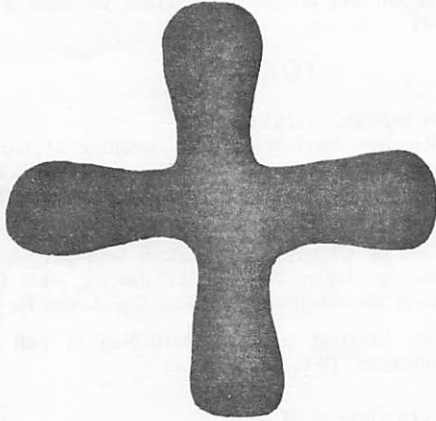

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON

External: Reception on barge for guardians and other donors highlighted by local councilman's comment: "If this much has happened in six months, imagine what can happen in six years". Isle of Dogs family club sponsors soccer game against off Islanders; Isle of Dogs wins 3-1. Vehicle maintenance guild holds first training session.

Internal: In-kind cars brings total of non-working vehicles to four. Starts ecclesiola with sherry and Sun Tzu.

Contradiction: Building quarter's battleplan while standing in midst of enemy territory. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: Holds Imaginal Education course with three regional teachers and 21 around the table. Holds first TM with 250 present, then two cadre meetings; Penton decides to have an RS-I and Partick to start implementing PCE tactics.

Internal: Sends out Ken Whitney to El Bayad Consult in midst of end of quarter with spicy celebration. All Youth now attend school.

Contradiction: Deploying troops to intensify regional impact while meeting global demand for consult troops. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Plymouth trek shows promise for TM:Europe as circuit maps in planning room reveals decision to do TM in Bristol Region. Sends TM brochure to printer. Sends Mr. and Mrs. Shaw to El Bayad Consult.

Internal: Decor blitz readies House for ITI and TM push. Sends Joan Weeks to El Bayad after Bristol fund-raising trip.

Contradiction: Deciding whether we are ready to attack in midst of quiet before the battle. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Large Catholic parish puts on show with \$300 proceeds for Maliwada. Uses third world newsletter as springboard for \$1,000 target.

Internal: Week 2 planning lends solid concretion to primary quarter thrusts of TM:Europe and ITI:Birmingham.

Contradiction: Needing to catalyze regional leadership in TM and ITI campaigns while method of doing so remains unclear. (Wk. 2)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Outside of Paris, housing is cheaper; have found one agency that has access to facts. Completed rough drafts of articles to follow preliminary report on state of church in France.

Internal: Ebenezer Fez Quao sojourns in House on way from Spain to Ghana. Helene Halstoch sojourns for ten days. A Jewish art student from London who addresses the House with "how to care with and for the non-Christian.

Contradiction: Structuring time and space for generalship, not waiting for all the troops to arrive in order to do something. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME

External: Twenty guardians receive news of the next four consults and Lions Club Italy gets news of Town Meetings. Naples colleague agrees to bring prospective Naples sponsors to Rome Town Meeting.

Internal: Talented Phase I and II people earn House \$300 with bit parts in two movies in less than a week. Woodburys arrive from Canada. David Lazear returns from ITI:Lagos en route to Chicago.

Contradiction: Converting wonderful ideas into concrete plans. (Wk. 10)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS

External: Umuahia ITI is great authorization and

(GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG)

ending with global dancing to Filipino band.

Contradiction: Sensing victory in midst of experiencing just difficulties. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Consult battleplanning reveals indicative of further work on housing in Fuk Wah Tsuen.

Internal: Indicative battleplanning outlines quarter timeline over against internal anxiety.

Contradiction: Obtaining adequate housing. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG

External: All-Island Council of the two regions in Taiwan is happening with Movemental colleagues present.

Prepares and secures LENS materials and locations.

Internal: Celebrates Teachers' Day, birthday of Confucius, with battleplanning session. Conversations of winning, held with colleagues at Council, occasion wonder and excitement. Sun Tzu study begins in House.

Contradiction: Experiencing self as five generals charging into battle and finding few troops following after. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: ICA receives official non-profit status in Republic of the Philippines.

Internal: Sudtonggan slide show impacts the House as priors return from Area Council. Judy Albers arrives and the Coker family passes through on way to Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Doing the mission in the midst of planning it. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Pedagogy weekend involves 13 and several solid pedagogues in the making emerge. DuPont promises \$NT 10,000 (about US\$ 250).

Internal: Sends Ed Dillinger to Jeju on loan; sees several villages during short discontinuity. Sojourner, TinaFan, decides to continue the struggle and begins intern year.

Contradiction: Creating course recruitment model which exposes assumptions, focuses intentionality, includes built-in accountability, and is the region's model. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU

External: Guardian Don Quimby visits and provides technical expertise for corn, gardens. Movie, "Captain Barbel" is shown to 1,000+ people. First chicken and vegetables are harvested. Health clinic is packed with children in skin disease drive. Receives payment from first expert rope sample; receives more orders. Orders first two bags of monthly flour supply from General Milling Corporation after three years of development calls. Sells first batch of demonstration chickens with enough profit to buy second batch.

Internal: Celebrates birth of Faustito Vendiola Jr. to Faustito and Josefina de la Serna. Jack Callum finally gets married to lucky lady, Nancy Rabor. Welcomes three Cokers to stay and Packard and Philbrook for visit.

Contradiction: Shifting to second quarter of project. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: In-kind development calls promise future possibilities; metro trek to two metros reports on Sudtonggan and re-claims wandering grads.

Internal: Sends Philbrook family to Sudtonggan to celebrate with Cebu Region wedding of Jack Callum and Nancy Rabor; two holidays in one week give time for House planning and family discontinuity.

Contradiction: Beginning new quarter with story that the transition is not yet complete, therefore we need more time. (Wk. 1)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Receives development gifts totalling \$1,300 in less than two weeks. Visits with three government officials, National Diet, Tokyo Assembly and local ward office relative to PCE.

Internal: Visit by Christy, an American who has won a family name in Japan for Kabuki dancing, the first Westerner to attain this honor at House. She dances for all.

Contradiction: Creating circuiting battleplan to pull off bi-lingual colleagues. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JE JU

External: Hay mowers and duplicator pass customs duty free. Invitations sent to island leaders for their meeting at Kwangyung Week XIII.

Internal: Muellers arrive. Hong Kong Centrum visits site. New staff welcomed by village leaders. New staff battleplan with high excitement after tour of township. Village Ri Chong begins regular meals with House. Visitor from Health Office team comes, Mrs. Kim.

Contradiction: Forging the staff and community core capable of implementing project while overcoming the communication isolation that bogs down troops, funds and supplies. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Bank of America gives donation for JHDP. Choi Kye Yong schedules Korean Guardians Meeting for next week.

Internal: Sends out Rev. Kang Shin Chul and Rev. Sung Chul to Chicago on global assignment; welcomes Ed Dillinger and Judy Hess on way to Kwangyung. Four-day House battleplanning celebrates victory and prefigures victory.

Contradiction: Creating year's model, clouding urgency of weekly development quota. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Framing picture of Japanese public sector begins to take form through guild research and visitation.

Internal: Reflective conversation on ecclesiola dynamic causes creative re-evaluation of spirit life.

Contradiction: Ritualizing significantly the new quarter. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Calls and visits in four metros; re-opens conversation toward HRM and GCF, first LENS registration.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

Movemental event, held in Protestant Theological college in heart of old Biafra; opened by Catholic Archbishop, Dr. Francis Arinze; participants from 13 tribes, three nations and seven denominations, sponsored by 10 bishops and Cardinal Ekandem. Wedge team locates GSD site, Ijede, the capital of an ancient kingdom with 10 satellite villages; is fishing community on Lagos Lagoon. Initiates funding with visit to CIDA representative.

Internal: Moves into new House. Sends Addingtons to Brussels for visa; starts visa procedures for Mardel Phillips and Lyn Wisman.

Contradiction: Translating Movemental readiness into GSD auxiliary staff. (Wk. 2)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Holds Amsterdam trip dealing with development, Town Meeting: Europe, and finances and bank accounts in 1-1/2 days.

Internal: French training for the children begun by sojourner.

Contradiction: Being self-support sign in the Nexus in midst of the income crisis on the continent. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Continues circuit set up for Kortrijk, Belgium demonstration TM city. Andrew Moals, guardian, returns with serious reflection on Kreuzberg Ost; collates Dutch workbook for TM. Cross Area circuit calling teams set up. Holds El Bayad night for consultants and supporters.

Internal: Gearing for facility search intensification while fighting flu bug that levels House. Kreuzberg Ost is still a major troop demand.

Contradiction: Implementing systematic and regular circuit schedule. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Sends Fred Beeker to Kreuzberg to help translate documents and Frank Little to Germany for HRM.

Internal: Mr. and Mrs. Harold Long of Oregon visit House. Sun Tzu addresses all on focusing and dispersing troops.

Contradiction: Pushing through resentment to care. (Wk. 2)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Visits in Cologne, Heidelberg, Nurnberg and Vienna turn up three more decided consultants for the Kreuzberg Consult.

Internal: Recreates its elegant front entranceway, painting and polishing, and becomes expert in the Tom Sawyer style, eliciting the help of anyone who passes by. Sends Tim Dissmeyer to Berlin to assist in the pre-consult set-up.

Contradiction: Discerning what is needed to further the three campaigns here in Frankfurt, knowing the urgent demands of GSD in Berlin. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN

External: First building facade revitalized in gold and brown with Turkish German and American painters.

Requests to do three more shop fronts along Wrangelstrasse. Shopowners display posters telling of consult in pictures and prose. Presents documents to community at dinner gathering. Global Language School community teachers ready to go with classes in Turkish, German, English; locates facility. Bishop of Berlin sends cash gift as indication of his support of project.

Internal: Berlin colleagues and Kreuzberg Ost residents aid in translation of document into German. Area Council includes TM circuitry plans, KHDP battleplanning, fine celebration. Lands new teaching job at Berlin American High School.

Contradiction: Meshing all programmes, subtactics, events, miracles, into one effective HDP. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA

External: Holds introductory meeting with 80 villagers in HDP. Finalizes three trustees and submits EI registration.

Internal: Tours HDP area, followed by battleplanning and building 21 point vision. Sinyangwe family moves in for intern year. Sharon Young arrives. Sends Esther Milandu back to seminary.

Contradiction: Working through authorization net to final permission to move into HDP area. (Wk. 1)s, ns for two weeks along with Angolan seminarian. Estimates paves way for entering HDP.

Contradiction: Organizing the steps into HDP. (Wk. 13)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD

External: Meeting of Westshore Cadre in Beni Suef gathers 36 people on 24 hours notice who offer wide array of BHDP support from 100 kilos of sugar to work teams. Mobil Oil Egypt and MISR bank proposals submitted. Ford Foundation indicates interest.

Internal: Exciting dinner with village Coptic priest reveals depth colleagueship and leads to creation of "Emshi-Emshi-Emshi" ritual. Transformed collegium and Week II PSU dramatize the power of corporatness.

Contradiction: Waiting for authorization steps that are out of our hands clouds our timelines. (Wk. 13)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Holds Elders meeting, KBA meeting (Kawangware Business Association), commissions meeting, and has delivery of 32 tons of balast for Kawangware Block Industry.

Internal: Birth of Teran Edward Leopke, departure of Sharon Young to Lusaka assignment, and visit from Joyce Quimbey of Hong Kong makes this week one of arrivals and departures.

Contradiction: Making support system work without waiting for them to move it. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Nets initial set-up of four Village Meetings in three weeks of maneuvers, one each in four of eight Kenya provinces. Engages everyone from ITI grads to in-kind printer in Swahili translation of Village Meeting materials.

Internal: Has full House of visitors for Village Meeting

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI)

leadership training and for House Church, creating chairs out of boxes of in-kind curry powder and coffee. Places checker board in living room which has colleagues asking for generalship chess lessons.

Contradiction: Receiving possibilities with a yes in midst of foreseeable overwhelming practices. (Wk. 2)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY

External: Maliwada Human Development Training School, Naua Gram Prayas opens October 3, 1976, with 85 participants, 20 staff, and chief guest, Dr. Zacharia.

Internal: Two day marathon enablement is celebrated by auxiliary and training school staff at opening feast in community centre.

Contradiction: Meshing timeline and troops for maximum advance on replication and Maliwada fronts. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Byculla Guild prepares for street miracle as follow up to Gram Sabha. Two separate sponsors claim two Gram Sabhas in same week for Jabalpur. House enablement of all India development seminar concludes with visit to Maliwada.

Internal: Sends out intern John Cabral and sends Ronnie Powell to Maliwada on re-assignment. Ann Slicker returns from hospital. House experiences new wonder as kitchen and office space is transformed with new decor.

Contradiction: Proceeding with fluid end-of-quarter structures while visitors and transients are all at sea. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Launches grassroots development in India with 3,000 rupees in one week. Fixes dates for two Gram Sabhas, October 10 and 16, with 12 recruited for SMS school. All six regions of Area Delhi are hit by circuit rides and SMS. Sends out colleagues to SMS.

Internal: Emerging Generation takes active part in House cleaning blitz. House member secures job. Sends out Elaine Warden to Bombay.

Contradiction: Getting grassroots development plus House earnings to a level of self-support by yesterday. (Wk. 2)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Receives first Colombo Region circuit breakloose with two yeses for Gram Sabhas and committals for January. Municipal corporation in Hyderabad gives full support to city-wide Gram Sabha programme. Sends out nine from Area Madras to Human Development Project. Gunfoundry Guild pays for and posts Gram Sabha posters; begins local funding development.

Internal: Does Quarter II battleplanning in six-hour blitz. Hosts Beera David and Rev. A.C. Kinsinger from Vijayawada Region.

Contradiction: Internalising and grounding battleplans while already intensifying the battle. (Wk. 2)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Final week's recruitment before Human Development Training School brings some non-successes and some successes. Old colleagues sustain House both in spiritual and economic dynamic as funds run low.

Internal: House population reduced as campaign against rats and mice meets with success. Calcutta's annual Puja Festival injects celebrational spirit into Week II structures.

Contradiction: Creating story and space which move House in direction of common thrust of Movement. (Wk. 2)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: Introduces new House members to regional colleagues, netting clergy contacts, invitations for business consults and a great Indian dinner at colleagues new home. Gridding and circuit prep is aided by McCleskeys on way to El Bayad.

Internal: Wayside Inn in full swing as consult team arrives and sent out to El Bayad. Bronwyn Rees arrives from Australia and is sent out to Academy and last member of House arrives and sent out again to complete housing project in Kelapa Dua. Hari Raya celebrated with visit to new Singapore Handicrafts Center and movie.

Contradiction: Discerning the sign in Singapore for HDP amidst total government urban renewal. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR

External: Hari Rari holidays enable more teams on the road for HDP site selection as we continue to scour countryside. Sends Dick West out to Kelapa Dua HDP and El Bayad Consult as agriculture consultant and to bring back first-hand data on activity in Indonesia and Egypt to share with Malaysia companies and leaders.

Internal: First in-kind comes to ICA training center. Completes internal life manual for Quarter II and celebrates completion of Quarter I with feast and community outing.

Contradiction: Finding a way of starting all of the different tactics from Quarter II planning. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA

External: Submits AID proposal. Awards cup to winning stake at conclusion of Badminton tournament in Kelapa Dua. Starts first sewing class with 18 women and two men.

Internal: Moves auxiliary from red and white tent to new House. Completes Quarter II planning.

Contradiction: Finding the miracle that catalyzes local people. (Wk. 2)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG

External: Meets with House in preparation for Fuk Wah Consult. Week II task force works on comprehensive development system in preparation for manual completion.

Internal: Sends Jenkins to Ivy City Consult. Visits with Joyce Quimby en route to Manila from Isle of Dogs and Kawangware. Celebrates Quarter I ending and Quarter II beginning with Chinese banquet and

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA)

Internal: Fall time design gives gift at extended collegium reflection.

Contradiction: Running but finding shoes are still at the block. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI

External: Sends out House member and guardian, an economics professor at Fukushima University, on research trip and comparative study of Senya in Tokyo, Miyata in Fukuoka, and Kwangyung II in Jeju as part of search for possible GSD sites in Japan.

Internal: Sends out Minoru Seino and Hideyuki Watanabe after month's sojourn. Completes quarter battleplanning.

Contradiction: Joining all efforts in region to focus and solidify present troop strength. (Wk. 1)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: North circuit, 1,200 miles, nets seven service club speaking engagements, two preaching engagements, \$165 in hand from donor calls, and \$85 in-kind. Holds regional planning on Saturday; does Roman Catholic strategizing with Sydney colleagues plus Sr. Janet of Newcastle.

Internal: Uses Monday holiday to work through regional development strategy. Holds quarterly celebration with colleagues. Secures two jobs.

Contradiction: Finding donors and references and actually hitting the road with development tactics. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Gains momentum and local council involvement for Scarborough CMA. Receives \$125 in-kind paint donation for Oombulgurri.

Internal: Gwenda Rees lands job. Holds massive clean-up of garage to facilitate bike work shop area by Youth. Burbidge returns.

Contradiction: Hitting all arenas with intensity, requiring new sharpness in requests and House coordination. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Defines Darwin Christmas festival role. Work continues on quarter and yearly rationale for circuits and development.

Internal: Implements new time design and structures for new quarter.

Contradiction: Moving strategically and decisively with new quarter's plans. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI

External: Oombulgurri Djaruk (Community Congress) celebrating three years in Oombulgurri and one year since consult happens with parade, feasting, reports, issue workshops, guild planning and a great celebration. Djaruk construct for E.G. explodes new curriculum vistas.

Internal: House turns inside out as marathon decor workshop invades collegium room, production grids, banners and lots of merriment. Stake visiting with first edition of Oombulgurri's bulletin intensifies penetration.

Welcomes Gabriel and Edith Chapmann, visiting from Sydney, Andrew Duncan home from Perth for holidays, and sends out guardian John Murchland after his visit leaves us spinning on Kelapa Dua and profound decision guardians have made to enable local man.

Contradiction: Actuating the vision of the congress. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Regional Council launches task forces: development, in-kind, community meeting, community training consultation, assignments and basic planning for quarter. This expanded mission has doubled the committed work force. Schedules CMA method evaluation for three consecutive Mondays.

Internal: Receives Karen Clover into House. Sends Sally Gowers out to Darwin House. Celebrates end of quarter with volleyball and feast.

Contradiction: Reconstructing circuit momentum to move from beach head to the cliff face. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Excitement and future participation in GSDs aroused by evening of slides. Country Women's Association network of 70 clubs across Victoria are organizing in-kind support for Oombulgurri. Incoming Apex Zone President opens door to assistance of 68 clubs for CMA in Western Victoria.

Internal: First ecclesiola study of Sun Tsu gets all thinking strategically relative to coming week's tasks. Completes Internal Life Manual.

Contradiction: Having effective teams embracing both region and House operating in relation to turf and time. (Wk. 2)

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CANBERRA

External: Touching base with every House in SEAPAC via telephone and mailing reveals Community Youth Meeting held in Apia with 150 attending, including Prime Minister.

Internal: In-kind half of yearling beef highlights quarter-ending celebration.

Contradiction: Moving feet of clay down the yellow brick road. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Guild members meet twice in week and push plans for clean up in four weeks time; Central Circuit rider reports yesses to CMA at every stop; Apex speaking engagement enables guardian to tell Oombulgurri story.

Internal: First Central Circuit Trek begins and other House members disperse to cover many exploding missional demands.

Contradiction: Turning excitement into concrete action that moves the mission down the road. (Wk. 1)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO

External: Week I is highlighted with guild planning for Quarter II and the celebration of Quarter II with the second Community Congress. Breadfruit tree expands to snack shop.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO)

Internal: House encounters Asian way of moving in the midst of another week of active waiting.

Contradiction: Worrying about the problems of the MHDP rather than working through the social contradictions of the Marshall Islands. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Remote Samoan village agrees to send Aagron Kovati to ITP, a whole village decision.

Internal: Experiences discontinuous in midst of battleplanning to travel by plane, truck, to isolated Samoan village, which grounds life-style of 90% of Pacific.

Contradiction: Deciding strategies which will enable mission to take place in midst of honouring cultural realities. (Wk. 13)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: TM maneuver teams go to Salt Lake City and Los Angeles; Bob and Barbara Prather add 2000 miles to VW van while circuiting Southern California. San Francisco urban maneuver gain endorsement from city supervisor, Robert Mendelson, Market Street Merchants, and U.S. Congressman John Burton and makes presentations to State Chamber of Commerce meetings in Los Angeles and San Jose.

Internal: Hosts bi-weekly guardians meetings. Impacted by 73-year-old volunteer secretary from R. S. V. P., representing senior citizens willingness to participate in TM.

Contradiction: Following up all the plates that are spinning after three Bay Area maneuvers as lonely in House person. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Campbell and Sunnyvale Bank of America managers say ye to creating TM cores; Scotts Valley TM committee has first meeting; Mountain View TM committee is in final stages for October 23.

Internal: Holds informal Open House with 11 metro colleagues viewing Habitat slides; re-discovers Community paper.

Contradiction: Recreating time and space to achieve the possible in the midst of seeming impossibility. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Front page boasts headlines and editorial column devoted to Carson City TM. Oak Park Guild decides to take on responsibility for TM

Internal: Sends John and Susan McCabe to Los Angeles and Carlos Zervigon to New Mexico, both for IM set up maneuver. Ecclesiola watches presidential debates on TV.

Contradiction: Intensifying TM set up using nets to get 20 TM set up in one day. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Los Angeles maneuver ends with 46 Bank of Americas visited, resulting in new strategy and 14 yeses to core meetings. Knutson in State Chamber of Commerce meeting sits at head table and is introduced with "It would be too bad if your Chamber did not do one of these programs".

Internal: Illness reigns throughout House; first ecclesiola seems right on. Ends week with fantastic Moroccan meal at top of Los Angeles restaurant.

Contradiction: Having a strategy for visited bank managers to keep initial excitement going. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: A Holds Albuquerque Maneuver in Camber building, highlighted by endorsement letter from mayor, Chamber of Commerce, with another coming from the Council. Three steering committees are ready to begin.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Meeting of core to form ICA advisory board for Montana is concrete step for breaking open major funding and authorization. TM assembly is great event for training TM workshop leaders.

Internal: Intr. House and metro troops celebrate a week of full engagement at House Church Picnic and volleyball celebrates south side parish as home of PCI

Contradiction: Moving strongly on two or three fronts leaving loop holes in comprehensive battleplanning. (Wk. 1)

IRRELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Commerce City holds TM parade with bands, scouts, fire engines a block long to promote upcoming TM with 2,000 watching.

Internal: Order Blue Pinto arrives, now to the truck stops. Transforms new guest room from red and blue pop art to enchanted garden green.

Contradiction: Holding the tension of acceleration of number of town meetings and profound impact of event itself. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY

External: Completes Regional Town Meeting Newsletter and proves means of awakening all to depth of TM colleagues. Pierre core sets tentative date of November 13. Local minister, McBride volunteers to go trekking and use his contacts to set up TMs.

Contradiction: Training generals in sophisticated, disciplined strategic thinking. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

Internal: Ecclesiola dinner party in living room cum Oriental tea room, transforms House with winning construct and adds reflective dynamic to life of radical engagement. Attic is cleaned for garage sale.

Contradiction: Flying into quarter with unwieldy campaigns and no unifying plan of attack. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Visits two steering committees and begins plates spinning in other communities.

Internal: Richard Elliot family celebrates House Church.

Contradiction: Trusting intuition to do necessary homework in all arenas. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

Internal: With completion of Internal Life guides and experiencing powerful ecclesiola using new construct, House feels itself guided for a powerful quarter.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum created by maneuver while intensifying each of the sectors simultaneously. (Wk. 1)

CHICAGO

GLOBAL CENTRUM: CHICAGO

External: Hosts over 250 at Eleventh Guardians Consult; produces concrete suggestions relative to GSD funding, repository, acceleration and replication, TM strategies, orchestrators, and acceleration, as well as Intra-global Movement issues, such as sixth floor renovation, new funding sources, and troop disbursement. Received first glimpse of GSD sites for every hour, introducing such far-away places as Ijeda, Shantumbu, Vaviharsh, Kendurgau, Sevagram, Taiwan, Fukuoka, Lodge Grass, Southern U.S., Eastern Canada and Cano Negro. Celebrates opening of Maliwada SMS School.

Contradiction: Taking internal discipline utterly serious. (Wk. 12)

Contradiction: Integrating serious development thrust by House with ongoing Town Meeting set-up circuits. (Wk. 12)

Internal: A dessert tutorial at breakfast with bacon in the repainted collegium room marks new quarter. Sends Joan Seacord nad Ralph Mantz to El Bayad Consult.

Contradiction: Leaving shadows in the drawer, like Peter Pan. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Holds Huntington TM. Eight cores and four TM dates are set in Altoona Metro during first maneuver.

Internal: Has fine ecclesiola with Harry Truman as guest via TV.

Contradiction: Feeling paralyzed by reluctance of communities in Pittsburgh to say yes to TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE. ROCHESTER

External: Week 4, Webster Mini-TM excites everyone and demonstrates again the power of participation in the construct.

Internal: Special Ho use Church with 20 present celebrates final arrangement for repayment of original downpayment on House six years ago and rehearses the journey with those who helped make it possible.

Contradiction: Keeping the brooding edge of external mission assignments in midst of immediacies. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

The contradiction lies in the arena of creating the nickel and dime support system on a regular basis to keep all programmes moving.

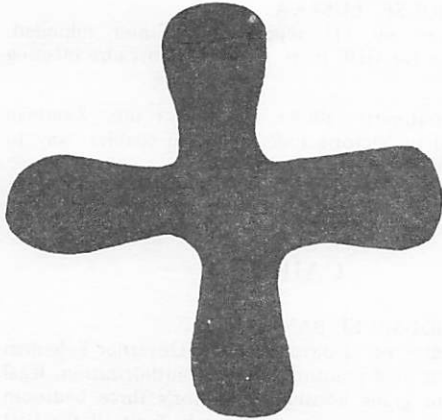
Nexus Bombay reports that cleaning the guild for training school participants released the vision of replication in the villages. Brussels rediscovered that PCE is a new way to launch Town Meeting: Europe and the three campaigns. Chicago mused on "what we are doing" as points to articulate what we are, and re-images for selves the vital roles the guardians are going to engage in relative to the new face of the global Movement. Sun Tsu's insights on generalship reaffirm that the engagement in doing a profound deed is always a self-conscious spirit embodiment of the profound mystery, which is love. Collegium on fascination, fear and hope of the guardians brought new insights and new depth in realizing the new roles and significance the guardians are going to play in the three campaigns. The contradiction lies in the arena of creating practical models to allow the overwhelming jobs that need to be done after the council to happen.

Canberra reports 60 present at the Pittwater Community Seminar (GCF) and a Kuala Lumpur LENS set for October 28. Hong Kong worked on quarter teaching assignments and intern training models. Bombay: four villages met in Maliwada for two-day session and decided that replication is "on" and the Consult document, translated into Marathi, is being published for distribution. El Bayad assumes direct responsibility for NAME. The contradiction is in the arena of determining the scheme of maneuvers that most effectively utilizes the existing strong points in capturing the immediate objectives that allow the total battle to be won.

Centrum Hong Kong sent stipends and House checks to all Houses, and found that, having written guidelines and procedures for finances enabled the corporate body to care for corporate funds. Bombay reports the completion of the 1975-76 books, and that they are ready for the audit in Nagpur. Work continues in Canberra on securing visas for staff to stay in Australia; Nairobi reports under the same rubric, sending people to Brussels to gain visas for residency in Lusaka, various parts of Africa. Nexus Brussels struggled with consensus on \$200 debt limit and the intensification of corporateness in finances. Chicago Nexus time was consumed in preparing the physical environs for the Eleventh Guardians Consult: preparing guest rooms, re-building bathrooms on the sixth floor, preparing menus and gathering food for event, creating and hanging new decor. The contradiction lies in the arena of keeping systems operating globally while time is consumed in the particular.

Municipal corporation in Hyderabad gives full support to city-wide Gram Sabha programme. Sends out nine from Area Madras to Human DEvelopment Project. Gunfoundry Guild pays for and posts Gram Sabha posters; begins local funding development.

Internal: Does Quarter II battleplanning in six-hour blitz. Hosts Beera David and Rev. A.C. Kinsinger from Vijayawada Region.

Contradiction: Internalising and grounding battleplans while already intensifying the battle. (Wk. 2)

External: In midst of experiencing global and metro concern for village through receiving of ten power mowers from Japan and doctor, nurse and dentist regular visit arrangement from JeJu City, the community shows its willingness to struggle with planning for future in a passionate guild meeting plus long follow up second meeting to create-corporate model for use and care of

mowers, planning the congress celebration.

Internal: Experiences deep sense of excitement and new corprateness created by working side by side with community harvesting grain and painting seven store fronts.

Contradiction: Bringing off the Congress celebration as a doorway to breaking loose bans now that the guild dynamic is going strong.(Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Kyung In Energy Company gives \$10,000 to JHDP over the next year. Citizens National Bank architect offers to make \$1000 blue print for Kwangyung staff house free of charge and guardians meet to support JHDP and market LENS. Makes Taejon metro trek.

Contradiction: Creating a two year plan that uses indicative situation as gift, while building an ongoing battleplan. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

Contradiction: Planning for comprehensive and concrete while moving it. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Front page boasts headlines and editorial column devoted to Carson City TM. Oak Park Guild decides to take on responsibility for TM.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO)

Internal: Sends John and Susan McCabe to Los Angeles and Carlos Zervigon to New Mexico, both for TM set up maneuver. Ecclesiola watches presidential debates on TV.

Contradiction: Intensifying TM set up using nets to get 20 TM set up in one day. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

Internal: 25 at Daily Office Monday morning to symbolize beginning of Seattle Maneuver. Special weeks collegium rhythm releases wisdom of total house and metro colleagues to form maneuver strategies.

Contradiction: Scheduling TM fall quarter keeps momentum from building to set winter and spring dates. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: New coordinators guide brings up new generation of steering committees releasing greater excitement and freedom.

Internal: Quarter celebration is discontinuity as journeyed to a fine Moroccan home for an evening at DarMarghreb to participate in gifts of North African cuisine and culture.

Contradiction: Playing same game with new rules with lots of people sitting on sidelines. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

Contradiction: Shifting regional self-story from resentment of change to possibility for creative response to change. (Wk. 3)

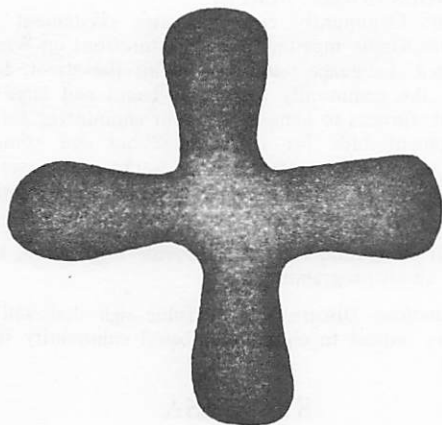

Sacramento maneuver sets four TM dates in five days. Troops dispersed to Sacramento, Seattle, Denver, North Dakota, Los Angeles and sends six to guardians meeting.

Internal: Remnant rallies round and creates miracles, experiences Week II as spirit happening.

Contradiction: Following up all of the possibilities opened up to us by the maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: Sets core meeting for November 9, in Santa Clara.

Internal: Creates working charts for four quarters. Collegium on "Sickness unto Death" shows Kierkegaard has power still.

Contradiction: Finding ways to use troops to the best advantage of mission. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Three from Sacramento House, four from other California House and seven Sacramento colleagues participate in first week of maneuver. Holds pioneer movement on town with Banks of America and Chambers of Commerce. Sets or holds 15 core meetings, with six yesses and four dates already set.

External: Practicing the art of reaping maneuvers with four core meetings set for this week. Regional planning session nets the image of an atom with regional core as nucleus and three programs orbiting it.

Internal: Embodying the art of interior preparedness with study of Sun Tzu and systematized and reorganized office. The art of matching troops with geography promises a quick urban victory down the road as three circuit wedges move in ever greater intensity toward Los Angeles. Hosts Dexters on stop through with news of Kwangyung II.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX
