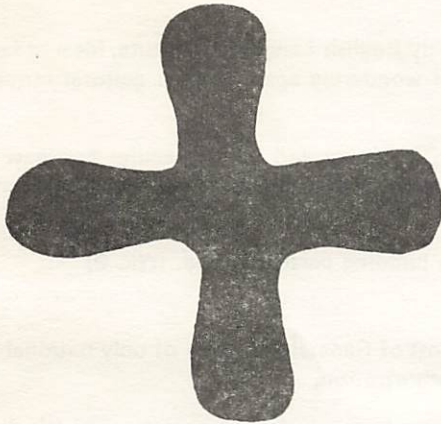

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Granted Bridge House, a 19-room Georgian villa built in 1810 by prisoners of the Napoleonic Wars, as facility on Isle of Dogs. Receives 11-building, seven-acre complex next to River Thames as great possibility for housing community industry. Authorization going at full speed with visits to both regional and national politicians and corporations. Local Isle residents help to restore Bridge House. Sends proposals for 160,000 pounds. Brings off all scheduled courses including LENS in Oxford. Thirty return to British Isles from ITI:Amsterdam.

Internal: Sends Robinsons and three consultants from Area London to Maliwada Consult. Wayside Inn Dynamic shifts as guests don work clothes to assist with restoration of Bridge House. Receives interns Alan Berresford and Stephen Polyarck.

Contradiction: Eliciting global care in midst of intensifying local responsibility. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Holds consult with 23 clergymen in Aberdeen. Secures decision for clergy RS-1 in May.

Internal: Sends out Fiona Willoch to London. Newly decorated lounge transforms common space cutting over against "temporary quarters" image.

Contradiction: Implementing "we're here for life" style necessary for serious engagement in midst of housing blocks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: LENS course is great success with 25 around table. Facility lent by Anglicans.

Internal: Buys new car from colleague car dealer. Necessity of new House becomes possibility.

Contradiction: Finding ways to engage new colleagues in way that most cares for Bristol. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Two new cadres meet in Huddersfield and Nottingham.

Internal: Bishop Wickham celebrates House Church. Receives Michael Shaw as intern.

Contradiction: Allowing intensity of focus to obscure the why and what of task. (Wk. 8)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Week of intensive community research uncovers wisdom of social philosophy within French operating community structures.

Internal: Week of all people in House working in gives forces to do community research and depth reflection on discoveries.

Contradiction: Experiencing paralysis running into many manifestations of possibility while moving full speed ahead. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Fifteen Trasteverini are regular students in twice-weekly English Language Institute. Meal at famous restaurant of parish and visit to fine restored palazzo sets all wondering again what a cultural miracle in Trastevere might be.

Internal: Welcomes presence of extended family, the Lymans, in House and parish; secures two new jobs: translation of biography of foundress of an Order, and university ethics course meld direct mission and permeation.

Contradiction: Following global model in PCE at same time as building particular one. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Sir Louis Mbanefo invites House to fill temporarily post of General-Secretary of only national body of practical ecumenical cooperation. Post carries considerable authorization.

Internal: Begins to make use of General-Secretary's flat and car in Lagos, but most operating models did not anticipate attempted coup and subsequent curfew.

Contradiction: Finding manpower for ITI recruitment. (Wk. 9)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Works toward shaping continent Europe's summer program events via phone, setting context for consensus.

Internal: Receives short ecclesiola construct in time for full ecclesiola celebration by all, including troops leaving for other countries at end of evening.

Contradiction: Intensifying permeation and already active job hunting in midst of collapse of work permit applications. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Metro colleagues experience abundance of life through Imaginal Education and then proceed to take over House to do French luncheon with 25 attending.

Internal: McIntosh family visits ecclesiola. In-kind shipment of cheese, chocolate, desserts, soup and coffee from Nestle's arrives.

Contradiction: Making turn into discontinuous weeks of quarter without losing momentum. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week II Global Social Demonstration research PSU with presence of an urban planner and other Dutchmen yields unexpected insights and possibilities for future.

Internal: Secures two part-time jobs. Deeply addressed by conversation with dinner guests about the sociological contradictions and spirit state of people in the Netherlands.

Contradiction: Discerning and creating forms and strategies of comprehensive care which must be decided upon now, with clarity that it is time to move to local with practical care structures. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Two simultaneous development treks in Vienna and Munich open many possibilities; one-time contact requests HRM by letter. Sends invitations for Primal Community Consult Week 9.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA)

touches two metros in one swoop. Visit to Mrs. Nasution, head of Indonesian social welfare and wife of key general, explodes possibilities of Global Social Demonstration.

Internal: House holds spontaneous celebration after call on Mrs. Nasution. Welcomes Father Charles Morrissey, who is very surprised at finding 80 Roman Catholic orders in Indonesia. Hears helpful collegiums on state of Catholic church.

Contradiction: Seeing new possibilities of Global Social Demonstration as blinding to once clear priorities. (Wk. 8)

HONG KONG GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: JWM, Moriarity, Packard and Rafos visit Mactan. RS-I in Cantonese in Hong Kong reveals new crop of powerful young pedagogues. Prepares for Area Priors' Council.

Internal: Area prior visits. Heidi Holmes returns with images, documents and songs of Majuro.

Contradiction: Maintaining ongoing systems in midst of shortage of troops. (Wk.9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: RS-I of 37 taught by regional faculty and recruited by colleagues points to growing momentum of identification with spirit movement. Makes 25 LENS calls this week.

Internal: RS-I set up by House involves intern and sojourner in clarifying substance of Daily Office in first step to reviewing translations of materials.

Contradiction: Relating strategically all to single thrust of PCE. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: Metro colleagues commit themselves to helping staff ICA office regularly. First PLC and LENS Quarter IV registrations are in hand.

Internal: Hosts English RS-I, then moves into new additional apartment upstairs.

Contradiction: Integrating all programs into year objective, the ITI, which is one step toward Global Social Demonstration. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Sponsorship meeting beckons latent guild to share concern and say yes to event in parish. Circuit north reveals need for depth sensitivity and methodology in making colleague visitations.

Internal: Missional family course as House training reveals dread and fascination relative to inventing needed family style. Morning pedagogy ground Bultman; evening pedagogy translates freedom lecture into dialects. Tribal resettlement creates new external situation.

Contradiction: Creating immediate depth experience and training of staff in response to deepening involvement in parish, speaking engagements, and teaching and training opportunities. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Circuits to two metro cities turn up more PLC registrations and two interested in ITI. First week of ITI in-kind nets Xerox, plywood, two busses, and all toilet paper you could ask for.

Internal: Twenty-three around table for ecclesiola, including ten unexpected guests is great occasion. Completes ITI host committee, including late-president Chiang's chaplain, and pastor of island largest Presbyterian church.

Contradiction: Catalyzing adequately decisions on part of grads to recruit laymen, allowing RS-I to happen. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Holds first key Roman Catholic PLC with 10 new participants, three priests, two sisters present. Development work on Mactan sends three more out on circuits with newsletter in hand. Signs contract on new

program building.

Internal: PSU on St. Valentine's day gets all models built and many underway, enabled by Jesus Principle conversation. Intern does pedagogy collegium on Tillich, ecclesiola study preparation, seminary and sodality, all for first time.

Contradiction: Prioritizing all tasks so time appears to be enough. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Proposals and tactics workshop excites PCE core; Butuan Metro Cadre is enthusiastic about hosting Week 9 Regional Council. Development nets \$1,000 USD from Stanfilco (Standard Fruit Company). Butuan Metro appoints Metro Development Coordinator. Finalizes and submits Stanfilco LENS proposal for Quarter IV course.

Internal: Fantastic conversation at ecclesiola on "Our Town" elicits enthusiastic participation from all present. Three return from assignments as other two leave on teaching assignments. Participates in symbolic life of parish by attending vigils marking deaths of two local residents.

Contradiction: Creating new tactics for actualizing movemental self-support. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Discussion with Program Committee of American Chamber of Commerce in Japan discloses favorable response to TM '76 in Tokyo, and consideration of possible sponsorship. Carl Hickey stays for week in Sanyo parish, for familiarization with area and residents.

Internal: Visit by Kang Byoung Hoon and Bill Schlesinger bring Area closer to region, and broadens globality, vision.

Contradiction: Surviving constant daily successes, and being able to consolidate them to move to successful completion of all missional tasks. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU

External: New Jeju governor Chang and National Assemblyman Hong visit Kwangyung to speak to village leaders and receive briefing; nurse speaks to 64 ladies on nutrition and YWCA Board Members visit.

Internal: Banker Kim Bong Hak hosts whole House at his Jeju City mansion for luncheon.

Contradiction: Activating the five working guilds for corporate planning of implementation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Metro trek passes through all six metros with visits and meeting in four of them. Sign is Rev. Hong Jong Taik, local church pastor in Seoul who travels down to meet team in Pusan and speaks at preaching mission. Receives notification of JWM's itinerary by U.S. State Department via U.S. Embassy in Seoul.

Internal: Hosts Mary and Christopher Work from Jeju and Carl Hickey here on Area teaching assignment. Sends out Kang Byoung Hoon on Area Priors' trek.

Contradiction: Deciding that fire which burns up life is fire that refines it. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Metro circuit to Okinawa uncovers unknown ITI grad (Manila '72) and establishes many new relationships. Development brings home another key gift for Global Social Demonstration in march of weekly miracles.

Internal: Fukuoka guardian gives major decor piece to House.

Contradiction: Moving interested responses for LENS into actual commitments. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Holds primal community Training School with 25 participants from Orders, welfare workers, and city staff who work in PCE; kicks off with \$1000 for Jeju from participating School Sisters of Notre Dame;

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA)

highlighted with testimonies from two long-time resident leaders and Rev. Nakamon, long-time pastor to Tokyo day-laborer district.

Internal: Neighborhood and guild core enablement for PCTS multiplies power of in-house forces.

Contradiction: Discovering charge totally outrun supply line. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Visits three metros, Hirosaki, Sendai and Akita. Moves on PCE planning and contexting; tips development scale at same time.

Internal: Holds work party for region-wide mailing to churches which promises new roads to metro circuits and development.

Contradiction: Experiencing communications to local as often more difficult than to global. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY**

External: Planning day with Canterbury Community Aid Society fixes day for Community Meeting Australia (CMA) in Campsie while Tamworth Centenary committee examines proposal for CMA as part of the centennial celebration.

Internal: PCE colleagues host collegial informal evening in which Carlos Zervigon addresses all on state of movement.

Contradiction: Moving even when development is not bringing in necessary missional programme money. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Community Meeting Australia (CMA) date is set for Melville and CMA date is set in Kalgoorlie. Jaycees at Maximum Security Fremantle Gaol invite CMA Week II. CMA orchestrator training grounds new insights in sponsor set-up. Oombulgurri receives latest batch of 200 in-kind day-old chicks. Rotary contact breaks loose possibility for obtaining electricity generating plant for Oombulgurri.

Internal: Burmese manager of local supermarket treats us to seven-course Burmese/Chinese feast at House. Celebrates with Ramages at local Sheraton as they visit on development honeymoon.

Contradiction: Breaking into networks of local community that will move beyond one-to-one contacts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Prepares for Community Meeting Australia using PCE materials.

Internal: Reading "Watership Down" at mealtimes has whole House intrigued.

Contradiction: Walking the line between what is possible and the revolutionary deed. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Week of practical signs with tractor and plough repaired and ploughing; pump engine completely overhauled on site in 36 hours by team of non-mechanics. Sends Dowsett and Jo Richardson to Canberra to do framing. Home-made ginger beer, first sign of processing plant, fizzes everywhere. First barge trip for year brings new lawn mower, tractor after expensive repairs. School year begins with over 80 students and 40 acres ploughed for sorghum.

Internal: Welcomes Ron Lichtermost and Drude McMaster for two-week sojourn. Writes February development report, does socio-economic gridding at guild night. Auxiliary studies four Global Social Demonstration documents. Hears Jo Richardson report on development trip.

Contradiction: Rehearsing story that sustains day-by-day vision of possibility while always moving with what you've got. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Port Pirie says yes to Community Meeting Australia as trek nets gift of office space complete with phone from local Community Development Officer; second Oombulgurri emissary, Michael Martin, arrives for school quarter and becomes part of Ned Baker family.

Internal: Schedules Oombulgurri guest nights from now til end of quarter. Hosts two staff members from Sue Wegner's school as breakopen tactic for Oombulgurri as school funding raising project.

Contradiction: Making sure that all thrusts are spinning well in midst of CMA thrust for Port Pirie. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Taps local pool of consciousness and resources as Prahran 5 survey teams knock on doors in neighborhood. Greg Stevens, Melbourne veterinarian, says yes to going to Oombulgurri.

Internal: March of Miracles undergoes metamorphosis as mid-course corrections for next 20 weeks are made. Ray Richmond says yes to going to Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Building bridge in story that journeys people and towns from yes to Oombulgurri to Community Meeting Australia. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA

External: Negotiations intensify with Treasury as decision nears in regard to incorporation and tax-exemption status. Sends out team to Broken Hill for development and four speaking engagements.

Internal: Duffy, Donnelly and Dowsett arrive for development workshop.

Contradiction: Formulating metro cadres. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Local artist takes initiative to design exciting art form for community billboard; uncovers inventor who is deeply committed to underdeveloped situations, with breakthroughs in portable, inexpensive housing and hydroponics.

Internal: Teresa Lingafelter visits en route from Majuro to Oombulgurri and spins with House on Majuro II report and Global Social Demonstration projections.

Contradiction: Focusing full-steam on CMA and Global Development. (Wk. 9)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Holds training program at Marshallese Community Action Agency for six members representing eight skills of Atoll Human Development Team. Sawmill working and first boards create excitement in community. TASC begins moving \$100,000 inventory with \$25,000 moving in first week.

Internal: Writes implementaries and timeline for tactical system and begins meeting by arenas. Sends out Lomoto and Shiniko colleagues from Mill. They take back diamond of Pacific symbol to hang and tell the story.

Contradiction: Dealing with authentic insistent demands of outside forces with different priorities than those House creates. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Development money comes in for ITP, receives first check from sale of paper shells. Metro cadre begins accepting assignment. Sends letters to all major church leaders in Suva. Report from Tonga changes March circuit itinerary as long hoped-for Tonga Metro Cadre sends first report of work during past month. Tonga report lends renewed purpose to upcoming Area Council and Lenten mailing.

Internal: Purchases 34 necklaces to send for sale in San Francisco. Local colleagues join House for Sunday night on the town; views slides of Papua, New Guinea, with UN doctor. Father Joe talks about coming to ecclesiola without being invited, seeing himself as part of the group. Week II PSU produces rough draft on new South Pacific story.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA)

Contradiction: Directing passion that is present in local man. (Wk. 9)

FRANCISCO****RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Mission TM '76 is overwhelming success as 350 come out to participate in one glorious day; local support is evidenced as local man present in full force with 20 sponsoring groups all participating, 79 different contributors, and local Elder's Guild receiving two beautiful framed resolutions from state Assemblyman Foran and state Senator Milton Marks, during grand celebrative lunch interlude.

Internal: Welcomes colleagues who remind all of global task, Fred Hess and David Scott who work on TM '76 development, and Rich Michael who reports on Majuro Consult; Bob St. Clair reports on EDGE. Hosts TM '76 celebration for sponsors at end of great day in Mission district.

Contradiction: Naming what is learned in TM '76 and doing it again in Nob Hill TM '76 next week. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Fresno circuit ride produces new positive responses to Town Meeting in Fresno Metro. West Valley Community Group invites ICA to lead workshop in preparation for mayor's visit, solidifying image as methods providers and preparing way for Town Meeting.

Internal: Securing of new car puts wheels on circuits. Discontinuity during holiday weekend occasions reflection on discerning spirit in mundane.

Contradiction: Turning many positive responses in parish into a Town Meeting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Community school network chooses TM '76 as its major strategy for year, receiving nod of approval to write proposal to fund the strategy.

Internal: House and metro colleagues are formed into Town Meeting polis teams, including coordinator and ambassadors. Holds first meeting of Rams at ecclesiola of 25.

Contradiction: Deciding when and where to do strategic follow-up. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Swirl of program events in Week II engages 240 in TM '76, 500 (70 all day) in HRM, and 20 in RS-I, and activates leadership staff of 20 to cover necessary roles. Meeting with state ARBC executives moves "Youth TM '76" down the road.

Internal: Collegium on Epp's "Jesus Principle" gives House new images of move it, move it, move it!

Contradiction: Unlocking local man's passion in engaging in TM '76 set-up. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Human Relations Commission Training Service proves methods in swirl through cynicism to enthusiasm. Fullerton TM drops off snowball and Coronado takes its place.

Internal: Emerging Generation mini-TM manual in great style - signs all over House, plotting inventions on triangles, creating inventions. New intentionality and focus brought to office space and time design.

Contradiction: Creating new form of sustaining power to keep rubber on road in midst of task in focus. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: Meets with representatives from 35 organizations in Phoenix to lay out basic strategy for ten Town Meetings. Revises circuiting model and assignments.

Internal: Collegiums on movement in India and particularly Maliwada by Nerrandra Paul and study of Liberal Heresy paper strengthen tension between external and internal dimensions of spirit.

Contradiction: Creating practical model to release mundane catalytic presence necessary to break loose Town Meeting sponsor journey. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: One circuit nets three informational meetings as catalyst for steering committees.

Internal: Narrendra Paul's visit from India happens while people are sent to Montana, Vancouver, Wisconsin, reminding all of global movement not just valley movement.

Contradiction: Building models in time for needs as they pop into actuality. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Celebrates Butte TM '76 as both colorful and exciting. Many comment at close of day: "I had only planned to stay for the morning." Whole state sees Town Meeting via television.

Internal: TM '76 training pays off as movement colleagues lead smooth workshops in Butte. Ecclesiola sodality is real event, with seminary study in a.m.

Contradiction: Moving beyond "I do my part" to "what needs to happen next and where shall I plug in?" (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: TM '76 presentation at state Jaycees convention draws forth unsolicited witness from president of local club and recent TM '76 participant. Participant from Boulder TM '76 one year ago requests permission to record song for air along with any other songs written.

Internal: PCC impacts both House and metro with Global Social Demonstration slides and opportunity to single-mindedly develop urban strategy.

Contradiction: Engaging in matrix of assignments that will catalyze next level of steering committee journey. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Metro colleague adds local man dynamic to three-day North Dakota circuit.

Internal: Collegiums on Jesus Principle and Liberal Heresy break open depth possibility of breakfast conversations. Analysis of last six month's budget shows where energy is as House funds are keeping circuits rolling.

Contradiction: Being effective spiritizers in towns visited. (Wk. 9)

EDMONTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Breaks open Global Community Forum in the North with "Mighty Peace Meet"; miracle circuit team ends two-week trek with two forum days set: Rocky Mountain House and Medicine Hat; "I'm forum, are you forum?" slogan for Southwest Edmonton CFC.

Internal: JWM's "Six Speeches" recontextualizes and excites House with new sensing of where movement is.

Contradiction: Clarifying ways to move on the "wins". (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Participates in four-hour consult in North..

Internal: Colleagues donate time and trucks to move House. Invites all out to eat and prepares House Church meal next day. Glenda Johnson lands job with headquarters for Habitat Public Relations. Mathews' "Six Speeches" paper impacts all.

Contradiction: Moving from stated strategies to tactical implementation. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: High schools are planning Town Meeting events.

Internal: Spends Week II in Town Meeting pedagogy workshop and in creating new decor.

Contradiction: Discerning common understanding of parish thrust in midst of wandering in missional desert. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Troika in Battleford and steering committee in Humboldt turn tactical forms on Saskatoon and Regina.

Internal: Prepares for PCC with creation of Global Social Demonstration decor.

Contradiction: Allowing regional colleagues to see possibility of service to globe. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Centennial 5 Community Forum is on the road with 30 visits to potential sponsors, as regular circuits to other cities go on.

Internal: Ecclesiola celebration with "Six Speeches" conversation and movie "Barry Lyndon" provide welcome discontinuity.

Contradiction: Motivating potential sponsors to make firm decision. (Wk. 9)

HOUSTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Within a week, small industrial suburb pulls together 20-member TM '76 steering committee, appoints chairman, vice chairman, and secures basic funding and facility.

Internal: Guest Ruth Marshall's report on Maliwada Consult leaves all spellbound; Rick and Linda Jones receive assignment to Majuro, all within a few hours Monday morning.

Contradiction: Recreating form of movement in midst of transition. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: TM '76 circuit begins with visit with American Association of Retired Persons president-elect and ends with 700-man Town Meeting at Odessa.

Internal: Study of Epps' paper on Jesus Principle deepens awareness. Discovers ecclesiola construct for quarter is exactly right as three left in House rehearse for Friday night before TM '76.

Contradiction: Allowing all to see that caring for self comes through external expenditure. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Kingsville Jaycees decide to spearhead Town Meeting. In-kind car battery helps car situation. Holds Greyline tour for ITP.

Internal: Visit from Paul family from India gives ecclesiola report on Global Social Demonstration: Maliwada as global sign and addresses all with necessity and presence of Global Social Demonstration around globe.

Contradiction: Allowing built-up momentum to direct course rather than catalyzing additional momentum. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

Contradiction: Needing to intensify troop training and sponsor catalyzation in midst of multiple TM '76s. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Four do Town Meeting workshops. Attends Jaycee convention. Denton black group decides to pick up TM '76 and sets date for June 10 (Black Heritage Day).

Internal: Receives in-kind loan of IBM typewriter. Study on liberal heresy strips all naked. Creates North Texas TM '76 endorsement flyer.

Contradiction: Struggling to be catalytic in midst of demonstration mentality. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Participates in three tremendous TM '76s in Oklahoma City, Lawton, and Alva. Holds HRM on Sunday with tremendous response.

Internal: Hosts Don Clark, Don Bascom and Nan Grow for TM '76 and HRM.

Contradiction: Excellerating speed relative to time it takes a town to decide to launch TM '76. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Shreveport troika decides to hold four TM '76s on one day; Kiwanis Lt. Governor agrees to be overall coordinator for all four. Jackson and Clinton MI, decide on Town Meetings, with Kiwanis, Jaycees, and Civitans leading those groups. Lands 30-minute presentation invitation at District Kiwanis Mid-winter Conference.

Internal: One of two read cars goes to shop for new engine. Everyone in House is involved in TM '76 circuits as eight polis and micro cities are visited, five for the first time. Sunday planning sessions are getting longer!

Contradiction: Deciding what does "living off the land" mean concretely and can we afford the time and troop expense of doing it, or can we afford not to. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Blitz part of Arkansas which had not been seen before and was thought to be "dead" country.

Internal: Thursday morning Booher model study brings consciousness about The Way Life Is.

Contradiction: Being intentional in midst of being overwhelmed by demands. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: PCC, Global Social Demonstration slides are great introduction for black TM '76 contacts in city. Marietta Saturday a.m. slide show presentation with representatives from most civic clubs in town accomplishes steering committee of 15 plus invitation to do same presentation at state Jaycee convention.

Internal: Buys baby blue Cadillac after five months working at Cadillac agency. Walt Epley stops by on permation assignment to Florida, enlivening PCE evening.

Contradiction: Maintaining core of internal House life, especially in evenings, when TM '76 calls are primarily based on when group you want to visit has its regular meeting. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Mails newsletter and TM '76 invitations.

Internal: TM '76 public relations includes regular 15-second TV spot; writes TM '76 articles for three state-wide publications; 22 are present at first Carolinas metros RS-I. Methodology of Kawangware Consult impacts all.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensive missional thrust while giving away methods. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: PCC is great happening with Allapattah being represented by all cultures. Jaycees create and mail their TM '76 brochure to over 300 clubs in Florida. Bradenton, Sebring, Boynton Beach, Key West, Miami Shores all ready to go. First timer at sponsorship meeting is given assignment of in-kinding doughnuts for Kendall TM '76 shows up next morning with 25 dozen. Also in-kinds 15 reams of paper, color printing by AM for product cover, pens, pencils, pork 'n beans.

Internal: Sojourner decides to stay another week. Anxious excitement pervades in anticipation for Kendall TM '76, a highly catalytic meeting for southern Florida, especially Dade county. Renovates House by pulling trees out of roof.

Contradiction: Trying to keep yeses from turning into "Oh yes, I remember you". (Wk. 9)

CHICAGO GLOBAL CENTRUM CHICAGO

External: North American priors arrive for NA Continental Council.

Internal: Collegiums focus issues of the three campaigns into twenty-six practical recommendations paragraphs. Cleaning blitz does practical council preparation. Sends out Bill Pfaffs to Oombulgurri and George and Wanda Holcombe to Majuro.

Contradiction: Catalyzing North American Global Community Forum set-up process. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Already have 10% of 300 Illinois Jaycee chapters with TM '76 dates set, 25% by July quite possible. Fifty meet for 5th City Consult prep; 5th City clean-up with 25 from Student House is really moving it. Writes \$400,000 proposal to set up another Training Center plus one in 5th City. Palatine TM '76 is great happening. Two slide projectors in-kind for TM '76 set-up.

Internal: Welcomes three consultants back from Majuro. They give great report and slide show.

Contradiction: Wanting orders without doing necessary battleplanning. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Attends bi-regional meeting with Bruce Morgan at Missouri Research Institute, Kansas City, MO. Weekly circuit uncovers Hill City setting up county-wide TM '76.

Internal: Secures two jobs. Initiates in-kind network with gift of piano.

Contradiction: Trusting methods and discovering key to releasing local Town Meetings. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: NE Jaycees State Convention breaks loose interest in TM '76 across state. Congressman Bedell and Mayor of Omaha endorse TM '76. Second Ralston TM '76 follow-up under "another Town Meeting" rubrics reveals guild dynamic.

Internal: Discovers mobile collegiality in invitation to have ecclesiola at Ralston TM '76 coordinator's home.

Contradiction: Relying on old world images of things falling apart when situation is new and wider universe to love. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Sets up six Town Meetings with three appointments. Visits with Missouri Community Betterment officers. Phase I of their program is community awareness and goal setting. Town Meetings are exactly what is needed.

Internal: Receives two job offers in one day to bring House back to full employment. Hosts Richard Greene and Sally Emerick, here on global development trip.

Contradiction: Exploding Town Meetings across whole geography in midst of catalyzation explosion in metropolitan area. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Sensing lure of superficiality in Town Meeting demands us to consider all encounters as depth encounters. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Holds TM '76 workshop leader training session in Quincy, IL, for local people and steering committee. Jaycees booth in Belleville yields 46% Jaycee chapters in state seriously moving on TM '76. Visits Midwest Research Institute in Kansas City.

Internal: Emerging Generation take to kite flying at the arch. Mails invitations to PCC at House to 85 key city and Town Meeting people.

Contradiction: Finding ways to tell story the way it needs to be told in many different situations where believable answers are needed. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Holds first HRM in bi-metro in Merrill. Sets plan for Oneida TM '76.

Internal: Thirteen new participants, including two members of Oneida Indian tribe, attend PCC.

Internal: Actualizes regional dynamic; three Houses join forces financially and on circuits. Winter ice storm enables missionally, miraculous reordering of office.

Contradiction: Creating rationale for deployment of troops when troops and geography are uncertain. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Networks open and accelerate with Independent Insurance Agents saying yes to TM. Black endorsement through People United to Save Humanity (PUSH), Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) key to urban circuits.

Internal: Global news event conversation breaks loose in morning collegium as 6th graders, youth and adults realize again interrelatedness of globe.

Contradiction: Creating back-up system that allows intensification of circuits. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Two more dates set for Town Meetings in Mt. Pleasant and Saulte Saint Marie point to cruciality of regional workshop leader training. One hundred present at sponsorship breakfast; state Jaycees convention includes TM workshop; and 10-20 communities expected to be represented at Pontiac TM, February 28th.

Internal: Ecclesiola highlighted with guardian couple as guests; 11 year old Emerging Generation transforms time design by attending local YWCA; and IBM donates typewriter for use through 1976 and perhaps longer. (RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND)

Internal: Sodality is great happening as metro workshop leader from Midwest TM '76 shares his experience and trains all in TM '76 workshop procedures. Ecclesiola cares for corporate reflection in midst of three great campaigns.

Contradiction: Building more corporate strategizing time for situations such as rural Ohio in time design while not missing beat on circuits. (Wk. 8)

NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Intensifies sponsor and pre-sponsor events.

Internal: Collegiums on "Six Speeches" and World Hunger reveal relevance of Global Social Demonstration to impact global food crisis.

Contradiction: Fearing demands of following through on 72 Town Meetings results in doing minimum job of circuits. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Arouses passion for East Liberty through Town Meeting '76 as community sings of "High Hopes" and demands action now.

Internal: Study on liberal mindset sets brooding screen for House. Ecclesiola is set off in fine style with Chinese meal and decor and impacting conversation on "Our Town".

Contradiction: Making full use of East Liberty demonstration Town Meeting after victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

Contradiction: Deciding the story that wins and believing in it ourselves. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Week of authorization visits includes state senator running for U.S. congress, and State Bicentennial chairman; new circuit opens in Ellicott City. Full week in retrospect as debriefing recalls Hagerstown circuit with troika meeting in Luray, PCC naming seven targets in Baltimore City and eliciting greater responsibility from key colleagues, and endorsement of TM by Southwest Baltimore Ministerial Fellowship.

Internal: Holds collegium on parish vision. Highlights training in collegiums on initial visits and data exchange and sodality construct pushes orchestration prowess.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: State Jaycee booth on TM '76 results in inquiries and in symbolizing intention to move with networks.

Internal: "Six Speeches" addresses House as it pushes all beyond TM '76.

Contradiction: Training movement in midst of mass impact. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Holds successful HRM at Maspeth United Methodist Church in Queens while doing three troika lunches and TM '76 follow-up meeting.

Internal: Holds Week II conversations on liberal heresy. Hosts Global Development team and HRM pedagogues.

Contradiction: Recruiting Town Meeting grads and metro troops effectively to help with Town Meeting development without slowing down freight train. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

Contradiction: Firming up strategy on 12 TM '76 dates set and 12 projected by Week 13. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Two-day blitz in Laconia sets up core meeting for Week 9. Two guild members travel to Brockton TM '76 and return with new excitement, plus secures in-kind food from "Stop and Shop" for Manchester TM '76.

Internal: Sends Margaret Refior to teach HRM in Brooklyn. Struggles with Metro Council construct as it calls colleagues together for first time this quarter.

Contradiction: Discerning difference between mildly interested and strongly committed TM '76 sponsors before setting up core meeting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: After six months, seats of city despair, New Bedford and Lawrence, consolidate troika's decision to do TM '76. Revises model for training ready local leadership for TM '76, February 28.

Montreal for most. Local people get new image of what ICA can do. "French Connection", Anna Mae Knight, Canadian metro colleague from New Orleans, joins group, scatters doubloons from Mardi Gras throughout each bus.

Internal: Anna Mae Knight conducts collegium on state of American Roman Catholic church.

Contradiction: Broadening base of relationships without evidence of deep core forming itself. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: CFC circuits widen base of contacts as friend from Alberta is discovered who has been waiting to be called. Obtains many names in previously unknown polises.

Internal: Continental and Area representatives come to Toronto to continue developing many arenas of movement activity.

Contradiction: Moving into future with power by consolidating gains made on many fronts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

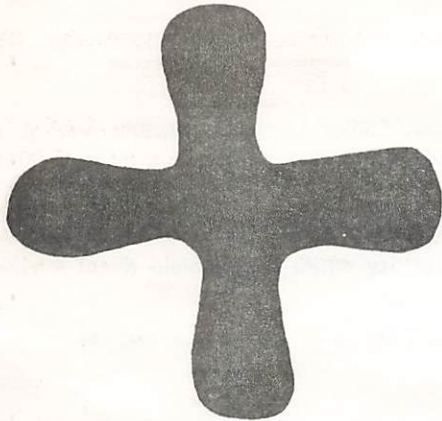

Internal: Spends Week II in Town Meeting pedagogy workshop and in creating new decor.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE)

Contradiction: Discerning common understanding of parish thrust in midst of wandering in missional desert. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Thorough groundwork and having colleagues as authorization gives strong supportive representative gathering for first steering committee in Prince Albert.

Internal: Two newly secured jobs lift House out of financial tail spin.

Contradiction: Building authorization network and ICA story that allays suspicion and creates trust. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Gets three foot by two foot cases of puffed wheat, in-kind.

Internal: Centennial 5 sponsor committee off and running with sponsorship meeting date picked.

Contradiction: Keeping hold of ends of many ropes without getting entangled. (Wk. 10)

HOUSTON RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Within a week, small industrial suburb pulls together 20-member TM '76 steering committee, appoints chairman, vice chairman, and secures basic funding and facility.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

Internal: One five-figure salary secured, plus two other probable offers, signals end of financial crisis in sight.

Contradiction: Discerning how to do circuit in House's own home polis while being sapped by many other demands. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: Holds three Town Meetings in OK on February 28, with total of 890 people attending: OK City, Lawton, Alva. Snowball hits us in the face Tuesday night as Lawton informs all of plan to do four more neighborhood Town Meetings.

External: Four do Town Meeting workshops. Attends Jaycee convention. Denton black group decides to pick up TM '76 and sets date for June 10 (Black Heritage Day).

Internal: Receives in-kind loan of IBM typewriter. Study on liberal heresy strips all naked. Creates North

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS)

Texas TM '76 endorsement flyer.

Contradiction: Struggling to be catalytic in midst of demonstration mentality. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Sets another TM'76 in Okmulgee June 26. Tulsa TM '76 is cranking up for May 1. Celebrates fine HRM at Centenary United Methodist Church.

Internal: Puts together new Rolodex for instant communication with world.

Contradiction: Journeying continental core effectively without burning out narrow vision. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Metro colleagues pick up new responsibility for TM '76. Eight Town Meetings are scheduled between April 10 and May 15. Guissinger returns to Maliwada.

Internal: Mardi Gras celebrates New Orleans and the church year. Celebrates birth on February 28 of Alison Thelma (4 lbs. 14 ounces) to Frank and Sandy Powell. Welcomes ITP visitor, Anja Bos, and sojourner Terry Fahrenbacher.

Contradiction: Getting all to say that the sponsor committees formed can do the job. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Blitz part of Arkansas which had not been seen before and was thought to be "dead" country.

Internal: Thursday morning Booher model study brings consciousness about The Way Life Is.

Contradiction: Being intentional in midst of being overwhelmed by demands. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Jacksonville holds pre-steering committee meeting which becomes steering committee meeting before it is over; sets date and assigns tasks, imaging this as first of several TM '76's for city.

Internal: Shifts Tuesday night to task teams for TM '76, inviting metro colleagues to keep coming over that evening. Town Meeting takes precedence over family night for many families, as Town Meeting presentations to clubs capture our imaginations. Sends Clifford Wilson to new assignment at Chicago Centrum.

Contradiction: Designing olympic-speed-style snow shoes to keep up with snowball. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Mails newsletter and TM '76 invitations.

Internal: TM '76 public relations includes regular 15-second TV spot; writes TM '76 articles for three state-wide publications; 22 are present at first Carolinas metros RS-I. Methodology of Kawangware Consult impacts all.

Contradiction: Maintaining comprehensive missional thrust while giving away methods. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: PCC is great happening with Allapattah being represented by all cultures. Jaycees create and mail their TM '76 brochure to over 300 clubs in Florida. Bradenton, Sebring, Boynton Beach, Key West, Miami Shores all ready to go. First timer at sponsorship meeting is given assignment of in-kinding doughnuts for Kendall TM '76 shows up next morning with 25 dozen. Also in-kinds 15 reams of paper, color printing by AM for product cover, pens, pencils, pork 'n beans.

Internal: Sojourner decides to stay another week. Anxious excitement pervades in anticipation for Kendall TM '76, a highly catalytic meeting for southern Florida, especially Dade county. Renovates House by pulling trees out of roof.

Contradiction: Trying to keep yeses from turning into "Oh yes, I remember you". (Wk. 9)

External: Experiences great Uptown TM'76 with 615 attending.

Internal: Kenneth and Deana Henry arrive on way to Majuro. Sends out team to Isle of Dogs Consult.

Contradiction: Creating the cross-centrum systems that will undergird the practical demands—i.e. funding and materials—of the coming quarter. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Local church visits reveal existing care nets and expands South City authorization.

Internal: All adults employed for week, thanks to Manpower and third full-time job. Kawangware study enables all to see single thread winding through all.

Contradiction: Maintaining tension between economic self-support and promoting TM '76. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Sev Sorenson, agriculture professor for 30 years, from Nebraska City, decides to go to Jeju.

Internal: Spends collegium time to battleplan mid-course intensification. Ecclesiola is celebrated with showing of "One Flew Over Cuckoo's Nest".

Contradiction: Engaging people's passion when and where it happens. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

Internal: Ash Wednesday reminds all of religious presence in midst of secular.

Contradiction: Making local conscious of TM '76 tied together to bring off Town Meeting. (Wk. 10)

Contradiction: Deciding to move through existing Town Meeting steering committees to break loose new set-up machinery for 216 Town Meetings in region. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Possibilities are whirling. Arthur, IL, completes highly successful TM '76 with Amish community represented. Morton, Bloomington, IL, continues steering committee meetings while Lord appeared to mayor of Bushnell in his sleep, and commissions him to do TM '76.

Internal: Finds TM '76 story telling enhances after leading workshop at Arthur, IL, TM '76.

Contradiction: Overcoming blocks in small towns in order to continue momentum of snowball. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Holds first HRM in bi-metro in Merrill. Sets plan for Oneida TM '76.

Internal: Thirteen new participants, including two members of Oneida Indian tribe, attend PCC.

Contradiction: Struggling with finances in midst of mission breaking loose all around. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Visits 20 new towns and 13 Jaycee clubs, including prison chapter at Waupun. East Madison sets date for April 24 and Brookfield confirm May 1 date. A gracious guardian buffet takes place with highlight of presentations of slides from three consults. Celebrates Shrove Tuesday with pancakes at breakfast metro core meeting.

Internal: Extensive dispersal of House staff on missional assignments and youth to extended family leaves no one at home. Begins Lenten season with fast on Ash Wednesday and decision to use Lenten journals at collegium on Wednesdays.

Contradiction: Creating internal/external rhythm which honors missional demands and corporate life. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Best letter yet from mayor of major city, Indianapolis. Visit with city librarian-colleague in Lexington yields two presentations on history and sociology of city—perfect prep for TM '76 set-up.

Internal: Actualizes regional dynamic; three Houses join forces financially and on circuits. Winter ice storm enables missionally, miraculous reordering of office.

Contradiction: Creating rationale for deployment of troops when troops and geography are uncertain. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Networks open and accelerate with Independent Insurance Agents saying yes to TM. Black endorsement through People United to Save Humanity (PUSH), Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) key to urban circuits.

Internal: Global news event conversation breaks loose in morning collegium as 6th graders, youth and adults realize again interrelatedness of globe.

Contradiction: Creating back-up system that allows intensification of circuits. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Holds first HRM in Madison Heights day after most dazzling TM '76 in Pontiac yet in region convinces all of secular-religious and religious-secular dynamics. Mayor of Pontiac stays for entire day and becomes engaged.

Internal: Hosting four pedagogues from globe enlivens House Church celebration. Missional thrust intensifies with entire House engaged in TM '76 and HRM.

Contradiction: Building necessary structures to journey region toward Xavierism, having prioritized next twenty TM '76's before July, 1976. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Designs and produces TM '76 Sponsors Manual which organizes chronology from foray to date of Town Meeting with methods and models for recognizing and training executive coordinators, steering

committees, and sponsors committees.

Internal: Sends priors to Area Council meeting in Chicago.

Contradiction: Designing models and systems needed to insure winning on the road while being on the road all the time. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Creates Area Town Meeting Newsletter and sends it to all Town Meeting contacts and grads and other Houses in Area.

Internal: Hears colorful collegium on New York City politics. Jason Megraw is one of 50 finalists out of 500,000 school children participating in city spelling bee.

Contradiction: Creating second, third, fourth level strategies for moving from initial yes to final decision for Town Meeting. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Parish indicative battleplan creates avenues for entry into parish as House polishes appearance with back yard transformation and room creation for community Emerging Generation.

Internal: Visit to Manchester school for black culture event leads into House celebration attending jazz concert performance by local church at Heinz Hall.

Contradiction: Finding channels of authentic participation that would enable catalyzation of Manchester Town Meeting. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Regional Council draws 37 colleagues, over 10% non-RS-I grads, to share models necessary to catalyze 216 Town Meetings in Rochester Region, and to experience Global Social Demonstration. Region and House staff three Town Meetings, two HRM's and one RS-I. Maplewood Town Meeting becomes demonstration sign to whole region, as representatives from each metro attend.

Internal: Two more House members decide to get full-time jobs as economic reality becomes clear. Hosts TM '76 guests at House and celebration gives chance to talk about profundity of programs.

Contradiction: Deciding to be trained people and be ICA consultants 100% of time. (Wk. 10)

IRELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: Maryland Municipality League invites ICA to do mini TM '76 workshops at State convention. Enters Garfield TM '76 in Distributive Education State Bicentennial project contest. Roanoke, VA, steering committee includes mayor, state representative, Chairman of Bicentennial Commission, and five major corporation heads.

Internal: Global Social Demonstration prep begins through collegium study. Area Priors trek breaks open TM '76 leadership training model.

Contradiction: Engaging full time in Global Social Demonstration prep while engaging full time in TM '76. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Week of authorization visits includes state senator running for U.S. congress, and State Bicentennial chairman; new circuit opens in Ellicott City. Full week in retrospect as debriefing recalls Hagerstown circuit with troika meeting in Luray, PCC naming seven targets in Baltimore City and eliciting greater responsibility from key colleagues, and endorsement of TM by Southwest Baltimore Ministerial Fellowship.

External: State Jaycee booth on TM '76 results in inquiries and in symbolizing intention to move with networks.

Internal: "Six Speeches" addresses House as it pushes all beyond TM '76.

Contradiction: Training movement in midst of mass impact. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Holds successful HRM at Maspeth United Methodist Church in Queens while doing three troika lunches and TM '76 follow-up meeting.

Internal: Holds Week II conversations on liberal heresy. Hosts Global Development team and HRM pedagogues.

Contradiction: Recruiting Town Meeting grads and metro troops effectively to help with Town Meeting development without slowing down freight train. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Norwich, CT, sets October 17 for TM '76. Eighteen people, ten organizations hold first planning meeting for May 1 Town Meeting in Hartford's South End. House sets aside Tuesday afternoon for strategy session to release TM '76 dates.

Internal: Ash Wednesday is celebrated at Daily Office and in evening at Episcopal church in parish. Jim Stewart stays at House while working on state project. Morgan Fleming is torch bearer at Good Shepherd Episcopal church.

Contradiction: Getting Town Meeting dates set and on board. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Metro Council is signal event of re-engaging colleagues in edge work. Nashua Corporation agrees to do in-kind printing for guide books for North American continent.

Internal: Sends out House member to orchestrate Town Meeting; brings back news and fresh insights.

Contradiction: Turning on core set-up and core meetings quickly without giving in to wishful thinking. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Brockton TM '76 becomes everything you ever wanted and more: quality local workshop leaders, total city support, 375 at day, and local radio rises to immediate response on proposal for public forums. Warren RI, says yes to TM '76 in four weeks. Boston burst into bud of expectancy with affirmation of eight city TM '76's by steering committee members.

Internal: Ash Wednesday night is covered with snow and ice is announced for prayer and contemplation. Entire House is present for ecclesiola for first time in four weeks.

Contradiction: Daring to vision future necessities when there is not enough time to complete present necessities. (Wk. 10)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Global Social Demonstration is given in French to group of community leaders.

Internal: Dr. Lao shows up in the person of Steve Harrington, who teaches us to play the role of consultant.

Contradiction: Shifting from just using our methods to embodying them. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: CFC circuits widen base of contacts as friend from Alberta is discovered who has been waiting to be called. Obtains many names in previously unknown polises.

Internal: Continental and Area representatives come to Toronto to continue developing many arenas of movement activity.

Contradiction: Moving into future with power by consolidating gains made on many fronts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sends Northern trek to Sudbury, Timmons. Ottawa West steering committee has LENS grad volunteer to be Community Forum Canada leader.

Internal: Guardian family comes to dinner and discusses Global Social Demonstration location. Ernie Smeathers spends evening of CFC planning at House.

Contradiction: Sensing transition is needed, but with twelve weeks of CFC ahead, not knowing to what. (Wk. 10)

External: Completes and mocks up ITI:Caracas report for printer. House member, Fr. Davila, conducts retreat for Catholic Women's Association on role of 20th century churchwoman.

Internal: Spends Week II creating battleplan for next 20 weeks. Reveals quarter of heavy Global Social Demonstration research.

Contradiction: Holding long-range strategies in midst of mountain of practical immediacies. (Wk. 9)

Data received through global band results in increasing number of calls in Nairobi and pushes daily global thinking. Hong Kong senses breakthrough in scheduling treks in long term blocks. 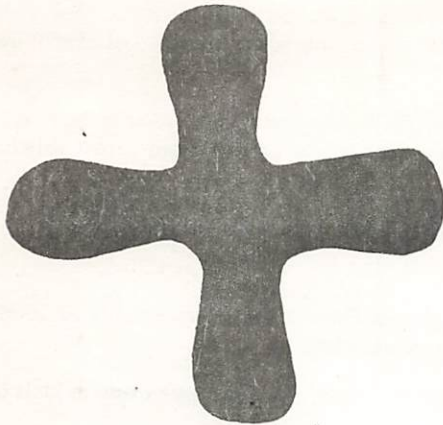

Internal: Sends Robinsons and three consultants from Area London to Maliwada Consult. Wayside Inn Dynamic shifts as guests don work clothes to assist with restoration of Bridge House. Receives interns Alan Berresford and Stephen Polyarck.

Contradiction: Eliciting global care in midst of intensifying local responsibility. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Four Glasgow Metro cadres meet to create Global decor in new Youth Club, a cadre miracle three years in the making. Edinburgh Cadre takes first step in new PCE parish. Isle of Dogs story excites region as consultants prepare to go south.

Internal: Sends out five Isle of Dogs consultants at House Church celebration.

Contradiction: Finding local forms to contain the passion of returning consultants. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

Contradiction: Working out of common model of where all are headed, as reflected in awareness of exposure of numerous operating images and responses. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: South Denver sets May 15 for first city TM '76, including 13 organizations, favorable newspaper coverage.

Internal: Return of Jan and Armando Divas from Guatemala impacts House with slides and discussion concerning earthquake, raising possibility for Global Social Demonstration.

Contradiction: Accelerating in midst of fractured consensus relative to Global Community Forum campaign momentarily stalling Town Meeting '76. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Four TM '76 circuits on the road, all get positive responses. Sends six representatives from Rapid City to Women's Forum in Minneapolis. Experiences breakthroughs relative to images and troika for North Rapid Heritage Celebration.

Contradiction: Finding appropriate nutcracker to crack the hard nut of South Dakota. (Wk. 11)

External: Southwest Edmonton holds Community Forum, 150 participate with 11 local workshop leaders to make this CFC a demonstration to the city.

Internal: All time spent preparing for Southwest Edmonton as House prepares training models, practices checklists, does in-kinding and some Wayside Inn hosting and sends Rory Gowers off to Isle of Dogs Consult.

Contradiction: Moving full steam ahead with CFC but no dates ahead of us has left us without sign posts. (Wk. 11)

Contradiction: Maintaining stance of "they happen all the time" when we have not had one (CFC) yet. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Community ethnic groups decide to support Centennial 5 Community Forum by representation on steering committee.

Internal: Call from city catalyzes repair of fire escape and plans for doing additional House repairs.

Contradiction: Demonstrating that engagement in the spirit movement and its practical forms is more significant than where people are presently engaged. (Wk. 11)

HOUSTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON**

Internal: Spends week on the road, Friday evening reporting, Week II prep for Saturday doing of key tactics.

Contradiction: Defining the key tactics for major win. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: Great TM '76 in Miami with 275 adults, 85 children in attendance. Children's TM '76 has in-kind flag-shaped pizzas from Pizza Hut. Tulsa TM '76 date is set for June 5.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA)

Internal: Doenges Prother's Ford provides new car for third consecutive Town Meeting within four-week period.

Contradiction: Finding ways to get people in phase II and III engaged all day in Town Meeting, particularly men. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: First annual Memphis - New Orleans bi-regional event is held in Jackson, with hotel housing for 12 House and metro colleagues courtesy of the local Jaycees, featuring story sharing, timeline building by both regions as well as strategizing on the two states we share: Mississippi, Alabama.

Internal: Second floor renovation enters second room, armed with spackling, paint, brushes, ladders. Four of five adults attend Week II event in Jackson.

Contradiction: Finding, recognizing, fanning into flame the spark of interest which is beginning of any Town Meeting sponsorship committee. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Blitz part of Arkansas which had not been seen before and was thought to be "dead" country.

Internal: Thursday morning Booher model study brings consciousness about The Way Life Is.

Contradiction: Being intentional in midst of being overwhelmed by demands. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Jacksonville holds pre-steering committee meeting which becomes steering committee meeting before it is over; sets date and assigns tasks, imaging this as first of several TM '76's for city.

Internal: Shifts Tuesday night to task teams for TM '76, inviting metro colleagues to keep coming over that evening. Town Meeting takes precedence over family night for many families, as Town Meeting presentations to clubs capture our imaginations. Sends Clifford Wilson to new assignment at Chicago Centrum.

Contradiction: Designing olympic-speed-style snow shoes to keep up with snowball. (Wk. 10)

Internal: New spirit of possibility is brought to PCE with three new participants in one evening. Capturing inter-agency mailing list makes it possible to broaden marketing of various happenings: LENS, TM'76.

Contradiction: Raising immediate sign of new troops as sign to enable old hands. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Sets Port Washington, East Madison Town Meeting dates. Sponsorship meeting is enlivened by chairman, who, upon returning from Monroe TM '76 said "I think I'll join ICA". Monroe TM '76 hosts 226 adults and Emerging Generation in midst of being hit by worst ice storm in history.

Internal: House celebrates its greatness by bowling at local alley. Hangs gift of Majuro stick chart in living room. Holds Monroe leadership training session by candlelight as ice storm fells trees and power lines.

Contradiction: Creating discontinuous event that calls forth total commitment. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Best letter yet from mayor of major city, Indianapolis. Visit with city librarian-colleague in Lexington yields two presentations on history and sociology of city--perfect prep for TM '76 set-up.

Internal: Actualizes regional dynamic; three Houses join forces financially and on circuits. Winter ice storm enables missional, miraculous reordering of office:

Contradiction: Creating rationale for deployment of troops when troops and geography are uncertain. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

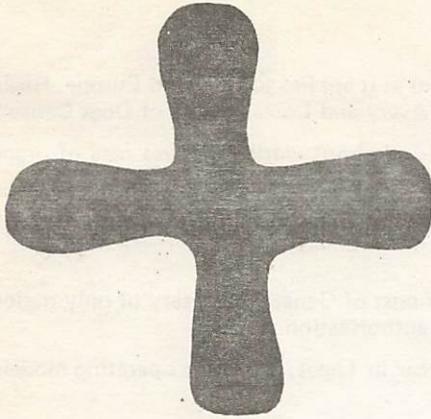

Contradiction: Reorganizing energies without losing momentum in all campaigns. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Town Meeting finally gets authorization with Jaycee state-wide mailing, plus three cities, one of them South Wichita, requests presentations and date-setting.

Internal: House is self-supporting with securing of four full-time jobs in two weeks, two job upgrades in third week.

Contradiction: Taking initial excitement about TM '76 and enabling it to become 12 Town Meetings by July '76. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Sev Sorenson, agriculture professor for 30 years, from Nebraska City, decides to go to Jeju.

Internal: Spends collegium time to battleplan mid-course intensification. Ecclesiola is celebrated with showing of "One Flew Over Cuckoo's Nest".

Contradiction: Engaging people's passion when and where it happens. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Receives \$500 from Overland Park for TM '76. Attends Area Council. Receives official go-ahead for TM '76 at Kansas Governor's conference on Aging.

Internal: Begins new Daily Office witness series on liturgy. Does collegium on intern prospects.

Contradiction: Encountering plateaus in arenas of networks, set-up, steering committees. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Preparations for Women In the Future forum next week lead to 55 registrations. Wagoner, SD, asks to have consult for town which is experiencing great tensions between whites and Native Americans. Work with Community Education network opens up terrific TM '76 sponsorship possibilities.

Internal: Ash Wednesday fast intensifies the religious stance and lends perspective to our efforts. Mid-quarter correction Week II allows for consensus articulation and tactics for the next seven weeks. Decision to intensify Whittier experiment, Last Temptations of Christ illuminate week end.

Contradiction: Standing on mountains surveying clouds rather than getting down and cutting grass. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Clinton Town Meeting, first in Iowa in almost a year is grand happening. Holds South Illinois Bicentennial Conference workshop in Marion, workshop leader training session in Quincy. Strategizes and assigns state of Iowa to be shared with Omaha, St. Louis, Minneapolis Houses. Visits Chamber of Commerce, Des Moines Life Underwriters.

Internal: Works on Academy prospects, one of whom is guild member who cared for children all weekend. One new job, one job upgrade complete full employment for year.

Contradiction: Prioritizing ceaseless, unlimited number of demands from many cities and networks in such a fashion that catalyzes thrust toward 5000. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Kiwanis of Carthage, IL, invites 35 to hear TM '76 presentation. Pekin Bicentennial Commission creates a "Catch 22" to get a coordinator, "if we don't have a member, we'll appoint someone to be a member".

Internal: Whole House travels to Chicago for 5th City work day and Area Council.

Contradiction: Training steering committees to act as corporate body. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Holds first HRM in state of Minnesota in Duluth. Total engagement of House priors signaled by attending Area Council and Women's Forum. House is depleted to one Emerging Generation and one baby sitter.

Internal: New spirit of possibility is brought to PCE with three new participants in one evening. Capturing inter-agency mailing list makes it possible to broaden marketing of various happenings: LENS, TM '76.

Contradiction: Raising immediate sign of new troops as sign to enable old hands. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Modification weekend brings forth greatest miracles ever.

Internal: Having development present in bi-metro, especially Ardil Watson's first visit to a North American Religious House is great event.

Contradiction: Finding new screen to interpret who we are as constant circuiting changes us. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Snowball finally starts to roll as three new TM '76 dates are set. TM '76 sponsor's committee in PCE parish plans for continuing work in parish.

Internal: House experiences rising from ashes to soar into new engagement as we decor and occupy space not used since December fire.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS)

Contradiction: Keeping fingers in the phone long enough to enable productive use of circuiting time. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: TM '76 is practically set up in one day as bank executive puts his calls on hold, calls in others, turns his office over to troika team during foray visit.

Internal: House Church is event that focuses passion, builds collegiality, as total House and many metro colleagues stand before global demand and celebrate engagement.

Contradiction: Focusing vision on the future in midst of immediate demand of the now. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Five of six metros are represented at Regional Council to face contradictions head on. Sponsors meetings ground TM '76s as unprecedented gift. Questions about follow-up are raised as Pontiac calls city council meeting to discuss proposals from TM '76 and invites all participants. Inner city sponsorship committee meets for four long hours to firm up commitments for upcoming TM '76 on April 3, the first in city of Detroit.

Internal: Study of "Sophistication" paper shows way for presencing TM '76 in an appropriate style. Raising question of intern possibilities pushes decision to strengthen internal life. House celebrates with world famous chicken dinner.

Contradiction: Enabling covenant without causing schism between House and region. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Designs and produces TM '76 Sponsors Manual which organizes chronology from foray to date of Town Meeting with methods and models for recognizing and training executive coordinators, steering committees, and sponsors committees.

Internal: Sends priors to Area Council meeting in Chicago.

Contradiction: Designing models and systems needed to insure winning on the road while being on the road all the time. (Wk. 10)

NEW YORK RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: New Town Meeting development tactic sees eight banks contacted for funding this week, three suburban and five city.

Internal: Hears famous terrific collegiums, develops four-week ecclesiola study guide, visits Franklin Jefferson Bicentennial exhibit at Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Contradiction: Enabling Town Meeting dates to appear on our timeline. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: One contact in Huntington sets up three steering committees in Huntington, Hamlin, Point Pleasant.

Internal: Paints 25 X 14' front parlor after stripping away 40-year old wallpaper. Begins job as community relations director in one of Northside Parish neighborhoods.

Contradiction: Creating rationale for catalyzing leadership development. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Holds three TM '76's, two in black communities; eleven new workshop leaders participate. Sets up troika luncheon and other speaking engagements.

Internal: Three people cover Daily Office assignments all week demonstrating holding structures is key, not how many people attend.

Contradiction: Building major strategies to engage more people for bigger job. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: More circuit visits in parish begin to uncover myriad of organizations, making Boulevard Town Meeting a possibility before summer.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND)

Internal: Ecclesiola celebration, evening of cards and Scrabble, sharpens strategic prowess and consensus building.

Contradiction: Enabling metro cadre care for metro aside from circuits and consultation. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON

External: "New U Community" Directory of Services goes to press. Northwestern High School, Hyattsville, MA, endorses Town Meeting. Northern VA, finds Jaycee spark plug for state-wide campaign.

Internal: Betty Pesek provides marvelous face lift in development team assigned to Washington. Cliff Wilson arrives and is off and running. Ides of March wipes out five cars.

Contradiction: Holding tension between long-range cultivation of networks and immediate Town Meeting push. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Maryland Jaycee state executive endorses TM '76, mails materials to all chapters. This catalyzes Cumberland troika. Hosts first Martinsburg workshop leaders training.

Internal: Secures one full-time job as legal secretary; second secures second job as waitress, third goes job-hunting after his firm goes bankrupt.

Contradiction: Covering the mission while becoming solvent. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: Five individuals weight Academy and three communities struggle with Town Meeting.

Internal: House undergoes face lift by painting, tribal resettlement, and creation of "executive suite" just in time for guests, Pastor Jim Reid and Japanese teacher Toshe Isinguro who came to dinner and went to steering committee meeting.

Contradiction: Placing distance markers to pace ourselves by. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: Town Meeting blitz on Newark's five wards uncovers firm local resolve to have TM '76 on June 5 in Central Ward, the 1967 riot area. Core group of 16 persons makes covenant to meet weekly following East Hanover TM '76.

Internal: Bombs set off in House blitz to annihilate 5,000 sojourning cockroaches. We win.

Contradiction: Channeling the passion of new Town Meeting grads to give firm kick to the snowball. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Wine and cheese bring together recent Town Meeting participants at House, which sparks highly constructive dialogue between suburban and urban residents on likenesses and differences of ways to approach the two settings.

Internal: House's new decor on inside addresses guest and us. Reaches full employment with securing two new jobs, one as secretary to executive director of U.S. Olympic Committee.

Contradiction: Embodying stylistically and practically that we have shown up at the right time, in the right time with the right tools. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Six communities commit to troika or planning meetings. Park Street 5 continues to build towards TM '76 on May 1. Inkind computer service is firmed up this week.

Internal: House undergoes "The Great Clean" and sends Darrell Marley to Indianapolis House. Finishes study of "Small is Beautiful".

Contradiction: Creating development plan and story that allows both local and matching funds to be raised in local community. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Portland Core meeting is set for March 30, with police department as initiators using LEAA. Keene State College students work toward college TM '76 for May 8.

Internal: Sends out Rose Worden, borrowed for two weeks from Area House, back to New York. Area enablement for TM '76 circuit is great happening.

Contradiction: Finding snowball strategies to capitalize on recent momentum. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: New waves of future are visible as we train 36 local people, metro colleagues, and selves in five days to be workshop leaders for Town Meetings. New Bedford informational meeting has 35 people raring to go with strong troika behind them.

Internal: Collegiums stand before taxes and possibility; finds tax refund eligibility. Studies Six Flags.

Contradiction: Completing model for Town Meetings in Boston after having built and implemented model for Rhode Island. (Wk. 12)

MONTREAL RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Community Housing Corporation writes charter, ready for publication, locates permanent office.

Internal: Presence of potential CFC sponsor at ecclesiola calls forth House creativity to adapt construct. Sends John Stringham to Isle of Dogs Consult. Invites 16 people from Area involved in Week II Area Publishing House dynamic.

Contradiction: Maintaining campaigns momentum while dealing with increased financial push. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Sudbury confirms businessmen's consult to improve communications in downtown Sudbury.

Internal: Celebration is mid-push with dining and dancing at Chateau Laurier. Montreal colleagues pack House for Area printing PSU.

Contradiction: Making the switch from breakopen circuiters to spirit trainers with five events scheduled. (Wk. 12)

CARACAS RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Regional Council gathers for barbeque and to hear report on '76 ITI. Sends LENS mailing to grads and prospects. Translates ITI report into Spanish for continental mailing of report. Late ITI scholarship check arrives through Fr. Bede Hornung's development efforts with family in Europe. Rafael Davila visits with ITI grads in Lima. Guardian Jamil Dunia reports 10 paid registrations for Rotary LENS and long list of considering.

Internal: Rev. George Archer (ITI '75) drops through on visit and reports Caribbean Conference of Churches' interest in EI programs for future. Sends Rafael Davila to Maryknoll meeting in Lima. House goes on city trek using Other World categories and discovers mystery and depth of Caracas.

Contradiction: Catalyzing edge of thrust instead of doing it. (Wk. 11)
