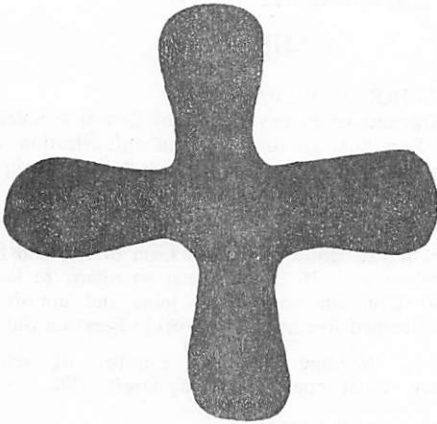


GLOBAL ORDER REPORT

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Canterbury guild, Oxford cadre and North American local congregation raise funds and build curriculum for IHDP pre-school. Publication of summary statement on IHDP and context on ICA enable guildsmen in recruitment story. Island Youth take assignments in cinema programme, TM steering committee, development and authorisation calls. Vehicle maintenance guild creates symbol.

Internal: In-kinds river boat tour around Isle of Dogs. Potential Island intern family participates in ecclesiola. Experiences power of corporate study from Bonhoeffer, Estimates, Sun Tzu.

Contradiction: Distinguishing the terrain from the enemy. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE GLASGOW

External: Five go to T.M. publications P.S.U. in Bristol.

Internal: Two new jobs secured; 80 ecclesiola invitations mailed; ecclesiola conversation by Greg Tolman. best in years.

Contradiction: Doing battle with economic tyrant and not being consumed. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Caerphilly (Wales) authorization gives nod and local Rotary Club secretary decides to locate the troika.

Internal: Those assigned to be permeaters are fully employed. Hosts miracle Area P.S.U. which translates T.M. material. Printing moves ahead.

Contradiction: Developing an image that recruits the III, as a crucial part of the three campaigns. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: House sends Zenon Janik, Larry Greenwald and two regional colleagues to T.M.:Europe materials workshop

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Prints first pages of FCF workbook; begins implementing ITI recruitment battleplan; hosts Mr. and Mrs. Bhagwat at dinner (government official from Aurangabad who aided in selection of Maliwada as GSD site.)

Internal: Internal structures revitalised; celebrates ecclesiola dinner-party style and a new model for team task assignments allows a new intentionality in enablement and symbolic roles.

Contradiction: Producing FCF workbook holds up actual FCF set up. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Florence circuit opens up unexpected doors on new vistas on T.M. possibilities. Does promotion for November 13 Incontro Di Quartiere in Trastevere and visitation toward others in Naples.

Internal: Context expanded to Eschatological-Universal with collegium of news from the desert and reflections on the mission.

Contradiction: Forgeing ahead relentlessly while appearing to wait graciously for sponsors and permission givers. (Wk. 5)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Start ball rolling for ICA registration. List of delegates for medical order. Five day consultation includes

their mother-general and representative to the papal pro-nuncio.

Internal: First GSD packet helps focus planning. Attends Bolshoi ballet performance at national theatre.

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Permeation assignment visits turn into calls on behalf of the whole mission and turn up ways to get paid for methodological prowess.

Internal: Celebrative Saturday evening image comes off in fine style with meal, decor, and visit to the Grand Place.

Contradiction: Breaking through the bureaucratic structures to obtain work permits. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Core groups for TM emerge in four cities Liege, Gent, Kortrijk, Charleroi as circuits gain rhythm.

Internal: Creating development notebook, discover list of 100 sources (grassroots) El Bayad consultants return.

Contradiction: Getting a clear picture of core prospects to get core time line. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Week of development yields two new regular pledges and pick up of a \$2000 check from Dutch funding agency. Two new people join cadre in TM campaign. Receives great endorsement letter from a colleague social worker.

Internal: Three day sojourn of extended family Anateuka provided discontinuity as House receives gift of movie tickets.

Contradiction: Designing tactics that yield immediate results in meeting this month's continental development goal. (Wk. 5)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Creating the Gemeindeforum-Europa(TM) story in Frankfurt; completed brochure and workbook in German; invitation sent for mini demonstration and training.

Internal: Research and writing of lectures on Germany for Global Language School. Decor completed with 54 Area names up in entrance way.

Contradiction: Finding combination to unlock the door to Gemeindeforum-Europa set up. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: Key authorization breakthrough in development as Kaiser Aluminum gives names of banking heads for Berlin and promises endorsement. Stake calling with community people reveals power of local. Saturday night celebration with eight community residents strengthens community core.

Internal: Ecclesiola Sun Tzu study is life giving as it cuts away paralysis. Sunday corporate planning sets anticipation at a high pitch

Contradiction: Creating and operating out of a clear vision of next steps. (Wk. 5)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Draws up ITI report and printer inkinded. Designs stations for HDP prep. Kitwe metro cadre meeting scheduled;

Internal: Discontinuity allows for forays into Zambian game park and to Victoria Falls. Sun Tsu enables 'way to victory' with three guests at ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Moving on seven week pathway to consult amidst of final authorization. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Opening of El Bayad HDP by Governor Soleiman Mitwali of Beni Suef granting letter of authorization, legal registration and grais housing in doctor's three bedroom apartment over veterinary hospital newly built all the first day.

Internal: El Bayad House welcomes team of five and three Order members and 26 international guardians to launch Project. 30 Egyptian consultants joins and almost 100 villagers. Welcomed five interns at Weekly Feast on Sunday.

Contradiction: Needing sufficient number of vehicles causing very thirst consultants on desert. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Holds Elders meeting, KBA meeting (Kawangware Business Association), commissions meeting, and has delivery of 32 tons of balast for Kawangware Block Industry.

Internal: Birth of Teran Edward Leopke, departure of Sharon Young to Lusaka assignment, and visit from Joyce Quimbey of Hong Kong makes this week one of arrivals and departures.

Contradiction Making support system work without waiting for them to move it. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: In-kinds Week II transport and driver for maneuvers and also lay-out for English/Swahili workbooks. Swahili translation continues in Nairobi while first Mombasa circuit of current year is underway.

Internal: Obtains work permit after visits to top immigration officials, opening door for future permits for ICA staff. Seventeen year old demonstrates astonishing sensitivity as workshop leader in Village Meeting training session. Celebrates Kenyatta Day with city. News conversation on ban of public meetings in province where first VM is scheduled awakens sensitivity to political arena.

Contradiction: Running out to do Village Meetings or being paralyzed by fear instead of finding ways to strategically gain authorization for Village Meetings in face of current political insecurity. (Wk. 5)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: Maliwada Human Development Training School participant have two day Shram Dan (Work Day) giving face-lift to entire village.

Internal: Celebrates the marriage of Simon S'Soza and Archana Mandal October 17. Beth and William Jackson

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY)
arrives.

Contradiction: Mobilizing troops to break thru on all the battle fronts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Sets up Gram Sabha in Pune and Jabalpur, a signal explosion in development. Assigns six members out to develop their travel funds through systematic blitz.

Internal: Receives family of Vinodi Bai, Lalitha, Bina Joy, Pinky, Bobby, and three Youth from Jabalpur as interns. Produces Quarter II House manuals.

Contradiction: Using the large and small forces scattered across the Area in one great missional thrust. (Wk. 4)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Vivan Paul to Gram Sabha in Jabalpur. Delhi participates in Continental development push in two strong circuits.

Internal: Celebrates Diwali by whole house having sweets, candles, fireworks, etc. Spends fast day in physical expenditure with washing corporate space. Gram Sabha pedagogy great entertainment at weekly planning.

Contradiction: Getting the courage to risk jumping into the unknown relative to jobs and Gram Sabha (Wk 5)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Gunfoundry Guild implements first post Gram Sabha miracle, an eight foot by sixteen foot mural with Hyderabad map and Gunfoundry symbol on it, painted on huge wall of local school. Community elder and miracle gun remarks-This is only the beginning. Vijavwada circuit returns with great Gram Sabha authorization

Internal: Goes developing on RS101 from Fveryone blitz and discovers that all are developers.

Contradiction: Securing definite support from Mvriad of possibilities. (Wk. 5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Sends unexpected regional colleague to HDTS in Maliwada. Continues Gram Sabha preparations, highlighted by completion of comprehensive task guideline sheet for local steering committees. Holds meetings in three regions for Gram Sabha decisions and set-up. Creates Area development plan for releasing grassroots funds for global development band.

Internal: In midst of transforming House with new decor, old regional colleague stops in to see what is happening since GRA.

Contradiction: Holding tension of self-support and circuit rides with unexpected immediate Gram Sabha demands calling for attention. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Visits with local church pastor focuses on urban farm project-hydroponic farming.

Internal: Two bedrooms recovered as house space is readied for quarter. Store room recreated as auxiliary office.

Teacher from American school is first House Church guest of quarter.

Contradiction: Locating HDP site difficult and allowing energies to be absorbed by decondary demands. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: High priority GSD village trek with Deputy Governor of Federal Reserve Bank indicates clear-cut collegiality with one of TWC. Week II development workshop opens campaign for program budget and US\$48,000 GSD requirements.

Internal Returns from Area planning meeting in Singapore sobered by commitment to total area budget. Celebrated Deepavali with visit to Hindu Temple at Batu Caves and Bar-B-Q at Templer Park.

Contradiction Manning big development guns when sights are all trained on GSD. (Wk.5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA

External: Excitement about project continues to mount as over 100 attend second stake meeting, 20 attend first guild meetings and over 500 watch first community film (Global Exposure Program). Agriculture guild plows six plots of land with new community notorized tiller.

Internal: Spirits lifted by newdecor and furnishings and lights from in-kind generator. Sends out Kay Lush as Joint Embassy School's representative to 'College Admissions Conference in New York. Celebrates engagement of Eunice Miclat and Sherwood Shankland.

Contradiction Moving villagers from individual engagement in activities to corporate engagement in decision-making.(Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM HONG KONG

External: Sends Tony Elizondo and Bruce Robertson out on Osaka and Taipei treks. Sends out GSD newsletter and Global Operational file system to all.

Internal: Ellery Elizondo lands job with Hong Kong Shanghai Bank as Procedures and manual Writing Specialist. Ecclesiola continues to be a refreshing interlude of Week I.

Contradiction: Discerning the practical events and stories that release and objectify the demand to move it. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Affirmative development trek including key authorization for Hong Kong GSD occurs while housing research continues in Fuk Wah and newsletter and completes brochure mass mailing.

Internal: Sister, who has been previous guest at House Church, tells of her experiences and another member of her Order comes with her to participate in dynamics of 20th Century Order.

Contradiction Breaking open both geo-social terrain and images in order to locate housing in project village. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOSHUNG

External: All-Island Council of the two regions in Taiwan is happening with Movemental colleagues present. Prepares and secures LENS materials and locations.

Internal: Celebrates Teachers' Day, birthday of Confucius, with battleplanning session. Conversations of winning, held with colleagues at Council, occasion wonder and

excitement. Sun Tzu study begins in House.

Contradiction: Experiencing self as five generals charging into battle and finding few troops following after. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Circuits to Legaspi and Cavite City reaffirms strong support in the region establishes metro cadre and sets up PLC/GCF plans for Quarter II

Internal: Interlude and shortened tin design give lift to ecclesiola. Sends out Judy Albers to Davao for GCF initiation work. Receives Tito de la Zerna and Ben Patote enroute to Maliwada. Celebrates birthdays fo Truman Packard and Zheny Armas.

Contradiction: Viewing each tactic as individual action rather than a part of total swirl of events that make up missional thrust. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Peter Hu joins Kaohsiung House in HDP site research in southwestern Taiwan farming/fishing villages. Development and LENS are missional focus Circuit to Taichung interests Mary Knollers in consult

Internal: Pedagogy excites 15 colleagues as Christ Lecture in Mandarin led by Lin I-Hong is focus for theological reflection and dialogue. HDP slide show awes ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Making contacts for religious and secular courses suffice to secure adequate audiencws. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE CEBU

External: Receives medicines and clinic apparatus from Philadelphia Pharmaceutical Association thru Squibb Pharmaceuticals; rabbit hatch material from GMC Workdays on abara dving experiment and fish pond demonstration. Eduardo Abartez visits Sudtonggan and promises to give generator. Eight HDP slides shown to guild meetings and LENS recruitment at St Theresa's College with 60 people both government and business sectors.

Internal: Welcomes James Aberg for development and Judy Alvers for brief visit. Sends out Ben Potat to Manila for Maliwada Rreplication School. House goes to 12 point tour to acquaint new staff to place.

Contradiction: Demonstrating possibilities for Philippines through practicl business ventures on appropriate seale in Sudtonggan. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE DAVAO

External: Initial plans made for PCT GCF in Nabunturan. In-kind 100 pounds of rice and \$250 worth of lumber for remodeling of training center.

Internal: Welcomes Judith Albers on area task forces. Sends her out to teach LENS in Cebu Hosts largest ecclesiola with nine guests.

Contradiction: Keeping all plates spinning whil remodeling the foundations. (Wk 5)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Slide show at International School of the Sacred Heart results in offer of students to raise development funds and Dr. Aksinov offers in-kind medical supplies and continuing financial support.

Internal: Dr. Kavoori, Executive Director fo Family Planning Institute, India, visits House

Contradiction: Living with continuing suceses and creating comprehensivy community events. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JEJU

External: Thousand villages attend gala congress in all-night celebration Saturday Dr Moon's nurse begins regular visits while Sung On church sends three doctors and dentist for Saturday clinic. Distributes cement for 100 new toilets; begins village bulletin, starts new pasture program; visits homes of village women Negotiates for gas station, expands Jeju development re-organizes guild, all this amidst busy hay harvest.

Internal: Tribal resettlement moves kitchen and re-orders office. Miss Park Myong Hwa arrives to sojourn and is assigned to health outpost. Converts toilet to septic with new vents. Orders finances and collegium on community reformulation puts new light on project. Hosts visitors Rev. Kim Chung Mon and Rev. Che Chung Shik.

Contradiction Laying down new operational images. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE SEOUL

External: TM Korea set-up in Munjun-dong, Seoul City. Kwangju Metro trek breaks open metro development,visits pastors for HRM set-up; PCE site research focus on four districts of Seoul

Internal: Celebrates life and death of regional colleague Rev. Park Shin Won. deeply addressed by Sun Tzu study as basic to Korea's own strategic mind-set.

Contradiction Rearranging troops and re-establishing metro troops for development priority. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE FUKUOKA

External: PLC recruitment in Hiroshima and Ita-kyushu. Development calls begin to generate new support for GSD. Guild continues work on translation of GSD materials.

Internal Remerbers the healing work and cruciform call as all participate in RSI

Contradiction Moving beyond unnecessary waiting. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE OSAKA

External Kobe Town Meeting Week 6 receives request from Mayor's office to be represented. Japan Overseas Christian Service offers \$300-\$500 medical supplies for Jeju

Internal Hizondo is through on first development trek

Contradiction Enlarging contacts into the secular. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE SENDAI

External Has more GSD research with colleagues from Hokaido Whangers of Houston delight 17 people with GSD stories on way to Guardian consultation in the Phillipines.

Internal Collegium points to new direction for colleague participationishiguros do Japanese-English translation of the Tazoe report on JeJu.

Contradiction Telling it like it is while getting involvement as do it. (Wk 5)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE. SYDNEY

External: Anna Stanley visits and Sydney Metro Circuits are established. South Sydney town planner is very affirmative New Castle Christian Womens group hears

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY)

Oombulgurri story and decide to forge annual dinner outing and give \$6 each.

Internal: Takes ecclesiola dynamic to South Sydney ethnic dance festival, while Jay Zahrt and Peter Duffy have excellent entries in art exhibition.

Contradiction: Pronouncing absolution on the given situation and doing the doable tactics. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Shell Company grants Oombulgurri right to purchase fuel at government rates and sends a shipment of in-kind goods to Oombulgurri. One woman comes alive and produces full team of workshop leaders for Scarborough CMA.

Internal: Anita Duncan arrives from Oombulgurri for Community Health training course and sends out Stanley to Jakarta.

Contradiction: Finding that the motivity issue is not when the first breakloose occurs but when the ongoing work becomes just hard work. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Builds circuit planning model for the year. Secures three floats for Christmas week parade.

Internal: Sally lands a job at the hospital.

Contradiction: Trusting the situation enough to allow selves to move with it. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Market Garden Trickle Irrigation System connected to town water supply doubling water consumption yet constant water supply maintained. People passing through medical audit now number 189. Greens patch for small stock completed. Kitco gets new garden.

Internal: Old office space reclaimed. New office continues being transformed into war room with installation of repository bookshelves.

Contradiction: Enabling community momentum when all available transport unavailable. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Gawler names CMA day Troikas set up in Elizabeth, St. Augusta, Kapunda Blackwood. Steering committees set up in Mr. Gambier and in-kind CMA manual and housing materials for Oombulgurri. Siera College holds workshop session.

Internal: First ecclesiola with new manual. Kim Smith celebrates 14th birthday. Night shift frees up KareClover to plug into day one activities.

Contradiction: Sustaining motivity of local community meeting troikas and steering committees over the summer period with dates set in March/April. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Hobart trek already wins \$250 in hand with Lanuceston still to visit. Pulling out all stops to locate building materials for Oombulgurri's first five houses.

Internal: Katrin Ogilvy orchestrates great workshop on profound function of task for area PSU. In-house expands due to EG meas
Contradiction: Becoming one thrust in circuits and backup. (Wk. 5)

CANBERRA

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CANBERRA

External: Visits guardians for November meeting. Parliamentary liason officer requests to work with PSU.

Internal: Operations treks in Sydney and Perth. Major funding proposal writing for phone for Oombulgurri. Write Guardians meeting invitations as eight inches of rain falls causing nearby worst floods in 100 years.

Contradiction: Being consumed by immediacies limits organisation of tasks for key movement troops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: In-kind breakloose in PCE around K-5 miracle event; 130 lbs. sausages, 400 breadrolls, 24 litres ice cream, 480 cans soft drinks, theatre slides, 600 plastic bags, 100 oranges. Dalby CMA date set. Summer Programme site secured.

Internal: Yallop arrives for development push as Vosler leaves on two week trek; House celebrates the task in midst of intensification on all fronts.

Contradiction: Finding images that shift pre-conditioned no responses into decisions to risk participation. (Wk. 5)

SUVA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO**

External: Marshalls receives another field trip ship; the MS Caroline Islander begins plan for coconut tree products and sawmill display conjunction with agriculture. Initiates sanitation campaign by scheduling testing of drinking water on Majuro.

Internal: Celebrates end of quarter and Walk-up tells story of how he got his name giving the opportunity to jump into next quarter with a new sense of winning.

Contradiction: Worrying about the problems of the MHDP rather than working through the social contradictions of the Marshall Islands. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Highlights of Metro Cadre B-B-Q at Lufihufi include reading of CYM (GCF) 76 story; receives Lisa Motz and Ed. and Ann Higgins and sends out Aageand Fuatai to ITP.

Internal: Excitement of indicative battleplanning and Hana's return undampened as three house members meet natural disasters: aladder fall ending in a broken foot, a trip down the steps and being stranded on the reef.

Contradiction: Moving it with programs yet waiting on the Lord while planning maneuvers. (Wk. 5)

SAN FRANCISCO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO**

External: Urban maneuver in San Francisco opens doors to Unions and city politics. Choses Berkeley as site for TM in winter quarter by community college. Sacramento maneuver sets four TM dates in five days. Troops dispersed to Sacramento, Seattle, Denver, North Dakota, Los Angeles and sends six to guardians meeting.

Internal: Remnant rallies round and creates miracles, experiences Week II as spirit happening.

Contradiction: Following up all of the possibilities opened up to us by the maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Sets core meeting for November 9, in Santa Clara.

Internal: Creates working charts for four quarters.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE)

Collegium on "Sickness unto Death" shows Kierkegaard has power still.

Contradiction: Finding ways to use troops to the best advantage of mission. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE SACRAMENTO

External: Completes two week Northern California Maneuver having visited 44 towns, sets 14 cores and seven dates and breaks loose in-kind food and lodging.

Internal: Cynthia Vance and Joy Thomas keep house in being and children cared for while others go to the far north.

Contradiction. Knowing what's critical to follow up on over against what we could follow up on (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Continues attack on City of Seattle. Burien plans 12 months of public forums; Richland Youth commission votes to sponsor TM and sets date for 4/16/77 and ICA staff organizes into geographic commands.

Internal: First week that guest room is empty all week Shadow principle is activated as two Youth drive extensively on permits and Thursday ecclesiola time is expanded to allow for necessary work.

Contradiction: Integrating the program thrusts to necessary development and self support demands. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Women's Forum decides to take practical responsibility for doing Night at the Institute for TM steering Committees. Core meeting in Santa Barbara looks good for finally breaking open the sixth metro.

Internal: Areal participation calls for two house and one metro colleague outside the region on maneuver. Regional core meeting releases affirmation of TWLI with image of an atom.

Contradiction: Maintaining model for TM's increasing in numbers and geographic spread so that follow thru effectively on whatever is started. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE PHOENIX

External: Maneuver prep continues with letter from Governor Castro; Pip says yes to printing requests and mailing list updated.

Contradiction: Finding and recognizing the key person that will implement the yes to TM in his community. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: The La Vaz task force meets twice to take responsibility for getting the newspaper out

Internal: Ecclesiola gives way to allow task force to actualize. Possibility of doubling salary is further explored by attendance at the Texas Cattle Feeders Association.

Internal: Oklahoma City and Tulsa Houses worked Week II in three task teams on the TM:Oklahoma 100 promotion, training, and field operations.

Internal: House experiences Wayside Inn dynamic as many colleagues pass through. Global finance briefing brings welcome release. Ecclesiola pinches to have three present while House Church is doubled in number.

Contradiction: Beginning to move in the new phase of TM set-up ten TMs at a time in Illinois. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Visits 12 towns through three on-going circuits and were moved toward core formation. Transfers six years of development data from tri-metro into house files.

Internal: Jim Higgins is miracle worker of the week: transforms trash room into quest room, has hair styled and is new buffet room amnager at the Peoria Hilton.

Contradiction: Discerning the right moment to achieve swifft victory. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

Contradiction: Sustaining those who care, as the weariness of circuiting and consulting set in. (Wk. 5)

External: Midland sponsor committee launched in a big way with everyone important to city structures present. First Ethnic TM held, Belgian-American, draws 175, including Lieutenant Governor Damon who is Belgian. Damon praises TM and ICA for contribution to Bicentennial.

Internal: Brad Grow starts paper route with Detroit News. Circuiter returns with potatoes, cider, colorful leaves, onions, and flowers. Roadside stands are irresistible and economical.

Contradiction: Deciding priorities now that Detroit Region has more communities and institutions demanding programs than assignable troops. (Wk. 2)

Internal: Consultants identify with assigned turf, key to sustaining engagement.

Contradiction: Knitting all happening and stories into total picture of three campaigns. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Forms 26 communities around Huntington and targets 14 for TM set-up.

Internal: Gets feet wet on framing process on the homefront.

Contradiction: Waiting for a four wheel drive while our two wheel drive carries us forward. (Wk 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Addressograph Multigraph regional offices in Buffalo rehearses its decision to supply machines for TM, including new model to be test marketed in region and local church decides to have RS-I in February.

Internal: TM coordinator calls in midst of ecclesiola, Sun Tzu, and provides direct example of tactical application of his principles.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Bi-metro guild harvest celebration establishes new collegial network as representatives from five TMs share post-TM community happenings as well as resolve to continue their care.

Internal: Five House members welcome 16 metro guests to House Church, including a student taking leave of absence from school in order to make money to go to Africa GSD.

Contradiction: Articulating context that will enable those who care for local community to understand how that effects the globe. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Vermont maneuver victory. Thirteen towns have set dates or already held pre-steering committees meetings. Bob and Virginia Fishel and Bob Hanson are ICA consultants at the Town Day of the Vermont League of Cities in Barre.

Internal: TM 76 in Bridgeport held at the University of Bridgeport with the President opening the meeting with a great talk about the community and university working together. This day is the beginning.

Contradiction: Thinking through follow-up as area consultants move on to the next maneuver. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY

External: Holds Colonie workshop leader training with six ready to be leaders. Syracuse set-up locates housing and transportation.

Internal: Procures site for Bi-Regional meeting at Suny-Albany.

Contradiction: Doing necessary planning and coordinating to effectively engage the troops. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Creation of Day I Week II Boston maneuver builds comprehensive thrust along with simultaneous maneuvers in Syracuse and Portland.

Internal: Week II spirit life focus on issues to be decided at Tuesday election reveals need for comprehensive legislation.

Contradiction: Deciding to do what we have built models to do. (Wk. 5)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Father Belanger, provincial of Capucin Order, raises \$4,000 by asking four other Orders to \$1,000 each, for the Maliwada Replication School, as Operation Peregrine maneuver sweeps through Quebec and Montreal on to Halifax.

Internal: Announces birth of Johnathan Alexander to Yvonne and John Stringham. Victory celebration reveals globality of House and region as seven cultural dishes are prepared.

Internal: Enters further into experiences that all are responsible for all the mission through a detailed maneuver planning and thru sending two to Halifax and one to Montreal in maneuver.

Contradiction: Creating images and coordinating structures to drive all into achieving financial support. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: While Ilona and Brian are at Montreal, and Nancy is at Halifax, remaining House troops penetrate Ottawa Polis by attending rummage sale and football game. Ottawa city communities say yes to CFC. Iroquois steering committee of 15 is already two weeks ahead of timeline. Sends orchestrator, participants to great Hastings CFC in Region Toronto.

Internal: Vaviharsh Gram Sabha story thrills all with leadership role of Maliwada people. Welcomes Nancy Frazer back from Halifax Region by sending her to do Iroquois workshop training. Welfare subsidy enables Dag to attend fine children's village pre-school.

Contradiction: Finding those who care in a community. (Wk. 4)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: RSI with 19 participants held in Caracas. House, by invitation, attends christening of book on socio-economic development of Barlovento (location of HDP site) and meet governor and other key contacts.

Internal: Rose West returns from Caribbean and George West and Marcel Rainville leave for Lima on South circuit.

Contradiction: Assuring in-kind construction materials for HDP site. (Wk. 5)

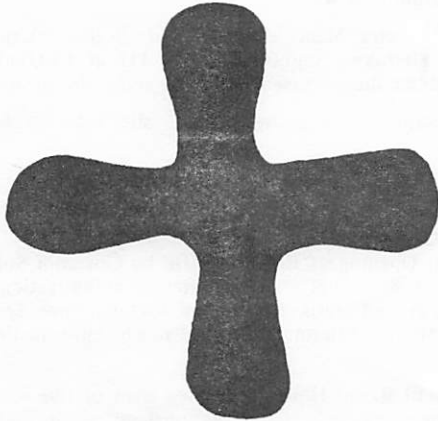

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Cannonball, North Dakota is chosen as site for GSD. Two TMs come into focus for January/February.

Internal: Halloween costume cabaret for all 30 reveals hidden individual resources for celebration and releases all ages to begin again fresh.

Contradiction: Giving TM to the state to fund, set-up and staff. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Maneuver is a great event in city and north and south Colorado as four large neighborhoods and two new networks are broken into.

Internal: Addressed by collegial responses to most wanted list; EG scare themselves with their own haunted house.

Contradiction: Distinguishing between the yes of I will take responsibility and yes of this is a great event for someone else to do. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Location of Native American HDP in bi-metro occasion shifts in assignments, use of time and focus of energy for House and metro colleagues, one of which volunteers his carpentry skill for site renovation.

Internal: Structures, especially Emerging Generation, prove to be supportive beat as troops are disbursed and other sick.

Contradiction: Sustaining intensification and diverse fronts with increased disbursement of troops. (Wk. 6)

Queen City. Site visits continue to look for GSD site. Helps plan five-year evaluation and planning for Balmoral and St. Marks Church.

Internal: Celebrates birth of Maria Teresa Vergara, born Wednesday, October 27, 1976. Sends out RS-1 mailing to region; prepares newsletter for mailing.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum of Forums by engaging those who have participated in previous Forums. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG

External: Intensification of circuits releases core and steering committee decisions.

Internal: Six month Guy Flowers starts preschool. Week II includes finishing repair of front entry and fire escape and massive basement cleaning.

Contradiction: Maintaining Momentum on every circuit every week, whether we're there or not. (Wk. 5)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Schedules Downtown Town Meeting sponsored by Houston Rotary, largest in U.S., for February 5, at Rice Hotel. Mississippi maneuver schedules 21 Town Meetings and raises \$2000 from Mississippi Power and Light.

Internal: All hearts and minds focus on national and local elections, as House watches three networks at once, all night.

Contradiction: Creating clear images of "taking the South" and "taking Texas". (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: More local citizens put their creativity into history bending as broader based sponsorship for North Heights allows new data to move their TM date to January. La Voz task force actually distributes the paper. Pampa Jaycee president decides to call the first core meeting.

Internal: Honoring La Voz task force member's own fund raising project enables great tamale feast for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Living off the Future vision, requiring dropping details that assure day-to-day victories. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: After weeks of grassroots hassling in South San Antonio, mayor pro-tem finds key which unlocks resounding yes in South San Antonio, and also ideal facility for TM.

Internal: In midst of double development blitz on bi-metro from two teams, Charles Watson works some Indian magic to provide delicious Indian curried chicken with all the trimmings for a celebrative ecclesiola meal.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA

External: All flanks form a solid front in TM: Oklahoma 100 as board of trustees president sends out letter raising seed money and Week II task forces prepares community brochure, collates presentation document, and sends out first press releases.

Internal: TM: Oklahoma 100 task forces demonstrate selves to be mobile revolutionary forces, meeting in Tulsa to do Week II planning.

Contradiction: Determining what it means to have 100 participating communities with steering committee meeting in next two months when journey of communities is speeded up. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Bogalusa's second core meeting has 60 present, with ICA introduction by mayor, date set for February 26. Houma Metro maneuver starts with half-hour meeting with mayor, ends with picture-taking session at newspaper and article announcing next meeting. Discovers committee in Lake Charles that has been meeting every week since TM in September; their next TM is set for January.

Internal: Alison Powell is back in hospital, Joseph Mathews and Charles Lingo join Don Clark in Mississippi and select Pace as GSD site. Monster and die (one dice) go to colleagues' house for Halloween party.

Contradiction: Developing forms of engagement and structures for road troops. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

Asks when he can expect ICA mysterious presence. Holds workshop training in Decatur, Alabama Week 14 and sends Gibson to Little Rock for Arkansas maneuver.

Internal: Sends Johnson to Nashville for civil engineer test in preparation for Kawangware assignment. Global development visits local pastor who gets a phone call from president-elect, Jimmy Carter.

External: Sends orchestrators to eighteen TMs, including Kansas City CIF with an anticipated 1000 in attendance. Phase one staff holds Imaginal Education course. Student House presents follies to corporate body.

Receives reports as collegium from attendance at American Academy of Religion. Constructs booth for the Jaycee International meeting in St. Louis and sends staff to gun the slide show and booth. Holds cost cutting task force.

Contradiction: Budgeting expenditure of monies, time and troops. (Wk. 6)

External: Springfield meeting of Peoria, Chicago and St. Louis work on Illinois 100. Confirmation from Florida of JCI Human Development workshop November 9. Key conversation takes place in Twin City regarding set-up

Internal: House experiences Wayside Inn dynamic as many colleagues pass through. Global finance briefing brings welcome release. Ecclesiola pinches to have three present while House Church is doubled in number.

Contradiction: Beginning to move in the new phase of TM set-up, ten TMs at a time in Illinois. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Visits 12 towns through three on-going circuits and were moved toward core formation. Transfers six years of development data from tri-metro into house files.

Internal: Jim Higgins is miracle worker of the week: transforms trash room into quest room, has hair styled and is new buffet room amnager at the Peoria Hilton.

Contradiction: Discerning the right moment to achieve swift victory. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Forty from all parts of Division North attend training session for consultants, orchestrators and children TM leaders.

Internal: Guardian gives collegium on recent Guardian's Consult.

Contradiction: Enabling colleagues who are employed to see themselves taking off work for one day a month to do circuiting. (Wk. 6)

Contradiction: Intentionalizing internal life for the sake of care for selves while caring for the world. (W 12)

External: Creation of Day I Week II Boston maneuver builds comprehensive thrust along with simultaneous

Contradiction: Deciding to do what we have built models to do. (Wk. 5)

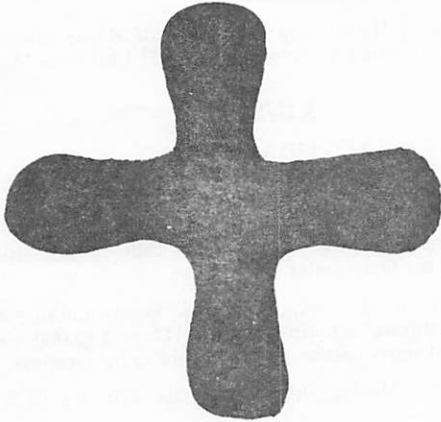

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Lubbock TM is back on road. Key to South P Plains Maneuver prep is endorsement received from South Plains Association of Government. TM presentation is made to 10 Kiwanis presidents of Panhandle. South Plains Sector Maneuver sets up five core meetings in four days and with a three-person maneuver team. Week II journey of House to Big Spring to join colleagues to visit 46 recent TM grads allows great reflection on significance of TM.

Internal: Snowball fights celebrate four-inch snow. House impacted by style of discipline in movie "Marathon Man". First collegium on Profound Humanness is great address. Closing celebration at Big Spring celebrates 16th birthday of Neil Furqueron, steering committee member.

Contradiction: Deciding to win when you smash into your limits. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: After weeks of grassroots hassling in South San Antonio, mayor pro-tem finds key which unlocks resounding yes in South San Antonio, and also ideal facility for TM.

Internal: In midst of double development blitz on bi-metro from two teams, Charles Watson works some Indian magic to provide delicious Indian curried chicken with all the trimmings for a celebrative ecclesiola meal.

Contradiction: Bending small Texas town's social patterns so troops can follow-up lower valley maneuver at five hours distance on week ends. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: First phase of TM: Oklahoma 100, securing the support, is completed with governor's brunch, giving recognition to TMs effect on citizenship. Attention is turned to securing the 100 participating communities.

Internal: Collegium research on the Wedge reprot focusses on study of the internal generalship dynamic, while Sun Tzu study with guild and colleagues focuses on external generalship dynamic.

Contradiction: Attaining instantaneous coordination in order to get most mileage out of one-hour visit with 240 local communities before January first. (Wk. 8)

Internal: Emerging Generation participates in Central City 5 field trip with Jets to unearth Oklahoma rose rocks.

Contradiction: Spreading troops to farthest regions of Area while maintaining accelerating momentum of TM Oklahoma 100. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Alabama committed for TM is formed and new brochure is complete with George Wallace's endorsement, printed in-kind by AM. Holds first experiment with use of both Day I and Day II troops for Week II maneuver to Pacayune, Mississippi.

Internal: Welcomes Jay Antehen for southern Mississippi Maneuver. Celebrates Alison Powell's return home with ice cream and cake.

Contradiction: Finding ways to sustain the decision of the 25 communities to have TM in first quarter of 1977. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: After Decatur TM, coordinator receives calls from eight Jaycee clubs for comments. Alabama maneuver reaps the fruits of Decatur with cores set in Huntsville, Arab, Hueytown, Gadsden, Cullman, Jasper, and Scottsboro Jaycee network begins to click. Franklin, Tennessee, sponsors meeting ends on celebrative note and many question asked about ICA.

Internal: Welcomes David Beal from Alabama maneuver. A week end of planning for upcoming coordinator training is held. Ms. Kennedy lands part time job.

Contradiction: Articulating the necessary focus that allows the miracles to happen. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Savannah, Georgia's oldest city, is captured by TMs, releasing 20th century possibility and decides to do another TM the first of the year.

Internal: Full employment is reality as Bill Gooch secures managerial job. Don Clark visits in metro for staffing "Pace". Half of Emerging Generation celebrate birthdays all in one evening.

Contradiction: Catalyzing troops to explode recruitment of metro community TM. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: TM follows Rhett Butler to Charleston. Most excited participants include four Girl Scouts and Phase II civil rights leader.

Internal: Working on TM promotional portfolio causes deep reflection on victory that each TM has been.

Contradiction: Moving people from being interested in TM to being on the count-down before Christmas. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Area Houston receives over \$1,100 for training workshop leaders for American Heart Association convention in Miami Beach. Development team meets with Propeller Club.

Internal: House and colleagues see GSD slide of El Bayad. Are honored by presence of Ike Powell and Don Clark. Development team of three is here for ten-day trek.

Contradiction: Holding the tension between local and areal

demands when House troops have been cut to one person full time during Day I. (Wk. 8)

CHICAGO

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO

External: Amidst excitement of Thanksgiving week, sends out consultants to four TMs, two in Canada. Sends out consultants to Inyan Gakpi HDP Consult.

Internal: Sends John Michael to join parents in Majuro. Academy ends with Odyssey, feast of closing. Nexus receives gifts from Centruns at Thanksgiving feast, highlighted by spin on Dark Night and conversation on Mayflower Compact.

Contradiction: Deciding what training event is crucial for Nexus to bring off the three campaigns and care for selves. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO

External: Experiences greatest economic miracle yet in six days: drawings and small business administration loan of \$400,00 for auto service center is virtually sealed, with same design as shopping center and about same size. Holds first formal meeting of representatives from the 16 5th City groups. Internal: Patch and paint for one wall in kitchen amazingly recovers Benedictine principle regarding food prep. House accepts invitation to chili supper at black church and is received with existential welcome to neighborhood as key to catalyzing the future of Northside. Hunting trek for pheasant bags rabbit.

Contradiction: Tying up loose ends and building motivity with holidays around the corner. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Rejoices in 1000-participant CIF, resulting in 67 challenges and 63 proposals delivered to production in a Cushman cart, and 65 people trained as workshop leaders. Offers for TMs keep coming in after CIF.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY)

Internal: Enlightened by aptness of Tillich's phrase, guilt transformed into confidence and courage/fate transformed into meaningful destiny. Creates fine metro lounge.

Contradiction: Capturing what we have learned about energy in reaction to TM to re-apply that to our global strategy. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

Internal: Gears up for development week. New stove appears Wednesday.

Contradiction: Finding yes before pre-sponsors meeting. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: TM colleague, Bob Runnels, sends endorsement letters on Equifax stationery to counterparts in Litchfield, Mattoon and Mt. Sterling, Illinois. Pushing on Illinois with visits to six cities in Central Illinois.

Internal: Timeline is completed for rest of quarter. Plans Thanksgiving. Rolodex is updated for first time since establishment of House.

Contradiction: Adjusting strategy to Division South and seeing that we are still responsible for the whole. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Day I circuits meet with Decorah steering committee; initiates top \$600 proposals in Davenport and gives TM presentation at statewide Iowa Community Betterment Day convention in Des Moines. Internal: Blank lease follows eviction notice in same building. Hosts 18 around table for Thanksgiving.

Contradiction: Rethinking long-range strategies in light of maneuver accomplishments. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Division East maneuvers win as Walton and Bushman enable House to work Bowling Green and Muncie polises. Bowling Green core meeting sets date. New Castle is penetrated for first time. Lafayette follow-up meeting plans for on-going sessions. Full page plus front page pictures highlight Louisville TM in Louisville Defender.

Internal: Experiences Wayside Inn dynamic as guest rooms are full every night.

Contradiction: Forming and catalyzing bimetro to enable the on-going move on Indiana and Kentucky. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

Contradiction: Focusing the plethora of necessary tasks into one clear missional image. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: East Northside TM magnetizes community most visibly seen in clergy; Pittsburgh maneuver commences. Frames 11 town and sets cores.

Internal: House triples in size with maneuver. Participates in finance trek; celebrates Cameron Grow's 14th birthday.

Contradiction: Providing forces in midst of Movement transition from House to task. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

Religious Order readiness to support GSD continues to be a focus in Canada and the tactic is spreading to U.S. We are experiencing ever broadening authorization base in government and service club structures across the world, highlighted by events in Nairobi, Canberra, Canada, Germany, and U.S.A. The dam is beginning to break. The contradiction lies in the arena of creating tactics for expanding circuits with new contacts.

Research Centrum events have been diverse, varying from creating a Phase I cultural heritage course in Nairobi, Guardians Consult procedures in Canberra, a three-campaigns showplace for visitors to Chicago Nexus, and a New Year's Eve celebration model in Brussels to Industrial and Housing Development research in Hong Kong. Breakthroughs were related to primal community, including intermediate technology implementation in Nairobi, establishment concerns in Hong Kong and work on inclusive statement of practical social philosophy in Chicago.
