his decision to intern. Carnine family hosts House at picnic at their home. Hartford Courant rider brings copy of Declaration of Independence to newspaper from Philadelphia on horseback.

Contradiction: Getting ready for operating as an Area. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Portland, Maine Jaycees vote to sponsor TM (first TM for Maine). Workshop leader from Claremont signs up for GRA, asks to sojourn.

Internal: Fund-raising calls on metro colleagues becomes occasion for profound spirit care, as all are eager to be engaged in all arenas, including financial.

Contradiction: Overcoming summer mindset in NH and Maine "vacationland" in House, colleagues, and TM sponsors. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Receives initial monies for second \$600 from businesses in city of Lynn. Systematic visits of regional CAP directors and meeting with MA state Jaycees makes TM an authorized program for 1976-77.

Internal: Completes internal life structures for coming quarter, including readings from "Voices of 1776".

Contradiction: Building plans for the real number of troops that succeed. (Wk. 2)

MONTREAL**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

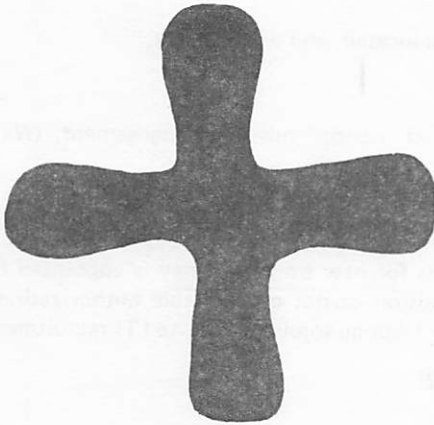

External: Fourteen attend first Obrero 5 mini-school parents' meeting; holds PCE celebration on 68th birthday of Lola (Grandmother) Paning.

Internal: Welcomes Perez-Victoriano family for intern year: Christine and her children, Mariflor, Elizabeth, Edmundo, and Aurelio. Contingency of life is dramatized in death of "Resurgence", House cat, and celebrated by Emerging Generation burial ritual.

Contradiction: Scheduling morning corporate time in midst of early external demands. (Wk. 3)

TOKYO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: Continues to work on development, turning personal contacts into missional ones, netting in-kind gift of laundry soap for starters.

Internal: Takashi Oda, who spent 1973-74 in 5th City and on House trek, shows up in Tokyo for UNICEF job, delights all as deep colleague in Sapporo.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO)

Internal: Writing proposals and visiting government departments impacts all with power of corporateness and world's struggle for methods of effectivity.

Contradiction: Deciding to risk when current political and economic climates create desire for solid, unshifting ground. (Wk. 3)

Internal: Exertion of last quarter reveals great changes under the weight of GSD with new self-consciousness and new grasp of how to meet the task demanded.

Contradiction: Taking what has happened last quarter and pushing through to the level of detail with spirit that allows community to break through. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Metro cadre planning week end produces one-year vision and one quarter plan to engage whole nation of Samoa in three campaigns at Island Paradise spot, Lufi Lufi. Bryants from Sydney spend three hours in Solo Solo with Temeses discussing galaxy and PCE; both are congregational pastors.

Internal: Quarter I perpetual sojourn models (how to multiply two people) begins with bi-Areal emphasis as Sydney pastor family, John and Laurel Bryant, arrive; Bernadette and Karina decide to sojourn Week 3.

Contradiction: Contexting colleagues to be the mission, not just participate in it. (Wk. 3)

SAN**FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: TM Assembly is regional event in David Zollars' church with 80 present. Experiences breakloose in contradictions dealing with urban, suburban and small towns. New regional dynamic emerges with many new colleagues; evening celebration highlights day.

Internal: Begins next 200 years of intensifying circuits with bi-metro ten-day sojourn, doubling troops as 60 attend opening feast. Sends Doug and Janet Kurtz to Chicago; receives Dixie Jennings and Rod Teets as interns. Hale Prather, on way to Chicago, and Feodora Mattos, on ITP trek remind all of global engagement.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of circuits while building corporateness for Summer and Fall push. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: McDonalds promises food for July 17, San Jose TM; two displays in city bicentennial celebration net registrations and favorable publicity from crowds.

Internal: Program funds for June from metro colleagues come in with all promised for July. New decor in collegium room sets mood for sojourners and circuits.

Contradiction: Projecting comprehensive circuit model beyond July. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Attending the regional TM Assembly in San Francisco is great event.

Internal: House gets ready for Quarter I by sending Marilyn Lesslie and Rosemary Kennedy to GRA:Chicago and sending Higgins and McCabe on TM circuits leaving metro and visitor from San Jose to answer the phones.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in summertime. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Sets up Camas and Burlington TMs with metro colleagues setting up appointments and making calls. Local steering committee member calls to remind consultant to be at the steering committee meeting.

Internal: Acceptance speech of Jimmy Carter impacts all.

Contradiction: Maintaining local program while having no in-House ICA office personnel. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Task force planning meetings continue to plan summer program with breakthroughs in time design, practices, and recruitment.

Internal: Builds Jaycee model for meetings with representatives of local clubs set up across Southern California through District Governors. Park Si Won gives collegium on Korea and impacts House with song "Ari-rang".

Contradiction: Pulling together into one thrust to get corporate priorities out. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Sets date in Wickenburg. Visits 18 communities during past week of circuits. Begins North Phoenix steering committee.

Internal: Celebrates past week's accomplishment by eating steaks, swimming under rubric of expenditure.

Contradiction: Being single-minded relative to getting 20 TM dates for Quarter II. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: Conversation with design students from Brigham Young University begins cataloguing of Utah intermediate technology resources. A first, Latter Day Saints leader decides to set international meeting for community of three small towns.

Internal: House and colleagues celebrate birth of David Anthony, June 23, to Jim and Kitty Overall. House member is unexpectedly offered job in University of Utah medical school, and accepts.

Contradiction: Nailing down concrete images of future significance of TM '76 completely apart from Bicentennial in order to remotivate colleagues. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Circuiters visit seven new towns, experience breakthrough on County TM strategy. ICA staff is on panel "World Hunger and American Life-styles".

Internal: Participates in global/national happenings via TV: Olympics, Democratic convention, while repainting. Holds midnight House Church by candlelight (all women).

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum in midst of intensification in all arenas, with new global assignments in sight. (Wk. 3)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Sets September TM date for Lafayette, initiates one steering committee troika, visits 15 cities and towns.

Internal: Intra-global Movement is theme for basement decor. House Church send-out to rally and collegium on Youth role in Order are week's signal events.

Contradiction : Speeding up gap between initial yeses to TM and practical activity instead of strategizing on summer mindset lag. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Two more troika meetings commit towns to Fall TM. Borrows \$1000 for program funds and creates model to develop repayment.

Internal: Celebrates end of two-year lucrative job and sends House person to GRA:Chicago.

Contradiction: Shifting from massive intensification to particular depth intensification without sensing changed time design as lax period. (Wk. 2)

EDMONTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Letter from key figure in Millwoods gives solid backing for Fall forum in Millwoods.

Internal: Hosts ITP Theodora Mattos from Berlin.

Contradiction: Finding effectivity where and when it is least expected. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Forms new sponsorship groups in Vancouver Metro.

Internal: Regional colleague spends few days in sojourn program; Feadora Mattos from Belgium House, stops by, gives collegium, continues on North American trek.

Contradiction: Learning to use regional level authorization from several networks to catalyze dozens of sponsorship meetings. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Glenellen sets October TM date. Key major funding contacts with Exxon and Standard Oil leave town.

Internal: In-kind nets fresh produce and free business courses for House member. House celebrates expenditure with hot volleyball games.

Contradiction: Recreating engagement in mission amidst summer lull. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Receives check for \$1,000 for CFC from Cargill Crain Company. North Battleford circuit finds troika reaffirming decision for CFC made three months ago.

Internal: Sends out Vergara and Baker to GRA:Chicago.

Contradiction: Discerning the necessary tasks for July to allow August intensification to happen so CFCs occur in October, not January. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Intensifies circuits with all House people involved.

Internal: Sends Emerging Generation to camp; gives up coffee in effort to meet budget and pay outstanding bills.

Contradiction: Discerning strategy that is going to break loose CFCs in September and October. (Wk. 2)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Holds four TM steering committee meetings, two new core initiations. Obtains two second jobs.

Internal: Letter from Bishop Joshi introduces sojourner, Miriam Dabhi, a key Indian church woman, for a week. Highlight of week is morning collegium study of "Generalship".

Contradiction: Dealing with tension between intensification of mission and intensification of financial enablement during summer months. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Recruitment of TM rally moves from zero to five in weekend, with calls coming in. Big Spring steering committee continues the miracle work as authorization comes in from Chamber of Commerce, Air Base, Bicentennial Committee.

Internal: Views and art forms Carter's acceptance speech for Democratic nomination at ecclesiola. Cathy Marsh's parents, the McCalls, spend week. House attends wedding of Fred Howard and Sylvia Hamed.

Contradiction: Getting people to do the necessary without giving directives. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Experiences TM core breakthroughs in Sinton, Uvalde, Mercedes, Floresville; emergency development campaign nets the needed June/July program funds.

Internal: Repaints and refurbishes House to prepare for annual rent negotiations.

Contradiction: Releasing inside small town authorization while being outside consultants. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Central City 5 Guild evaluates Stiles Circle Park miracle and waters new plants. Six people will be going to GCF rally.

Internal: Sends out Baileys to GRA:Chicago. Development team spends two weeks in OK City. Sends Nancy to Iowa for new car and job, Harlans to family discontinuity which nets \$100 for cookie jar. Facility care results in "better home and gardens".

Contradiction: Releasing community to build structures through which to maintain miracle like Stiles Circle. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Nurtures TX Jaycee contacts; does initial proposal writing designed to give TM program status at Jaycee Summer Board Meeting. Fort Worth cadres host TM booth at community July celebration.

Internal: Creates summer time design, newly functional office. Celebrates 4th of July and full cookie jar with Athens Cadre on Ellen Key's lake barge.

Contradiction: Creating new tactics which allow teams and colleagues to engage the world. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Secures TM date for Idabel, OK, on September 18, 1976. Circuits continue to be strong during summer months as new doorways open up continuously.

Internal: Enters all the proposals from the 25 TMs in OK on computer through in-kind donation of computer terminal and time.

Contradiction: Maintaining circuit pressure when everyone is on vacation. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Once again the Day II dynamos cover eight polis cities; bilocation is just around the corner. Plans RS-I for Ft. Walton Beach.

Internal: Mother Teresa of Calcutta comes to New Orleans and impacts all with her simple determination to care, and her statements that "Sanctity is not a luxury for the few, and that we are contemplatives in the middle of the world". She demonstrates that it is possible to care for the impossible.

Contradiction: Broadening the consultant base through enabling colleagues to be self-starters. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Whole region meets for celebration in Nashville and trip to Grand Ole Opry.

Internal: Entertains visitors from North Carolina, New Orleans, Houston.

Contradiction: Holding tension between internal life and move it, move it. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Finds new corporateness in fund raising, as Centrum and House combine forces with urgency of local financial situation eliciting new creativity for global and local programs.

Internal: Sends Terry McCabe and Jay Antenen to summer GRA in Chicago. Ken Fisher and Charlene Powell work development circuits from House.

Contradiction: Passing the baton in upcoming transition of troops while keeping doors open and wheels spinning. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Visits two cities that were closed during Foray 216 days, revealing two things: there is more openness now to programs that go beyond goal-setting objective, and, strategies for moving on cities have been strengthened in combat.

Internal: Holds House Church meal with brown man food and garb.

Contradiction: Letting colleagues know situation of ICA finances without forfeiting mission to dramatize reality. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Circuiter's presentation is evaluated by Homestead, FL, Toastmasters as she seeks to excite them about Town Meeting. Admiral of Coast Guard gives go-ahead for TM on Opa-Locka Air Station, with the image of an airplane hangar as the plenary area.

Internal: Old RS-I grad feels deeply honored by invitation to be House Church celebrant and is returning for another week. Chicago guardian visits and reports regarding Chicago TM and development models.

Contradiction: Maintaining stance of the general when immediate battles seem to be falling through. (Wk. 3)

CHICAGO GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO

External: Sunday morning House Church celebration sends GRA:Chicago participants back to local situation to be generals in TM campaign. Monday evening Silver Jubilee feast welcomes global priors from 23 areas of globe, every Nexus, to Global Priors Council. Hears reports from every Area on past year and futuric contradictions.

Internal: Announces birth of Silk baby girl to Jack at Neibaj Silk, July 25, 1976. Generals Lounge and GSD slide show continue to impact all.

Contradiction: Coordinating newly-created task force data from GRA:Chicago with ongoing Centrum continuum activities into one concerted thrust. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Fifth citizen in-kinds food from McDonalds single-handedly. Receives 200 paid registrations from 28 blocks and from 22 5th citizens calling for CIF; 3500 Van Buren holds second work day. Jets raise \$45 for 5th City tractor. Has CIF workshop training for new 5th citizens. Gets \$20,000 IDA grant for pre-school; safe streets patrol continues towin victories daily.

Internal: Participates in opening of GRA; impacted by slide show, address on "spirit war". True's collegium spin on the profundity of stake calling impacts all. New House decor impacts three site visit groups, especially visitor from Caritas from Brussels.

Contradiction: Forgetting contradictions previously decided to release during Week 1. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Circuits produce excited TM advocates with one Wichita man deciding to pull together troika for Northwest city TM.

Internal: Marge Tomlinson impacts House with four-day stay; sends Emerging Generation out to camp and sixth grade trip.

Contradiction: Eliciting metro troops to participate in metro circuits. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Iowa Jaycees project state-wide demonstration in December to break loose set-up. H.U.D. joins in on three urban steering committees as result of Papillion TM grad's commitment.

Internal: Marsha Winter begins sojourn. TM rally calling happens all week. Metros join House for Sunday House Church with weekly planning following.

Contradiction: Turning advocacy into steering committees, steering committees into dates. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Visits eight new towns this week as part of Summer '76. Sends two to GRA:Chicago with buckboard fiesta for 20 colleagues with barbeque chicken, watermelon as kick-off for summer.

Internal: Welcomes Terri Druckenmiller as sojourner. Guests are present for collegium every morning.

Contradiction: Masimizing effectivity of 14 TM callers when 200 are needed. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Receives Butler Foundation grant for \$5,000 for MN Town Meetings. Schedules first Urban Native American Community Forum for August with full fee in hand. Whittierites (150) attend one-week family camp at in-kind facility, including staff and meals. Signal forging out of troops with team consciousness from what on the surface appears to world to be community's problems. The 48,000 people in Minneapolis Region who attend July 3 and 4 celebration learn the "Whittier Story" from official host, Whittier colleagues.

Internal: Celebration takes place at Art Institute as Whittier workers and House are guests with city's patrons at special preview.

Contradiction: Articulating corporate story, corporate decision out of battleplan that allows things to happen. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Major emphasis is on development as Centrum team arrives in midst of regional push to raise local program money. Both efforts uncover TM set-up possibilities, long-term colleagues, and cash.

Internal: GRA:Chicago and development trek depletes House troops. Evening conversations using Week II formats are helpful reflective tool in midst of flurry.

Contradiction: Coordinating idiosyncratic strategies of lieutenants, placing battalions, repairing tanks, timing the attack to win the battle. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Bi-metro moves full speed ahead with two new steering committees, calling for GRA, and initiating new development thrust. Town Meeting Assembly held in Farm Bureau headquarters celebrates the five TMs already held and maps out follow up and future of TMs. Receives authorization from the Co-operative Extension Service; letters of endorsement and recognition go out to all offices in Illinois.

Internal: In-kind nets 2 1/2 cases of collards with subsequent need for cooking instructions, providing entree into parish. Celebrates Quarter and 4th of July with 4:00 a.m. breakfast, ending day with a bang. Mimeograph and offset press are made available. Two House members upgrade jobs.

Contradiction: Telling TM story with sense of life and death urgency. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Jaycee regional government involvement chairman agrees to go circuiting. Bergstrom paper provides support for TMs.

Internal: Transforms Emerging Generation room into General's Lounge for summer.

Contradiction: Seeing that key local people can squeeze 15-minute appointment into busy schedule of camping, fishing, vacations. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Ninety visits, 350 calls in Milwaukee in 10 days produces four tentative and one for sure TM date. Sets Brodhead TM for October. Mailing impacts Milwaukee and Madison economic, political, cultural dimensions.

Internal: Peter Cartwright, Methodist circuit rider, rides again and again in breakfast collegiums. Welcomes 12 sojourners. Dick and Stephen La Blanc rescue Youth Camp in northern Wisconsin.

Contradiction: Being global style that allows shifting gears quickly. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: At Jefferson County, KY, Jaycee Presidents Meeting, ten presidents state "we're going to do one". Seven out of 15 towns visited on circuits are new ones.

Internal: Hosts House Church plenary with ten metro colleagues. Secures \$225 for circuits and ICA titled car.

Contradiction: Learning to operate office as remote control switchboard when all are on the road. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Visits ten communities in regional demonstration. Circuits open up eight new concrete TMs for Fall, with Jaycees leading the way. Agricultural belt is where it is at right now.

Internal: Walnut Hills Youth Project, housed in ICA basement, is excited about continental rally, with four registered, after week of demonstrating community care with a clean-up project.

Contradiction: Meeting all appointments in face of August shifts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: TM paves the way: School Board says yes to special education TM; region explodes with calls from every team; Ron and Sharon Corl spend three days in northern Michigan; Lois Martin circuits in Detroit. Mails 3000 professional newsletters. CIF steering committee, House, make joint recruitment/financial visits.

Internal: Regional celebration sends out Robert Walton, Frances Roper and Allison, Grant Breiner to GRA:Chicago. Samuel Roper goes to circuit the home of metro colleague; all other House members participate in regional circuitry.

Contradiction: Holding tension between long-range impact tactics and immediate 45 communities that need pre-sponsor meeting within six weeks. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Plan for summer TM cultivation breaks loose with three new steering committees, growing list of TM grad consultants. Visits old metro grads for TM pledging; produces TM rally registrations and pledges, bringing count to 19 for rally attendance.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to highlight week as celebration of external expenditure and reception for new TM grads. Development plan begins to activate non-givers for TM funding. Goes on regional camping celebration for 4th of July.

Contradiction: Organizing TM forays, steering committees, and follow-ups with consultants, materials, cars, all at the same time. (Wk. 3)

NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Presents GSD and TM packets to Congresswoman Barbara Jordan and sets up appointment to visit her in the near future.

Internal: Team meetings sort out duties/responsibilities of management, operations and development arenas.

Contradiction: Experiencing TM rally as gap rather than springboard. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Second city-wide advisory committee for TM turns advocacy to sponsorship as Action Coalition of Elders commit themselves to sponsorship of TMs wherever they are held.

Internal: Greets Joyce Ollison for consultant training PSU and Sally Fenton back to New York after six-week urban TM circuit; celebrates July 5 with swim in Youghiogheny River.

Contradiction: Designing transrational time for Phase III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Twenty people attend CIF steering committee meeting. At Jaycees University Convention, one workshop becomes mini-Town Meeting; as a result, 30 Jaycees sign a card wanting to be visited in the future.

Internal: Rochester Metro Cadre decides to attend House collegium on Tuesday and Thursday morning for next 13 weeks. Sojourner, stopping in for the night, fills gap while many House people are sent out on circuits, GRA, permeation.

Contradiction: Building the forms of corporateness which allow caring people to be significantly involved across the region. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Global task force arrives with all going on development calls. Commitment from CAP on Richmond urban strategy puts TM on down the trail.

Internal: Sends out (reluctantly) troop to GRA:Chicago and troops suddenly triple in size with development task force, sixth grade trip task force, and sojourn families.

Contradiction: Carrying structures rather than dragging them amidst great internal and external missional shifts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: First pre-consult miracle in Washington GSD calls forth over 100 residents of Ivy City for Community Clean-Up Day as all ages and people in blue put shoulders to a common task. Community resident exclaims: "This is the first time in 32 years that I have seen this many people work together on a common project."

Internal: Sunday morning six-hour House Council and task force reassignments dramatize shift from Horizons Festival to GSD prep.

Contradiction: Turning the waves created by Horizons Festival weekend into the tidal wave for GSD in nation's capitol. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Regional Council comes forth with several new insights about role of consultant to history. Next week's Central Northeast Baltimore CIF promises to be exciting with a police officer for M.C. Mayor's Council on Criminal Justice heading the list of endorsements.

Internal: Kathy Bambeck sojourns for a week and Harold Williams stops in from Chicago to help with final week of CIF set-up.

Contradiction: Finding a new list of contributors and a way to break loose present list. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: After weeks of tactical work, Jaycees and mayors nets come alive as 15 mayors in one day and 14 Jaycee presidents are visited.

Internal: Sends out second wave of troops for the summer program as momentum does not decrease.

Contradiction: Creating new Movement with depth and strength of old Movement. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Metro development task force raises \$600 in hand during Week II. Landlord's brother sets up two days of TM appointments and plans rally attendance.

Internal: Super ICA office acquires gold-plated white wall paneling, fluorescent lights, shag rug in-kind.

Contradiction: Needing to demand global involvement of TM grads. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Week II of development phone blitz nets \$910 with another \$718 possible. Long Island office of Gestetner agrees to send operator and equipment to Town Meetings plus provide all paper and special binder for documents.

Internal: Intensified push on capital verse conversations grounds wisdom of scripture in a time of doing.

Contradiction: Following through with sustained development effort over the long haul. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Creates new warboard for collegium room, clearly laying out 1976-77 circuit rationale, meetings scheduled, other external events. Puts 30 TM document proposals on computer as part of GRA participation from Hartford.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD)

Internal: Receives unexpected gift from local merchant of station wagon full of bread and pastry; he was so impressed with enthusiasm that he promised to come back often because "there are no starving people where I come from". Study of Community paper is helpful reminder of life together. Sends Elaine Vollrath to GRA:Chicago.

Contradiction: Training 50 metro colleagues to be TM consultants. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Vermont Jaycees ask for 1 1/2 hour presentation-workshop at their state board meeting in August.

Internal: Celebrates birth of Albert David Bellamy to Michael and Barbara Bellamy on July 2, 1976, 7 lbs. 2 ozs. The grandparents visit.

Contradiction: Following through on TM openings, especially Manchester, Nashua, Portland, Bath, with necessary troops and intensity. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Rhode Island task force decides to set up 15 TMs for the Fall. New breakloose with MA state Jaycees happens as p.r. man says "this is just what we need; if the Jaycees do 40 or 50 on one day, just think of the publicity, and we could invite other communities to join us."

Internal: Regional meeting of Institute offices coordinates summer expansion of TM set-up. Development plan gives order to that overwhelming demand.

Contradiction: Continuing to build long-term models, knowing they are temporary balloon. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

Contradiction: Working through and clarifying crucial tactical areas in quarter when most of House will be outside continent. (Wk. 3)

While presenting proposal to Freedom From Hunger for 200,000 USD, Nairobi Nexus found selves suprised by suggestion of the General Secretary that she bring several other large international funding agencies to visit Kawangware, as she was sure that they would be interested in helping. Bombay received gifts of 55,000 rupees from a public sector company. Nexus Chicago, using the expertise of House priors for two weeks of circuiting, celebrates most successful month of cash in-hand for year. Beginnings of regularized giving to GSD take place in Nairobi with first individual (\$200 per month) and company (\$600 per month) commitments. The contradiction lies in the arena of figuring out how to incorporate the tactics needed to meet increased immediate cash and in-kind needs while maintaining ongoing visits on current strategic thrusts.

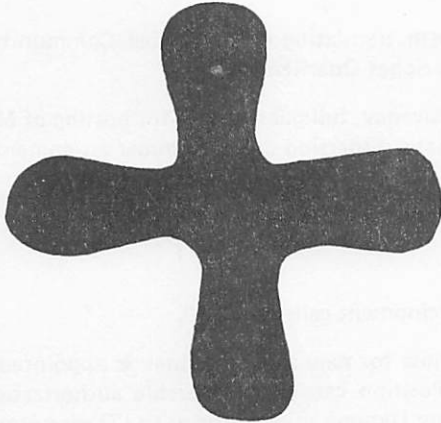

Internal: Creates new ICA office in village storage building. Schumacher review focuses practical implication; Choe Tong Shik returns from Seoul.

Contradiction: Re-instigating guild planning dynamic now that barley harvest is over and road is built. (Wk. 4)

Internal: Welcomes Ilonka and Stacey Roker from Nassau for two weeks sojourn and study. Guardian's Meeting Tuesday night brainstorms ways to raise money. Works on new decor, using summer program theme.

Contradiction: Doing task with fewer troops and same mission with everyone in midst of travel to and from Chicago. (Wk. 4)

CHICAGO**GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO**

External: Holds TMs in Grand Junction, Charlotteville, and CIF in Detroit. Creates memorials during Global Priors Council. Assigns special group to work on 1976-77 assignments around the clock.

Internal: Saturday evening celebration includes playing of strategy game "Risk" in Generals' Lounge by over 200 generals. Contradiction: Maximizing effectivity of 14 TM callers when 200 are needed. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Receives Butler Foundation grant for \$5,000 for MN Town Meetings. Schedules first Urban Native American Community Forum for August with full fee in hand. Whittierites (150) attend one-week family camp at in-kind facility, including staff and meals. Signal forging out of troops with team consciousness from what on the surface appears to world to be community's problems. The 48,000 people in Minneapolis Region who attend July 3 and 4 celebration learn the "Whittier Story" from official host, Whittier colleagues.

Internal: Celebration takes place at Art Institute as Whittier workers and House are guests with city's patrons at special preview.

Contradiction: Articulating corporate story, corporate decision out of battleplan that allows things to happen. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Circuiters in Quincy, IL, do development and TM set-up, hold consult with high school teachers and students toward CIF implementation. Interlude performers from St. Charles, MO, TM set up benefit concert for regional support.

Internal: Hosts ten guests on way to rally from OK City, and Amarillo, accompanying them on last leg of journey. After participating in find Area meeting at Rally, House view rehab housing, shopping center, block beautification in 5th City.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between TM set-up urgencies and maintenance of effective House support systems of files, supplies, finances. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Bi-metro moves full speed ahead with two new steering committees, calling for GRA, and initiating new development thrust. Town Meeting Assembly held in Farm Bureau headquarters celebrates the five TMs already held and maps out follow up and future of TMs. Receives authorization from the Co-operative Extension Service; letters of endorsement and recognition go out to all offices in Illinois.

Contradiction: Learning to operate office as remote control switchboard when all are on the road. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Visits ten communities in regional demonstration. Circuits open up eight new concrete TMs for Fall, with Jaycees leading the way. Agricultural belt is where it is at right now.

Internal: Walnut Hills Youth Project, housed in ICA basement, is excited about continental rally, with four registered, after week of demonstrating community care with a clean-up project.

Contradiction: Meeting all appointments in face of August shifts. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: TM paves the way: School Board says yes to special education TM; region explodes with calls from every team; Ron and Sharon Corl spend three days in northern Michigan; Lois Martin circuits in Detroit. Mails 3000 professional newsletters. CIF steering committee, House, make joint recruitment/financial visits.

Internal: Regional celebration sends out Robert Walton, Frances Roper and Allison, Grant Breiner to GRA:Chicago. Samuel Roper goes to circuit the home of metro colleague; all other House members participate in regional circuitry.

Contradiction: Holding tension between long-range impact tactics and immediate 45 communities that need pre-sponsor meeting within six weeks. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Plan for summer TM cultivation breaks loose with three new steering committees, growing list of TM grad consultants. Visits old metro grads for TM pledging; produces TM rally registrations and pledges, bringing count to 19 for rally attendance.

Internal: Ecclesiola continues to highlight week as celebration of external expenditure and reception for new TM grads. Development plan begins to activate non-givers for TM funding. Goes on regional camping celebration for 4th of July.

Contradiction: Organizing TM forays, steering committees, and follow-ups with consultants, materials, cars, all at the same time. (Wk. 3)

Contradiction: Experiencing TM rally as gap rather than springboard. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Second city-wide advisory committee for TM turns advocacy to sponsorship as Action Coalition of Elders commit themselves to sponsorship of TMs wherever they are held.

Internal: Greets Joyce Ollison for consultant training PSU and Sally Fenton back to New York after six-week urban TM circuit; celebrates July 5 with swim in Youghiogeny River.

Contradiction: Designing transrational time for Phase III. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Twenty people attend CIF steering committee meeting. At Jaycees University Convention, one workshop becomes mini-Town Meeting; as a result, 30 Jaycees sign a card wanting to be visited in the future.

Internal: Rochester Metro Cadre decides to attend House collegium on Tuesday and Thursday morning for next 13 weeks. Sojourner, stopping in for the night, fills gap while many House people are sent out on circuits, GRA, permeation.

Contradiction: Training 50 metro colleagues to be TM consultants. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Vermont Jaycees request 1 1/2 hour presentation workshop at their State Board Meeting in August.

Internal: Celebrates the birth of Albert David Bellamy to Michael and Barbara Bellamy, July 2, 1976, weighing 7 lbs. 2 ozs. The grandparents visit.

Contradiction: Following through on TM openings, especially Manchester, Nashua, Portland, Bath, with necessary troops and intensity. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Rhode Island task force decides to set up 15 TMs for the Fall. New breakloose with MA state Jaycees happens as p.r. man says "this is just what we need; if the Jaycees do 40 or 50 on one day, just think of the publicity, and we could invite other communities to join us."

Internal: Regional meeting of Institute offices coordinates summer expansion of TM set-up. Development plan gives order to that overwhelming demand.

Contradiction: Continuing to build long-term models, knowing they are temporary balloon. (Wk. 3)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Breakthrough visit happens with Roman Catholic hierarchy; he informs us of his intentions in relation to the internal care of three Frontenac Roman Catholic parishes which is very much in line with our hopes. CFC rally permits communities considering CFSs to work through challenges and proposals.

Internal: Ecclesiola celebration allows confirmation of hopes held for a long time regarding symbolic power of Frontenac.

Contradiction: Reconciling mutually exclusive demands to participate in GCF rally and breaking even in House and programme finances. (Wk. 3)

External: Eleven colleagues from London and Toronto Regions attend the GCF Rally in Chicago, including two people assigned by recreation director, who is a CFC workshop leader.

Internal: Area Montreal rents a bus so all may travel to the Rally as one group.

Contradiction: Sowing the seeds for a Regional Council that gives motivating vision and practical images of how to get the job done. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Wintario grants are available for city of Ottawa forums. Recently recognized colleague decides to participate in rally.

Internal: First time unequivocal yes is said in response to invitation, namely, every night is a guest night.

Contradiction: Enabling colleagues to take self-conscious initiative that will allow all to move corporately in a common task. (Wk. 3)

CARACAS RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Finishes \$20,000 funding proposal for January HDP consult; takes it to Latin American Division of U.S. Bishops' Conference. Completes list of prioritized GSD sites.

Internal: Sends Rafael Davila to GRA:Chicago. In midst of flu epidemic, House completes program design for year.

Contradiction: Working through and clarifying crucial tactical areas in quarter when most of House will be outside continent. (Wk. 3)

Five tons of soya flour were also in-kind to help launch Maliwada Nutri-Food Industry. Meeting with Shaw Foundation in Singapore opens up new possible funding for GSD in Malaysia while total tax exemption in Australia for ICA releases \$18,000 from Utah Foundation. Gracious presence of Development Centrum:Chicago hosted Nexus global priors at victory reception after Global Priors Council, celebrating greatest month in Centrum history, over \$350,000 in hand. The contradiction lies in the arena of creating the systems that will maintain the ongoing need per month while simultaneously meeting the "big money" needed for replication.

Maliwada miracles include fodder planted, shed sit chosen, 10 cows promised for dairy industry. Surybhar. Devatkar impacts businessmen, government officials, diplomats on three-city development, advocacy, authorization trip, flying in plane, talking on phone (to Chicago) for first time. Authorization breaks through simultaneously in Singapore with second meeting with local minister of Parliament, contact with agricultural expert of Singapore. Nairobi begins training five interns entering ITI; discovers anew the painful task of training new colleagues in RS-I. Chicago Nexus shifts thrusts of Research Nexus, re-names posts, creates public writing task force. The contradiction lies in the arena of turning villagers' sense of dependency away from auxiliary to those leaders who are ready to handle it to catalyze replication.
