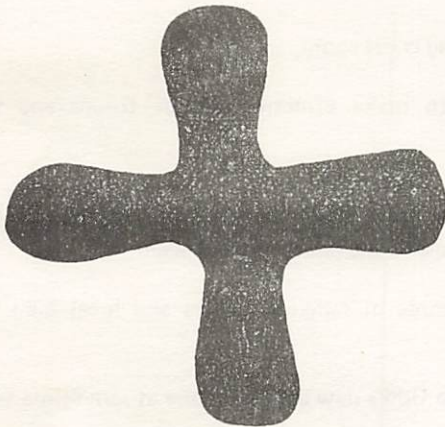

## LONDON

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON**

External: Guild impacts 100 with waterborne jumbo sale raising local funds for preschool which has been licensed in record time with first class with 25 enrolled. Practical training sessions are held for home shoe industry with guaranteed initiatory loan. Nine-week curriculum for island youth is launched with strong affirmation from educational and social service structures. Auxiliary and guild make further calls directed towards opening cinema and social club.

Internal: Week 11 portrays sophistication of collegium room. Ship comes in as receive several hundred pieces of crockery in-kind in readiness for Europe's GRA from Sea Lines.

Contradiction: Focusing on bull's eye of IHDP target arenas by using symbolic power of one thrust. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW**

External: Edinburgh and Glasgow cadres meet to run through and culturally modify TM for Scottish audiences.

Internal: House car sold for scrap limiting circuit activity.

Contradiction: Enabling "powerlessness" of House due to troops and finances to strengthen cadre's responsibility for involvement. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL**

External: Bristol plays key role in funding of Isle of Dogs cottage industry by sending key guardian to visit Island who promises to completely fund shoe-making industry.

Internal: Receives Jeremy Bland which leads to impromptu celebration while reflecting on "One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest". Receives Sheila Maguire and Stephen Polanzk from London. Youth exams are in full swing.

Contradiction: Turning cancelled RS-I participants into yeses for GRA: Isle of Dogs. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER**

External: RS-I registrations is at 12 yeses one week before course. Isle of Dogs representative, Susan Crick, speaks to 20 residents of Orrell Park Community in Liverpool. Speaking engagement with Young Christian Students (YCS) nets 4 and colleague couple of long standing to host and teach in RS-I.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER)**

**Internal:** Celebrates Peter Clements assignment to India. Three regional guests spend 2 days in House.

**Contradiction:** Grasping sense of critical need of self-symbol within corporate symbol. (Wk.8)

**PARIS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS**

**External:** Leads services in two different churches on same Sunday. Kawangware slide presentation breaks loose external missional possibility for international church, while two services are led for host British Methodist Church.

**Internal:** Transforms split-level organ motor room into enchanting guest room.

**Contradiction:** Structuring external tasks and internal life to make effective use of troops and time. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME**

**External:** In midst of compiling data from Trastevere research questionnaire, group of students from English Language Institute (ICA) drop in and push for concrete action now to move on revealed need.

**Internal:** Ecclesiola guest night continues to bear fruit as people of religious orders and local men from Trastevere meet together over Schumacher.

**Contradiction:** Doing tactical implementation that is obedient to God's new activity while at same time taking seriously quarter's battleplan. (Wk.9)

**LAGOS**

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS**

**External:** Prepares first ITI mailing in anticipation of receiving brochures from Nairobi.

**Internal:** Management trek comes to Lagos; experiences globality of very local.

**Contradiction:** Getting troops for ITI recruitment and development in Black Africa's most populous nation with gross domestic product which is more than that of all other Black African nations put together. (Wk.5)

**BRUSSELS**

**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

**External:** Nexus goes to Brussels Religious House to hear El Baiad report by Fred and Sarah Buss.

**Internal:** Hosts Global Development team, Joseph Mathews, Neil Vance, Charles Hahn following key visits in Bonn and Berlin.

**Contradiction:** Performing practical continental servant role in all areas needed in midst of quarter-long dispersion of troops. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS**

**External:** Global Social Demonstration (GSD) slide show at local church businessmen's club raises possibility of support from former tanker captain and Isle of Dogs docker. Five more GSD sites around Liege added to list. Jaycees party and week-end conference on community and parish enable contact with concerned local people.

**Internal:** Sends out Isle of Dogs GRA mailing. Does new GSD Belgium decor.

**Contradiction:** Prevailing mindset that community care and grassroots participation possible only through political structures. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM**

**External:** Signal evening with medical missionary sisters yields interest in GRA:Europe and GSD slide presentation set-up for residents of well-known high rise city. Receives 5 yeses to GRA:Europe and 3 good possibilities.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM)**

**Internal:** Invitations to GSD slide show yields growing list of particularly significant colleagues. Metro circuit trip by recently returned ITP participant creates great interest in ITP and GRA:Europe.

**Contradiction:** Moving with strategic thrusts and tactical actions blocked by complexity and unclarity with regard to local implementation. (Wk.8)

**FRANKFURT RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

**External:** Presentations, conversations, informations and church services making up the Frankfurt "Kirchentage" (Church Days) and trek to Stuttgart and Pforzheim Metros reveal an omnipresent concern for life in the city.

**Internal:** Jim Mathews stays overnight. Josa De Almada, refugee from Angola, decides to attend ecclesiola on regular basis. Sets up 2 new rooms in House; accomplishes this task with more non-chalance than last year.

**Contradiction:** Seeing no German interns in immediate sights. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN**

**External:** Facility found in heart of Global Social Demonstration site. Plans are in gear for immediate relocation.

**Internal:** Bishop Kurt Scharf and wife visit House and are deeply excited by Kawangware film and promise assistance for Berlin GSD.

**Contradiction:** Subletting present facility while completing facility in community. (Wk.9)

**KINSHASA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA**

**External:** Thirty-five attend Lusaka PLC; grads help teach. Forty business men and women from 25 major national and international companies gather at University of Zambia for LENS; response is "We'll recruit the next one." ITI site is confirmed. Mails 85 ITI invitations to PLC grads.

**Internal:** Movement grads move in for weekend to enable LENS. Lyn Mathews brings Isle of Dogs Consult to Lusaka and sets get-prepared-context. Lusaka businesses provide in-kind needs for program. Host teachers from Chicago, London, Nairobi.

**Contradiction:** Regrouping for ITI, HRM and development while consolidating past gains. (Wk.9)

**NAIROBI****GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI**

**External:** New signs go up on Demonstration Urban Farm in midst of second French bean harvest, averaging 30 pounds of beans a day; Kawangware Business Association hosts Humphrey Slade, former speaker of Parliament, for lunch; local handicraft sales total 80 USD in one day; and Kodak decides to donate film and processing for KHDP.

**Internal:** Hosts Mary Bengel and Gary Tomlinson en route from Lusaka LENS; nexus analyzes block industry through screen of "Small is Beautiful".

**Contradiction:** Staying ahead of increasing project momentum so that it is carefully directed. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI**

**External:** Small group of Bahati 5 PCE colleagues gather in House for Week II of methods training and indicative battleplanning on Africa.

**Internal:** Gift of 70 pounds of green bananas from Uganda colleagues initiates creative African menus.

**Contradiction:** Moving concretely on bringing in paid registrations for ITI from broad arena of affirmation. (Wk.9)

**BOMBAY****GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY**

External: Two Maliwada residents, Asaram and Umadevi, are sent out to GRA:Hyderabad.

Internal: Joseph Slicker arrives for one-day visit to Maliwada on his way to SEAPAC.

Contradiction: Securing sustaining structures, training emerging leaders and breaking open new ground all at once in order to both ensure that Maliwada stands as stronghold while taking concrete steps toward replication. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY**

External: Group from Bombay proceed to Maliwada to join GRA work weekend, and stay for rest of GRA in Hyderabad.

Internal: Welcomes Jessica Fitzroy Casswell born to Timothy and Rose Casswell 22nd of May, 11:55 p.m.

Contradiction: Doing internal and external preparation for return of troops. (Wk.9)

**DELHI****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Sends out 40 GRA "job" letters with reply cards and receives 5 answers in 3 days; books train reservations for 40 to GRA.

Internal: Collegium study of "Intermediate Technology" regrounds practical approach to real contradiction in community reformulation. Guests include Mr. J.S. Dethé, Chandigarh with plans for Maliwada Community Center, T. M. Kumar with plans to attend GRA and Rev. Robert Kimble from Manchester with his last few weeks of year's global odyssey.

Contradiction: Enabling majority of regions to risk definite commitment to GRA with GRA 3 weeks away. (Wk.5)

**MADRAS****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD**

External: Guild meeting following PCE miracle workday decides to meet weekly.

Internal: Visits by Richard West, Cyprian D'Souza Satya Kumar, and Lynn Mathews reveals the intra-globality of movement. Lyn's spin on "The One Holy Catholic Church" points toward new form of church.

Contradiction: Training the necessary troops for the long march. (Wk.7)

**CALCUTTA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Final stage of GRA recruitment reveals 26 registered (5 from Circus Five).

Internal: Global Management Trek arrives. Lyn Mathews spins on Isle of Dogs Consult and Cyprian D'Souza giving context highlights visit.

Contradiction: Shifting from complete immersion in ITI/GRA preparation to necessary Area mission after GRA. (Wk.7)

**SINGAPORE****GLOBAL CENTRUM: SINGAPORE**

External: Donna McCleskey preaches at Barker Road Methodist worship service; appointment is set with permanent secretary to Ministry of Social Affairs as key step toward GSD prep.

Internal: Patti Morton of Hong Kong House visits; David McCleskey returns from Global Finance Trek; and hosts 6 guests ecclesiola night.

Contradiction: Getting clarity on vision of 1977 in midst of radical alternatives for new directions in nexus zone. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE**

**External:** Two men from Chief Minister's Office of Sarawak Government journey to Lapu Lapu for GSD Consult. Receives ITI registrations that move Singapore Region from "Don't fail" to "Heaven". Regional family hosts order for evening of Indian feasting in honor of Maliwada.

**Internal:** Delightful evening combines welcoming Mary Warren Moffett to Singapore after great Kuala Lumpur LENS, birthday celebrations, and send out of ITI staff to Penang. Everyone pours over GSD photos from Kawangware and Malidwada that Mary Warren brings, plus Kwangyung and Lapu Lapu photos from Rafos in Hong Kong. Sends Bill Westre to teach in Kuala Lumpur LENS.

**Contradiction:** Getting financial undergirding for ITI:Penang and GRA:Hong Kong. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR**

**External:** External: Nearly all Kuala Lumpur ITI participants are from PCE. Decide that remaining PCE members and House are about GSD research putting LENS follow-up and guardian development in that context. Thirty-four man LENS at Kuala Lumpur Hilton comes off well raising possibilities for company in-house LENS and consults.

**Internal:** Sends out Jayasekaras and Gail West to prepare for ITI:Penang at same time sends out PCE members to ITI. Dick West returns from 17 day consulting trip to India with amazing stories about Maliwada progress and new replication document for India which provides new authorization for GSD in Malaysia. Mrs. Jayasekara becomes Emerging Generation prior for next four weeks.

**Contradiction:** Getting GSD research done when permeation, ITI development, LENS and guardian follow-up demand all time. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA**

**External:** Forty-three register for ITI from Jakarta and Manado Regions and IBM contributes \$200 to ITI. Village leader and National Council of Social Welfare staff member go to Lapu Lapu Consult. First in series of 8 PCE training sessions focus on missional family.

**Internal:** Celebrates birth of Ruth Helen Morris on May 14 and welcomes arrival of Patty Morton of Hong Kong on a business survey of Indonesia. Sends out two House members to ITI preparation and one House member to Lapu Lapu Consult.

**Contradiction:** Keeping all programs "moving it" with all three in-House people sent out to other cities. (Wk.9)

**HONG KONG GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG**

**External:** Holds treks in Manila and Tokyo; LENS in Tokyo; Hong Kong pedagogy for Chinese teachers. Holds 2nd GRA Recruitment Night with GSD slides. Authorization calls with government figures in Taipei break loose registration.

**Internal:** Steve Carter visits for couple days on his way back to States to attend school. Redesigns space of living room and collegium. Sends out one from each centrum to Lapu Lapu Consult.

**Contradiction:** Getting tactics-tactics done effectively yet efficiently and dance at same time. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG**

**External:** One registers for GRA:Hong Kong. Recruitment network begins to bring in RS-I participants and many 'I am interested' phone calls for ITI:Taipei.

**Internal:** Sends out Patty Morton to 8-week assignment with her job exploring future economy of Indonesia. Buddhist Economics study excites and challenges all.

**Contradiction:** Making available energy effective with 4 course quotas to be reached by Week 8. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG**

External: ITI momentum building with 18 at island-wide PLC; receives nod from Tainan Catholic Bishop and mails 450 invitations.

Internal: Kawangware document and "Small is Beautiful", Buddhist Economics whet post-ITI appetites.

Contradiction: Discerning length of strategic pause between casting out the nets and hauling the ITI fish in. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA**

External: Final development push for Lapu Lapu Consult taps religious orders; picks up checks during first wave of typhoon. Consult participants are greeted in torrential rains and enabled to reach Cebu for opening of Consult.

Internal: Sends nine to Consult, leaving five to handle Manila's ground operations. Keeps basic systems operating in midst of typhoon.

Contradiction: Doing the necessary in midst of typhoon as banks, post offices, government offices and businesses close. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI**

External: ITI yeses pass quota of 30 and still climbing. Global Language School in three metros helps prepare for ITI. English RS-I has 20 signed up.

Internal: Sends out Ed Dillinger to Lapu Lapu Consult. Kang Byoung Hoon lays over, visits key host committee member, and tells colleagues "GSD and PCE is the direction of the church."

Contradiction: Securing 10 Roman Catholic participants for ITI. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU**

External: Cardinal Rosales of Cebu gives his blessing to LHDP while governor and mayor commit their presence to opening session. Three hundred bags of in-kind cement arrive and masons volunteer work all night to complete flooring.

Internal: House attends 2 fiestas--Sudtunggan and key guild colleagues' community fiesta; the latter serves as great welcome for consult team, Crockers and Wiegels.

Contradiction: Having site ready in midst of total consult prep. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO**

External: Hand-written, hand-delivered invitations produce results at PCE core meeting. Four confirmations for GSD Consult and 4 more considering. Regional newsletter produced in only one day (in-kind printing).

Internal: Daily learning of "motivating phrases" (e.g. fantastic, tes bon, magaling, jao) in 10 languages spiritizes House; also includes learning a Thai drinking song.

Contradiction: Assuring three participants to GRA:Hong Kong in midst of intensifying multiple demands. (Wk.8)

**TOKYO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO**

External: First 100% businessmen's LENS in Hong Kong sector is held in Tokyo and demonstrates breakloose from traditional Japanese static and hierarchial style with enthusiastic participation by each participant.

Internal: Two collegiums awakens to new images of mission when sojourner Misako Motoshige talks about historic problems in Sanya area, and Terry Bergdall reports on missional approach in Fukuoka Region giving fresh outlook on doing the impossible.

Contradiction: Building new and imaginative approach to hold new colleagues and new possibilities birthed by LENS and PCE. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU**

External: Replication is downbeat of week as Agricultural Guild visits Isadore Ranch, largest ranch on island; Ri Chang (village leaders) Association is briefed on Kwangyung and guardians from Jeju City and Seoul, including Dr. Helen Chung Lee, visit Kwangyung.

Internal: Joins residents from all around island in celebrating mystery of Mount Halla in annual Azala Festival.

Contradiction: Experiencing polity struggle as opportunity for creating necessary new forms. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL**

External: Metro trek to Taegu and Chunju continues grassroots development. Global Social Demonstration funding proposals are prepared for foundations.

Internal: First Odyssey in Seoul Region outside of ITI impacts all. House welcomes Kang Byoung Hoon and Harry Wainwright back from trek to Jeju.

Contradiction: Sustaining area projects without collapsing internal maintenance. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA**

External: Guild recognizes its a corporate unit and is financially responsible for guild attending GRA:Hong Kong. Quarter IV celebration is planned following model-building for clean-up of land in parish.

Internal: Emerging Generation structures begin in fine style as colleagues take children to see "MacBeth", "Friendly Beasts" and the zoo all first week. Colleagues donate beds and help with resettlement as four Ziegenmier girls arrive plus arrival of sojourner, Mr. Kwak from Republic of Korea.

Contradiction: Moving beyond "Thursday Night Guild" image to "24-Hour Guild". (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA**

External: LENS gives context for guardian's decisions. PCE guild community leaders seriously consider next step to ward community meeting. Receives five requests for ITI invitation letters during Sendai PCE consult with 10 pastors in Okayama sparking cadre interest.

Internal: Evaluates ecclesiola and Daily Office as deeply sustaining. "Small is Beautiful" appears around table in Japanese translation and continues to beckon new economic perspective.

Contradiction: Moving necessary people to ITI registration. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI**

External: Visits Anglicans in 3 metros and Kikusue in Sapporo as another possible PCE site.

Internal: Makes preparations for children's camp for grade school children in Japan.

Contradiction: Trying to find PCE sites with conflicting images of PCE unclarified. (Wk.8)

**SYDNEY****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: New England Regional Council of Social Development OK's \$400 for CMA. Surry Hills CMA capitalizes on May day polling to pass out 3,500 brochures on CMA to approximately 4000 people.

Internal: Receives Mark and Olive back from 5th City Consult and Dick Stanley back from area-wide CMA trek.

Contradiction: Fielding CMA story that pulls the plug on every parochialism and ends with positive presumptive close. (Wk.6)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH**

**External:** Receives national authorization from visits to Bishop Witt (Oombulgurri is in his Diocese) and State Government Departments. Speaking engagement with Melville Business and Professional Women's group strengthens base for CMA.

**Internal:** Arrival of Sam Alberts and Selwyn Meehan from Oombulgurri Council and Ray Richmond strengthens development thrust. Jim Danby blows guardians' report to global dimension in presentation to open-house day.

**Contradiction:** Building guardians and new movement and demonstrating methods that move people beyond their dissatisfaction with present known methods of primal community building. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN**

**External:** Initial CMA visits to all 10 Darwin Aldermen bring affirmative response.

**Internal:** Third House move in year temporarily moves House out of PCE area. New address is 57 Wellington Parade, Alawa, Casuarina, N.T. 5792. All mail should go to P.O. Box 4781, Darwin, N.T. Hosts 2 Oombulgurri students on way back to Brisbane.

**Contradiction:** Putting enough sustained push in an area to get breakthrough. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI**

**External:** Preschool building complete just in time for crucial Department of Aboriginal Affairs(DAA) inspection. Council hosts visitors in fine style as all guild areas shine. First eggs from second batch of chickens.

**Internal:** Hosts House full of visitors including local and state DAA officials and representative of Oombulgurri's auditors. "Small is Beautiful" continues to reflect. Sends emissaries back to school, students and teachers on holiday trip.

**Contradiction:** Implementing appropriate tactics in face of \$1000 demands and \$1.00 budget. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE**

**External:** Southeast CMA trek opens up new ground while 7 colleagues make themselves available for treks in Adelaide. Speaking engagement to 6 Anglicans raises deep vocational issues.

**Internal:** Two House adults and 18 guests attend House Church. Alan Hawke and friend from Sydney sojourn for 3 days. Ray Richmond stops by en route to Perth. Karen Clover, Thurston Birtwhistle and Maureen Ellis come to Oombulgurri guest ecclesiola.

**Contradiction:** Keeping one step ahead of chaos in order to engage colleagues in practical doing. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

**External:** Portland Community Meeting is set for July 17. Keith and Josie Braithwaite begin research on coordinating committee for CMA, Port Melbourne.

**Internal:** First week of second school term is celebrated as House and guests see fabulous production of "Jesus Christ Superstar" who says "It's easy to conquer death...all you have to do is die."

**Contradiction:** Unblocking GRA participants. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA**

**External:** Initial responses for ITI:Penang come in. Further Oombulgurri speaking engagement is arranged. Discovers another major funding possibility through World Council of Churches.

**Internal:** Str. Janet Hughes (Mercy Roman Catholic Order) arrives to sojourn for week. Str. Anne Dawson (Ursuline Roman Catholic Order) comes for meal. Receives invitation to talk GSD through retired Bishop Garnsey. Roxana Harper and David McCleskey walk through order and program finances.

**Contradiction:** Finding out where to get finances to enable ITI and GRA participants. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE**

External: ITI:Penang travel funding nears halfway mark and countdown to takeoff begins; Tourist Bureau and State Government are "quite happy" to lend slides for Community Meeting Australia workbook; sends out PCE celebration invitations.

Internal: Welcomes students back from holidays, sojourner family for 2nd time, and CMA colleagues from Sydney.

Contradiction: Aligning secondary brooding with primary image—House lives are about CMA. (Wk.8)

**SUVA****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO**

External: EMAKITKIT becomes stance of Marshallese claiming ever larger responsibility for Marshallese Human Development Project as TASC member builds crab farm, and Ebon, Jaliut and other islands "at work".

Internal: Ecclesiola turns into celebration as Summer Prep Team returns from Ebon and Jaliut bearing gifts from colleagues in South.

Contradiction: Creating signs of community care in midst of style of succeeding at doing commendable job being block. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA**

External: Party at guardian's house to send out metro cadre member to Canberra provides opportunity for informal discussion with Prime Minister of W. Samoa. Flexible time design enable metro cadre to plan first miracle which will coincide with Independence Celebration.

Internal: Roxana Harper breaks into House finance meeting with phone call from Singapore. House member lands job as supermarket designer for school holidays.

Contradiction: Chasing steeple as challenge with hurdles getting raised mid-jump. (Wk.9)

**SAN FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Community colleges decide to co-sponsor 3 TMs. Date set for El Cerrito TM in September. New combination discovered after Fremont TM: Elders and Jaycees.

Internal: Area Prior Vance reports on Global Social Demonstration possibilities among native Americans. Lyn Mathews' visit brings new global picture and image of "being the presence". Bishop Joshi, Mr. Charles, Mr. Lal, Mr. Kumar from India visit following Methodist General Conference.

Contradiction: Finding way to build momentum over summer while maintaining pre-July 4 operational plan. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE**

External: Steering committee for San Jose TM happens amidst numerous visits to Kiwanis and Jaycees which set up sponsorship presentations. Contacts multiply through Human Relations Commission and Mexican-American organization for Community Issues Forum.

Contradiction: Holding tension between dreams and detail work needed to fulfill them. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO**

External: First long-distance workshop leader training for Fallon, NV TM '76 is accomplished while American River College of Sacramento sets November 20 TM date.

Internal: House and metro are impacted as project one year program budget with money in hand as metro becomes self supporting. Celebrates Susan McCabe's 26th birthday. Ecclesiola sodality deals with bi-metro issues and week's calendar.

Contradiction: Journeying TM ambassadors (circuiters) into TM '76 consultants. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE**

**External:** Central Washington circuit breaks open five new towns.

**Internal:** Othello colleague in-kinds 300 pounds of frozen french fries and 500 pounds of raw potatoes. Workshop leader party and conversation on procedures discloses deeper sensitivity to happening of challenge workshop.

**Contradiction:** Deciding the tactics now for fall TM set-up. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES**

**External:** Starts regional planning on summer program in Los Angeles. Visiting District Governors of Jaycees opens up possibilities of district clubs to hear about TM.

**Internal:** In midst of wedding preparations Global Development teams keep hopping with many strong possibilities for enabling TM '76.

**Contradiction:** Caring and feeding steering committees with tenuous contact. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX**

**External:** Town Meeting follow-up model emerges as geographic metro cadre development.

**Internal:** New resolve rises out of rediscovery of warrior style and concrete circuiting model.

**Contradiction:** Creating assignment structure that covers arenas and releases needed passion to win. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY**

**External:** Metro colleague kicks off steering committee for CIF in Burley, ID, June 9.

**Internal:** Born is 3518 gram, 53.34 cm Joseph Francis Jones to Rich and Margo Jones on May 15, 1976: "salvation has come to this house today".

**Contradiction:** Building plan which makes summer most creative time of year before it is gone. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS**

**External:** Contacting neighborhood task forces, police department, Federation of Women's Clubs, Montana Department of Institutions, Montana Planning Agency for LEAA CIF program. CIF is tool to reveal evolutionary nature of development in Billings.

**Internal:** Celebrates Sara Albright's high school graduation. Welcomes presence of Louis Albright from Isle of Dogs Human Development Project for daughter's graduation.

**Contradiction:** Utilizing multitude of available resources to contact and commit all sectors of social process triangle for CIF. (Wk.9)

**IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER**

**External:** Global Development presentation to United Methodist women in Pueblo, CO brings money in hand and promise of future gifts. State Jaycees Convention booths brainwashes TM '76 as their program and nets one coordinator.

**Internal:** Memorial Day study of "Morality: Practical Methods" and picnic on Lookout Mountain signals beginning of summer and intensifies TM '76 work in Urban Area.

**Contradiction:** Netting steering committees in midst of receiving "paper" endorsements from Jaycees, League of Women Voters and American Association of United Women. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY**

**External:** Sends TM mailing to circuit contacts. Distributes 4,000 brochures in North Rapid.

**Internal:** House celebrates quarter with colleagues. Experiences Dune conversation as helpful. Emerging Generation structures expose children's detachment as school closes.

**Contradiction:** Reading and responding to group for successful informal meeting resulting in TM dates. (Wk.9)

**EDMONTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

**External:** Ft. Smith (Northwest Territory) has leadership saying yes to CFC. Ft. Sask pre-launch meeting secures "caller" and lunch possibility. T.V. program on SW Edmonton CFC leaves House video tape of show.

**Internal:** Receives communication from Lynn Bell by 2-way radio (only communication from Loon Lake). Looks at decor with seriousness. Celebrates Victoria Day with in-door picnic complete with family games.

**Contradiction:** Finding the strategy that holds tension between real summer situation and multitudes of possibility. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER**

**External:** Preparation for Global Social Demonstration presentation at Habitat includes on site visit, customs clearance, program arrangements with centrum while new regional strategy organizes 78 towns into 13 circuits.

**Internal:** Landlord contracts House to repair roof: brings forth proceeds towards cookie jar. Habitat host role begins with arrival of Clair Woodbury.

**Contradiction:** Juggling many plates entails feet on ground rather than pie in sky. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE**

**External:** Turnagain TM on its way as tasks are assigned at Anchorage sponsors meeting. Possibilities emerge in regards to funding.

**Internal:** Car wash for cookie jar nets \$167. Welcomes Don Raschke for first half of week. Ends week with celebrating John Poole's high school graduation.

**Contradiction:** Saying no to story: "Summer is a time to collapse". (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON**

**External:** Assignments are made for plunge into CFC development.

**Internal:** Jean Smith shares commonization of global finance model.

**Contradiction:** Pushing ahead with strategy yet remain open to seemingly tangential possibilities. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG**

**External:** Expands Brandon circuit and creates parish sign by mowing, cleaning and planting flowers in vacant lot.

**Internal:** Income flows in with house painting job, garage sale, and in-kind of 20 bags cement, six yards of sand for basement renovation. Celebrates Victoria Day at beach.

**Contradiction:** Motivating community citizens while experiencing internal lack of motivation. (Wk.9)

**HOUSTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

External: Relaxed participants and staff demonstrate that TM '76 is fun in Jacinto City, an industrial, work class neighborhood of Houston and continue to comment on enjoyable experience of workshops.

Internal: Permeation assignment takes House member to Guatemala for 5 days; state representative and coordinators of 2 TMs in District and their families attend Sunday luncheon at House; Sends out Don Clark to Lapu Lapu Consult.

Contradiction: Avoiding image of "dropping" towns outside polis after the Town Meeting. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO**

External: Lubbock sets date for TM, July 24. Big Spring troika meets (formed by members of Permian Basin Metro Cadre), and House does mid-course battleplanning to speed up snowball in West Texas.

Internal: Events come off with help of Wayside Inn dynamic, as Jim Stowell, Matt Reveles, Joyce Shank and daughter Jo, and Cindy Sadler attend ecclesiola and Gary Ray, black minister, stops by for House study of "Pedagogy of the Oppressed". Acknowledges North Heights as official PCE with placing of decor in collegium room.

Contradiction: Answering effective the question "What can I do to help" at early stages of entry into a town. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO**

External: Town Meeting '76 hits front page of city paper, "Northside Recorder". All circuits rescheduled together with follow-up model for San Antonio TM.

Internal: Facility renewal on several fronts; lowers entry hall ceiling, covers heating ducts, hangs curtains, does yardwork, in-kinds dinnerware and glasses.

Contradiction: Getting sponsorship to jell in heat of summer. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY**

External: Oklahoma City CIF and TM follow-up group decides to create "New Style for Stiles Circle" by recreating first city park built in 1893.

Internal: Major work on "Report of TM '76 to Oklahoma" includes procuring photos from towns across state.

Contradiction: Activating steering committees to be ready to have their TMs in early fall in midst of "summer lag". (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS**

External: Mesquite, TX TM comes off with total endorsement of City Council, Mayor and Bicentennial Commission. Eastfield College hosts, president is present all day, and Congressman, Jim Maddox, participates in morning workshops of his second TM.

Internal: Spray gun and compressor arrive and final painting of rooms in new House begins as move looms just week away.

Contradiction: Organizing situation, including labor, to tie up loose ends of facility prep so that focus can shift back to external. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA**

External: Passes out 40,000 flyers proclaiming June 5 as Tulsa TM '76 Day. T.V. and radio spots: completes 30 second public service announcements.

Internal: John Joseph Slicker arrives home after two and half months in hospital following his birth.

Contradiction: Getting delegates at conventions to TM '76 while holding tension of massive promotion. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS**

External: Mobile TM of 250 includes area and mini-TM; second CIF steering committee meeting shows CIF doing itself; Baton Rouge does follow-up. Meeting of 12 at Lake Charles sets August date. Reorganized Church of Latter Day Saints gives first \$100.

Internal: Whole HOuse travels to Mobile TM.

Contradiction: Insuring August TM will come off to start snowball of fall. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS**

External: Break-open in Alabama occurs as four towns decide TM dates.

Internal: Continental perspective is given to circuits with week's visit from Jean Baringer. Two cars are made ready for road with one more to go.

Contradiction: Enabling group to take assignments from first yes to TM. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA**

External: Savannah Jaycees Board of Directors vote to do TM. Southeast steering committee celebrates and builds two proposals: 1) creates visible signs in local setting (murals) and 2) everyone works on another TM.

Internal: Sunday AM reflection on task teams creates new format for same. Susan Curry gets job lead from TM contact visited on Saturday circuit ride in Cartersville.

Contradiction: Creating plan whereby can move from one TM to 5000 without pausing to regroup. (Wk.9)

**IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE**

External: Old Fort and Cullowhee Mountain colleagues move into turn to community through catalyzation of community contacts for TM.

Internal: Breathing new life into models for keeping TM data updated and relevant.

Contradiction: Keeping experimental models of structure grounded in mission of task through style of servanthood. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI**

External: Third State convention, third week in row, as TM has display booth at State Convention of Women's Political Caucus. Guardians hold first meeting with 17 present including 4 new guardians. Circuits continue with trips to Central Florida and West Coast.

Internal: Depth issues raised by ecclesiola study "Small is Beautiful" impacts House and metro again.

Contradiction: Maintaining circuits every week without being consumed by financial and transportation demons. (Wk.9)

**CHICAGO****GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO**

External: Three Centrum personnel take sophisticated slide show to Habitat Conference in Vancouver to tell the story of Global Social Demonstration.

Internal: Welcomes home Ken Hamje and Neil Vance. The Order celebrates the births of Jessica Fitzroy born to Timothy and Rose Casswell May 22, Ruth Helen to Scott and Doris Morris on May 14, and Charles Samson to Michael and Jody May on June 7. Creates new troop schema for Day I and Day II enablement.

Contradiction: Discerning new modes to catalyze Town Meeting acceleration. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO**

**External:** Trumbull Block Club does Week II miracle with some 100 persons participating in sweeping, painting curbs, picking bricks, building brick gardens, spreading gravel, painting trees, boarding up buildings, moving, repairing sidewalks, planting gardens, putting up sign; capped with dinner on lawn and some 200 in courtyard. Nine businesses are represented at first association meeting. Takes documents to agencies. Elders prefer Elders Security Patrol over outing.

**Internal:** Builds weekly rhythm rationale.

**Contradiction:** Creating synchronized auxiliary forces from House and community. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA**

**External:** Town Meeting grads from Governor's Conference initiate one TM troika and register for Week 9 TM Assembly. Conference enables clergy colleague to become actively re-engaged in TM '76.

**Internal:** Visit by the Druckenmillers and Joe Pierce spiritizes House and enables model for unified approach to TM in Kansas communities. In midst of lay-offs in office, one House member gets promotion and raise.

**Contradiction:** Remembering that 5,000 TMs is task while doing set up for TMs in Wichita Metro. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA**

**External:** Two steering committees formed in Crete and Omaha by single presentation to key groups. Groundwork is laid with key visits in Des Moines, Council Bluffs and Lincoln. Northside Guild does community clean-up in rain which is second miracle in 2 weeks; total garbage collected comes to 25,000 tons.

**Internal:** Town Meeting Assembly mailing is done by metro cadre. Begins mailing of 5,000 given by League of Municipalities. New TM phasing chart complete.

**Contradiction:** Beginning next month's foray while pulling together last month's victories. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY**

**External:** Overland Park TM has 130 participants and catalyzes four other TMs. Metro meeting with Joe Pierce allows all to grasp new relationship to circuit assignments.

**Internal:** Visit of Joe Pierce adds life to House Church and collegiums.

**Contradiction:** Making current tactics effective to do 5000 as see challenge of Governor's Conference to follow-up 96 communities. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS**

**External:** Native American Association decides to use TM-like format for meeting of urban Indians. Town Meeting Assembly is great happening. Looks forward to doing them out in region. Whittier Business Dinner reveals an iron man who spoke up, demanding business guild before it was suggested; out of spirit happening, elderly lady broke her wine glass at end of "Top of the World".

**Internal:** Percy Vinning drives 6 hours to come to Town Meeting Assembly; arrives Friday night and plugs into set-up. Leaves Sunday saying "This is the most effective weekend I've ever had." Sends June Seary out to Lapu Lapu Consult.

**Contradiction:** Eliciting broad community involvement. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

**External:** Proposals are submitted to IBM and Sunnen Foundation. Movement colleague from years back contributes \$1000, committing same over next five years toward Global Social Demonstration. TM requested for West End of St. Louis for end of July by West End Development Corporation.

**Internal:** Development battleplan built for 1976 for first time puts funding load squarely on House back. Goal for 1976 is \$24,800. Shifting from 4 to 3 car model until about July 31 toward making it financially for fiscal year.

**(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS)**

**Contradiction:** Discerning cross-over tactics for intensifying TM '76 set-up circuits and regional development toward 30 TMs and \$24,800, respectively, by December 31, 1976. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA**

**External:** Many metro troops volunteer to help with TM Assembly while workshop leaders are trained as another victory in preparing for TM June 5 in Danville.

**Internal:** Bishop Joshi's visit is inspirational. Projection chart of 150 towns propels all into the future.

**Contradiction:** Doing mini-tactics now that will assure breakopen of engagement and avalanche of Global Community Forum. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY**

**External:** Wisconsin Jaycees officially endorse Town Meeting '76.

**Internal:** "Out of the House into the community" conveys dynamic that continues to energize troops. First prize "Town Meeting '76" booth at Jaycee Convention is product of House corporate effort.

**Contradiction:** Getting corporate preparation and back-up for all major House assignments. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

**External:** Brookfield City Council passes resolution creating youth advisory board as result of TM. Sun Prairie United Methodist Church offers to underwrite TM. Oscar Mayer grants \$500 for Madison TM. Wisconsin Federation of Coop decides to initiate TM in 8 counties for October. Pastors decide to do TM.

**Internal:** Adds in-kind tomato and pepper plants to garden. Receives 1000 lbs. cheese donation. PCC evaluation turns griping session into challenges with which House can deal. High school youth receives English award.

**Contradiction:** Regaining Xavier Principle for parish in midst of being lost in thrust of TM focus. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS**

**External:** Television press conference for Mapleton Fall Creek, IN TM '76 is held. State Jaycee Press takes 25 TM packets to State Convention for policy committee members to present what is needed for state program.

**Internal:** Decides to hold planning weekend. House member receives packet of 10 state department forms for India permeation. Gears up for Indy 500.

**Contradiction:** Staying on moving train with track layers some times catching up. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI**

**External:** Nets come in filled to brim with State Jaycees doing 100 TMs for 1975-76, State Kiwanis opening their convention doors, and municipal league extends 300 mayors' meeting invitations to speak and set up booth. Backup systems take lead with Vandalia Jaycees deciding to host regional Jaycee training for TM.

**Internal:** Many colleagues involved in RS-I, TM, Global Development and Global Management, all happening simultaneously, create nerve center for 6-month projection. Experiences Memorial Day House picnic including extended other family, Ed Millers.

**Contradiction:** Moving while new edge is being created in networks and clusters in midst of feel that is of standing still. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT**

**External:** Michigan Jaycees include TM in their "Parade of Chapters" program; Michigan National Association for Advancement of Colored People passes resolution for TM; two TMs in one week in Flint with 325 and Kalamazoo with 120, both at community colleges.

**Internal:** Allison Joan, 6 lbs. 5 oz., is born May 8, to Jeffrey and Frances Roper; House sends Tom Reemtsma to Citizens Participation Conference in Minneapolis.

**Contradiction:** Building models to be catalysts and specifying how implementaries are done. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND**

External: Central TM in inner city Cleveland is miracle story for all. Two major companies open doors for funding in wake of Central success story.

Internal: Ecclesiola bulges with up to 30 guests weekly, more than 2/3 recent TM grads.

Contradiction: Planning snow and caring for 1400 new grads who are asking "what next". (Wk.7)

**NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK**

External: Frames five cities in White Plains Metro; makes 8 calls per day as Big City strategy rolls.

Internal: Importance of communication, coordination and reference point are grounded as metro colleague holds down front desk and phone with 23-person house out on mission.

Contradiction: Shifting from sense of sacred time as sustaining in mission, to sacred space. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH**

External: PCE hosts 18 for city-wide framing workshop. Attendance includes city councilman.

Internal: Summer battleplanning is terrific! Sally Fenton arrives "on loan" from New York.

Contradiction: Getting rid of prevalent illusion that isolated victory leads to significant results. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER**

External: Development for Town Meetings activated in three metros reveals \$25,000 worth of proposals in process of submission.

Internal: Week I, Day II task force actualizes quarter tactics with new power.

Contradiction: Setting clear images of October-December TMs among steering committees before "summer arrives". (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND**

External: Troika with supporting organization is secured for four-polis city in Tidewater.

Internal: Karen Raschke, traveling council, impacts House. Post Hanover County TM reflection sets off reflective week of tailoring models to specific situation.

Contradiction: Holding tension of particular in midst of holding common thrust. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON**

External: Jay City TM accelerates with workshop leader training; steering committee creates loudspeaker tape: "Turn that T.V. off, wives put away that vacuum cleaner, come to the Town Meeting!". Sixteen people attend CIF workshop training.

Internal: Receives three people as fellows: Deborah Owens, Elizabeth Sheldon, Cliff Wilson; Wilbur Leatherman visits; Dick Funk becomes half century old.

Contradiction: Holding tension between coordinating Horizons Festival '76 which is like orchestrating a 5-ring circus running three miles behind it with shoe laces tied together and five more fire eating TMs breathing down neck. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE**

External: Dover Town Meeting happens; three more Jaycee clubs decide to head up TMs for their communities; Jaycaettes appoint state and regional directors for TM; CIF supports model ex-offenders program, mayors coordinating council on criminal justice and community corrections.

Internal: House strategizes West/Southwest Baltimore TM.

Contradiction: Developing tactical concretion to assure that all events are usable and all projections actualized. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

**External:** Development team of three arrives to spend week in House building comprehensive budget for next year, visiting three top leaders in city, and strategizing request of one bank to look at submitting proposal for \$140,000 to fund 36 TMs and three 5th City projects to follow.

**Internal:** Record in-kind food donation arrives on Fast Day requiring neighborhood restaurant and parochial school to provide freezer storage for 10 cases chocolate and coconut meringue pies with George Emerick of Global Development team putting on wild feast to break the Fast.

**Contradiction:** Building model to do TM in midst of development discovering tremendous opportunities. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

**External:** PCE is sustained as community takes over House/community vegetable garden. Newburgh experiences truly catalytic and representative TM. Newark's Central Ward holds TM carnival as first funding event. Three-church HRM is scheduled.

**Internal:** Collegiums move us to new edges of thinking on workshop leaders training. Experiment with Friday AM ecclesiola continues with celebrative breakfast. Receives 10 gallons of in-kind blueberry swirl ice cream.

**Contradiction:** Building structures that intensify and implement decision of House and metro to move as one mission. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN**

**External:** Brooklyn Metro breaks loose with 3 TMs set this week; Canarsie, June 27, Flushing, June 26, Springfield Gardens, June 26. Maspeth TM set for June 12.

**Internal:** Carlos Ollison does guest collegium on 5th City Consult and enables to see not just past but future. 5th City Love Song becomes Number 1 on House hit parade.

**Contradiction:** Building models to engage everyone, with competence in every aspect of mission. (Wk.7)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD**

**External:** Town Meeting Assembly takes place with 7 TM '76 programs represented; planning meetings in Greenfield, New Britain, and North End Hartford; 4 from steering committee on radio for 30 minutes for June 5th TM '76.

**Internal:** Preps for Town Meeting Assembly and ecclesiola is powerful happening for House.

**Contradiction:** Knowing what to do now, in order that 84 TM '76 programs happen in next year. (Wk.8)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER**

**External:** Holds first Northern New England TM '76 in Laconia; new and old colleagues "want to be more involved" in TM set-up, and snowball is really underway.

**Internal:** Bellamys return from Academy to move into TM '76 set-up.

**Contradiction:** Engaging colleagues who are ready to move to do 35 TMs. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON**

**External:** Town Meeting '76 New Bedford with 375 registered claims "City of Future" out of city of despair with demonstration of corporate power by steering committee.

**Internal:** Reappropriation of space with repainting of lounge and redesign of office space creates image of beng ready to receive the world.

**Contradiction:** Enabling colleagues to deal with ulcers same way enable steering committee to deal with theirs. (Wk.8)

**MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL**

External: City archivist gets image of importance of his contribution to social demonstration.

Internal: In-House social methods training program enables deeper reflection on use of methods in relation to contacts with other groups.

Contradiction: Deciding what to do while waiting for catalytic action to catch fire in midst of sense of urgency to move it, move it, move it. (Wk.5)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO**

External: Two communities in Toronto Metro move closer to CFC with discovery of new and old friends.

Internal: Key corporate space refurbished with fantastic decor.

Contradiction: Focusing energy so local and practical circuit jobs get done in way which also motivates and involves colleagues. (Wk.9)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA**

External: Initial proposal for 12 CFCs is submitted to alderman in charge of 150th anniversary celebration of city.

Internal: Area Montreal covers Rochester Region and New York City. Opening up possibility of local neighborhood exchange in fall season. Sends out Clair Woodbury as coordinator for Canadian participation in Habitat.

Contradiction: Structuring to maximize forces and enable fruition of fall possibilities when fuzziness has crept into clearly defined missional arenas. (Wk.9)

**CARACAS RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS**

Upper New York Church gives \$8,000 gift as way to symbolize missional focus of the congregation. New work being done toward standardizing GSD proposals. The contradiction lies in the arena of moving money into the bank every day while breaking open new funding arenas.

Primal Community Consults in the form of Town Meeting Assemblies were held in Boston, Philadelphia, Seattle and Wichita. The contradiction lies in the arena of securing the one large funding gift that will catalyze the other donations to Global Social Demonstration.

Programs include Town Meetings in Ashtabula, Atlanta, Baltimore, Bay City, Beaumont, Danville, Fallon, Hartford, Highland Park, Holdenville, Indianapolis, Ivey City (Washington DC), Lynn, Newark, Oxen Hill (Washington DC), Sommerset Hills, Tulsa, Washington; LENS in Paris and Tokyo; RSIIIA in Manado and Social Methods Training Day in Caracas. The contradiction lies in building the new schemes that provide the troop strength necessary both in the field and in the back-up systems.

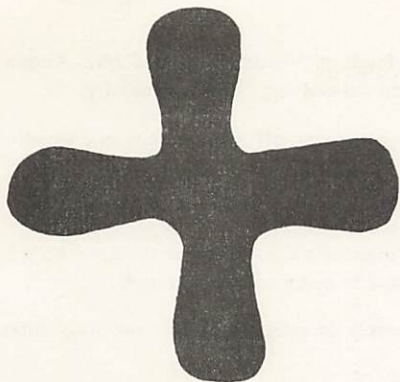

Internal: Week 11 portrays sophistication of collegium room. Ship comes in as receive several hundred pieces of crockery in-kind in readiness for Europe's GRA from Sea Lines.

Contradiction: Focusing on bull's eye of IHDP target arenas by using symbolic power of one thrust. (Wk.9)

Internal: Old grad interrupts House Church to announce depositing four crates of posh camp edible leftovers in House kitchen.

Contradiction: Finding key to sustaining corporate decision to do all three campaigns when one shows up in particular. (Wk.10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE**

External: Twenty-seven people meet to form Portland Community Meeting Australia. Sponsors' committee produces document on next week's sponsorship tasks.

Internal: Welcomes Margaret More from Oombulgurri as emissary to Colac. Holds teachers guest night.

**Contradiction:** Getting identified and recording insights and tactics found to be most helpful to mission in Minneapolis Region out to the globe. (Wk.10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS**

**External:** Illinois Jaycee leadership seminar has ICA staff from Chicago, Peoria, St. Louis involved in set-up workshop with Jaycees from 35 cities for Town Meeting '76. Circuits intensify on Week II. Visits Monsanto, Pet, United Van Lines for GCF funding.

**Internal:** Hosts Rev. Park Si Won from Seoul, Korea, House. Tuesday night news conversation helps get three nights of evening TM '76 set-up work grounded in contemporary world.

**Contradiction:** Releasing motivity of new colleagues from Town Meetings already held to carry out tasks of framing and set-up in many, many cities. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA**

**External:** Ottawa sets its TM date (a town first contacted in August Foray). Creates and sends out two mailings for TM Assembly--1000 pieces.

**Internal:** Celebrates Memorial Day with grand picnic featuring main dish specialties from each family. Pastor Gerald Rhoades of Church of the Bretheren comes to Peoria for 3-day sojourn.

**Contradiction:** Contacting metro colleagues to engage in pulling off TM Assembly. (Wk.10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY**

**External:** Sunday House Church with many outsiders is event that welcomed back Academy participants with reports on their experience.

**Internal:** School is out for summer. Holds celebration Thursday with sending out of Salmon children, Jane Wright and her children. Kirsches and Brian May are assigned to Emerging Generation summer structures.

**Contradiction:** Maintaining momentum during summer after experiencing troop strength cut in half. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE**

Internal: Simfukwes impact all with story of Mumt in Africa and style. Focuses on internal life for first time this quarter. Zan White, Atlanta, stays in House during management conference, fixes plumbing, trains House plumber.

Contradiction: Passing baton from Day 1 to Day 2 without losing a step or dropping baton. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE**

External: Focus on set up for West Southwest Baltimore TM while 10 new Jaycee organizations indicate interest in holding TMs in their communities.

Internal: Hosts Ray and Eleanor Searle (M. Shinn's parents) from California and welcomes assistance and participation of Karen Raschke. Collegium on reflection of role of Religious House was signal event. Welcomes new intern, Martha Vehorn.

Contradiction: Finding ways to objectify situation in order to release the creative push. (Wk.10)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA**

External: TM '76 Assembly allows all to see concretely TM '76 as new Movement; work begins on journey of 80 who will be doing the 50 in the Fall.

Internal: Spends week mulling over what is new strategy, model, decor, slogan for the 5,000.

Contradiction: Creating story and spirit tools that journey a TM '76 grad to be a global servant. (Wk. 11)

**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK**

External: Journeys Newark's North Ward Steering Committee through attendance/funding push, responding to demand for active vs. passive consultant style.

Guardian network shows its strength and cruciality to Movement funding by paving the way for \$170,000 proposal to major corporation and commitments to raise House program monies through loan agreements. Formation of advisory panels in meeting with 30 business, government and professional people initiates guardian dynamic in Kenya. Donors see new possibilities for assuring on-going and long-range support of the Movement by committing friend's monies and self's stored-upness (via will). Receives M\$100 from brother of Singapore's foreign minister, Rajaratnam; 1,000 USD confirmed from AAUW in Jakarta. The contradiction lies in the arena of raising program funds to keep circuits on the road, and issue of local funding, which raises the question of how to maintain the momentum of new campaigns and strategies without falling into old ways to relieve immediate pressures.

The contradiction facing the band is breaking loose the large symbolic gift that will enable the massive funding necessary to do Human Development around the globe.

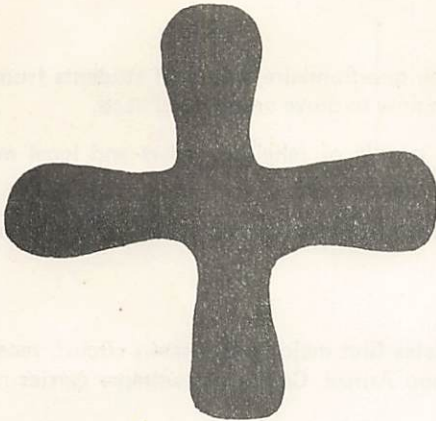

Internal: Eight guests come for TM Week II: Friday night they were guests that were strangers and by Saturday night they had shifted to passion-filled colleagues who were planning for the next TM.

Contradiction: Putting same passion into rest of region as put into two Black TM's in last two weeks. (Wk. 12)

#### RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Town not showing on circuit rationale until Fall decides now to have TM and follows timeline better than communities with constant prodding. Using functional format for slide presentation gives concrete images of TM events and tasks.

Internal: Sends two out of five adults for week trekking and discovers that internal and external structures continue in full force. Metro colleague re-landscapes external surroundings to ICA office.

Contradiction: Proceeding with development on the local level in midst of ongoing mission. (Wk. 12)

Contradiction: Passing baton from Day 1 to Day 2 without losing a step or dropping baton. (Wk. 11)
