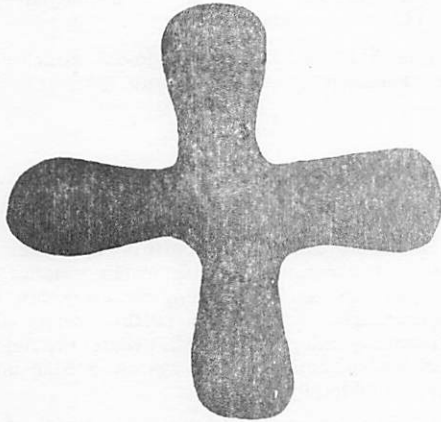

DECEMBER 1-6, 1977



LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Cahir Street Community has first class of Global Language School with seven participants (four languages) and completes Christmas mural. Bridge House renovation includes roof repair. Painting of HDP office and completion of 3 X 10 oil painting by Danny O'Neill illustrates the three European and one NAME HDP. Power House path is completed with 100 in-kind paving stones.

Internal: House celebrates completed life of Joseph Wesley Mathews at House Church with regional colleagues and guild members.

Contradiction: Releasing guild meeting to be an event that makes a difference to the community each week. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: The second wave of charitable trust proposals gets prepared for sending out as grants begin to arrive from first set. Two regional colleagues and two House members travel to Wales to lead Town Meetings.

Internal: Third part-time job is obtained as self-support dragon begins to gasp his last.

Contradiction: Strategizing on how to win as support builds slowly for Quarter III Scotland campaign. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Visit with the Queen's Council, Speaker of the House of Commons, secures his support for work in Wales and the U.K. Patrols do 44 development calls in Wales.

Internal: House celebrates Stuart Wright's eighth birthday.

Contradiction: Becoming one of the "clubs" informal funding networks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Three regions and nine cities are represented with 27 around the table for GWF.

Internal: Inkind bonanza for GWF is highlighted by ten

Contradiction: Finding the footbridge over the chasm between great interest/appreciation and missional engagement. (Wk. 9)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: House visits 22 embassies in GWF framing. The secretary general of the International Council of Women, the oldest women's organization in the world, shows interest in enabling local women's council to collaborate with GWF and GSD. Development follow-up nets 450 francs (450 USD).

Internal: Singing the global priorities spiritizes ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Dove tailing all tasks into one mission. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Week of local leadership in HDP is symbolized by Youth Action Core recruiting, collecting money and running projector for packed House at movie and supper club. Another \$1,000 (US) this week in development comes as breakthrough happens on loan for wood industry.

Internal: Terminese man makes generous loan of power saw so House can cut full winter wood supply from the forest.

Contradiction: Following up advantages as victories change battlefield more quickly than troops are able to regroup. (Wk. 9)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP

External: First Nigerian Guardians Meeting gathers 20 people for reporting and planning and reveals an expected deep collegiality. IHDP brochure and Community Training Institute report is published. Traditional leaders attend coordinators meeting for the first time as all reflect on last eight weeks and plan for the future. People of Ijede, trustees, Guardians and Bishop of the Lagos archdiocese of the Anglican church write letters to government on behalf of ICA in Nigeria.

Internal: Letter from Federal Ministry of Internal Affairs requires entire timeline and troops to focus on strategy and tactics for getting visa extensions and developing structural relationship with the government toward future cooperation.

Contradiction: Developing a strategy with coordinators for finishing all tasks by December 31 in order to provide the existential push to bring all to the finish line. (Wk. 9)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Nexus troops are dispersed to all areas this week—London, Paris, Brussels, Frankfurt, Rome and Cairo and all fronts are covered.

Internal: Collegiums continue to be stellar, symbolized with the collegium on the Limbourg TM maneuver.

Contradiction: Demonstrating that every aspect of work and activity are self-supporting. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Global Women's Forum of 16 women provides authorization entres into Amsterdam and Alkmaar as well as funding possibilities for GWFs in the Netherlands and third world. A Schiedam doctor is ready to do Town Meeting.

Internal: House hosts GWF and development teams. New development maneuvers are completed along with India slide show ready to hit the road. Claire Whitney does collegium on Belgium's Boorgloon maneuver.

Contradiction: Moving on victories before Christmas. (Wk. 9)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Town Meeting in Heidelberg Altstadt with 150 present is great event: Ruhr Valley and Vienna GWFs have 40 present at each. Town Meeting is set for East German/West German border village of Werxhausen for May 28. A steering committee meeting is held for two TMs in Wesel on February 18.

Internal: Wolf-Dieter Friebel and Mary Jan Elliott guest as they orchestrate Heidelberg Town Meeting. Three criss-crossing treks transform Frankfurt House into Grand Central Station.

Contradiction: Deciding the appropriate reports for nurturing metro colleagues. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN—KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Thirty decorated Christmas trees go up on all the streetlights of Wrangelstrasse. Evergreens and holly bushes are put in the 14 new flower boxes on Falckensteinstrasse. Businessmen on Wrangelstrasse donate 500 marcs for the trees. Christmas market flyers and posters go up. Cafe windows Christmas decorations include an electric train. Saturday social methods training participants prepare for first pedagogy tutorials. Local firm gives ink for special color Christmas edition of the newspaper. AM and Borsig appointments result in form commitments. German language class attends play.

Internal: VW van returns after six weeks in repair shop. Inkind freezer arrives. House celebrates Thanksgiving with feast, reading of Mayflower Compact, conversation and children's play.

Contradiction: Enabling corporateness rather than competition. (Wk. 9)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA—SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a 4-week Area Johannesburg circuit. ITI Report and grad newsletter completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers that assure victory. (Wk. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO—EL BAYAD HDP

External: Five-hour planning meeting with guilds results in comprehensive move into remainder of quarter. Letter from office of Mrs. Sadat clears storage costs in Port Alexandria. New menus from Community Kitchen include produce from garden. Surplus from garden is selling out every day. Over 106 babies are weighed, only five lose weight. Literacy classes are being taught by village staff. English classes are full with emerging leadership, both men and women. Second sale of 2,000 bricks is sold locally.

Internal: Arrival of Charles Hahn and Randy Williams from Brussels Nexus reminds all of globe.

Contradiction: Clarifying the role of Project and auxiliary to the village leadership. (Wk. 9)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI—KAWANGWARE HDP

External: National Council of Women of Kenya invite ICA to do GWF all over Kenya and in women's prison. Two cows and a calf show up. First low-cost choo (toilet) is completed. Her Excelency Miss Margaret Kenyatta says yes to GWF and "The Great Two Years" celebration. World Neighbors commits \$1,000.

Internal: Fine House Church witness on adventure results in midnight rendezvous as 10 House people gather at Kabira Station to greet John Rupert and Daudi Barnes after their all-night train ride in the cattle car with two new cows and a brand new calf.

Contradiction: Finding creative means of engagement in the task that moves Kenya down the road. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: Participants of May GWF gather for tea and hear of NGP, and immediately begin enabling marketing of village products and GWF recruitment, thus heralding women's guardian role. House receives 25,000 rupees as the first installment of Rs. 3 lakhs, private sector support for Kendur HDP.

Internal: Diwali celebration is highlighted by candlelight dinner, fireworks and sweets. Emerging Generation continues celebration with movie and circus. House sends John Patterson to Maliwada, Roy Stansbury and Jaspal Sangh to Chikhale and receives Jim Hamje back from a week at Shalgaon HDP.

Contradiction: Organizing troops and designing time to pull off simultaneous GWF, Project Director's meeting, HDTS, Urban Trip and the Ahmedabad cadre meeting all with finesse. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Fine Global Women's Forum in the Indian Merchant's Chamber, attended by 23 ladies who represent commerce and industry, educational institutions and various social organizations, is held. Fine Project Directors meeting in Sophia College is attended by 55 people and represents all the actuating villages in Maharashtra. Area visit to Ahmedabad resulting in cadre meeting is attended by eight colleagues.

Internal: House hosts Leah Early and Marie Paul as Global Women's Forum team arrives. House receives Claire Clements from Delhi, Sherine James from Hyderabad, who is on her way to Toronto, and Mark Green from Minnesota. A fine ecclesiola is held by candlelight.

Contradiction: Making the huge leap required for effective engagement of willing non-staff forces in new village efforts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Auxiliary initiates possibility of school uniform contract to increase village industry. Survey of 50 latrines is done. Preschool uniform material arrives. Two village youth read story conversation at state meeting.

Internal: Larry Philbrook arrives with news from Project Directors Meeting and word of Mathew's death. Whole House struggles with issues of appropriate response.

Contradiction: Enabling village decision to be continually visible. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: In village shramdam, preschool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwali, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. New clinic promises to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jaspar to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inked travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI**

External: Ramesh and Roger burn midnight oil to send letters about GWF to area and regional colleagues. Area trek goes out for GWF. Area colleagues decide to go to continental council in Maliwada. United Nations visitor, Mrs. Sally Shelley from New York, requests ICA attendance at meeting where Mrs. Vijay Laxmi Pandit, Nehru's sister and former president of the U.N. assembly expresses delight in ICA story given by Ramesh Agarwal of Delhi House. Women of 20 leading families hear GWF story at leading politician's home, and some sign up on the spot.

Internal: Week of celebrations includes Id (Muslim), Guru Nanak's birthday (Sik), and Thanksgiving.

Contradiction: Structuring final recruitment for GWF so that it will enable the possibility of 50 or more in the coming year. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP**

External: A swirl of activity as collector sanctions well to village and Dr. and Mrs. Fishman, retired missionaries with over 40 years experience in Andhra Pradesh, visit Nadlapur after hearing about HDPs in their home town, Redlands, California, at a TM. Electrification of Harijan colony is completed with eight fluorescent tube lights where previously there were none.

Internal: Auxiliary hosts village elders at Andhra Pradesh State Formation Day tea. The entire auxiliary celebrates Diwali, the festival of lights, with two days of discontinuity in Hyderabad.

Contradiction: Breaking the mindset of taking things for granted. (Wk. 9)

CALCUTTA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA**

External: Formal invitation for first GWF in Eastern India are distributed. Yeses come from unexpected quarters.

Internal: Possibility of renting a very particular house in a very specific locality brings visible concretion to the mission in Calcutta.

Contradiction: Maintaining spirit structures in midst of dispersed troops and fragmented space. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Newcastle Metro opens with development maneuver and raises \$2,500 in four days, with guardians springing up in all directions. Authorization goes full steam ahead in medical profession across whole Area Sydney. Singapore Nexus signs lease for larger facility allowing for budgetcut. Management systems prepare for audit.

Internal: House sends out troops for CMA in Brisbane, attended by 175.

Contradiction: Organizing the move in midst of external mission demands. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visit about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of development secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year is tackled as Wiltse family arrives.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of Southeast Asia and how the Centrum dynamic will be supportive. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: Planting of the cash crop, maize, is completed with 43 villager picking up gromozone for readying padi for plowing. Villagers have special send-out for the Medan House. Sime-Darby Holdings appoints liaison to the Sungai HDP with great possibility of inkind. Bamboo industry delivers four stalls to restaurant for catering service.

Internal: Leadership training meeting is held for all the guild and stake leaders and all the meetings are being lead by villagers. A belated end of quarter celebration is held with great feast of saute.

Contradiction: Playing the catalytic role in the midst of village decision to lead the Project. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Visit from Phillips Electric brings real possibility of village electrification. English course begins with 15 villagers three times per week. US AID approves funds for Kelapa Dua HDP for 55 million rupiah or \$132,000. Canadian Embassy approves money for entire village water system. Tractor is back and running full time. The chicken shed is approved as free gift.

Internal: House welcomes new sojourner, Soedtarja. Willy Terok goes to Manado to prepare for his Medan, Sumatra passport and visa. Ibu Mein Suhardi's parents visit from Central Java.

Contradiction: Training village leadership to think and plan for the future and at the same time tackle the immediate problems of day-to-day survival living. (Wk. 9)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Two development teams trek to Manila and Tokyo. Three GWFs are held in the Philippines. Ticketing for Hong Kong Area Council is completed. Japanese Guardians meet in Oyubari.

Internal: Nexus is impacted by details of the miracle of 20 GCFs in Davao Region, Mt. Apo Eruption Maneuver and anticipates the miracle of the Blue Angle Maneuver, site selection, and consult preparation there. Thanksgiving feast celebrates victory of quarter. Area prior is hosted and sent out on continuation of area trek.

Contradiction: Enabling troops to celebrate the victory before the victory and do planning in relation to that victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Nam Wai Beautification Guild, composed of village youth, builds bamboo waiting shelter. Donations of plants and shrubs from agriculture and fisheries department enable planting of village square park and school wall border. Caterpillar, Far East, arranges donation for use of bulldozer and operator to prepare ground for village football field. Community elders decide name for their group and write Hakka wedding ceremony for Hakka history book they are preparing. Village advisory council demonstrates unity to move ahead on legalization of Nam Wai Development Corporation. Week ends with villagers celebrating the Ijede HDP, complete with African food.

Internal: Ecclesiola is highlight beginning with an interlude including the "Man from the Ministry" radio program and ending with sodality radio program of Johnny Carson's answer man from ICA staff. Area prior visits and spins on taking care of yourself.

Contradiction: Maintaining priorities while maneuvering unexpected developments. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Stage is filled and cement topped with village help. Chinese document is sent to Taipei for printing. Town Meeting in four villages near Hai Ou goes very quickly and very well. Six villager prepare papers to go to Sudtonggan.

Internal: Memorial service for Joseph Wesley Mathews is occasion for dignified House celebration of life and death. Fast day reminds all of hunger issue world-wide. Whole House attends wedding feast of son of head of social affairs of district government. House hosts Art Rowe of Hong Kong Development and Bruce Macomber of Taipei for GCF set-up.

Contradiction: Expanding context of family corporateness to village corporateness. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: GEF visits to Philippine Women's University president and Philippine Christian University vice president open interest in university assistance in HDPs. ICA board chairman initiates donor giver list with 2,000 pesos.

Internal: Global nexus colleague exemplifies servant force in great style.

Contradiction: Developing management systems to enable intensified task and dispersed troops to do effective job. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development maneuver nets 54,000 NT in addition to 100,000 NT for interest-free loan, equivalent to \$1,400,000 and \$2,600,000 US respectively. Hai Ou report is printed in English and Chinese. Community Forum brochure is sent to printers.

Internal: English teaching for Formosa Rubber Company gives self-support a boost.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from planning to doing the Forums, GWF and CS-1. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN-HDP

External: It has been a week of reorganization of forces in Sudtonggan resulting in average daily Early Learning Center attendance of over 100, truants returning to elementary school and adult education resuming with newly electrified meeting site at the health clinic. Sea food, land food and animal husbandry workers combine to initiate commercial farm to bring in immediate income. Commerce mans a booth at the Lapu Lapu fiesta bringing in the best prices yet for baskets and abaca products. Foundation is poured for new

windmill and house are electrified in three puroks.

Internal: Dick, Joe and Tito return from GCF miracle in Davao. Memorial service is held for Joseph Wesley Mathews.

Contradiction: Unblocking engagement of larger number of troops in daily training. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Support base for Davao Project is expanded by Rotary Club presentation and GWF with 32 present. The 20 GCF documents are delivered to municipal mimeographing office. Site selection research illuminates condition of final HDP site. GWF brings in 500 pesos in development.

Internal: Following Mt. Apo Eruption celebration, a swimming party follows an evening of singing, dancing and feasting. House sends Joey Armas to Manila, and Nanie Amistoso, Dick Ando, Tingley Ando, Helen Potot, Purita Limpanog, Joe Bagingnao, Tito de la Serna and Dick Alton to Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Naming the focus of the advantages and disciplining selves to the press of time to move on it. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Jim Oberg makes 42 development calls in 2 ½ weeks and maneuver writing charts the future course of Development.

Internal: Dolly Mannon is sent out to Delhi and Justine Moriarty is sent out to Africa from a fine House Church beginning Advent.

Contradiction: Closing the deals for common communication and symbolic systems withing the Japanese Houses. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Village mayor uses inkind tractor every day for a week in his fields as demonstration. Pfizer Drug Company representatives bring inkind drugs to eradicate parasites and an inkind filmstrip full of global images. Youth take over writing and distribution of weekly bulletin. Circuiters set up four mini Town Meetings for one day; 90% of TM goal is completed before HDTs begins in January, 1979. Vinyl house is up for the winter.

Internal: Charades of 16 global priorities are enjoyed by all at ecclesiola sodality. Permeator gets English class at university.

Contradiction: Creating new management model to care for regional and local loose ends. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House sends out Jeju provincial vice governor and Sae Maul chief to visit HDP sites in USA and Japan. Chuncheon is visited for site selection of new northern HDP. A meeting is held with chairman of the board of the largest private foundation in Korea regarding future funding. Local pastors and colleagues are telephoned for grassroots gifts. Local church collegium studies the HDTs curriculum.

Internal: Preparations are made for the Joseph Wesley Mathews Memorial Service in downtown Seoul. House is impacted by collegium conversation on "How has God prepared us for this moment?"

Contradiction: Discerning the strategic role of Town Meeting in the midst of preparing for the HDTs and new northern Project while maneuvering troops to cover all fronts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Good responses to setting up GSFs in Nagasaki metro net possibility of a leadership training seminar while

finding a place for lodging there. Two colleagues respond to need for TM callers to set up steering committees in both Obori and Futsukaiichi in Fukuoka metro.

Internal: Wednesday marks celebration of both Japan and American Thanksgiving day feast as House has two women guests. House re-battleplans maneuvers up to December and the beginning of the next quarter.

Contradiction: Planning objectivity to keep this quarter moving while being excited about next quarter. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Tokugawa Castle maneuver goes to three polises to set up two demonstration TMs. Town Meeting training event brings colleagues from four prefectures to House for one-day experience of the Town Meeting dynamic plus reflection time for anticipated uses in Japan.

Internal: Walt and Jean Blackledge make two-day trip to Korea as Walt secures teaching visa; 21 celebrate Thanksgiving eve with hot apple pie and write TM materials.

Contradiction: Creating the cement for unifying the stones on the path to victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Sapporo cross country ski course is visited while exploration for local ski course is expanded. Physical survey forms are distributed for daily stake walk checks. Stake maps and decor are prepared for stake meetings. Battleplan is built for Early Learning Center, with opening scheduled in January, 1978. On Week II#0 towns are visited by five circuit teams to break open TM in Hokkaido.

Internal: New assignment format into guild arenas maximizes program expansion. Thanksgiving party with local residents introduces new customs. Three new jobs are obtained for self-support.

Contradiction: Pushing through Project programs and area maneuvers with troops on hand. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: ARC donates all steel and fabrications for Community Hall foundations. Strategic network saturation with CTC Training Program continues. Trek team transport is all set to go to Oombulgurri on November 30. Twenty visits to government and local community people for DTC result in five yes and eight possibilities. Two companies say yes to donating goods for Oombulgurri Hall. GWF is launched with a core meeting.

Internal: Wild ecclesiola breaks 24-hour fast and concludes with "Journalists Reports" and cartoons as sodality. Readings from "While the Billy Boils" rehearse Australia's heritage.

Contradiction: Discovering which network will mould the fracturedness of this city. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Three demonstration Community Meetings blow open possibilities in many directions. Sisters of Mercy sign of two for CTC with one more possible and one Academy prospect. Community Meeting: Western Australia state committee is formalized while four more groups come to the fore (churches, women's groups, mining companies and banks); MacRobertson Miller Airlines donate six one-way airfares (\$1250) to Oombulgurri for completion of night school while transport company agrees to ship all materials free.

Internal: Fast day intensifies missional self-consciousness and is highlighted by mealtime readings from Lawrence and Hammersjold. John Cock is sent out as he completes the job

of creating a missional powerhouse.

Contradiction: Occasioning the commitment as new colleagues and contacts increase. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: First phase of preparation and training is completed as Walkabout Team reaches full strength and prepares for first Community Meeting at Oombulgurri on Week 2.

Internal: Collegiums keep the context broad to focus in on the particular of Community Meeting training for Operation Walkabout.

Contradiction: Securing the point of advantage in making contact with key people. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: First Aboriginal CMA demonstrates competence in use of methods and deep excitement over new song.

Internal: Visit from Operation Walkabout team with fresh image of Community Meetings for aboriginals impacts all. Two luxuries arrive in the form of motorcycles, sparking new life.

Contradiction: Creating effective forms that allow community participation in Operation Completion. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Region is impacted by the corporate power of maneuver as following victories are scored: 1) After several quarter of concentration on the Adelaide metropolitan area, Bushfire Maneuver dispenses troops to far corners of the region (Maree to Bordertown) to lay groundwork for country Community Meetings in Quarter III. 2) 11 people say yes to committee of 1,000 in one week. 3) Eight Community Training Consultation registrations are gathered for January GRA. 4) Four Community Meetings are held in one week. 5) A consultant for the Madan Consult is recruited. 6) 15 tons of cement is inkinded for Oombulgurri. 7) Inland and committed fund total \$3,000.

Internal: House Church and maneuver debriefing are held at colleagues' house. Four are sent out as maneuver troops to home regions.

Contradiction: Finding structural ways to hold in being the regional passion that has been released during preparation and actualization of Bushfire Maneuver. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Local women in Sherbrooke Shire decide to have GWF in March. Development weekly reporting to major corporation contributors strengthens context for funding and firms credibility. Conversations are held with 12 guardians regarding Committee of 1000. Denys and Vivian Correll show slides of Maliwada to 35 guests describing their role in health acceleration there and embodying a style of participation available to everyone.

Internal: Tony Allen sojourns and major funding team is hosted for the week. Global fast on Maliwada guest night takes on new meaning. House experiences "ships passing in the night" dynamic as Bill Norton is sent out to Tasmania.

Contradiction: Finding appropriate concrete task, to claim engagement of interested friends and to expand the movemental conversation with history. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Work is done on scholarship to Academy for aboriginal youth from Department of Education from appropriate fund for Aboriginals Overseas Education.

Internal: Study of polity document reminds all that experiment is on behalf of world and calls for what polity

might practically look like in a village. Memorial Service with extended colleagues renews contact with former Faith and Life community member, Don Stoddard.

Contradiction: Insuring completion of three HDPs and initiation of two HDPs along with pushing year of Management and Development along with Community Training Consult and Oombulgurri completion both coming at the turn of the year. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Recruitment for Summer Program and Community Training Consultation intensifies with contacting 38 people for January events. Development troika of region meets to strategize further. Guardian development and inkind grass seed go to Oombulgurri. Plans are made for regional Christmas party.

Internal: House senses new sophistication with new blue tablecloth and serviettes for House Church.

Contradiction: Understanding that impact strategies include tactics that appear to be mundane, like mailing and filing. (Wk. 9)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: Five more neighborhood TMs are completed this week: Caloha Bayside, Wotje town, Jenrock (2), Mico and Mejit town, exploding practical vision for saturating the district center of Uliga with 18 more in the next three weeks. In the midst of the direct thrust into the community with neighborhood TM, House decides to do an indirect tactic, "Operation Christmas Package" to explode the symbol of the diamond of the Pacific.

Internal: House sends Blood and Chia families out after 1 1/2 years in the Project and receives new intern family, the Telekaus, from the Gilbert Islands.

Contradiction: Increasing pool of resources of translators fast enough to keep pace with the daily expanding demand. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Site selection team completes initial sweep of 80 villages on main island of Western Samoa. Truck gets stuck across washed-out bridge in three feet of water. Village men, women and children come to the rescue. Mary Knoll Brother Sebastian is contacted, who photographed Cano Negro HDP. Local ITI grad offers help to enlist patrons for Western Samoa HDP.

Internal: Ecclesiola study on Order polity gives new focus to old missional resolve.

Contradiction: Seeing that doing the mission is taking care of yourself. (Wk. 9)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Community Youth Forum involves youth from both San Francisco and Los Angeles regions, utilizes Tom McClain and Hendrik Idzerda as pedagogues and pays for itself. Global Women's Forum brings together colleagues from across the region to rehearse the course and to strategize marketing for Quarter II and III. Town Meeting forges its way across Northern California, as full-time circuiters and regional colleagues team up to orchestrate four TMs and set up three more.

Internal: All-out total House and region push on Development as California forges a replicable model of a state adopting a Maharashtra village as a memorial to Joseph Wesley Mathews. The week's blitz has already netted \$8,772 with \$4,772 ready to go back to Chicago with Development

team.

Contradiction: Weaving together the massive number of contacts from the past month into a viable network. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: California Planning Meeting in Fresno metro is a time with old colleagues to vision the future on forthcoming California Project. Full participation in Adopt a Village Development blitz with altered House timeline engages all and builds new development contacts with old and new colleagues.

Internal: Seeing the "Circus of Dr. Lao" during Planning Meeting recalls task to do the impossible in local communities and the Thursday evening dinner with San Francisco is a celebration of the glory of intense missional engagement of the battle worn warriors.

Contradiction: Creating the needed task forces to begin Town Meeting saturation in the Valley, secure orchestrators and begin Project staging. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Participation in San Francisco region Adopt a Village Development blitz secures funding from one half of Sacramento Town Meeting steering committees, opens up corporations and initiates church participation. Two more Town Meetings are held in Northern Counties and three more in the city of Sacramento. Senior Citizen meeting is televised and shown on 6:00 and 11:00 news.

Internal: Regional colleagues become expert at leading Town Meeting workshops with new evening Town Meeting format.

Contradiction: Developing a continuing structure to intensify GSD preparation, GWF initiation, and metro cadre engagement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Twenty-one attend TM in snowstorm in community with population of 95. Metal building 12 X 12 is inkinded from TM grad for Inyan Wakagapi.

Internal: House celebrates Thanksgiving with fine dinner and Mayflower compact conversation and House visits island abode of colleague for great day of discontinuity.

Contradiction: Deciding to win on all fronts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: Orchestrators declare that three TMs held were best spirit happenings of any TMs they had attended. Article of HDPs is written corporately for Intermediate Technology: Los Angeles and the Los Angeles Energy Fair, including appeal for volunteers.

Internal: Terrific House Halloween party calls forth spirits to release spirit tales from past as incognito Cadillac disappears, hopefully to return, for its role of dynamic delivery (transportation).

Contradiction: Bracketing good ideas and issues not yet ready to be tackled so that corporate energy and time focus on ripe tasks. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: First CYF is held in region, funded locally and held in Phoenix high school. Metro cadre workshop discovers advantages from TM work in New Mexico.

Internal: Fine, glorious Thanksgiving feast is highlighted by touch football game. House holds futuric workshop, building six-month spirit journey chart.

Contradiction: Organizing potential. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: ICA mails 301 GWF brochures. Lake City,

Colorado, TM is great event with 10% of inhanitants consensing that this was town's greatest event of recent years.

Internal: In the midst of frantic GWF preparation, House manages to spend two evening on catch-up practice.

Contradiction: Discerning whether the enemy has sling shots or machine guns in midst of being dropped behind enemy lines. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Four Town Meetings (two on one night) in western Montana brings total to 16 this quarter. Development begins Eastern Montana Campaign (Operation Bushwack) with great reception from banks.

Internal: Whole House (minus circuiters) assist Inyan Wakagapi HDP in planting 80 trees and celebrates with steak breakfast at House Church.

Contradiction: Eliciting leadership style of affirmation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Analysis of challenges and proposals of 30 TMs, articulation of insights on evening format and initial formation of winter strategy is great event.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with 30 engages all in profound reflection on covenant.

Contradiction: Maintaining the integrity of profound awakenment while coloring every county yellow. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY--INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Day care space is renovated, materials inkinded, money contributed from a new Guardian source, leaving the main block, and salaries for teachers to be dealt with. Then a car drives up unknown and unsolicited and three salaries are offered. Planting of 1,200 trees are completed just before winter blizzard. Two rabbits are certified for transport to Vogar rabbitry. First winter blizzard proves effectiveness of winterized rabbitry. Newsletter and Community Day Care Committee show up daily at ICA center.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a great happening--the worst winter storm since 1897 moves in and turns "Night on the town" in Bismark into night on the town in Cannon Ball with fantastic winter celebration.

Contradiction: Finding ways to ground indicative battleplanning to release community structures and give sustained support to the covenant with this community. (Wk. 9)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: Global Women's Forum is well received by women representing wide cross-section of city. All available troops travel to Saskatchewan to paint that province yellow, and succeed.

Internal: Development team arrives and colleague brings wine which transforms spagnetti and meat balls into celebrative event.

Contradiction: Creating local maneuvers which transform the "left behind" experience into meaningful engagement. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Golden colleagues set Forum date for January. Heather is sent to Saskatchewan for areal maneuver sweep across the winter prairies.

Internal: Colleagues bring House Church meal and celebrate with colleagues from areas Montreal and San Francisco.

Tickner obtains position with adult education college.

Contradiction: Turning attention from rural circuits to expanding urban Vancouver networks. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Visit with the former Lt. Governor and Fairview Town Meeting Master of Ceremonies, Red Boucher, nets decision to get \$5,000 development money in the next two weeks and a "prayer meeting" to ensure victory. Town Meeting Assembly document mailing, with sample proposal implementation plans and workshop method for building these plans are sent to 200 Town Meeting participants as first tactic in practical follow-up to TM Alaska. Meri Fountain arrives unexpectedly providing child and office care.

Internal: Models shift to enable whole House as it hits the \$15,000 maneuver model. Inkind food and gift certificates renew faith in the real possibility of living on inkind.

Contradiction: Naming and implementing catalytic tactics that are going to do all maneuvers.. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Dispersed House engages in preparation for Forums and GWF recruitment. Local Women's group gets busy collecting materials for Vogar quilt industry.

Internal: New colleague, Norma Chapman, visits House after completing assignment in Africa. Old colleague of Nan Grow's, Rev. Ramona Underwood, visits House.

Contradiction: Coordinating direct action of mission with journeying of the constantly emerging, caring people. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG-VOGAR HDP

External: Vogar Community Store has grand opening; first paychecks are given out to Vogar Products (quilt factory); Global Women's Forum is held on Sunday. Canada Works grant is received by Manitoba Metis Federation local which provides ten new jobs. Thirty show up for Friday night showing of "The Seven Faces of Dr. Lao". Forty are in attendance on Saturday night, 30 for the second time.

Internal: Guest rooms in the basement are redone to accommodate GWF staff and circuiter returns after three weeks on Alberta maneuvers. Insulation, frost shield, and gypsum board are installed in outer walls and ceiling of log cabin.

Contradiction: Allowing the community to appropriate and help design new maneuvers. (Wk. 9)

HOUSTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HOUSTON

External: Short week concentrates in three counties using three different networks. House journeys to Dallas for sector weekend planning correctives. We ride the heel of success: 393 Town Meetings in Texas and Oklahoma in 148 counties.

Internal: March to the Sea Maneuver (Texas Gulf Coast) is celebrated on Thanksgiving eve with 130 fried shrimp, oysters and jumbalia. Thanksgiving is welcomed with wild ducks and turkey and conversation that points toward the awakening, engagement and fulfillment of the Pilgrims.

Contradiction: Avoiding being led to January TMs in turf we don't intend to be near then. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Panhandle Reconnaissance Maneuver reveals follow through victories and reservoirs of troops for future maneuvers. New possibility is uncovered in Hemphill county (we thought there was only one to win in the entire county) in rural church serving as center to human settlement called Gem.

Internal: House forces attend celebration of the completed life of Joseph Wesley Mathews.

Contradiction: Breaking down comprehensive demands to the simple set of tasks that need to be done today. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Second Parish Day in Cotulla with Mexican Americans and Anglos working together for the first time is great event. Knippa Parish Day is held in Spanish with plans to invite the whole town to a Town Meeting.

Internal: TM orchestrators and other old colleagues gather for House Church to celebrate the closing of the first maneuver. House prepares to choose from three possible inkind facilities for next quarter.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on the momentum while training and financing troops. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OKLAHOMA CITY

External: One Town Meeting is held this week in Jay, Oklahoma, on a Tuesday evening. Two Guardians orchestrate TM. Oklahoma is near completion in covering all 77 counties. Staff ventures to Dallas for Oklahoma-Texas sector meeting of the five Houses for mid-course corrections in maneuvers.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast at House is a treat to behold. Mrs. Slusher, Shelley's grandmother, is present as guest.

Contradiction: Recruiting for statewide Town Meeting Assembly in Oklahoma City. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DALLAS

External: Town Meetings. in Cookville, Linden. and Pecan Gap prove the four-hour TM construct can happen anywhere, anytime and be successful.

Internal: Don Clark visits and does collegium on Town Meeting acceleration. Clesson McDonald visits from Washington, D.C. and House prepares for bimetro Thanksgiving feast.

Contradiction: Keeping eyes focused on the next four weeks while sliding into Quarter III. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA-DELTA PACE HDP

External: Adult literacy class begins with 15 participants and three local teachers. Two state Jaycee vice presidents from Mississippi and one from Illinois joining two Jaycee chapters in Pace to form a Pace Jaycee chapter; 20 Pacers meet with \$20 to form the chapter. The Delta Pace Community Association is legally incorporated. Global Women's Forum is held with 28, including four from Duncan, Mississippi. Economic Acceleration PSU is held with 15 participating. Health Acceleration report is written and Health Bulletin Board is put in Town Hall. Social work class from Delta State University visits to see the update.

Internal: Art Birkey visits for two days to prepare for moving in January.

Contradiction: Maintaining creative tension between leadership and emerging community leadership. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW ORLEANS

External: Day I and Day II experience wins all week with eight sprouts, five blooms and three harvests.

Internal: Mark Harvey and son from Pace stop in for dinner and move on after spending the day in Baton Rouge visiting architectural department at LSU.

Contradiction: Allowing communities who think Town Meeting is a good idea to experience the hope that they can do it. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Town Meeting is set in Holly Springs, Mississippi, with three black churches for December 19. First meeting for Tunica, Mississippi, Town Meeting has new article and 10 show up to plan county-wide TM to be held in suburban black church and all after the City council said no.

Internal: Kelly Michael has children singing on second day of new job. Datsun takes a nose dive as car wreck limits transportation but not troops.

Contradiction: Using West Tennessee county coverage to win with development in Memphis. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Two Town Meetings are set up, one in December and one in January. Staff locates a funding organization that basically funds only "consultation fees" (salaries).

Internal: "Freat feast of the seaboard sector" (24 around the table from Miami, Atlanta, Chattanooga, Charlotte and Chicago) is highlight of four days of mid-quarter Thanksgiving.

Contradiction: Creating visible victories for the quarter to use to break open the possibilities on doorstep. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHARLOTTE

External: Three TMs are held in far western part of the state with ten more in the clute.

Internal: Youth cluster receives school report cards, then plans to intentionalize study time.

Contradiction: Developing field contacts that can allow TM set-up over the phone. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MIAMI

External: Seven Town Meetings in counties across the belt line of Florida are completed. Xerox of Orlando offers \$100.00 with a suggestion to apply for more after January. The governor's letter comes and is fuller and more supportive than the one the ICA wrote for him. One sponsor of the first Town Meeting, Montverde, asks to get 100 copies of the document printed, pay for them and gives \$25.00 bonus saying, "At Thanksgiving, we got three feuding groups together talking to one another and they want me to run for mayor."

Internal: Sector Thanksgiving celebration in Atlanta refreshes, inspires and gets two Miami folks out on circuits. Call at southeastern office of Youth Project raises possibility of self-support in Florida doing consultant work with an Orland town whose future mayor wants to become another "Fifth City" project.

Contradiction: Continuing momentum while dealing with the busy Christmas mindset, Continental Council in Chicago, funding for future Town Meetings and need to create new materials, and do self-support. (Wk. 9)

CHICAGO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO NEXUS**

External: Academy ends, graduating 70 to engagement in the world. Staff is sent to over 100 TMs held during the week. Twenty women from Osaka visit, meeting with ICA staff regarding Global Women's Forum. The social acceleration trek continues in Fifth City, with 13 Guardians lending expertise.

Internal: House sends John Sung back to Taipei and Lee Jae Joon, Lee Soo Young, and Lee Jung Ja from Academy to HDS in Korea.

Contradiction: Getting into Quarter III to give contextual frame for Continental Council. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CHICAGO-FIFTH CITY HDP

External: Town Meeting is held with community in 1½ hours. Win-door industry collects over \$700 in orders for storm windows. Elders Action Guild takes off on preschool uniform sewing project. The industry initiation loan is expanded. Movement ecclesiola is held with Fifth City, House members and Guardians all in attendance. Four new Town Meetings are set this week.

Internal: Sharp collegiums, beginning with a Monday collegium on "maneuver thinking" get mood of week focused.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum with key program victories. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: Initiation of TMs continues in Flint Hills area, with four held and four scheduled, five being set up.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast with Powell family features corporate conversation on "Oh, God" with all the trimmings.

Contradiction: Maintaining chastity in completing the counties when the temptation is to use miracles already created to deepen authorization and funding. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Norfolk TM brings Nebraska TM total to 17, with seven counties covered. Dates are set for December and early January in six new counties, and Nucor Steel becomes newest statewide sponsor with \$300 gift.

Internal: As 40,000 women gather in Houston, two women hold ecclesiola Friday night—signal of the way things are likely to be.

Contradiction: Getting trained in the practices and gounded in the dynamics of 3½ hour TMs before the first one happens. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: St. Louis House joins Kansas City House in one day consult in Springfield, Illinois, which occasions metro gathering.

Internal: Mailing to nearly 1,500 TM contacts is ready on time. Two cluster members join high school wrestling team. Metro colleagues join in TM data preparation.

Contradiction: Keeping in step with colleagues while hurrying toward 16 priorities. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: All but five counties in the state are set with a TM before the middle of December. A crew of 20 from the metro, House and past TMs orchestrate five TMs over the weekend. Emerging Generation lead children's TM by themselves. The Town Meetings happen in the midst of a statewide blizzard. Inkind victories include over \$1,000 in office materials, food and lodging—and a car!

Internal: Sunday night House Church is a festive event after a week in which all youth, Emerging Generation, Day I and Day II troops participate in 11 TMs across the state. House participates in celebrating the life and death of Elaine Hockley; Mark Hockley leaves for Chicago to attend funeral.

Contradiction: Catalyzing yeses to TMs when official and unofficial leadership see the creative cohesive power of the TM but are afraid to take initiative. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Two more Town Meetings are set and mailing is prepared for Open House impact event.

Internal: House member receives \$50.00 for two-hour singing job. Work toward House renovation and winterization goes

on. Week is topped by great Thanksgiving feast, complete with the traditional St. Louis Thanksgiving trek and baking of six kinds of pies. Traditional Thanksgiving snow fall is a day late but enjoyed by House none-the-less.

Contradiction: Concentrating on full-time Town Meeting set-up, full-time preparation for House renovation weekend and full-time prep for development blitz. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Over 50 adults attend evening Town Meeting in Orient, Iowa, the birthplace of Henry Wallace (population 324). Letter contexting winter push to complete one TM per county, plans for a state assembly in March and plans for a HDP site in the spring is mailed to over 200 friends and colleagues in preparation for funding blitz Week 10.

Internal: Mobile House Church in Cedar Rapids opens possibility of neighborhood Town Meeting in January and new engagement for several colleagues.

Contradiction: Having all systems, including funding, ready to go by January 1 to complete remaining 80 counties by March. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Menominee County, Michigan, is set for December 15, turning all of Michigan yellow.

Internal: Thanksgiving feast is great event, with two old colleagues and Mexican family of five joining table. Depth-filled conversation on the future bursts forth after traditional conversation on Mayflower compact.

Contradiction: Making GSM enough of a priority to release troops to do GCF. (Wk. 9)

Contradiction: Creating victory story and model for TM funding blitz. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Three day-long TMs are held in Kendallville, Huntington, and Fort Wayne to launch TM: Indiana with 170 in attendance. Louisville and Lafayette cadres meet Monday night to strategize on TM and RS-I and have White and Vermillion counties moving nicely. Initial yeses in both Hancock and Hamilton counties look good.

Internal: Twelve House and metro colleagues journey to Chicago to celebrate the completed life of Joseph Wesley Mathews.

Contradiction: Creating timelines that manipulate time so that 10 more TMs get done before the Christmas mindset takes over. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: House team of two spends three days in far reaches of the territory to find local man looking for community responsibility and involvement. Planning for 1978 TM brochure is begun.

Internal: Job search continues and renters are anticipated by November.

Contradiction: Realizing that the task is never complete while sensing the earth moving underfoot. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Thirteen TMs are held in a week's time to complete victorious Northern Michigan Campaign of 26 counties prior to hunting season.

Internal: Seventeen colleagues celebrate completion of Northern Michigan campaign and launching of southern Michigan campaign to complete state before Christmas. Circuit teams get gonged in gong show singing medley of Town Meeting songs before packed night club audience.

Contradiction: Uncovering gold mines in golden glove state to pay for great campaigns. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: The first evening TM is scheduled for Thursday night with everything ready to go in one week. Incredible Saturday blitz includes 15 community citizens and results in posters on every corner, brochures in every home and speeches or phone calls to organizations and churches.

Internal: House initiates metro circuits by meeting with colleagues for dinner in each of three polis groups.

Contradiction: Remembering to ask for colleagues' engagement. (Wk. 9)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Two key Koreans, Lt. governor and Sae maul Undong leader of Jeju Island visit House and show slides in midst of climaxing TM campaign: 60 TMs coordinated and staffed this week and meeting of northern and southern division logistics at coordination center to plan New York State Assembly next week.

Internal: Planning for the critical events of the next weeks of the quarter takes place during the heat of engagement.

Contradiction: Symbolizing the destinal significance of the quarter, pulling the maneuver into one unified thrust in order to let it go and skillfully engage the new maneuver of next quarter. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House braves snow and icy roads in 11-hour drive to area house for Week II maneuver writing session. Concrete plans are made for December house preparations for Quarter III maneuvers which will complete all the remaining counties in the area.

Internal: Saturday morning Daily Office and breakfast are great spirit happenings with all House members present for the first time in two months.

Contradiction: Releasing metro troops to enable a leap frogging into Quarter III before January 1.. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

Announcement of Delta Pace featured on Xerox commercial on the "Hobbit" TV special, at Thanksgiving feast keys calling to past and potential givers.

Internal: Fifty people attend regional House Church here. Facility is tidied up and winterized.

Contradiction: Deciding where the concentration of forces will be for next phase of the maneuver in the Town Meeting: Mid Atlantic campaign. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: Highlight of the week is the Community Thanksgiving dinner, Wednesday evening organized and cooked by the men. New Community Center Director enters training period in preparation for the role of community activities coordinator. The Ivy City Human Development Project Club concretizes the calendar for December in Ivy City.

Internal: House sends out Bob and Pat Howard to Isle of Dogs. Series of collegiums is held commonly across the area to provide the opportunity for reflection and planning.

Contradiction: Deploying selves strategically given the troop and task demand. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Hagerstown follow-up nets \$300, reveals that videotape of Town Meeting shown to fifth graders excites them about participation in decision-making and creates way to move on proposal to increase citizen participation through school system.

Internal: Presence of two circuiters enables reflection on maneuvers and anticipatory projections for next quarter (what do you do when your state turns gold?)

Contradiction: Releasing those ready to be GSF to assume care for broader realm of society. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

Internal: Star Wars celebration on Week II launches week of traveling at faster than light speed.

Contradiction: Engaging others in the task. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

Internal: Under the rubric of Getting the Jump on January, three collegiums were held to evaluate the past quarter, giving new hope and vision for the future. The whole House is present for fine corporately prepared Thanksgiving feast.

Contradiction: Establishing regular corporate reflection of comprehensive Project design. (Wk. 9)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Having proudly completed repainting and functionally renovating the Medical Dispensary, Health Caretakers are commissioned in a festive ceremony attended by community and health officials in representation of regional hospital and the state of Miranda Health Department. First TM (Foro Comunitario) given by Cano Negro leaders, in conjunction with members of Caracas cadre, calls forth visible sign of resurgent hope in nearby village of Tapipa Grande.

Internal: House celebrates the completed life of Joseph Mathews with prayer and memorial service, and sends priorship to funeral service in Chicago.

Contradiction: Formalizing practical training program to enable efficient Project management. (Wk. 6)

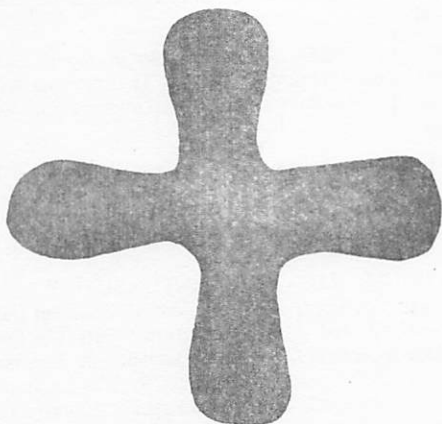

Contradiction: Releasing guild meeting to be an event that makes a difference to the community each week. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: House and region receive fresh impetus for TM after participating in three TMs in Wales. Global Women's Forum in Manchester goes well.

Internal: Campaign News collegium broadens horizons and guardian's paper 'Life of Destiny' provides a chart as a mirror for reflection.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

Contradiction: Winning with globally common models in a country whose primary focus is nation building. (Wk. 10)

Contradiction: Creating necessary vehicle to accelerate emerging breakloose in grassroots circuits. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Town Meeting in Heidelberg Altstadt with 150 present is great event: Ruhr Valley and Vienna GWFs have 40 present at each. Town Meeting is set for East German/West German border village of Werxhausen for May 28. A steering committee meeting is held for two TMs in Wesel on February 18.

Internal: Wolf-Dieter Friebel and Mary Jan Elliott guest as they orchestrate Heidelberg Town Meeting. Three criss-crossing treks transform Frankfurt House into Grand Central Station.

Contradiction: Deciding the appropriate reports for nurturing metro colleagues. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Thirty decorated Christmas trees go up on all the streetlights of Wrangelstrasse. Evergreens and holly ushes are put in the 14 new flower boxes on Falckensteinstrasse. Businessmen on Wrangelstrasse donate 500 marcs for the trees. Christmas market flyers and posters go up. Cafe windows Christmas decorations include an electric train. Internal: VW van returns after six weeks in repair shop. Inkind freezer arrives. House celebrates Thanksgiving with feast, reading of Mayflower Compact, conversation and children's play.

Contradiction: Enabling corporateness rather than competition. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS is on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradictuib: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers that assure victory. (Wk. 8)

Contradiction: Daring to trust present models while constantly refining and pushing new ones. (Wk. 10)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: National Council of Women of Kenya invite ICA to do GWF all over Kenya and in women's prison. Two cows and a calf show up. First low-cost choo (toilet) is completed. Her Excellency Miss Margaret Kenyatta says yes to GWF and "The Great Two Years" celebration. World Neighbors commits \$1,000.

Internal: Fine House Church witness on adventure results in midnight rendezvous as 10 House people gather at Kabira Station to greet John Rupert and Daudi Barnes after their all-night train ride in the cattle car with two new cows and a brand new calf.

Contradiction: Finding creative means of engagement in the task that moves Kenya down the road. (Wk. 9)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS—MALIWADA HDP

External: Gram Sabhas are held in Takli, Dahbad, Malewadgaon and Deohlali. Visitors from the Hunger Project come in with film crew to include the Project in documentary. Head of group is Warner Earhard, inventor of Garhard's Seminar Training in the US Consciousness Raising seminars. General Secretary of Janata Party, the ruling party in India, visits Maliwada. Two demonstration visits come from villages.

Internal: House celebrates yellow ur with Chinese cooking, songs, games, stories and decor from Korea, Japan and Taiwan. Joe and Ann Slicker celebrate 30th wedding anniversary.

Contradiction: Doing effective catalytic action with sporadic presence. (Wk. 10)

to have more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in yach of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Proposal for piped water scheme is presented to government authorities. Village square is inaugurated. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: House sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. House welcomes new auxiliaries, Rangunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI—UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI—SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Lions Club conducts a health camp with seven doctors and free medicine. The first Guardians meeting successfully plans economic development. Village men and school children do a miracle workday on streets and drains.

Internal: Auxiliary house gets a new floor and whitewash. Larger program chart, girds, inkind travel posters and colorful curtains give House a dynamic face. Jack Gilles is welcomed to work with acceleration treks.

Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Ramesh and Roger burn midnight oil to send letters about GWF to area and regional colleagues. Area trek goes out for GWF. Area colleagues decide to go to continental council in Maliwada. United Nations visitor, Mrs. Sally Shelley from New York, requests ICA attendance at meeting where Mrs. Vijay Laxmi Pandit, Nehru's sister and former president of the U.N. assembly expresses delight in ICA story given by Ramesh Agarwal of Delhi House. Women of 20 leading families hear GWF story at leading politician's home, and some sign up on the spot.

Internal: Week of celebrations includes Id (Muslim), Guru Nanak's birthday (Sik), and Thanksgiving.

Contradiction: Structuring final recruitment for GWF so that it will enable the possibility of 50 or more in the coming year. (Wk. 9)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD—NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Formal invitation for first GWF in Eastern India are distributed. Yeses come from unexpected quarters.

Internal: Possibility of renting a very particular house in a very specific locality brings visible concretion to the mission in Calcutta.

Contradiction: Maintaining spirit structures in midst of dispersed troops and fragmented space. (Wk. 9)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Visit from Mrs. Lim of the Ministry of Cultural Affairs encourages decision to register.

Internal: Dolly Mannon is welcomed on way to assignment in Delhi. Whole House, minus one, is impacted by the writing of the Global Priorities song.

Contradiction: Building a consensus on Area Council that enables it to be a happening. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visit about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of development secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year is tackled as Wiltse family arrives.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of Southeast Asia and how the Centrum dynamic will be supportive. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

External: The weeds on 200 acres of padi land which has not been in use for the past three years has been poisoned in preparation for planting the padi.

Internal: The ICA is registered as a not-for-profit organization by the government of Malaysia.

Contradiction: Enabling government and semi-government agencies to work together with ICA which is a private organization for the Sungai Lui HDP. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Guild meeting is hosted by village woman. Forty people meet to participate in making decisions. Education guild sets up weekly time for teachers to meet for planning. Literacy classes are held in each kampung.

Internal: Kelapa Dua continues to be the staging area with many staff members from other projects coming and going as expansion plans continue.

Contradiction: Creating visible signs which bring forth engagement from all stakes. (Wk. 10)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Two development teams trek to Manila and Tokyo. Three GWFs are held in the Philippines. Ticketing for Hong Kong Area Council is completed. Japanese Guardians meet in Oyubari.

Internal: Nexus is impacted by details of the miracle of 20 GCFs in Davao Region, Mt. Apo Eruption Maneuver and anticipates the miracle of the Blue Angle Maneuver, site selection, and consult preparation there. Thanksgiving feast celebrates victory of quarter. Area prior is hosted and sent

out on continuation of area trek.

Contradiction: Enabling troops to celebrate the victory before the victory and do planning in relation to that victory. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Nam Wai Beautification Guild, composed of village youth, builds bamboo waiting shelter. Donations of plants and shrubs from agriculture and fisheries department enable planting of village square park and school wall border. Caterpillar, Far East, arranges donation for use of bulldozer and operator to prepare ground for village football field. Community elders decide name for their group and write Hakka wedding ceremony for Hakka history book they are preparing. Village advisory council demonstrates unity to move ahead on legalization of Nam Wai Development Corporation. Week ends with villagers celebrating the Ijede HDP, complete with African food.

Internal: Ecclesiola is highlight beginning with an interlude including the "Man from the Ministry" radio program and ending with sodality radio program of Johnny Carson's answer man from ICA staff. Area prior visits and spins on taking care of yourself.

Contradiction: Maintaining priorities while maneuvering unexpected developments. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Three Town Meetings (Local Community Planning Discussion Meetings) happened in Fang Liao Hsiang within four days. Three representatives from Taiwan government bring necessary materials for visit to Sudtonggan HDP. New telephone is installed in the village.

Internal: Thanksgiving Day was a happening as several villagers, representatives from the government and the Taipei House came to join in the celebration. House joins villagers in the celebration of the completed life of a 24-year old villager and finds selves joining in the grieving.

Contradiction: Naming the miracles for the villagers as they happen. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: GWF receives top level authorization from Dr. Leticia de Guzman, executive director of the National Commission on the Role of Filipino Women (also President of Philippine Women's University).

Internal: Meeting with prestigious SGV auditing firm (inkind) initiates audit of ICA: Philippines books for 1976 and 1977.

Contradiction: Devising strategy for self-support breakthrough in stride with program victories. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development maneuver nets 54,000 NT in addition to 100,000 NT for interest-free loan, equivalent to \$1,400 and \$2,600 US respectively. Hai Ou report is printed in English and Chinese. Community Forum brochure is sent to printers.

Internal: English teaching for Formosa Rubber Company gives self-support a boost.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from planning to doing the Forums, GWF and CS-1. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Over 138 villagers attend play at St. Teresa's College, Cebu, and 50 village women participate in Global Women's Forum in Cebu, making cultural explosion the theme for the week. Ten villagers are involved in the Mactan 10 GCFs to be held this Saturday and receive orchestrator's training and are briefed by those experienced from the Davao 20 blitz. Firt hand pump is installed in Purok 3, occasioning

great water fight celebration. Demonstration toilet is completed for the Early Learning Center.

Internal: The evening of the Global Women's Forum is spent with gala celebration of men cooking, serving and singing to Auxiliary Health and Education staffs, with GWF team as honored guests.

Contradiction: Creating story and maneuvers to release completion image in five week's time. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Support base for Davao Project is expanded by Rotary Club presentation and GWF with 32 present. The 20 GCF documents are delivered to munipicle mimeographing office. Site selection research illuminates condition of final HDP site. GWF brings in 500 pesos in development.

Internal: Following Mt. Apo Eruption celebration, a swimming party follows an evening of singing, dancing and feasting. House sends Joey Armas to Manila, and Nanie Amistoso, Dick Ando, Tingley Ando, Helen Potot, Purita Limpanog, Joe Bagingnao, Tito de la Serna and Dick Alton to Sudtonggan.

Contradiction: Naming the focus of the advantages and disciplining selves to the press of time to move on it. (Wk. 9)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: In Development, one million yen Sandoz grant, plus another gift of 4,000 yen indicates a new trend in Japanese authorization and Development.

Internal: An outstanding collegium on the solitary journal is held.

Contradiction: Creating double thrust of LENS/Development and getting Japanese callers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: As the village elders meet to design the Village Treasury operating procedures, the chickens lay 28 eggs. An average of 1 1/2 TMs are set up and held each day. A fantastic HRM is held at Ham-Duk. TMs are 99% set up before January in every district on Jeju. Cement, gravel and sand arrive for Training Center. Boiler systems pipes are bent for floor heat radiation.

Internal: House experiences Fast, HRM, 16 priorities workshop, waking up economic. Jeep dies in the middle of the road.

Contradiction: Creating a corporate mind for village and staff. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: House sends out Jeju provincial vice governor and Sae Maul chief to visit HDP sites in USA and Japan. Chuncheon is visited for site selection of new northern HDP. A meeting is held with chairman of the board of the largest private foundation in Korea regarding future funding. Local pastors and colleagues are telephoned for grassroots gifts. Local church collegium studies the HDTS curriculum.

Internal: Preparations are made for the Joseph Wesley Mathews Memorial Service in downtown Seoul. House is impacted by collegium conversation on "How has God prepared us for this moment?"

Contradiction: Discerning the strategic role of Town Meeting in the midst of preparing for the HDTS and new northern Project while maneuvering troops to cover all fronts. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: A week of circuit riding gives key leads on sites and colleagues to set up PLC, HRM and a GWF in the Naha metro

and new contacts with English teachers in Hiroshima metro.

Internal: One of guild members visits to fête House with a special tea ceremony in the midst of first of two battleplanning sessions.

Contradiction: Being able to meet the demand with staff and models when a breakloose happens. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Town Meeting in Awaji begins preparation of island leadership for further Town Meetings. Development breakthrough: school Christmas party is scheduled with promised gift of \$400 for Oyubari.

Internal: New miracle board excites House as miracles pop up daily.

Contradiction: Driving down the stakes of two TMs set for this week while shooting the arrows that will assure that the TM torch gets passed. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Sapporo cross country ski course is visited while exploration for local ski course is expanded. Physical survey forms are distributed for daily stake walk checks. Stake maps and decor are prepared for stake meetings. Battleplan is built for Early Learning Center, with opening scheduled in January, 1978. On Wee II, 40 towns are visited by five circuit teams to break open TM in Hokkaido.

Internal: New assignment formate into guild arenas maximizes program expansion. Thanksgiving party with local residents introduces new customs. Three new jobs are obtained for self-support.

Contradiction: Pushing through Project programs and area maneuvers with troops on hand. (Wk. 9)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Team of 6 set out to lay foundations for O.H.D.P. Community Hall and deliver inkind vehicle to Walkabout Team. Major funding circuit begins with \$1000 in hand from ESSO (Aust.) through contact of local guardian whose wife inkinded \$1000 worth of coloured G.W.F. brochures.

Internal: Dispersion of House highlighted while youth host the Oombulgurri Trek Team for their last supper. Phone runs hot as Jay Zahrt sells bikes to fund Christmas vacation to Oombulgurri.

Contradiction: Enabling people to see our campaigns as authentic channels for their engagement. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: Three demonstration Community Meetings blow open possibilities in many directions. Sisters of Mercy sign of two for CTC with one more possible and one Academy prospect. Community Meeting: Western Australia state committee is formalized while four more groups come to the fore (churches, women's groups, mining companies and banks); MacRobertson Miller Airlines donate six one-way airfares (\$1250) to Oombulgurri for completion of night school while transport company agrees to sip all materials free.

Internal: Fast day intensifies missional self-consciousness and is highlighted by mealtime readings from Lawrence and Hammersjold. John Cock is sent out as he completes the job of creating a missional powerhouse.

Contradiction: Occasioning the commitment as new colleagues and contacts increase. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: First phase of preparation and training is completed as Walkabout Team reaches full trength and

prepares for first Community Meeting at Oombulgurri on Week 2.

Internal: Collegiums keep the context broad to focus in on the particular of Community Meeting training for Operation Walkabout.

Contradiction: Securing the point of advantage in making contact with key people. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: First Aboriginal CMA demonstrates competence in use of methods and deep excitement over new song.

Internal: Visit from Operation Walkabout team with fresh image of Community Meetings for aboriginals impacts all. Two luxuries arrive in the form of motorcycles, sparking new life.

Contradiction: Creating effective forms that allow community participation in Operation Completion. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Global Women's Forum core meeting held with regional colleagues, resulting in the launching of two weeks of visits to potential "advisory board" gold star names to lend weight to the programmes in March. In-kind transport for 20 tons of materials to be sent to Oombulgurri secured. Steering committee meets for Adelaide Inner City Churches Community Meeting. Development reaches \$2250 in hand and \$2000 committed for the quarter so far.

Internal: House hosts Ken Wiltse who enables "every person a house finance manager" concept to approach reality. Prince Charles granting of a school holiday 2nd December enables youth to finish assigned model building for the Area Phase I Summer Programme.

Contradiction: Breaking through to the 1-a-day image that will enable mass awakening throughout the whole of South Australia and additional parts of the Adelaide Region. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MELBOURNE

External: Local women in Sherbrooke Shire decide to have GWF in March. Development weekly reporting to major corporation contributors strengthens context for funding and firms credibility. Conversations are held with 12 guardians regarding Committee of 1000. Denys and Vivian Correll show slides of Maliwada to 35 guests describing their role in health acceleration there and embodying a style of participation available to everyone.

Internal: Tony Allen sojourns and major funding team is hosted for the week. Global fast on Maliwada guest night takes on new meaning. House experiences "ships passing in the night" dynamic as Bill Norton is sent out to Tasmania.

Contradiction: Finding appropriate concrete task to claim engagement of interested friends and to expand the movemental conversation with history. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CANBERRA-SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: Hon. Bill Withers holds Dept. Of Aboriginal Affairs to justice as it tries to evict all local Oombulgurri residents in political move by Aboriginal Land Trusts over diamond profits from Oombulgurri reserve. Walkabout team shocked as discover the waste and devastation of government funds in 15 Northern Territory Aboriginal Communities, which lends authorization support for Oombulgurri.

Internal: Move from 2 houses and into one fantastic facility in record time. Plans for open house. Men arrive back in time to assist with move. Visas extended until Aug. 1978. Fast initiates "A'CT' Manoeuvre" as big push on summer program recruitment (CTC), GWF, and Guardians event.

Contradiction: How move GSD's fast relative to authorization, and articulate evaluation criteria in anyman's language for human development. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISBANE

External: Stuart Parkoff, out-of-work colleague, agrees to head north with Anthony on CT /Development/CMA trek. Invitations for Christmas Party (CTC tactic) are ready to deliver. Newsletter is ready for printing.

Internal: Julie gets part-time job with colleague. Jennifer's youth group goes on weekend work and entertainment trip to Goondiwindi; and Anthony returns from Adelaide maneuver.

Contradiction: Holding together all the dynamics of the mission and winning. (Wk. 10)

SUVA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MAJURO-MARSHALLS HDP

External: Five more neighborhood TMs are completed this week: Caloha Bayside, Wotje town, Jenrock (2), Mico and Mejit town, exploding practical vision for saturating the district center of Uliga with 18 more in the next three weeks. In the midst of the direct thrust into the community with neighborhood TM, House decides to do an indirect tactic, "Operation Christmas Package" to explode the symbol of the diamond of the Pacific.

Internal: House sends Blood and Chia families out after 1 1/2 years in the Project and receives new intern family, the Telekaus, from the Gilbert Islands.

Contradiction: Increasing pool of resources of translators fast enough to keep pace with the daily expanding demand. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: APIA

External: Evening with the Institute impresses 33 people with HDP slides, while Aaoge Kovati's "welcome home" report demonstrates readiness of local colleagues to participate. Eleven more villages visited.

Internal: House cleaned and decorated. Kitchen resurrected, and in celebration, House attends Thornton Wilder's play "OUR TOWN".

Contradiction: Planning to move into the village but HDP consult date still undecided. (Wk 10)

SAN FRANCISCO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN FRANCISCO

External: Community Youth Forum involves youth from both San Francisco and Los Angeles regions, utilizes Tom McClain and Hendrik Idzerda as pedagogues and pays for itself. Global Women's Forum brings together colleagues from across the region to rehearse the course and to strategize marketing for Quarter II and III. Town Meeting forges its way across Northern California, as full-time circuiters and regional colleagues team up to orchestrate four TMs and set up three more.

Internal: All-out total House and region push on Development as California forges a replicable model of a state adopting a Maharashtra village as a memorial to Joseph Wesley Mathews. The week's blitz has already netted \$8,472 with \$4,772 ready to go back to Chicago with Development team.

Contradiction: Weaving together the massive number of contacts from the past month into a viable network. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN JOSE

External: California Planning Meeting in Fresno metro is a time with old colleagues to vision the future on forthcoming

California Project. Full participation in Adopt a Village Development blitz with altered House timeline engages all and builds new development contacts with old and new colleagues.

Internal: Seeing the "Circus of Dr. Lao" during Planning Meeting recalls task to do the impossible in local communities and the Thursday evening dinner with San Francisco is a celebration of the glory of intense missional engagement of the battle worn warriors.

Contradiction: Creating the needed task forces to begin Town Meeting saturation in the Valley, secure orchestrators and begin Project staging. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SACRAMENTO

External: Participation in San Francisco region Adopt a Village Development blitz secures funding from one half of Sacramento Town Meeting steering committees, opens up corporations and initiates church participation. Two more Town Meetings are held in Northern Counties and three more in the city of Sacramento. Senior Citizen meeting is televised and shown on 6:00 and 11:00 news.

Internal: Regional colleagues become expert at leading Town Meeting workshops with new evening Town Meeting format.

Contradiction: Developing a continuing structure to intensify GSD preparation, GWF initiation, and metro cadre engagement. (Wk. 8)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEATTLE

External: Two Town Meetings held—last two in WA reset. Regional nurture/development circuit nets \$ and provides nurture of colleagues.

Internal: Advent wreath and decor launch the new Church year.

Contradiction: Sitting on anxieties about details while doing the Necessary Deed. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LOS ANGELES

External: New colleagues appear, highlighted by church couple planning 6 month Maharashtra assignment and readers of our "help wanted ad" in Intermediate Technology news letter who come to house to discuss their participation.

Internal: A two day House planning retreat in mountains provides a new sense of direction.

Contradiction: Overly pregnant with plans for California HDP, we find ourselves operating day by day in a maintenance pattern, waiting for labor to begin. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHOENIX

External: First community/school Town Meeting was held in Flagstaff. Metro Cadre hosts a guest speaker who is both theologian and fund-raiser and who resolves to help us.

Internal: City Council of Phoenix passes unanimously an ordinance giving us a city-owned 18-room mansion at a dollar-a-year rent. This is an unprecedented action in city history and locates us in a great strategic location.

Contradiction: Organizing potential. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SALT LAKE CITY

External: ICA mails 301 GWF brochures. Lake City, Colorado, TM is great event with 10% of inhabitants consenting that this was town's greatest event of recent years.

Internal: In the midst of frantic GWF preparation, House manages to spend two evening on catch-up practices.

Contradiction: Discerning whether the enemy has sling shots or machine guns in midst of being dropped behind enemy lines. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BILLINGS

External: Four Town Meetings (two on one night) in western Montana brings total to 16 this quarter. Development begins Eastern Montana Campaign (Operation Bushwack) with great reception from banks.

Internal: Whole House (minus circuiters) assist Inyan Wakagapi HDP in planting 80 trees and celebrates with steak breakfast at House Church.

Contradiction: Eliciting leadership style of affirmation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Six Town Meetings are held in six mountain towns in spite of the heavy snowfall. Calling every home in Rico nets one-half of the adult population at the Town Meeting.

Internal: House begins analysis of challenges and proposals of 51 Town Meetings held this year. Advent is ushered in with House Church witness and the lighting of candles.

Contradiction: Beginning to generate momentum for four remaining state campaigns while wrapping up Colorado, planning impact courses, and wading through over-crowded Christmas schedules. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY—INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Day care space is renovated, materials inkinded, money contributed from a new Guardian source, leaving the main block, and salaries for teachers to be dealt with. Then a car drives up unknown and unsolicited and three salaries are offered. Planting of 1,200 trees are completed just before winter blizzard. Two rabbits are certified for transport to Vogar rabbitry. First winter blizzard proves effectiveness of winterized rabbitry. Newsletter and Community Day Care Committee show up daily at ICA center.

Internal: Ecclesiola is a great happening—the worst winter storm since 1897 moves in and turns "Night on the town" in Bismark into night on the town in Cannon Ball with fantastic winter celebration.

Contradiction: Finding ways to ground indicative battleplanning to release community structures and give sustained support to the covenant with this community. (Wk. 9)

EDMONTON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON

External: An evening community forum at Cadogan, Alberta is enabled by a new colleague from Global Women's Forum who drove orchestrators there (three hour drive) and did production for the evening.

Internal: House exchanges troops as area maneuver continues in Manitoba with 14 forums set for Week 10. Winter hits again. Phase I receive first report cards of the year.

Contradiction: Being a strong house dynamic in the midst of area maneuvers. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VANCOUVER

External: Golden colleagues set Forum date for January. Heather is sent to Saskatchewan for areal maneuver sweep across the winter prairies.

Internal: Colleagues bring House Church meal and celebrate with colleagues from areas Montreal and San Francisco. Tickner obtains position with adult education college.

Contradiction: Turning attention from rural circuits to expanding urban Vancouver networks.(Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

External: Visits with newspaper editor and foundation director open way to on-target strategy for securing

development funds, while permeator draws up Iron Man-esque Symbol for State Human Rights Commission, and Alaskan Rural Economic Development Research is done by House Univ. student in preparation for Alaska HDP.

Internal: House week illuminated by participation in city-wide Christmas tree-lighting ceremony. The practical gleaned from old RS-1 recruiting days pays off as four House members go vacuum selling. House celebrates birth of Teresa Jean Hamje when she and Jeanette attend House Church.

Contradiction: Releasing yeses to large development contributions while keeping supply lines open to sustain Area through jobs and inkind. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SASKATOON

External: Dispersed House engages in preparation for Forums and GWF recruitment. Local Women's group gets busy collecting materials for Vogar quilt industry.

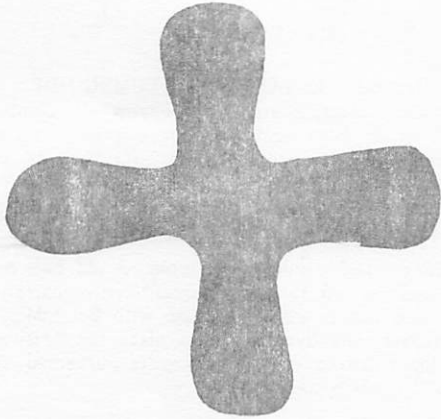

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS jobs on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers that assure victory. (Wk. 8)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CAIRO-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Canadian Embassy says yes to funding fish farm. Project receives grant from OxFam:London. New guild space is recreated from empty building and furnished with tables and benches made from unsaleable bricks and scrap lumber.

Internal: Three sojourners and six visitors from American University in Cairo demonstrate the possibility of volunteer engagement in helpful and practical form. Great Thanksgiving feast celebrates showers of blessings.

Contradiction: Daring to trust present models while constantly refining and pushing new ones. (Wk. 10)

NAIROBI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Ruth Habwe gives promise of funding from Women of Kenya following site visit. Provincial commissioner gives first time affirmation of KHDP with great two year celebration stamp of approval. Local Guardian, Peter Ndwari, calls for moment of silence in memory of Joseph Mathews as family gathers with Order to celebrate forthcoming wedding of Peter Njuguna and Benedette Muthoni.

Internal: The Nairobi Religious House celebrates with the Global Order the marriage of the first African Order couple, Peter Njuguna and Benedette Muthoni.

Contradiction: Activating the cooperative, the community care structure, rapidly enough. (Wk. 11)

BOMBAY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY NEXUS-MALIWADA HDP

External: Demonstration farm harvests 2,600 kg of sorghum for community kitchen. Nanaje Deshmuk, General Secretary of Janata Party, describes Maliwada as an "oasis

in the desert of village development" and terms HDTs students as nursery seedlings to be transplanted across India's rural villages. Several small scale industry possibilities are demonstrated to guild. Gram Sabhas in three new replication villages happen: Dabhad, Deolali and Takali.

External: In village shramdam, preshcool is painted, temple is repaired and house whitewashing campaign is launched. Divali is celebrated in five-hour festival with lights from the village generator.

Internal: New divisional decor in collegium room renews auxiliary energy and vision of the mighty 250.

Contradiction: Showing village leaders how to turn the key to release government funds already sanctioned. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KOLAMBI-KOLAMBI HDP

External: Khadi village industries meets with Kolambi high school grads and decides to back loans for a dairy scheme, poultry farm and a general store and clothing store for five people who presented models.

Internal: Auxiliary celebrates major Hindu festival, Diwali, with village by lighting buildings with 130 oil lamps, fireworks, feasting and attending a film show in Akola.

Contradiction: Bringing unity to village into two factions by elections. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers. Great Health Fair is attended by Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city. Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UTI-UTI HDP

External: State Bank of India adopts village, insuring loans for all villagers and key woman leader brings other women to guild meeting for the first time.

Internal: New auxiliary arrives in time for early morning and sunset bird watch over prize hybrid sorghum plots.

Contradiction: Moving rapidly on all fronts with massive possibilities staring all in the face. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SHIVNI-SHIVNI HDP

External: First edition of "Shivni Voice" is written by villagers and distributed in local city. Literacy classes begin with 20 people and village teacher. Contradiction: Maintaining and demonstrating internal corporate patterns when priorship is constantly required to be away from the village. (Wk. 9)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: GWF with 26 elite women gives new authorization base.

Internal: Swirl of guests for GWF and development happens. Marie Paul goes to Chandigarh to enable Dethé family after the death of Monini's sister, Rohini.

Contradiction: Refocusing energy after GWF breakthrough. (Wk. 11)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: While GWF team invites governor of A.P. to inaugurate GWF, the rest of the auxiliary processes bank loans and blasts huge rock at entrance to village.

Internal: Auxiliary experiences itself as stretched as 50% of the troops are out on GWF set-up or discontinuity.

Contradiction: Finding the right tool to share the vision with the village. (Wk. 10)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: GWF in Calcutta YWCA comes off with 30 present. First reactions are encouraging.

Internal: House members move into new facility, its location ideal for building on past PCE work as well as being a jumping-off point for Development and the Eastern India Village HDP.

Contradiction: Doing the external mission in midst of immediacies of sustenance of survival. (Wk. 11)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE NEXUS

External: The next step in Sungai Aup authorization is accomplished. LEV trek returns from successful ten days in Sungai Lu and heads for Kelapa Dua.

Internal: Plans for Area Council are near completion with location and food secured.

Contradiction: Guarding Order's auditability in having books in order. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE-SUNGAI AUP HDP

External: Colleagues from East Malaysia visit about authorization maneuvers in Sarawak. September launch of development secures \$6,700.

Internal: Intensive battleplan for year is tackled as Wiltse family arrives.

Contradiction: Forging clarity on the future of Southeast Asia and how the Centrum dynamic will be supportive. (Wk. 1)

Internal: House sends out Ruthe and George Yost for visa renewal to Singapore.

Contradiction: Maintaining full-time development thrust and training village and auxiliary in priorship at the same time. (Wk. 11)

HONG KONG

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG NEXUS

External: Centrum hosts 20 from Area Hong Kong for Area Hong Kong Council; 40 participate in Hong Kong GWF.

Internal: House welcomes Carol Pierce, Joyce Quimby and

Aimee Hilliard for GWF. Bob Fishel and Isabel Bishop arrive en route from Maliwada HDTS to Seoul HDTS. Dolly Rowe secures job.

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum on all fronts. (Wk. 11)

Guild meeting is success with 20 people around the table and economic-based format brings excited discussion.

Contradiction: Finishing this quarter with a bang while next quarter is already upon us. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: ICA receives 15,000 pesos from Scott Paper company, Philippines, and 2,000 meters of wire for SHDP electrification.

Internal: House sends out colleagues to Area Council in Hong Kong and sends GWF team to Hong Kong.

Contradiction: Moving ahead while grounding the season of waiting. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development maneuver nets 54,000 NT in addition to 100,000 NT for interest-free loan, equivalent to \$1,400,000 and \$2,600,000 US respectively. Hai Ou report is printed in English and Chinese. Community Forum brochure is sent to printers.

Internal: English teaching for Formosa Rubber Company gives self-support a boost.

Contradiction: Breaking loose from planning to doing the Forums, GWF and CS-1. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGANN HDP

External: Eleven villagers converge on 123 meters of inkinded material to sew uniforms for 150 Early Learning Center students, 10 teachers and eight Services Guilders; 136 uniform white T-shirts are inkinded. ELC field trip to Cebu International School is great event; 18 men move the three-ton rock saw to donated land and Craft Guild prepares for a fantastic display at the Cebu International Bazaar. Undersecretary of Education visits HDP with 70 school superintendants from across the Philippines. Pundok (stake) meetings with 212 attending mark HDP strength in ability to care for all 912 residents.

Internal: House opens quarter with jeep trek to Cebu to see "A Bridge Too Far". Finishing touches on House finally keep all chickens, ducks, dogs and goats out of corporate space.

Contradiction: Releasing tactics that will transform gap

before. New Years into completion of HDP. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Langub chosen as the Davao HDP site is a depressed, agricultural village on a mountain ridge overlooking Davao City. Bruce Robertson and Herminia Banayo are sent to Langub as "Village Criers" to prepare the village for the HDP Consult and Roy Philbrook goes to Hong Kong Area Council and to Manila as the "National Alert" formation of Blue Angels maneuver. Over 80 people in Langub attend a Community Assembly on HDP practices.

Internal: A 30-hour mini-Odyssey allows all to reflect deeply and includes a hike up the mountain to Langub, followed by a contemplation workshop.

Contradiction: Turning massive task paralysis into steamroller attack. (Wk. 11)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Mr. Shibata, senior researcher for Hitachi, visited Tokyo House to look into the possibility of working with ICA as translator, staffing, Guardian and serving full-time after retirement in about two years. Development calling continues to reveal patron willing to help.

Internal: Campaign breakfast celebrates 1,000,000 yen gift.

Contradiction: Deciding in midst of unfocused thrust to leave unfinished the battleplanning. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU-KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Forty gold metal winners from the International Skills Competition held in Amsterdam arrive from their homes on the mainland of Korea to repair everything from watches to the truck in the village. Village treasury leaders decide they are in charge of the Kwangyung industries, not the ICA. Egg production of the 1,000 hens is up to 80 eggs a day after the first week. Three TMs in the first four days happen. Five villagers attended the first TM and helped lead the workshops. Now individuals are volunteering on they days they can go. Visitors from Manchester, U.K. hear about Kwangyung and decide to visit.

External: Social acceleration team arrives on the heels of a fantastic community Thanksgiving Festival with 10 turkeys, greens, cornbread dressing and sweet potato pies.

Internal: Long Week II provides opportunity to winterize the House barely before the snow flies. Order Polity Document revitalizes common memory.

Contradiction: Pushing to the depths a series of key events which are scheduled almost one on top of the other. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

External: 200 mile race against the elements and the clock is won as orchestrator arrives 5 min. before TM is to start.

Internal: Battleplanning for the month of December gives clearer picture for the next campaigns.

Contradiction: Deciding to move on into the unknown, leaving concrete, certain possibilities behind. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OMAHA

External: Norfolk TM brings Nebraska TM total to 17, with seven counties covered. Dates are set for December and early January in six new counties, and Nucor Steel becomes newest statewide sponsor with \$300 gift.

Internal: As 40,000 women gather in Houston, two women hold ecclesiola Friday night—signal of the way things are likely to be.

Contradiction: Getting trained in the practices and grounded in the dynamics of 3½ hour TMs before the first one happens. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Nine mail order TMs happen in 16 counties where 48 letters went; five are scheduled for January. Half of state's letters are in the mail or ready to go. Guardian planned thank you dinner is great success as reports are heard from TMs and GSDs.

Internal: Walt and Pam Blood are back in the country from two years in Majuro. One person joins House after returning from Academy just in time for mail ordered TM orchestration.

Contradiction: Deciding to schedule more TMs than able to orchestrate, or no need to worry about contradiction until you have it. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Six TMs, three sector assemblies are held in midst of raging blizzard. Local TM core and ICA consultant recruit 20 people off the street for Lake Benton TM. Assembly participants are impacted by commonness of challenges across state and by sharing miracle event possibilities.

Internal: Morning collegiums reflect on three campaigns from vantage of winner's circle. Whittier clergyman does House Church witness on hope.

Contradiction: Prioritizing troops and focusing on development priorities while finishing Minnesota campaign with 15 TMs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST. LOUIS

External: Two TMs are held in S. Illinois, bringing recent total of House to twelve. Conditions of the town and seriousness of the local leaders about rebuilding in Ewing, Ill., make us think of GSD. Pocahontas set for next week. Mailing for Open House sent this week.

Internal: We in-kind 34 gallons of paint and two meals for 40 which thirteen people devour ravenously during fantastic work day of scraping, plastering, and painting with help from our friends, the Student House.

Contradiction: In the midst of Missouri and Illinois coming ready for a funding blitz simultaneously, we find ourselves having scheduled a large Open House for the same weekend as Priors' Council, proving once again that you can't be everywhere at once. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Three evening and one all-day TMs are held in new counties. House completes draft of budget for funding blitz. We send 5th issue of the Town Meeting: Iowa Update Newsletter to press.

Internal: First mobile House Church in Cedar Rapids held with two families and Dick Mark present. Discuss plans for a ½ day neighborhood Town Meeting in Cedar Rapids in January as possible first step toward a county saturation plan.

Contradiction: Adequate preparation for funding blitz so that many friendly colleagues can be directly involved and our goal of \$18,000 can be reached. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: Six TMs are held. Six more counties are done. Menominee county (an eternal 'rock-in-the-road') gets date set for January.

Internal: All adult members of House orchestrate TMs.

Contradiction: Making GSF enough of a priority to release troops to do GCF. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

External: Celebrative mood of continental council, area council and bimetro council planning meeting calls forth plans for fantastic New Year's eve.

Internal: Newsletter and Xerox address labels are all printed inkind by Blackhawk Corporation.

Contradiction: Maintaining TM momentum during season of celebration. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Finalize arrangements with Council on Aging to conduct 9 TMs in 9 counties. They pay \$2,500. Complete plans with CAAP for 9 TMs. They pay \$1,800. Sisters of St. Joseph in Ft. Wayne give \$1,200 for India and Indiana Committee for Humanities asks for proposal for 10 more GWFs a cross state @ \$650 each.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS)

Internal: Complete moving into new facility provided by Indianapolis Foundation at 3038 Fall Creek Parkway, keeping us in Mapleton. Fall Creek neighborhood and giving us excellent 14 room house. Ruth Landmann returns to House after 4 month special assignment.

Contradiction: Capitalizing on new advantages in authorization and funding to get TM to every county quickly. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Pounding the last few spikes (counties) into Ohio—looking toward the last golden one.

Internal: Report cards celebrated at House Church Sunday breakfast feast.

Contradiction: Thinking the front is solidifying and looking again to see the race intensifying. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DETROIT

External: Metro troops do five TMs on one night as the state turns gold.

Internal: House joins the rest of Detroit in Noel celebration at city's culture center.

Contradiction: Fighting the new development fight when all the troops have been exhausted. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Initial work on battleplan for Kentucky counties and Quarter III results in exciting pain for all fronts.

Internal: House life battleplanning to care for urban mission and support systems for Quarter III happens.

Contradiction: Expanding forces in midst of battlefront coverage. (Wk. 11)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Newly conferred Dr. Jan Dodd's party with 60 guests reveals intrigue and appreciation with HDTs on part of university students, faculty and related services. Last-minute party prep goes on close to T.V. set where challenge to Those Who Dare (Loisada - Lower East Side) is aired as pocket of cultural power. With the completion of counties in the state of Maine, 50 Guardians do extensive planning for Quarter III and troops are sent to launch campaigns in Pennsylvania and North Carolina.

Internal: Advent profoundly manifests its anticipation dynamic through Advent mailing when everyone keeps asking, "When are we finally going to get these things in the mail?"

Contradiction: Moving beyond old one-horse image of inking to produce a 22-car fleet. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House braves snow and icy roads in 11-hour drive to area house for Week II maneuver writing session. Concrete plans are made for December house preparations for Quarter III maneuvers which will complete all the remaining counties in the area.

Internal: Saturday morning Daily Office and breakfast are great spin happenings with all House members present for the first time in two months.

Contradiction: Releasing metro troops to enable a leap frogging into Quarter III before January 1.. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Nelson Stover and Jan Ulangca participate in site selection of Social Demonstration site possibilities in New York.

Internal: Great Thanksgiving feast with whole of Rochester House present for the first time.

Contradiction: Internalizing methods in order to deal with the flexibility of TM time design. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: Grassroots development phoning continues with stories of Town Meeting: Mid-Atlantic victories. Fall maneuver celebration features movie "Oh, God," and site selection PSU on Sunday morning. Ten sites are chosen for initial review in the South division. Announcement of Delta Pace featured on Xerox commercial on the "Hobbit" TV special, at Thanksgiving feast keys calling to past and potential givers.

Internal: Fifty people attend regional House Church here. Facility is tidied up and winterized.

Contradiction: Deciding where the concentration of forces will be for next phase of the maneuver in the Town Meeting: Mid Atlantic campaign. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: A management task force looks at business expansion and development and House decides to respond to continual letters from Craver family in Brussels and corporately writes a letter informing them on the progress of Ivy City.

Internal: Community Youth Forum preparation yields 70 pre-registrations and anticipation amongst Ivy City youth. Renovation continues as heat is installed in preschool and Crummel Hall and pipes and walls are brightly painted in pre-school room. Stake leaders and Health Advocates meet to plan Christmas food drive as a part of practical stake care.

Contradiction: Externalizing the markings of internal resolve with structures and symbols to enable the star in the East to become a reality. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Three TMs are done with good attendance, all five pillars and awakening is definitely occurring, combined with mailouts to metro and TM colleagues, keeping House moving away from the House.

Internal: Reports from Continental Council spin House into visions of possibility, seeing "Exemplar" roles as categories of caring for selves and others.

Contradiction: Enabling the recreative pause in a way that transforms building Quarter III implementaries. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: The Area participates with great excitement in P.S.U. for GSD site selection.

Internal: In a series of 3 collegiums there is great enthusiasm as every House in the Area focuses on "The Role of the Religious House". Tops off the week with whole House home from Mid-Atlantic Campaign with a great Thanksgiving feast.

Contradiction: How to enable GSF in being more engaged in the decision-making and every phase of the mission (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: HDP presentation in Basking Ridge Presbyterian brings for HDP consultants, gives substance to the church's decision to adopt a village. GWF in Hartford includes area-wide representation. Area New York task force of global guardians gather at Area House to write maneuvers for December and Quarter III. Profound Humanness spins and eagerness to work is highlight of Week II. New leadership emerges out of very impacting event.

Internal: Advent cards and New Year's eve celebration invitations are mailed to region in anticipation of high

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK)
celebration.

Contradiction: Sending Guardians to Consults while doing Area GCF and being responsible for continental TMs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Incredible Guardians Meeting for New York Area calls forth new leadership, as Don Richert is sent to Area Houston to do TMs in response to a grant for North Carolina.

Internal: Guardians Meeting celebration, with plans made for three more celebrations coming soon, making it clear we celebrate on ontological time.

Contradiction: Structuring serious assault on transportation needs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Global Women's Forum is held with 33 present. Martha, Gerry and Carol Heway appear on radio talk show to promote it, and ICA receives long, positive interview afterward by the Christian Science Monitor; NOW representative is also positive. TMs are completed in every county in Maine; Mark Whitney conducts sign/symbol/song workshop in a TM and village clerk of Monkton, Vermont, writes a letter thanking ICA for TM.

Internal: Christmas card is designed and sent to printers. Julie Wilson is sent out after completion of three-month sojourn. Wesley Salmon joins Hartford track team.

Contradiction: Building a solid advocacy base for GWF in view of schedule for next two quarters. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

External: Metro guardians attend Area Meeting. Two remain behind to orchestrate Sobleskill TM. Dorcas and Jeff Clithero complete set-up of remaining up-state counties and travel to NYC where they set up Putnam county. The House travels to Maine to help turn it gold.

Internal: Long needed update of House finances initiated. Logistics office recreated. Deann gives House Church witness on a week of Maine maneuvers.

Contradiction: House spending time responding to immediacies rather than longer-range priorities. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: The largest, northernmost county in Maine is conquered! The yellow is taking over.

Internal: Under the rubric of Getting the Jump on January, three collegiums were held to evaluate the past quarter, giving new hope and vision for the future. The whole House is present for fine corporately prepared Thanksgiving feast.

Contradiction: Building the tactics which require the concrete participation of the GSF and prepare troops adequately to be able to say yes to what is required. (Wk. 9)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Youth Forum steering committee is set up by Montreal House youth circuit team; launching of the Community Forum Communautaire Quebec assures authorization for provincial campaign. House goes circuiting in two cars and returns with one car and three CFCs on order.

Internal: Lorne staff member, David Weinstain, leads House in Saturday night Chanukah celebration. James Bay circuit team returns home with six CFC documents and victory stories, reminding House of the reality of the North. Con

Moore visits on way to Greyshock/Moore wedding in Lorne, bringing greetings from Europe and House and has fun creating all kinds of ways to use the abounding supply of cucumbers and tomatoes.

Contradiction: Holding tension between getting Forums done before Christmas and honoring community's timelines. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: The whole House is sent to three area fronts: New Brunswick, St. Lawrence Seaway Forums and area inkind.

Internal: House moves out of present facility and sets up ICA office in a metro colleague's home until a rent-free facility can be found.

Contradiction: Keeping the identity of the Toronto House and holding the cruciality of its geographical care while absent from the turf. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: The north circuit team has 4 out of 5 counties with dates. River Valley in Nipissing county sends 25 of its 150 residents to Forum. All were in trapping, hunting or lumber businesses and three spoke English.

Internal: Reception for Marguerite LePage prior to India assignment allows old colleagues to get together for the first time in three quarters.

Contradiction: Appropriating direct mission "mini-maneuvers" in the face of a massive self-support maneuver. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Lorne resident and ICA staff journey to nation's capitol to tell the Lorne de l'Acadie story and to further the financial undergirding of the project. In Lorne the ice-covered roof of the firehall is completed by bare-handed men in -10C weather.

Internal: The wedding of Tom Greyshock and Connie Moore is celebrated with parents coming from opposite sides of the world. Both community and House are impacted with the bridal shower, bachelor's party, followed by the wedding celebrated by Fr. Albert in the parish church.

Contradiction: In the midst of a five-week manouever with many things happening, the style of immediacy and experience of not much happening indicate that the underlying contradiction is inadequate manouevre imagery. (Wk 10)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS-CANO NEGRO HDP

External: Foro Comunitario in Rio Caribe with 189 registered is occasion for great celebration in village and metro. Cano Negro sends 2 residents out to help enable the foro. The arrival of the Economic Acceleration Team helps to launch the week of the "Cano Negro Commercial Garden." Nine Venezuelan Agricultural experts participate in this event and create a 10 page manual on how to grow papaya and squash. Four hectares of land are prepared for planting. A tree nursery is built in 2 days by the newly commissioned farm workers, and the week is capped off by a mock wedding between the community and the garden with the newly inked tractor arriving dressed up as a bride and 500 prepared bags of papaya seedlings as the groom. This was followed by a wild fiesta which lasted until the wee hours of the morning.

Internal: We welcome colleagues from Chicago who challenge our intents about effective village economy. We celebrate Thanksgiving as part of the House Church.

Contradiction: Keeping vehicles out of the garages and on the road. (Wk. 10)

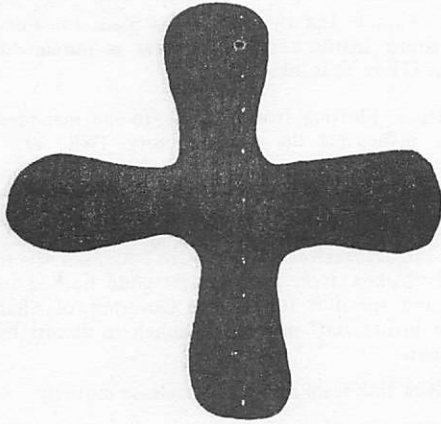

Internal: Care fir sekf (priorship training) and structure (office and painting) are infused with excitement in planning 12 days of Christmas Odyssey.

Contradiction: Finding the means whereby long-range plans become present reality rather than future dreams. (Wk. 11)

PARIS

Internal: Annex space arranged in monestary next door allows resettlement which houses all. Popcorn and Vin Chaud enable the celebrationg and trimming the Christmas tree.

Contradiction: Catching up all systems to missional edge. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

Two farm workdays clear land for expanded vegetable farm. GWF promotional materials are printed. Four more companies see possibility for their participation in Ijede HDP. Lions Club considers funding toward public lights and light industry. Apex Mills says yes to donating used equipment for heavy industry with John Holt ready to do repairs in inkind. Miracles occur in cement block factory, water tower and tank

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS-IJEDE HDP)

Internal: Garbage pit in back yard is dug out, readying House for another year of garbage removal.

Contradiction: Maximizing time in order to release possibilities. (Wk. 11)

BRUSSELS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS NEXUS

External: Two Nexus meetings are held following Continental Council pushing through implications for Quarter III and revealing requirements for ordinary and for extraordinary responses.

Contradiction: Focusing full attention on self-support and Development while continuing impact thrust. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: House hosts six Guardians for dinner. Adrie Nortier returns from six months in Kelapa Dua and is strong colleague. Follow-up visit and letters maintain development momentum for January.

Internal: Week II of scribbling and rug shampooing is climaxed by the Emerging Generation hanging the greens. Evenings are marked by corporate preparation for area council.

Contradiction: Pulling off a fine December without a clear picture of the victories of January. (Wk. 12)

FRANKFURT

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Old contacts are revived and new ones made in five different metro circuits. Two HRM dates and four core meetings for TM are set. Support is secured for the GSD campaign in the form of authorization, volunteer possibilities, Development and work camp possibilities.

Internal: Continental Council reveals new self-sufficiency and self-reliance on the part of Houses symbolized by the overwhelming relief experienced at adopting a Development and disbursement system which puts the burden and responsibility on individual Houses.

Contradiction: Tying up loose ends which block a coordinated and organized advance on all fronts into the next quarter. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: U.S. ambassador's visit to the Project is firmed up for December 27. Wednesday evening guild conversation is led by ofnc of the guilders, symbolizing the emerging decision of the community to take over the Project leadership.

External: Village Meeting training prepares all Zambian staff of ITI grads. GWF and LENS recruitment nets big fish. Community Development Officers and Shell/BP and Zambian State Insurance LENS ois on for Week 9. Wes Lachman returns from a four-week area Johannesburg circuit. ITI report and grad newsletter are completed.

Internal: Old cracked windows are replaced and bars over all windows express care for a newly registered organization in Zambia. New life is added to House with Peter Malabe interning. Wayside Inn dynamic takes place for Botswana Bible Training Institute staff. Fiat car is purchased and storage for ITI decor is inkinded.

Contradiction: Shifting from old one-to-one maneuvers to marketing maneuvers tha assure victory. (WK. 8)

Contradiction: Eliciting leadership style of affirmation. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DENVER

External: Campaign council builds Quarter III plan with emphasis on coloring Area San Francisco yellow and impact intensification. Development team on C nipaig 343 trek reports great victory.

Internal: Everyone works on TM report, a pull-together and evaluation of the 53 TMs held in Colorado during 1977.

Contradiction: Dealing with the Shristmas season roadblock in Development and TM Colorado report. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RAPID CITY--INYAN WAKAGAPI HDP

External: Toni Iron Road is star of Denver development trip which nets \$900 in hand, a serious commitment by Native American Resource Federation to enable Cannon Ball truck farm and Colorado's state treasurer deciding to use his clout to help with authorization. New equipment is installed in the cafe. Four CETA positions are awarded to the community which will bring \$27,000 into the community in wages for three day care teachers and one shopping center employee, enabling it to be open seven days a week.

Internal: Bells leave for Continental Council. Blizzard watches and bitterly cold weather slows things down, but auxiliary manages to actuate 90% of all tactics for the week. Harry and Lillian Swift Horse enjoy fried rabbit and ecclesiola study with auxiliary.

Contradiction: Moving beyond the tendency to hibernate during the bitterly cold weather. (Wk. 11)

EDMONTON**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EDMONTON**

External: All the House regathers after eight weeks of GCF maneuvers bringin continental and area council reports. Area council creates an economic task force and plans Quarter III maneuvers.

Internal: Fast day is occasion for Quarter III regional planning leading into tremendous Christmas celebration: tree secured and trimmed by Emering Generation, House decored and son of Claus appears with gifts for everyone.

Internal: House reports and plans on the other side of the new edges and indicatives of continental council.

Contradiction: Organizing internal systems to set the stage for January British Columbia maneuver. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ANCHORAGE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WINNIPEG--VOGAR HDP

External: Nine Community Forums, beginning of renovation of Vogar Community Hall, arrival of first meat in store and almost everyone gone to Forums, development or inkind makes for a scattered week. Winnipeg colleagues host maneuvers teams, development and inkind teams steadily for three weeks and occasions decision to form a self-conscious metro cadre. Baconridge, a neighboring Metis community, turns out 16% (50) of population for full-day Forum; 14 evening Forums are set up in one week, which nearly completes Manitoba. Inkind for ICA staff house and Community Forums rolls in.

Wood heater is installed in ICA house which causes high enough internal temperature (outside was -30 C) to tape seams and paint. Arrival of Eastern Bridge Maneuver team enlarges House Church to bursting point.

Contradiction: Giving practical form to the one thrust that the HDP and Forum maneuvers need to be in the midst of this kairotic moment. (Wk. 11)

Internal: Houston/Austin RS-1, PLC, Academy, CS-1, Town Meeting, LENS' grads stand side by side in a new comprehensive (Hong Kong) filing system. We all celebrate

the 1/3 completed list with in-kind pizza and music from a 40 foot organ.

Contradiction: Designing logistics so a two person maneuver is freed to concentrate on set-up. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMARILLO

External: Roby and Clarendon decisions bring total to nine TMs set for January.

Internal: Victory weekend opens with Christmas decor celebration and breakthrough in self-support with first secured job in wide-open apartment cleaning market and closes with House participation in Posada celebration.

Contradiction: Releasing winning plays in each huddle through instantaneous rehearsals of total game plan. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SAN ANTONIO

External: Four parish days this week complete the fall maneuver. Velia Limon, Father Joseph LaPauw and Tom Broersma join House, area and Centrum troops as orchestrators. Development proposals are submitted.

Internal: House inkind everything we need for western sector meeting.

Contradiction: Building a transrational model for Quarter III that allows for intensive local development. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TULSA - DELTA PACE HDP

External: New street signs routed and painted, posts up. Board of Aldermen names street in front of school "Joseph W. Internal: Thanksgiving dinner in Pace with Pacers and House followed on Friday night with a sector celebration where the Memphis, Pace and New Orleans Houses mixed to create

great Town Meeting dramas in Star Wars, Sesame Street, and Charlies' Angels.

Contradiction: Using holiday mindset to raise money for the mission. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MEMPHIS

External: Hardeman County looks to a Jan. Twon Meeting

Internal: Memphis House packs up and celebrates community Thanksgiving, a dinner theatre of stars and a workday of miracles in Delta Pace. December planning with New Orleans and Pace spurs new insights to complete the quarter's work.

Contradiction: Using the scheduled TM's and those already held for new hooks into last counties. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ATLANTA

External: Liggetts of Chattanooga pick up the responsibility for journeying 5 January dates. Town Meetings in SE Tenn. Roman Catholic sisters in Cumming set January date for Town Meeting. Invitations sent out for State Committee luncheon as House initiates the "Advent of Miracles" Maneuver.

External: Social acceleration team arrives on the heels of a fantastic community Thanksgiving Festival with 10 turkeys, greens, cornbread dressing and sweet potato pies.

Internal: Long Week II provides opportunity to winterize the House barely before the snow flies. Order Polity Document revitalizes common memory.

Contradiction: Pushing to the depths a series of key events which are scheduled almost one on top of the other. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WICHITA

Internal: Advent profoundly manifests its anticipation dynamic through Advent mailing when everyone keeps asking, "When are we finally going to get these things in the mail?"

Contradiction: Moving beyond old one-horse image of inking to produce a 22-car fleet. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: House braves snow and icy roads in 11-hour drive to area house for Week II maneuver writing session. Concrete plans are made for December house preparations for Quarter III maneuvers which will complete all the remaining counties in therea.

Internal: Saturday morning Daily Office and breakfast are great spirit happenings with all House members present for the first time in two months.

Contradiction: Releasing metro troops to enable a leap frogging into Quarter III before January 1.. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

288 External: Nelson Stover and Jan Ulangca participate in site selection of Social Demonstration site possibilities in New York.

Internal: Great Thanksgiving feast with whole of Rochester House present for the first time.

New leadership emerges out of very impacting event.

Internal: Advent cards and New Year's eve celebration invitations are mailed to region in anticipation of high celebration.

Contradiction: Sending Guardians to Consults while doing Area GCF and being responsible for continental TMs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Incredible Guardians Meeting for New York Area calls forth new leadership, as Don Richert is sent to Area Houston to do TMs in response to a grant for North Carolina.

Internal: Guardians Meeting celebration, with plans made for three more celebrations coming soon, making it clear we celebrate on ontological time.

Contradiction: Structuring serious assault on transportation needs. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Final county in New England turns gold with a Town Meeting. House sends out cards and New Year's Eve invitations to Religious Houses and metro colleagues.

Internal: The area council in New York determines the new focus and direction for Quarter III and is an exciting experience of corporateness and practical maneuver thinking.

Contradiction: Focusing on Quarter III and determining the necessary field maneuvers in New England. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

288 External: Metro guardians attend Area Meeting? two remain behind to orchestrate Sobleskill TM. Dorcas and Jeff Clithero complete set-up of remaining up-state counties and travel to NYC where they set up Putnam county. The House travels to Maine to help turn it gold.

Internal: Long needed update of House finances initiated. Logistics office recreated. Deann gives House Church witness on a week of Maine maneuvers.

Contradiction: House spending time responding to immediacies rather than longer-range priorities. (Wk 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Area team successfully yellows five district: in two-week Northern Ontario GCF maneuver.

Internal: Three House members are dispersed for area self-support maneuver. Half of House is in Ottawa, half is in Detroit.

Contradiction: Clarifying the image of Toronto House relocation strategy. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

288 External: Northern circuit team has 4 out of 5 counties with dates. River Valley in Nipissing county sends 25 of its 150 residents to Forum. All were in trapping, hunting or lumber businesses and three spoke English.

Internal: Reception for Marguerite LePage prior to India assignment allows old colleagues to get together for the first time in three quarters.

Contradiction: Appropriate contradiction. (Wk. 9)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

288, External: Lorne resident and ICA staff journey to nation's capitol to tell the Lorne de l'Acadie story and to further the financial undergirding of the project. In Lorne the ice-covered roof of the firehall is completed by bare-handed men in -10C weather.

Internal: The wedding of Tom Greyshock and Connie Moore is celebrated with parents coming from opposite sides of the world. Both community and House are impacted with the bridal shower, bachelor's party, followed by the wedding celebrated by Fr. Albert in the parish church.

Contradiction: In the midst of a five-week maneuver with many things happening, the style of immediacy and experience of not much happening indicate that the underlying contradiction is inadequate maneuver imagery. (Wk 10)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Foro Comunitario in Rio Caribe with 189 registered is occasion for great celebration in village and metro. Cano Negro send two residents out to help enable the Foro. The arrival of the Economic Acceleration Team helps to launch the week of the "Cano Negro Commercial Garden." Nine Venezuelan Agricultural experts participate in this event and create a 10-page manual on how to grow papaya and squash. Four hectares of land are prepared for planting. A tree nursery is built in two days by the newly commissioned farm workers, and the week is capped off by a mock wedding between the community and the garden with the newly inked tractor arriving dressed up as a bride and 500 prepared bags of papaya seedlings as the groom. This was followed by a wild fiesta which lasted until the wee hours of the morning.

Internal: House welcomes colleagues from Chicago who challenge intents about effective village economy and celebrates Thanksgiving as part of House Church.
