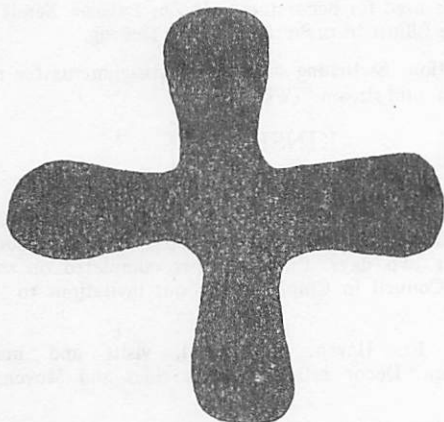

LONDON

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LONDON-ISLE OF DOGS HDP

External: Government authorities are pleased at proposal for all-Island family social club on river front site. Youth Action Corps begins training program and inkind 2,000 lbs. of materials for Power House. John Garnet, of industrial development advisory board, visits and approves first proofs of the board's brochure, a full-color brochure to attract new investment on the Isle of Dogs--inkind printing by British Petroleum.

Internal: Sends Michael Shaw and John Brown to Kwangyung II.

Contradiction: Raising the flags and banners that will consolidate the troops. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: One core and two sponsors' meetings set dates for autumn TMs.

Internal: Development push begins by targeting the first 236 charitable trusts with proposals going to press.

Contradiction: Asking for 236,000 pounds by Thursday in a discontinuous time of the year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Participates in first area maneuver in London; has two good authorization calls in Wales and recruits for summer program. Receives solid authorization letter from Ferndale TM coordinator.

Internal: Celebrates Chris Boivin's 16th birthday and plans summer of practical engagement for him following global model. Begins search for new House required for Fall.

Contradiction: Using next six weeks of summer when all fronts require attention. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Litherland and Lower Broughton TMs unfold with handbills out, inkind machinery humming. Hilary

Lindsey shows interest in participating in Termine project. Night club agrees to sale of \$500 worth of tickets for special night to fund TM. Steering committee builds to 27 for Week 3 in Lower Broughton.

Internal: Jean Taylor returns from four weeks in Termine. Dennis Miller visits as his U.S. naval vessel stops in Portsmouth for jubilee celebrations; Mr. and Mrs. Clark, from McCook, Nebraska, visit.

Contradiction: Lifting the direct burden of TM to the steering committee. (Wk. 13)

PARIS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PARIS

External: Forum Communautaire circuit, after a long gap between circuits, finds warm reception.

Internal: The move of the Paris House to its new location, 3 Rue d'Issy, Vanves is accomplished. Global corporate power is demonstrated with the help of Brussels Operations Centrum in form of Don McClain; Frankfurt House, Tim Dissmeyer; and Tom McClain, all helping in the move. Also Paul and Peter Clements, India, help in renovation.

Contradiction: Making turn from initial contact to follow-up in FCF. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: The THDP node opens on the central piazza and is filled every night; 40 come to doctor's talk. Space is claimed with 24 street signs and five shop signs.

Internal: Sends out the last of the consultants, also two to Korea and Chicago, and gets back the document writing squad.

Contradiction: Bridging the gap between the model and the accessible activating resources. (Wk. 1)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS -IJEDE HDP

External: First co-op meeting elicits exciting possibilities

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

Work day at the spring sees 150 Ijedians participating. Governor visits to dedicate new courthouse. Proposal for Fishermen's Warehouse is submitted to government. "Welcome to Ijede" sign is erected on bus stop. Mailing for Community Training Institute to be held on August 21-September 2 in Ijede is mailed and area-wide circuit begins.

Internal: Sends out Loeppkes to North America, Richard Kitney to Korea. Richard Poresky, wandering hospital administrator, returns to help set up health system.

Contradiction: Taking all of the many plans for Ijede and focusing them anew. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS**GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS**

External: Continental task force comes together in Brussels to put wheels on GRA '77.

Internal: Mark Poole arrives from Bayad for one day. Dramatic space transformation happens as GRA '77 prep continues.

Contradiction: Discerning the focus of the GRA in the midst of many continental priorities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Inkind from Kraft & CPC Knorr Soup for Summer GRA.

Internal: Collegium on GRA content breaks loose concrete images. Brenda Gilmour returns from Termine after 3 1/2 week absence.

Contradiction: Doing a TM in neighborhood that will trigger TM across Benelux. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Does maneuver research in beach-head. Sends Anja Bos to orchestrate Essen TM. Two surprise visits, one from a consultant at Lorne De L'Acadie and one who drops in to see if he can volunteer for a year at Isle of Dogs, surprise all.

Internal: Wayside Inn sees House full to bursting point as hosts five people over Week II, one couple on way to Kelapa Dua, another couple on way to spend honeymoon as volunteers in El Bayad, and Rick Robinson, from Iowa.

Contradiction: Continuing the long-term models that will finally create order in midst of accumulated chaos. (Wk. 13)

FRANKFURT**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT**

External: Singing is agreed upon as the key dynamic of TM in Essen-Dellwig. Addressograph-Multigraph supplies photocopy machine for document production and anything else needed to be photocopied. Follow-up consultation to TM in the Schwarze Heide reveals willingness to write letters for authorization and to be a task force for refining workbook. Two excellent press releases report on Schwarze Heide TM.

Internal: Office and files are totally redone. Tim Dissmeyer is off again, this time to assist in preparation for GRA '77 in Brussels. Nathan Oyler graduates from kindergarten.

Contradiction: Recruiting people who have participated in TMs to the GRA in Europe. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Final touches come to the Park as asphalt is laid and benches put in place. Instantly, Park becomes a bee hive of activity by young and old. Moving guild meetings to Kreuzberg Ost Centrum, street level, attracts new guildsmen. Possibility arises of community purchasing a 40-apartment house with four businesses in Falckensteinstr gives totally new economic thrust to the project.

Internal: Transforms living room into art gallery when 7,000 marcs worth of art is delivered by a local Kreuzberg lady to be used for decorating Cafe Zur Laterne. Sends out Mary Jane Elliott to orchestrate TM in Dellwig.

Contradiction: Switching commission assignments for next quarter in mid-stream. (Wk. 1)

KINSHASA**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP**

External: Launches circuits to all metros on every third week basis. Development trip to Copperbelt nets \$1000 in hand after two days. Cabinet paper completed on shop. Christian Council in Chipata mails out invitations to "TI Day".

Internal: Fr. Haven, PLC grad, visits and makes contribution. Decor reflects circuit rides and Movement building.

Contradiction: Building the airtight model for doing the ITI with only two people in House. (Wk. 1)

CAIRO**RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD-EL BAYAD HDP**

External: Signal Friday workday moves the water trench digging way down the road, indicating a shift in community participation, with over 75 adult men involved, many of whom started working before we arrived on site. Community Association becomes registered, which allows for truck receipt. Literacy examination is taken by 120 with results appearing to be successful.

Internal: Boivins celebrate 30th wedding anniversary. Aaron Nelson is two years old.

Contradiction: Daring to do hard tactics when the door is open in spite of own doubts. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI**GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP**

External: Barclays Bank gives first three installments of US \$63,057.27 in ceremony in Square with Kenya Police Band providing the music. More intense guardian engagement through mini-consult at first monthly working lunch.

Internal: Celebration follows Barclays Bank presentation for Nexus and Area House and management gets door handles and leaking sinks fixed.

Contradiction: Turning Barclays funding into a trend and not a one time happening. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Three more Village Meetings in this week stretch workshop leaders and decor materials. Twenty by the end of the quarter are assured. Swahili and English VM posters move from artwork (inkind) to printer (inkind) with Kodak doing camera work in between, inkind, of course.

Internal: Jean Miller takes last exam at University of Nairobi and secures supplementary job at Geri's office

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI)

while she attends Priors' Council August Assembly '77 planning moves from theoretical to practical with six registered, first sponsorship developed, vice-president's office and western province MP endorsements, as well as initial inkind victories.

Contradiction: Doing training that releases faith stance. (Wk. 1)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Development blitz, including two members of Global Health Acceleration team, sends out three teams daily covering 25 pharmaceutical companies. RS 20,000.00 loan, the first part of RS 50,000.00 loan sanctioned to Kendur Dairy Society for purchase of cows.

Internal: House walls come close to bursting following council as receive seven families, Vikas, George Wambugu, Liz Marquis, Ronald and Selveena Powell, Juliette and Maxine, Roger and Teresa Butcher, Adam and Gayle and Paul Thompson. Celebrates Ram Chandra Bhosure's 18th birthday.

Contradiction: Sustaining the ongoing back-up and long range vision in midst of being swallowed up by short term 'blitz' assignment. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Commissions health caretakers in Maliwada. Staff returns from two Consults, Uti and Shelgaon.

Internal: Cycles 100 people through Bombay House, to and from villages, and Chicago Centrum. Health TM's nutrition collegium reveals daily diet contains a surplus of protein but a deficiency in calories.

Contradiction: Creating troop, time, task flow model which will take advantage of the complex, ever-changing swirls in the Bombay House. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: Global Women's Forum held in Nasile, a Vaviharsh village. Village continues Shramadan on Sunday digging pits for village forestation drive with mango trees.

Internal: The whole auxiliary travels to Maliwada for the quarterly Council. VHDP has the great honor of deputing P.T. Jamlekar as Project Director to VTI village, Desmond Balm as Project Director to Vandapur village, Vikas Khare to Bombay on the Development Centrum and Anand Warne to Shelgaon village as project back up. Receive Napoleon Mwithiao from Kawangware HDP as auxiliary member in Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Re-assigning old and new troops to effectively move this coming quarter after having the most experienced staff pulled out. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR-KENDUR HDP

External: Holds two successful Global Women's Forums, one at Poona City and the other at Kendur. Sent out ten farmers for the agriculture training program. Visits were made for development and the authorization.

Internal: The House was busy in the preparation for the Global Women's Forum. The auxiliary joins the village for celebration. Receives new interns.

Contradiction: Keeping engaged with the project work in the village when most of the troops are out for development and authorization visits. (Wk.10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (work day) on repairing old temple, steps,

cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara District capital city. Completes village consensus and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and inkind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden is prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James, arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channeling some of the raw enthusiasm and energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Indignation of Movement indicated by troops paying their own travel to consults.

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk.7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Five dry land farming experts offer 15 acres of soil for demonstration crop-growing. Mr. Chellapa, The chairman of ICA:India visits NDHP and grants 2 bore well diggings. Preschool children receive equipment for study and play, and uniforms are being made ready. Intensive recruitment for Global Women's Forum is on.

Internal: Receives the Global Women's Forum faculty. Mr. Surrender Reddy gave a fantastic address during the breakfast collegium in Nadlapur.

Contradiction: Being clear on Guild/Stake operations. (Wk.5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: HDP site selection trek continues in Sarawak near Sibu and Kapit with exciting reports being sent in by Hays. HDP bulletin mailed telling the story of Sungai Lui.

Internal: Visit by Maryknoll Father from the Phillipines, Jim Pfeffer, as he seeks methodology for working with local communities, and leaves excited, planning to visit Sungai Lui and Kelapa Dua. Sun Tzu study enhanced by military

colleagues lending an air of practicality. Nan and Bill Grow arrive from the Philippines on their way to Jakarta ITI.

Contradiction: Unclear vision of next stage of development. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGGAI LUI HDP

External: Thirty village heads from all over Malaysia visit the project site as part of their course. Has celebrations and cultural dances in conjunction with the visit. Preschool goes on an outing with the 60 children to visit an aboriginal village. Youth Meeting is held with about 80-90 youths participating. Trash bins are placed all over the village to upkeep cleanliness. Rice planting nears completion. Completes 40 vegetable gardens and plants vegetables. Inkinds timber logs to build bridges.

Internal: Tim Lush and Joe Hays arrive in from Jakarta to meet Joe Mathews. Staff goes out on a picnic to the local waterfall and spends whole Sunday morning, including lunch outside. Had a splendid time!

Contradiction: Effecting willing guardians and colleagues. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Village meeting elects a core group to work on plans for the use of all the land in Nam Wai. First meeting, three days later, reveals new leadership. Pig farmer decides to use pig manure drying process offered by agriculture and fisheries department, as part of a plan to improve sanitation, use of land and smell.

Internal: Sends Andrew Howell out to new assignment in Sudtonggan after two week's participation in family life and Nam Wai HDP. Centrum provides needed troop power and extends electricity, allowing installation of fans.

Contradiction: Discerning key to corporateness within over-individualistic images of social change. (Wk. 13)

HONG KONG

GLOBAL CENTRUM: HONG KONG-NAM WAI HDP

External: Initial English class begins with over 60; preschool registers 75 out of potential 80 with average attendance 60-70 and neighboring village asks if their kids can come too; three villagers and Sims go to Taipei for development. Weekly garbage service begins.

Internal: Dragon Boat festival brings many guests to House, all bearing "tsang-dz", the traditional rice wrapped in bamboo leaves, around 300 of them. Sends out three: Doug to World's Fair, Pat for visa renewal in Hong Kong, Peggy to Taipei for E.G. exams.

Contradiction: Discovering villagers are short of exit requirements for any international travel. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HONG KONG

External: Preschool opens with ten children and grows each day. Health Day is great success as 100 children are seen by doctors. Colgate Palmolive, Johnson & Johnson, Nestles Corporation are among the sponsors of the day. NHDP Training Center is completed with outside of House having Chinese and English lettering saying Nam Wai HDP Center. Gives Chinese document to villagers; they report it to be better than the English one.

Internal: Guests from Philippines met by one of House permeators come to Nam Wai and cook fantastic Filipino dinner.

Contradiction: Changing low visibility of present actualization. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KAOHSIUNG-HAI OU HDP

External: Action week sees villagers on trips to provincial commission of agriculture, county mayor and reconstruction officer, district office of civil affairs and nearby school principal. District Pond Engineer and Ching Fa net company come for visit; a new road is promised; 60 attend again for English, with one new preschool teacher.

Internal: Sends Dillinger to Hong Kong to renew visa. Hosts Kaohsiung college students; impacted by Stonewall "No Sleep/Sleep" reading.

Contradiction: Capturing kyrotic and chronological moments in community life when planning the week's activities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Ben and Hale Prather and the Quimbys depart for World's Fair. Entertains Huntington Harris, Chairman of the Advisory Committee Voluntary Foreign Aid; submits 32,000 pesos in six proposals.

Internal: Builds quarter timeline, followed by a celebration, "The Contradictions Costume Cabaret".

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Development calling intensifies and includes a team of three villagers and one auxiliary coming to Taipei for calls to provincial offices and businesses. Receives grant of \$10,000 NT for Hai Ou kindergarten, marking beginning of harvest from recent proposals.

Internal: Sends out three Johnson, four Hsus and one Sung to World's Fair and GRA in two days time. Table is still filled with guests and visitors from Hai Ou HDP and metro.

Contradiction: Creating models for bringing yet-unknown order to an unfamiliar chaos. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CEBU-SUDTONGGAN HDP

External: Makes a field trip with 15 mothers to visit Opon Emergency Hospital malnutrition ward, as a part of continuing health education. Eighty children are enrolled in preschool, 26 in grade I and 40 in grade II for the new school year.

Internal: Sends out Elsa Batica to Manila and Nancy, David and Thomas Prather to GRA. The Quimbys and the Osborns visit Sudtonggan. Three key community families participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Wiping out inertia. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DAVAO

External: Buena Vista sets GCF date for August 27.

Internal: New rain water tank to catch drinking water is installed and working.

Contradiction: Keeping from being overwhelmed and paralyzed by catalyzing troops. (Wk. 13)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Joseph Iida, key Movement colleague, makes second planning visit to Oyubari site, and reduced travel fares are inkinded for consultants. Authorization support letters for ICA registration continue to come in.

Internal: McCleskys and Allerdings pause on way to Oyubari HDP Consult, and impact the House with summary of African and Asian HDPs.

Contradiction: Making sure that concern over details of the Oyubari consult do not blind us to the certainty of the intended victory. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU -KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Many pieces of the puzzle are fitting as we experience new buildings, roofing ceremonies, water and electricity in all new buildings. All official blocks are removed, as evidenced by the daily arrival of black jeeps in the village and extra work troops from the ROK navy and Jeju City High Schools.

Internal: Ends camping out in the Training Center by turning on the plumbing for flush toilets and showers just in time to receive many members from the Seoul House who came to assist in World's Fair prep. The Training Center is becoming a community node and the tables are always overflowing with construction workers and other guests.

Contradiction: Fitting the remaining pieces of the puzzle together to enable the 25th. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

External: Two-hour meeting with Sae Maul Undong leader breaks open government authorization for the World's Fair. Signal visits to Kwangyung II of Kang Byoung Hoon and other keeps the momentum building for World's Fair. Trip to Chunchon sets up ITI steering committee which takes over the practical prep. World's Fair is go as remaining contradiction of plaza land is solved, while Governor Chang shows his enthusiasm for the happening. Global Women's Forum trek is completed in Seoul with 30 women leaders participating.

Internal: Sends Lee Jae Joon and Choi Jong Shik to Academy in Chicago. Last ecclesiola is highlighted with slides of the Sae Maul Undong Movement in Korea. Mr. Hong Nam Pyo begins his intern year as a student at the National University, son of regional colleagues. Jana Salmon graduates with honors from sixth grade.

Contradiction: Shortening timeline and actualizing promises. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FUKUOKA

External: Oyubari Consult is a natural for development. Troops hear yeses as they tell the story to students and colleagues.

Internal: Inkind clothes dryer arrives just in time for rainy season. Personnel return from Oyubari HDP brings many exciting stories.

Contradiction: Taking hold of the summer before old summer images strangle all. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OSAKA

External: Successfully manage first step to incorporation with the help of guild members and the signing of 50 people as members of the Shadan Jojin (ICA in Japan).

Internal: The Guild is growing again, but only to four as we continue dialogue with Sun Tzu.

Contradiction: Finding the spring rains have filled up the River of Consciousness and the boat has termites. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

External: Two trips into Sapporo yield visits with Professor Kitamura of Hokkaido University who promises two days participation in the Oyubari HDP consultation plus introductions. Longtime colleague Fr. Joseph Iida receives personal invitation and visit with Mayor of Yubari City to discuss upcoming Oyubari HDP.

Internal: House receives Father Gudalefsky, Sr. Benedice, Father Lucky and Mr. Aoki for first House Church visit as

culmination to week's activities of preparation. Shaws, Denise Quimby arrive via guild transportation system.

Contradiction: Lining up the concrete tasks for the consult preparation committees. (Wk.12)

SYDNEY

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SYDNEY

External: Visits to federal local member of Parliament, director of Italian community and ethnic radio and sister to the Lebanese Consult, speaks enthusiastically for CMA.

Internal: Youth collegium workshops possibilities for Area Sydney and Seapac, Youth summer, missional program. Barry Oakley returns from area team maneuver to Oombulgurri, traveling by car for 8000 miles, breaking tyranny of distance, and reports exciting progress and a focusing of six breakloose maneuvers.

Contradiction: Being able to follow up possibilities to ensure concrete progress. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PERTH

External: New Era Aboriginal Fellowship committee is excited by Oombulgurri story and agrees to release trust funds for promotion of arts and sport.

Internal: Packs books to send to Oombulgurri and pull together service club data for area coordination.

Contradiction: Being about one task when everything seems disrelated. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DARWIN

External: Secures 2000 feet of timber for Oombulgurri housing. Letter from United Church of North Australia Aboriginal Training officer requests Maliwada document.

Internal: Oombulgurri evaluation points toward need for replication model and phasing out timeline.

Contradiction: Being positive that Oombulgurri is the symbol of future of human development in Australia and the world and affirming it. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OOMBULGURRI-OOMBULGURRI HDP

External: Hard economic miracles are actualized with the arrival of a walk-in cool room and a freezer along with the first grain sorghum harvest of 40 acres and the second week of fresh locally produced pork in the store.

Internal: Hosts Aboriginal Legal Service who talked with the community about future mining contracts.

Contradiction: Finding the opening that breaks through the peer pressure that paralyzes engagement. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ADELAIDE

External: Visits to mayors in seven communities result in yeses for Community Meeting. Divides into four circuits to implement the task of setting up ten community meetings on one day. Youth conference held in Gawler, a direct spin-off of TMA. Gawler results in formation of ongoing youth committee. Identifies troikas in Campbelltown, Barossa Valley and Tea Tree Gully.

Internal: House does workshop on global assignment recommendations. 4 of 10 Adelaide Summer program participants available for global assignment. 15 people attend slide night on 3 April CMAs. Experience Australian Dance Theatre for Ecclesiola and celebrate Wegners' anniversary with house dance.

Contradiction: Breaking through the mass set-up of CM when old one-by-one method seems to be working well. (Wk.1)

Contradiction: Struggling with how to keep everything going. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: "Summer Discovery" program begins with 25 6-12 year old Ivy City participants. Project sends out 24 to Kwangyung II, Fifth City, Vogar, New York and TM New Jersey. Ivy City representative meets with Mayor Washington to give six month report and generates excitement about funding assistance.

Internal: Expands auxiliary's consciousness and gets all out of parochialism as Doug Wilson is sent to E.G. camp, Cheh Cheeng gives collegium on Korea and 75% of House participates in New Jersey and TM campaign.

Contradiction: Releasing core leadership as well as community masses to sense the significance of the victory that we are in midst of and not trapped in failure mentality. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Send out 5 to Summer program at New Jersey Assembly report night. 4 participate in Ivy City workday. 2 go to New Jersey TM Assembly.

Internal: Send out Ellen Howie to camp and Jim Meyers to GRA. Assign Roy Kauer to GRA on the way back from Vogar.

Contradiction: Discerning how to move strategically during July, with mass impact campaign timelined for next Spring. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: New Jersey Town Meeting Assembly happens with 180 people demanding a network of those who care, and continued accountability after the assembly. New York Times reporter stays all day.

Internal: The day after the state campaign is over, summer hits with new house decor, return of the Gilberts and Tom Price from India, children leaving for camp, and area strategy session planning state campaigns for '77-78.

Contradiction: Not waiting until Fall quarter to put into the works the crucial insights relative to authorization and funding discovered from this state campaign.(Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: TM:New Jersey campaign launched June 1 at Somerset County Jail. Area orchestrating forces arrive for 15 TMs to be doubled and then quadrupled in coming weekends. Over 83 newspapers across the state are covering the event; 10,000 document covers are inkinded. June 4 celebration at the Area House has most appropriate theme of "New Jersey Firsts".

Internal: Claudia Haman is special guest for the week and May Wilson, Judy Lindblatt, and Dorcus Rose arrive for week on the road. Sends out Smyres to Oyubari and then Kwangyung II. Arnold family is caught up by TM:NJ and decide to spend vacation in Lorne HDP.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK)

Contradiction: Catching the wave of momentum that builds attendance and development into the Assembly. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Participates in TM:New Jersey Assembly in Trenton, winding up TM:NJ campaign while rest of troops recruit for GRA.

Internal: After New Jersey campaign, troops return to Brooklyn and celebrates as a House, first House Church since beginning of Quarter IV.

Contradiction: Releasing people to participate in Summer '77 with one week left. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Does summer recruitment, preparation for summer. House attends "Toward Tomorrow Fair", future fair at University of Massachusetts at Amherst (agriculture, solar heating, dry toilets, for displays), a picnic in Northampton Park and then Fishels stop by and share watermelon.

Internal: Gordon Major family visits for the week from Toledo, Ohio, on way to vacation in New Hampshire. Randell and Russell White depart for camp with pizza party. Sees movie, "New York, New York", a great film.

Contradiction: Preparing for the Fall without pre-empting summer decisions and results. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY

External: Whole House and most of the metro goes to New Jersey for third week of Town Meetings. Ten adults and 3 youth orchestrate and enable 12 TMs and the celebration.

Internal: Wild TM:New Jersey celebration in Morristown followed by evaluation and Area House Church focus the New Jersey campaign and set imaginations spinning about what it would mean to do a New York state campaign.

Contradiction: Translating excitement over New Jersey TMs and Schenectady 10 TMs followup into registrations for Summer '77. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Summer '77 recruitment continues and reminds all that a new quarter is approaching.

Internal: After three weeks of chaos in the halls and on the stairs, the reconstruction is finished and the halls are clean and ready for guests, with a brand-new room.

Contradiction: Turning maybe's and considering into yeses and registrations for GRA. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Review of pre-coordinator and coordinator meetings in the Eastern Townships leads House to hold a mini forum at which we are unexpectedly honored with a real live resident of one of the township communities. Forum pushes all to rework strategy for townships.

Internal: Experiences French Canadian culture in food, language and community celebrations, with folk singing and dancing in the Olympic stadium and parks and a mass in Notre Dame Cathedral with over 100 parish priests concelebrating.

Contradiction: Keeping forums covered and not allowing summer fever to take over. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TORONTO

External: Regional colleague takes over leadership for Etobicoke Forum push.

Internal: Sends out Keller family. Jennifer Robins graduates to high school. More guests show up for House Church than House members, with all deciding to go to GRA and one to Lorne for summer.

Contradiction: Keeping momentum up for Etobicoke forums. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Development troops storm the Seaway, Peterborough and the Capital to locate dollars and one Summer Programme registration.

Internal: Hosted development team and spent Saturday night at the movies.

Contradiction: Keeping up internal and external momentum when troops are minimal. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX-LORNE DE L'ACADIE HDP

External: Week long Handcrafts PSU recovers 3 traditional arts. Two cabarets, back-to-back, earn over \$1200 for Lorne de L'Acadie Fire Protection Program, as newer fire truck arrives, while need for protection is accentuated by two fires in three days, one destroying nearby Jacquet River school, affecting area school availability.

Internal: Spirit analysis collegium on the community causes deep reflection. Auxiliary is impacted by evening conversation on Bonhoeffer's "Ministry of Holding One's Tongue", from Life Together. Welcomes sojourner Marina Gerbin from Montreal, and one-day visits by four nuns from Plaster Rock, N.B., and the Drown family, guardians from Indianapolis.

Contradiction: Raising need start-up capital for economic development, which is slowing down needed engagement in the community. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Fourth Latin American ITI closes sending grads back to their respective countries preparing to do HDPs. Faculty does mini-Ur images course for 25 Cano Negro villagers. Fence goes up around community garden after lone pig threatens to eat all the crops. First garden harvest comes in of red and white radish. Fifty youth descend on garden to weed and care for it.

Internal: Fr. Don McNamara, pastor of the Tapipa parish, invites staff and auxiliary to farewell party for ITI staff including steak and all the trimmings.

Contradiction: Intensifying development. (Wk.1)

GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT CENTRUM

Global Development Centrum reports breaklooses from Canberra: the Bank of New South Wales sent \$500 for GSD. Guardians begin to send in money following the Guardians' Meeting with Dr. Dick Porter sending in \$500 from Perth. Waltons is the second company to give money on a CMA proposal, heralding new possibilities for Development. A task force team is sent to Oombulgurri to prepare for the Freedom from Hunger visit in late June, on which depends \$75,000. Brussels reports gifts from Chase Manhattan and others, building a base of \$1500 per month for Bayad support. Hong Kong reports low cost ticketing acquired from KAL for Nam Wai for the World's Fair, as well as Hai Ou through CAL. In Chicago, extra troops from the Houses have increased development during the GRA. The contradiction lies in the arena of building the summer battleplan and coordinating hot spots, stories, and extra troops to raise the needed money.

GLOBAL RESEARCH CENTRUM

Global Research Centrum reports from Hong Kong that the Oyubari Consult closed and the writing week began - the fifth HDP for Area Hong Kong. Canberra Centrum does local research and finds a restaurant with a band for the Priors' Council Sunday night celebration. Marketing possibilities for the Marshalls are found in Melbourne and Perth through contacts at the Guardians' Meeting. Task Forces from the continent begin to implement GRA '77 Brussels acceleration. Over 700 attend the opening feast of GRA Chicago. Highlights of the first week are the 6.30 collegiums on the three campaigns, practical task force work, the 9.00 interlude on the 2nd floor Victory Plaza amid the potted plants, fountain and wicker furniture, as well as the innovative, inexpensive, dietary menus at every meal. The contradiction lies in the arena of being the corporate interpreter of the significance of Movemental events.

GLOBAL OPERATIONS CENTRUM

Global Operations Centrum reports from Hong Kong of doing ticketing for everyone to the World's Fair. The Area Sydney Priors' Council builds a timeline for nation-wide explosion of CMAs in Australia. Canberra receives word of a strategy in Newcastle to cluster 6 CMAs in one day. Excitement is already generating here for January '78 Community Training School for doing state campaigns for CMA. Brussels begins this year's resettlement with ticketing of the Gilmours to India. Report on Bayad by Mark Poole and India replication by Neil Vance in Brussels celebrates the week of the 23rd and 24th HDPs. Task Forces at GRA Chicago on GSD and GCF become operational, focusing of the year's practical engagement of troops, while visa work and ticketing in anticipation of resettlement begins. The contradiction lies in the arena of assuring no summer slowdown in the HDPs and GCF.

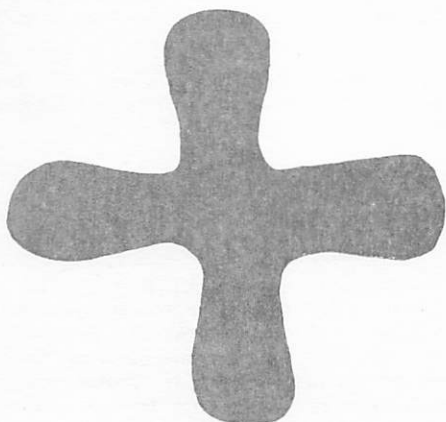
GLOBAL MANAGEMENT CENTRUM

Internal: Alison John sojourns as part of her training to be a social worker. Receives 6 pounds a day for her training program. Michael Shaw returns from Kwangyung II. Experiences dispersion as 6 are gone to GRAs.

Contradiction: Sustaining momentum on all programs amidst intensifying stake action. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: One core and two sponsors' meetings set dates for autumn TMs.

Internal: Development push begins by targeting the first 236 charitable trusts with proposals going to press.

Contradiction: Asking for 236,000 pounds by Thursday in a discontinuous time of the year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Participates in first area maneuver in London; has two good authorization calls in Wales and recruits for summer program. Receives solid authorization letter from Ferndale TM coordinator.

Internal: Celebrates Chris Boivin's 16th birthday and plans summer of practical engagement for him following global model. Begins search for new House required for Fall.

Contradiction: Using next six weeks of summer when all fronts require attention. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANCHESTER

External: Sends Larry Greenwald to Brussels Research Assembly. Litherland TM takes significant step forward as churches and organizations join in registration drive and promise reinforcements to steering committee.

Global corporate power is demonstrated with the help of Brussels Operations Centrum in form of Don McClain; Frankfurt House, Tim Dissmeyer; and Tom McClain, all helping in the move. Also Paul and Peter Clements, India, help in renovation.

Contradiction: Making turn from initial contact to follow-up in FCF. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME-TERMINE HDP

External: Termine citizens for the HDP, as steering committees, finds housing for consultants, women work on menus, and local men take ICA to the mayor.

Internal: Mark Poole arrives from Bayad for one day. Dramatic space transformation happens as GRA '77 prep continues.

Contradiction: Discerning the focus of the GRA in the midst of many continental priorities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Begins framing and steering committee recruitment with daily visits to residents of St. Gilles commune.

Internal: Sends out Brenda, Alexa and Ramona Gilmour to visit family before assuming role in India GSD replication.

Contradiction: Exploiting the advantages already gained in order to break through Belgian suspiciousness about TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

Internal: Father Brychcy, a Jesuit priest, spends weekend at House, planning a three-week program in August for his Christian Life Community here in Kreuzberg Ost. This will

be one of the Jesuits' first attempts of designing a new mission program of the CLC.

Contradiction: Re-imaging the auxiliary's role in the second year of the project. (Wk. 2)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA-SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Launches circuits to all metros on every third week basis. Development trip to Copperbelt nets \$1000 in hand after two days. Cabinet paper completed on shop. Christian Council in Chipata mails out invitations to "ITI Day".

Internal: Fr. Haven, PLC grad, visits and makes contribution. Decor reflects circuit rides and Movement building.

Contradiction: Building the airtight model for doing the ITI with only two people in House. (Wk. 1)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Signal Friday workday moves the water trench digging way down the road, indicating a shift in community participation, with over 75 adult men involved, many of whom started working before we arrived on site. Community Association becomes registered, which allows for truck receipt. Literacy examination is taken by 120 with results appearing to be successful.

Internal: Boivins celebrate 30th wedding anniversary. Aaron Nelson is two years old.

Contradiction: Daring to do hard tactics when the door is open in spite of own doubts. (Wk. 1)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI-KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Auxiliary and 40 community residents spend Week II battleplanning for the coming quarter ending with work day in Muslim. Pours floor for metal training shop and COMARTKA moves to a larger more centrally located facility.

Internal: Nelson Njenga is received as intern.

Contradiction: Enabling the journey begun in Week II battleplanning as the burden of doing it closes in. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Last minute VM spins off to one more, the 16th in Kenya; 7 of 8 provinces are done! Young employed colleague, Humphrey Maina, takes vacation from work and pays own way on circuit ride. (GLOBAL CENTRUM BOMBAY)

loan, the first part of RS 50,000.00 loan sanctioned to Kendur Dairy Society for purchase of cows.

Internal: House walls come close to bursting following council as receive seven families, Vikas, George Wambugu, Liz Marquis, Ronald and Selveena Powell, Juliette and Maxine, Roger and Teresa Butcher, Adam and Gayle and Paul Thompson. Celebrates Ram Chandra Bhosure's 18th birthday.

Contradiction: Sustaining the ongoing back-up and long range vision in midst of being swallowed up by short term 'blitz' assignment. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Commissions health caretakers in Maliwada. Staff returns from two Consults, Uti and Shelgaon.

Internal: Cycles 100 people through Bombay House, to and from villages, and Chicago Centrum. Health TM's nutrition collegium reveals daily diet contains a surplus of protein but a deficiency in calories.

Contradiction: Creating troop, time, task flow model which will take advantage of the complex, ever-changing swirls in the Bombay House. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH-VAVIHARSH HDP

External: Global Women's Forum held in Nasile, a Vaviharsh village. Village continues Shramadan on Sunday digging pits for village forestation drive with mango trees.

Internal: The whole auxiliary travels to Maliwada for the quarterly Council. VHDP has the great honor of deputing P.T. Jamlekar as Project Director to VT1 village, Desmond Balm as Project Director to Vandapur village, Vikas Khare to Bombay on the Development Centrum and Anand Warne to Shelgaon village as project back up. Receive Napoleon Mwithiao from Kawangware HDP as auxiliary member in Vaviharsh.

Contradiction: Re-assigning old and new troops to effectively move this coming quarter after having the most experienced staff pulled out. (Wk. 10)

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk.7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Five dry land farming experts of 15 acres of soil for demonstration crop-growing. Mr. Chellapa, The chairman of ICA:India visits NDHP and grants 2 bore well diggings. Preschool children receive equipment for study and play, and uniforms are being made ready. Intensive recruitment for Global Women's Forum is on.

Internal: Receives the Global Women's Forum faculty. Mr. Surrender Reddy gave a fantastic address during the breakfast collegium in Nadlapur.

Contradiction: Being clear on Guild/Stake operations. (Wk.5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

External: HDP site selected in Sarawak with JWM and Tim Lush; Sungai Aupban Iban Longhouse located near Sibul. Hosts ITI participants, Seoul Fair participants and Michael Smith, Sungai Lui sojourner, on journeys.

Internal: Sends Joe Hays to ITI Bandung, Indonesia, Julie Hays for Development in Jakarta, and Erica Hays to Sungai Lui, and sends out sojourner, Robert O'Keefe, to USA via Bangkok.

Contradiction: Doing development with all troops assigned out. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KUALA LUMPUR-SUNGAI LUI HDP

Internal: Sends Dillinger to Hong Kong to renew visa. Hosts Kaohsiung college students; impacted by Stonewall "No Sleep/Sleep" reading.

Contradiction: Capturing kyrotic and chronological moments in community life when planning the week's activities. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MANILA

External: Ben and Hale Prather and the Quimbys depart for World's Fair. Entertains Huntington Harris, Chairman of the Advisory Committee Voluntary Foreign Aid; submits 32,000 pesos in six proposals.

Internal: Builds quarter timeline, followed by a celebration, "The Contradictions Costume Cabaret".

Contradiction: Maintaining momentum. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

Contradiction: Finding and re-telling the significating story that frees all from despair and paralysis of the July syndrome. (Wk. 2)

TOKYO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TOKYO

External: Oyubari HDP Consult ends and writing of the document is completed.

Internal: Joseph Mathews visits Japan. Many guests are hosted. Centrum development trek begins.

Contradiction: Finding the Oyubari HDP in being, seeing that a new year is beginning, having no quarter planning, done. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU--KWANGYUNG IL HDP

Internal: Celebrates July 4th with picnic, watermelon seed spitting contest (won by John McCabe-42' 8") and fireworks, followed by week's focus on dynamics of priorship.

Contradiction: Remembering that the local TM campaign is the life and death struggle. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KANSAS CITY

External: Sent out TM coordinator to Vogar consult. Three TMs same weekend. Rhoda Ertel reviewed Health trek slide show. Guardians meet and decide on development proposals for summer program. Are agency on aging consult invitations produce six area responses in four days. After

two successfully completed.

Internal: School is out and EG morning work projects begin and afternoon swimming. No hot water offers training dynamic for global assignment. Ivenhoe demonstration TM releases food supply for rest of summer.

Contradiction: Keeping Missouri TM campaign moving at same time of summer program and self-support push. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MINNEAPOLIS

External: Breakthrough in summer battleplanning methods enables seeing the indicative in relation to flexible models plans Minnesota Future Day celebration pulls together state of the state. Will Balough, Town Meeting Man, a live band and 60 colleagues celebrate five months of expenditure and teh launch of Minnesota Future Day. Lois Polari from the Governor's office suggests the skit go on the road and appear at a large training session for workers throughout the state. 'It's the best tool I've seet showing the need for local participation and grass roots planning.

Internal: Welcomes Mary Alice Smalls from Brussels Centrum. Has Laurel and Hardy movies celebrate absurdity in midst of summer battleplanning. Sun Tzu grounded in practical action of development. Internal: Chaos is subdued as both office and basement become workable areas instead of morass of boxes.

Contradiction: Maintaining Xavior posture in midst of wild dreams about future assignments. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Corporation development continues; receives \$800 from Louis Allis and Rexnord Corporations. Report on Termine Consult brings out 40 colleagues for the evening. Addressograph Multilith prints TM Assembly document.

Internal: Helen gets assigned to prior the GRA kitchen; E.G. leave for camp. The third floor is prepared for the building inspector.

Contradiction: Doing needed planning. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Five attend Global Women's Forum in Evanston, Illinois, including YWCA program director, who agrees to set one up in Indianapolis in the Fall. The CIF in Louisville draws 200 and catalyzes new authorization in LEAA in Jefferson County. Sends Barbara Schwartz to Vogar Consult and Gary and Pat Drown to Lorne De L'Acadie. Dennis Kelly returns from Termine Consult.

Internal: Celebrates first time that whole House is present since March with a great feast, with major focus on self-support with cookie jar, second jobs, part-time work, collecting on debts and garage sale.

Contradiction: Continuing to find ingenious ways to deal self-support deficit a death blow and at the same time enabling maximum participation in Summer '77. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

External: Four more counties are in the chute for October 1 TMs. Portsmouth cadre signs up for Summer '77, raising three full scholarships from County Commissioners and Chamber of Commerce, while strategizing Southeastern Ohio TMs.

Internal: Total House travels to Chilicothe for outdoor drama, "Tecumseh", an extraordinary enactment of the Shawnee Indian in Ohio Country. Sends out E.G. to summer camp under the guidance of Robert Price, Order Youth.

Contradiction: Keeping September-October-November TMs in being and troops readied in the midst of summer mindset. (Wk. 13)

Internal: Celebration of the training of the orchestrators.

Contradiction: Recruiting for the Summer '77. (Wk. 12)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH.

External: Call from Mayor of Sharpsburg and visits with Catholic clergy point the way toward 30 TMs for Allegheny county and city of Pittsburgh for October.

Internal: One more trained person as John Maslon returns for Global Academy and inkind in swing again as Clark Candy Co. and McDonalds offer to help with TMs.

Contradiction: Getting key authorization for county wide steering committee as summer approaches. (Wk. 10)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Builds preparation quarter plans for statewide Fall campaign. Tri-metro troops are engaged in New Jersey Assembly, Ivy City workday, while preparing for GRA.

Internal: Celebrates the Fourth by participating in two great city-wide events—raft race and fireworks. Morrill family arrives to sing "Pomp and Circumstance" for Anita's graduation.

Contradiction: Discerning enough of next quarter's script to write the publicity before the cast is picked. (wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

External: TM in Fredricksburg is quite seriously moving on with money and training and find planning in midst of nothing else like it in southern Virginia.

Internal: After last week end being in Newark, forces regroup and are again sending three to Newark, one on first orchestration assignment and E.G. to colleagues in two different directions, demonstrating participation in global Movement.

Contradiction: Struggling with how to keep everything going. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: WASHINGTON-IVY CITY HDP

External: Ivy City is impacted with the return of youth John Brown and Tony Smith from the Vogar Consult via Chicago, and reports of Kwangyung II World's Fair by community residents, Annie Wooten and Jeannette Swanson. Beautification campaign launches in Ivy City under the rubric of "Beautify in July". as 5000 yards of sod get laid, flowers planted, bushes, grounded, fences erected, and benches painted. Local residents push their creativity to name the new park. Block clubs meet for the first time and present themselves with challenge of beautifying blocks.

Internal: Completes battleplanning. Sends out 9 to GRA and receives Catherine Bundy from New York for summer inkind intensification.

Contradiction: Mobilizing quickly all program, back-up forces, tools and materials for summer beautification. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BALTIMORE

External: Send out 5 to Summer program at New Jersey Assembly report night. 4 participate in Ivy City workday. 2 go to New Jersey TM Assembly.

Internal: Send out Ellen Howie to camp and Jim Meyers to

GRA. Assign Roy Kauer to GRA on the way back from Vogar.

Contradiction: Discerning how to move strategically during July, with mass impact campaign timelined for next Spring. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PHILADELPHIA

External: New Jersey Town Meeting Assembly happens with 180 people demanding a network of those who care, and continued accountability after the assembly. New York Times reporter stays all day.

Internal: The day after the state campaign is over, summer hits with new house decor, return of the Gilberts and Tom Price from India, children leaving for camp, and area strategy session planning state campaigns for '77-78.

Contradiction: Not waiting until Fall quarter to put into the works the crucial insights relative to authorization and funding discovered from this state campaign. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BROOKLYN

External: Sends out House and metro troops to GRA:Chicago.

Internal: Moves to New York Area House as part of regional consolidation to prepare for Fall campaigns.

Contradiction: Recording wisdom of TM New Jersey campaign while needing to be two steps ahead of Fall campaigns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Sends mailing for summer reporting-planning-celebration on August 6. General prep for a New England maneuver continues: received foundation directories and targets 200 towns.

Internal: Sends Jean and Adia Hanson to Chicago for GRA.

Contradiction: Preparing for coming year. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY

External: Whole House and most of the metro goes to New Jersey for third week of Town Meetings. Ten adults and 3 youth orchestrate and enable 12 TMs and the celebration.

Internal: Wild TM:New Jersey celebration in Morristown followed by evaluation and Area House Church focus the New Jersey campaign and set imaginations spinning about what it would mean to do a New York state campaign.

Contradiction: Translating excitement over New Jersey TMs and Schenectady 10 TMs followup into registrations for Summer '77. (Wk.1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Summer '77 recruitment continues and reminds all that a new quarter is approaching.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON)

Internal: After three weeks of chaos in the halls and on the stairs, the reconstruction is finished and the halls are clean and ready for guests, with a brand-new room.

Contradiction: Turning maybe's and considering into yeses and registrations for GRA. (Wk. 13)

MONTREAL

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Review of pre-coordinator and coordinator meetings in the Eastern Townships leads House to hold a mini forum at which we are unexpectedly honored with a real live resident of one of the township communities. Forum pushes all to rework strategy for townships.

Internal: Experiences French Canadian culture in food, language and community celebrations, with folk singing and dancing in the Olympic stadium and parks and a mass in Notre Dame Cathedral with over 100 parish priests concelebrating.

Contradiction: Keeping forums covered and not allowing summer fever to take over. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: OTTAWA

External: Learns of St. Lawrence Community College's decision to sponsor multiple county forums at Cardinal Community Life Guild meeting.

Internal: Sends out Art Rowe to GRA and Gwen and Dag to camp. Joseph Keve reports to Cardinal Community Life Guild on Maliwada and he and Alison Hart treat House to Indian feast.

Contradiction: Making the summer a significant leap forward amidst questions about future. (wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX

External: Week long Handcrafts PSU recovers 3 traditional arts. Two cabarets, back-to-back, earn over \$1200 for Lorne de L'Acadie Fire Protection Program, as newer fire truck arrives, while need for protection is accentuated by two fires in three days, one destroying nearby Jacquet River school, affecting area school availability.

Internal: Spirit analysis collegium on the community causes deep reflection. Auxiliary is impacted by evening conversation on Bonhoeffer's "Ministry of Holding One's Tongue", from Life Together. Welcomes sojourner Marina Gerbin from Montreal, and one-day visits by four nuns from Plaster Rock, N.B., and the Drown family, guardians from Indianapolis.

Contradiction: Raising need start-up capital for economic development, which is slowing down needed engagement in the community. (Wk. 1)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Fourth Latin American ITI closes sending grads back to their respective countries preparing to do HDPs. Faculty does mini-Ur images course for 25 Cano

Negro villagers. Fence goes up around community garden after lone pig threatens to eat all the crops. First garden harvest comes in of red and white radish. Fifty youth descend on garden to weed and care for it.

Internal: Fr. Don McNamara, pastor of the Tapiapa parish, invites staff and auxiliary to farewell party for ITI staff including steak and all the trimmings.

Contradiction: Intensifying development. (Wk.1)

CAMP BUCKATABAN-SIXTH GRADE TRIP

External: Canoe trip: canoes eight hours paddling first day and canoe jousting highlighted hard week which ended with two-mile lake crossing in two-foot waves. Survival expedition: takes only flour, salt and peanut butter for the week; feasted on clams, crawfish, and blueberry biscuits last night out. Bicycle marathon: takes three hours to go first five miles because of breakdowns, but completes the course in spite of two crashes and numerous other delays.

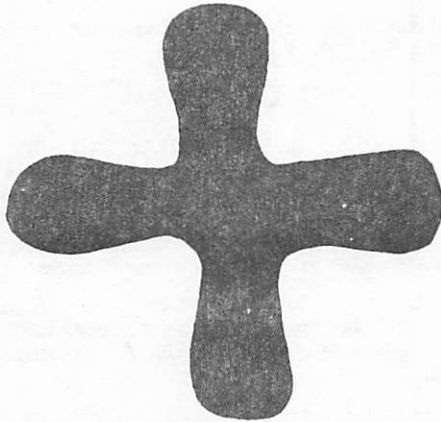

Two steering committees in Greater London set TM dates and a task force produces a TM brochure for Great Britain.

Internal: Thirty Algerian visitors, four from Isle of Dogs, two of the interpreters for Termine consult sojourn with the House.

Contradiction: Thinking through the battle and advantages to insure the victory. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: One core and two sponsors' meetings set dates for autumn TMs.

Internal: Development push begins by targeting the first 236 charitable thrusts with proposals going to press.

Contradiction: Asking for 236,000 pounds by Thursday in a discontinuous time of the year. (Wk. 1)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRISTOL

External: Participates in first area maneuver in London; has two good authorization calls in Wales and recruits for summer program. Receives solid authorization letter from Ferndale TM coordinator.

Internal: Celebrates Chris Boivin's 16th birthday and plans summer of practical engagement for him following global model. Begins search for new House required for Fall.

Contradiction: Using next six weeks of summer when all fronts require attention. (Wk. 13)

Internal: All return from Summer '77 programs.

Contradiction: Creating plans for next quarter amidst fog. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROME —TERMINE HDP

External: Termine citizens for the HDP, as steering committees, finds housing for consultants, women work on menus, and local men take ICA to the mayor.

Internal: Holds House Church with 26 in Rome, pulling together dispersed troops as HDP is symbolizing launch of HDP preparation week.

Contradiction: Acting out of a long-range vision with respect to development and authorization when responding to immediate needs. (Wk. 2)

LAGOS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS — IJEDE HDP

External: First co-op meeting elicits exciting possibilities. Work day at the spring sees 150 Ijedians participating. Governor visits to dedicate new courthouse. Proposal for Fishermen's Warehouse is submitted to government. "Welcome to Ijede" sign is erected on bus stop. Mailing for Community Training Institute to be held on August 21-September 2 in Ijede is mailed and area-wide circuit begins.

Internal: Sends out Loepkes to North America, Richard Kitney to Korea. Richard Poresky, wandering hospital administrator, returns to help set up health system.

(RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LAGOS)

Contradiction: Taking all the many plans for Ijede and focusing them anew. (Wk. 1)

BRUSSELS

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BRUSSELS

External: Development goes on trek to Netherlands with Dutch Jesuit from Egypt on team.

External: Hosts GRA:Europe.

Contradiction: Preparing to be away for two plus weeks after creating massive continental maneuvers. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BRUSSELS

External: Begins framing and steering committee recruitment with daily visits to residents of St. Gilles commune.

Internal: Sends out Brenda, Alexa and Ramona Gilmour to visit family before assuming role in India GSD replication.

Contradiction: Exploiting the advantages already gained in order to break through Belgian suspiciousness about TM. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Does maneuver research in beach-head. Sends Anja Bos to orchestrate Essen TM. Two surprise visits, one from a consultant at Lorne De L'Acadie and one who drops in to see if he can volunteer for a year at Isle of Dogs, surprise all.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: FRANKFURT

External: Fresh areal maneuvers are created at GRA'77 Brussels, made possible by exchanging data, contacts, ideas across the continent. First major continental and areal maneuvers of the quarter accomplished as free-leases for telex machines in Frankfurt and Berlin are inked from ITT and within two days the director of Caritas in Austria, the head of regional development of the border villages in Austria, the head of the Protestant Catastrophe Relief Service, the director of the stock exchange in Vienna, a member of the finance ministry, the founder of the research foundation for development aid and three others agree to come together on September 17th to plan the details for a LENS course in Vienna.

Internal: Creates designs for summer months and guests begin to arrive: Banks, Chris Boivin, Jacob Goertzen, Mary Bengal and Inger Bartman.

Contradiction: Orchestrating critical maneuvers in midst of dispersal of troops. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

External: Economic dimension of community has breakthrough as forms of co-ops are investigated with legal contacts and community people are excited about participating. Kreuzberg Ost T-shirt go on sale and are big success with both children and adults.

Internal: Attends German-French festival and experiences new respect for traditional dances.

Contradiction: Creating images and methods that give clarity on practices of operation. (Wk. 3)

KINSHASA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA - SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Regional and metro coordinators on polis circuit uncover thirst for ITI training. Locates ITI site on outskirts of Lusaka. ITI trustees fellowships offered to heads of church. Has good turn-out for ITI Day in two more metros. \$1,800 comes in this week.

Internal: Mrs. Lachman, chairman of trustee and metro coordinator joins House for first ecclesiola of quarter. Sends out Maybin Simfukwe to GRA.

Contradiction: Getting the vast ITI recruitment net to start landing the fish. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD-EL BAYAD HDP

External: Grand opening of the community kitchen takes place following a marathon evening's work by auxiliary and Public Work Corps to complete the concrete flooring. Project director, with village member of Community Association, travels to Alexandria to arrange for release of trucks.

Internal: Group of 25 dental students from Cairo are welcomed, and the project is explained. They offer, in due course, to give free dental treatment to the village on a special visit.

Contradiction: Focusing assignments to adequately engage the troops with more tasks than troops. (Wk. 3)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI -KAWANGWARE HDP

External: Shorthand classes for adults begin; puts in culverts in Kawangware Road, opening it for traffic after rains wash it out. COMARTKA moves to new, larger, contrally located site as business booms. Farm apprenticeship classes end with week of exams.

Internal: Sends out Jim Kilgore to Global Priors Council and fund raising.

Contradiction: Reshaping time and priorities to new quarter and new battleplan. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI

External: Prepares for August Assembly with collegiums, planning with KHDP, printing recruitment flyer and massive inkind: 25 kg soap, 50 kg cooking oil, 50 kg flour, 50 kg maize meal, 10 kg tea, ice cream and 3,000 shopping bags with KHDP grid on one side and VM symbol on other. Shibuye and Kahunira are VM number 17 and 18 held in Kenya--both with over 300 participants. Holds second guardians luncheon at House, featuring Lela and workshop on educational programs.

Internal: Sends out Bonnie Tolman to Student House and Warren and Geri to Priors Council.

Contradiction: Grasping totality of preparation and recruitment tasks for August program necessary to make assignments for next four weeks. (Wk. 3)

BOMBAY

GLOBAL CENTRUM: BOMBAY-MALIWADA HDP

External: Twelve Health caretakers trained and commissioned in a grand finale to three week of intensive work in health. Community well which collapsed a year ago in the monsoon is rebuilt entirely by the community. Sukdi (nutritious food) contract is renewed and doubled.

Internal: Wiegels and Singhs sent to Worlds Fair. Cyporan Deaouza family sent to Kendur and others to staff consult.

(GLOBAL CENTRUM BOMBAY)

Contradiction: Putting the wheels under the new Sukdi contract in order that a new economic stability be established. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY — UTI REPLICATION

External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sent fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the representative of the university came and gave guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary helped in sowing the seeds. Each house got numbered, plus the community kitchen garden got started.

Internal: Have shifted from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gave a nice room for the project office in which the Uti Human Development Project office was set up. This week many guests visited, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH — VAVIHARSH HDP

External: Vaviharsh makes it on the postal map as Vaviharsh Post Office is opened with Vishnu Kekare, HDTs graduate, selected as Post Master. Three auxiliary members are sent to Male Village to initiate the project with the consult. The village hand pump is finally repaired, bringing relief to village women, who carry water one furlong up the steep hills of the village.

Internal: A roll of blue cloth is inkinded and the auxiliary will now have their blue uniforms.

Contradiction: Orienting programs and tasks when the village's only concern is bringing off the next harvest. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR—KENDUR HDP

External: A week of generating new community interest through a great visit from the Global Health Acceleration Team is topped off by the first planting of the community garden and a VM with 50 present.

Internal: Welcomes three new troops from Shelgaon, Dr. and Mrs. True, and Mary and Cyprian De'Souza and welcomes back from the Shelgaon Consult Suman Patil and Reg Kontz, and from Bombay trip, Housakai Ghavage and Crispin Kontz.

Contradiction: Closing the gap between the auxiliary and the villagers, with nurture of local leaders and binding all into one thrust. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon comes alive with large attendance at Shramdan (work day) on repairing old temple, steps, cleaning out mud filled tank, building sample of cobblestoned road and cleaning streets. Rotary Club speaking engagement and visit to the collector gains solid support from Satara District capital city. Completes village census and land map and secures records from Talati.

Internal: House set-up with furniture from Gram-Panchayat, village high school and inkind paint. Demonstration kitchen garden is prepared and toilets dug and extra room constructed for living space. Project director, Jasper James, arrives in time for Sunday Shramdan.

Contradiction: Channeling some of raw enthusiasm energy to procuring materials and other input that will transform work into solid effectivity. (Wk. 1)

DELHI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: DELHI

External: Indignation of Movement indicated by troops paying their own travel to consults.

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD

External: Five dry land farming experts of 15 acres of soil for demonstration crop-growing. Mr. Chellapa, The chairman of ICA: India visits NDHP and grants 2 bore well diggings. Preschool children receive equipment for study and play, and uniforms are being made ready. Intensive recruitment for Global Women's Forum is on.

Internal: Receives the Global Women's Forum faculty. Mr. Surrender Reddy gave a fantastic address during the breakfast collegium in Nadlapur.

Contradiction: Being clear on Guild/Stake operations. (Wk. 5)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Internal: Corporate sessions are enlivened by report on Nadlapur Consult and the charting of the Tao. Has one job possibility in sight. J.P. Singh family, regional colleagues, participate in House Church.

Contradiction: Opening the eyes of colleagues to the excitement of the MHDP and the replication and then flipping it for catalyzing interest in initiating a village project in Area Calcutta. (Wk. 6), on: Holding the Continental demands as demands, and that in tension with the demand of self-support. (Wk. 10)

SINGAPORE

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SINGAPORE

emerge, seven villagers take trip to dairy farm in preparation for government training and aide in acquiring dairy cattle.

Internal: Celebrates end of quarter with night of bowling for whole House. Sends West To U.S. and welcomes Yallops for quick reports on Oyubari Consult and Australia.

Contradiction: Engaging local leadership regularly or on a full-time basis in the project. (Wk. 3)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA—KELAPA DUA HDP

Contradiction: Having so many glorious opportunities at hand, and feeling inclined to save them for next year's replacements and new troops. (Wk. 3)

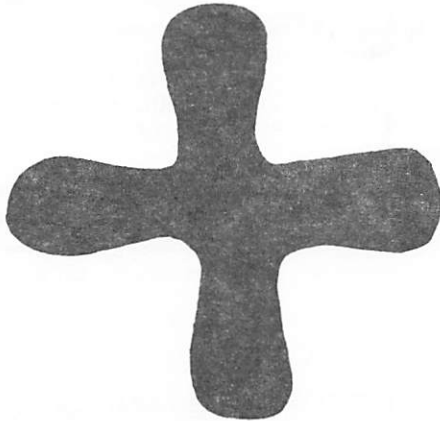

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: LUSAKA - SHANTUMBU HDP

External: Regional and metro coordinators on polis circuit uncover thirst for ITI training. Locates ITI site on outskirts of Lusaka. ITI trustees fellowships offered to heads of church. Has good turn-out for ITI Day in two more metros. \$1,800 comes in this week.

Internal: Mrs. Lachman, chairman of trustee and metro coordinator join House for first ecclesiola of quarter. Sends out Maybin Simfukwe to GRA.

Contradiction: Getting the vast ITI recruitment net to start landing the fish. (Wk. 3)

CAIRO

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: EL BAYAD - EL BAYAD HDP

External: Grand opening of the community kitchen takes place following a marathon evening's work by auxiliary and Public Work Corps to complete the concrete flooring. Project director, with village member of Community Association, travels to Alexandria to arrange for release of trucks.

Internal: Group of 25 dental students from Cairo are welcomed, and the project is explained. They offer, in due course, to give free dental treatment to the village on a special visit.

Contradiction: Focusing assignments to adequately engage the troops with more tasks than troops. (Wk. 3)

The next day one of the representative of the university came and gave guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary helped in sowing the seeds. Each house got numbered, plus the community kitchen garden got started.

Internal: Have shifted from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gave a nice room for the project office in which the Uti Human Development Project office was set up. This week many guests visited, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

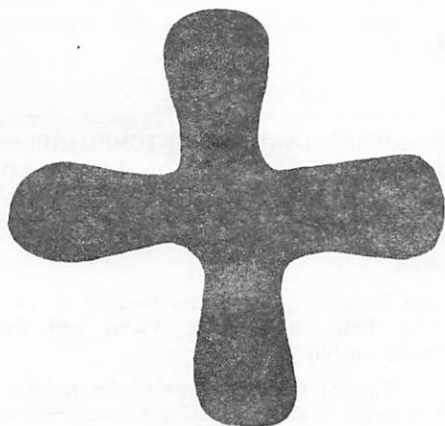

Contradiction: Sustaining the momentum of community decision to assume responsibility in this discontinuous interim. (Wk. 4)

External: ITI recruitment shifts focus from nation to Lusaka Metro, as registrations roll in daily, topping 1/3 of 100 goal. Cabinet Minister of local government and housing, the Hon. J.B. Siyomunji, agrees to give the opening address.

Internal: Carol Manchishi, new Order member of the Soli (meaning fire) Tribe, is born to Victor and Rodah Manchishi family on July 23.

Contradiction: Turning the enthusiasm of the national ITI recruitment network toward producing 60 registrations by August 14. (Wk. 6)

Internal: House celebrates Peter Clements' graduation. Sends out House youth and prepares for "Tea for Two" for the next 3 weeks. Dr. and Mrs. Dan Benedict from Denver stop at the Delhi House while on a world tour to hear replication stories and plan a side trip to Maliwada.

Contradiction: How to use 3 weeks with 2 adults in the House as a break-open time. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Long-awaited drilling rig arrives to bore two free drinking water wells and seven agricultural wells. Plants 30 acres of hybrid sorghum as demonstration. Great excitement as tractor arrives for monsoon ploughing and first 25 crop loans are released from bank. New community centre building is now under construction to provide accommodations for preschool and literacy classes as well as community meetings during monsoon.

Internal: Celebrates the life and death of V. Durgaiyah's father. New battleplanning method brings new level of participation and responsibility at weekly planning meeting.

Contradiction: Discerning the catalytic events for each week and ensuring that they occur. (Wk. 6)

CALCUTTA

Internal: Sends Walter Blackledge to Davao GCF. None Garcia comes up from Davao to go to ITI Korea. Holds Concentration Game for ecclesiola.

Contradiction: Finding renewed corporate power amidst doing individual assignments. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TAIPEI

External: Makes development and courtesy calls to introduce new ICA director around town. Training dynamic continues in midst of transition times as colleagues gather for CSIIIA in Chinese, pedagogy evening.

Internal: Housing models shift daily as number of sojourners drops to five and five from Hai Ou are hosted. House sings as Typhoon Vera smashes windows and floods both floors.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: JEJU - KWANGYUNG IL HDP

External: Sends out 13 from Jeju Do to Chun Cheon ITI with travel money raised. Full moon comes out over Friday night movie in the plaza. A 6:00 a.m. delivery, house to house, of "Bulletin" sets up guild meeting and finds everyone at home.

Internal: Holds ecclesiola with Kazanzakis study by moonlight with Mt. Halla silhouetted in the background. Hyun Ke Jung preschool teacher, interns in House. Rev. Kang Byon Hoon's family visits while he is at GRA, Global Priors Council in Chicago.

Contradiction: Getting village to decide to deal with the "Village Treasury" in order to take seriously its own financial development. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SEOUL

Internal: Two House members and Emerging Generation are in Seoul House, with others at ITI, Global Priors Council and Jeju Do HDP.

Contradiction: Coordinating all forces in shift to ITI while continuing to be Kwangyung backup. (Wk. 6)

Osaka Chamber of Commerce, International Division Director, Sugimoto, calls on companies for inkind and volunteers article in Chamber magazine as development intro to 23,000 companies. Thirty man days by 15 people bring document to edge of completion. Calls and plans for Oyubari celebration and Open House on July 31; receives 40+ yeses so far.

Internal: Prepares for Oyubari celebration and Open House.

Contradiction: Planning re-engagement after major victory is completed. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: SENDAI-OYUBARI HDP

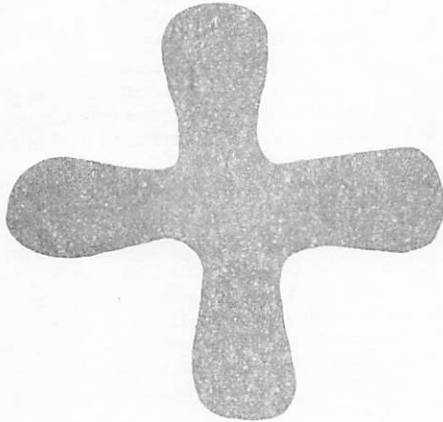

Contradiction: Discovering new ways to spark interest and engagement in the community. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GLASGOW

External: TM development calls raise 270 pounds in one week in Dundee. Power of singing transforms Whitfield steering committee meeting into an explosion of Scottish music, celebrating the third successful week of fund raising with Dundee corporations.

Internal: Is impacted with enthusiasm about Bayad conveyed through Father Matteus, who passes through after World's Fair and GRA Chicago.

Contradiction: Finding creative ways to use minimal troops and vacation pace to intensify colleague contacts. (Wk. 5)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: AMSTERDAM

External: Implements strategy to identify colleagues with mailing of 525 development letters.

Internal: Cleans building, transforming entrance way into its former glory, impacting House and other tenants in building.

Contradiction: Keeping the maneuver plates spinning and their thrust unified with staff leaving, one adult + two EG in-house and overlapping discontinuity schedules. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BERLIN-KREUZBERG OST HDP

Internal: Dawning awareness that there are mighty forces at work in history breaking local ment loose to come to the ITI and we are one of them.

Contradiction: Shortage of skilled workers makes it difficult for some employees to obtain three weeks leave for ITI. (Wk. 7)

Contradiction: Enabling everyone to keep up with increased momentum. (wk. 6)

NAIROBI

GLOBAL CENTRUM: NAIROBI

External: Assembly decor is nearly finished one week beforehand with nightly help of Nexus. Creates faculty and participant manuals. Registrations continue to arrive.

Internal: The two campaigns in Nairobi join forces in assembly prep.

Contradiction: Not falling through the gap between the two years' assignments. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NAIROBI-KWANGWARE HDP

External: Recruitment trip to Central Province brings in first paid registration from Village Meetings, 21st registration counting Kawangware, for Human Development Assembly. Assigns day-house troops to KHDP to prepare for August assembly.

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOMBAY

External: Holds first GWF in Aurangabad and Maliwada while circuit ride to Nagpur. lines up GWF in 1½ days. Speakers at Project Directors' meeting are from State Bank, Rural Development Agency, and Hybrid Seeds Maharashtra.

Internal: Connie Wityatma from Jakarta is here to join GWF team.

Contradiction: Switching strategies from mass movement among the 85% to reach the 15% through GWF. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: VAVIHARSH

External: Vaviharsh makes it on the postal map as Vaviharsh Post Office is opened with Vishnu Kekare, HDTs graduate, selected as Post Master. Three auxiliary members are sent to Male Village to initiate the project with the consult. The village hand pump is finally repaired, bringing relief to village women, who carry water one furlong up the steep hills of the village.

Internal: A roll of blue cloth is inked and the auxiliary will now have their blue uniforms.

Internal: Auxiliary all fitted with new blue clothes. Hosts several national and international visitors.

Contradiction: Focusing engagement into one corporate thrust. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: KENDUR

External: Preschool is impacted this week with the artform

of dance and the whole auxiliary is participating in English and Marathi classes, begun this week.

Internal: Work begins on a toilet for the auxiliary and the highlight of the week is a celebration Friday evening where Claire Clements danced.

Contradiction: Building the structures under work which allow for maximum participation of villagers. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: TASGAON-TASGAON HDP

External: Tasgaon HDP moves ahead securing loans for 32 farmers, for the Demonstration Farm, Sanction of Parent Seed. Health Fair in village is great; Rotary Club doctors from Satara, nearby capital city, attend. Clinic moves to new premises, larger with more maternity care rooms with two beds. Kitchen gardens are prepared in each of the six stakes. Villagers take up responsibility and leadership for NGP by applying to the Zilla Parishad for 50,000 grant phased over two years for village reconstruction. One acre of land is donated for high school. Presents proposal for piped water scheme to government authorities. Inaugurates village square. Mahila Mandal has successful GWF in Satara and village; sends two women to Male Consult.

Internal: Sends Rose to Uti for set-up, Jasper to Chandigarh. Welcomes Ragunath Yadav, M. Gaikwad and S. Gaikwad, new auxiliary.

Contradiction: Maintaining the same speed with new auxiliary. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: UFI-UTI HDP

External: Receives one quintel of hybrid jowar and cotton for the demonstration farm on June 30, 1977. The Agriculture University sends fertilizer, insecticide, and seeds. The next day one of the representatives of the university comes and gives guidance to local farmers. All auxiliary help in sowing seeds. Each house gets number, plus the community kitchen garden starts.

Internal: Shifts from school to another small auxiliary house. One villager gives nice room for the project office in which the Uti HDP office is set up. This week many guests visit, one being Vazir Sultan Tobacco Company officer.

Contradiction: Facing auxiliary and house problems. (Wk. 3)

Internal: Marie Paul returned from Southeast Asia and Hyderabad; Vivian Paul sent to G.R.A. in Chicago, Roger Butcher visits house briefly from development village, Paul children and Bevin Innis and Tressa Butcher return.

Contradiction: Freeing up time from work and EG to do development. (Wk. 7)

MADRAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HYDERABAD-NADLAPUR HDP

External: Long-awaited drilling rig arrives to bore two free drinking water wells and seven agricultural wells. Plants 30 acres of hybrid sorghum as demonstration. Great excitement as tractor arrives for monsoon ploughing and first 25 crop

loans are released from bank. New community centre building is now under construction to provide accommodations for preschool and literacy classes as well as community meetings during monsoon.

Internal: Celebrates the life and death of V. Durgaiyah's father. New battleplanning method brings new level of participation and responsibility at weekly planning meeting.

Contradiction: Discerning the catalytic events for each week and ensuring that they occur. (Wk. 6)

CALCUTTA

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CALCUTTA

External: Highlight of visiting old colleagues with the story of village replication is one young lady who says she will visit Maliwada during her holidays.

Receives authorization nod from resident of the 3rd Division. letter to Immigration approving project and requesting 24-month work visa from Jawan Empaling, M.P.

and parliamentary Secretary of Health, and assistance from RASCOM (Rajung Security Command) in the form of detailed mapping of HDP site, river transportation, bedding, tent, some printing and assistance in obtaining ancient auto.

Internal: Sungai Aup vacant school quarters is in kind staff facility. Receives new intern, Lanianak Pelugan, from Sungai Aup.

Contradiction: Getting reading for September Consult with minimal troops in time of global planning and reassignment. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE JAKARTA-KELAPA DUA HDP

External: Guardians meet at dinner to begin building network of support and interest. Second preschool opens in Dahung with 25 children.

Internal: Preparation for 20 university students from Japan and Indonesia who are spending two weeks experiencing the village.

Contradiction: Finding the key to enable self-consciousness on part of community leadership. (Wk. 5)

HONG KONG

Internal: House enjoys first hand report of Oyubari from Denise Quimby. Two birthdays add festive air to Friday breakfast and Saturday dinner.

Contradiction: Letting the "interim assignment" capture the show. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE : TAIPEI

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ST' LOUIS

External: Recruitment for Fall Kickoff event begins and search for new facility affords opportunity to tell our story all over town.

Internal: Chideaki Cho and Tamura from Fukuoka visit House and meet parents of Fukuoka House members, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ziegenmier, Sr. from Eureka. Collegium on Symbolic-Extended-Movemental sheds new insight on both the Order and our Regional Colleagues.

Contradiction: Doing the "Big Think" and finding the right chord to strum to make the year to start. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PEORIA

External: Four week's work on Fall set-up yields six TMs firm, 10 which will decide this month, 16,000 state brochures printed, all inkind, 10,000 newsletters printed and distributed, and a proposal to the cooperative extension service to work with TM next year.

Internal: Student House work weekend converts Peoria facility into four apartments for sale. Inkind pizza, hamburgers, breakfasts, chicken, watermelon, soft drinks and ice cream, as well as building materials help to make the event enjoyable as well as productive.

Contradiction: Getting troops in the Fall to harvest what has been sown this Spring. (Wk. 11)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: GREEN BAY

External: House staff and metro colleagues meet early morning to plan mini-maneuver on early Town Meetings.

Internal: New collegium decor and Office reorganization greet 44 guests who come for House Church and Gibson family send out.

Contradiction: Holding urgency and excitement of summer over the House transition period. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MILWAUKEE

Contradiction: Assembling and encampment of troops without losing the momentum and enthusiasm of the summer. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: INDIANAPOLIS

External: Entire House and six metro colleagues participate in GRA and return with the fruits of the global effort. Receive grant of 1,300 dollars to fund first two GCFs September 17 and 18.

Internal: House takes a "Countie trek" and visits Bengal Indiana (12 houses and two churches-one for sale). Bushels of fruit and vegetables frozen for a nutritious winter.

Contradiction: Using the local advantage to do more than the local. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CINCINNATI

Contradiction: Bringing files, finances and future recommendations up to date in order to enable a head start for new people next year. (Wk. 4)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CLEVELAND

External: Tm Ohio celebration picnic and summer send-out is success with 45 in attendance, including six new TM families for first visit. "Music Man" is fine context as 18 register for GRA attendance.

Internal: Send-out of Smith to camp staff and others to GRA creates new models for metro TM teams to carry ongoing TMs.

Contradiction: Planting the seeds in July for flowering of Fall TMs. (Wk. 2)

NEW YORK

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEW YORK

External: Writing New York state song highlights state-wide

PSU; 20 colleagues from across state do serious research and are amazed at track record; state TMs have produced a large list of potential advocate and steering committee members.

Internal: Day II research on New York is highlighted by seeing movie "New York, New York".

Contradiction: Experiencing fullness of discontinuity, knowing that the mission is intensifying. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: PITTSBURGH

External: Renew communication with colleagues in midst of discontinuity via sending out of August newsletter and invitations to House Church.

Internal: Parlor conversation after House Church reveals colleagues commitments to participate in House structures and missional assignments.

Contradiction: Locating key to significant engagement in midst of many collegial affirmations. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ROCHESTER

External: Leadership in all three metros ready to do the fall campaigns, most call the house to make sure the war is still on, it is!

Internal: Summer materials are organized and an annotated bibliography is printed and sent to key metro leadership.

Contradiction: Making the appropriate assignments for colleagues such that the mission gets done and all are engaged. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: RICHMOND

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: NEWARK

External: TM:New Jersey campaign launched June 1 at Somerset County Jail. Area orchestrating forces arrive for 15 TMs to be doubled and then quadrupled in coming weekends. Over 83 newspapers across the state are covering the event; 10,000 document covers are inked. June 4 celebration at the Area House has most appropriate theme of "New Jersey Firsts".

Internal: Moves to New York Area House as part of regional consolidation to prepare for Fall campaigns.

Contradiction: Recording wisdom of TM New Jersey campaign while needing to be two steps ahead of Fall campaigns. (Wk. 2)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HARTFORD

External: Phone invitations to Area Council yields six yeses the first week. Development work for the year begins with research.

Internal: Sent out Mark Whitney to visit parents in Belgium. Welcome Ginny Terry for the weekend. Collegiums were signal happenings, especially on Order Polity and Touchstones of priorship.

Contradiction: Discerning the critical arenas of engagement to secure the quick victories with many options for engagement this month. (Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: ALBANY/MANCHESTER

Internal: House returns. Six at ecclesiola. Found study of Moral Issue of our times a deep address. David Rose sent out to new assignment

Contradiction: Preparing for Fall Campaign slowed by Summer exodus and need for Area decisions.(Wk. 7)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: BOSTON

External: Summer '77 recruitment continues and reminds all that a new quarter is approaching.

Internal: After three weeks of chaos in the halls and on the stairs, the reconstruction is finished and the halls are clean and ready for guests, with a brand-new room.

Contradiction: Turning maybe's and considering into yeses and registrations for GRA. (Wk. 13)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: MONTREAL

External: Five communities represented at L'Estrie first forum event outside of metropolitan Montreal IN-KIND story for Area Council captures butcher,baker, grocer and the stationer for total of 500 dollars.

Contradiction: Laying the foundations for next year while being open to area planning and changes in personnel. (Wk. 6)

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: HALIFAX: LORNE DE L'ACADIE

External: Visit of Local municipality representative to guild night to indicate availability of 10,000 dollars grant.

Internal: Beach party with visiting Ministry of Agriculture forestry expert chopping logs for the fires.

Contradiction: Preventing initiation of other programmes even though community is ready due for anxiety over consolidating existing programme leadership roles. (Wk. 7)

CARACAS

RELIGIOUS HOUSE: CARACAS

External: Great strides made in construction of Community Center as community hitches in on floor and column pouring on three general workdays (instead of one) during the week. Pre-school is renovated with beautiful furniture received from Ministry of Education and Sears Roebuck of Venezuela donated 10,000 bolivares to Project.

Internal: Grappling with the situation and finding we can do it as the water pump breaks down, allowing us to reexperience the daily life routines as they were in Cano Negro before the Project started, and as news from the Priors Council reminds us that we are the ones, reduced in number though we may be, called to bring forth new possibilities.
